REMARKS:

This is report by Team Four, assigned to the science area that contained the body of David Sanders, at Columbine High School. The team was also assigned the south and central portion of the school. In addition to Lloyd, the reporting team leader, other members and their duties were:

- Tony Gallardo, Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office
Sketching
- Bruce Davis, Greenwood Village Police Department
Video, measurements and trajectory

On Tuesday, April 20, 1999, Team Four members responded at various times to a staging area set up on Pierce Street, north of Columbine High School, to assist JCSO in the investigation of multiple deaths, shots fired and explosions. No teams entered on April 20 due to safety concerns with the presence of unexploded devices.

On Wednesday morning, April 21, 1999, a planning meeting was held. Team leader Robert Lloyd, along with Chris Andrist, JCSO, Tom Griffin, C.B.I., and Sergeant Randy West were appointed as co-crime scene coordinators. The purpose of the group was to establish procedures for documenting the scene and setting up crime scene teams.

After an assessment of the scenes by members of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, and Jefferson County Coroner's office, a preliminary walk through was conducted to establish assignments.

Agent Griffin documented the scenes with 35mm photographs and Robert Lloyd videotaped the bodies. Another back up 35mm and video team, consisting of Criminalist Tom Adair, Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department and Chris Loptien, JCSO, also videotaped and

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photographed the bodies. The documentation commenced at 10 a.m. and was completed at 12 noon.

On April 21, 1999, at approximately 12:30 p.m., Chris Andrist assigned crime scene personnel to various teams. This meeting was conducted to ensure a standardized approach to all of the scenes. Each team member was then escorted through the various scenes in the school for an assessment of evidence.

Photographs were taken to record the areas investigated by Team Four. Each photograph was documented in a photo log, which is a part of this report.

Team Four was issued evidence numbers 1500 through 1699. An evidence log was maintained to record the numbers used by Team Four. Measurements were taken on each item of evidence collected for inclusion in diagrams and will not be repeated here.

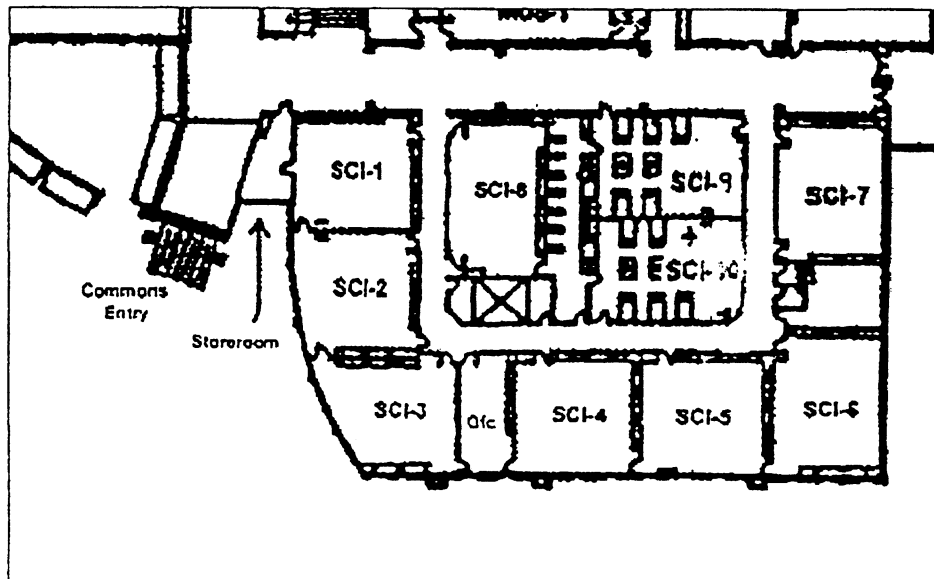
Columbine High School is located on the west side of Pierce Street at the intersection of Fair Drive. The main entry to the school faces east with parking lots on the south side of the school and on the northeast side. Various athletic fields are located on the west and northwest areas of the school grounds and Clement Park borders the north side. The school is a two-story structure with the main entrance being on the upper level. There is exterior access to the lower level on the south and west sides. The main or central hallway for the school runs east and west with the front doors being on the east side and the office area just to the north of the main entrance. The north side of the central hallway on the main level consists of the administrative offices, the gymnasium, the band room and specialty classrooms such as the wood shop, ceramic studio and photography. Numerous other smaller classrooms are also located north of the main hallway. South of the main hallway is the primary classroom area for Social Studies, Language Arts, Math and Science. It also contains the auditorium. The library is located in the west end of the main level with the cafeteria being on the lower level directly underneath the library.

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There is a south entrance to the school on the lower level at the west end. This enters the southeast corner of the cafeteria. There is a stairway that goes from this location to the main level at an intersection of hallways at the southeast corner of the library area (see diagrams). The Science area is in the southwest side of the school on the main level. There are ten classrooms in this area labeled SCI-1 through SCI-10. There are two Science office rooms and a chemical storage area (see diagrams). There is a storeroom on the west side of SCI-1.

This science storeroom has a doorway on the east side into SCI-1 as well as a doorway on the north side onto to the hallway at the top of the stairs coming up from the cafeteria on the lower level. This hallway at the top of the stairs from the lower level runs east and west and is another main hallway south of the central hallway. This hallway intersects with a hallway that runs north and south in front of the library area. These two hallways intersect at the southwest corner of the school above the southwest entryway on the lower level. The west wall of this science storeroom is also the east wall of the southwest entryway to the school. One victim of the shooting was found in this science storeroom on the west side of SCI-1.

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ACTION TAKEN: On April 21, 1999, Team Four entered the building at approximately 1:35 p.m. The processing of the scene continued until Tuesday, April 27. The approximate scene activity times were as follows:

Wednesday, April 21st, 1:35 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Thursday, April 22nd, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Friday, April 23rd, 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Monday, April 26th, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Tuesday, April 27th, 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Science Storage Room/ Body #13

In the science storage room was the body of a white male, which had been previously designated as body # 13, later identified as teacher DAVID SANDERS. The body was on the floor positioned on his back. His head was pointed north towards the hallway door in the room. His feet were pointed south and his arms were down along his sides. Mr. Sanders was bare chested. His blue and white dress shirt and T-shirt were cut and pulled down to the waist. He had gray slacks and brown shoes. Under the body was a flannel shirt and next to the head was a gray sweatshirt. These items appeared out of place with the clothing Sanders was wearing. It was noted that there was an absence of blood under the body. There did not appear to be any evidence in the room to indicate that this was where this victim had actually been shot.

Initially there were two wounds visible: one was in the upper mouth and he appeared to be missing two teeth; the other was an apparent bullet wound on the front of the right shoulder. Once the initial documentation was completed, the Coroner's Office was requested to respond to conduct their examination. Triena Harper of the Jefferson County Coroner's Office and a member of the Denver Coroner's Office responded and conducted an investigation on the victim (see also: Coroner's Report). The examination disclosed two additional bullet wounds in the victim's back, one on the upper right shoulder and one at the base of the lower left side of the neck. The bullet wound on the back of the right shoulder appeared to be related to the bullet wound on the front right shoulder. The bullet wound at the base of

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the neck appeared related to the wound in the victim's mouth.

The victim had a wallet, which tentatively identified him as William David Sanders, dob: 10/22/51, with an address of [REDACTED], and described him as a white male, 6' tall, 190 lbs., brown hair, blue eyes and wearing corrective lenses. The driver's license was a Colorado driver's license #942973429 and showing a social security number of 315-54-0935.

The victim was placed in a body bag, which was sealed and carried to the Coroner's vehicle at the front entryway to the school. After the body was removed from the storeroom, additional photographs were taken to document the room without the body present.

Located in the hallway, just outside the storage room door, were two large pools of suspected blood on the carpet. In both pools of blood (items #1513-1514) were suspected bone fragments. Between the pools of blood and the north storage room wall, the team recovered a single tooth on the floor (#1517).

East of the large pools of blood the team observed additional bloodstains in the carpeting. The first one appeared to be a right hand, believed to be Sanders, due to the close proximity of the tooth and tooth fragments. This pattern had all fingers and thumb patterns in the carpet. A few inches further east the team observed a bloody outline consistent with knuckles of a hand, with voids where the back of the fingers would have pressed on the carpet. Further east along the blood trail was a second right hand impression, with fingers and thumb.

The staggered blood trail continued east then turned south toward Science Room 1 (SCI-1). On the door of SCI-1 there was blood on the door handle and several blood drops on the floor below the handle, as if someone had been standing there. The trail did not enter the room.

The blood trail continued south past the two doors for SCI-2. The blood trail did not enter this room. It continued to SCI-3 where it did enter the room. There was a large pool of blood

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in front of the black chalkboard, which is on the east wall. Several feet away were additional bloodstains along with several T-shirts, a fire blanket, and additional clothing on the floor covered with blood. There was a tooth fragment (#1537) on the floor. On the floor was a portion of a blue and white dress shirt (#1538), consistent with the shirt found on DAVID SANDERS in the science storage room. A pair of blood stained glasses (#1539) was located on a desk along the north wall.

On the floor in the southwest corner of SCI-3 was a hand-lettered sign (#1540), which read, "1 BLEEDING TO DEATH."

In SCI-2, eight tables were set up in a barricade like position across the back of the room. The bloodstains on the floor indicate Sanders was pulled from SCI-3, through SCI-2 (behind the table barricades), through SCI-1 and into the science storage room.

In summary, the investigation revealed that SANDERS was shot twice while in the hallway outside the science storeroom. He probably crawled east until reaching the next hallway junction where he turned south. He opened the door to SCI-1 but did not enter. He then continued south to the end of the hall and entered SCI-3. He was subsequently taken from there across the backs of SCI-2 and SCI-1 to the science storeroom.

Processing of the science storage room and victim was completed at about 6:00 p.m. This completed the work on April 21, 1999.

On April 4, 1999, Team Four returned to the scene of Columbine High School and signed in at approximately 0800 hours. At this time the team began to measure the evidence that had been located and numbered on the previous day. Again photographs were taken to document each item of evidence with the number plaque in view. Where appropriate, the items were photographed with and without a scale. This included evidence item #1500 through item #1553. See the evidence recovery log for the details relating to the individual items.

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A decision was made to mark all holes and impact points on walls and windows with numbers prefixed by the letter "BH" since it was sometimes difficult to determine whether the hole or impact was made by a bullet, shotgun round or bomb fragment. All holes and impact marks were measured to document their position (see diagrams). All penetrating impacts were searched to try and locate the projectile causing the hole. When found, they were photographed and measured for location. Where appropriate, probes were used to determine trajectories and relate specific evidence to the holes. Photographs were taken of these holes both with and without the probes in place.

Hallway South of Library

Examined and photographed were numerous bullet holes and defects in the south wall and windows at the west end of the southern east/west hallway. The windows overlook the entryway for the south entrance and to the lower level commons area. A total of 16 holes or impact points were noted. BH-1 was a hole through the lower portion of the wall close to the west edge of the wall with the Science storeroom. This projectile went through the south wall of the hallway and into the west wall of the storeroom and was recovered inside the wall just south of the sink and cabinet located in that room. The projectile recovered appeared to be a bullet fragment and was recovered as item #1548.

The hole designated as BH-2 located in the lower left hand area of that section of wall (as you look towards the south) was approximately one and one-half inch in diameter and may have been made by a piece of bomb fragment. This hole penetrated the wall and is associated with a hole gouged in the west wall of the Science storeroom. The projectile did not penetrate this wall and would have fallen to the floor in the entryway of the commons area. The size of the hole would be consistent with the end cap of one of the bomb devices.

BH-3 was a small hole in the molding at the base of the wall in line with a tear in the carpet south of that location which was designated as evidence item #1503. The projectile causing this hole penetrated the south wall of the hall and

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also penetrated into the west wall of the Science storeroom. The projectile recovered in the wall appeared to be a bullet fragment and was designated as evidence item #1553.

The hole BH-4 was caused by a projectile going through the south wall below the windows and impacting the window frame at the south end of the east wall of the commons entry area (subsequently recovered as evidence item #1618).

The hole BH-5 was on the lower edge of the window on the south wall. The projectile did not penetrate the metal window frame and is believed to be a bullet fragment which was found directly underneath that spot, that being item #1543.

The hole BH-6 was caused by a projectile that penetrated the vertical window frame for the center portion of the window of the south wall and the projectile was lodged inside the frame. This was a bullet subsequently recovered as evidence item #1616.

The holes BH-7, BH-8 and BH-9 are holes through the window glass of the window on the south wall. These may relate to impacts on the south wall of the entry to the commons area (BH-48, 49, and 50).

The impact point designated as BH-10 was a mark on the wall in the shape of the profile of a flathead screw. A screw of the same size and shape was recovered from the carpet south of that location and was evidence item #1502.

The hole BH-11 was in the wall on the west side of the windows. The projectile causing this hole penetrated the wall and pointed directly to a broken window above the south entry to the commons area. This projectile also penetrated that window and no evidence item was recovered that could positively be associated with that hole.

The hole BH-12 was the furthest west impact on the south side of that hallway wall. This is a low impact into the drywall behind which was a concrete pillar. Numerous lead fragments were recovered from this hole and designated as item #1550.

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The hole BH-13 was located in the wall over the windows on the south wall with the projectile penetrating completely through the wall. No associated evidence item was recovered.

BH-14 was actually a metal fragment stuck in the wall above the windows. This was recovered as evidence item #1551.

The hole BH-15 was also above the windows but did not penetrate to the other side. The wall was opened up and a metal fragment was found lodged in the insulation between the inner and outer walls and collected as evidence item #1548.

The hole BH-16 was in the wall above the windows and penetrated through to the area above the entryway for the commons area. No item was recovered for this hole.

Science Room #8

Overall photographs were taken in SCI-8 where it was apparent that shots had been fired through the window of the northwest door, into the classroom in a southeasterly direction. A table, inside the room had been tipped up in front of the door. Two fired shotgun shells and three fired 9 mm casings were found outside the doorway to this room (see evidence item #1525 through #1529).

New Information Received

At approximately 1600 hours on April 22, 1999 the team was advised by Scott Mundine, an agent for the Colorado Bureau of Investigation, that interviews had indicated a student had a video camera in the music room that contained images of one of the suspects from the previous Monday. This room was found to be Music-1 and with the description given to Scott Mundine the associated evidence was found in that room. This was a backpack, a Sony video camera, a blue hat and a white t-shirt. These items were photographed and their location measured. They were not collected pending an examination by bomb squad personnel.

At approximately 1630 hours, the team was contacted by Chris Andrist who advised that other interviews indicated a student in one of the Math rooms also had videotape of at least one of the suspects. This was found to be Math room

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#10 and was associated with a student Eric Veik. A backpack, plastic bag of videotapes and a video camera bag were found at this student's desk in Math #10. The photographic documentation of these items was deferred to the next day.

The photographs taken on April 22, 1999 included roll #7 through roll #12. The team cleared the scene at Columbine High School at approximately 1700 hours.

Math Room #10

On Friday, April 23, 1999, the team entered Columbine High School at approximately 0800 hours. Photographs were taken to document Math #10 and specifically the desk of Eric Veik. His desk was in the third row from the east and was the second desk from the south. A test paper on the top of the desk showed the name Eric Veik, also on the top of the desk was a pencil and a calculator. On the north side of the desk was a black backpack. On the south side of the desk was a black video camera case and a plastic Target bag containing six Sony VHS tapes. (See evidence items #1559 through #1562). It should be noted here that neither these items nor the backpack and other items in the music room had yet been searched by the bomb squad.

Science Room #8 (continued)

Team Four returned to SCI-8 to continue the photographing and documentation of the evidence in this room. (See evidence item #1563 through #1586.) This evidence consisted primarily of fired bullets, lead fragments and shotgun shell wads. As previously stated it appears the shots fired into the room came from the northwest door going southeast across the room towards the southeast door of the classroom. As done previously in the hallway, bullet or projectile impacts and holes were designated with a number preceded by the prefix "BH."

BH-16 was a hole in a plastic electrical conduit along the east wall of Science room #8. A bullet fragment was recovered from inside this conduit as evidence item #1582. (It was later noted that BH-16 was used previously, so there are now two references to this number).

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BH-17 was an impact in the east wall, which penetrated the wall and exited into the chemical storage room on the east side of SCI-8. The projectile impacted two metal cabinets inside this room and was recovered on a shelf as evidence #1585.

BH-18 was an impact point on the east wall of SCI-8 and recovered was a small fragment imbedded in the wall as evidence item #1581.

BH-19 was an impact point on the east wall. No fragments were recovered.

BH-20 was an impact point on the east wall through a Wolf poster. The projectile went partially through the wall and was imbedded in the insulation between the walls. This was recovered as item #1584.

BH-21 was a hole in a lower cabinet door on the east side of the room, the cabinet being directly under the sink. The projectile was recovered from within the door as evidence item #1577.

BH- 22 was an impact point on the top drawer of a cabinet on the east wall underneath the sink. This was an impact point only. No evidence was recovered from this spot.

BH-23 was impact point on the east wall at the top of the Wolf poster. This is an impact point only.

BH-24 was a hole in a box sitting on the east counter just south of the sink area. The projectile went through this box and impacted a Safeway sack. The hole in the Safeway sack was marked as BH-25. The projectile continued though the Safeway sack and impacted the back splash on the back of the east counter and this was marked as BH-26.

BH-27 was an impact point on the south wall by the southeast door to SCI-8. There were two fragments imbedded in the wall at this location, which were recovered as item #1583.

BH-28 was also on the south wall by the southeast door and was an impact point only.

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BH-29 and BH-30 appeared to be impact points on the ceiling tiles in the middle of the room but the projectile did not penetrate these tiles. The angle indicated by the gouge in the ceiling tile pointed back to the northwest door to SCI-8.

BH-31 and BH-32 are impact points in the upturned desk in front of the northwest door to SCI-8. BH-31 was an actual hole punched through the edge of the desk and BH-32 appeared to be an impact point only.

West Science Hallway

In the hallway south of SCI-8, by a mechanical room, two spent shotgun shells were found on the floor (items #1530 and 1531). Blood spatter was seen on the wall of the hallway across from Science office #1. This is at the junction with the south hallway running east and west. A sample was collected as Item #1532.

Science Office #1

Team Four next examined Science office #1, which is located on the south side of the building between SCI-3 and SCI-4. This office area has a door on the northwest corner of the room (opening onto the hallway); a door on the southeast corner (opening to SCI-4); and a door on the southwest corner (opening to SCI-3). Teachers' desks are along the west wall. There are two rows of equipment and bookshelves down the middle of the room and the sink along the east side.

It appears multiple shots were fired into this room through the hallway door window, including shotgun and 9 mm. An incendiary device was also ignited inside this room. A live 9mm cartridge was found outside the door to SCI-3 and three fired 9mm casings were found outside the door to the science office (items # 1533-1536).

The incendiary device consisted of a glass bottle with some type of flammable liquid. There was also a CO2 cartridge, matches, and lead fragments found in the debris (items #1587-1594). Burn deposits on the glass door to the Science office indicate that the device may have been stuck on the window of the door with the initiator (which would be the CO2 cartridge) filled with some type of flammable and/or

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explosive compound. Since a lid was found for the glass bottle but no wick or other fusing, it appears as though the CO2 cartridge may have been the intended initiator for this device. While there were burn deposits on the door window, it does not appear that the glass jar containing the flammable liquid actually broke until it hit the floor inside the room. This would suggest that perhaps the CO2 cartridge was attached to the device, which was attached to the window but the cartridge failed to explode and simply spewed burning debris from the top depositing it on the window. The window was subsequently broken with the device landing on the floor inside the room. It was noted that the CO2 cartridge was not ruptured. A small fire was apparently started but extinguished by someone using a dry chemical fire extinguisher.

The bookcases down the center of the office were impacted by projectiles with the path of the projectiles pointing back to the northwest door. This would put the projectiles on a southeast trajectory coming through the door of the office.

Team Four left the Science area at approximately 1700 hours and attended a briefing in the auditorium for all the crime scene investigation teams. At approximately 1800 hours, Team Four cleared from the school. Taken on 04/23/99 were photo rolls #13 through #20.

On Monday, April 26, 1999, Team Four returned to the scene at Columbine High School at approximately 0800 hours. There, the investigation of the scene inside Science office #1 was resumed. Photographs were taken to document the individual items of evidence collected and also more bullet holes and impact points inside the room. Evidence collected from the Science office #1 consisted of evidence items #1587 through #1614.

BH-33 was a large impact point on the west edge of the window frame for the door to Science office #1. This impact point would be consistent with a shotgun round.

BH-34 was an impact across the spine of the books on the second shelf unit to the south and the third shelf down from the top.

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BH-35, BH-36 and BH-37 represent the path of the projectile traveling southeast from the northwest corner of the room. This is a large hole skipping across the spine of a Sigma catalog and through the south end of the second shelf unit to the south (BH-35). BH-36 is a hole in a blue 3 ring binder at the north edge of the third shelf unit to the south which is a through and through hole leading to BH-37 which enters another 3 ring binder just to the south of the first. Within this second 3 ring binder was recovered a large lead fragment and other smaller fragments were found when the 3 ring binder was moved. These were recovered as item #1607 and would be consistent with a shotgun slug. Item #1606 may be fragments relating to this item (#1607) as they were recovered on the same shelf beneath BH-35. It was also noted that a single shotgun wad in three pieces was recovered from inside the room. These were items #1597, #1608 and #1610.

BH-38 was an impact on the end of the second shelf unit to the south and recovered in that area were two small lead fragments marked as item #1611.

BH-39 was a hole through the end of the second shelf unit to the south which when a probe was placed through the hole lined up with BH-41. BH-40 was a second hole through the end of that same shelf unit which related to BH-42. BH-41 was in the divider between the east and west shelf units as was BH-42. The projectile going through BH-39 and BH-41 was recovered as item #1614 (a lead fragment located in a culture tube box on a shelf on the east side of the room). The projectile from BH-40 and BH-42 was recovered as item #1613, another fragment located inside a second culture tube box on the east shelf units. Item #1614 was in the box on the fourth shelf up from the floor and item #1613 was in the box on the fifth shelf up from the floor. Both of these were on the second unit to the south on the east side of the room.

South Science Hallway

The Science area has a U-shaped hallway with two north/south segments, which are on the west and east sides and the bottom of the U is the east/west hallway on the south end of the Science area. On the north side of the hallway at the intersection with the eastern northwest

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hallway was an impact point marked as BH-44. BH-44 is a gouge in the wood molding on the northwest corner of the intersection with the south Science and the east Science hall. This would locate it at the southeast side of SCI-10 and kitty-corner (northwest) across the hall from SCI-6. SCI-6 is located in the southeast corner of the Science area (see diagrams).

BH-45 is a hole in the hallway wall just to the north of the doorway for SCI-6. This is a through and through penetration into SCI-6. BH-46 is a hole in a speaker mounted on east wall of SCI-6. The projectile went through the speaker and into the wall behind the speaker. This is labeled as BH-47. The projectile was subsequently recovered as item #1615.

Entryway-South Commons Area

Team Four returned to the area of the entryway for the commons area located at the southwest corner of the school. In looking at the south wall over the entryway, additional impact points were noted that possibly relate to the initial impact points located on the second floor above the entryway (BH-7, BH-8 and BH-9).

The impact labeled BH-48 was in the window frame of the windows over the south entry to the commons. This is an impact point with no penetration.

BH-49 was a hole in the glass window over the south entryway over the east set of doors. This window is a set of double pane glass and the projectile penetrated the northernmost pane but did not penetrate the southern pane. A projectile was recovered between the glass as item #1619.

BH-50 was in the frame of the window at the southeast corner on the east wall of the entryway. A projectile was recovered relating to this as item #1618 from inside the window frame.

A nail (item #1620) was found on the ledge of a column on the southeast corner at the top of the stairway from the commons area to the second or main level of the school. A possible impact point was noted on the wall south of where the evidence was located and marked as BH- 51. Again

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photographs and measurements were taken on all of the above items and impact points.

The rolls of film taken on this date included roll #21 through roll #39. Team Four cleared from the scene at Columbine High School at approximately 1810 hours on April 26, 1999.

Outside the Commons Area

On Tuesday, April 27, 1999, Team Four entered the scene at Columbine High School at approximately 0800 hours. Team Four and the other investigators attended a briefing in which the remaining items of evidence needing to be collected were discussed. Team Four was assigned to collect a fragment of a bullet found outside the school. This was labeled as item #1622 and was found outside the south commons area in the lawn just to the southeast of the entry doors. This was photographed and measured for the diagrams.

Science Room #7

The team then went to SCI-7 where witness reports had indicated that several people had made notes relating to the bombing within the school as they sat in the room waiting for rescuers. Numerous papers were seen in this area strewn on the floor at the front of the classroom, which would be the west side of the room. These papers were photographed and collected as item #1623.

Tech Conference Room

Team Four was also requested to photograph the Tech conference room, which is located on the east side of the Tech Lab area. This had not previously been documented. It was noted that on one of the write-on boards on the north side of the classroom were the words "The skool sood bee blown u.p.s."

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


