INVESTIGATION:

On 05-07-99 at 0945 hours I interviewed Jenny Allen in the presence of her mother at her home. Jenny stated that her mother drove her to school the morning of 04-20-99 arriving at 0715 hours. She stated she entered the school through the main entrance. She did not notice anything unusual going on outside. She stated she has fourth period off as an off hour and used it to study in the cafeteria. She stated she entered the cafeteria approximately at 1015 hours and entered from the stairway. She stated maybe a third of the tables were full, holding approximately 65 kids. She stated a lot of them come and go throughout the hour.

Jenny stated she did not know who HARRIS and KLEBOLD were, would not recognize them, and didn't even know their names. She stated she was not aware of the "trench coat mafia" group. Jenny stated she sat at a table with Dawn Muirhead, Lindsey Dowling, Lindsey (last name unknown), and Melissa Lorenz. She stated she didn't notice anything unusual around the cafeteria. She stated during fourth hour she went to the Rebel Corner Store and got a snack. She stated the bell rang at the end of fourth period and she went upstairs to her science class.

Jenny stated that it was in her science class that her teacher heard two pops. She stated she wasn't aware of the noise until the teacher mentioned it. Then the fire alarm went off. She stated her teacher, Mr. Moiser, told the class to get out. She stated the kids in the class started to go west in the hallway but they were met by kids coming their way who yelled at them to get back. They heard gunfire and explosions. She stated they went back

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to the science room which she indicated on the attached diagram and hid under the tables. She stated that they were in the classroom for perhaps three and a half hours and didn't get out until after 1600 hours. She stated the SWAT team eventually got her class out. She stated during the stay in the room, another teacher came in looking for a first aid kit. She stated that the explosions shook the floor and she could tell they were close.

Jenny stated she remembered the thought for the day having to be with "420". She stated another girl told her that it was an indication to bring marijuana to school and use it. She also said the thought for the day had something to do with "I know you guys don't want to be here."

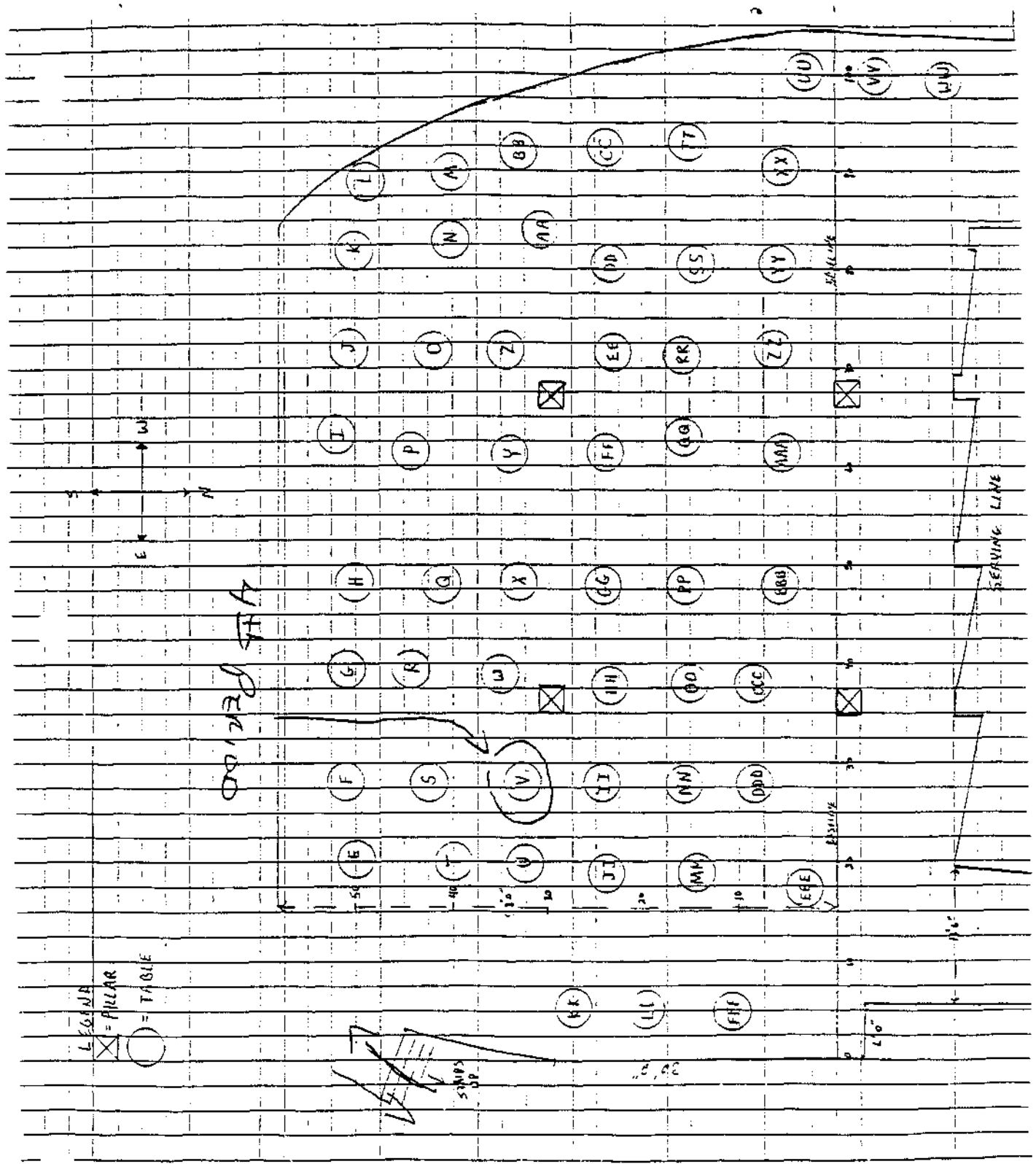
At this point Mrs. Allen stated her family used to live at 8002 South Vance Street, across the street from Brooks Brown. Mrs. Allen stated a year to a year and a half ago while living on South Vance Street, Mrs. Brown came over to tell Mrs. Allen about a kid to be on the lookout for. Mrs. Brown had a yellow sticky paper with a kid's name on it, his description, and a license plate number. Mrs. Brown was very intent on telling Mrs. Allen to be aware of this kid that was violent, dangerous and apparently making bombs. She asked Mrs. Allen to call the police immediately if she were to see that car out in front of the Brown's house. Mrs. Allen could not remember the kid's name.

AREA AT ABOUT 11¹⁵ AM. SHE USUALLY SITS AT THE TABLES
ACROSS FROM THE 'REBEL CORNER'. HER BLACK AND BLUE BAWLPACK
(EDDIE BAWER BRAND) WAS ON THE SHELF BY THE WINDOWS. THE
PACK HAS A BRACELET ON THE ZIPPER AS A PULL.

BROOKE WENT TO THE VENDING MACHINES JUST PAST THE MAIN
STAIRS. SHE RETURNED TO HER FRIENDS, B.S. SECORD, KATE REBROVIC,
ELWINE MILCER, ISAH SALAZAR, AMER STANLEY, QUIN BEERTZ,

Summary of Statement (cont.) _____

MULVANEY & COLLEEN SCHWARTZOTT. THERE WAS A COMMOTION AND PEOPLE WERE STANDING UP, LOOKING WEST. THERE WAS A 'POP' NOISE HEARD AND THE JANITOR WAS BY THE STAIRS, TELLING PEOPLE TO 'GET DOWN'. INITIALLY BROOKE THOUGHT IT WAS A DRIVE BY SHOOTING SINCE SHE LOOKED OUTSIDE AND SAW A WHITE PICKUP TRUCK IN THE JUNIOR/SENIOR LOT DRIVING SLOW AT FIRST AND THEN SPED OFF. THE JANITOR THEN SAID, 'RUN!' BROOKE RAN PAST THE DOOR BY REBEL CORNER AND THEN TO THE PARKING LOT. SHE CONTINUED TO RUN TO PIERCE ST AND WAS TOLD TO KEEP RUNNING. THEY WENT TO THE 3RD HOUSE ON POUL STREET AND CALLED HER PARENTS.

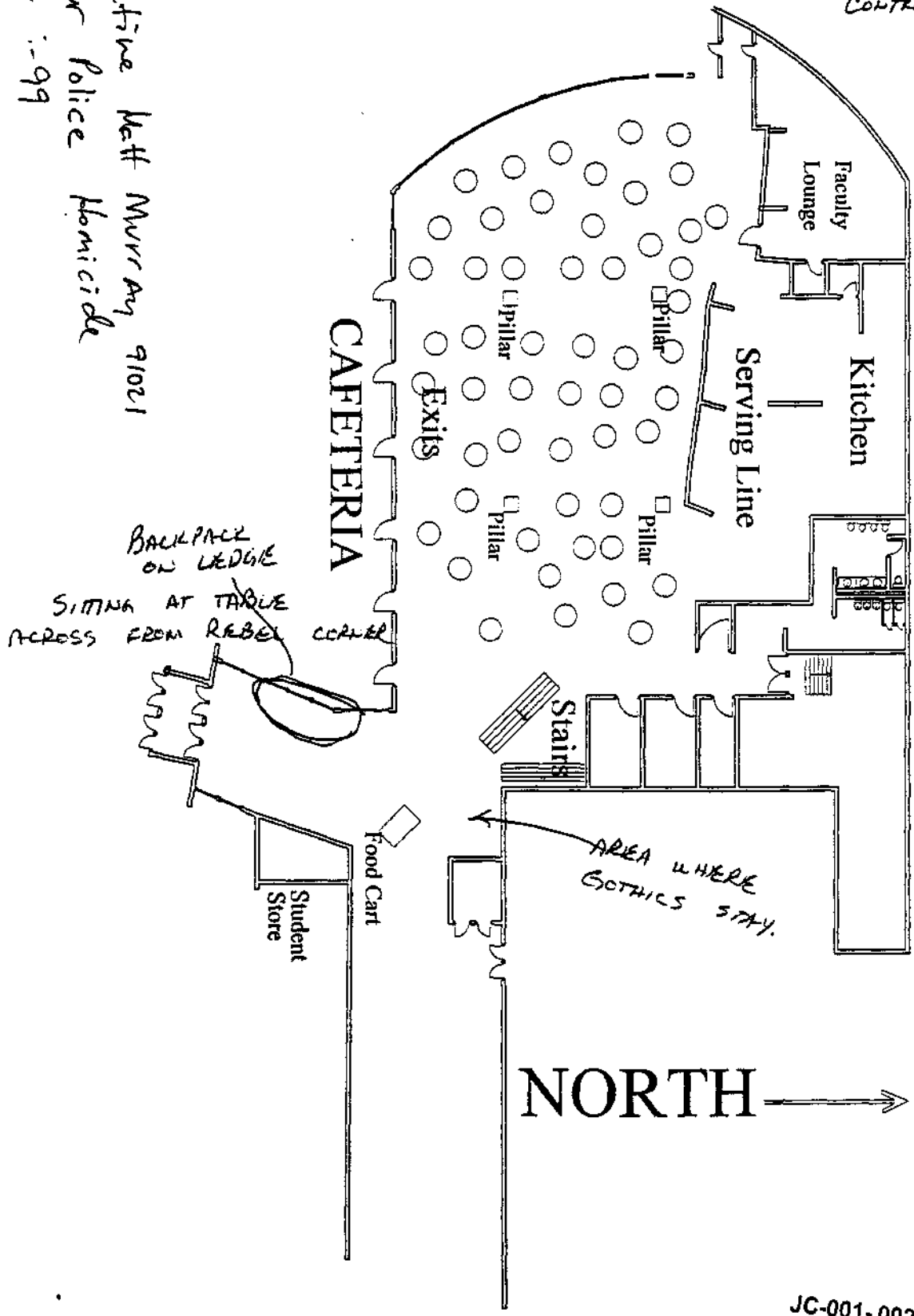

ON 080399 I TELEPHONICALLY INTERVIEWED ALTINAY SEMIH, A STUDENT AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL. ALTINAY REPORTED THAT THIS WAS HIS FIRST INTERVIEW WITH THE POLICE SINCE APRIL 20, 1999.

ALTINAY REPORTED THAT HE WAS AT SCHOOL ON THE DAY OF THE SHOOTING. ALTINAY REPORTED THAT HE WAS AT WYBRON TREN FOR HIS FIRST THREE CLASSES OF THE DAY, HE THEN WALKED TO COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL PARKING LOT AND PARKED IN SPACE # 295. HE ENTERED THE SCHOOL BY THE DOORS ENTERING THE KITCHEN (HE REPORTED THAT HE THOUGHT THESE DOORS WERE THE SAME AS HARRIS AND KLEBER USED TO ENTER THE SCHOOL). HE THEN GOT IN LINE AND GOT SOME PIZZA. THEN HE HEARD KIDS YELLING, "SOMEBODY'S GOT A GUN", HE, NOR DID OTHER STUDENTS BELIEVE THIS, THOUGHT IT WAS A PRANK. HE THEN HEARD SHOTS BEING FIRED, THOUGHT IT WAS FROM OUTSIDE, THE SOUNDS SOUNDED LIKE POPPING SOUNDS HE REPORTED ALTINAY REPORTED THAT STUDENTS BEGAN TO GET DOWN ON THE FLOOR AND HIDE, HE HID TOO, NEAR REBEL CORNER. HE DID NOT REMEMBER HEARING THREE GUN SHOTS, ONLY LOUD SCREAMING AND KIDS RUNNING.

ACTIVITY REPORTED THAT KIDS STARTED TO LEAVE THE CAFETERIA, BUT TEACHERS SAID TO NOT LEAVE. HE REMEMBERS A LADY TEACHER RUNNING AROUND AND MR. SANDERS RUNNING AROUND TRYING TO HEAR STUDENTS. ACTIVITY RAN OUT THROUGH THE BUSINESS AREA, HE HEARD MORE GUN SHOTS AND COULD HEAR BULLETS HITTING WALLS THAT WERE CLOSE TO HIM. HE AND OTHER STUDENTS BURIED THEMSELVES INTO A ROOM AND WAITED, HE HEARD WHAT HE THOUGHT WAS A LEON, THEN THE FIRE ALARM SOUNDED, ACTIVITY THEN RAN OUT THROUGH A SET OF EMERGENCY DOORS AND RAN TO THE "MORROW" HOUSE ON PIERRE ST. On 4-26-99, Inv. Raker did conduct an interview with Jamie Am at their residence, and Am states that she was in line to get her food a person known to her as Chris Markum came in the west door yelling "there's a guy with a gun, get down!"

Am then sat on the floor, heard shots and then she observed a white male in a white t-shirt outside the windows but did not see gun and was unable to provide a description.

Amos then ran to the auditorium hallway and got into the elevator and took it to the 2nd floor and since the 2nd floor was full of smoke took the elevator back down to the 1st floor and then ran to the auditorium.

Am did hear gunshots but never saw a gunman.

Am did leave her backpack in the lunchroom at table SS or DD and that the pack is gray and black

Am states that she had been in the cafeteria since 10:30 until the shooting started and that she never observed any unusual duffel bags, people or events.

The interview was concluded at this time.

She talked to her friends and went outside. She put her back pack down outside, by the doors of the cafeteria (by the windows). She walked back in to the cafeteria, got in line, and bought lunch. She was waiting for Tiffany Sharpley (no other info. available except that Tiffany has a twin brother, Chad.) to pay. She heard one pop from the stair area. Someone yelled they have a gun. A janitor and Mr. Sanders were yelling for every one to get down. She went under a table with Dustin Gorton (797-3613), a boy named Brett, Greg Garcia, a girl named Kristen, and some other kids.


She heard gun shots. She couldn't tell where the shots were coming from, inside or outside, or where. She couldn't see anybody. She saw people getting up and running toward the stairs. There were too many kids running up the stairs for her to run to the stairs. She ran to the kitchen. There were two lunch ladies. Everyone ducked into one of three rooms. She was in the bathroom with 6 boys, Dustin, Brett, Fletcher and three other boys she doesn't know.

She said that she heard something like little explosions, four of them. About 20 minutes later she heard someone in the ceiling. She said it sounded like the ceiling was going to break. As they were walking out of the room, a kid fell through the ceiling. The force shut the bathroom door. She didn't know the kid who fell through the ceiling, but said that he was blonde, and she's since seen him on the news. She thinks his name may be Nick Foss. She said that she left the bathroom when she heard the ceiling noise. She went out the kitchen door, along where the vending machines are, and out the door by the faculty lounge. She got behind a car with SWAT members. They had her run to a police car and then jump a fence and then she went to another police car.

Julie never saw the shooters.

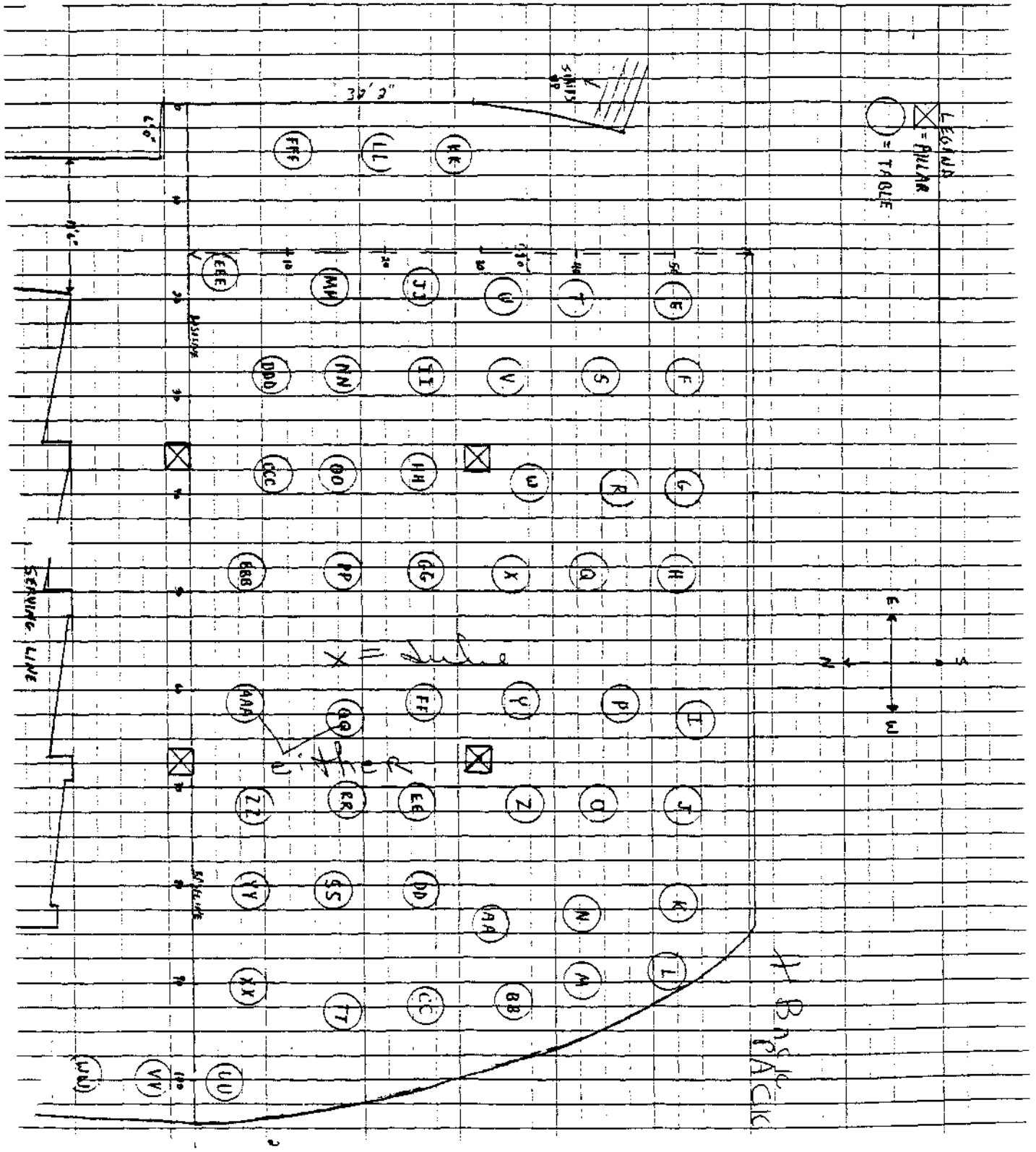

On April 27, 1999 at 1000 hours I met with Kim Anderson and her mother, Janet Lee, at 7289 West Chestnut Drive in Littleton, Colorado for the purpose of an interview.

Kim provided the following information about the Columbine High School incident, which occurred on April 20, 1999:

- Kim got out of math class at 11:10 a.m. and immediately went to her locker near the main entrance of the school. She stated that this is her typical routine
- Kim stated that she then went back to the math hall and met with Jamie Klement (973-8978), who she routinely eats lunch with.
- Kim stated that they both walked down the stairs and in to the Commons area of the cafeteria at about 11:15 a.m. She stated that this is routine for her and Jamie and that she is fairly sure about the time.
- Kim stated that they walked towards the kitchen area and then west. She identified the table, at which she was sitting and included the travel route into the cafeteria. The table was identified as DD on the FBI evidence diagram.
- Kim stated that she was facing the northwest and that the following were sitting at the table when she got there: Lori Reynolds, Erin Hoffman (female) and Elizabeth (unknown last name). She stated that Jamie Klement went to the kitchen area and entered into the kitchen by the west door
- Kim stated that she was eating Goldfish Crackers, a Kudo's bar and a V-8 drink. She stated that she was wearing a black and gray mini-skirt and a white short sleeve shirt. She stated that she normally waits for Jamie to return before she eats and therefore, she was "shaking up her V-8" drink
- Kim stated that she had her black, Jansport backpack with a leather bottom with her. She stated that her German and business notes were in the backpack, as well as Jamie Klement's ID Card
- Kim stated that "everyone started to get up near the windows (west)", which usually means "that there is a fight or something": Kim stated that at about the same time Mr. Sanders came "out of the teachers lounge and yelled 'get down, get down' and he had a terrible look on his face". Kim stated that Lori, Elizabeth, Erin and herself all "got under the table" and that everyone in the cafeteria was saying "oh God, oh God
- Kim stated that she "everyone near the windows started coming towards them (east)" and that she heard what she thought was "firecrackers" She described them as "bang, bang, bang, bang" She stated that the noises were coming from the "west door near the teachers lounge". She stated that she did not see any of the "shooters" and did not hear anybody say anything "other than yelling and screaming".
- Kim stated that she thought, based on the noise of the gun shots, that the "shooters were coming in the west door".
- Kim stated that she started to "scoot behind a trash can, which was right behind her (east)". She stated that she "scooted until she got to the middle of the cafeteria (between table designation GG and FF) and then got up and ran towards the stairs" She stated that she "ran up the stairs and went left (opposite the direction of the Library) and then past the Science hall" where she eventually "ran out the door by the Math hall and over to Leawood Park"
- Kim stated that she did not see the "shooters" in the cafeteria and did not see the "shooters" in the hall as she exited.

- Kim stated that she did not notice any "large duffel bags in the cafeteria" and did not "see anybody bring any big duffel bags in to the cafeteria". She stated that "there were a lot of back packs on the tables and some on the floors" but nothing that "seemed bigger than normal".
- Kim stated that she did not know the suspect gunmen (Harris or Klebold) and in fact, never even heard of them prior to the newscasts after the incident.
- Kim stated that she "has never heard anything about the Trench Coat Mafia", nor has she "ever really seen anybody walking around the school with trench coats on".
- Kim stated that her boyfriend, Joe Sorenson (303-932-2348 / address on South Harlan), told her recently that he (Joe Sorenson) knew Eric Harris. Sorenson apparently told Kim that the Seniors of 1998 named "that group the Trench Coat Clan" which later became the "Trench Coat Mafia".
- Kim stated that she did not hear anybody talk about guns or bombs prior to the incident at CHS.

I gave Kim Anderson and her mother my business card should they need to have a contact regarding this incident. Included with this report is the diagram that Kim drew her location, entrance into and exit out of the cafeteria.

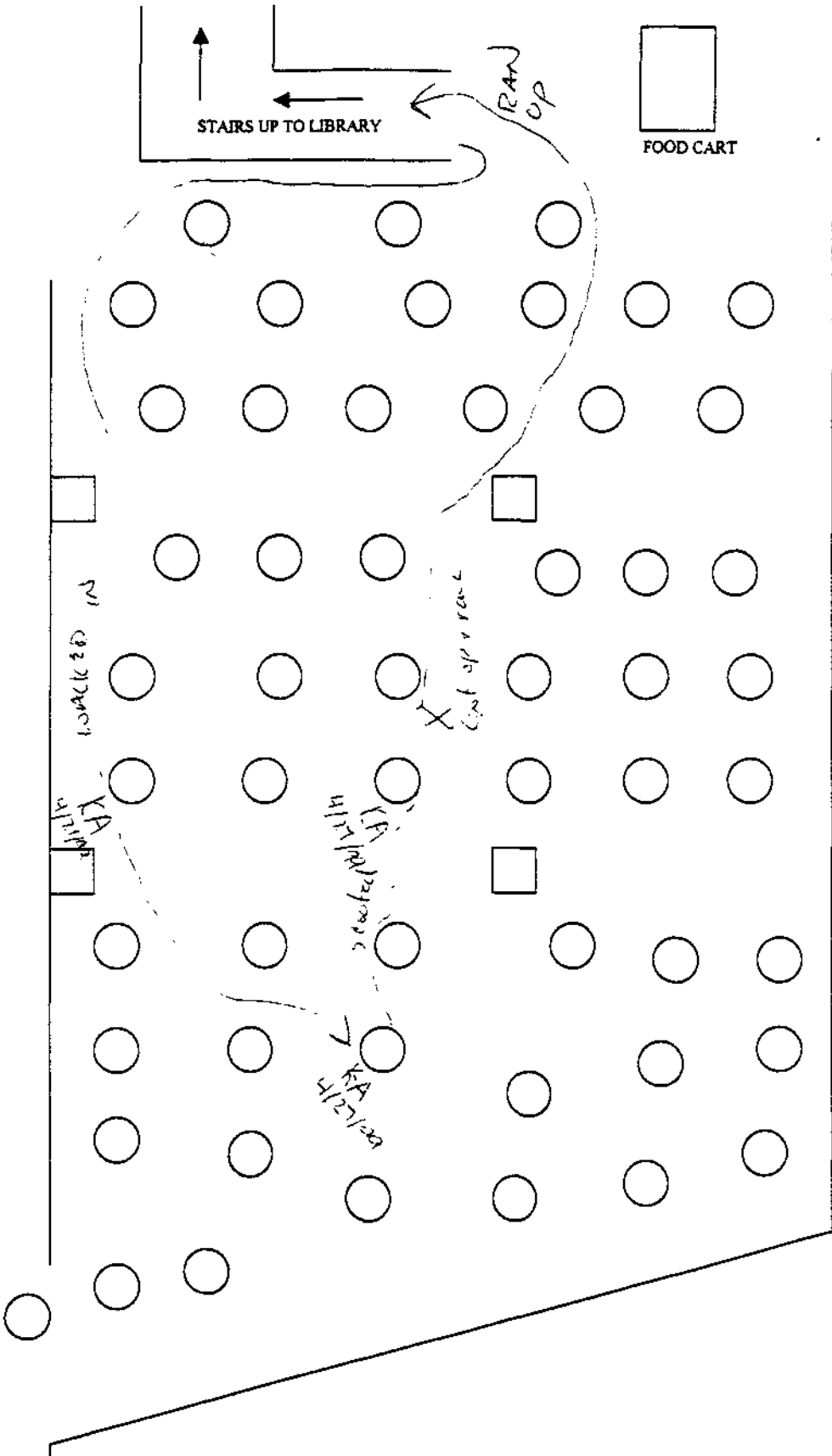

Sarah Marie Anderson, DOB 07/21/1983, 7600 South Kendall Boulevard, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)979-3266, was interviewed at Saint Philip Lutheran Church, 7531 South Kendall Boulevard, Littleton, Colorado, in the presence of her parents, Gary Anderson and Mary Arenas by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Anderson provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Anderson got out of Math class, taught by Mr. Bundy, and proceeded from the Math area with her friend Danielle Stanek, and went down the main hallway directly to the cafeteria. Once in the cafeteria, Anderson set her bookbag at the lunchroom table (marked DDD on diagram sketch), got her lunch, and returned to her table. Anderson remembers that Danielle Stanek, Samantha Roman, Tina Shabez, and Sara Ryan were also sitting at her table. Anderson was sitting at the table facing east.

Anderson had been eating for approximately five minutes when she saw four or five boys run in the cafeteria from the exit by the teachers lounge. They were yelling that someone was shooting. Everyone in the room got under the tables. Anderson could hear what sounded like explosions. William Sanders and some janitors were running around the cafeteria telling the students to stay down. Everyone in the room stayed under the tables for two or three minutes. Anderson remembers hearing glass in the cafeteria break and saw someone dressed in black outside the cafeteria doors by the teachers lounge. When the glass started breaking, everyone climbed out from under the tables and began to run in all directions.

Anderson ran in the bathroom on the northeast corner of the cafeteria and stayed there for two or three minutes. There were a few other girls in the bathroom, but Anderson did not know who they were. Anderson and the other girls left the bathroom and went with Mr. Andres and a group of students into the auditorium. The group went through the auditorium and out the auditorium's north exit. Anderson then ran east down the main hall toward the main entrance and then north down the hall by the

counselors office and post-grad center and out the exit behind the gymnasium. As Anderson ran down the main hall she noted that the windows on the doors at the main entrance to the school were shot out. Once outside, Anderson joined a large group of about 250 students outside the entrance, who had stopped in front of a 4' high fence. Anderson waited in the group for a moment until someone said they saw one of the gunmen. Then everyone started climbing the fence. Anderson and many of the other students then ran to Clement Park.

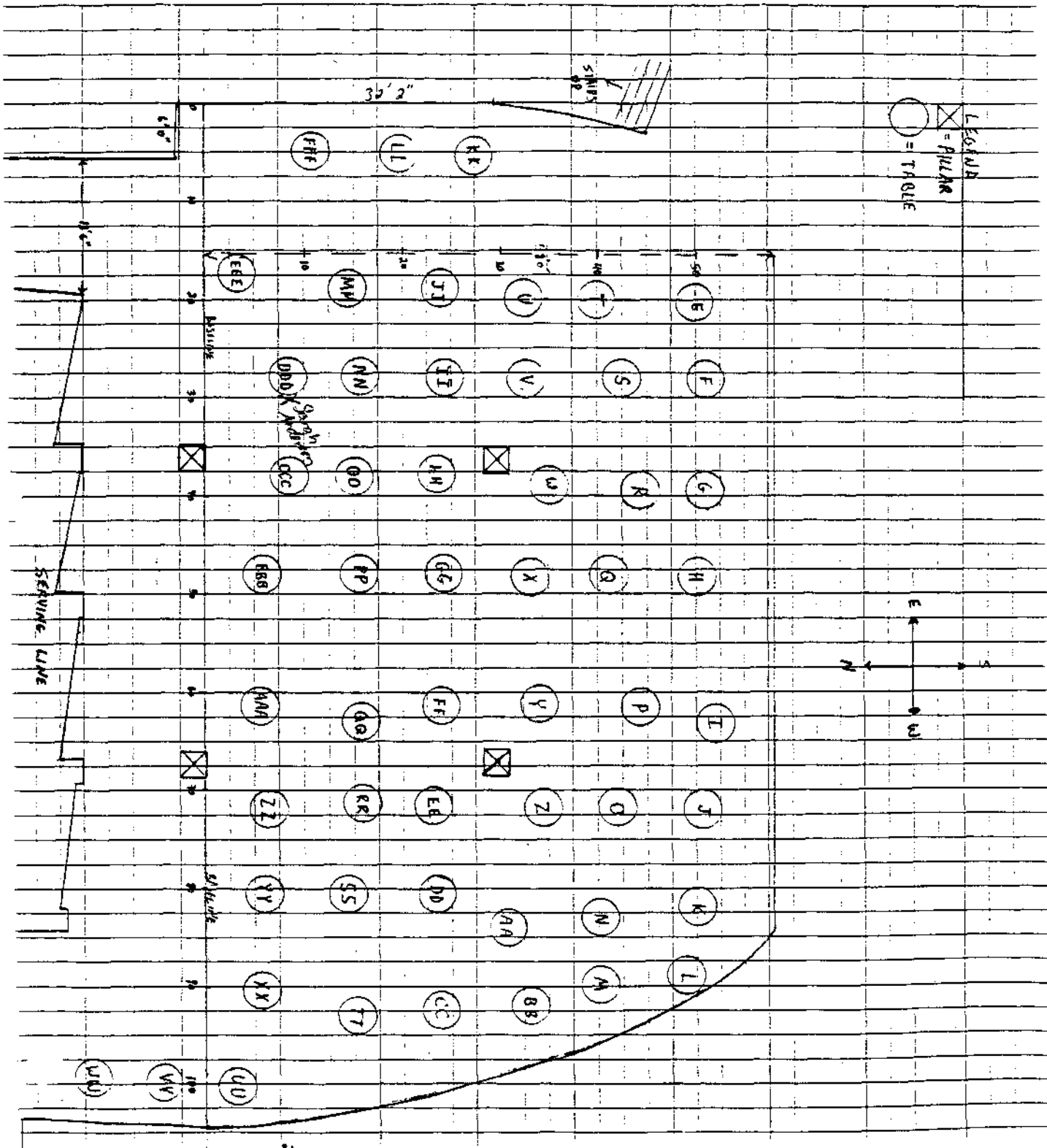
Anderson did not remember seeing any large duffle bags sitting in the cafeteria. Anderson did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of the other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia. Anderson has since heard rumors that a former member of the Trenchcoat Mafia, who had graduated last year, was at the school that day. Anderson only knows his last name is Stair.

That day, Anderson was wearing white shorts, a plum-colored turtle neck tank top, and sandals. Anderson left a black book bag, brown wallet, and gray Express jacket in the cafeteria.

CHS student, cafeteria witness

On May 17, 1999, this investigator met with Tyler Anderson at his residence. Present during the interview were his parents, Lynnea and Clark Anderson.

Tyler advised that he entered the cafeteria at approximately 11:10 a.m. after his fourth hour Spanish class. He said that he and John McMaster sat a table at the far west end of the cafeteria. He was shown a sketch of the cafeteria and indicated that he and John had been at the table marked "VV." He stated that he noticed nothing unusual in the cafeteria at that time. He advised that he went to the counter, got his lunch and returned to his table. After what he thought was about five minutes, he saw a number of students stand up and look out the west windows. He said that he also stood up and could see a student laying on the ground outside the west door. He said he then saw Mr. Sanders in the cafeteria and he was telling all of the students to get down. He advised that he and John hid behind some folded tables and while hiding, heard what sounded like gunshots outside. He said he heard gunfire a few minutes later which

sounded to be coming from the upper level of the school and was mixed in with heavier, louder explosions. He believed the explosions were coming from right above his location as dust from the ceiling was falling on him. He advised that a student known to him as ANTHONY SAMMAURO walked into the cafeteria from the southwest door and picked up a backpack from the top of a nearby table and walked away - he said he did not see where "Tony" went. He said this person was very calm - or at least appeared to be.

Tyler stated that sometime later, there was a big explosion in the cafeteria and he could see a large fire coming from an area by the kitchen counters. He said that he and John went out the northwest door, nearest their location and crouched down against the building. He stated that from there, he observed injured students on the ground. He said Sean Graves was laying close by as was a girl. Tyler said he saw Lance Kirklin sit up, holding a hand to his face, and then fall back to the ground.

Tyler advised that he and John ran to the adjacent parking lot and hid briefly behind a car. He said they saw a police officer who motioned to them to run toward him. He said they ran west across the grass and a police vehicle pulled up and they got in. They were transferred to another police vehicle and were driven over to Clement Park.

Tyler believes that while he and John were in the cafeteria, shots were being fired in their direction. He said he heard bullets striking nearby.

Tyler stated that he did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. He said he heard of no rumors relating to this incident or talk of any kind which would have indicated a situation like this was going to occur.

On the day of this incident, Tyler was wearing khaki pants, a white Denver Nuggets T-shirt and a brown cap.

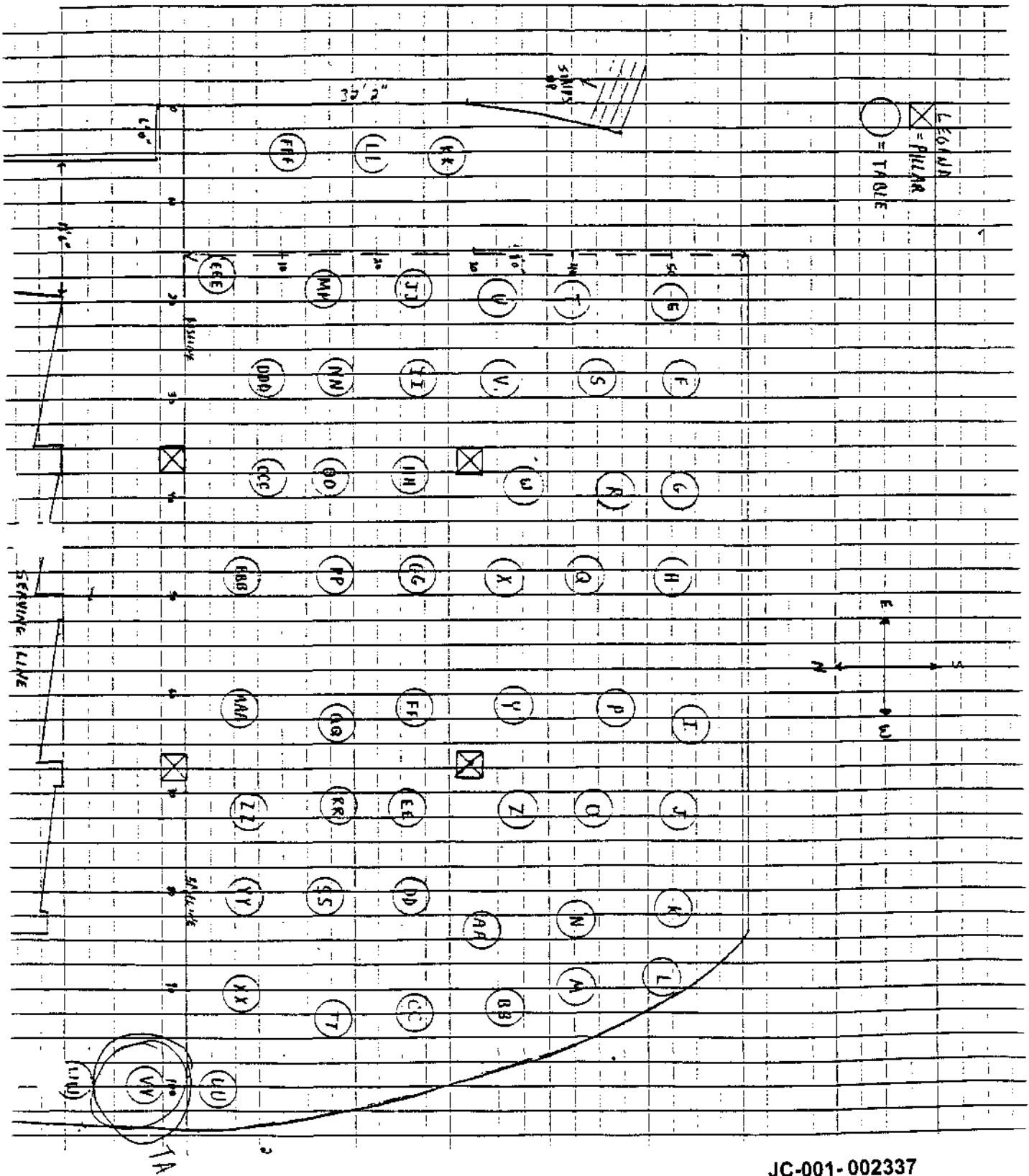

INVESTIGATION:

On 04-27-99 at 1000 hours Detective McGlynn and I interviewed Paul Andrews in the presence of his father at his home. Paul stated he drove to school in the morning of 04-20-99 and parked in Clement Park. He stated he did not know KLEBOLD or HARRIS, not even by sight. He stated he did not know any of the other members of the "trench coat mafia" but recognized them as being members just by the way they dressed. He stated he did not see any of the TCM, ("trench coat mafia") members that morning at school. Paul stated he got out of his fourth period class at approximately 1110 hours. He stated he immediately went to the cafeteria and had been sitting down for five to ten minutes before the commotion began. He stated he entered the cafeteria by coming down the stairs. He stated he brought his lunch and he indicated on the attached diagram which table he sat at. He also listed others that were sitting at the same table. Paul stated he did not see anything unusual in the cafeteria. He stated the cafeteria was packed with kids and many of them had their backpacks with them. He stated that he had a blue Jansports backpack that had papers and a notebook inside. He also had a white tuxedo shirt and a TI-186 calculator, a math book and a Spanish book, as well as two notebooks in his backpack.

Paul stated that he noticed everybody started to stand up from their tables and look out the west windows. At this time he thought there was a fight going on outside. He then saw Mr. Sanders by the west cafeteria exit.

door. Mr. Sanders yelled for everyone to get down. He stated that everyone got down under their tables. He stated that they were under the table for approximately 30 seconds when kids began to panic. He stated that everyone started to run toward the stairs. He stated he left his backpack and ran toward the kitchen area, hopping over the lunch line (counter). He stated he looked around as he headed toward a storage closet in the back area of the kitchen. He stated there was a washing machine in this closet. On the attached diagram, Paul listed the kids that sat at his table as well as the other people that went into this storage closet with him. He stated that there were 18 people in the storage closet when they closed the door, which he described as a solid door. He stated during this time they heard continuous gunshots and explosions outside of the closet. He stated that they were inside the closet approximately one and one half to two hours. During this time the gunshots and explosions continued at random. He stated that there was a shotgun because he recognized the noise that it made when being fired. He stated the shotgun was not fired as much as the other gunfire.

Paul stated that after they were in the closet for approximately 30 minutes, they heard Tony's voice outside. They recognized Tony's voice because he is the head janitor in the school. They opened the door and let Tony in and at this time they noticed a lot of smoke outside in the kitchen area. Paul stated the storage closet was getting very hot and stuffy during this time. He stated he they could hear more commotion going on above them with bombs going off or bookshelves falling on the floor. He stated he remembers three bursts of gunshots approximately three-quarters of the way through this stay in the closet. These were very distinct and loud. He stated they also heard others knocking on the door and they did not know who it was. The voice said, "Greg and Kristin I know you are in there". The person outside the door then slipped a school ID under the door, bearing the name of Brett Kistalnic. No one recognized the voice and one of the occupants in the closet, a male teacher, did not allow the door to be opened. Approximately five minutes later they noticed a ceiling tile above them being moved. They looked up and saw that it was in fact Brett Kistalnic. Brett did not come down into the closet but stayed up in the ceiling.

Paul stated Tony had a radio which they were able to learn that a fire truck was coming around the building to rescue them. Paul stated that Tony turned the radio's volume low and instructed everyone to get down and cover their heads. They were warned via the radio that they would hear knocking on the door and that would be Denver Police coming to rescue them. He stated the knock on the door came and Denver Police were there. They led them out of the closet into the faculty lounge. A window in the lounge had been broken out and they had

On 07-08-99, at about 1700 hours, I responded to 6365 West Frost Drive, to contact Nathan Anema. This interview was assigned to me as a follow-up interview to one that Denver Police Department Detective R. Polak had conducted with Nathan Anema and his mother Roxane Anema on 05-07-99.

Upon arrival at 6365 West Frost Drive, I contacted Nathan Anema and his mother, Roxane Anema. I asked Nathan to describe the suspect that he had seen throw a pipe bomb at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Nathan said this suspect was a white male, tall in stature, thin build, wearing a black trench coat that may have been constructed out of canvas or similar material (Nathan said he did not believe the trench coat was made out of leather) and hung to just above ground level. Nathan said this suspect was also wearing a black baseball cap that was worn on his head backwards. Nathan said he saw this described suspect

remove a pipe bomb from inside of his trench coat jacket, take approximately two steps and then throw the pipe bomb.

I also showed Nathan Anema sixty photographs in ten photo line up sheets. After looking at the line up sheets, Nathan picked out two photographs as possible suspects, one was in Line Up #3 and was photograph #1. This is a photograph of Dylan Klebold. The other possible suspect photograph was in Line Up #7 and was photograph #6. This is a photograph of [REDACTED]. Nathan said he knew who the photograph of Dylan Klebold was, and said he knew Dylan Klebold by name. Nathan said the other photograph he picked out of a line up as a possible suspect [REDACTED] he did not know this person's name. He did say that he had seen this person in the hallways of Columbine High School, and remembered this person as wearing a trench coat. Nathan said on 04-20-99, when he heard that a Trench Coat Mafia student was responsible for the shooting at Columbine High School, he immediately thought of the person in Line Up #7, photograph #6 as the Trench Coat Mafia student. This again, is a photograph of [REDACTED].

Nathan Anema and his mother, Roxane Anema, were given my business card. They both said they would contact me in the future, should they learn or remember any information that may be pertinent to this case and this investigation.

The photo line-ups were submitted into JCSO evidence vault.

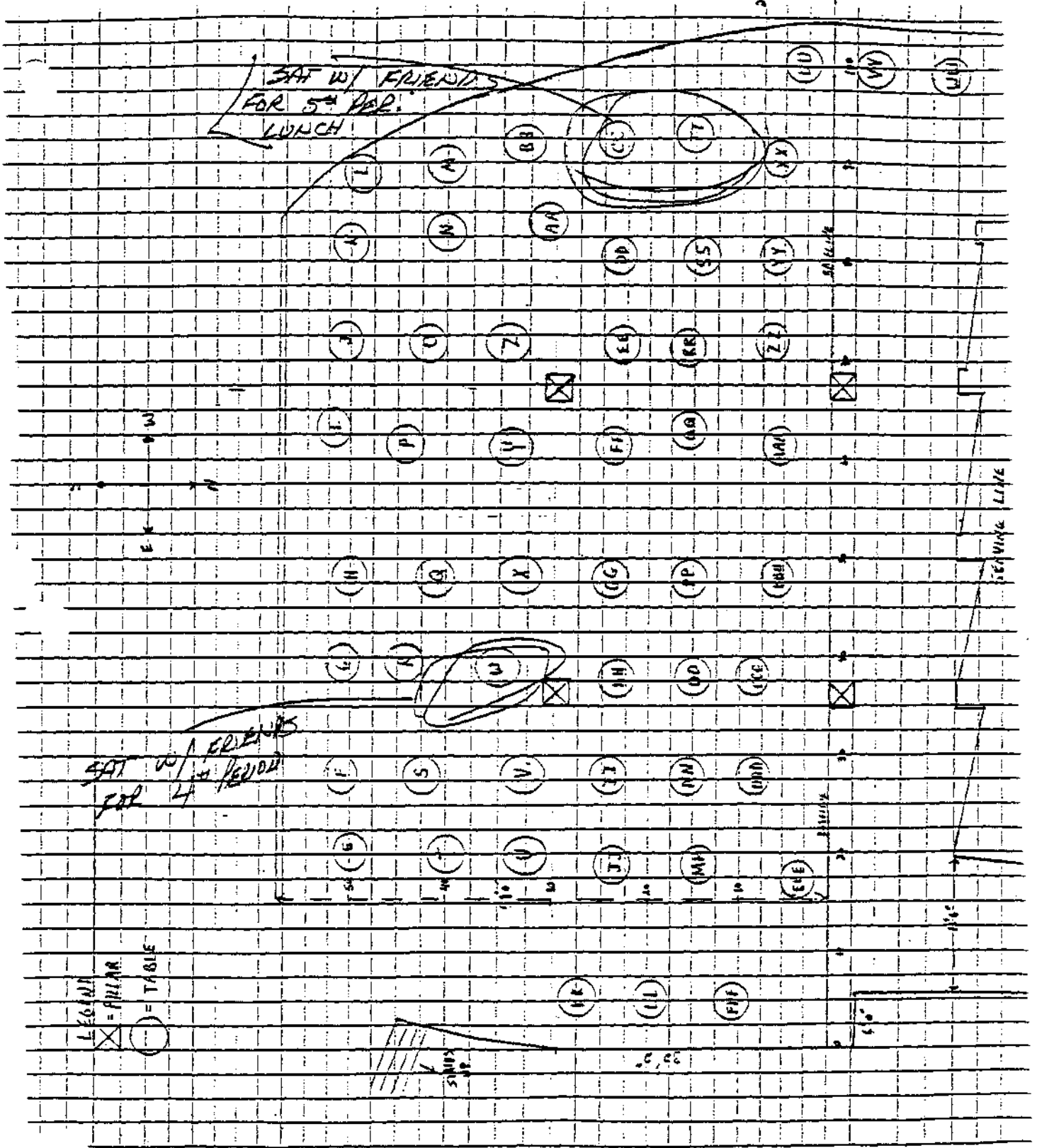

INVESTIGATION:

On 10-12-99 Columbine High School student Nathan Anema was re-interviewed at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office South Sub-Station. His mother, Roxanne Anema, was present during the interview.

The purpose of the re-interview was to clarify Anema's observations during the April 20th shootings at Columbine High School, specifically the statements made by Anema during an interview on 7-8-99 with task force investigators. In that interview Anema identified [REDACTED] as possibly being the person he saw throw a pipe bomb during the shootings at Columbine High School on 4-20-99.

Anema told me that he was sitting in the cafeteria at a table near the windows when the shooting started. He was seated with Brad Miller and Tyler Stark. Anema told me that he first saw a boy shot in the knee outside the cafeteria windows on the sidewalk. Anema then saw a male standing near the bottom of the west cement stairs throw what Anema thought was a pipe bomb into the parking lot. Anema described this person as a tall male, wearing a long black trench coat and a baseball cap on backwards. Anema did not recall seeing this person with a gun in his hand. Anema stated that he initially thought the person that he saw throwing the pipe bomb was [REDACTED]. He stated that he had seen [REDACTED] several times at Columbine High School and during those times he always saw [REDACTED] wearing a "German-type" hat on backwards, that was similar to the type of hat worn by the person who threw the pipe bomb.

Anema stated about two or three days after the shooting he looked through his high school yearbook and saw [REDACTED] picture. After looking at the picture, Anema thought that the person he saw throw the pipe bomb was [REDACTED]. Anema stated that it was approximately two weeks after the shootings that he realized that the person he saw throw the pipe bomb was actually Dylan Klebold and not [REDACTED]. This was based on the media coverage of the shootings.

I then showed Anema a series of three photographs (51-A, 52-A, 53-A) taken from the video camera in the cafeteria. After looking at the photographs, Anema positively identified Dylan Klebold as the person he saw throwing the pipe bomb.

On 05-05-99, contact was made with Nicholas Antonio at his residence at 7619 W. Friend Ave., Littleton, CO. He confirmed being a freshman at CHS, and being present at the school on 04-20-99. He noted being present in the cafeteria during 1st hour (0730-0815) and again during 4th hour (1015-1100) seated at table "LL". He is assigned to "A" lunch (5th Hour), and remained seated at this table during this period, where he was seated with Erica McCluagherty, Drew McCuskey, Ryan Chilleli, Candice Cushman and 3-4 other unknown students.

He first noted begin made aware of trouble when he saw students gathering around the windows screaming, and he then saw black smoke outside the west windows of the cafeteria. He ran to the windows and saw a subject in a white shirt apparently throwing unknown items towards the roof. Shortly thereafter Mr. Sanders came running from the area of the teacher lounge, yelling for everyone to "get down". He soon heard what he believed to be gunshots coming from the area of the west door. Students began running from the cafeteria and Antonio followed other students up the stairs to the main floor.


He ran down a number of halls, eventually arriving in the auditorium where he exited the school and proceed to Leawood Park. While inside the school, he did not confront any gunmen.

Antonio did not see any duffe bags in the cafeteria, nor did he see any suspicious activity while seated in the cafeteria prior to the initial notifications of trouble in the school.

In addition to his blue backpack with an Air Force Academy Patch, which was left in the cafeteria, he left a number of items, baseball cleats, and other shoes, in his athletic locker, #1.

On 04-27-99 at 3:55 P.M. Det. Terry Demmel 78007, assigned with the Columbine Task Force, met with Columbine High School student Crystal Archuleta. Crystal's mother was present during the interview. Crystal reported that she went to the school store to have lunch. Crystal and her friends Alicia Maes, Jeanelle Russell, Alieah Russell and Veronica Nuncio ran outside to the parking lot to see if the girl lying on the sidewalk was ok. It was Anne Marie Hockholter. A female teacher yelled to get down. They then also noticed a boy that was shot laying 10-15 feet away from Anne Marie. Crystal layed down with the injured girl.

Crystal observed a male party wearing a trench coat, a black ball cap turned around backwards, very tall; that Crystal believed to be a student that she knew as a [REDACTED]. Crystal observed the party in the trench coat throw one pipe bomb on the hill above the cafeteria. She did not see the party carrying a gun. The party was alone and had no one with him as he then walked up the stairs and into the entrance door next to the Library. When asked by det. Demmel how she knew it was [REDACTED] she said that Perry was pigeon toe'd and that the person was walking that way and went up the stairs in a very distinct pigeon toe'd manner. Crystal attempted to demonstrate the manner. She thought he was wearing tennis shoe's but was not exactly sure about that.

Crystal remembers seeing an older full size dark brown pick-up truck circling the parking lot very slowly. The truck was described as having a very loud engine; slowly drove out of the lot approximately 2 minutes before a Jefferson County Sheriff wearing a yellow T-shirt and driving a gray car pulled into the parking lot.

INVESTIGATION:

On May 3, 1999 at 0929 hours I contacted Crystal Archuleta at her home for an interview. Her mother was present. Crystal then told me the following:

- * She is a junior at Columbine High.
- * When asked, she did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She said she has never seen them before in school and did not know them by face or name.
- * When asked about other trench coat students, she said that she knows a [REDACTED] to be one of them. She said it was [REDACTED]

██████ she saw walking up the hill by the stairs outside the cafeteria when the shooting began. She did not know ██████████ name prior to the shooting. She said that she looked in her 1997 yearbook and identified him as the trench coat student she has seen around school and as the one she saw walking up the hill.

* She described ██████████ from seeing him in school at times. She said he is a white male, very tall "almost 7 feet," very thin, with very curly dirty blond or brown hair down to the neck, always had a black ball cap turned backwards, bad acne, no facial hair, hair would stick out from under cap, further described as having a "weird walk" as in being pigeon-toed with long strides. (She was then shown the color class photograph with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. She said she did not recognize anyone from that photo. When asked specifically if the photograph of Dylan Klebold could be the student she saw in school at times with the trench coat she said it was not.)

* When asked, she did not know a ██████████ or a ██████████

* She did say that she knows a girl's name who hangs around with the trench coat students, Alex Marsh. She does not know her any further than that.

* When asked, she said she has heard of the, "Trench Coat Mafia."

* When asked, she said that she did not see any of the trench coat students at school the day of the shooting, other than believing she saw ██████████ at the time of the shooting. She said the trench coat students usually hang around before school in the small vestibule area at the entrance to the choir room.

* When asked, she said she saw no objects that looked out of place that day in school. When asked specifically, she said she never saw any duffle bags at school that day.

* She had chemistry for 4th hour until 11:10 a.m. She went down the stairs from the science area and to the student store, "Rebel Corner." She went by herself and got her lunch. She then joined some other girls on the east window ledge that is just south of the student store.

* She then had lunch there with; Elisia Maes, Aleia Russell, Jeanel Russell, and Veronica Nuncia.

* The first thing she noticed was that a girl she saw outside near the west windows of the cafeteria fell. She thought at first that this girl fainted because she heard no gunshots. She and her friends then went out the south entrance to help the girl. At that time she did not know who that girl was.

* When she got to the girl, she saw a "pile of blood." She said the girl had some kind of chest wound. She said an unknown female teacher then yelled from the west cafeteria door for everyone to get down.

* She then heard several gunshots. The friends she was with then ran inside the school. She stayed and laid on the cement ground by the shooting victim.

* She then noticed that a "big brown truck" was circling around the parked cars in the lot and then left. She said the truck was old and rusted brown. She could not describe it any further and did not know who was inside.

* She then looked up the hill by the stairs outside the cafeteria. She said she then saw a brief profile of a male in a trench coat on the dirt area between the stairs and the school wall. She said this male turned to his left and walked up the hill out of sight by the west doors to the school. She said this was the male she thought was [REDACTED] She said her profile look at this male was only for a second or two. When asked, she said she did not see the male holding anything. She described that male as

tall, wearing a black trench coat, a black ball cap on backwards, and black warm-up-type pants with black high top tennis shoes.

* She then stayed on the ground and talked with the wounded girl. She then learned from the girl that her name was Anne Marie Hochhalter.

* When the male disappeared on top of the hill by the west doors, she heard more gunshots and heard glass breaking. She thought she was laying on the ground 15 to 20 minutes. She then noticed that the school police officer was in the parking lot. She thought he was shooting at the suspect. She said that other cops then showed up.


* She said that a "jock" named Nick or Chris Foss then came out to where she was with the shooting victim. He crawled over to them and asked if they were okay. He then stood up to aid Hochhalter. She then heard more gunshots and thought the suspects were shooting at Foss. She saw Foss spin around, but he was not hit.

* She then ran to a cop car out west of the hill. She did not know what happened to Hochhalter. She said several other students were behind that car. She identified Makai Hall who was wounded, Austin Eubanks who was wounded, and Crystal Woodman as some of the students behind the car. She eventually was transported out of that area by police.

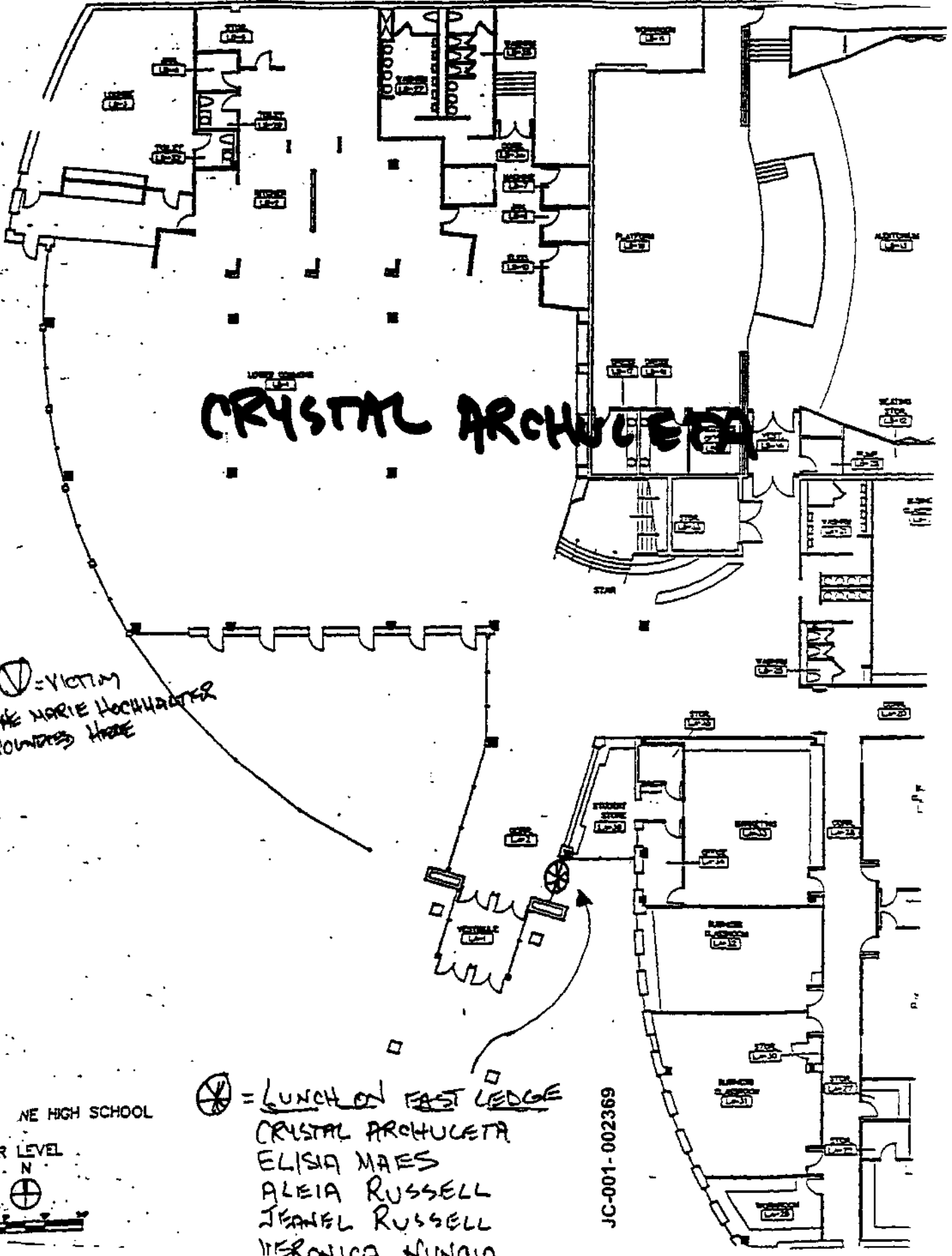
* She thought it was 20 to 25 minutes from the time she first saw Hochhalter fall to when she got to the cop car.

* During the incident she heard explosions that sounded both close and far away.

Investigation: On 10-19-99, I met with Crystal Archuleta and her mother at the Jeffco south sub-station reference the shooting at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. I explained to Crystal and her mother that I needed to re-interview Crystal reference a couple statements she had made in her earlier interview. I asked Crystal if she recalled speaking with an Investigator earlier reference Columbine High School and she said she did. I asked Crystal if she remembers telling that Investigator that she saw [REDACTED] wearing a black trench coat, sitting on top of the hill by the stairs near the cafeteria when the shooting began and she said yes, she did. I asked if she was sure that it was [REDACTED]. She said that she believes it was. I asked if she knew who [REDACTED] was and she said yes, she did. Crystal said that she has seen [REDACTED] around school and he is always wearing a black trench coat and black boots and that he walked pigeon toed. I asked Crystal if the person that she saw on the hill on April 20th was dressed in the same as that [REDACTED] normally wore and she said yes, he was. I asked if he was wearing anything other than what she had described and she said she believes that the person on the hill had possibly Reebok tennis shoes on and had on a baseball cap that had a red letter on the front of it. I asked if she was able to tell if it was [REDACTED] or not and she said that she believed it was him. At this time I brought out photos #51 and 54 and had Crystal view them. Crystal looked at Dylan Kleibold and said that she believed that is the person she saw on the top of the hill. Crystal said that when she saw the male on the hill, he did have a baseball cap on, but in the pictures there is no baseball cap. I asked Crystal if it's a possibility that she saw Dylan and not [REDACTED]. She said yes, after looking at the pictures, she does believe that it was Dylan and not [REDACTED]. I asked Crystal if she saw anyone else during the shooting at the school and she said no, the only one she saw was Dylan Kleibold, whom she believed was [REDACTED] at the time.

I asked Crystal if there was anything else that she has remembered since her first interview. She said no, that she had told the first Investigator and me everything that she has recalled of the incident.

At this time the interview with Crystal and her mother was concluded.

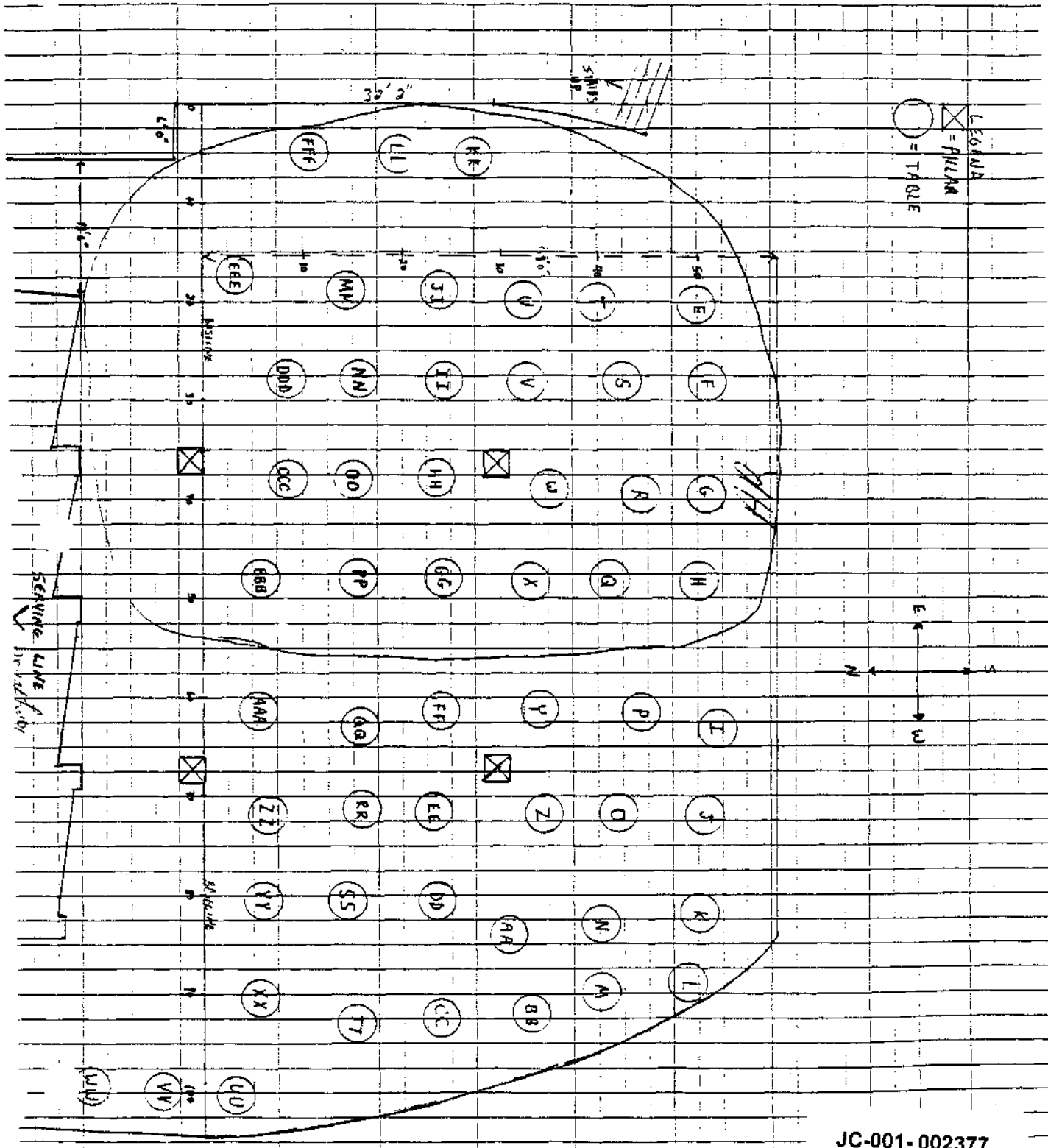

Jessica Arzoia said on 04-20-99 at about 0720 hours, she arrived at Columbine High School for her classes, with her sister Sarah Arzoia. Jessica said she entered Columbine High School through the main doors on the east side of the school where the administrative offices are located. Jessica said she walked down the hallway to her choir class, which is near the top of the stairway that leads down into the cafeteria/commons area. Jessica said her choir class started at 0730 hours on 04-20-99 and lasted until 0820. She said while walking to this choir class, she did not see any unusual people or items. Jessica said she went to her Language Arts class next which is also on the upper level of the school and in the math hallway. Jessica said this Language Arts class started at 0825 got out at 0915. Jessica said after her Language Arts class, she went to her third hour class, which is math and said this class lasted from 0920 to 1010 hours on 04-20-99. She said when she left her math class she went to her fourth hour gym class that is on the upper level of Columbine High School. This class began at 1020 and Jessica said her class went outside to play flag football. She said they went outside to the field that is just west of the cafeteria windows and doors. Jessica did not recall anything suspicious or any suspicious people or items during this gym class while they were playing football near the cafeteria. Jessica said she got out of the gym class early after changing back into to her civilian clothes. She said she got out at about 1100 hours on 04-20-99. Jessica said she walked from the gym class, down the stairway from the upper level of the high school to the lower level, and into the cafeteria/commons area. Jessica said it took her an estimated seven minutes to make this walk, and to arrive in the cafeteria. Jessica said she went to a table in the cafeteria that is located very close to the bottom of the stairway and to the right as she was going downstairs. Jessica said she goes to the same table every day, and told me it is the second table from the stairway after she turns to her right at the bottom of the stairs. Jessica said she had several friends at the table that she was talking to. These friends are Matt Bruce, Ben Schumann, Andrea Elsnor, Amber Rosetta, Heather Whaling, and possibly another female student whom she only knows as Candace. Jessica said while she was seated at this table, she was facing the serving line, which would be in a northwest direction from her seat. Jessica said Ben Schumann went to get something to eat at the serving line, and as he returned, Jessica said she saw several students looking out of the west cafeteria windows toward the outside of the school. Jessica said approximately two minutes later, a student whom she knows as Chris Markham yelled at everybody in the cafeteria to get down on the floor, and said this was because somebody had a gun. Jessica said she got down onto the floor for approximately fifteen seconds and said she heard two gunshots during this time period. Jessica said she may have seen "two flashes" from outside of the cafeteria windows. The students that were standing at the west side cafeteria windows then yelled at everybody in the cafeteria to run. Jessica said she got up off the floor and ran up the stairway to the second level of Columbine High School, where she said she hid in the first classroom she could find. Jessica said while she was

running up the stairway, she heard approximately nine more gunshots that sounded like they were coming from just inside of the cafeteria door located near the faculty lounge. Jessica said she did not turn around and look, but just kept running up the stairway. The classroom that Jessica ran into was a science room that had a female teacher (name unknown) inside of it. Jessica said once she was inside the science classroom, she hid in a storage room that is inside the science classroom. Jessica said she was hiding in the storage room with four other students, who she only knows as Nicoie, Mary, Annette, and Andrea (last names unknown). Jessica said they hid between some shelves in the storage room, and listened to gunshots outside of the room. She also said they prayed. Jessica said that while sitting and hiding in the storage room, she heard approximately thirty more gunshots and three explosions. Jessica said the first of these thirty gunshots sounded like they were coming from just outside of the science room they were hiding in, and then the gunshots began sounding like they were being shot from farther and farther away from Jessica's location as these shots continued. Jessica said in the classroom next to the storage room that she was hiding in, she "heard about three bumping noises," that sounded like to her something was bumping into the wall between these two rooms. Jessica said this lasted only for a few seconds and then the noise disappeared. Jessica said she stayed with the other students hiding in the storage room for approximately three hours, and then they went into one of the science classrooms for approximately another hour before SWAT rescued them. Jessica said SWAT members searched them and then escorted them out of Columbine High School through the Social Studies hall door. This is where Jessica said they exited the high school. Jessica also said she eventually made it to Leawood Elementary School after being chauffeured there in a bus.

Jessica said that she did not see any duffie bags or propane tanks such as the ones that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria, either prior to or during the shooting on 04-20-99. Jessica said she has not heard about any other suspects who may have been involved in the shooting. She also told me she has not heard of anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms.

Jessica said on 04-20-99 when she ran out of the Columbine High School cafeteria, she left her backpack and its contents next to the table she had selected to sit at earlier, while in the cafeteria. Jessica said she has since recovered the backpack and contents.

Jessica said she did not have much information in reference to the Trench Coat Mafia or the Trench Coat Mafia students. Jessica said prior to the shooting on 04-20-99, she had heard of the name Dylan Klebold, however, at that time she would have not

known who Dylan Kleboid was by sight. Jessica said she never heard of the name Eric Harris. She also said she had seen students in the hallways of Columbine High School that she assumed were Trench Coat Mafia students by the way they dressed. Jessica said as she recalled, these students dressed in black clothing, and one wore a beret. Jessica said she did not recall seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students gather underneath the stairway in the cafeteria/commons area of the high school. Jessica said she did not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Jessica Arzola said she does not know of anybody who has a double pierced eyebrow. She said she did not see what the "Thought of the Day" was for 04-20-99, that was on the Rebel News Network (RNN). Jessica said nobody pays any attention to the "Thought of the Day" anyway when it is being broadcasted during second hour classes.

Jessica Arzola told me that at no time on 04-20-99 during the shooting, did she see any of the shooters and/or suspects.

I asked Jessica Arzola how she has been doing since the incident. She said during the first couple of weeks after the shooting, she had some rough times and had a hard time sleeping at other times. Jessica said that she has seen counselors through her church, as have her other family members. I gave Jessica my name and phone number and asked her to contact me if she or anybody in her family wished to talk with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate in the future. I told her I would make the necessary arrangements for her at that time.

DISPOSITION: Case remains open, pending further investigation.

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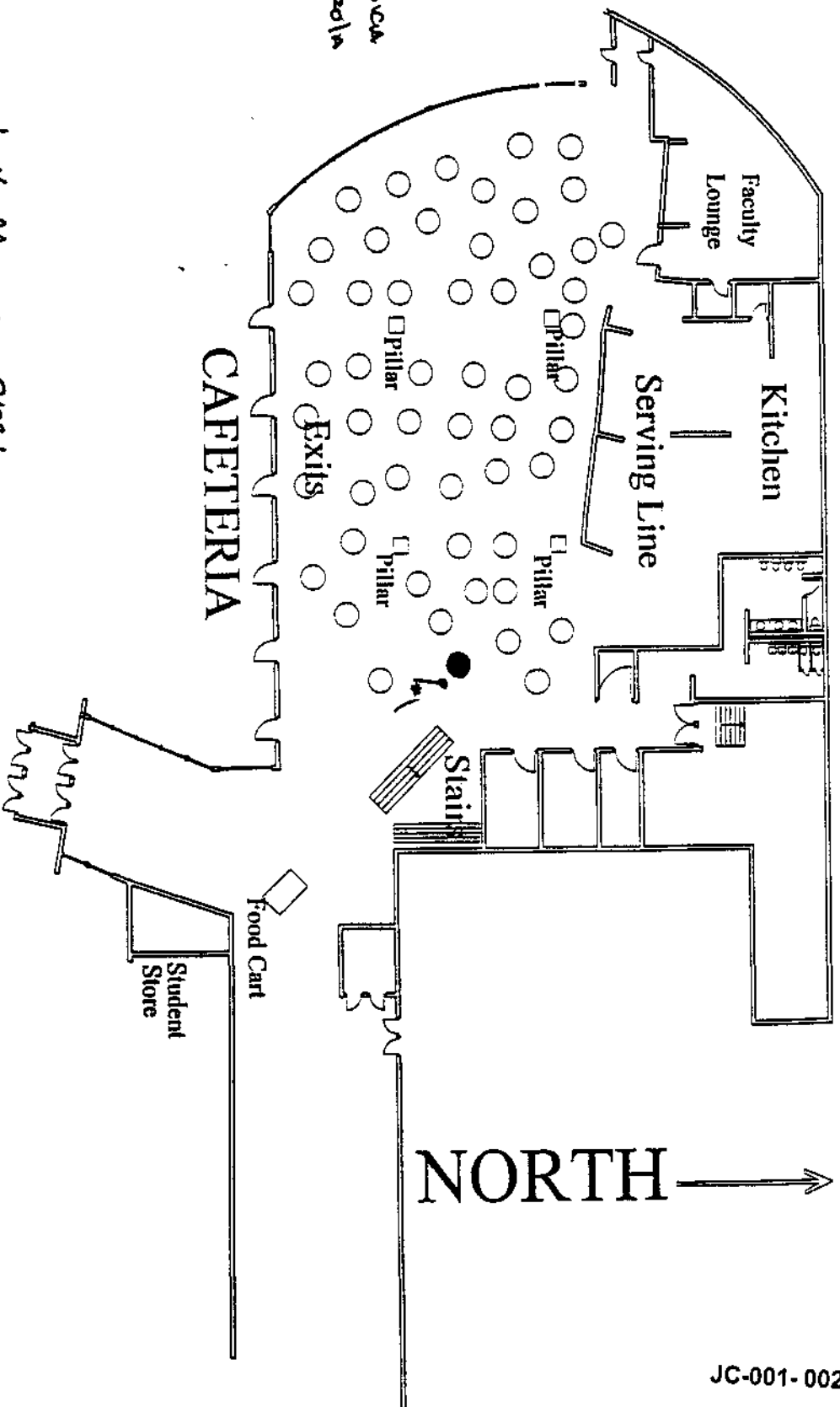

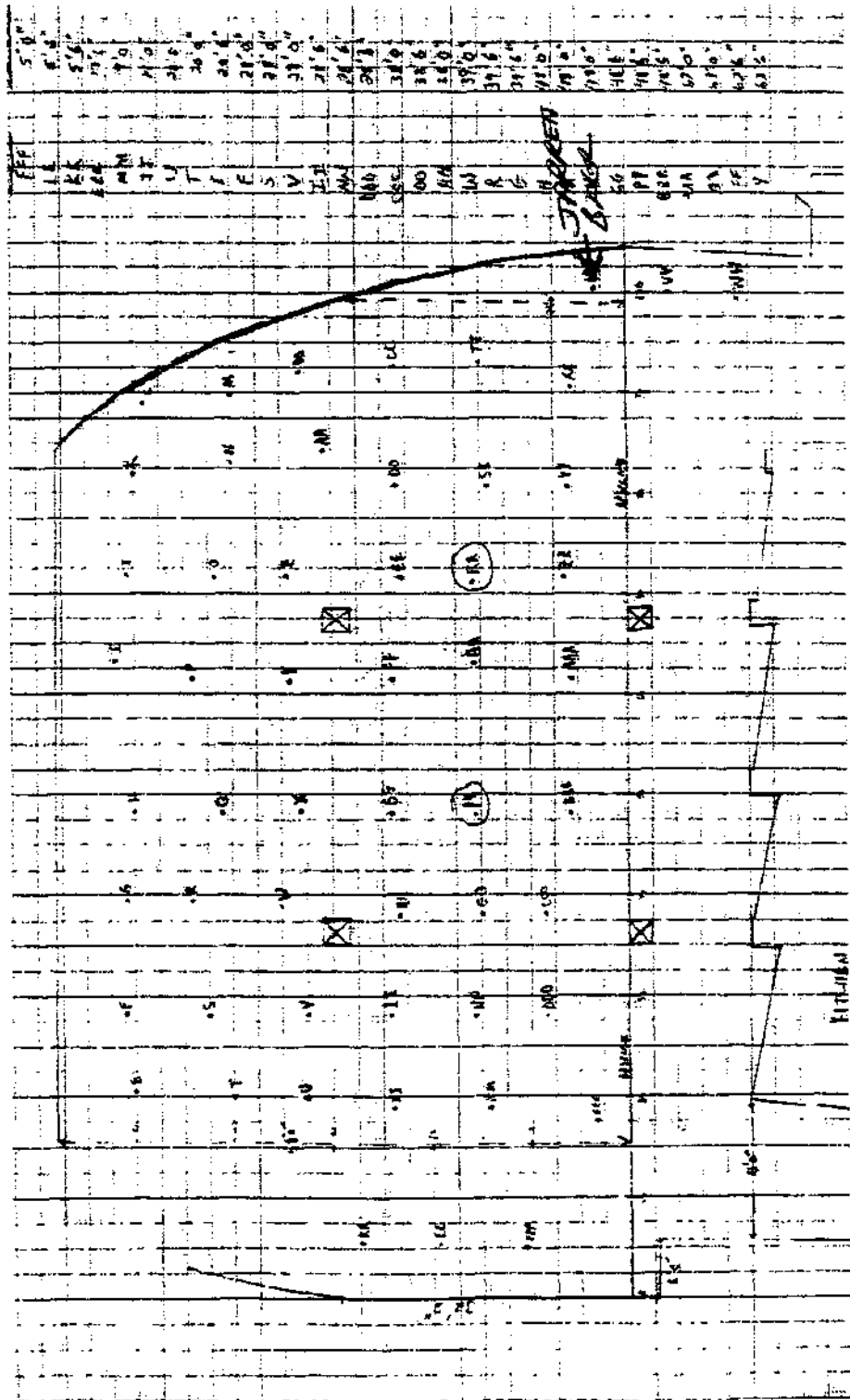

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On April 27, 1999 I was assigned to interview Natalie Baker a student at Columbine High School and possibly was in the cafeteria during the shooting.

On April 27th at 1620 hours I arrived at 5123 S. Cody Ct. and did interview Natalie Baker. Also present during this time was a friend of Natalie who identified herself as Ashley Egeland. Ashley is also a student at Columbine High School and was in school at the time of the shooting.

Natalie confirmed that she was in the cafeteria when the shooting broke out. She advised that she was sitting at the table identified as "V" on the diagram labeled BAKER. She continued to say that she was sitting with Marni McCellen, Jennie Pollock, and Bae Gattont. Natalie related that she had placed her back pack under her chair. Natalie advised she had a black Jan Sport pack, and that it contained her make up and glasses. She continued to say that at about 11:20AM she noticed a janitor running back and forth and heard him say "they had guns". At this point a teacher ordered everyone in the cafeteria to get under the tables and stay down. Natalie reported that there were shots, and while she was hiding under the table she noticed a male subject standing in the hall in front of the student store near the south-east corner of the cafeteria. She continued to say that this subject was wearing a black trench coat but she could not say whether this person was armed. She did say that she did not observe this subject fire any shots. After a while she reported that she along with a large group of students ran up the stairs that lead to the main level south hall and ran out of the school by way of the main entrance of the school. Natalie said that the group ran across S. Pierce Street to a

park on the east side of Pierce Street where they stopped. While they were in the park a teacher told them to get down that they (suspects) were coming. However nothing else happened.

Natalie reported that she did not observe any type of large duffle or gym type bag in the cafeteria when she arrived nor did she see anyone carry such an item into the cafeteria while she was there. She continued to say that she did not know the person she saw at the cafeteria entrance near the student store. Natalie reported that she had heard the subject at the south-east entrance to the cafeteria said "anyone wearing a white hat is gona die" but she did not hear this herself. Natalie stated that she had heard nothing about the incident before it occurred. Natalie said that she knew nothing about anyone bringing guns or bombs into school, nor had she heard anything about anyone making bombs (at this point Natalie glances at Egeland). Natalie continued to say that she does not know anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia other than seeing them in school. At the end of the interview with Natalie, Deborah Baker said to Ashley "you saw them didn't you". Ashley acknowledged that she had seen two of the shooters so I began an interview with Ashley (refer to report about the interview with Ashley for details). The interview concluded at 1705 hours.

I spoke to Deborah Baker on April 28th by phone. She reported that Natalie had told her when she pick Natalie up, after the incident, that there had been possibly two other shooters other than Harris and Klebold, but Natalie did not know them. She continued to say that what Natalie had told me was the same that had been related to her. Ms. Baker also stated that the statement made by Ashley Egeland was the same thing that she had been told by Ashley and that she had cautioned Ashley that before she repeated the story that she (Ashley) should be darn sure it was true since it was a very serious accusation.

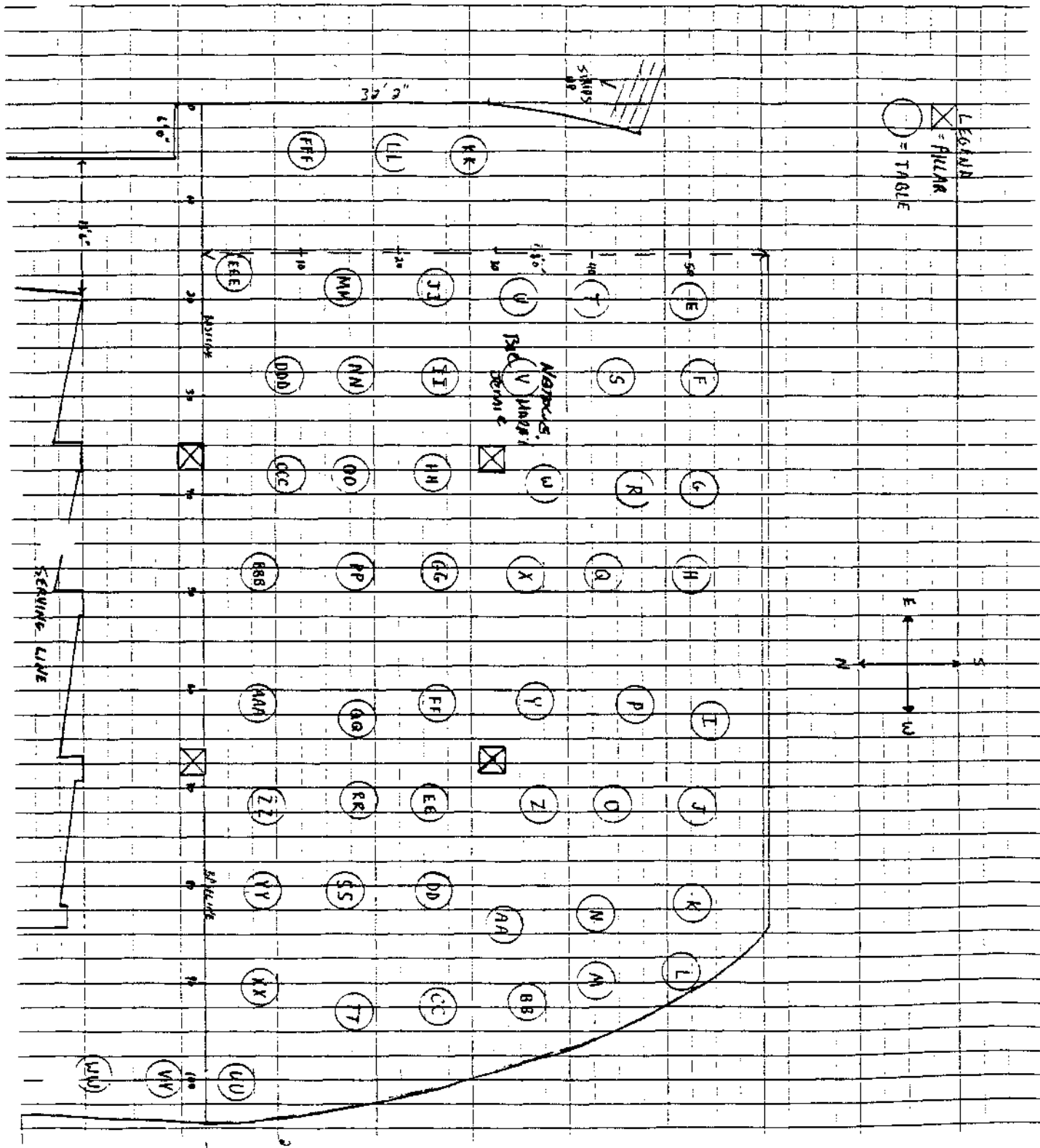

On May 4, 1999 I received a request to re-interview Natalie Baker about her being in the cafeteria during fourth period, the period before lunch, and seeing any duffel bags in the cafeteria at this time. On May 12th I contacted Natalie's mother, Deborah Baker, and made an appointment to talk with Natalie on May 13th at 0700.

On May 13, 1999 at 0705 hours I went to 5123 South Cody Court and spoke to Natalie. Natalie said that she was in the cafeteria during fourth period, and this was her free period. She advised that she was sitting at the same table she occupied during lunch. She continued to say that she does not recall seeing either a orange or blue duffel bag on the floor any place in the cafeteria while she was there. Natalie advised that she was not looking for such a bag so she probably would not have notice one. She stated that no one carried an orange or blue duffel bag into the cafeteria while she was there during fourth period.

The interview concluded at 0715 hours.



INVESTIGATION:

On 4-28-99, I met with Kelsey Bane at her residence, with her mother present. This meeting was in reference to the shooting at Columbine High School. I at first showed Kelsey a sketch of the cafeteria area at Columbine High School and asked if she could mark on the sketch where she was sitting at the time of the shooting. Kelsey said that she was not really sitting at a table, but was standing next to one. The area she showed on the sketch did not have a table, so she showed me where to draw in a table and she placed an "X" where she had been standing. I asked Kelsey to explain to me what had happened that morning. Kelsey said that she was standing at the table talking to a friend of hers, Sara Schweitzerberger. Kelsey said while talking to Sara the cafeteria became very quiet and everyone began getting underneath the tables. Kelsey said she heard someone say "He has a gun". Kelsey said she heard someone else say "He just shot someone". I asked Kelsey if she knew who the person was who said that and she said no, the person was about 10 feet behind her, but she didn't know who it was. I asked Kelsey if she heard any gun shots and she said no, she did not. I asked if she heard any explosions of any type and she said once she was outside she did hear explosions, possible two of them. I asked Kelsey what happened after she heard this person comment about someone getting shot, and she said everyone then got up and left the cafeteria. She said she went to the elevator area and then exited through a door that leads to the auditorium. Kelsey said that she ran through the auditorium to Mr. Andre, Sr., who was at the front of the auditorium and asked how to get out. Mr. Andre was telling everyone to go up the stairway to the main hallway. Kelsey said she went to the hallway and by the counselor's office and out the door by the weight room, which leads outside. Kelsey said that she ran by the tennis court and the baseball field and then went to Clement Park. Kelsey said while she was at Clement Park, she met up with a friend of hers, Sarah Arzola. Kelsey said that while talking to Sarah, she saw a white male in the park who was laughing. Kelsey said Sarah asked the male why he was laughing and the male said "You mind your business, and I'll mind mine". I asked Kelsey if she knew who this male was and she said, "No". I asked her if she could describe the male to me and she said that he was very thin as if he was a "doper". She said he was about 5'5" to 5'6" tall, dark hair, with a clean haircut. She said it was short, but not stragley. She said he had no facial hair, nor glasses. I asked what type of clothing he had on and Kelsey said "dark clothing", but she couldn't remember what kind of pants, but she remembers they were "dark". I asked what type of shirt this male had on and Kelsey said "a dark tee shirt".

I asked Kelsey if she knew either Dylan or Eric and she said no, she'd heard of them through school, but did not know them. I asked Kelsey if she knew any of the Trench Coat Mafia and she said she knew some from last year who had graduated. She says she knows Joe Stair, and believes he is the leader of the Trench Coat Mafia. I asked if she had seen Joe in the area of the school on either Monday or Tuesday and she said that she had heard through friends that Joe was in the area of the Columbine Library on Tuesday afternoon, but she did not know if he'd been there before. I asked Kelsey if she knew any other members and she said she knew Brian Sargent, who does not attend school this year. Kelsey said that Brian and Joe are always seen together and that most of the time when she sees Brian, he's wearing a white shirt, but she's never seen him in a trench coat.

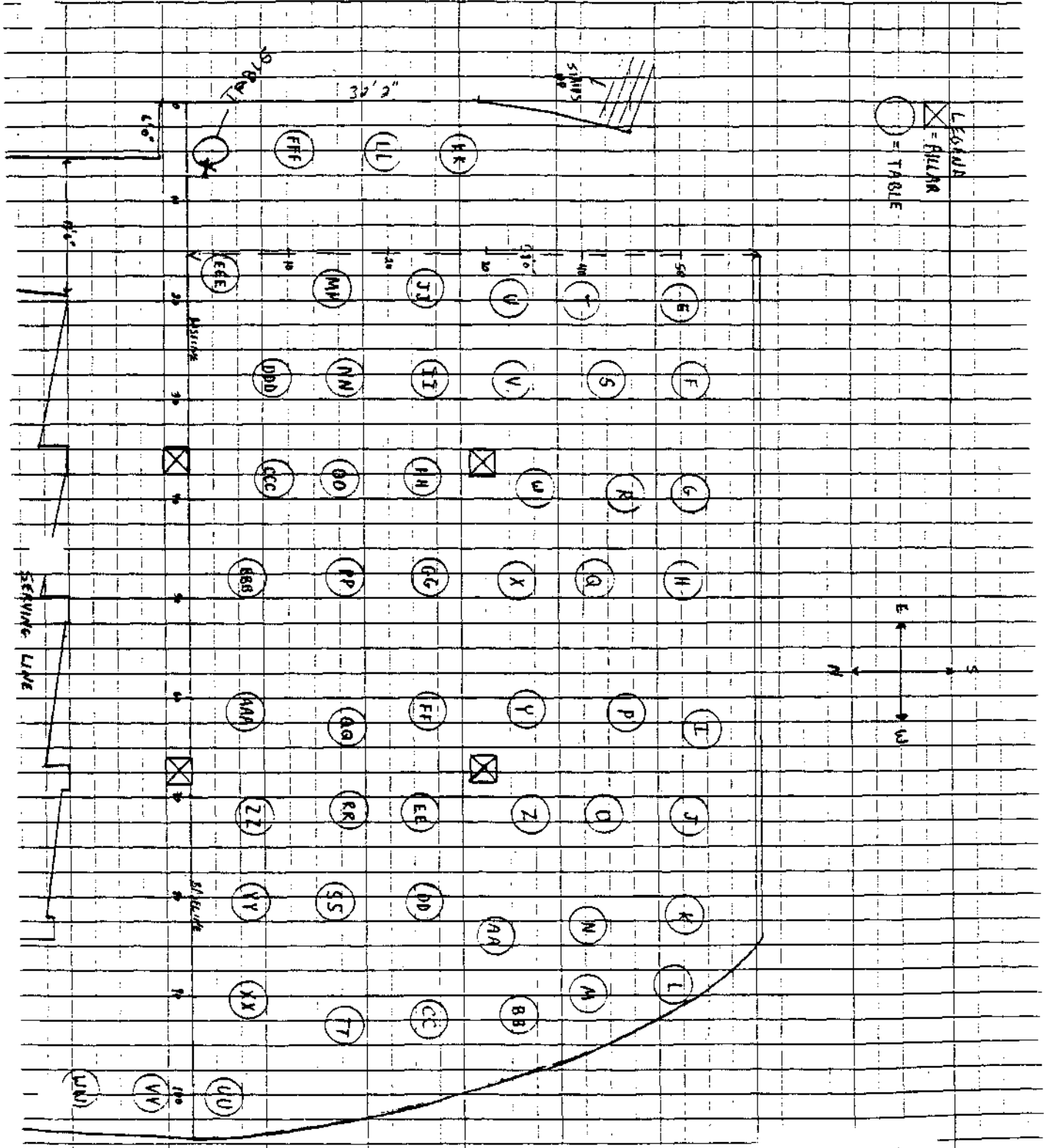
I asked Kelsey what time her lunch started. She said approximately 11:15. I asked what class she was coming from and she said that she had just left Choir and had to walk to her locker before entering the lunch room. I asked Kelsey what type of clothing she was wearing that day and she said she had on Khaki pants and a black tank top. I asked Kelsey if she had left any property in the cafeteria and she said she left a black Eddie Bauer backpack with her books, a day planner, some lotion and a supply bag in it. I asked Kelsey if she had seen anything out of the ordinary in the cafeteria when she was there. She said, no, she did not. I asked if she remembered seeing any large duffie bags that did not appear to fit in the cafeteria surroundings. She said no, she did not. I asked Kelsey if she remembered seeing any of the shooters at the school or anyone with any of the bombs in the school. She said no, she did not see anyone. She just heard approximately two explosions once she was outside the school. Kelsey said that she did hear later in the week that the members of the Trench Coat Mafia at Chatfield did not go to school on Tuesday, but she does not know if that's correct or not.

I asked Kelsey if there was any further information that she could remember about that day. She said no, not at this time, but she will look through her year book and see if she can identify the male that was laughing in the Park. I gave Kelsey my business card and asked that she call me with that information.
