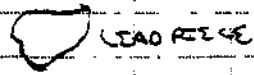

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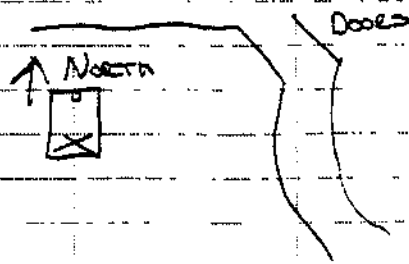
NARRATIVE:
 On 4-23-99 I WAS ASSIGNED AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL COMMAND CENTER. AT ABOUT 1230HRS. SGT. J. JUNKALA GAVE ME A PASTEL BAGGIE CONTAINING A PIECE OF "LEAD" FROM WHAT APPEARED TO BE A SPENT BULLET. A CITEZ EN WAO LOCATED IT IN HER CAR PARKED IN THE FACULTY AREA OF COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL. HER INFORMATION IS ENCLOSED. I MAINTAINED CARE, CONTROL AND CUSTODY OF THE ITEM UNTIL I GAVE IT TO SCOTT IDOLY, DEPUTY SHERIFF, WHO PLACED IT INTO THE JCSO EVIDENCE VAULT.

Quinn Allison BOORTZ, date of birth 12/18/83, was interviewed at her residence, 6139 S. Fenton Ct., Littleton, Colorado on May 04, 1999 at approximately 7:30 PM. BOORTZ' mother was present for the interview. They were advised of the personal and professional identity of the writer, and the purpose of the interview.

BOORTZ advised that she is a freshman at Columbine High School and was present in the cafeteria on April 20, 1999, during the shooting which occurred at the high school. BOORTZ stated that she has "A" lunch, and entered the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 AM. She bought lunch at the Rebel Corner, which is the student store. She sat at a table in the area adjacent to the cafeteria just outside of the Rebel Store. BOORTZ stated that she sat with Megan MULVANEY, Kate REBROVIC, Laura FARBER and Travis JONES.

BOORTZ stated that she began eating her lunch when people began running by their table. BOORTZ overheard someone saying something about someone getting shot. She went out the south doors and began moving in a northwesterly direction along the cafeteria windows. As she did so, she observed two bodies down on the ground, so she turned around and went back into the cafeteria through the door she had exited through.

When BOORTZ entered the cafeteria, some janitors were telling people to get under the tables. She got under a nearby table, where she stayed for approximately 30 to 40 seconds. She noticed that everyone was running out, and she then ran back out the south door once again. She ran across the south parking lot, then south on Pierce Street to Polk Avenue. She stopped at a house on the corner and knocked on the door but did not receive a response. She and several other students then knocked on a door four houses down, where they were allowed to enter. BOORTZ recalled that some of the students in the house with her included Brooke ALLISON, B.J. SECORD, Megan MULVANEY, Laura FARBER, Amy STALEY, Mike FOSTER and Colleen SCHWARZOTT.

BOORTZ stated that she did not see any duffel bags or anything else unusual while in the cafeteria. She advised that

she had been wearing a blue short sleeve shirt with a white collar and blue jeans.

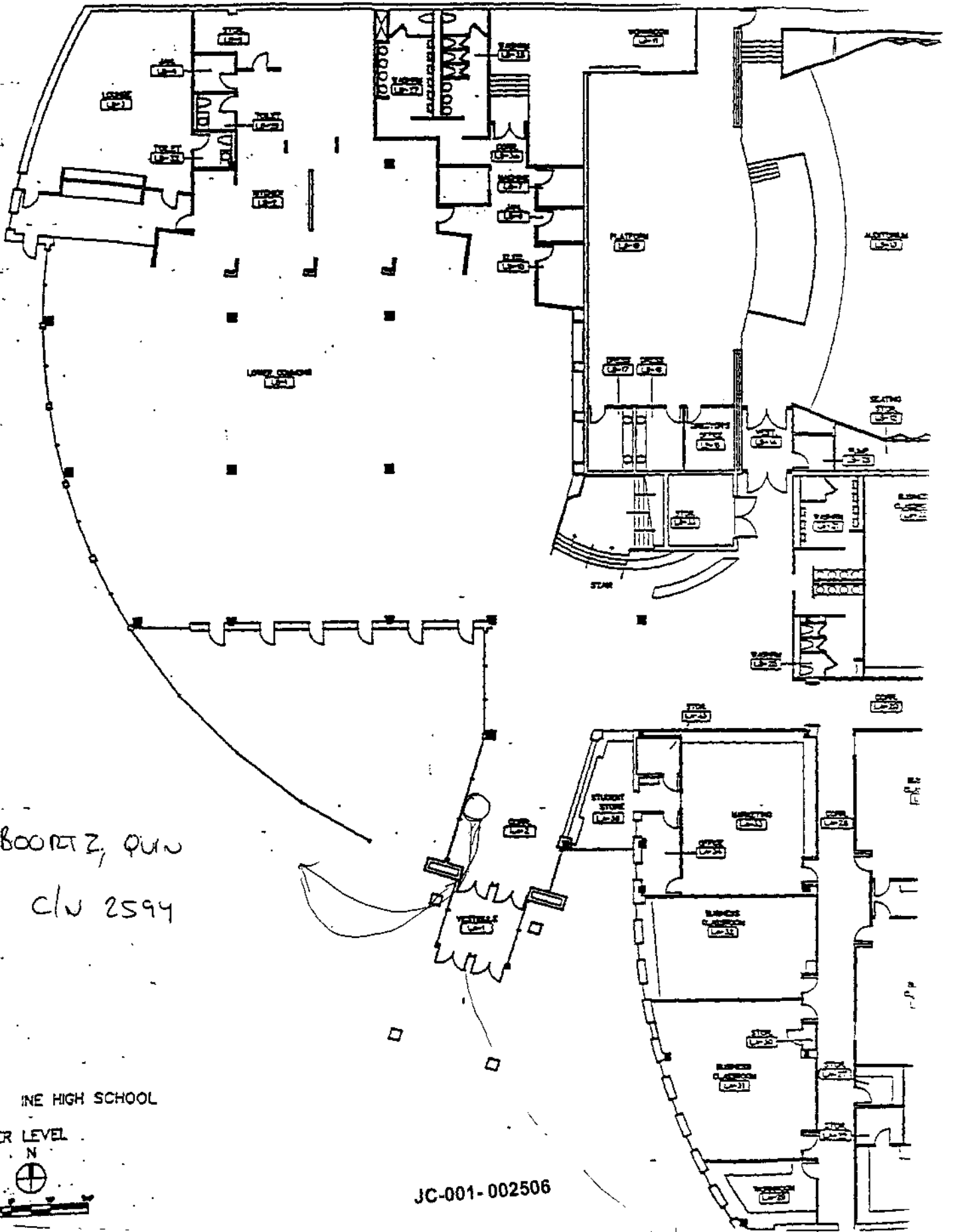
BOORTZ advised that she had Eric HARRIS in gym class last semester, and thought he seemed like a "wannabe jock". She had only seen him once in a trench coat. She did not know any other members or associates of the Trench Coat Mafia.

While at the BOORTZ' residence, Quinn's father Gary BOORTZ advised the writer that his daughter Erin's white 1992 Chevrolet Blazer, Colorado license HJP050, had sustained several bullet holes while parked in the school lot. Gary BOORTZ stated that the vehicle was released to him on Friday, April 30 by a trooper from the Colorado State Patrol. BOORTZ pointed out the bullet holes and damage to the trooper. The trooper told BOORTZ that the vehicle had probably been processed, but took photographs. BOORTZ stated that he entered the vehicle and found a relatively intact bullet inside, which he provided to the trooper.

BOORTZ stated that after returning home he began to clean up the interior vehicle, which contained a lot of broken glass. While doing so, BOORTZ found a small piece of what he believed might be a bullet. The writer examined the object, which does appear to be a piece of copper-jacketing from a bullet. BOORTZ advised that he recovered the bullet material from the floor area below the steering wheel. BOORTZ stated that he was told that Sgt. Chris Tomford of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department would be calling him to pick the object up, but had not received a call.

The writer agreed to take possession of the bullet material and provide it to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department. The writer contacted Sgt. Tomford, who advised that she had not been told about the bullet. The writer will be booking the bullet into Jefferson County Sheriff's evidence.

INVESTIGATION:

On 08-03-99, I contacted Columbine High School student Bradley Bootsma by phone. I asked him about the events which occurred on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School. This interview is connected with DN#3125.

Bootsma stated that he attended classes in the morning hours of 04-20-99 beginning with his first period class at 0730 hours. Bootsma stated he did not see suspects Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris on the morning of 04-20-99. He knew both of their names and had seen them before, but he did not know either of them personally. He knew that they were both associated with liking "German stuff." I asked Bootsma if by German stuff he meant Nazi related interests. He stated he did not know if it was a Nazi related interest.

Bootsma has "A" lunch which begins at about 1110 hours. For lunch he went down to the cafeteria. In the cafeteria, he sat at a table by the supports in the middle of the room. He sat with students Chad Sharply and Kevin Elsmore. He stated that everything appeared to be normal when he was in the cafeteria. He did not see anyone carrying anything heavy such as a duffle bag while he was there and he did not see either Klebold or Harris.

Bootsma stated that he first noticed that something was wrong when an unknown teacher and three to four unknown students ran into the cafeteria from the outside. They entered the cafeteria by way of the door which is near the Teachers' Lounge and near the kitchen. When the teacher and students ran into the cafeteria, they ran toward the stairs. Bootsma heard someone yelling about something going on outside. He did not recall what specific words were said. He didn't know if it was about a shooting or a fight or someone with a gun. He stated that several students began to look out the cafeteria windows to the west.

Bootsma stood up and tried to look outside, but he couldn't see anything. He then saw a girl who was close by the benches outside the west windows. He believes he heard her scream. He stated that she had shocked look on her face. Bootsma said an unknown male began to yell, "Get down! Everyone get down!"

People started to get on the ground and underneath their tables. Bootsma was still looking outside. He saw a gate swinging by the bottom of the stairs which is by the west cafeteria entrance near a tree. Bootsma did not see anyone by the gate. He then sat down. People began running up the stairs. He got up and started to go toward the stairs, but stopped when he heard a very loud boom. He wanted to see what it was. He thought it might have come from outside, but he was too far away from the windows at this point to be able to see anything. Bootsma started to go toward the stairs again, but stopped because he heard gunfire coming from upstairs. Most of the students at this time were out of the cafeteria and had finished going up the stairs.

Bootsma never did go on the stairs. He stopped by a trash can which is by the students store door because he heard a very large boom coming from upstairs. Bootsma stopped and thought for a moment. He decided to go down toward the Spanish hallway which is on the same level as the cafeteria. At the end of the hall, he saw an unknown teacher, and unknown students going into a classroom which was on the left of the hall by the door that leads to the outside. He joined them in that classroom. They stayed in that classroom for about five minutes and then decided that they would exit the doorway which leads to the outside of the school. This doorway exits toward the junior parking lot. When Bootsma exited that doorway, he crossed the Junior Parking Lot and went to the house, which is on the corner of South Pierce and West Polk Avenue. This house is commonly known as the "Mormon House." There, he hung out until such time as the police allowed them to leave.

Bootsma stated that he never saw Klebold and Harris on 04-20-99. He did not see any weapons nor did he see anyone get wounded.

Nicole Marie BOUDREAU, date of birth 07/02/83, was interviewed at her residence, 6843 S. Zephyr St., Littleton, Colorado, on May 06, 1999 at approximately 1100 hours. Her mother was present during the interview, and her sister Michelle was present during a portion of the interview. They were advised of the personal and professional identity of the reporting agent and the purpose for the interview.

BOUDREAU advised that she is a freshman at Columbine High School and has "A" lunch. On April 20, 1999, she entered the cafeteria at approximately 11:20 AM. She had first stopped off at her locker, and checked for a friend in the library who was not there.

BOUDREAU stated that she had brought her lunch, and took a seat at what she believed was table "O" on the map shown to her by the writer. Seated with her at the table were Katherine CARLSTON, Candace HEYWOOD, Elena SCHULTZ, Lacey ILONE, Jennifer BARNES and Michelle LNU.

BOUDREAU heard someone shouting for everyone to get down, and thought that someone was playing a senior prank. She saw others getting under tables, and was then pushed under her table by someone.

Other students in the cafeteria then began to run east towards the stairs, and BOUDREAU did the same. She ran up the stairs and toward the math and science building, exiting the east door which faces towards Pierce Street. She then ran across Pierce Street to Leawood Park, and ultimately into a nearby house. She stated that the house belonged to the parents of Eric and Christine LONG, fellow student's at Columbine High School. BOUDREAU advised that there were a large number of students present at the house. She could not estimate how many but later heard that there were approximately 100 to 150.

BOUDREAU stated that she did not see any unusual bags or objects within the cafeteria area. While still in the cafeteria, BOUDREAU heard several low "boom" sounds, and a lot of screaming. She could not tell where the sounds came from. She did not see the suspects at any time.

BOUDREAU advised that she had spoken to Dylan KLEBOLD before, having worked together on the production of the school play of Frankenstein. KLEBOLD worked sound while BOUDREAU was responsible for pyrotechnics. She advised that they engaged in small talk on less than five occasions, never discussing anything relevant or which would provide insight with regard to this investigation. BOUDREAU stated that the pyrotechnics used were flashpots, which were carefully controlled and kept at her home, with her parent's knowledge (her mother acknowledged this to the writer). BOUDREAU stated that she and KLEBOLD never had any discussions about pyrotechnics.

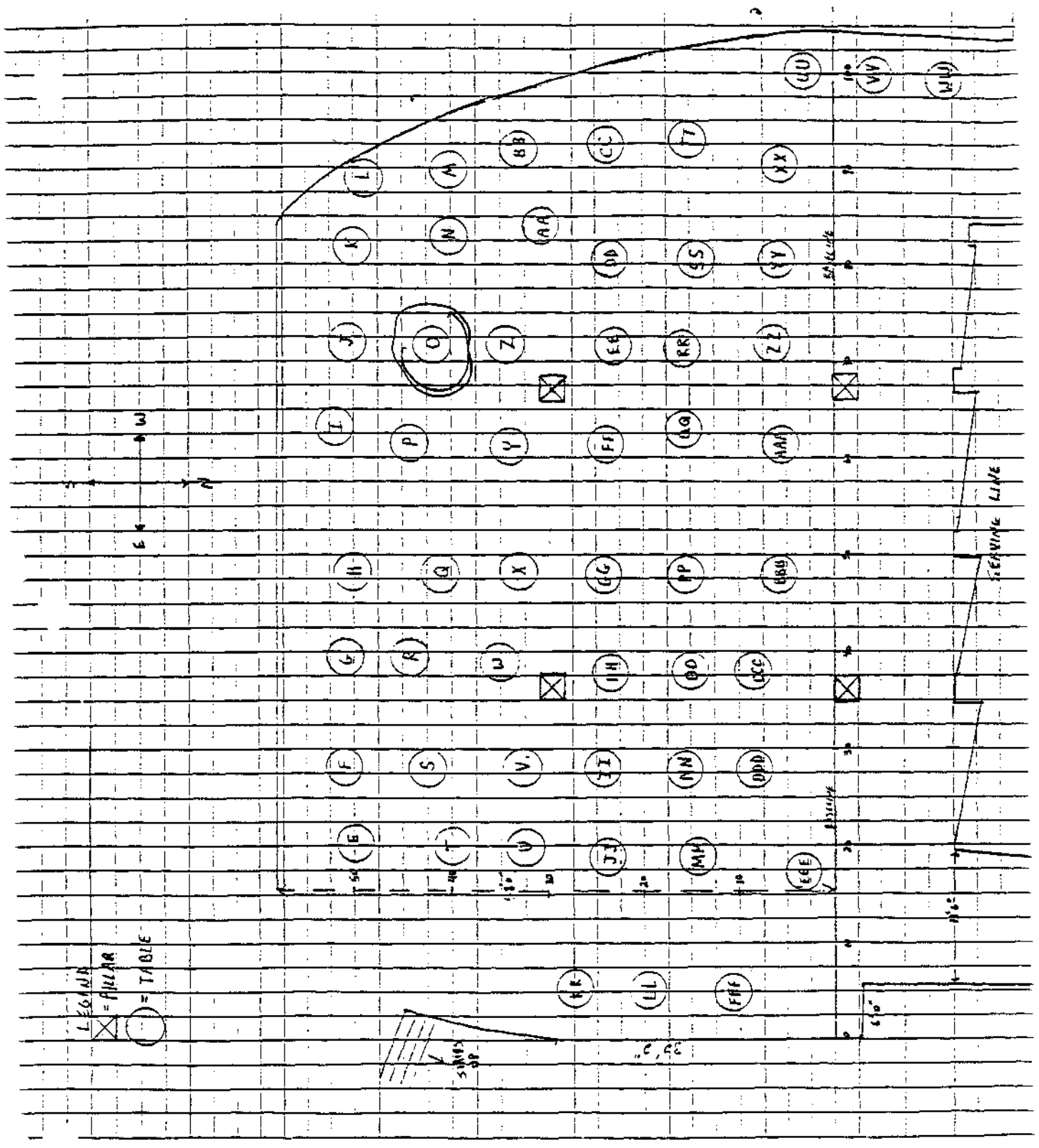
BOUDREAU advised that she knew a number of the "Trench Coat Mafia" members, primarily from the previous school year. She stated that she had little contact with them this year. She identified the subjects she knew as Alex MARSH (a female), Thaddeus "Tad" BOLES, Charles "Chuckie" PHILLIPS, Pauline LNU and Chris CORDOVA. BOUDREAU stated that she knew several of these individuals from classes, and knew Pauline and Alex from Art Club. BOUDREAU stated that she never heard any of these individuals talk about violence, guns, or pipe bombs.

BOUDREAU advised that she has access to the Internet through America Online. Her screen name is WOMBAT5899. She was not aware of the Eric Harris Website and did not access it at any time.

BOUDREAU did not hear or see any school announcements on the date of the shootings. She later heard that the thought of the day was, "You don't want to be here today".

BOUKHALFA was interviewed and stated the following: that while he was in the cafeteria, he saw a white male wearing a black trench coat and a black hat pull a shot gun from under his coat and shoot it at the ground. He also saw the man throw a grey tube with wires attached into the student parking lot. He heard it explode and saw a lot of smoke. BOUKHALFA then ran upstairs and while doing so, heard two more shots being fired.

INVESTIGATION:

On 05/03/99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN2513 for follow up investigation. The narrative stated that Jeremy Orban had been in the cafeteria at approximately 7:00 a.m. The source was Brandi Wiseman, a student at Columbine High School.

On 05/04/99 at 1130 hours I met with Jeremy Orban and his mother Joann Sander-Cederl at their residence. Also present at the residence were two other Columbine students, Braden Pesusich and Ali Boukhalfa. Both Pesusich and Boukhalfa were present in the cafeteria with Jeremy Orban and they were also interviewed.

Orban stated that he walked to school on 04/20/99 and that he arrived at approximately 0710 hours and that he entered the school through the main entrance then went to his locker and down to the commons or cafeteria area. He said he met a girl named Cari, last name unknown and Brandi

Wiseman. He said they were in the commons for approximately 10 to 15 minutes before first hour. Orban said that he didn't notice anything unusual in the cafeteria at that time. He didn't notice any unattended duffel bags or backpacks, although he said he wasn't really looking for any.

Orban left the commons area and went to Spanish on the lower level for first hour. He left Spanish and second hour went to chemistry on the main level, for third hour he went to history on the main level and after third hour he went to his locker and then to fourth hour across from the gymnasium, his math class. He then left his math class and went to the A lunch. He said that when he arrived he got in line to purchase food and after he purchased his pizza he went to sit at his table. He identified the table that he was sitting at as table AA. He said that the other people at his table were Braden Pesusich, Ali Boukhalfa, Seth Biggi, Ian Hales, Nick Romynyshtin, Rani Rao, Ryan Baris and Terry, last name unknown.

Orban said that he sat down at the table, took two bites of this pizza when he heard a janitor come in through an outside door yelling for everyone to get down. He said that he looked out the windows and saw a person who he believes was Dylan Klebold shot a male student in the leg and throw a pipe bomb into the parking lot. He said that he and other students then got under the tables. He said that then he and other students began running towards the stairs and as they ran Orban could hear what he described as booms thinking in retrospect that these were pipe bombs. Orban said that as he approached the stairs he could see that the stairwell was quite crowded and there was a teacher in the hallway by the food cart directing them down the hall. He said that he ran down the hall until he had to make a right and followed that hallway down to the last classroom. He said there were numerous students going into that classroom and there were several teachers in the class with them. He said that after several minutes the teachers heard the shooting from what he believes was upstairs and he, at the direction of the faculty, ran out the south exit doors from this classroom, across the student parking lot and to a house at Polk Street and Pierce. He said they went in the house for a short time and a student there had a cell phone and he was able to call his mother. He believed he was able to contact her at approximately 11:45 a.m. Orban had been separated from his

friends at the table when he left the table. Orban did not leave anything behind in the cafeteria. He said he had been wearing brown corduroy's and a green T shirt. He said he took his backpack with him when he left. Orban said that he noticed nothing unusual in the cafeteria prior to the incident beginning, that he didn't notice any large duffel bags or backpacks that appeared to be unattended. However, he stated that he probably wouldn't notice such an item because it is common practice for the students to drop their packs and go get food, using their packs to save a spot. Orban said that he was familiar with the trench coat mafia only by name and knew that they were kids that wore trench coats, but had no run in's with them and could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Orban did not know of any students who were building pipe bombs or stockpiling weapons. He does not have his own web site and does not have Internet access at home.

I next interviewed Braden Pesusich. He indicated he had not been in the cafeteria any other time during the day and had gone to the cafeteria for the A lunch. He said that he had come from the upstairs into the cafeteria, had gone to the lunch line and then made his way to the table when the incident began. He said that he observed people standing up by the west windows and felt perhaps there was a fight. He said that he had a fairly clear view of the kid running up the hill, trying to run up and get away, when he heard more shots. He said that he then observed what he thought were pipe bombs being thrown into the parking lot. He said that he saw one of the gunmen by the window shooting down towards the ground. He could not see what the gunman was shooting at. The only description he could remember was that this gunman had long curly hair and in retrospect thinks it was Dylan Klebold. He said about this time people were starting to run for the stairs to the cafeteria. He said that he ran along the south wall and that he saw a girl screaming. He thought her name might be Kim or Patty Blair. He couldn't be sure because the Blair's are twins. He said that the girl was screaming "Ann Marie, Ann Marie". He said that shortly past this girl that was screaming, was a male student who was covered with blood. He said he didn't appear to be injured, but he had blood all over him. He said he next focused on the stairs and saw there was a large crowd there and ran

down the corridor into the language section of the building. He said that he didn't go entirely down the hall, but made a right turn by the Special Ed hall. He said as he ran past the stairwell he could hear a rapid series of shots from where he believed was either behind him or upstairs. He said that he then ran down the corridor past the Special Ed classroom and out of the building. Pesusich said that he took his pack with him and he was wearing khaki colored pants and a dark blue T shirt and left nothing behind in the cafeteria. Pesusich said that he was familiar with the trench coat mafia only by name but had no run in's with them and could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Pesusich did not know of any students who were building pipe bombs or stockpiling weapons. He does have Internet access at home, however he does not have a web page or user name. Pesusich could add nothing further.

I also interviewed Ali Boukhalfa, who also stated he had only been in the cafeteria during the Attack and that he had come from upstairs. He said he had been in line and was making his way back to the table when the incident began. He heard a commotion and a loud thud outside the west windows. He got up and saw a suspect with what he believed was a shotgun. He observed him shoot the gun but did not know where he shot it into. He then saw what he thought was a pipe bomb go flying through the air and then the suspect ran to the north side and up the stairs. He then heard several loud bombs as he was getting down. He said that when the students began to run out of the cafeteria he ran for the stairs. He went up the stairs and then directly east out the southeast main entrance and across the street into the park. He said that as he was running out the corridor he could still hear gunshots which he believed were coming from behind him. Boukhalfa could not identify the person he saw with the shotgun and could provide no further information as to what the person might have been wearing.

Boukhalfa left nothing behind, he was wearing jeans and a dark grey T shirt with a marbled top. Boukhalfa said he was familiar with the trench coat mafia and had seen them around. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold but that in retrospect he had seen Klebold around the school. He had no direct involvement with the trench coat mafia, but had a friend named Brett

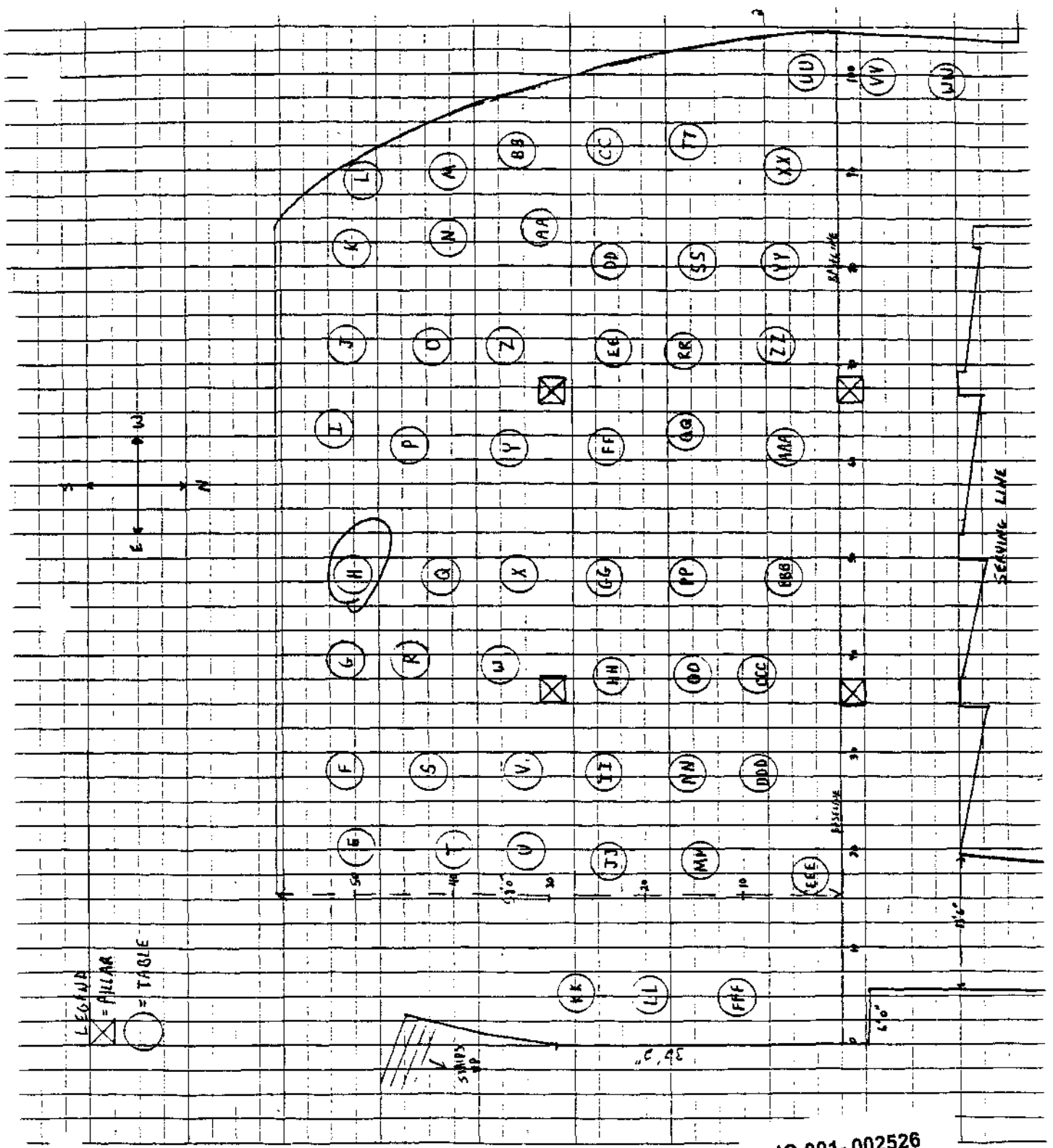

On April 27, 1999 at 1600 hours I met with Joshua Brinkley and his father, Gordon Brinkley, at 6305 South Lamar Court in Littleton, Colorado for the purpose of an interview.

Josh Brinkley provided the following information about the Columbine High School incident, which occurred on April 20, 1999:

- Josh is a Sophomore and was in English class until 11:10 a.m. He stated that he actually got out a couple of minutes late and then went to his locker located in the Math Hall.
- Josh stated that from his locker he went down the stairs and into the cafeteria. He stated that the 11:15 a.m. bell rang while he was at the top of the stairs. He stated that he did not observe anything unusual in the hall at that time. Josh stated that he was by himself at this time. Josh was wearing blue jeans, a white Padre shirt and was carrying his black backpack. He stated that in his backpack were the following: a math book, math folder, history binder, Spanish binder, Spanish book, calculator, keys and some personal effects.
- Josh stated that he went to the area where he generally sits and met with the following: Keith Knackarud (972-8750), Tim Vaca, Jill Kaymens (sic), Breana Lumley (sic), Brock (sic) and a couple of more "guys" that he can not remember. Josh located the table that he was sitting at on the FBI evidence diagram, which was designated as table "HH". Josh also diagramed the route in which he used to get to the table. Josh stated that he was facing the stairs (east) while sitting at the table.
- Josh stated that he did not observe anything laying on the floor or any where in the cafeteria that would have been out of the ordinary, to include, large duffel bags or larger backpacks.
- Josh stated that he had been in the cafeteria for about two minutes and had just finished eating his sandwich when the following events occurred:
 - Mr. Sanders, Mr. Brookfield and a janitor (unknown as to whom) ran from the area of the stairs and towards the teachers lounge (west) along the kitchen side (north) of the cafeteria. They were all yelling "get down". Josh stated that he got on the ground with his head towards the kitchen, but his face was turned to the west. Josh stated that he heard what sounded like "two gun shots". Josh stated that they were "not really loud and sounded like a shot gun". Josh thought, based on the "low volume" that the shots were coming from the outside, near the west side parking lot. Josh did not think that they were explosions at that time.
 - Josh stated that at this time, "everyone (the student body) near the west windows started running to the stairs, so I got up and did too". Josh stated that he was "slow to get up" and probably one of the "last to get up the stairs". Josh thought that he was on the ground for about one minute. Josh stated that he "didn't really see any of the shooters, but did see a black figure out the window (west) while laying on the ground" and he "figures that it was someone in a trench coat". Josh stated that while on the ground, he did not see any large duffel bags or large backpacks.
 - Josh stated that he "jumped the balcony on the stairs and ran up the left side". He stated that "people were falling as they tried to get up the stairs". Josh stated that once he was at the top of the stairs, he ran left to the Science Hall and then out the door by the Math Hall.
 - Josh stated that he could hear "more shots coming from behind him" while he was "going up the stairs". Josh stated that when he "got to the top of the stairs, the shots seemed closer". He stated that the shots at the top of the stairs were more of a "rapid fire". He stated that he could tell by the sound that there were "two different guns". Again, Josh thought that there "maybe a shooter at the top of the stairs" because the shots "seemed louder" and "different" when he got to the top. Josh stated that he did not feel that "noises" he was hearing were explosions. He stated that he did not see any shooter at the top of the stairs or in the hallway while exiting.

- Josh stated that when he exited the school he ran to Leawood Park where he heard about four or five explosions from inside the school. He stated that he could not distinguish any additional gunfire at that time. Josh stated that he did not see anybody outside of the school that he thought was "a shooter".
- Josh stated that he "heard and saw a lot more of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM) last year". He stated that he has not "seen much of them this year", other than "in the hall and dressed in black". Josh stated that he "does not know any of their names or faces" and "could not identify them" if asked to do so. Josh stated that he had never heard of the names Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris until the first news reports came out. The last time he remembers seeing "somebody in black was at least three weeks ago in the hall".
- Josh stated that he has not heard anything about "guns or bombs" around the school prior to the event. Josh did stated that he remembers that the Rebel News Network "Thought of the Day" was something to the effect of "today is not going to be a very good day".

I gave Josh Brinkley and his father my business card should they need to have a contact regarding this incident. Included with this report is the diagram that Josh drew his location, entrance into and exit out of the cafeteria.

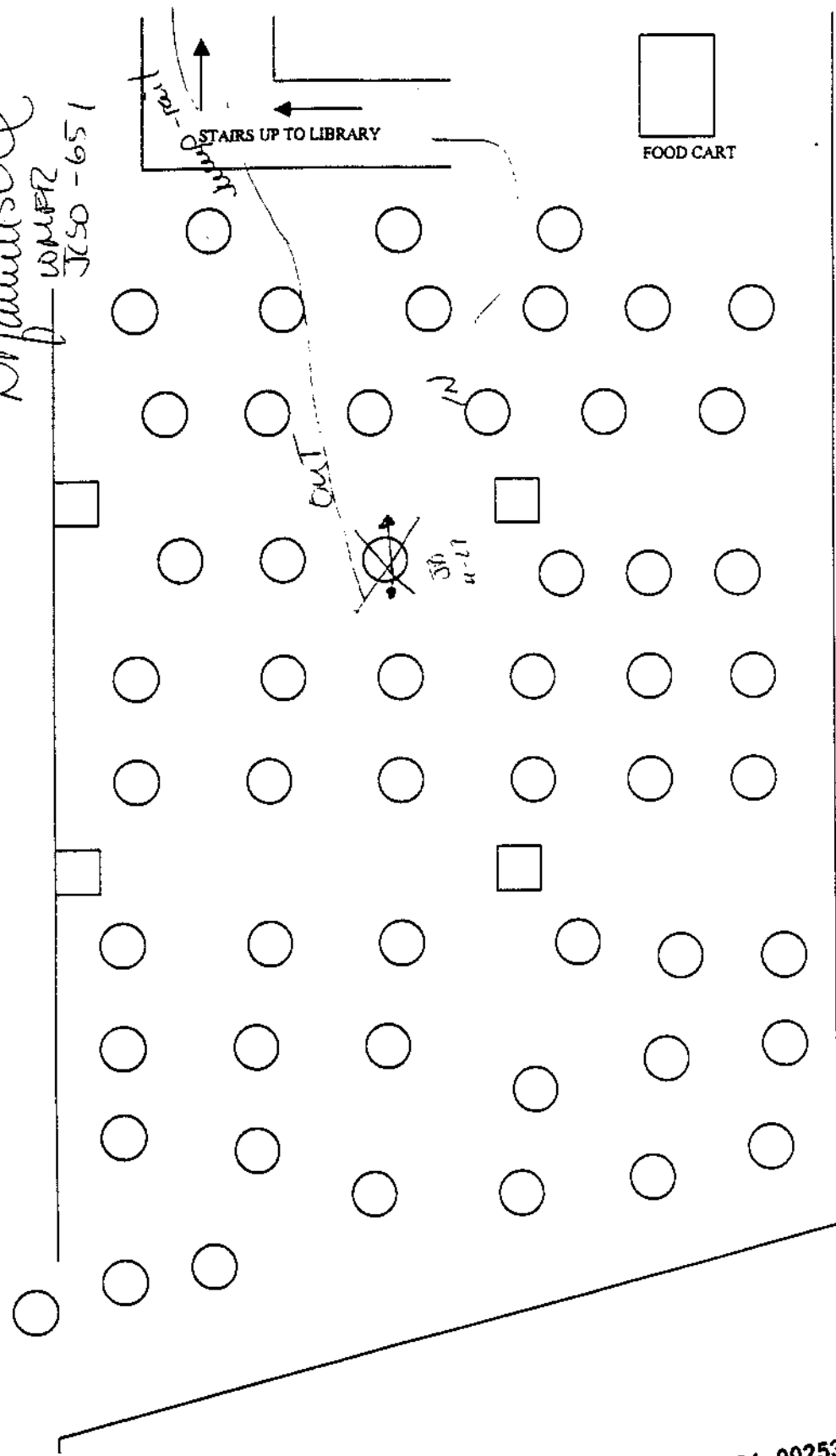

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It was about 11:20 AM, I was walking toward the front (the side opposite of the windows) of the cafeteria. Students began running toward me yelling "Gun". I ducked and ran to our office (FL office). I saw two of my students, Peter Forsberg and Matt Conley, along with a couple of other students and pushed them into the office with me. Also in the room were 4 other staff members: Laura Freund, Cathie Lutz, Shirley Hickman, and Charlette Killian. When we went to into the room I told everyone that there was a gunman in the school and "let's go to the back of the room, where we could hide. I then heard a series of explosions, that sounded like either a shotgun or some type of bomb. We stayed there until 2:15. At about 2:10, we heard the alarms (which had been sounding the duration) shut off. We then heard a series of bells, in which we thought was a good opportunity to get out (on a signal). We also heard on a radio (AM/FM) that the suspects had been apprehended. So we ran out of the school as quickly as possible. I did not notice anything on the way out.



With the permission of BROWN's parents, JUDY and RANDY BROWN, a witness interview was conducted concerning BROWN's knowledge of the shooting and bombing incident at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999 at approximately 11.15 a.m. RANDY BROWN voluntarily agreed and signed an FBI Consent to Search Release for any records maintained by America On Line with his e-mail address.

AARON BROWN stated he was sitting in the northwest portion of the school cafeteria at approximately 11:30 a.m., April 20, 1999, when he observed everyone inside the cafeteria stand up. BROWN looked outside and saw two individuals lying on the ground outside near the exit door and one individual collapsed outside. He then heard several gunshots and everyone inside the cafeteria fell to the floor. He heard a teacher tell everyone to get down and heard several more gunshots. BROWN stated he did not see any propane tanks on the cafeteria floor during this incident. Student began crawling along the floor and then standing up and running up the stairs. BROWN did not see any individual shooting inside or outside the school. BROWN ran up stairs to the auditorium and hears more gunshots, someone then yells to get to the front. BROWN hears approximately eight more shots and begins running with the crowd out the main door of the school. After reaching the front of the school, Mr. PETERSON, a teacher, directs the students to proceed to Clement Park. BROWN gets his vehicle, picks up BRIAN and DENAE PEDERSON and drives to an elementary school a short distance away.

BROWN could not provide any additional information relevant to this investigation. BROWN's parents were given re-contact instructions in case their son remembers something at a later date that he forgot to tell investigators.

On May 28, 1999, this investigator met with Jessica Brown at her residence. Present during the interview was her mother, Joyce Brown.

Jessica advised that on the day of this incident, her fourth hour orchestra class ended at approximately 11:00 a.m.. She said she went to the cafeteria and sat at a table with her friends, KRISTA HANLEY, PATRICK LEIKER, ALEX MARSH AND NICOLE MARKHAM. She was shown a sketch of the cafeteria and indicated that they were at the table marked, "XX." She said her friend Patrick had just come in from outside the cafeteria and asked her if she wanted to go outside and join Ann Marie. (Hochhalter) At that moment, Alex Marsh commented, "Hey, there's Dylan." Jessica looked out the window and observed Ann Marie and Kim Blair. She said they were walking and suddenly, they turned and began to run south. Jessica said she heard people yelling to "get down," and saw many of the students running towards the stairs. She recalled hearing what she thought were firecrackers exploding. She stated that she went up the stairs and a bomb

exploded near her. She advised that she saw Mr. Sanders and believed he had been injured as he was on the floor on his knees.

Jessica stated that she ran down the hallway which goes between the math and social studies labs, east, and out of the school, into Leawood Park across the street. She advised that she stayed there for a while and then headed home. She got a ride from a friend whose name she could not remember.


Jessica stated that when she had looked outside and saw Ann Marie and Kim, she did see Dylan Klebold. She said he was wearing a black trench coat which was closed so she was unable to see what he was wearing underneath it. She said he was wearing sunglasses and a hat. She was asked if he had anything in his hands and she stated that she saw him make a movement like he was throwing something and then did hear a "pop." She said she did not see him holding a gun.

Jessica stated that she knows most of the members of the Trench Coat Mafia. She explained that she was friendly with the female associates more so than the male members. She said that she did not socialize with them away from school.

Jessica stated that she was unaware of any rumors or any discussions among her friends which would have indicated that something like this was going to occur.

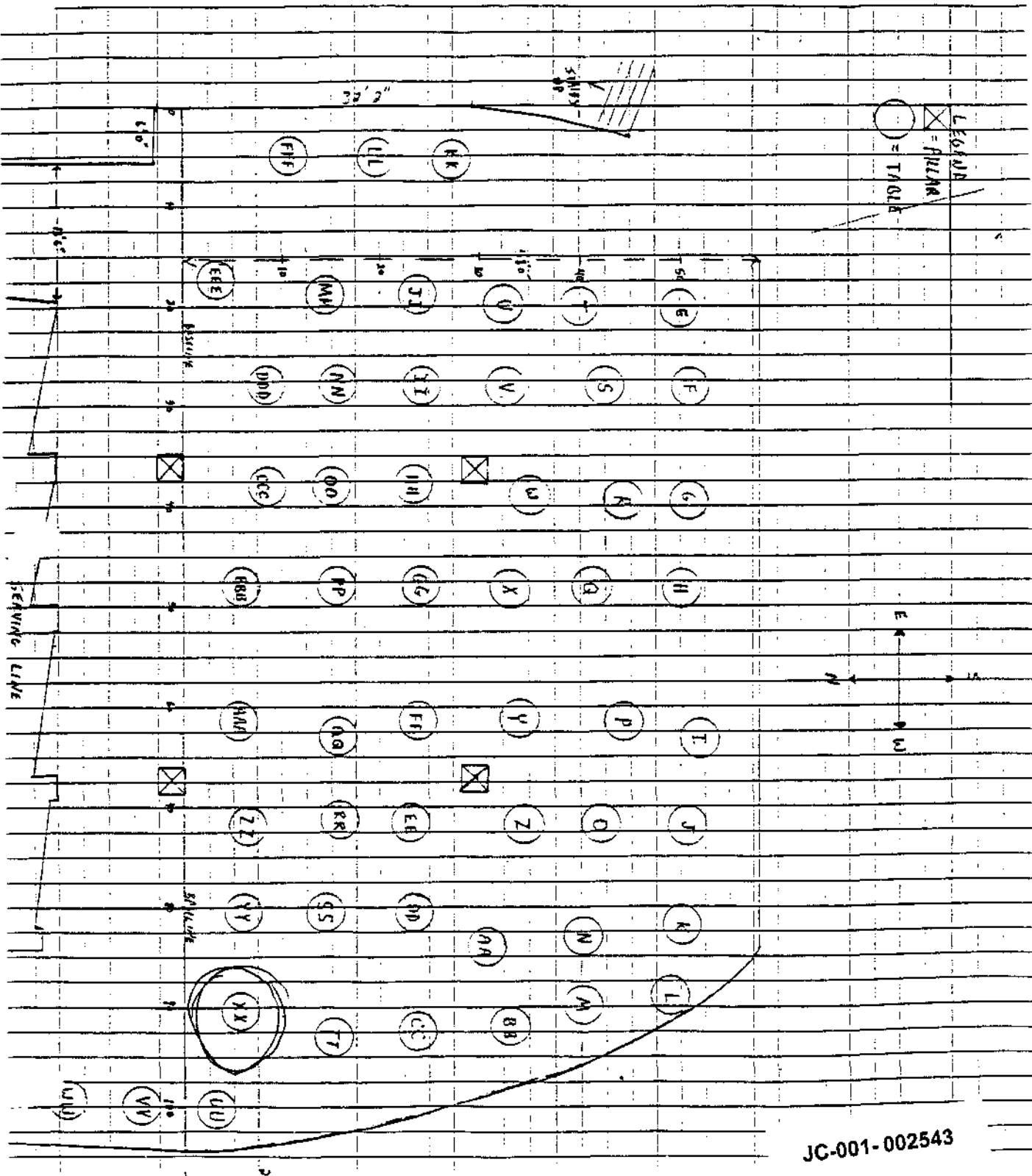

SHE KNOWS WHO THE SUSPECTS ARE BUT DOES NOT ASSOCIATE WITH THEM. SHE DID NOT SEE THEM AT PROM. KRISTIN HAD NO OTHER PERSONAL INFORMATION ON THE SUSPECTS OR THEIR ASSOCIATES.

THIS WITNESS DID EXPLAIN THAT A FRIEND, JEFF MARQUART TOLD HER THAT HE PASSED BY ONE OF THE SUSPECTS AS HE WAS LEAVING THE SCHOOL TO GO GET LUNCH ON CAMPUS AT 5TH HOUR. ANOTHER FRIEND, JIM BISSARD, TOLD HER THAT ERIC + DYLAN WERE AT BOWLING THAT DAY.

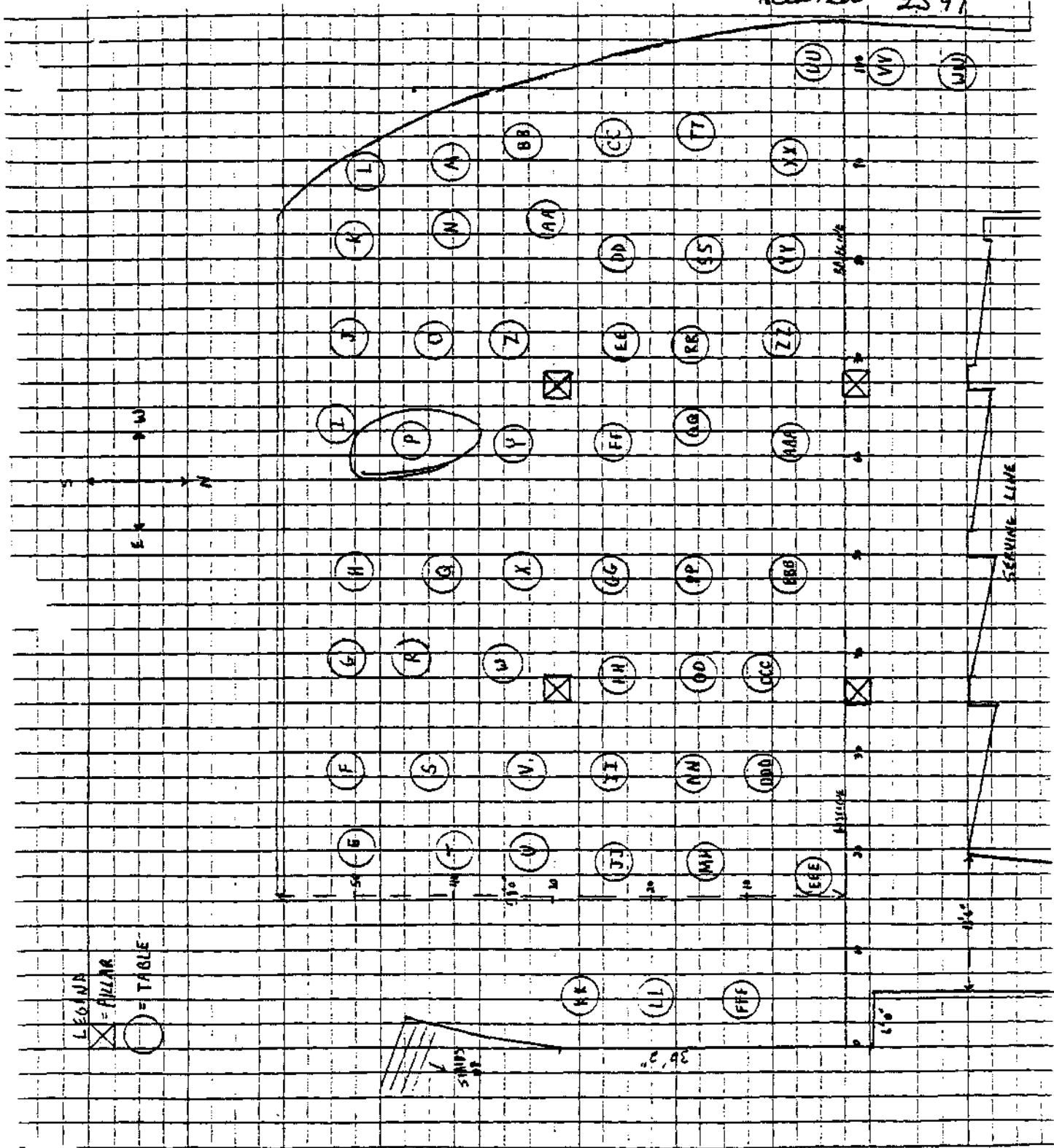

INVESTIGATION:

On 5-3-99 between the hours of 0923 and 1015 I had an opportunity to speak with Margot H. Brown in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 4-20-99.

Margot stated that at about 1110 hours after her fourth hour ceramics class, taught by Miss Wasicako, she went to her locker, which is in the main hallway of the school, and later she went to library, where she believes she arrived at about 1115 hours. Initially, Margot was at the library in order to complete some homework, but she'd forgotten a ruler she needed, so she left the library and went to the student store located in the Rebel Corner. Shortly after she arrived, she heard an unidentified voice yelling, "He's got a gun" at which time she saw a janitor telling the students to get down. Margot ran east from the cafeteria down the Foreign Language hall and as she was running, she remembers hearing a loud explosion and what appeared to be gunshots. Margot was asked who was with her. She reported her friend Valerie Mar, 303-972-6488 was with her. Margot stated they exited from an emergency exit located in the southeast corner of the school into the Junior parking lot and ran south the Mormon house, located at Polk Avenue and Pierce Street.

Margot was asked if she saw a gunman while she was in the school or after she exited and she stated she did not. Margot was asked if she'd spent any additional time in the cafeteria on 4-20-99. She stated that between the hours of 0730 and 0920 she was in the cafeteria area and she believes she was sitting at table "KK." She stated during that time she did not see anything out of the ordinary. I then asked if she saw two large duffle or sports type bags, one being blue and the other an orangish-red. She stated she did not see those two items.

Margot was asked if she had any additional information. She proceeded to tell me that shortly after she arrived at the Mormon house she remembers a student, who she described as being a senior named John, (last name beginning with the letter "s") came running to the Mormon house at about 1130 to 1140 hours. John proceeded to tell them that he was in the library of the school and he had a gun held up to his head by one of the gunmen. Margot said she didn't know if this individual was telling the truth or not.

Margot was asked if she left any property at the school. She stated that she did not leave any property other than the items which were in her school locker, telling me that she had grabbed her backpack when she exited the school.

At the completion of my interview with Margot, I provided her with a map of the cafeteria area and asked her to identify where she was seated, and her exit out of the cafeteria area. A copy of that map is attached with this report.

On 04-28-99 at 1515 hours, I interviewed Sarah Brown at her home. Her mother was not present, however she had been contacted prior to the interview. Deborah Brown had given permission to talk with Sarah without her being present.

Sarah stated that her mother drove her to school the morning of 04-20-99, arriving at approximately 0725 hours. She stated she entered through the main entrance of the school and was in a hurry because she was late. She stated she did not see anything unusual outside the building.

Sarah stated that she is familiar with the "trench coat mafia" group. She stated they were more public last year than they were this year, adding that they didn't wear the long, black trench coats as much. Sarah stated she did not know HARRIS and KLEBOLD personally, however knew them by sight from just being around the school. She stated she did not see them anytime that morning and she did not see the others in the group either.

Sarah stated that she entered the cafeteria from the downstairs hallway at approximately 1110 to 1112 hours. She stated that she had choir during her fourth period. She stated that there were already a lot of kids in the cafeteria. Sarah indicated on the attached diagram which table she left her backpack on. She stated she left her purse and backpack on this table and then walked immediately to one of the lines in front of the kitchen.

Sarah stated that suddenly all the kids on the west half of the cafeteria got up and went to the west window. She thought it was a fight in the parking lot that they were watching. She then heard a loud boom, boom.

Sarah stated that a kid whom she did not know, appeared in the cafeteria stating that someone had a gun. Sarah stated that at that point a wave of kids got under the tables. She stated a janitor ran westbound through the cafeteria toward the windows yelling for everyone to get down. She stated he was talking into a radio at this time. Sarah stated that teachers also appeared near the north west exit door of the cafeteria. Sarah stated she got down and hid behind a small staggered wall near the serving line. She stated she could hear approximately four more gunshots and then there was a pause before a bomb exploded, followed by a stream of gunshots. She stated she joined a group of kids who ran east in the cafeteria toward the auditorium doors. She stated the doors were locked and the group of kids that she was with were busy looking for places to hide. Sarah stated that as she looked back over her shoulder she thought she saw one of the suspects near the kitchen in the cafeteria with a gun. She stated she didn't see the gun clearly however she noticed that the suspect was dressed in a long, black coat and had his arms stretched out in front of him as if to be holding a gun.

She stated that someone unlocked the door to the auditorium and she was one of perhaps 25 kids who ran through the doors to the stage. She stated during this time she heard lots of shots being fired and people screaming.

As she ran out of the auditorium through the north east doors into the hallway, she stated that it sounded like gunshots were being fired really close to her. At that time she thought the gunman was coming into the auditorium because it was so loud. She ran through the hallway that runs next to the gymnasium. She stated she was pretty hysterical at this time and was yelling for others to run too. She stated she ran passed a girl who was simply walking and yelled at this girl to run. Sarah stated the girl replied something to the effect of, "Shut up. Man, if I could I'd kill that girl". Sarah stated that this girl kept repeating this and indicated that was meant for Sarah. Sarah stated this girl was wearing a green and orange Dolphins hat. She had on black jeans and a black shirt and she was described as being pudgy. This girl also had brown, shoulder-length hair. Sarah stated she looked through the year book to find out who this was and identified the girl as last name Marsh, who is a junior at Columbine. Sarah could not remember her first name but thought it began with an "A". Sarah stated she ran out the exit and went to Clement Park where they continued to hear gunshots. She stated she left the park with a friend in his car.

Sarah stated she had a green, Abercrombie backpack that had only one strap to it. Inside she had a math book and notebooks with a small calculator. Sarah stated she also left her purse in the cafeteria. She emphasized it is very important that she would like to get this purse back. Sarah's father passed away approximately one month ago and she has mementos from the funeral inside of this purse. Sarah described the purse as being brand new, blue plaid woven with blue flowers on it. Inside the purse is a maroon velvet or suede draw string pouch. It also contains sea shells. Sarah added that there is a ribbon on her backpack that says "Sarah, 2001".

Sarah was wearing jeans and a red shirt with a design on the front. She had on a blue jacket and her blond hair was in a ponytail.

Sarah added that she had heard HARRIS and KLEBOLD were into guns as was their group. She stated that they didn't really call them the "trench coat mafia", she stated they were mainly just referred to as. "the scum of the school".

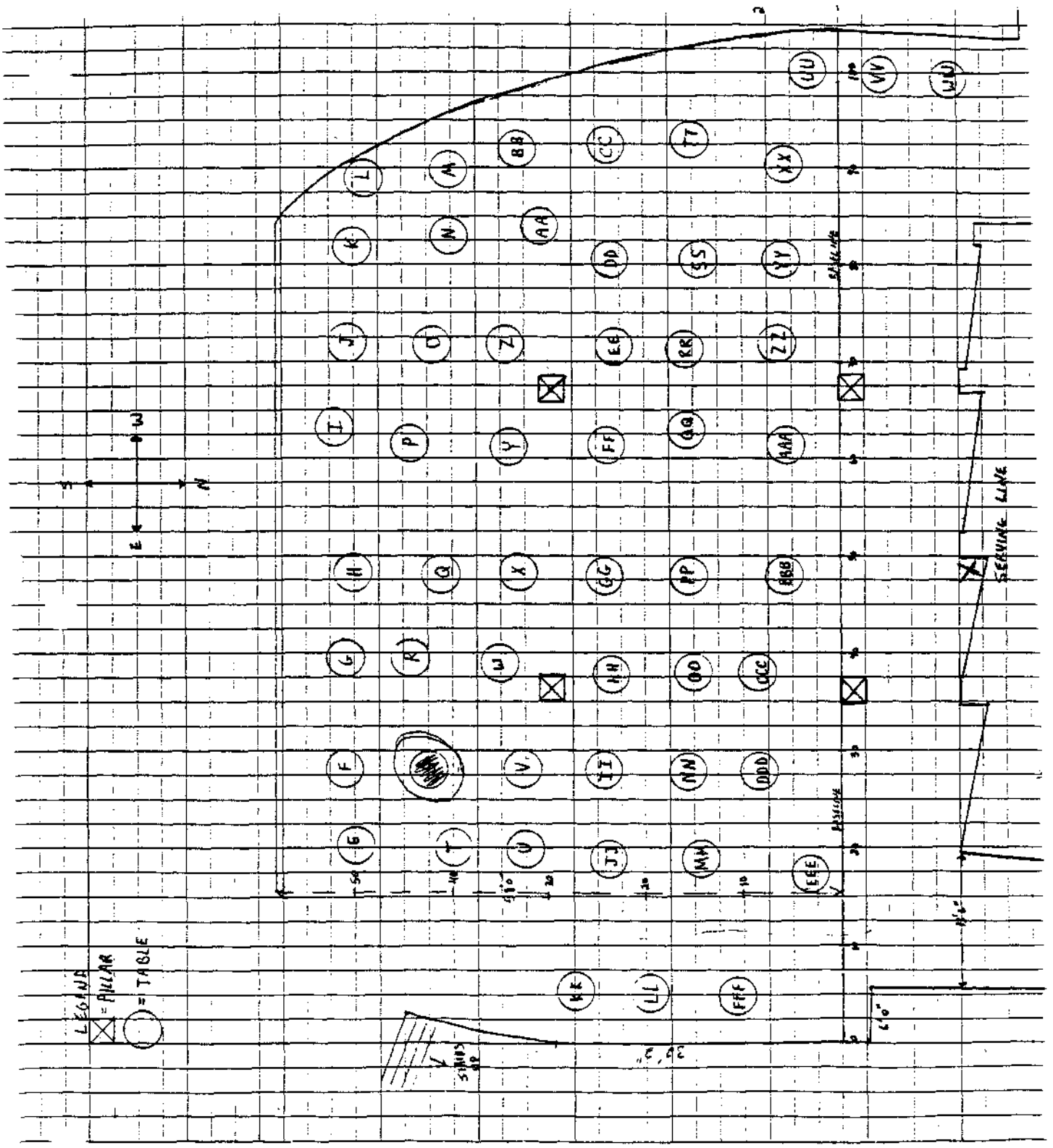

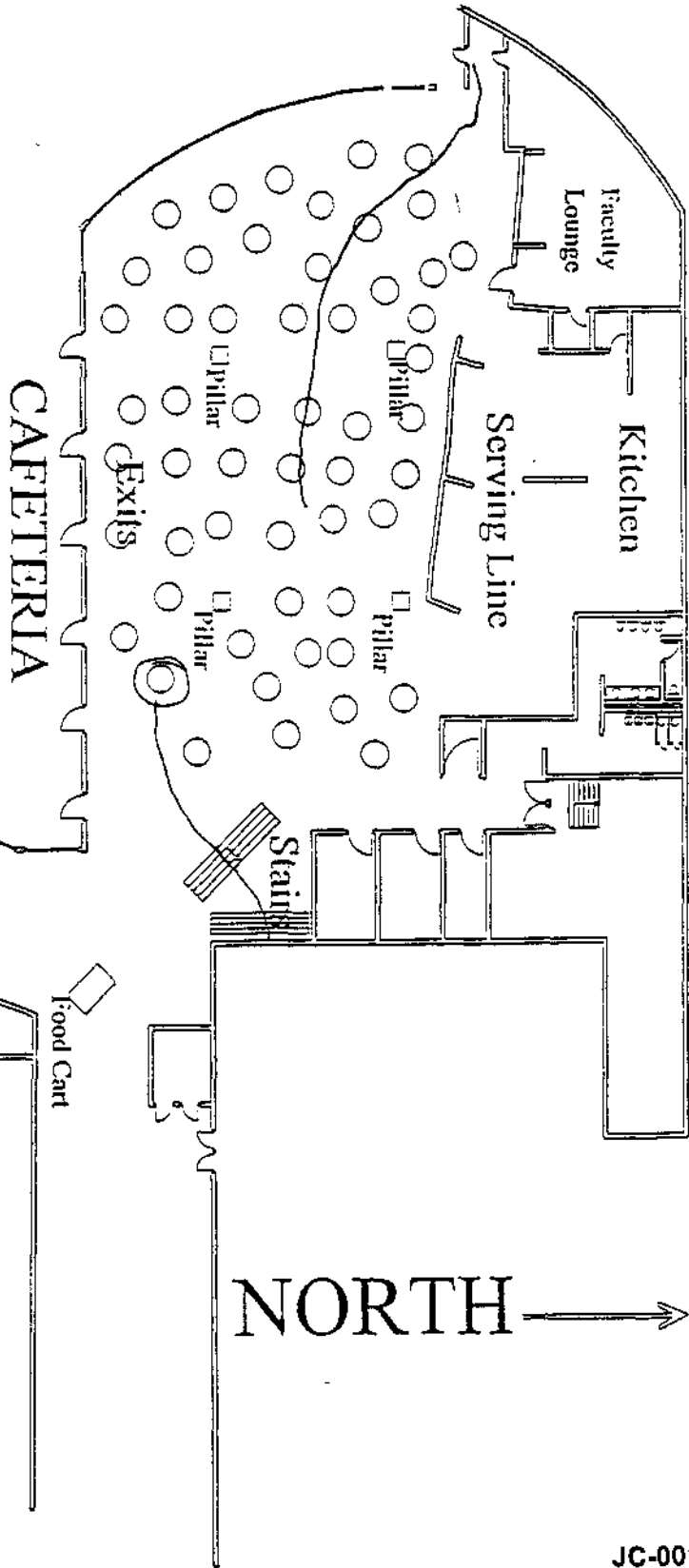

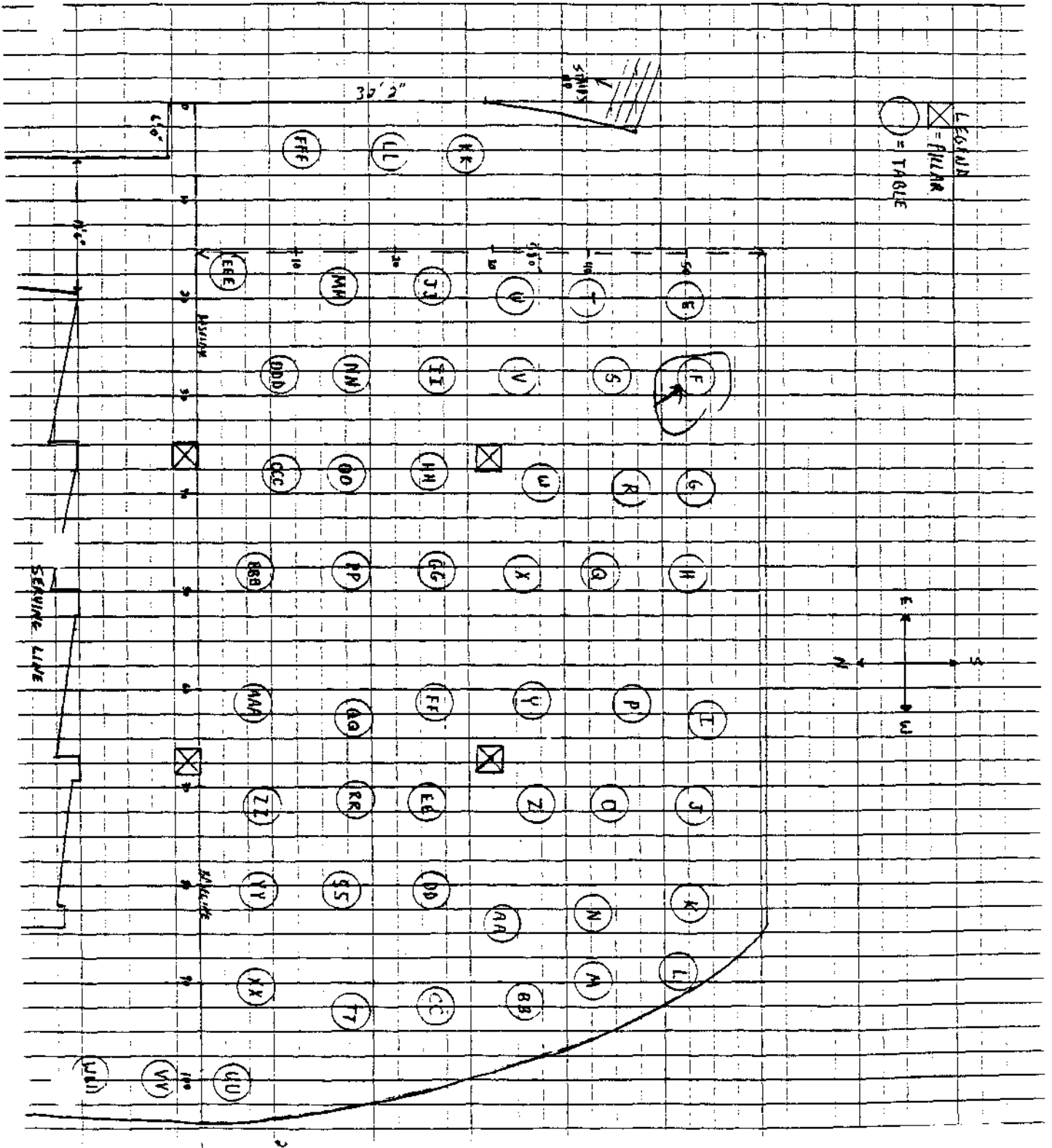

Narrative:

On 05-13-99 I interviewed BRUG via telephone. BRUG is a Spanish teacher at Columbine HS. MARSH is one of BRUG'S students. BRUG said that prior to April 20, 1999 MARSH was consistently writing in a spiral notebook, which at times was contained within a three ring binder. The writing by MARSH was to the detriment of all other class activities. MARSH refused to participate in class, and only wrote in the notebook. This writing was done for a minimum of one week prior to the incident. Subsequent to the incident at the school MARSH has discontinued the writing, and now reads during class. BRUG was unable to provide any other description for the notebook.

BRUG describes MARSH'S behavior prior to the incident as peculiar. BRUG explains that MARSH is preoccupied with death, as evidenced by statements made by MARSH to BRUG that she practices "dying scenes". Another statement attributed to MARSH is "I could have done this". This statement was made in reference to the shooting, and occurred during English class the first week of May 1999.

MARSH was interviewed by CBI Agent Linda Holloway in April of 1999 and she (MARSH) claims to be a former member of the trench coat mafia. MARSH told Holloway that she had been a member of the trench coat mafia as recent as 1998. Brug related during the incident, she never saw any of the gunmen. Initially when it started, she was in the cafeteria. One custodian came running through and told everyone to get down.

She heard shots, then the glass started breaking. The first custodian who came in was Jay and John came in right after him.

This Investigator asked Brug what she was doing in the cafeteria? She related she was just passing through on her way to the facility lounge to have her lunch. That's when everything started.

Kids started running away from the windows. They began running upstairs. Some of the kids came back down. They went towards the elevator and the bathroom. Lee Andres Jr. then opened the back door to the auditorium. About 100 kids went into the auditorium.

A bunch of these kids ran out the top of the auditorium and escaped. Some got out and the rest were stopped. Someone said there was a gunman up there. They were then trapped in the auditorium.

This Investigator asked Brug if the gunmen ever attempted to get in? She indicated that Lee Jr. said there is someone trying to get in. He came up and they stood there, near the door. Brug stated they did not open the door for any one.

This Investigator inquired from Brug if she ever heard any statements made by anyone? She related it was hard to heard. They just decided not to open the door. While inside, they heard noises. They could not tell if what they heard was shooting or bombs.

This Investigator asked Brug if she knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold? She said no. She indicated she never had either student in her class. Brug is a Spanish teacher.

While they were in the Auditorium, Jay came and told them that they needed to get out. Jay told them when the coast is clear, they were to run to the Foreign Language hallway, then out the school. Upon leaving the building, they went across the street to the park.

When she left the school, Nolene was with her. They had no idea where the two Lee's were at. On 05/05/99, I responded to 6378 South Chase Court and met with Julianne Brunaugh and her father. Julianne indicated that she had in fact been in the cafeteria when the incident began.

Julianne said her mother had driven her to school on 04/20/99, arriving at approximately 0720 hours. She entered the school by the main entrance and went to her locker located in the math wing. She then went to her first hour class, which is biology, in the science wing upstairs. For second hour, she has language arts as part of an american history class that she has second and third hour. This is in the upper level language arts wing. She said in between classes she went to her locker. Third hour she has history in the same classroom, and then for fourth hour she has choir. She again said she went to her locker between history and choir.

Julianne Brunaugh said that from choir she went down to the cafeteria area and would've arrived at approximately 11:15. She said she went to the pop machines and bought a soda, and then went to a table and sat down. She said she had taken two bites out of her sandwich when she observed people start running from the cafeteria. She said there were students coming in through the south doors screaming, get down, get down. She said Mr. Sanders came from the area of the faculty lounge, and he too was yelling get down. She said she stood up and looked out the window and saw students running in through the doors. Julianne said students in the cafeteria began to run towards the stairs, and she heard what she believed were gunshots. She said they sounded like firecrackers. She then heard two very loud explosions

as she was going to run upstairs. When she got to the stairwell, she heard what she believed were gunshots upstairs and down the hall. Julianne said there were custodians at the base of the stairs, and they guided them into the foreign language corridor. She said at the end of the corridor they turned left and ended up going into one of the french rooms which is at the very end of the building. She said that Cheryl Lucas, a language arts teacher, and Ms. Kelly, a humanities teacher, were in the room and were shutting the blinds. All the students in the room were huddled up against a wall. There was a phone in the room, and they attempted to dial 911, but it busy. She said one of the teachers was looking out of the windows and saw Mr. Capra in the parking lot waving them to come out of the building. The students were then evacuated out of the classroom. Julianne thought Ms. Kelly may have stayed behind to stay on the phone, however, she wasn't sure. She said as she ran from the building, she could hear what she thought were firecrackers again coming from inside the building. She said she ran across the parking lot to a dirt hill, slid down the hill and onto the sidewalk, and then went into the house on the corner which she referred to as the "Mormon house." She said she stayed inside for a short time and then left, catching a ride to a friend's house. She said she called her mom at approximately 11:30 or 11:40 from her friend's house.

Julianne said her backpack is rusty-red in color, and is a JanSport. She said it contains her math book, her spanish book, her Texas Instrument calculator, pens, pencils, and her purse that contains her school identification and her driver's license. She said she was wearing a pink shirt with a pink and black checkered top and jean shorts. She said she was wearing black shoes with large heels, and that she left them in the classroom when they ran out of the building because she could not run in the shoes.

Julianne said she has been aware of the trench coat mafia since her freshman year. She understood them to be just a group of people that hung around together wearing black trench coats and black clothes. She described them as a frightening group of people, and that she stayed away from them. She also said she thought they were dirty and had greasy hair. She said she does not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, does not know anything about them stockpiling weapons or building bombs, and knows of no other students doing so. She said that as she traveled at school that day, in retrospect, she doesn't recall anything suspicious or unusual. She did not see any large duffie bags or backpacks laying around unattended nor did she see any propane canisters.

Julianne said she does have internet access at home and maintains her own web page. She said her screen name is "Jules 3115." She said she does not have an ICQ account. She has not seen anyone with a double pierced eyebrow, and could provide no further information regarding the trench coat mafia.

Julianne added that the people who gave her a ride to her friend's house were possibly associates of the trench coat mafia; Brian Sargent, Frank Zirgez, and Nicole Dickey. She said Sargent was driving the car, and it was a little red compact car. She said they picked up her and two of her friends, Ashleigh and John Owens. She said they were very quiet in the car, and didn't say anything, and dropped them off at her friend's house. She said they came into the house for a short time, didn't say anything, and then left.

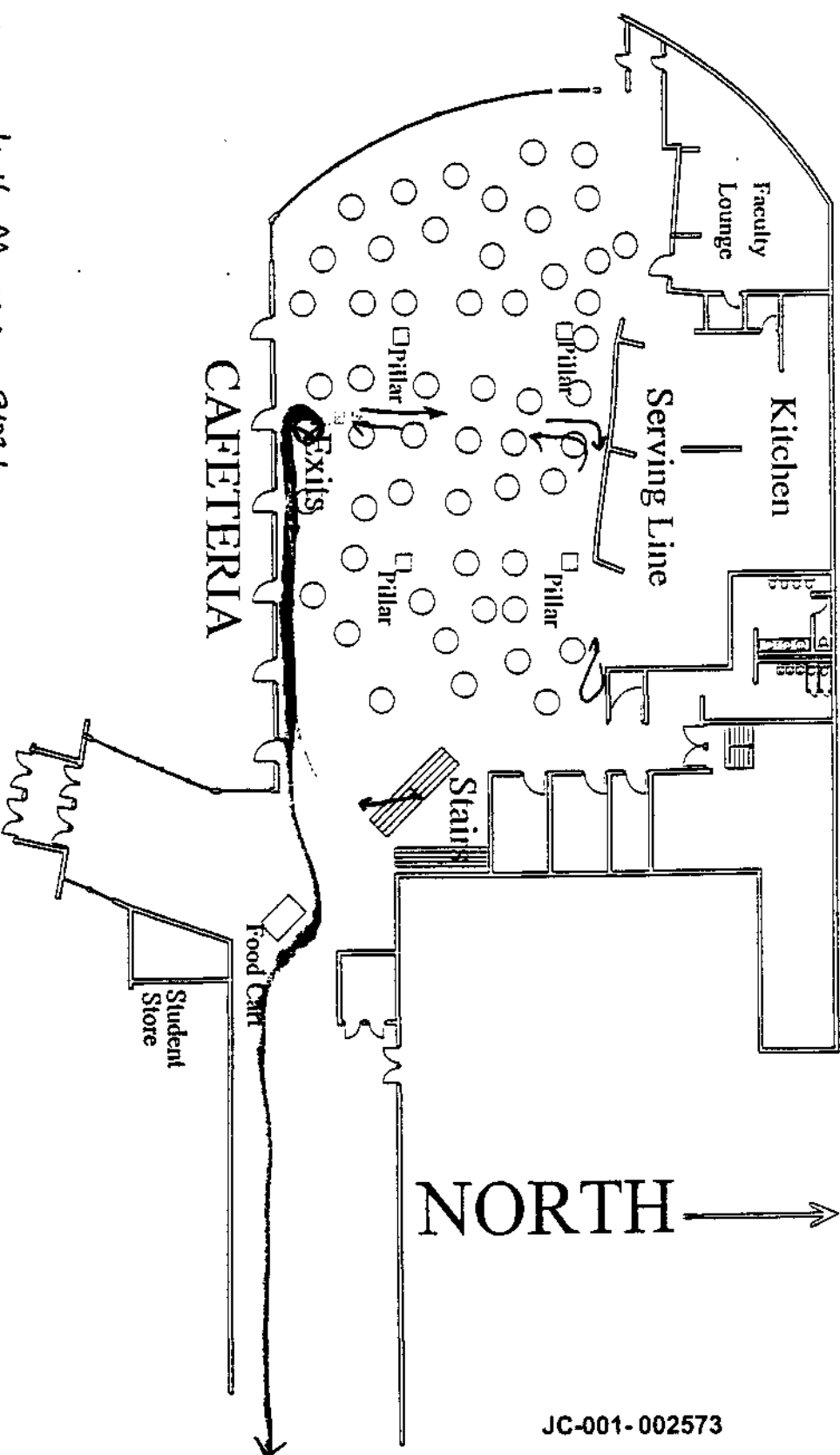

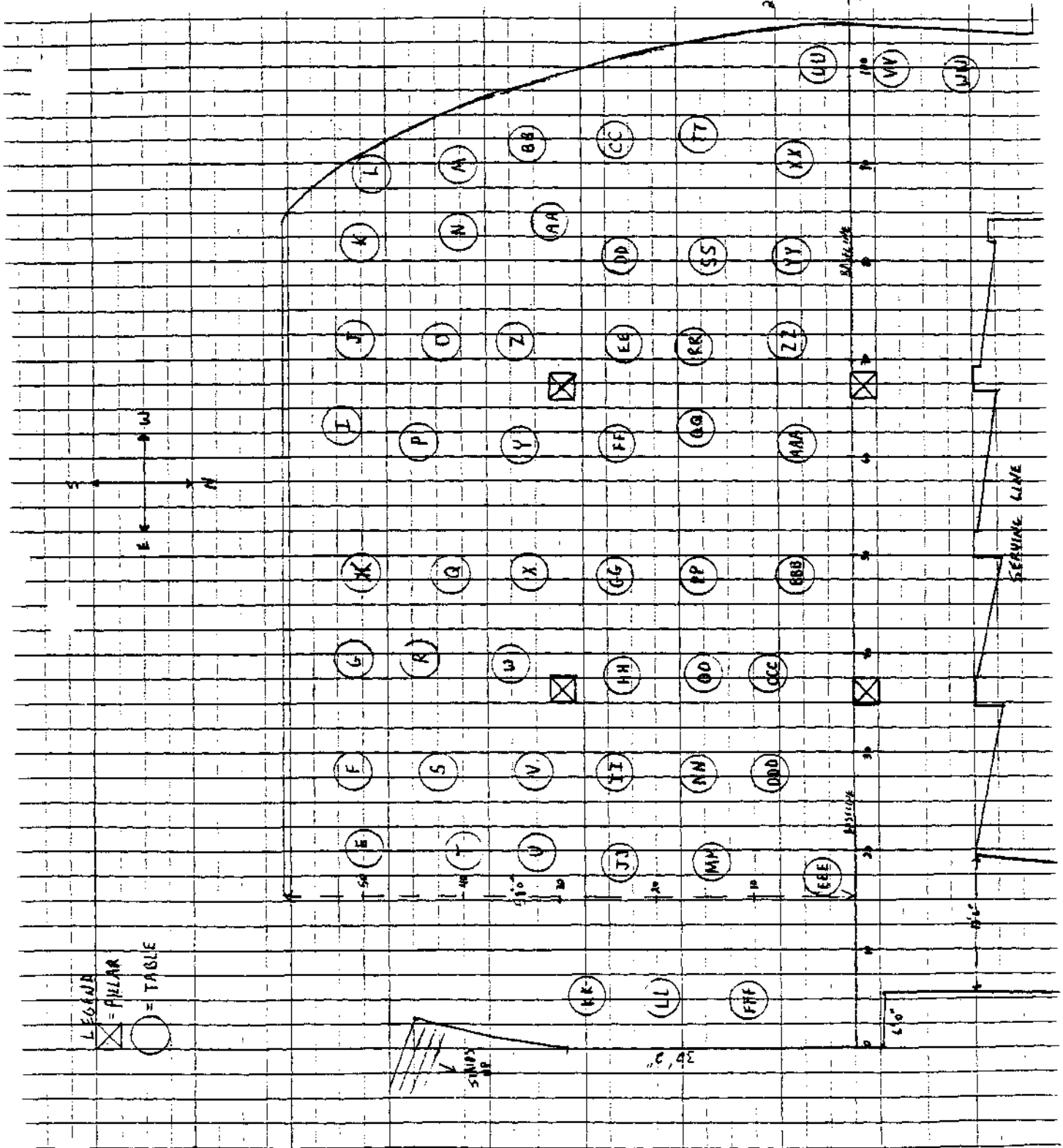

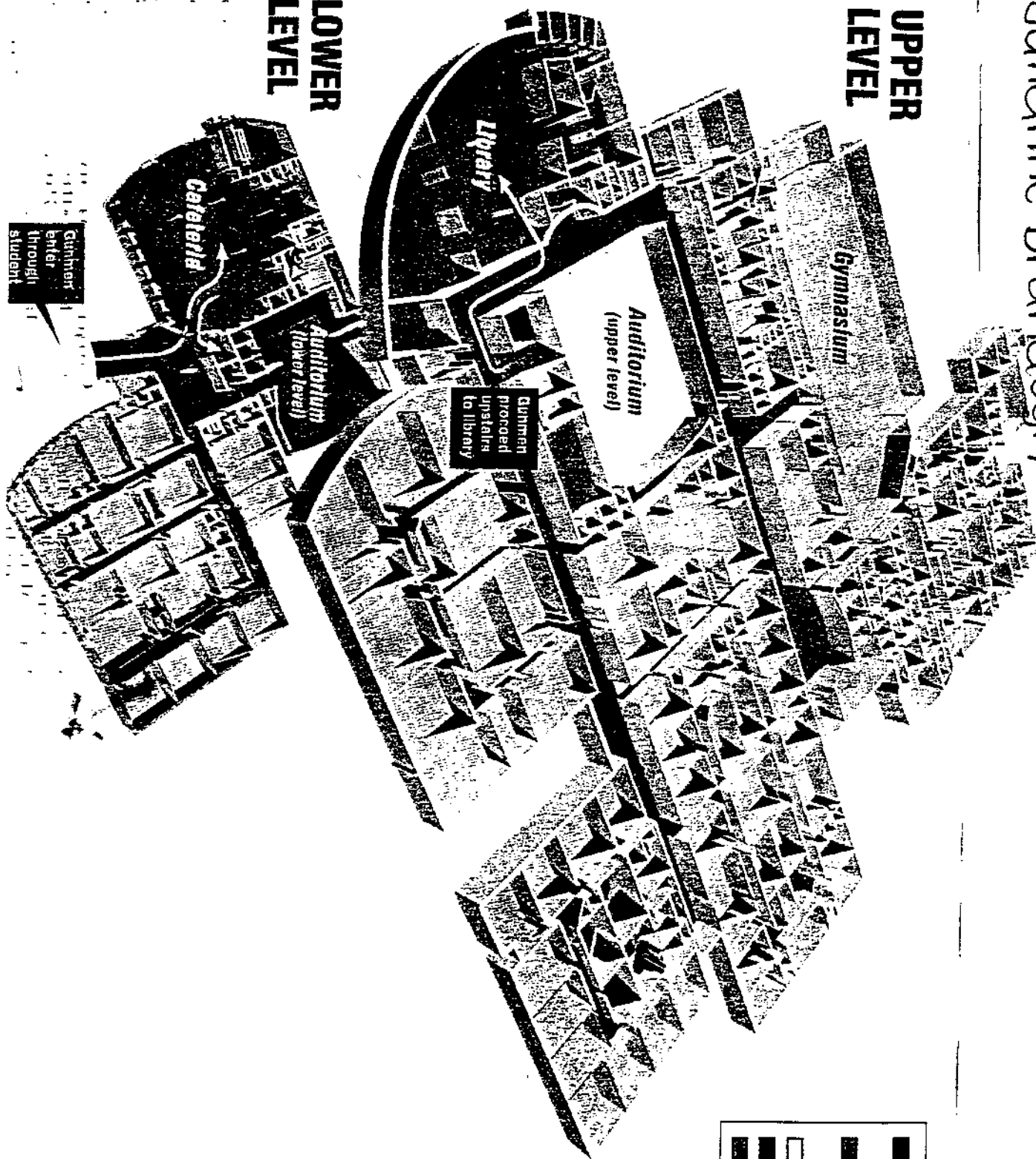

Justin stated that he arrived in the cafeteria at Columbine High School at around 1111 hours after he as released from his fourth period science class taught by Ms. Mosier. Justin did not observe anything out of the ordinary as he walked out of his fourth

period class and proceeded down into the cafeteria area. I provided Justin a map of the cafeteria and asked if he could tell me which table he was seated at. Justin identified table SS as the table he was seated at with his friends, Jesse Maddox, Tim (unknown last name), and Patrick Caruso. Justin advised after he arrived at the cafeteria that he placed his black Jansport backpack on a chair at his table in order to reserve his seat. Justin waited a few minutes before he proceeded into the food service line and later got his lunch and proceeded back to the table. Justin stated that he was seated facing west and that he could see out the west windows. Shortly after he had returned to the table and began to eat his lunch, he remembers hearing popping noises, which he later identified as gunshots, coming from outside the cafeteria. As Justin stood up, he could see that there was an unidentified person, a white male, lying on the grass to the west of the cafeteria and that the individual appeared to have some type of leg injury. Justin explained that the person had been shot in the leg. After seeing this, he remembers that somebody within the cafeteria started yelling to get down. Justin got underneath the table and later started to crawl to the middle of the cafeteria area. After crawling for several feet he stood up and proceeded to run with the other students to the stairs and continued up to the main level in the school. Justin explained that once he reached the top of the stairs that he heard either two explosions or two gunshots and they were coming from the cafeteria area.

Justin ran east from the top of the stairs, down the math/science hallway, and exited from the high school at the east doors. Justin stated that once he exited Columbine High School, he decided he was going to run home. He ran east down Fair Street and later flagged down a passing motorist who took him home.

Justin was asked if he observed a gunman while he was in the cafeteria area of Columbine High School or if he saw a gunman when he was looking out the west windows. He stated he did not see any gunmen. Justin was told about two large duffle bags or gym bags that were located within the cafeteria, one being blue in color and the other being reddish/orange in color. I asked if he observed those two items or if he saw anyone bring those into the cafeteria. Justin stated he had no idea who they belong to and he never saw the duffle bags.

I asked Justin if he remembers where the person who was lying in the grass outside the high school went. He stated that he remembers the individual was alive and he was limping towards the soccer fields.

Justin was asked if he knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, specifically the members, who the members were or if he knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Justin stated he did not know any of the individuals associated with that group. I asked if he was aware that Eric Harris had a web site. Again, he told me that he did not know anything about these individuals, and that he had no idea about the web site. Justin was asked if there were any rumors about school or anything significant that was going to happen on April 20th. He advised that he knew that April 20 meant something to the marijuana smokers, it was some type of a holiday

Justin was asked if he remembered what time he arrived home. He couldn't provide the exact time. His mom, Donna Bryant, stated that after Justin arrived home they started to hear the emergency vehicles which were responding to Columbine High School. Unfortunately, she could not provide the exact time that he arrived home.

Justin was asked if he could describe his clothing description on the incident date. Justin stated that he did not remember what he was wearing. Other than Justin's backpack, there was no other additional items that he had left in the school. At the completion of my interview I had Justin depicted on the cafeteria map where he was seated and his movement out of the cafeteria. A copy of that map is attached with this supplemental report.

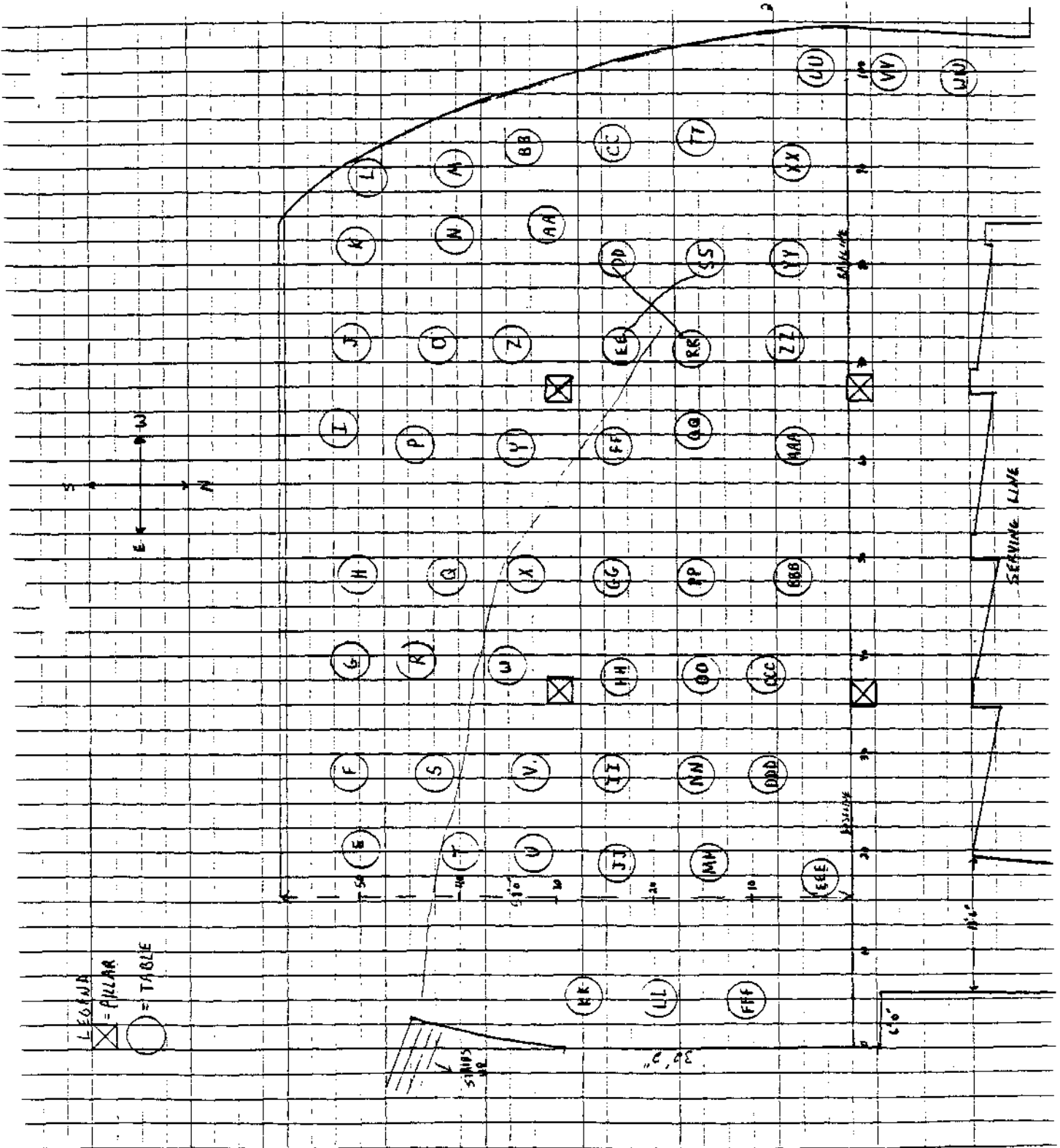

This investigator conducted a follow-up interview with this witness.

Nicholas (Nick) stated he was nearest the West door of the Cafeteria, where the door faces South and the window is waist high facing West.

He stated his friends, Dan and Lance were on the ground near the bottom of the stairs when he looked out the window. Shawn Graves was lying down next to the door on the outside of the cafeteria.

Nick stated he then saw the suspect walk down from the stairs outside and thru the window Nick observed the suspect shooting at Dan and Lance.

Nick described the suspect as a white male, with brown ear length hair, 6', skinny wearing a long black trench coat. He appeared to be shooting a rifle, because the length was long. Nick stated the suspect fired very quickly like 5 or 6 times.

Nick stated he then looked across the cafeteria and saw an explosion near the student store outside the cafeteria near the hall leading

to exit/entry door of the senior parking lot. He feels the time from the shooting until the explosion seemed like 1 or 2 minutes.

Nick stated at this time students went into the employees restroom and hid. He stated they went out the West door after a period of time and Dan, his friend, was lying face up at this time. Nick stated earlier Dan was face down when shot. Nick stated they all ran to a blue car where a policeman was and they all gathered near him. He thinks it was seven students. After a short period of time they were led to the soccer field fence and climbed over it to a waiting police car and then taken to a place by the ambulances.

Nick stated he left his backpack in the cafeteria, near the employees restroom. He stated it was black and was an "East Pack" brand.

NOTE: Nick stated he and some friends visited with Shawn Graves at Denver Medical Center and Shawn was able to communicate that he (Shawn) saw five or six people throwing devices in the Cafeteria.

The interview was concluded at this time.

INVESTIGATION:

On 04-27-99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN1021, an interview of John Bujaci. Detective Samacki and I responded to 7131 South Webster Street in Littleton where we were met. John and his father. John had been identified as possibly being in the cafeteria at Columbine High School on 04-20-99 when the incident began. He had been identified as being in the cafeteria via a backpack that was recovered by criminalistics units that processed Columbine High School.

John told us that he been driven to Columbine High School by his father and had been dropped off at approximately 0715 hours on 04-20-99. He entered the building through the main entrance and went to his science class, which is in the upper level. He had a science class for first hour and the second hour he went to his band class, which is located in the band room. For third hour he left the band room and went to math at his math room and for fourth hour he left the math room and went to English in his English room. John Bujaci said that prior to going to his science class and trips between classes, he had not observed any suspicious activity, suspicious persons or any backpacks or duffle bags that appeared to be unattended. He said it seemed like a normal school day.

After John Bujaci's English class, he went to lunch in the cafeteria. He is in what is referred to as the "A" lunch. He said that he walked down the stairs, along the wall, passed the exits, then between the pillars, to his table. He said that he thought his table was near where the condiments stand is located. He said when he arrived

most of his friends were already at the table, sitting and talking. He said that he sat down and that several seconds to minutes later, a teacher, Mr. Sanders, came into the cafeteria from what he believed was the entrance by the faculty lounge yelling, "get down". He said that he heard other people yelling but did not see where the yelling was coming from and he immediately dropped down under the lunch table. He then heard people yelling "he's coming". He said that he could hear several gunshots and that he noticed that most of the people were running out of the cafeteria and that everyone was running to the east toward the stairs. He too began to run and made his way through the cafeteria between the pillars toward the service line and then to the north toward the auditorium. He said that as he passed the freight elevator, someone pushed him into the elevator. He said that the elevator was extremely crowded but he didn't know anyone else inside. He said that they waited approximately ten seconds and then someone pushed buttons and they went up. He said when the door opened on the second floor, there was bluish smoke all throughout the air. He said it was smoky but he was still able to breath without covering his mouth. He said somebody immediately reached over and hit the down button on the elevator and they went back down. He said that when the elevator door opened on the second floor he could now hear gunfire from behind him and to his right indicating in the area of the library. He said he is not familiar with what guns sound like but thought that the sounds were that of firecrackers.

He also said that he heard explosions going off around him and he assumed the explosions were by the library. The elevator then went down to the cafeteria level.

John Bujaci said that when the elevator door opened, Mr. Andres, a choir teacher, and Lee Andres were opening the auditorium doors to their left and escorting the kids out of the elevator into the auditorium. He said that as he went through the auditorium there were people hiding between the seats and in the rows and that the fire alarms were going off inside the auditorium. John Bujaci said that he could still hear gunshots and he ran through the auditorium to one of the rows and then hid in between the seats.

John Bujaci identified Jay, a school security, or "narcotics guy" who came in and told the kids that were in the auditorium to get up. He said ten or fifteen minutes had transpired since he got off the elevator and was in the auditorium. He was now instructed that they were going to go out through the auditorium doors back through the cafeteria, passed the stairs and out through the lower level. He said that he was with a group of 50 to 60 students, that Jay, the security officer, told them that it was clear and that they should run and not look around and go as fast as they could to get out of the building. The group of students then ran the direction that they were told

by teachers across the east side of the cafeteria, passed the stairwell, down the hall, passed the food cart and out an east facing door. They then ran up a hill and across Pierce Street into the park. He said that they were in the park approximately fifteen minutes when they heard shooting again from the school and were told that they should run into the neighborhoods because they thought the shooting might be directed toward the park. John Bujaci thought that probably 30 minutes transpired from the beginning of the incident to the time he was in the park.

John Bujaci indicated that he been sitting at the table with Dustin Gordon, Sean Roberts, Greg Garcia, Austin (last name unknown), Paul (last name unknown), Bret (last name unknown), Richie (last name unknown), and Danny Lab. He further stated that when everyone started to run out of the cafeteria he was separated from these students.

When John Bujaci got into the park, he met up with friends, Chase Elmore and John Bright. He did not know where they had come from. John Bujaci said that he had a blue backpack, brand name was Eastpack. He said that there was writing on it which included the words "Metallica", "Ozzie", and "Megadeath". He said that inside the backpack should be his math book, his English book, his notebook with assorted papers, his Sharp scientific calculator, and his drumsticks. He said that he left these items behind but did not leave anything else at the table.

John Bujaci said that he was wearing a Bronco Super Bowl T-shirt and black jeans.

John Bujaci said that he does not know ERIC HARRIS or DYLAN KLEBOLD and he doesn't recall seeing them in the school ever before. He did say that he has heard of the "trench coat mafia" but he has had no problems or run-ins with anyone in the group. He said that he has not hear about anyone else or other suspects or any student discussing bomb making or gun buying. John Bujaci said that at no time on Monday or Tuesday did he see anything unusual in the school that would lead him in retrospect to believe that he may have seen packaging for bomb material that was left in the school. He also added that it is very difficult to tell in the cafeteria what backpacks or duffle bags are left because students routinely come into the cafeteria, place their backpack on a table, chair or floor to claim a spot and then go get on the lunch line.

John Bujaci also indicated on a map which is attached, where the students were sitting at his table and where his table was located.

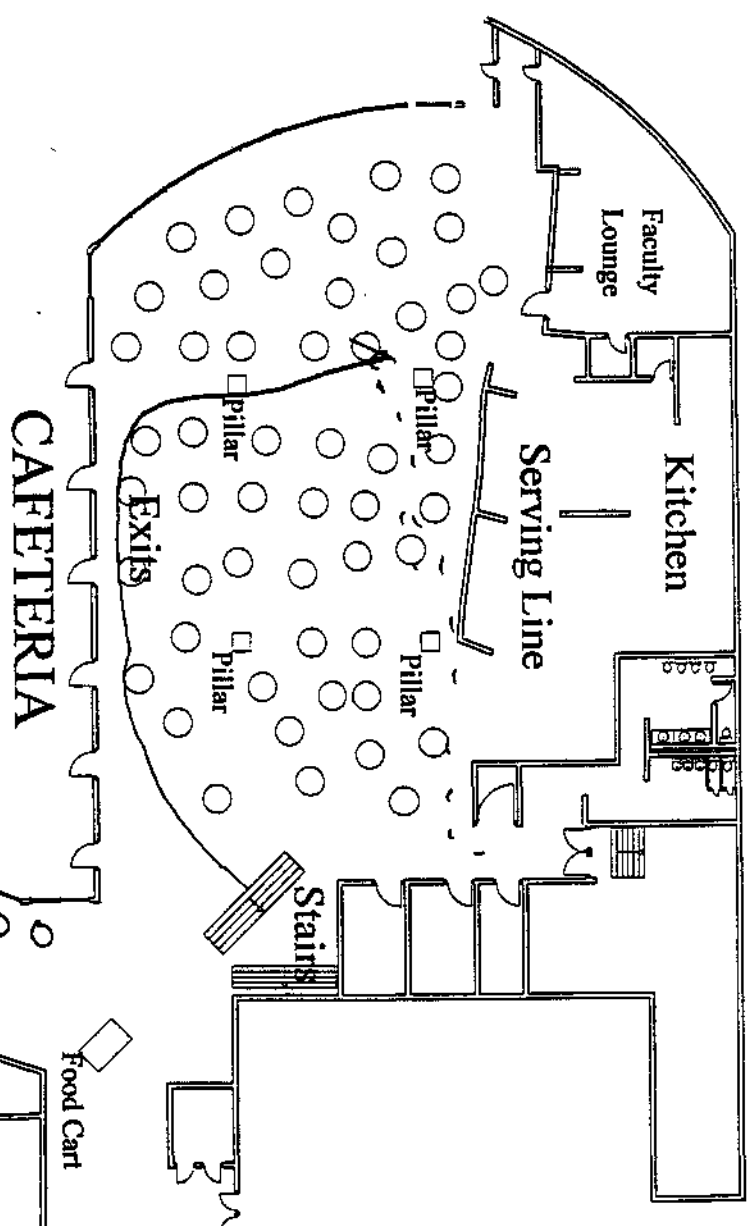
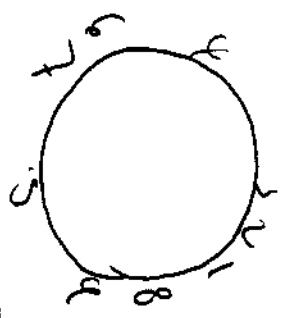

Jacqueline and John Burgess. Kelly did in fact confirm that she is on the "A" lunch list and that she was in the cafeteria when the incident began.

Burgesser said that she drove her car to school on 4/20/99 and that she arrived at school at approximately 7:10am to 7:15am, and that she parked in her assigned parking space, number 263. She said she entered the school through the west cafeteria door, or walked through the upper door on the west side into the library. She said she couldn't recall exactly which way she got into the school that day. She said that she does not go to her locker, the other student uses the locker and she uses her car as her locker. She said that she went to her first hour Spanish class, which is the corner room in the Foreign Language wing, which is taught by Mrs. Birch-Sterling; then left that class to go to her second hour class on the main level, the Physics room, taught by Mr. Manuello. Then left the second hour class to go to her third hour calculus class which is taught by Mr. Higgins. She said that she has fourth hour off and she went to her car, through the back doors, and then went to the library to study. She said that at about 10:50am she went down to the commons and met her friend Jennifer Doyle. She said that she wasn't feeling well, and then went to the payphones by the main office to call her mother so that her mother could contact the office and give her a sick excuse. She said that Jennifer was with her at that time. She said that after she called her mother, she then went into the Science department to Mr. Johnson's class. She had a class where some baby chicks were being experimented on and they needed an injection. However, Mr. Johnson was busy and she didn't have time to speak with him. She then went back downstairs into the commons to look for a friend and was getting ready to leave when a girl came running in through the east most southerly door and yelled that someone had been shot. She said that about the same time, Mr. Sanders came running through the commons near the serving line and was yelling for students to *get down*. She said that she went down behind a table by the student entrance and attempted to go out through the student entry doors. However she thinks there was a female teacher by the doors telling them not to go out that way because they did not know who was outside. She said that as she was getting under the table, she saw a mad panicked rush for the stairs, and she decided to run down the hall into the Foreign Language wing. She ran as far

down the hallway as she could go and then turned and ended up in a corner room with three female teachers, one of them being Mrs. Lucas, the other two she doesn't know. She said that as she arrived into that room, there were fire alarms going off, and she heard two, what she described as loud, explosions and several gunshots. The gunshots were spaced far apart and were not repetitive. She said that these sounds seemed to come from directly above her in the Science area. After these loud explosions, the teachers decided that they needed to get out of the building, and they ran out the south exit doors, and across the junior parking lot to the house on the corner of Polk and Pierce. She met a friend there, Kelly Dickson, and Kelly drove her home. She estimated that she arrived home at approximately 11:50am. She thought that perhaps she was in the Foreign Language room with Mrs Lucas for approximately ten minutes before evacuating the building. She said the other students she recognized in the Foreign Language room were Leigh Kamens, Steven Trujillo, Heather Dinkle, and Steven Lebsack. Burgess said that she did not see any of the suspects. She did not notice any duffle bags or backpacks in the commons area during any of the time that she was in there.

Burgess has heard of the trench coat mafia, and only knew that they wore trench coats and preferred to wear dark colors. She said that she knew who [REDACTED] was, but only by sight; she wouldn't describe herself as a friend or even an acquaintance. She said that in her sophomore year she had Dylan Klebold in some of her classes. She recalls that at that time he didn't appear to be into the dark clothing and the trench coat mafia. She never had any problems with him in any of her classes. She did not know who Eric Harris was, and does not recall ever seeing him at school. Burgess does have Internet access at home, but does not have an ICQ account, nor a screen name. She hasn't accessed any trench coat mafia sites on the Internet. She was in school during the Rebel News Network *thought of the day*, but did not see it. She's heard since that it had something to do with it not being a good day to be at the school, or 4:20 indicating that it was National Pot Smoking Day. Burgess does not know anyone with a double pierced eyebrow. The only other information Burgess could provide is that she knew there had been Prom signs posted around the school, and that on the Prom signs it said *it's coming...4/17/99*. She said she had heard that the 17 was crossed out and changed to a 20, and that the Prom

She said that the students on the Senate are Kelly Dickson, Kelly Adragona, Ben Price and Justin Carson. Burgesser could provide no further information on the suspects. She also has not heard of any students stockpiling weapons, ammunition, or talking about making bombs.

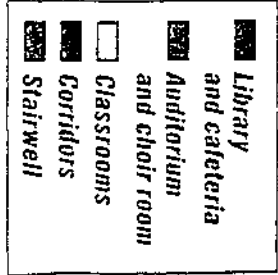
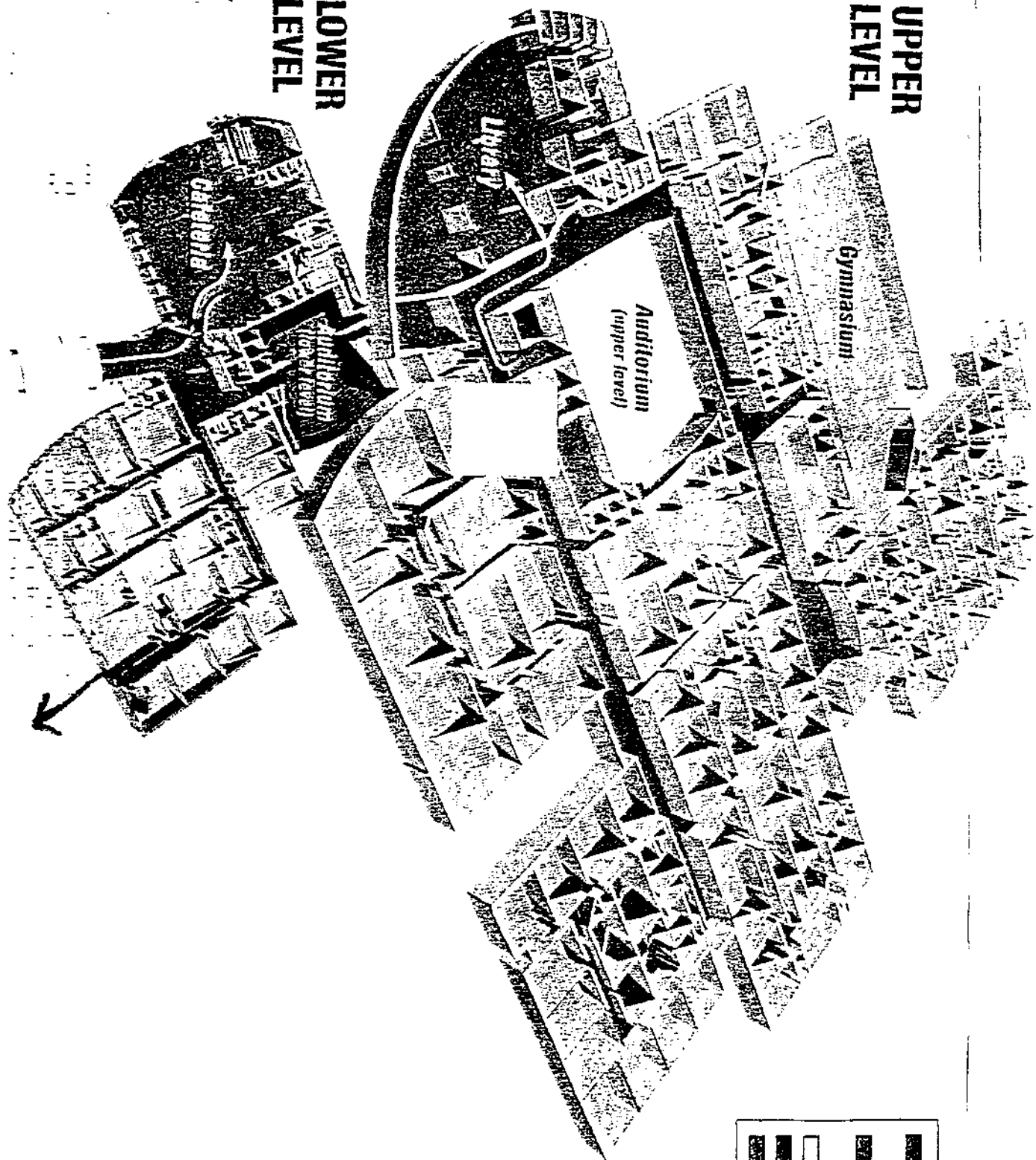

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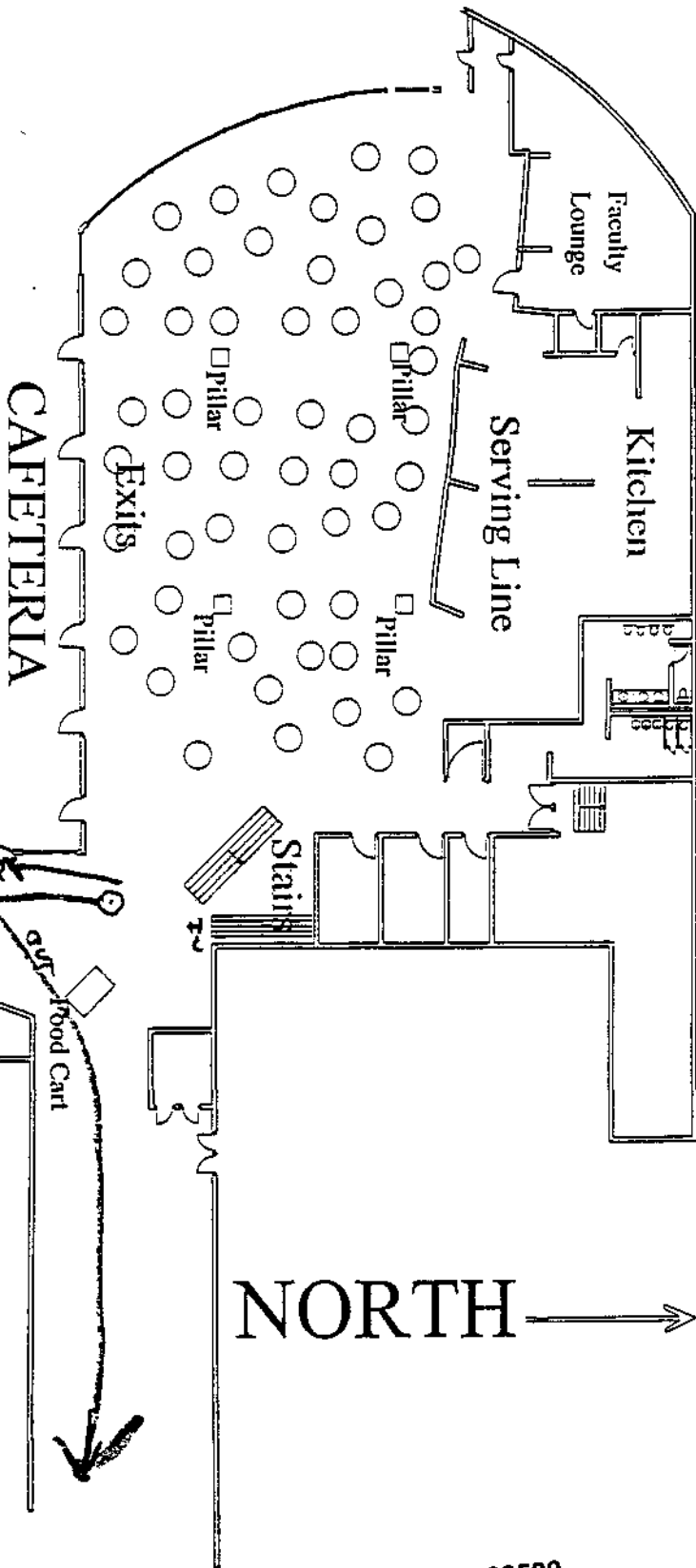
