FONCANNON went into a storeroom next to the kitchen bathroom, where he stayed for approximately two hours. He stated that he heard shots during that time. He and the others were ultimately escorted from the building by the SWAT team. FONCANNON believed that he heard shots during this time. FONCANNON estimated that there were 18 individuals in the storage room and that he did not know any of them. He believed that three were cafeteria employees, one was a janitor, one a male faculty member, and the rest, students.

FONCANNON stated that the SWAT team led them up the stairs on the west side of the cafeteria, and behind a fire truck which escorted them away from the building. FONCANNON was then driven in a marked police unit to the student parking lot located in Clement Park.


FONCANNON stated that he never saw the gunman, nor any unusual items or objects within the cafeteria. FONCANNON stated that he did remember that the school announcement said something to the effect of "You shouldn't be here".

FONCANNON advised that he did not know Eric HARRIS or Dylan KLEBOLD. He had heard of the Trench Coat Mafia, and believed there were approximately ten students who wore dark trench coats to school on occasion. FONCANNON stated that he did not know anything else about the group, or any of its members.


FONCANNON advised that he has access to the Internet via America On Line. His screen name is KFT43. He was not aware of the Eric HARRIS or Trench Coat Mafia-related websites until after the incident.

FONCANNON stated that on April 20, 1999, he wore a white baseball cap, a grey "T" shirt under a green long sleeve shirt, and blue jeans. FONCANNON stated that he left the green shirt behind in the storage room.

On 04-22-99, I telephoned witness Sandra Inman at 1445 hours due to the fact that she had called the Sheriff's Office stating that she had information concerning the Columbine High School shootings.

Witness Inman stated that she had a student named Lisa Forgan who had told her that she was in the cafeteria the entire time the incident was occurring, and that Forgan was hiding underneath a table when two armed suspects entered the cafeteria. Witness Inman said she was told by Forgan that these individuals were not wearing trench coats and described the individuals as one having long blond hair and an orange shirt and the other individual having blond hair.

Witness Inman stated that she believes Forgan told her that possibly she could ID these individuals if she could look through a yearbook and those photos were in there.

DISPOSITION: Case open, pending further investigation.

TERROR IN THE CAFETERIA CONTROL 4 1858

The date was Tuesday, April 20, 1999, and a terrible thing happened. I was sitting at one of the far corner tables in the lunchroom. My friends Billy and J. J. was sitting next to me. There was nothing different about the day. It was beautiful and jammed packed in the cafeteria. My friends and I talked about the school's system and stories. It was half-way into the period of "A" lunch. That's when the unexpected happened. I saw kids run into the cafeteria in fright. I was scared and confused. The kids were screaming and saying that there was a man with a gun. A girl was crying hysterically as the man try to get in. The doors were locked. Everyone got under the tables. One of the janitors yelled at me to get down. I noticed that he was tall and skinny. He had a bald area on his head. He was wearing a red sleeve-white shirt. I got under the center of my table. My friends were by the edge of me. I asked the girl what was the matter because she was sitting by the garbage still crying. She told me that AnnMarie got shot. I was scared. I heard gun shots in the cafeteria. I started to shake and cry silently. Everyone screamed in terror. I then heard the gunman throw pipe bombs. He was moving fast. I saw Mr. Kritzer. I felt so scared and worried and wondered what's going to happen. As the gunman ran into the cooking area, I heard Mr. Kritzer yell to get out. I saw everyone run towards the foreign language hall. Fear stood in my stomach. I told Billy and J. J. not to move and stay with me. As the other kids tried to leave, I heard everyone scream in terror as their lives were about to end. I saw the man shooting... he was tall with long blond hair and a big nose. He shot kids in that crowd. I heard more pipe bombs go off. Everyone left but I'm guessing 9kids were there in the corner near me. Smoke was in the room. I saw the first

gunman... he was medium size, narrow face, and had on a orange T-shirt with a blue cap. His hair was shaggy-curly blond. He kept throwing pipe bombs across the room. This guy also kept getting closer to us. Billy was going to leave and run. I told him not to leave and to stay. He did and I pointed to the direction that the second gunman may come in from. He did enter from there and he shot across the room and under most of the tables. Then, I saw the first gunman run across throwing more pipe bombs and being only 5ft from us. I saw him run towards (I think) the janitor. The other gunman was circling around inside and out. I was fearing that he could see me. I had nothing blocking me from sight. I heard what may have been the janitor yell at the man to put the gun down. The gunman yelled something back in German. I heard gunshots and the cooks scream. Silence swept across for a minute. They continued to throw pipe bombs and shoot in the cafeteria. I could feel the floor shake more violently. After being under the table for over an hour or more, I felt as if I was going to vomit. Smoke was everywhere. I heard them fire and a loud burst of a gas pipe. Gas swept into the room. My mind cried of panic. I knew it was gas and feared that the gummen may fire. They shot into the gas and fire swept across the ground. It took one second for it to reach 3ft to me. I panicked and felt the heat seek through me. I yelled run-fire-run-fire. We ran out the nearest door. We feared of being burned alive-getting shot also than escaping-getting shot. We ran down the South Parking Lot and hid behind a brown car as someone yelled that there was a man on the roof. We heard gun shots outside. We all felt the need of using the bathroom. Every 15 minutes the gunman would run outside and shoot. We feared of being noticed. Especially since, it may have been, Channel 4News helicopter circling around us. A girl with red hair cam up and hid with us. Another girl hiding behind another nearby car told

us that kids were still inside and were waving to get out. We sat in fear waiting to be rescued. We saw an ambulance drive by. I definitely knew that Billy, J. J., the girl, and I wanted to jump onto the ambulance and bring us home. Of course we didn't, but we waited. It was another hour or more till another cop directed us to safety. We ran to the fence and ran out towards the track field. A cop searched each of us to make sure that we didn't have any weapons. We were brought to a safe area around the corner in the street. A cop talked to me and I knew that he wasn't really caring about what I saw. I saw Mr. Kritzer limping. I asked him why he was limping and he told me it was because the pipe bomb struck near him. A brave man he is to help direct kids through the slaughtering nightmare. Billy and I stood near for feel of safety. We walked towards Leawood Elementary. That is where Billy met with his family and my brother, Mike, found me in tears.



On 09-27-99, at approximately 1020 hours, Lisa Forgan and her father Emanuel "Manny" Forgan responded to JCSO Investigations Unit so that a follow-up interview could be conducted with Lisa Forgan. Present during the interview with Lisa was her father, Emanuel Forgan. At this time I asked Lisa Forgan to relate what had occurred on the date of the incident, 04-20-99, at which time she advised me that at approximately 1100 hours she sat at what she indicated was table "J" in the cafeteria with William Hanifen and Justin Cozart. She said they were the only people sitting at this table, which is verified by the videotape of the cafeteria. She stated that she had her back to the main portion of the cafeteria and that Cozart was to her right and Hanifen was to her left, and both parties had their back to the wall and doors. She advised that they were just talking when people started getting under the tables around them. She stated at first they didn't realize what was going on. She said that Jay, the janitor, had run by telling them to get under the table. Lisa Forgan stated when she got under the table at this time she still did not realize what shappening. After getting under the table she said she heard gunshots coming from outside the cafeteria area, and that she

thought it was approximately five shots that were fired. Lisa Forgan advised that people began to scream in the cafeteria area and it became very loud. She stated that she remained laying flat underneath table "J" with both Cozart and Hanifen when she believes she sees one of the gunman run from the school store area, which is inside the cafeteria, towards the teacher's lounge. She said that she thought the gunman had a gun in his right hand and that he was firing into the air. Forgan described the gunman as wearing an orange T-shirt with a blue baseball cap on backwards. 17 to 18 years of age, white male with a large nose with what she believed was either a dirty dishwater colored hair sticking out from underneath the cap. She advised that she thought the gunman fired ten shots into the air as he was running across the cafeteria area. She advised that everybody was still in the cafeteria while this was going on. The video shows during this time sequence that Forgan is talking about is actually teachers and janitors running with portable radios in their hands. After this, she stated everybody began to get up and run towards the stairway and the halls, away from where she was sitting. Forgan stated that she stayed underneath the table, along with Cozart and Hanifen, and that she could hear more gunshots, approximately eight, going off. She said everybody began screaming again and that at this time she 1 her face buried in her arms. She advised she also saw a teacher by the name of Kritzer, who was wearing bluish colored dress pants, and a multi colored plaid dress shirt, in the cafeteria with the kids and that he also left with the kids when they all started to move towards the staircase area. The videotape of the cafeteria shows that Kritzer remains behind in the cafeteria after the kids have fled. The video also shows a pipe bomb going off near Kritzer, which knocked him down. Forgan then stated she saw a second suspect, who was possibly wearing a black shirt or coat, and who was tall, over by the cafeteria line. She stated that the suspect again was running from the serving line towards the school store inside the cafeteria. She also advised that there was explosions going on during this time frame. She advised that the room was filling with smoke from the explosions and that after a while the first suspect she described started shooting under tables. The video shows pipe bombs going off and Harris and Klebold coming into the cafeteria. The video then shows Harris firing his weapon. She stated she then began to hear gas escaping, which she believed was coming from the kitchen area. She stated that this suspect was approximately five to ten feet away from her. She stated that eventually the gas erupted into flames and exploded. She said the flames came close to her feet, at which time her, Cozart, and Hanifen ran out of the cafeteria. She advised that she believed there were at least five other kids in the cafeteria with her when they all exited the door. She stated she estimated her time inside the cafeteria anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour Once exiting the cafeteria, she stated that they ran in a crouched position to the parking lot area, and while doing so they ran past : person lying on the ground, who she just glanced at and could not tell if they were injured or alive or dead. She stated that Hanifer state" "Oh a dead body." She advised she was just concerned with getting out into the parking lot area and undercover.

I asked her about the reference she made in her typed report about a person being on the roof. She stated she heard somebody say there was someone on the roof, but she did not see this person because when she got behind a car in the parking lot she put her head down into someone's lap and did not look up after that. I had Forgan indicate to me where in the parking lot she was. She indicated she was possibly behind car #GBN4990. I then asked her about the reference she made to the gunmen coming out every 15 minutes and shooting. She again stated that she did not see anything because her head was down and that she heard gunshots in about this time frame and assumed it was possibly the gunmen coming outside to shoot. I indicated to her that she noted in her report that a girl with red hair had joined them. She stated that she did not know this girl's name, and did not know who she was. She said that this girl had come to where she was at during the shooting.

I then told Forgan that I would like to go over her report and ask specific questions about statements she had made in it tha had not already been clarified by her statement to me to this point. She indicated in her report that someone was trying to get in the doors of the cafeteria and was knocking on them and alluded to the fact that possibly it was a suspect. She stated that she did not see who was knocking on the doors, and had no idea if it was students trying to get in out of the line of fire or if i was suspects trying to get inside. I then asked about the statement where she said that he shot kids in the crowd. She stated that she thought the suspects were shooting kids in the cafeteria that were trying to flee. She stated that she thought the suspect was inside the cafeteria at this time when the kids were initially trying to flee the area. This was later clarified by the video and conversations with Forgan, which showed that the people inside the cafeteria at this time who she originally thought were the gunmen were in fact the janitors and some teachers running back and forth. Forgan stated she had heard gunfire going off at this time and thought it was now inside the cafeteria. I then asked her about her statement that the gunmen were going inside and out. She stated that this was inside and out of the cafeteria. She advised that she never actually saw the gunmen go inside or out of the cafeteria, and that she just assumed that's what they were doing. Forgan indicated in the report that once was outside in the parking lot that there were still kids inside and they were waving to get out. Forgan said that she did not see this and only heard kids in the area talking about kids still inside the school and waving. Forgan advised me that during the time that she was in the cafeteria there were no alarms going off. She stated that the only noise inside the cafeteria was gunshots, explosions or kids screaming. She stated that the alarms did not actually go off until the explosions and fireball when she exited the cafeteria, and that is the first time she heard any fire alarms. During the interview, Forgan indicated where she thought the gunmen were running back and forth in the cafeteria.

which was from the staircase to the serving line of the cafeteria. Upon viewing the video and speaking further with Forgan, it was clarified that in fact what she was seeing was the janitors and teachers in this area prior to the suspects entering the cafeteria. After Forgan again described the suspects she saw, she was shown photographs of Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris in the cafeteria area. Forgan pointed at the photograph of Dylan Klebold and stated, "That's the guy I saw." She stated also that the gun Klebold was carrying was the same gun she described and that she saw during the incident that the gunman was holding. She then pointed to Eric Harris and stated that this was in fact the other person she had seen during the incident. Forgan advised me that she had her face buried in her arms during part of the incident in the cafeteria and after seeing the



INVESTIGATION:

On 05-04-99, at about 0930 hours, I met with witness Bartholomew Foster and his mother, witness Mona Kail, at their residence, 172 West Alder Avenue. Bartholomew Foster advised me of the following.

On 04-20-99, just after i 100 hours. Bartholomew Foster was in the cafeteria at Columbine High School eating his lunch, when he saw several other students stand up and look out of the windows of the cafeteria. Foster advised he did not look out of the window to see what was taking place; however, he believed there was a fight going on outside of the cafeteria. Foster advised he glanced towards the windows at one point and saw smoke outside of the cafeteria. At approximately the same time, a teacher by the name of Mr. Sanders, came into the cafeteria from outside of the cafeteria doors and told everyone inside to get down on the floor. Foster advised that at this time, he was with other students, only two of which he could remember their names, one was Eric Sunde and the other was Sean Hooker. Foster advised there were four other students; however, he does not remember who they were, nor did he remember where each of the students were sitting at the table in the cafeteria prior to this incident. Foster advised after he was under the table for approximately two minutes, he began crawling across the cafeteria floor towards the hallway and the stairs which lead to the second floor of the high school. Foster advised he crawled a short distance, and then he stood up and began running with other students towards the stairway and up the stairs. He also advised that he could see smoke on the stairway. Foster said once at the top of the stairway, he turned to his left and ran down the hall a short distance to the Science room, where he entered the Science room with six other students to hide.

Foster advised that while they were hiding in the Science room, the total of the people that would eventually be in this room was 20 people including two teachers. Foster advised that one of the teachers stood at the two doors holding a fire extinguisher in case the suspects were able to gain entry to this room through the door, they were going to use the extinguishers as weapons for protection. Foster said at one point, he heard somebody outside of the door, and heard two voices talking, of which he could only hear the words "didn't care." Foster advised it sounded like male voices; however, he was not certain. He said when the voices were heard, or just prior to this, the students and teachers had put a table up against the door to block it from opening. Foster said a gunshot went through the window of the door and continued inside of the room through the table that had been put up against the door to block it. He said this builtet narrowly missed hitting Mr Sanders. Foster advised people were hiding in the Science room and were there approximately one to two hours, until they were rescued from this room by SWAT Team members

Foster advised he did not see either suspect during the incident: however, he remembers seeing Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris inside Columbine High School in the past. He said he recalls one of the suspect's wearing a red baret one time when he saw him inside the school. He said he did not know any of their names prior to this incident however. He also advised he has not heard anyone talk about the Trench Coat Mafia as being violent students within the school. He said they hung around with each other, and pretty much stayed to themselves.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Bartholomew Foster said he did not see any duffle bags inside the cafeteria on 04-20-99, nor did he see a propane tank that was in the cafeteria. He said it would have been difficult to see these bags due to the fact that most of the students that go into the cafeteria carry their own backpacks and set them down. Foster advised he had taken his blue Jansport backpack into the cafeteria when he entered it at about 1100 hours, and put it on the floor next to the table he was sitting at, and said he also had a lacrosse stick that was with him in the cafeteria that he left behind when he ran. Foster said he had been sitting at a table closest to the window within the cafeteria with his back to the window, facing into the interior of the cafeteria. This is when he heard "a couple of bangs."

I advised Bartholomew Foster and his mother, Mona Kail, that should they desire any counseling in reference to this incident, to contact me and I would arrange for a JCSO Victim Advocate to contact them.

"ISPOSITION: Case remains open, pending further investigation.



INVESTIGATION:

On April 26, 1999, Investigator Reker and I met with Kelcy Fowler at her residence, reference the shooting at Columbine High School.

I first explained to Kelcy why we were there and asked her to look at a sketch of the cafeteria at the School. I asked Kelcy if she could circle the table where she was sitting the day of the shooting and place an "X" in the chair that she had occupied. Kelcy circled the table marked "MM". I asked Kelcy if she was sitting with anyone and she stated yes, she was and gave me ten other names. I asked Kelcy if she could tell me what had happened that morning. Kelcy said the first thing they have on Tuesday are announcements and the announcement for the day was "Today is going to be a really bad day". Kelcy said that these ncements come out after second period, which is approximately 8:25 a.m. Keicy said that she has fourth period off and goes directly to the lunch room, which is at approximately 10:15 a.m. Keicy said at about 11:20 a.m., the janitor ran into the cafeteria, along with coach Sanders and was telling everyone to get down, get underneath the tables. Kelcy said that when everyone was under the tables her friend, Bae got on top of them and told them all to lay down. Kelcy said she remembered seeing Matt Katzmeir looking out the windows on the west side of the building. Kelcy said she didn't know what he had seen while looking out there. I asked Kelcy if she heard any gun shots and she said no, she did not. I asked Kelcy if she saw anyone with guns or any type of bombs. She said no, she did not. I asked Kelcy what happened once they were under the table. She said the janitor and Mr. Sanders then told the students to run up the stairs toward the library, which they did. Kelcy said once they started running up the stairs she did hear gun shots. Kelcy said the students then went to the auditorium where Mr. Andres, Sr., was. Kelcy said once in the auditorium they went on into the gym and then exited the gym and went outside. I asked Kelcy if she heard any names being called while they were running and she said "no". I asked Kelcy if she ever saw who was doing the shooting and she said, no, she did not.

Kelcy said that her friend Ashley Egeland told her that she saw a boy named proposed a gun at her. Ashley told Kelcy that said fired a shot at her, but did not hit her. I asked if she knew what has last name was and she said she believed it was the said to a lasked Kelcy if she knew and she said no, she did not. I asked if she knew either of the suspects and she said she knew both of them and they were always friendly to her and she had no concern about them. INVESTIGATION:

On April 20, 1999, while assisting with interviews on the scene of a multiple homicide at Columbine High School, I interviewed Columbine student named Paul R. Freeman. Freeman told me that he was eating lunch in the cafeteria of the school when a teacher ran into the room and shouted, "Run." At about the same time, he heard someone else yelling about some "guys with guns" and he heard what sounded like gunshots. Freeman said that he saw "a real tall" male wearing a black trenchcoat with some type of gun, but he was unsure of the exact description of the firearm. Freeman told me that he had seen the male around the school wearing his black trenchcoat, but said that he did not know the male's name. Freeman told me that this male normally wore a black ball cap of some type, and generally wore that ball cap turned around backwards. When I asked for a further description, Freeman told me that this male was about 6'3" tall, with medium to long brown hair and a "thin beard."

Freeman told me that he did not see anyone shot, and again said that he really didn't look at the gun(s) long enough to get any type of description of them. Freeman said that "everybody ran" from the cafeteria, and he remembered hearing "big explosions" as he ran.

Paul Ryan Freeman, DOB:10/22/83, 5528 South Iris Street, Littleton, Colorado, was contacted regarding lead DN27.

Freeman was in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting. He was seated near the Southwest entrance to the cafeteria (from the parking lot).

People in the cafeteria started yelling that there was a fight. Freeman started towards the doors to the parking lot and saw one suspect coming towards the school. He described the suspect as:

White male, black baseball cap (backwards), long hair pulled behind his ears, black duster type coat down to his ankles (dirty colored), black pants. He was not wearing a mask.

When asked who he initially thought the suspect was, Freeman stated "Klebold".

Freeman said the suspect had a weapon, possibly a shotgun, but he could only see the muzzle end of the gun.

Freeman ran to the common area and his under the stairs that go up towards the library. He remained there for ten minutes, hearing things hit the walls. He then grabbed a girl who was hiding under the drinking fountain and ran from the building.

He was directed from the school by teachers and had no other information.

Jessica Jade Friedman, DOB 10/13/1982, 5349 West Geddes Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)973-5557, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her brother, Matthew Friedman, by Special Agent(SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Friedman provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Friedman got out of class and then went directly to the cafeteria. Friedman did not see anything unusual on the way to the cafeteria. Friedman set her bookbag at the lunchroom table (marked HH on diagram sketch), got lunch, and sat back down. Friedman was sitting facing east. Friedman remembers that Ashley Pimley, Bryan Adam, Jill Kamens, and Tim Vacca, were also sitting at her table. Ashley Pimley was sitting to the left of Friedman. Friedman does not recall who was sitting to her right.

Friedman had been eating for about five minutes, when she looked over and saw that everyone on the west end of the cafeteria was getting under the tables. Friedman and everyone around her then climbed under their tables. After about two minutes, Friedman heard a couple of shots and everyone took off running. Friedman looked outside and saw a girl standing outside on the southwest corner of the cafeteria. The girl looked to be in shock and was holding her hands over her mouth and looking to the northwest. Friedman ran up the stairs and heard shots as she ran. Friedman then ran east down the main hall and out the exit at the end of the hall.

Friedman did not remember seeing any large duffle bags sitting in the cafeteria. Friedman did not see any of the gunmen. Friedman recalls seeing Dustin Gordon sitting at a lunchroom table in the vicinity of table marked QQ on the diagram sketch. Friedman did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of the other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia.

Friedman has heard rumors from some of the students that something bad is also supposed to happen 13 days after the incident at Columbine High School. Some of the students are



Friend said that he took the bus to school on 4/20/99 and it was Express #S1 that dropped him off at the main entrance. He estimated that he arrived at the school between 7:00am and 7:05am. He said that he usually then goes down to the commons to get something to eat. He said that he doesn't use his locker and carries all his books with him in his pack. He said that he would have arrived in the commons at approximately 7:05 to 7:10am and that he stayed there until approximately 7:25am. He viewed the two diagrams that the cafeteria provided, and indicated that he was sitting at table DD. He said that he was sitting with his friends Jeff Noll, Nate Canelli, and Justin and Mike Nafe. He said that at approximately 7:25 he left the commons area to go to his first hour Science class, which is located on the main level and taught by Ms. Mossier. He left his first hour Science class; he has second hour off and he went back to the commons area. He again viewed the diagram and Jicated that he had been seated at table JJ for second hour. He said that his friends Ben Johnson, Max Anderson, Drew McClusky, Jenny Nafe, and Arty Mar were also at table JJ during second hour, since they also have it off. Friend said that he left second hour to go to his third hour Spanish class which is in the lower level foreign language hall. The class is taught by Ms. Brug. He then went to his fourth hour class which is Team Sports, located in the gymnasium, taught by Coach Place and Coach Marshall. He said that he traveled down the main corridor to the stairwell to arrive at the "A" lunch. He said that he arrived just prior to the lunch bell, and that he didn't really sit down, but went over and put a pack on the table near the student entrance to the cafeteria across from the Rebel stand. He said that his attention was drawn to the main commons area when he saw students looking over tables towards the west windows. the street. The car was driven by a friend, Chris Dovan. He said Chris then took him to Pierce Street, and they went north on Pierce Street. As they were passing the main entrance to the school, there were masses of students and teachers running from the entrances crossing Pierce Street into Leawood Park. He said they had to stop their car because of all the students that were running across the street. He said they next went to Southwest Plaza where they met with other students and told them not to go back to the school.

Friend did not see any of the suspects. He also did not see any backpacks or duffle bags in the commons during any of the times that he was in there during the morning of 4/20/99.

Friend describes his backpack as a black, western pack, very large, and contains his math book, Spanish book, numerous binders, his calculator, and numerous homework papers with his name on them. He couldn't be sure iat he was wearing, but thought he was wearing shorts, a long sleeve T-shirt covered by a short sleeve T-shirt. Friend indicated that he'd heard of the trench coat mafia, but all he knew was that they were kids that liked to dress in black. He said the only person that he ever actually knew by name was Robert Perry, and he didn't really know him, just could recognize him. He did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Friend said that he does have Internet access at home but does not have an ICQ account. He had heard that the trench coat mafia liked the band KMFDM, and that there were KMFDM sites on the Internet. He said that this was some type of European or German Techno-Rock band. Friend does not know anybody with a double pierced eyebrow. He is not aware of any problems with the trench coat mafia and other students, and he is not aware of any students stockpiling weapons, ammunition or talking about making bombs.





Jonathan Fries said that he was running late for school on 4/20/99; he usually rides the bus, but on that particular day his mother drove him to school. When he arrived, he went in through the main entrance, and estimated that he arrived there at 0729 hours. He said that he immediately went to his first hour class, which is English, as he was running late. He says that he never goes to his locker between classes because he has all the books and paperwork that he needs in his pack. He said from English he went to his second hour class, which is Science, in the Science Hall, Mr. Moses is the Science teacher there. From the Science Hall he went to third hour class. Math, in the Math Hall. In his fourth hour class he went to the Band Room where he has Orchestra. He said his fourth hour class is usually ended a little early so that the students can put away their instruments, and from forth hour he goes to the "A" lunch in the commons, or cafeteria.

Fries said that he went down the stairs into the cafeteria and arrived there fairly early, approximately ten utes prior to the beil ringing. He estimated that he arrived there at 11:05. He said that he went right to his table and that the other students were already at the table. He identified the other students at the table as his friend Bo Lockwood, Eric Sunde, Jamie Amo, Tim Mulchey, Patrick Caruso, Justin (last name unknown), Laurie Reynolds, and a student he only knows as "Bear". He said that Bear is only a Freshman, but he is on the JV Football Team and he's nicknamed Bear because he is very large. He also said that other people came to visit and were moving from table to table. He said that Patrick Caruso's pack was at the table but he was actually at the lunch line when the incident began.

Fries did not buy lunch that day, but he did purchase a cherry Pepsi from the pop machine and a bag of Doritos. He went back to his table and at the table he took a sip of his soda and then heard a "pop" sound. Then he heard someone yell that there was a fight. fear of being shot, and then he heard someone yell they have guns, get out! They're coming in! He said that there was a panic and "a mad dash" for the stairs. He said that there were some other kids nearby that said that this was only a Senior prank. He could see that the stairs were packed, and a teacher, a janitor, opened the back stage doors to the auditorium. Fries said that he belly crawled from his position at the table to the east and he got up when he got by the auditorium doors. He said once they went through the doors they were on the stage in the auditorium. He said there was a guitar class going on, and they didn't believe the students as they came into the stage as to what was going on. He said that one student jumped up from playing his guitar and yelled "we're all going to die!", and sat back down and continued playing his guitar. He said that they then moved into the lighting room and down off the stage into the auditorium. He said they then worked their way through the auditorium to the rear doors. He said that as they reached the rear door and was about to leave the auditorium he heard the fire alarm go off. He exited the auditorium and started down the hall, he noticed that the fire doors the shut. He said that as he ran through the hallways, there were people standing there, he would pull them, and they would ask why he was running. He said that as he ran toward the main entrance he could see that there was glass broken out of the main doors. He said that his friend Bo Lockwood was with him the entire time.

Fries said that as they approached the main entry doors and saw the broken glass, they immediately turned to their left and ran down towards the band rooms. He said as they arrived at the next juncture in the hallway, Mr. Andres, Jr. was there directing them out of the building. He said once they got out of the building they headed towards Clement Park. Fries said that when he was in the cafeteria he heard what he described as five distinct shots coming from

outside. He could provide no description on the shooters.

Fries said that he left behind a red and black Burton backpack with red flaps. He says it's a large pack with

plastic backboard. He said it contains his calculator, TI86 Graphics, his reading book, math book, several

folders and three-ring notebooks, his Science folder, his Math folder, and a vocabulary book and a Daytimer.

Fries said he was wearing khaki pants and a white t-shirt with another blue shirt with two stripes on it over top

of the white t-shirt.

Fries said that he was aware of the trench coat mafia. He knew that they wore long black trench coats. He said

that he was told by a friend, Kyle, that he should never have anything to do with them and that he should never

look them in the eyes, and just avoid them at all costs. He said that a friend of his, Doug Ford, who is a

violinist, and he thinks is an Explorer for the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, might have more

information about the trench coat mafia.

Fries said that the only incident that he ever had directly with the trench coat mafia was that one day he was

cleaning up railroad ties as part of his community service on the cafeteria side of the school. He said that there

were a number of students all wearing trench coats and he assumed that they were trench coat mafia. He said

they were hanging around an older black BMW. He said that one of them called out "hey look...there's a little

punk! Hey, punk rock!" Fries said at the time, he had his hair bleached out and he didn't look at the students

Fries said that he doesn't know Eric Harris but that he did know Dylan Klebold, that they had gone to Governor's Ranch Elementary School together. He said he was never close to him but that he knew who he was. He said that he also knew a student named Brent Krolicki who he believes is an original, or even the founder, of the trench coat mafia. He said that he'd also heard second hand, but he doesn't know who he heard it from at one of the memorials, that a girl named Courtney, who has been nicknamed by the other students, "the Devil Girl", was asked about going to the cafeteria or the smoking pit, and she told whomever asked her that she wasn't going to the cafeteria because "something big is going to happen". Fries describes Courtney as a girl who always dresses in black and purports to be a Goth.

Fries also said that a girl whose nickname is Lydia, he believes her real name is Jamie Schoffne, is a trench coat member wannabe, believes she is a Freshman and the trench coat mafia has scorned her as she's not intelligent ugh to join their group.

Fries also indicated that he was concerned that Brooks Brown was telling the media and people that he was an outcast from the trench coat mafia. Fries believes that Brown was actually involved with the group and stated that the Senior pictures taken in the gymnasium, in which Brooks is in the picture with Harris and Klebold, is an indication to him that they are still friends. Fries questions why anyone who would be threatened would be hanging around out with them all the time. Fries does not have an Internet site, and says he hasn't accessed the trench coat mafia sites. Fries said that, in retrospect, he didn't recall seeing anything unusual in the school that day, unattended backpacks and large duffle bags in the cafeteria.



On 05-12-99 at 10:30 A.M. Detective Terry Demmel, assigned with the Columbine Law Enforcement Task Force, met with Columbine Faculty member Kathy Frommer at her home. Kathy stated that on Tues, the 20th that she had scheduled a banquet for her Marketing Education class. Kathy explained that the banquet was called "DECA" which stands for Distributing Education Clubs Association which the class is no longer called but that "DECA" is more recognizable so they have kept that symbol.

The banquet was scheduled to recognize outstanding students and was from 8:20 to 10:45 A.M. at the Welshire Rest. on So. Colorado Blvd. Kathy provided a list of 45 students that attended. See attached list for names.

Kathy reported that when the banquet was over she returned to the school with Pauline Coiby who had asked for a ride both ways. When they got back Pauline informed Kathy that she wouldn't be working at the student run store at Rebel Corner that day where she normally worked every day. The store is staffed by four students daily. Pauline informed Kathy that her father had made a Doctors appointment for her and that she was sick. Kathy then told Det. Demmel that Pauline Colby was in the Trench Coat Mafia photo in last years year book and that after everything happened the way it did that she couldn't help but wonder if Pauline really was sick or may have known something was going to happen.

Kathy stated that they had gotten a large shipment of food in that day at the store and she noticed that there weren't many kids inside for lunch. In conversation Kathy stated to


contact Nick Shuman as he reported to Kathy that before everything happened he saw a suspicious person looking into the windows along the south side of the cafeteria.


Kathy was in her office in the class room when she heard shots and looked out to see kids running. She and the class students scooped up the money off the counter and ran into the class room and locked the doors. They turned off the lights and waited making calls to parents on her cell phone. They could hear bombs going off while waiting. After about 3 hours they were rescued by a Swat Team and taken out of the school.

Kathy advised Det. Demmel that she has \$1200, in cash lying on the floor of the classroom that she hopes is safe. The money was the prior days receipts and she asked to please contact her when the money is ready to be returned.

Kathy stated that she was familiar with student and had an altercation with him at one time. She stated that he sat in the same chair at cafeteria table VV every day like clock work. She did not recall seeing him that day. Kathy marked the table on the map which is attached.

On May 15, 1999, this investigator met with Kathy Frommer at her residence. Her students are involved in the daily operation of the Rebel Corner Store which is open during the school's lunch periods.

She advised that on the day of this incident, she and her students had attended a DECA banquet and returned to the school at approximately 10:45 a.m.. She said she parked her vehicle in the student lot and did not notice anything unusual at that time. The store opened at 11:10 a.m., and by 11:15 a.m., all of her student helpers had arrived with the exception of one - PAULINE COLBY.

Mrs. Frommer stated that Pauline had gone to the banquet with her and returned to the school with her as well. She said that when they arrived back at the school, Pauline told her that she was going to go home as she was not feeling well. She was last seen by Mrs. Frommer in the courtyard area adjacent to the cafeteria.

Mrs. Frommer stated that while her store manager, Nick Schumann was counting the cash on hand, she went into the store office and immediately heard "popping sounds" and screams of students. She heard some of her students say "there's qunfire," or words to that effect. She gathered her students and they went into a classroom which was next to the store's office. She said that she was able to look out of a window there, giving her a view into the Rebel Corner area and saw one of the janitors running. She stated that she went back into the store office to get her keys and then went back into the classroom and locked the door from the inside. She advised that there were several loud explosions and one much louder than those previous. She said they continued to hear what sounded like gunshots and these louder explosions. She thought that the sounds were farther and farther away from their location in the cafeteria. She said there were noises coming from the science lab on the floor above them which sounded like tables being overturned. She stated that "around noon" she heard more gunfire which sounded far away. She said it was quiet after that and between 2:30 and 3:00 p.m., SWAT officers came in and took them out of the area.

Mrs. Frommer advised that she did not know Harris or Klebold. She believed that had some involvement with the trench coat group last year, but not this year. She said she had one confrontation with after had been cursing at another student. She said when she warned him about his language, he "got in my face," and was acting in an agressive manner. She said she separated the students and that was the end of it.

Mrs. Frommer advised that she left her keys in the classroom, and approximately nine hundred dollars in cash belonging to the school store.

Investigation continues.

The following investigation was conducted in Littleton, Colorado:

Brian Arnaud Fuselier, white male, date of birth October 30, 1983, place of birth Manassas, Virginia, Social Security Account Number 228-31-0146, residence 9203 West Prentice Avenue, Littleton, Colorado 80123, home telephone number (303) 979-1152, Columbine High School (CHS) student-9th Grade, was interviewed in the presence of his mother, Mimi Fuselier, and was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature and purpose of the interview. Fuselier was being interviewed in regard to the shooting incident at CHS on April 20, 1999. Fuselier provided the following information:

Fuselier provided his schedule of events on April 20, 1999, beginning with being picked up by the school bus and being dropped off at CHS at approximately 7:05 AM. Fuselier stated that the bus dropped him off adjacent to the side door located off Pierce Street. At approximately 7:10 AM he proceeded down to the commons area of the lower level. He stated he was seated in the areas of the cafeteria identified as either Table "HH" or "OO". He further stated he was sitting at the table with other CHS students, identified as Mike Naifeh, Justin Naifeh, Matt Friend and Nate Cawelti. Fuselier stated he did not notice anything out of the ordinary in the commons area on April 20, 1999.

Fuselier stated he proceeded from the commons area to his first period English Class instructed by Mr. Myer, prior to class starting at 7:30 AM. He described his walk from the commons area as walking up the stairs toward the Science Section of the campus, turning left heading east, and walking down the hallway. Fuselier described his first period class as an English Class from 7:30 AM, ending at 8:20 AM. Following English Class, he proceeded to his Foods Class instructed by Miss Zerr, immediately following the end of his first period class. Fuselier stated the hours of his second period class are from 8:25 AM to 9:15 AM. Following Second period class, he proceeded to his third period class, Geometry, instructed by Miss McWilliams which begins at 9:20 AM and ends at 10:10 AM.



Following Geometry Class, Fuselier proceeded down the stairs, adjacent to the library, and headed down, toward the cafeteria. He stated he has fourth period off, which begins at 10:15 AM and is over at 11:05 AM. Michael John Gagne, DOB 09/19/1983, 9167 West Cross Drive #104, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)979-5338, a freshman at Columbine High School, was interviewed at his home in the presence of his mother, Genevela Gagne, by Special Agent(SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Gagne provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Gagne got out of math class, left the math department, went west down the south main hall, and down the stairs to the cafeteria. Gagne went to cafeteria table marked G on the diagram sketch and stood there talking to his friends at the table. Jessica Guertz was also standing by Gagne. Gagne recalls that Jocelyn Provo and Betsy Kwerneland were seated at table G. Gagne was standing on the east side of the table facing west. Guertz was to his right.

Gagne was standing there when he heard people yelling to get under the table and he noticed that the west half of the cafeteria was under their tables. Gagne go under the table for a few seconds and then stood back up to look around. Because everyone was staying down, Gagne got back under the table. After a few more seconds, everyone got up and started running toward the stairs. Gagne started running with them and ran up the stairs. While running, Gagne heard approximately four shots coming from the direction of the cafeteria. At the top of the stairs, Gagne turned east down the south main hall and ran out the exit at the end of the hall. Once outside, Gagne ran across Pierce Street to Leawood Park and then a few minutes later went to Leawood Elementary.

Gagne was also in the cafeteria before first period with Greg Last Name Unknown(LNU) and David LNU, aka Bo. They were sitting at the tables along the west wall near the student entrance. Gagne thinks he was there from approximately 7:15 am to 7:30 am. Gagne did not see any large duffle bags in the cafeteria before first period or at lunch. Gagne has seen Dylan Klebold around school and has seen Eric Harris at the mall a few times with an unknown female in March and April 1999. Gagne did



not know any of the other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia. Gagne did not see any of the gunmen during the shooting.

Gagne has an Internet screen name of PunkMonk69, but to his knowledge has never talked with Harris or Klebold on the Internet. On the day of the shooting, Gagne was wearing blue shorts, a blue button-up short-sleeved shirt, and blue shoes.

On April 26, 1999, I spoke with Mr. Jay Gallentine at his residence located at 20661 Willobend Lane in Parker, CO..

Gallentine is a custodian at Columbine High School and has been employed by the schools for approximately 17 years.

Gallentine said that on April 19th and the 20th, he arrived at the school at about 0430 to to 0500 on both days. His normal work hours are 0600 to 1430. He recently lost his vehicle in a bankruptcy so his wife takes him to work and picks him up.

Gallentine said that he was in the cafeteria when a female student came rurning in yelling that a a student had been shot. He looked outside and saw a body on the ground and yelled for the students to get out or get under the tables. As the students were running out of the area he heared a loud explosion then gun shots from upstairs. He describes this time as complete pandemonium. He ran upstairs near the music room and could hear explosions and gun shots coming from the library area. The music room was full of kids. He saw science teacher, Theresa Lara who said that Mr. Sanders had been shot or that two students had been shot and for him to call an ambulance. As he was communicating with Lara (phonetic spelling) he said that she was looking past him with terror in her eyes and he turned around and "saw the tall gunman dressed in black, some white, ski mask, hand gun and a large gun or grenade launcher strapped to

his shoulder like a sling". Gallentin said that he leaped from the top step to the first landing towards the cafeteria and heard gun Once in the cafeteria he saw John Curtis and teacher Eric The three of them ran to the kitchen. Curtis was first and Gallentine said that he is sure that Curtis was being shot at. Then there was a loud explosion and Kritzer went down tried to get up and fell again then crawled to the kitchen and shut the door behind him where they all huddled under a stainless steel table. Student, Dusty Hoffschnider (phonetic) and three other students also They, mainly Hoffschnider, didn't want to made it to this room. stay in this room so Hoffschnider made a run for it and made it outside through the west door. Gallentine left this room and went to the lower auditorium door and went inside. He observed "the Andreas's (father and son teachers) and about 50 to 80 students. explained to them that they had to leave the building and to do exactly as he said which was exit the auditorium, turn right and : in down the hall (business and foreign language hall) and get outside. He checked the hall way and led them out. He said that when the boys and girls exited the room the girls heard the gun shots and explosions, became very frightened and started screaming as they were running. He felt the screaming drew attention to the gunman and knew he was being shot at as he ran back to the kitchen area. He thought that the shots he heard at this time were that of a Gallentine ran to the walk-in cooler accompanied by another custodian by the name of John Curtis. They had been in the cooler for a while (he dosen't know how long) and remembers looking at his watch and the time was 1:50PM. At approximately 4:15PM, the Swat Team removed them from the cooler.

Gallentine cleans up the cafeteria after the students use the room and often cleans up while a few students are still there. He does not recall seeing any bags around ar anything unusual. When asked wheather or not certain students hang around the tables, he mentioned one kid that almost always dressed in black including a black trench coat, black boots and either a black or white T shirt. This person ALWAYS wears a black beret. While Gallentine sweeps and cleans tables, he has heard this individual talk about guns to the

other males with him. Gallentine said that he has mentioned this to other custodians. When asked if this male was the same as the gunman he didn't think it was. He describes him as tall and wears wire rimmed glasses but the black beret is an outstanding feature. It appeared to Gallentine that he is frequently is accompanied by another male that dresses normally but has dark bushy hair. He said that both of these students normally get to the school cafeteria about 0630 to 0700, however neither student was there on the day of the shooting.

INVESTIGATION:

On 05/05/99, I met with Tyler Gamble at his residence reference the Columbine shooting. I explained to Tyler that I was there to talk with him about the shooting and where he was during the shooting. At this time I brought out a sketch of the cafeteria and asked Tyler if he could circle the table where he was sitting on the day of the shooting. Tyler said he could not remember for sure, but he was either at table "JJ" or table "U". Tyler made a mark at each table where he would be sitting. I asked Tyler to tell me what had happened that day. Tyler said he was sitting with three friends, Jeff Barnett, Russell Hanke and Steve Poole. Tyler said two students came running into the cafeteria saying someone was shooting outside. Tyler said this was approximately 11:20 hours. Tyler said that Mr. Sanders came into the cafeteria and told one to get under the tables because someone was shooting. Tyler said he remained under the table for a short time and while there heard a loud "boom". Tyler said he looked up and out the windows and saw smoke coming from the area of a car. When asked what type of car, he said he does not remember, he just remembers seeing the smoke. Tyler said that he then got up with the rest of the students and ran up the stairs, down the science and math hallway and left through the door at the end of the hallway. Tyler said he then ran to Leewood Park. I asked Tyler if he had seen who was doing the shooting and he said, no, he did not. I asked him if he heard any shots and he says he believes he heard shots when he got to the top of the stairway, as that's where the shots were coming from....they were in the cafeteria. I asked Tyler how many explosions he heard and he said he only remembers the one that was outside. I asked Tyler if there was any other time that he was in the cafeteria that day and he said, "no". I asked tyler if he saw anyone carrying or in possession of two duffel bags and he said "no". I asked if he saw two duffel bags in the cafeteria and he said, no, he did not. I asked if he remembered seeing Eric or Dylan on Monday or Tuesday and he said, "no". I asked Tyler if he left anything in the cafeteria and he said he left his backpack, which was an East pack and black in color. I asked if he heard anything from anyone else about any other suspects making bombs or buying guns and he said "no". I asked what he was wearing that day and he said Khaki shorts, white tee shirt and a baseball cap. I asked Tyler if he could provide any information on the Trench Coat Mafia gang and he said he believed most of the gang were seniors that graduated last year. Tyler said that his opinion of Eric was that he was more of a "wantta be" than an actual gang member. Tyler says he remembers in choir someone asked Eric to translate German music for them because he was good at translating German. I asked Tyler if he remembers who the student was and he said, "no". I asked Tyler if there was any other information that he could provide that would be helpful to our investigation and id at this time, he couldn't think of anything else. I gave Tyler my business card and asked that he call me with any other information.



On 4/26/99 I interviewed 16 year old CHS student Greg Garcia at his home in Littleton Co. Greg's mother was present for this interview. Greg stated he was in the CHS cafeteria on "A" lunch around 11:15am on 4/20/99. He had gone to lunch with Kristin Garramone and they each had gone through the food line and sat down together. He recalled he sat at a table with about 7 other students. He stated most of this group sits together on a regular basis at school.

I showed Greg a drawing of the cafeteria with specific tables marked. I asked him to look at this drawing and mark which table he was sitting at. I clarified the directions in the drawing and pointed out specific things, such as columns, windows and the food line. Greg pointed to table EE first, then pointed to table ZZ. He could not be sure which table, but was positive it was one of these. He recalled that he sat down at the table facing to the south.

Greg stated he did not recall seeing any unusual duffle bags in the cafeteria that morning, or prior to this. He stated that many students carry large duffle bags, specifically cheerleaders and lacrosse players. However, Greg did not recall seeing any such bags that morning. He also did not recall seeing anybody carrying an unusual bag that morning or any days prior to this. He did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, but believed he probably saw them at school during the past year.

Greg stated he left only his green unlabeled backpack in the cafeteria near his table when he exited the area. Greg was wearing a white t-shirt with denim shorts. Around 11:25am a teacher came running into the cafeteria and told everyone to get down. Greg heard gunshots and an explosion which appeared to have come from outside. He got down on the floor and immediately crawled into the kitchen and back into the left storage area. He stated that about 9 students and Tony the janitor were with him. They waited about 3 hours before being rescued by SWAT. Greg did not see anybody with a weapon, nor did he hear anybody talking outside the storage room. He continued hearing gunfire outside the room.


