VESTIGATION

On 082299, I telephonically interviewed Kristin Garramone, a student at Columbine High School. Kristen reported to me that she was interviewed once before by Jefferson County District Attorneys Office. Possibly by John Lauck.

On 042099, around 1115 hours Kristen Garramone was in the cafeteria eating lunch when the shooting incident began. Kristin said she was sitting at a table almost directly in the middle of the cafeteria. She was sitting with, Dustin Gordon, Greg Garcia, Sean Roberts, Richie Green, Bret Kostnalik, Paul Andrews, Dustin Meyers and others that she could not recall their names. While eating lunch a commotion broke out. Soon afterwards she saw students and Mr. Sanders run in and yelled for students to get down on the floor. She could hear gunshot. She told me the gunshots sounded like firecrackers. Garramone and her friends hid on the cafeteria floor for awhile. She then got up and ran into the kitchen where she hid in a mop closet with Sean Roberts, Greg Garcia, Austin Meyers, Paul Andrews, some of the lunch staff, some teachers and others that she could not recall their names. She was later rescued.

Garramone recalled stepping over a large pack on her way into the cafeteria on that day. She thought it was a duffel bag, but could not be sure. She reported that this was not unusual, because the cafeteria always had backpacks lying all over the floor.

Garramone said that she could not see the shooting or the shooters from her table location. She was only able to hear the shooting. Garramone told me that she was surrounded by her friends and could not see anything.

Garramone did report to losing her backpack on 042099 in the cafeteria. She said it was black.

Tyrone Garrett, black male, date of birth May 1, 1984, 9173 West Cross, Littleton, Colorado, (303) 972-6296, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the purpose of the interview. Also in attendance during the interview was Jessica Rosecrans and Cyenthia Margetts. Garrett provided the following information:

Garrett is a freshman at Columbine High School (CHS). Garrett does not personally know Eric Harris nor Dylan Klebold.

On April 20, 1999, Garrett went to school and attended classes from approximately 7:30 a.m. until 11:10 a.m. At 11:10 a.m., Garrett went to lunch at the school's cafeteria and sat at approximately Table DD. At Garrett's table was Kenny Rupp, Bo Last Name Unknown, Mike Naifeh, and Jarrett Baer. After getting his lunch, Garrett sat down at his table and observed everyone around him getting down on the floor. The janitors told everyone to get down. Garrett heard gunshots to the west, outside the cafeteria. Garrett ran east along the cafeteria's south wall and into the foreign language area. Garrett ran out the school's lower level south door with Nat Owen and Elaine Last Name Unknown. They ran across the street. Garrett could not provide any additional information regarding the incident.

Paul Freeman saw guys with guns in the cafeteria.



Ref: Interview of Columbine Sophomore Melinda Gattoni DOB 09-21-83

On 05-11-99 at 11 00 A.M. Detective Terry Demmel, who is assigned with The Columbine Law Enforcement Task Force, contacted Columbine Sophomore student Melinda Gattoni at her home. Melinda's mother was present for the interview. Melinda reported that on Tuesday the 20th she had 4th hour off and was in the Commons when she heard what sounded like fire works going off outside of the cafeteria that caused about 50 students to get up and run towards the windows. Melinda heard 4 loud bangs and heard the cafeteria window get hit and glass break. People were yelling to get down and she momentarily crawled under a table. Melinda marked on the map which table she was seated at when the incident began. Melinda had gotten down when she saw a person dressed in all black, wearing a trench coat with something dark wrapped around his upper face; she couldn't see if he was wearing a hat or not; walk into the cafeteria from the north door by the pop machines. Melinda stated that the party had a long black gun and was alone.

Melinda reported that she knew who Dylan was and had said "Hi" to him several times but that she could not identify the person who walked into the cafeteria wearing the trench coat and carrying the gun.

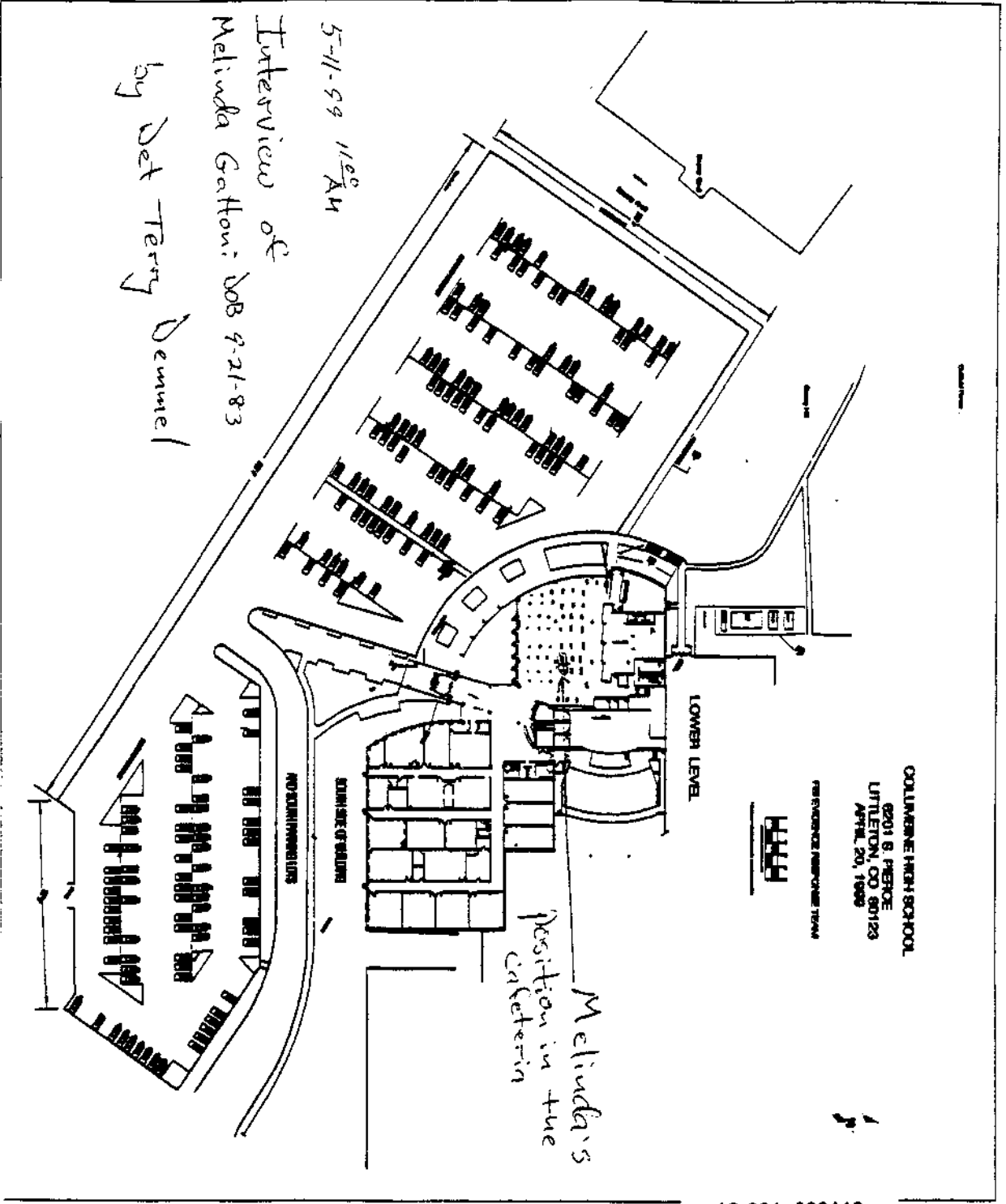
When the party with the gun came into the cafeteria Melinda stated she began to run when she tripped over a chair and fell down. Melinda then ran up some stairs and started to go into the Library when she changed her direction and went into the auditorium where she stayed for a while. She began screaming and was helped up and led out by another student that she stated was Matt Kechter: one the victims that was then killed.

Melinda reported that she ran into the main hallway and out of the east main entrance door. The glass from the door fell on them as they were going through it. Melinda suspects that the glass was already broken from what she thought was baseballs as she reports seeing baseballs lying on the ground outside of the door.

Det. Demmel asked Melinda if she saw any unusual items or bags in the cafeteria while she was in there with Melinda reporting that she thinks she saw a big red duffel bag that was larger than the many back packs that are normally in the cafeteria. Melinda reported that the bag was approximately 10 feet south of the table she was seated at and was sitting on top of a table. Melinda says that she got to the cafeteria table about 11.15 A.M. she believes and that was about the time that she saw the bag.

Melinda stated that a girl by the name of Ashley Eagland had told her that she had observed [REDACTED] come into the cafeteria and that [REDACTED] was involved. Det. Demmel checked with Group 4 and was advised by Det. Mark Woodward that Ashley Eagland had been contacted and interviewed and that Ashley did report that [REDACTED] was in the cafeteria and was involved in the incident.

INVESTIGATION:

On 06-29-99, between the hours of 1058 and 1204, I had an opportunity to speak with Bae Gattoni in reference to the Columbine High School incident that occurred on 04-20-99. Bae had been identified through witness interviews as being in the school cafeteria on the incident date.

Upon contacting Bae, she told me that she arrived at school on 04-20-99 at about 0705 hours and that she rode to school that morning with Brandi and Monica Malonson. They had driven to school in Monica's car, parked the vehicle over near Leewood Park and walked into the main entrance. Bae attended her normally scheduled classes, telling me that she has first hour Math

class taught by Mr. Capra. Her second period class is English, taught by Ms. Bonin. Her third period class is Biology, taught by Ms. Williams and she has fourth hour free. Bae told me that after her third period Biology class, she went to her locker and then proceeded down into the cafeteria area at the high school, telling me that she got down there at about 1030 hours. I showed Bae a diagram of the cafeteria and asked if she could tell me where she was seated on the incident date. She told me that she was seated at Table II and seated there with her were her friends, Natalie Baker, home telephone number of 303-978-0293, Kelsey Fowler, home telephone number of 303-973-2022, Jenny Polock, home telephone number unknown, Kristin Griffith, home telephone number unknown, Naomi Lucero, home telephone number 303-973-1368, Brandi Molonson, home telephone number 303-933-3269, Laura Green, home telephone number unknown and a student only known to her as "Renee."

Bae was asked if while she was seated in the cafeteria if she observed two large duffel bags or sports bags, one being blue in color and the other being an orangish red in color, which were located in the central core area. I was asking if she observed those bags or if she observed anyone bring those bags in on the incident date. She could not provide any information reference the bags. Bae proceeded to tell me that between the hours of 1115 and 1120, that she had gone up to the food service line where she got her lunch and proceeded back to her table, telling me that she was seated on the south east corner of the table and that she could easily look out the west windows of the cafeteria.

At about 1125 hours, Bae recalled hearing popping noises. She referred to them as firecrackers coming from outside the cafeteria. She told me that shortly after the popping noises, she saw two janitors, one janitor she identified as "Joe," the second janitor she did not know his name but described him as a white male, short, slender build, brown hair, mustache, had on blue jeans, tennis shoes and a black baseball cap. She told me that the two janitors were yelling at the students to get down under the tables. She initially thought that there was a fight going on between students or was possibly some type of a senior prank, but she got under the table, not knowing what was going on.

Bae recalls that she heard four additional popping noises coming from outside and that she began to look up from under her table and at this point she observed two suspects or gunmen standing outside the cafeteria out on the west sidewalk. Bae described the first suspect as being a white male, around 6'0" tall, blondish brown hair, shoulder length. The individual was wearing dark Army pants, a black t-shirt and he had black boots, just below his knees. She also stated that the individual was wearing a black



trench coat and that he was carrying some type of a weapon. Bae described the gun as being a smaller gun. It was only about 18 inches long and she recalls the suspect held the gun, using only his right hand. Bae told me through the media reports that she identified that gunman as being Dylan Klebold.

Bae then described suspect #2 as being a white male, around 6'0", telling me she didn't get a good description of this individual such as his hair color because he had some type of a hat or something else on top of his head. She told me the individual was wearing dark pants, had a white t-shirt on, a black trench coat and that he had a long gun telling me that this individual's gun was longer than suspect #1. I asked her to describe how the suspect was holding the weapon. She told me that he was holding the gun with both hands and that his right hand was near the trigger area. Bae stated that shortly after seeing the two suspects outside that she proceeded to run from Table H toward the staircase. As she was going up the stairs, she told me that she stopped on the landing area at the top of the first set of stairs, looked back into the cafeteria and observed suspect #1 who she identified as Dylan Klebold walk inside the cafeteria. Again, using the map of the cafeteria, I asked her where she observed this individual. She pointed out that he was standing in the row with Table L through XX over the west side of the cafeteria. Bae was asked if she observed suspect #2 at this point. She stated that due to the confusion, students started to run toward the stairs. She was not sure if suspect #2 entered into the cafeteria. Bae explained that once she got to the top of the stairs and was in the main level of the high school, she stopped for a few minutes, telling me that she had just recently transferred to Columbine High School and she wasn't sure where she should run. She told me that later she spoke with a friend of hers by the name of David Smith, who told her that he had yelled at her when she was standing up near the top of the stairs. David was telling her to run, but she did not, as she was trying to figure out where she would go. Bae told me that she ran into the auditorium. Once inside the auditorium, she tried to get into the audio room, but the door was locked. At that point, she told me that she sat down in a corner and there were several other students around her. She couldn't provide any identities to those students and they just waited in the auditorium.

Bae explained that she was probably in the auditorium for about ten minutes, when an unidentified white male student came into the auditorium and told them that they needed to leave the school. She told me that this individual led them out of the auditorium where they exited into the main hallway of the school and ran east toward the main office. As they reached the doors at the main entrance, Bae recalls hearing gunshots coming from down the hallway, just behind her and as she reached the glass doors, she

recalls that the glass panels in the doors shattered. She continued to run out the doors and ran east into the subdivision east of Pierce Street

I asked Bae if she had ever looked back when she got to the main exits to see who was firing the weapon behind her. She stated that she did look back and she described seeing a white male, wearing dark jeans and a white short sleeved shirt. He had light brown hair and was carrying a long gun. She could provide no additional information or description reference this person, telling me she just saw him at a quick glance as she was going out the doors. Through the description that Bae had given me in reference to suspect #2 who she saw outside, west of the cafeteria. This description sounds like Eric Harris after he had shed his black trench coat prior to entering into the west doors of the school.

Bae was shown photo line up #9 and asked if she could identify any of the subjects as being the individuals she observed in the school on 04-20-99. Bae immediately picked picture #3, who was identified as Dylan Klebold, telling me he is the individual he described as suspect #1, and later observed walking in the cafeteria at the high school. Bae was then shown photo line up page #3 and asked if she could identify any of those subjects. She immediately pointed to picture #2, which depicts Eric Harris and stated she recognized Eric Harris from the media accounts, but she could not positively identify him as being suspect #2

Bae was asked if she knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold or any of the associates of the Trench Coat Mafia. She stated that she knew the two were students but she couldn't provide any additional information about the two. She also told me that the only associate that she knew of the Trench Coat Mafia was a Melissa Sowder and she briefly mentioned an incident that occurred at Chatfield High School where Melissa told some of the athletes there that she wished she could have helped Eric and Dylan kill some of the athletes. She proceeded to tell me that apparently Melissa had been taken out of the school reference the threats she made toward the other students.

I had Bae described her clothing on the incident date. She told me that she was wearing a pair of khaki shorts, had on a white tank top, and had a blue long sleeve hooded jacket over the tank top. Bae was unable to provide any additional information reference this incident.

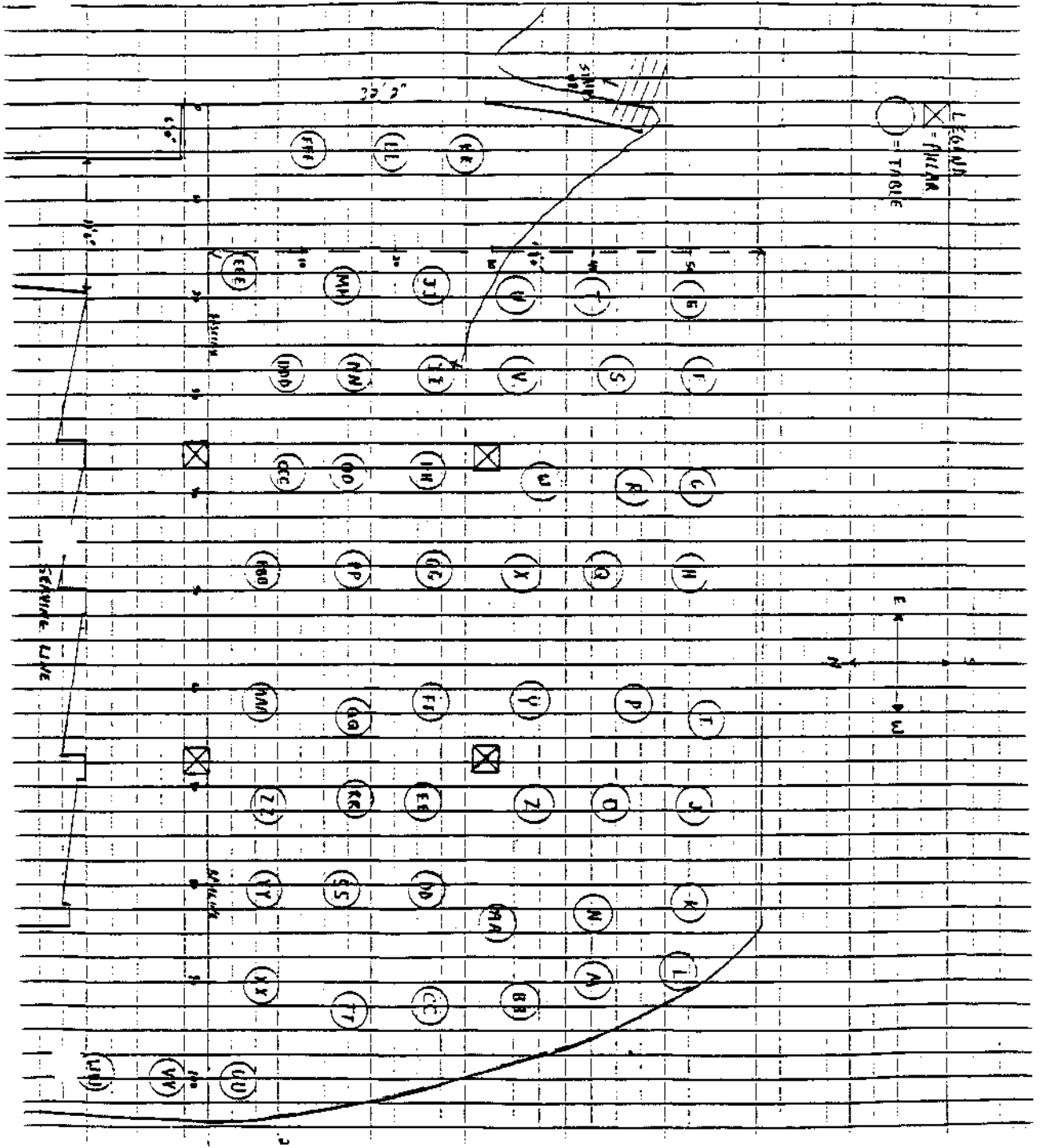

ACTION TAKEN:

On April 20, 1999 all Investigative Agents with the Colorado Bureau of Investigations, Denver office were advised over the radio to respond to Columbine High School to assist on a shooting. The Reporting Agent, Linda R. HOLLOWAY (R.A.) arrived on scene at 1:20 p.m. Numerous emergency personnel were already on scene and a command post had already been set up by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

The R.A. contacted several of the students as they were being shunted from the High School to the area near the Command Post. The students that I contacted are listed below. An attempt was made to contact a parent or family member by cell phone and the children were turned over to counselors or victim advocates

Jonathan VANDEMARK related that he had seen one of the armed gunmen. He described him as being short, having blond spiked hair and carrying an ooze with a black strap attached. He further stated that the gunmen belong to the Trench Coat Mafia. He further related that he had seen three or four bodies on stairs as he ran from the building at approximately 1445 to 1450 hours.

JC-001-003118

Kristine KOELLNER of CBI related that she had located information from the Internet on this group of people who identified themselves as the Trench Coat Mafia. Information that she had located was relayed to the R.A. at the High School and I relayed it to the Command Post. One page of the information was a message from a person identifying himself as LANG SILAS. He related in his message that he was the leader of the Trench Coat Mafia and that he would die on April 20, 1999.

At 2045 hours on April 20, 1999, Barrie GOETZ of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation, Pueblo office related to me that he had noticed a carving in a picnic table in the park to the north of the High School. A canopy covers a picnic area where laboratory personnel were gathered and being briefed on the scene. The carvings were the numbers "4:20" and on the opposite side of the same wooden table were the numbers "187". Both carvings appeared that they had been freshly cut through the painted surface of the tables. This information was related to Chief Investigation Kate BATTON.


On April 21, 1999 the R.A. assisted in the identification of the vehicles in the parking lots adjacent to the High School. Lists of registration information were relayed between CBI and the Command Post that were obtained through the Colorado Department of Motor Vehicles. Each vehicle in the parking lots had a piece of tape attached to a window and the names of the registered owners were written on the tape.

The Bomb Squad searched several cars to identify suspicious items that could be seen or that had any potential association with the shootings. The following lists of vehicles were searched by the Bomb Squad during the time period I was involved with the vehicle identification:

After marking numerous vehicles in the north student parking lot, the R.A. assisted inside the High School with Evidence Team #5 in the collection of evidence in the main hallway of the building.

SUMMARY: Linda HOLLOWAY of CBI arrived on the scene at 1:20 p.m. I contacted several students who were being shuttled from the High School, search them and debriefed them for any pertinent information. Their parents were contacted and they were turned over to victim advocates or school counselors. I also assisted in identifying and marking vehicles located in adjacent parking lots and kept track of some of the vehicles that were searched by the Bomb Squad. I later assisted Team 5 with evidence collection inside the school

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-11-99, at about 10:30 a.m., I interviewed CHS student Araceli Gaucin as follow up on DN2475. Although the lead sheet indicated that Araceli was previously interviewed, she told me that she was not. The interview was conducted at Araceli's home, while her parents were at work.

Araceli told me that on 04-20-99, at about 11:10 a.m., she had just finished her fourth period class, which is located on the school's upper level. After leaving class, Araceli said that she went to her locker and placed her backpack inside it. She then waited for her friend, student Michelle Huff (11th), who arrived at Araceli's locker within a minute or so. Araceli said that she and Michelle then exited the school's west doors, by the library, walked down the (outside) stairway, and entered the cafeteria through its northwest door, next to the teacher's lounge. Araceli said that they then stood in the serving line and purchased their lunches. Araceli estimated that it would have been about 11:15 a.m. at that time.

After Araceli and Michelle received their lunch trays, she said they both began walking back toward the cafeteria's northwest door with the intent of going outside to eat their lunch. Araceli said that upon reaching the door, but prior to exiting it (they were both still inside), they stopped and saw "about five students" at the door. Araceli said that there was a commotion, and assumed that a fight was taking place outside the door. Araceli said that she then took a closer look, still from inside, and saw

a male lying on the ground directly outside and to the right (west) of the door. Araceli said that a female teacher, whom she identified as Chris Redmerski, was leaning over this student and appeared to be touching him. Araceli said that she then looked outside the window to her right (west side of the door, facing west) and saw another male student lying on the ground, to the west of the base of the stairway. Araceli said that she was not sure what was happening, and thought it might be some kind of joke. At that point, Araceli said she heard what she thought was a gunshot, immediately followed by a couple of people who yelled, "Get down! Get down!" Araceli said that she then realized something serious was happening, and that she and Michelle dropped their lunch trays and ducked down onto the floor. Araceli said that she and Michelle were near the soda machines at this time, and heard one more gunshot that sounded fairly close. Araceli said that this gunshot sounded to her like it had struck glass. Araceli said that she and Michelle remained on the floor in that location for "about a minute," then began crawling toward the east door of the teacher's lounge.

Araceli said that she and Michelle crawled into the teacher's lounge, where she remembered seeing teacher Judy Greco, another female teacher (unknown), and a female kitchen worker. Araceli said that she and Michelle crawled to and hid between two soda machines located on the south wall of the teacher's lounge. Araceli said that they both remained in that location, between the soda machines, while the kitchen worker called for help on a phone inside the lounge. Araceli said that she and Michelle remained inside the teacher's lounge for approximately forty-five minutes, during which time she said she kept her head down and didn't see anyone outside the west window. Araceli said that she and Michelle finally exited the teacher's lounge after hearing someone announce "they're coming in!" Araceli said that she and Michelle crawled out the easternmost (south side) door of the teacher's lounge, and into the kitchen area. From there, Araceli said that she and Michelle ran toward the back (north) side of the kitchen, near the walk-in refrigerators / freezers. Araceli said that she and Michelle remained in that area with a group of people for "about five minutes," whereupon they ran into a small "storage room" located near the back of the kitchen. Araceli said that she remembers teachers Chris Redmerski, Judy Greco, an unknown male teacher, a janitor with a walkie-talkie, four female kitchen workers, and seven other people inside the storage room with she and Michelle (total of seventeen).

Araceli said that she and the others remained inside the storage room for approximately two hours, during which time she heard

what sounded like "people running and jumping" above her. Araceli said that she did not hear gunshots or explosions, and that as time progressed, the noises coming from above eventually ceased. Araceli said that at about 2:30 p.m., a SWAT team found them and ushered them out of the school by way of the broken window in the teacher's lounge.

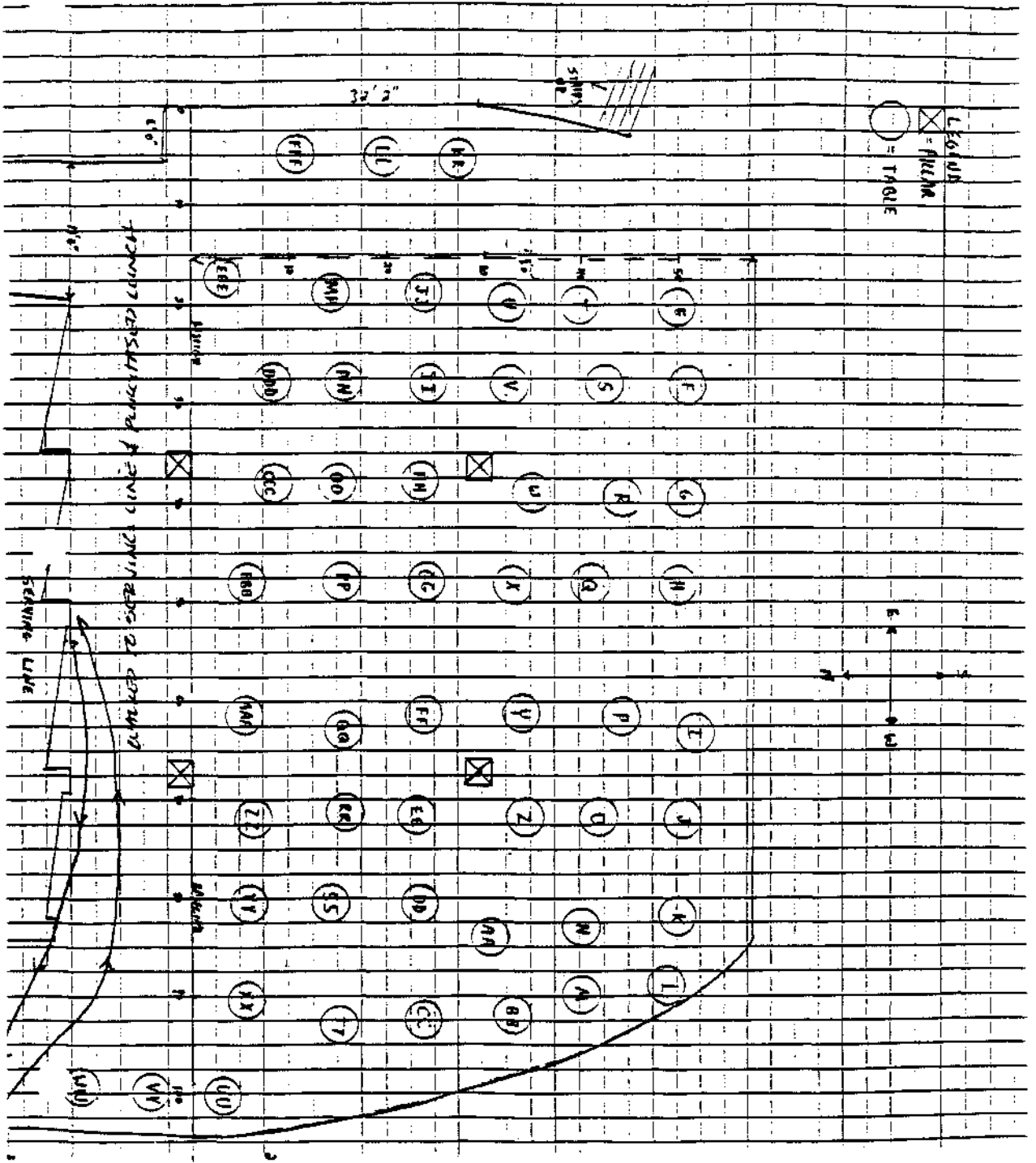
Araceli said that she did not see any shooter(s) or anyone wearing a trench coat at any time. Araceli said that she did not recall seeing any duffle bag(s) or anything else that she might consider suspicious /out of the ordinary. Araceli said that she did not personally know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, nor any of their associates as presented by the media. The interview concluded at about 11:12 a.m.

Rapid Start indicated that teachers Chris Redmerski and Judy Greco, and student Michelle Huff had not been scheduled for an interview. Accordingly, I prepared and submitted lead sheets for each.

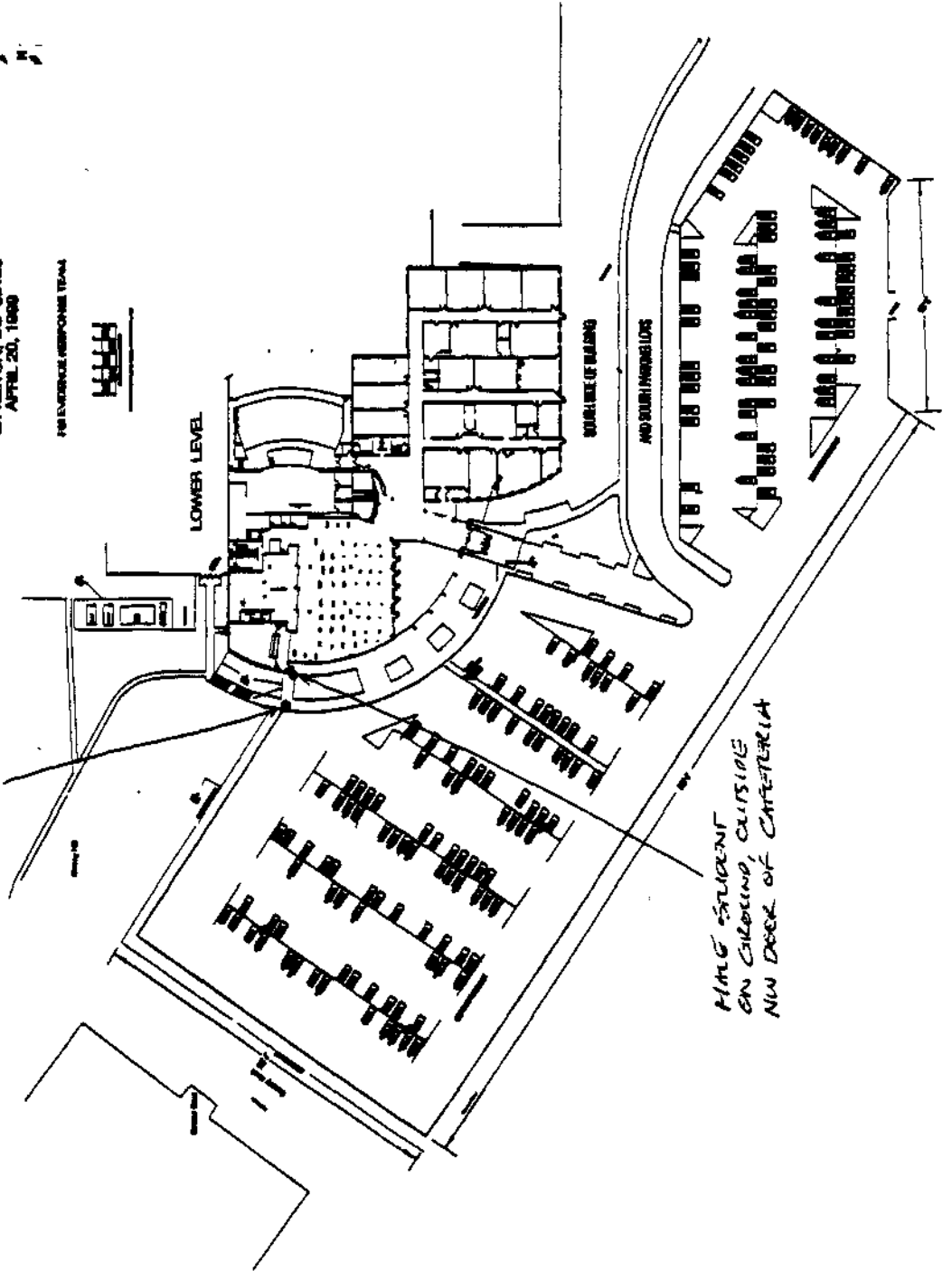


Katherine Gerum provided the following information regarding the April 20, 1999 incident at Columbine High School:

It should be noted that Katherine normally wears a hearing aid and appears to be a special needs student.

- Katherine was in Mr. Sander's Keyboard class prior to lunch (near the Marketing Department on the lower level). She stated that she got out at 11:10 and went straight to lunch. She sits at the bottom of the stairs at a rectangular table. She stated that she did not go into the cafeteria at any time and therefore did not see any large bags, duffel or otherwise, sitting on the floor.
- Katherine denies going into Rebel Corner or to the Student Store. She stated that she was sitting with a Sarah (from keyboarding class) and Heather (unknown last name). She stated that the second bell had already rang (post 11:15 a.m.). She thought that it was "just another day" at school.
- Katherine stated that a short time later a female student came in the south cafeteria doors and said "that a girl got shot". She stated that Mr. Sanders then came in and told everyone to "get down". She stated that she got on the floor for about "2 seconds" and then got up and ran at the direction of Mr. Sanders.
- Katherine stated that she went to the Auditorium via the hall near the cafeteria. She stated that from the auditorium, a bunch of students were trying to go up the right side, but that they all turned around. She "figures that there was a gunman up there", but did not see one. She stated that they all went up the left side after that. She stated that they then went east toward the main entrance and then took a left and down a hall. Katherine stated that they left the building and ran across the park.
- Katherine stated that she did not hear anything at all (Katherine does wear a hearing aid and had it in at that time). She stated that she did not see any "gunman" either. Katherine denies seeing any large duffel bags or backpacks.
- Katherine carries a red backpack, which she left at her table. She stated that it contained her purse, Library Card, a book, some money and a folder.
- Katherine does not drive, but has "seen some trench coats in the parking lot area" She stated that she has seen "them" about "three times all year" She stated that she has never heard of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM).

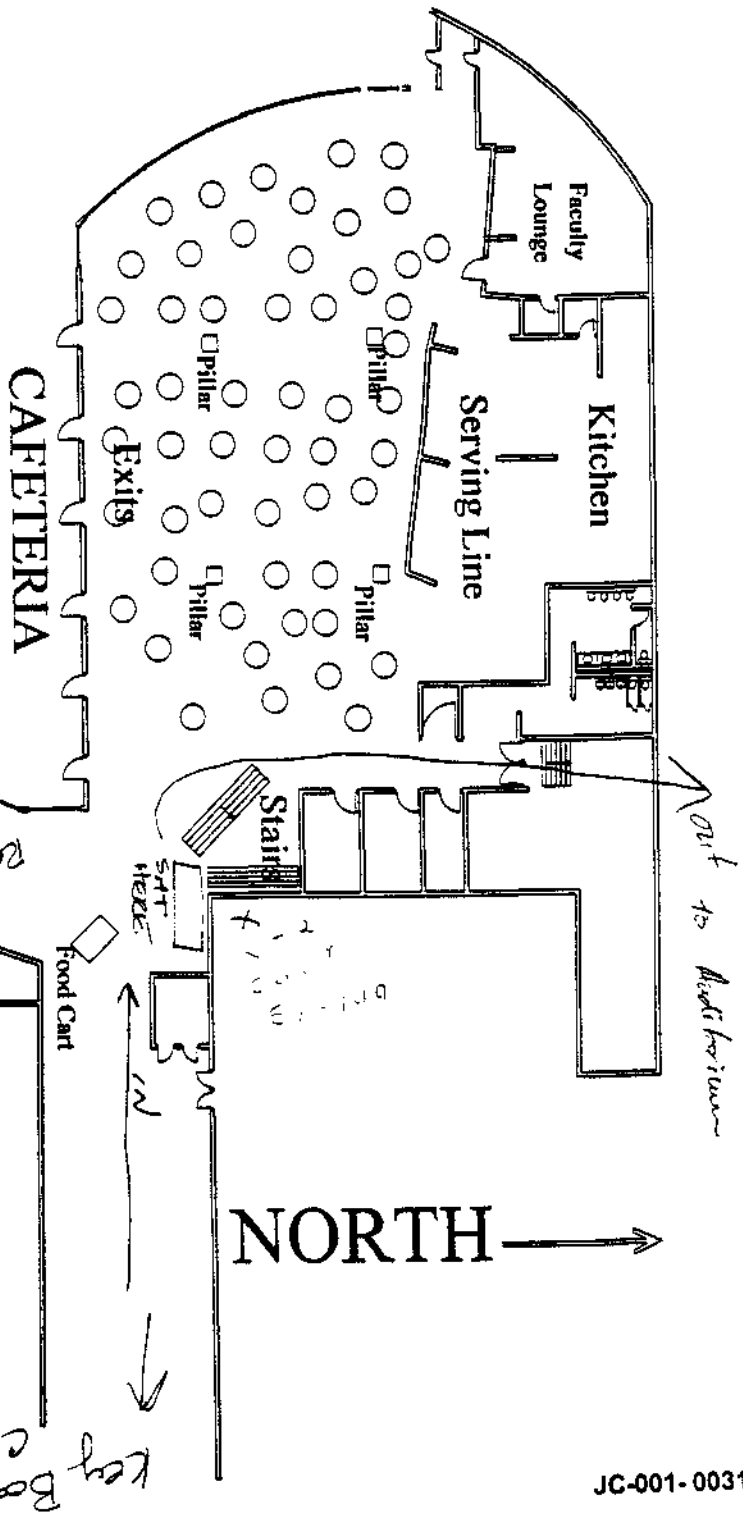

On 5/18/99 I interviewed Jessica Guertz at her residence with her mother present. Jessica reported that she entered the cafeteria at approx. 11:10AM and she sat at table H with Mike Gagne, Lauren Tocci, Chris Masias, Joslyn (unk last name), Jenny Ribble and Veronica Griffith. Jessica said someone yelled that there was a fight and they all got up to look out the windows. Jessica said she saw two guys dressed in Trench Coats, and a guy in white T-shirt possibly with them standing near the cement stairs. Jessica said she couldn't identify the parties. Jessica said she heard gun shots but she didn't see who was shooting. Jessica said she ran up the main stairs to the second floor and then she ran out the main hallway. Jessica said she didn't see the TCM on the outside of the school after the incident. Jessica said she left her maroon East Side backpack by table JJ.

Jessica related that she observed a TCM girl, Alex (unk last name) near tables J or I before the incident happened. Jessica said that the TCM would hang out near the commons area in the cafeteria.

Jessica said Eric Harris took her and Katie Thompson, and Veronica Griffith to lunch approx. two weeks prior to the incident. Jessica said Eric invited her because she was friends with Katie Thompson whom he really liked a lot. Jessica said that Eric was always really nice to her. Jessica didn't remember any unusual statements or behaviors that indicated Eric was going to do this.

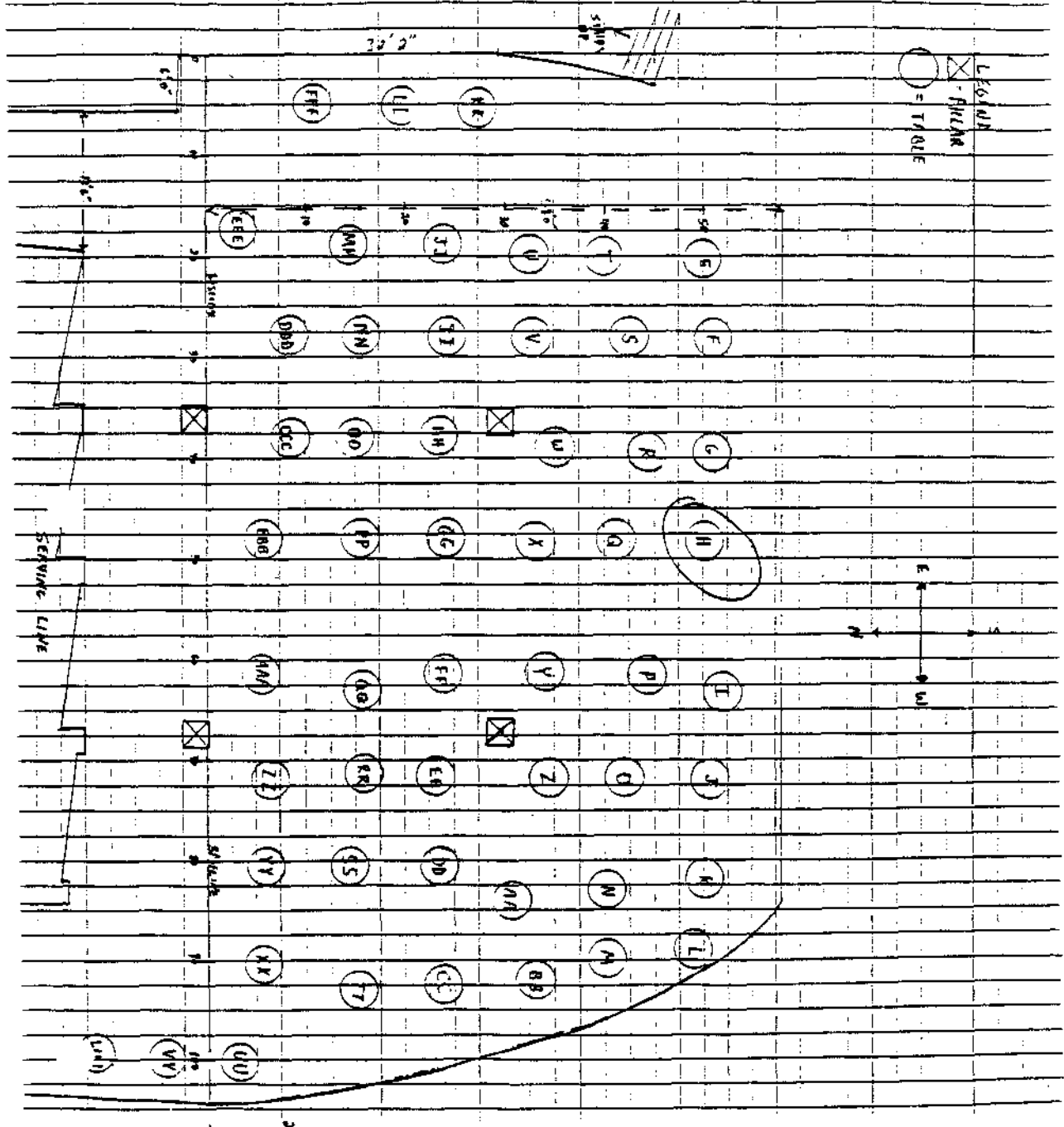

On 4/30/99, Brittany Gillette, DOB 7/16/84, 7871 West Quarto Drive, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. She was interviewed in the presence of her Mother, Marilyn Gillette, DOB 1/20/49. She provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Brittany arrived at school at approximately 7:15 a.m. She went to the cafeteria/commons area to work on a school science project. She noticed many backpacks, and also athletes type duffel bags, but none that stood out of the ordinary to her. There were approximately 75 other students in the area as well. After this, she went to her normal days classes, the last class she had was gym class, but she had a headache, so she went back to the commons to work on her science project at approximately 10:15 a.m. She then stayed in the cafeteria until lunch hour began. She was seated at table II. Seated at the table with her were the following students:

2. Amanda Heningsen
3. Marnee Mack

Marnee Mack and Brittany went up to the lunch line, bought lunch, and returned to their table. Brittany heard people gasping, and she then heard Mr. Sanders yelling for everyone to get down. Outside of the west cafeteria windows, she could see someone in a black trench coat moving around. Her and Marnee then got under their table. While under the table, she could hear shots, and she noted that students began to stand up and run for the stairs. She did the same, but fell as she went up the stairs, and had a difficult time getting up because of an injury sustained from gymnastics. She lay on the stair landing and saw a male in a trench coat that she could not identify come through the door of the cafeteria. He was pointing the gun in her direction and randomly shooting. She was then helped up by an unidentified student, got to the top of the stairs, and with the assistance of this student, ran down the math science wing hallway. At this point, she heard shots coming from near the library, and looked back and heard an explosion from near the library, and saw smoke in this vicinity as well. As she was running down the hallway,

she said that cement chips were flying, presumably from gun fire in her general direction. She exited the building on the east side, and ran across Pierce into the park, and went to the home of Lindsey Blair.

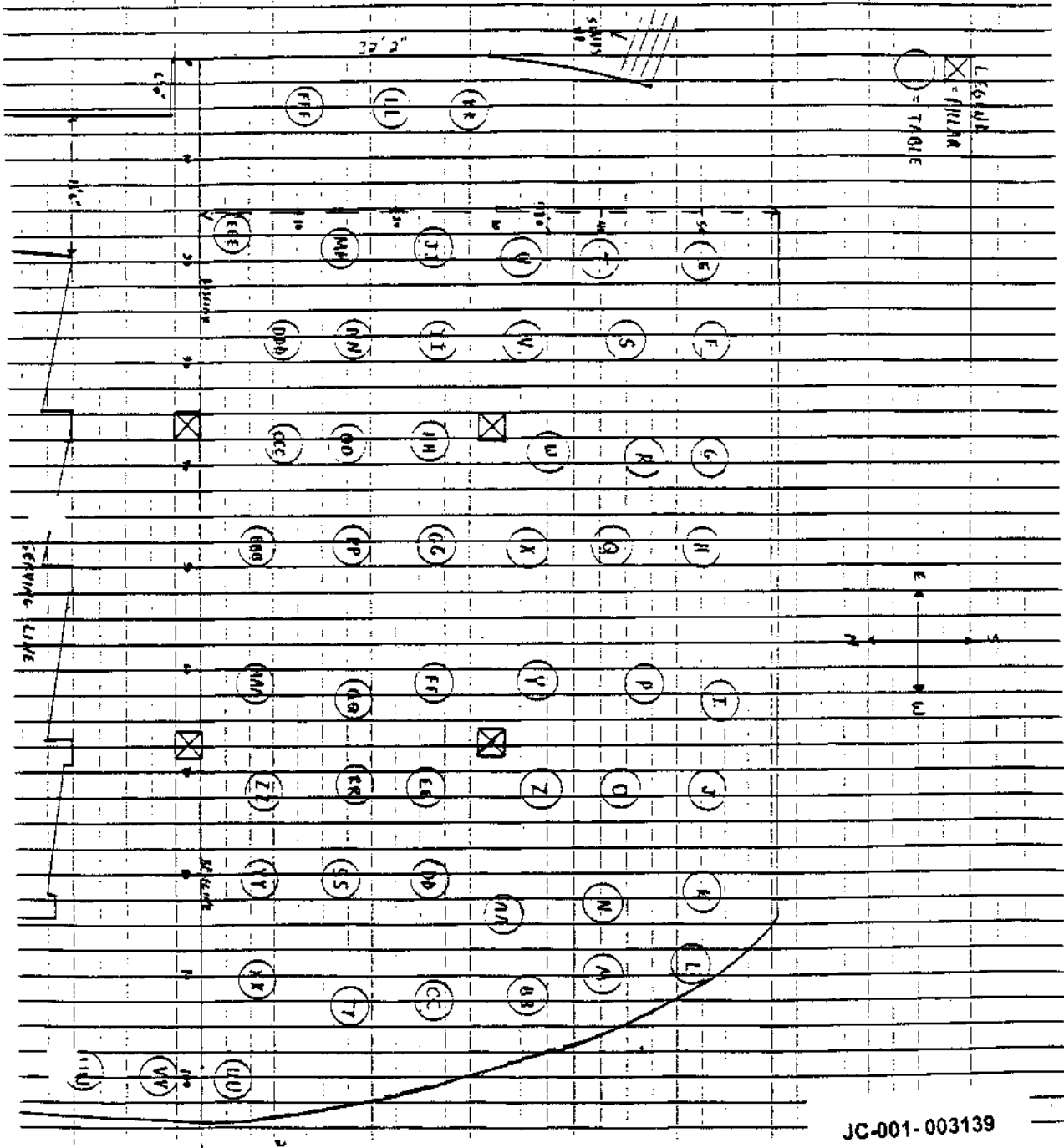
She didn't know Harris or Klebold, nor did she see anyone resembling them on Monday or Tuesday. She has heard of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM), but did not know them or associate with any of them. She does believe however, that two brothers named Nick and Brandon Schott may hang out with the TCM.

During her second period Jewelery class, she and James Helmes were talking about Senior prank day, and how unpleasant it would be. Another student heard them discussing this, and he said "that is nothing compared to what is going to happen". She did not know the name of this boy, but did know that he is a Junior, often wears black pants, a t-shirt and a vest, and has blond hair.

Brittanny does use the Internet, and has a screen name of Britty. She had heard that either Klebold or Harris may have had a screen name of "Red", and may have entered a chat room that she was in 3-4 months ago.

She positively identified a photograph of Dylan Klebold as the gunman who entered the cafeteria on 4/20/99 as related in the interview conducted on 4/20/99.

Plymouth Place that a neighbor of his named "Nathan" told him at 2:00 p.m. the day of the shooting that Corey DePooter was killed in the shooting. Nathan told Gabe that he found that out on news reports when no such reports were aired; Gabe also told her that he saw Dylan's black car and another tan sedan at Nathan's house the morning of the shooting; said Nathan is an "outcast" student who has Marilyn Manson posters in his room, said that Nathan now has moved to Florida with his family.

INVESTIGATION:

On May 5, 1999 at 1930 hours I contacted Sarah Gillings at her home for an interview. Her parents were present. Sarah then told me the following:

- * She is a freshman at Columbine High.

* When asked, she said she has seen Eric Harris around the school halls at times and knew he hung out with trench coat students, but she did not know his name.

* When asked about Dylan Klebold, she said she has also seen him around school but did not know his name. She said that Dylan looks a lot like another trench coat student named Robert. When asked if that last name might be Perry, she said "yeah, that's his name."

* When asked about [REDACTED], she said that he was the student who used to wear a beret. She did not know his name but has heard other students mention his name as a trench coat student. The last time she saw [REDACTED] was about a month ago. She either saw [REDACTED] out front of school or by the commons.

* When asked about [REDACTED] she had never heard that name before the shooting, but has heard it mentioned since.

* She did not know any other names of trench coat students or associates. She thought about 12 to 15 different students wore the trench coat at times. She has heard the name, Trench Coat Mafia, and said it was another name for that social group.

* When asked, she did not see any of the students mentioned above or other trench coat students or associates in the school the day of the shooting.

* She never saw any unusual objects in school the day of the shooting. When asked specifically about a duffle bag, she said that there are always larger sport bags around from students who are in sports. When asked specifically about duffle bags in the cafeteria, she said there were too many backpacks and bags to notice.

* The day of the shooting, she had 4th hour French class in the foreign language area. After getting out at 11:10 a.m., she went directly to the cafeteria and saw a male friend named Chris Lucas

who then walked with her to her locker by the gym so she could get her Walkman. She returned to the cafeteria and dropped her backpack off at a table. She looked at the diagram and thought the table was K. This was confirmed by the backpack location list.

* After dropping her backpack off, she went to the pop machines by the west cafeteria door. She started to walk back to the table and noticed Chris was in the far west lunch line. She turned around and got in line with Chris. She did not see any other students at table K when she dropped off her backpack. She said that her friends usually occupy table K and L for lunch.

* The time now was around 11:15 or 11:20 a.m. She heard what she thought was a car in the lot backfire. She then saw coach Sanders come in the cafeteria from the west door area and tell everyone to, "get down, get down." She did not know where coach Sanders then went. She saw janitors running in the cafeteria also telling students to get down.

* She then got down under a small ledge in the food line with Chris and a Kim Dehart. She heard an explosion, looked out west in the lot and saw the fire and smoke from that explosion. She saw students start to run out of the cafeteria and over the railing to the stairs.

* She decided to leave and went with Chris east along the food line and then got herded in by the kitchen door at the east end of the kitchen. She was with about 30 students. She said there was a lot of screaming and crying from students.

* She may have heard some gunshots, but was not sure. She then heard and felt the next explosion that she thought went off somewhere in the cafeteria because it sounded so close.


* Mr. Andres Jr. and a gray haired janitor who was tall with a mustache then took her group to the door that leads to the back of the stage in the auditorium. They then went up the left auditorium


aisle and out to the main hallway. Once at the hallway, she glanced left and noticed that the set of doors that she thought were fire doors just west of the auditorium door were closed. They went down the main hallway toward the main doors but were herded north down the hallway to the arts area. They then came out the set of doors by the northeast corner of the gym. A Mr. Butts was their also. They then went to "smoker's pit" and then out to Clement park.

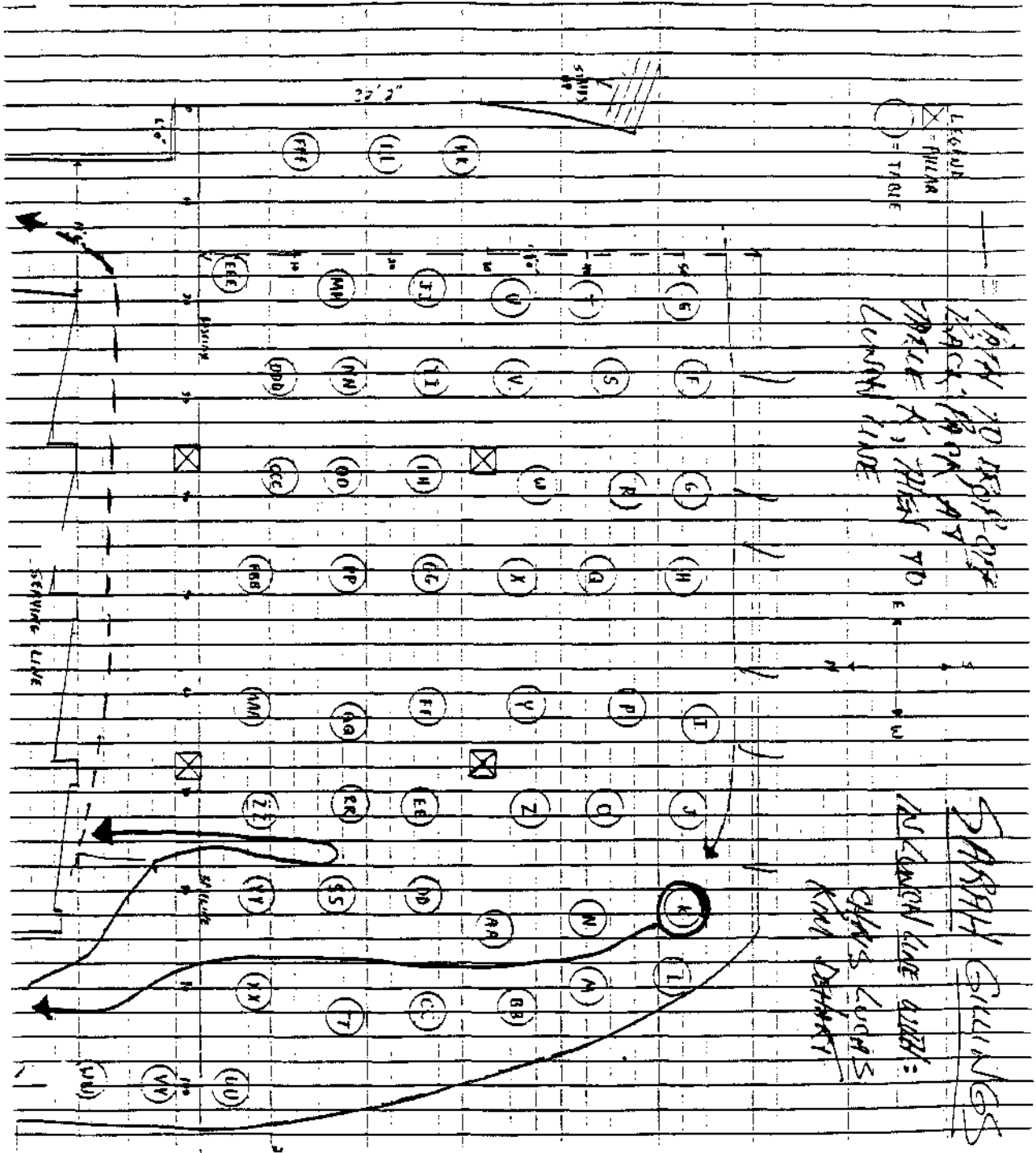
* She thought it took from 5 to 10 minutes to get out of the school from the time the incident began. She was wearing a black tank top, loose fitting jeans and black shoes.

* She then said that she had talked to a neighbor student who lives on Plymouth Place named Gabe Montoya. She said that Gabe told her that the Nathan who lives on his street told him at 2:00 p.m. the day of the shooting that Corey DePooter had died. She said Gabe told her that Nathan told him he heard that on the news. She thought that was suspicious because no names were released that early. She said that she has seen this Nathan before and described him as tall, skinny, oval face, with black buzz cut hair. She said that Gabe also told her that he saw what he thought was Dylan's small black car and another tan sedan at Nathan's house the morning before the shooting. She said that Nathan dresses normal but apparently has Marilyn Manson posters in his room. She said that Nathan has since moved to Florida with his parents.

On 05-05-99, contact was made with Alexandra Goldberg at her residence at 5415 Sunset Dr., Littleton, CO. She confirmed being a freshman at CHS and being in attendance on 04-20-99. She confirmed being assigned to "A" lunch and noted arriving in the cafeteria at 1110. She noted being seated at table "V" with Sara Filipiak, Lindsey Blair, Loren Bayer, Julie Nasiund and Nicole Wray. She was first made aware of trouble, when she saw a number of students in the west part of the cafeteria getting under tables. She initially thought it was a big fight, then heard a janitor run through the area yelling that someone had a gun and for everyone to get down.

She reports getting under the table for about 30 seconds then ran up the stairs as other students began exiting the cafeteria. She ran up the main stairs, past the library and started down the main hallway towards the exit, when she observed the windows in these exterior doors shatter. She does not recall hearing gunfire in this area. She and 5-6 other students turned around ran towards the auditorium where they hid for 1-2 minutes before exiting a north door with another student, Salli Melfi.


Once outside she proceed to Clements Park, eventually calling her mother and leaving the area.

On 5/5/99, Daniel Gonzales, DOB 2/5/83, 7339 South Zephyr Way, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. He was interviewed in the presence of his Mother, Valerie Hightower, DOB 8/4/59, he provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Daniel reported to Columbine High School at 6:30 a.m. for a football weight workout which was held in the school weight room. After the workout, he went to the cafeteria/commons area for breakfast at approximately 8:10 a.m. There were approximately 30-40 students in the cafeteria at this time. He didn't notice any large duffel bags that stood out to him, or notice anyone carry any duffel bags into the cafeteria. After he ate, he went to his normal morning classes. His last class prior to first period lunch was his science class.

Directly after science class, Daniel went to the cafeteria via the stairs near the library. Again, Daniel didn't notice any duffel bags in the cafeteria that stood out to him. He located himself at table JJ or possibly U, bought his lunch, and then returned to his table. He was seated at his table with the following individuals.

1. Mike Leary
2. Dusty Hoffschneider
3. Johnathan Caruso
4. Pat Simmington

After he finished eating, Daniel noted approximately six freshman run into the cafeteria from the west side area. He then heard an individual named Justin Norman yell that someone just got shot. An explosion and a shot were heard while a janitor was yelling for everyone to get down; the janitor came in from outside of the school. Daniel and his friends then got down under the table. Next, students began getting up and running towards the stairs. The group that Daniel was with ran to the elevator, got on and took it to near the library upstairs. However, when the elevator opened, they saw a lot of smoke near the library, and rode the elevator back down. From there, they went into the auditorium with Coach Andres Jr., and a janitor. The janitor locked all the

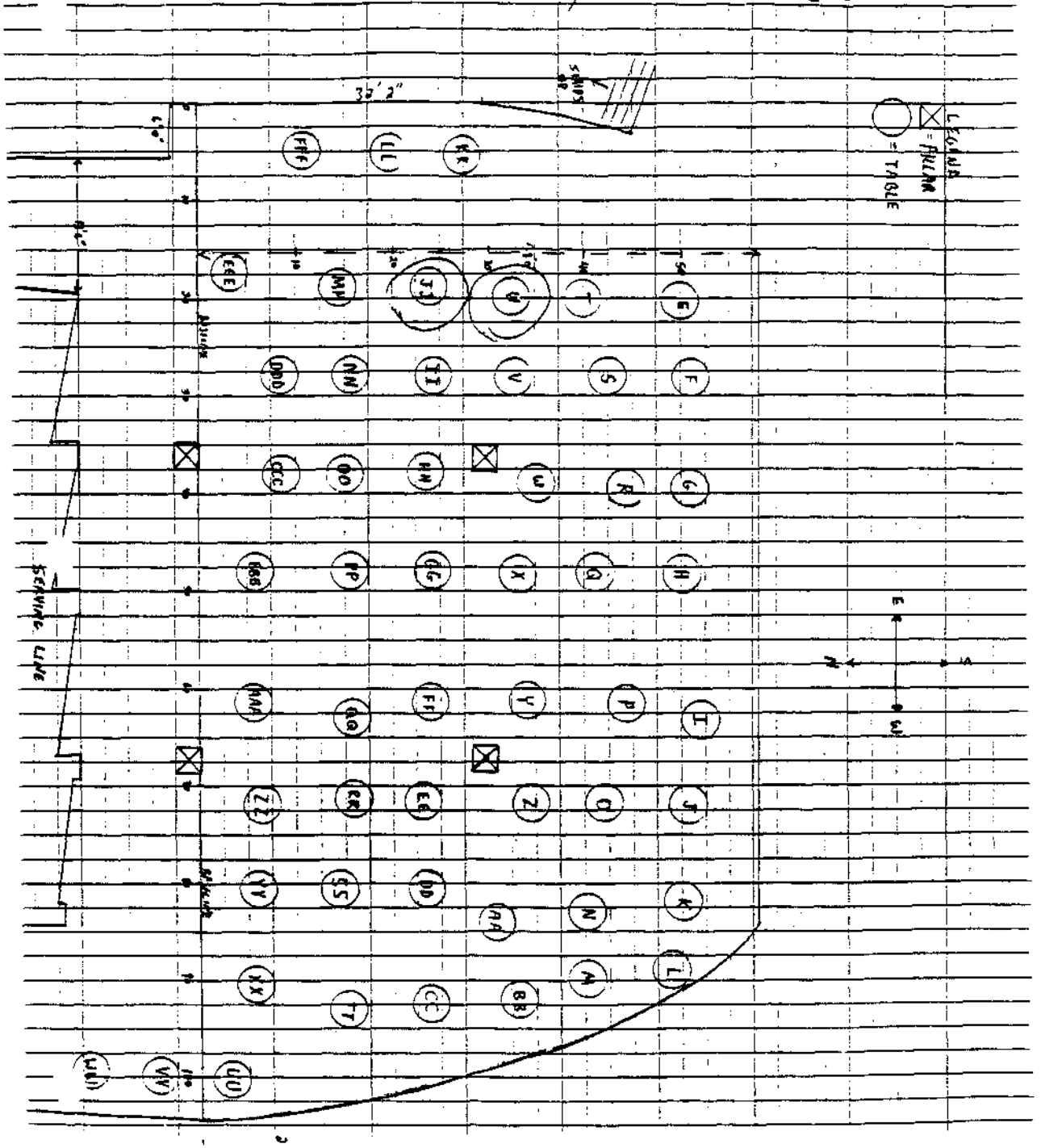

Rebecca Anne Goodwin, DOB 01/20/1983, 7754 West Plymouth Place, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)973-2746, a sophomore at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her mother, Margo Goodwin, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Goodwin provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Goodwin got out of Algebra II, located in the math department, and went to her locker, which is located directly outside the math department in the south main hall. Goodwin was with her friend, Lauren Bonin, and walked directly from her locker down the stairs to the cafeteria. Goodwin then sat down at a lunchroom table (marked NN on diagram sketch). Goodwin recalls that Kristen Sheffield, Lara Kenney, Andrea Launer, Niki Lawson, Katie Sullivan, and Sarah Dodrill were also seated at her table. Goodwin was sitting facing southwest. Lara Kenney was sitting to Goodwin's left and Kristen Sheffield was sitting to her right.

Goodwin did not get lunch and just sat and talked to her friends. After Goodwin had been sitting approximately five minutes, Goodwin noticed Mr. Brookfield hurry east along the north side of the cafeteria carrying a tray of food. Mr. Brookfield was hunched down and quickly set down his tray on a nearby table. A janitor along the north side of the cafeteria then started yelling and telling people to get down and not to get up. Goodwin and her friends got under the table and stayed there approximately 30 seconds. Goodwin heard several pops coming from outside the west side of the cafeteria. Some male students on the east end of the cafeteria then started yelling for everyone to get out.

Goodwin left the auditorium by running up the stairs, east down the south main hall, and into the auditorium from a door on the southeast side. There was a teacher in the auditorium who was telling the students to hide in the back of the auditorium. Goodwin estimates that there were 30 students in the upper end of the auditorium. Goodwin saw Stefania Ubowski and Samantha Haviland hiding in the auditorium as well. Goodwin

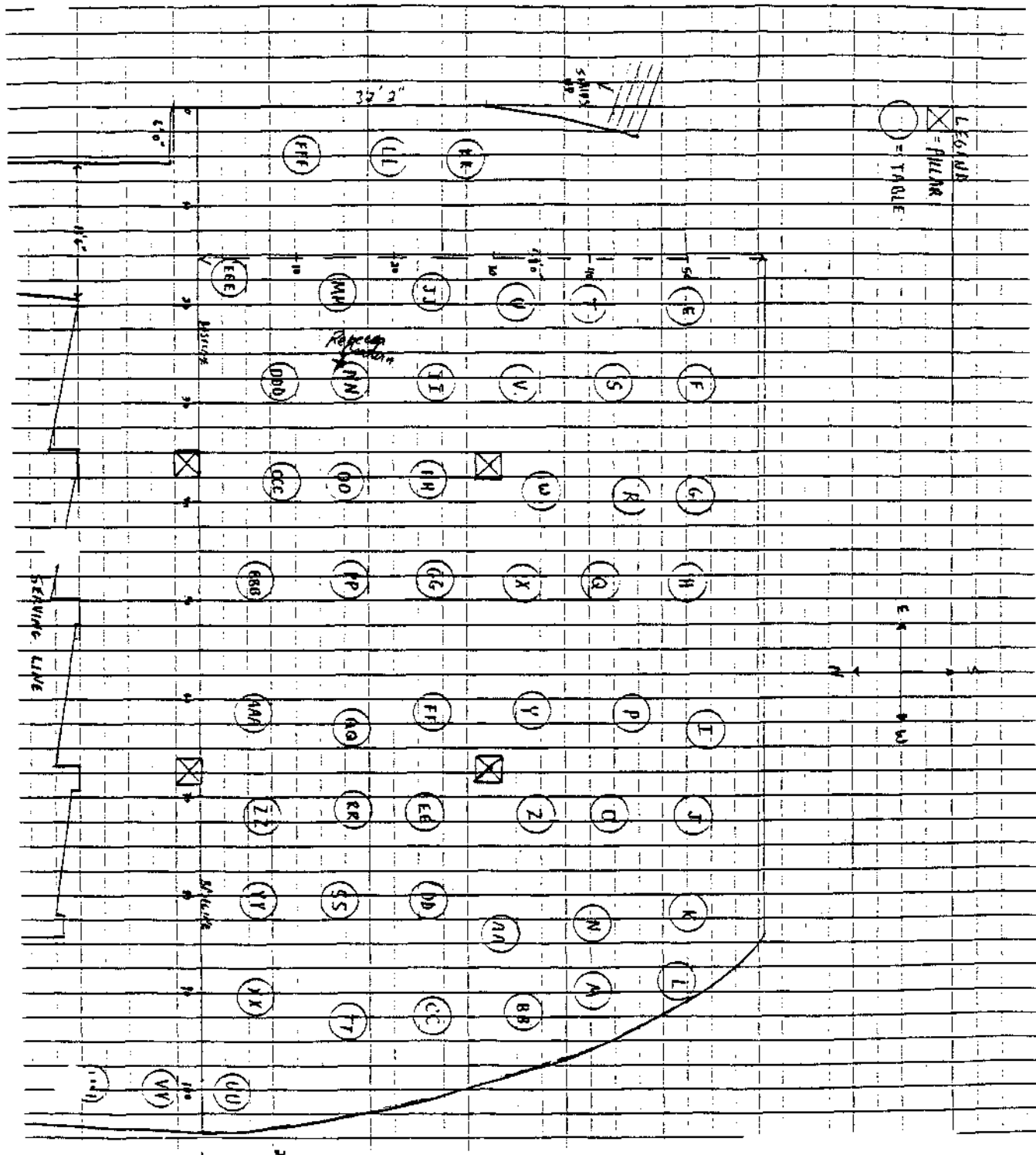

was in the auditorium only a few minutes, when Michelle Romero grabbed her hand and they ran out the northeast door of the auditorium into the north main hall. There were a lot of students in the hall. Goodwin and Romero ran east down the north main hall toward the main entrance to the school. When they were 10-15 feet from the inner door of the main entrance, one of the windows on the left side of the door shattered. Goodwin does not know what made the window shatter. Goodwin and Romero continued out the main entrance, through the teachers' parking lot, and to Clement Park. Goodwin recalls that Mr. Peterson was in the teachers' parking lot directing the students to Clement Park.

Goodwin was not in the cafeteria at any other time that day. Goodwin did not see the gunmen and did not see any large duffle bags sitting in the cafeteria during lunch. Goodwin did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia. Goodwin does not have an Internet screen name.

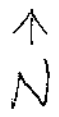

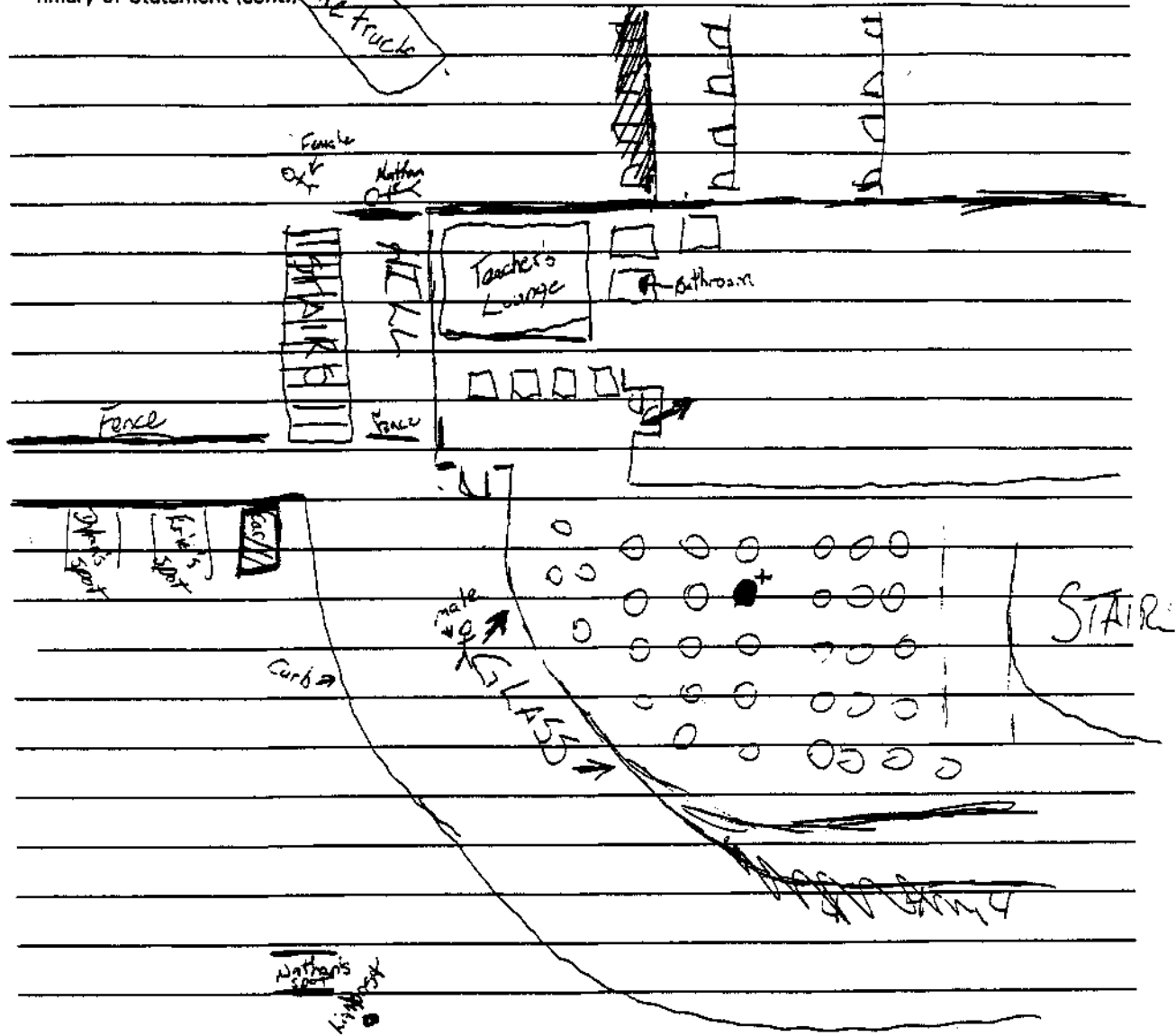

INVESTIGATION:

On May 6, 1999, at about 1820 hours, I responded to 7912 South Otis Court to interview witness Bryan Grande and his father. witness Gary Grande, in reference to the shooting at Columbine High School on 4-20-99. Bryan Grande told me the following He said on 4-20-99, at about 1115 hours, he arrived at the cafeteria at Columbine High School. Bryan Grande said he was carrying his backpack (a green backpack unknown brand with one of the straps broken).

He said that he went to a table located on the southwest corner of the cafeteria where he put his backpack down on the floor under

the table. Bryan Grande said he was with the following other students. Heather Wrabetz and Stephanie (unknown last name). Bryan Grande said that he was facing in a northwesterly direction when he heard two to three what he described as pops from outside of the cafeteria and when he looked out of the windows he saw a female fall to the ground outside of the cafeteria. Bryan Grande said he did not know who this female was, but believed it was a student. and said a male student, who he knows as Jason Otenwreath, was helping this female. Bryan said he did not know what happened to Jason due to the fact that he got underneath the table when told to do so and hid. He said other students began to stand up from the tables and run toward the stairs, which was east of their current location. Bryan Grande said behind his table and to the east a few feet was a trash can by an exterior door. He said he hid behind this trash can for an estimated 45 minutes. Bryan Grande said during his time behind the trash can he estimated that he heard 30 to 40 other gunshots and they sounded like they were coming from the library. He described the sound as coming from above his location, which he said would be the library on the second floor of the high school. Bryan Grande said at no time did he see any of the suspects, nor did he see anyone with a weapon. He said while he was hiding, however, he heard somebody say, "Let's shoot up." He said he does not believe they were referring to narcotics, but rather getting ready to shoot their weapons. He also said he heard the name "Dominic" mentioned, but he did not know who that might be. Bryan said she does not know anyone named "Dominic." I asked Bryan Grande if he considered running from the trash can to the exterior door of the cafeteria that was behind him. He stated he did not think to do this because he did not want to take any chance and try to run out if the suspects were in the cafeteria. Bryan Grande said when he saw an explosion take place in the cafeteria, he stood up from behind the trash can and ran out of the door behind him, exiting the school through the cafeteria. Bryan Grande said he then ran through the senior parking lot and hid behind a car until he was contacted by the police.

I asked Bryan Grande about the "Trench Coat Mafia." He advised me that he does not know any members of the "Trench Coat Mafia," nor did he know any of their names prior to this incident. He did say approximately two weeks before this incident he may have seen a student carrying a blue duffle bag in the school and he said this student was a male, possibly. Bryan said he does not recall any other further information about where in the school it was being carried or any other description of the item being carried.

Bryan Grande advised me that on 4-20-99 he was wearing a black T-shirt that has three to four buttons on the front of it, blue jeans, and blue high top tennis shoes.

He said he does not know anybody with a double pierced eyebrow. He said he does have the Internet in the house, however, it has been broken and not usable for some time. I gave Bryan Grande a business card and advised him that if he needed to talk with anybody, such as a counselor or Victim Advocate to call me and I would make those arrangements for him. Bryan said he believes he was doing okay, but if he has any problems he will get in contact with me in the future.

DISPOSITION: Case remains open, pending further investigation.

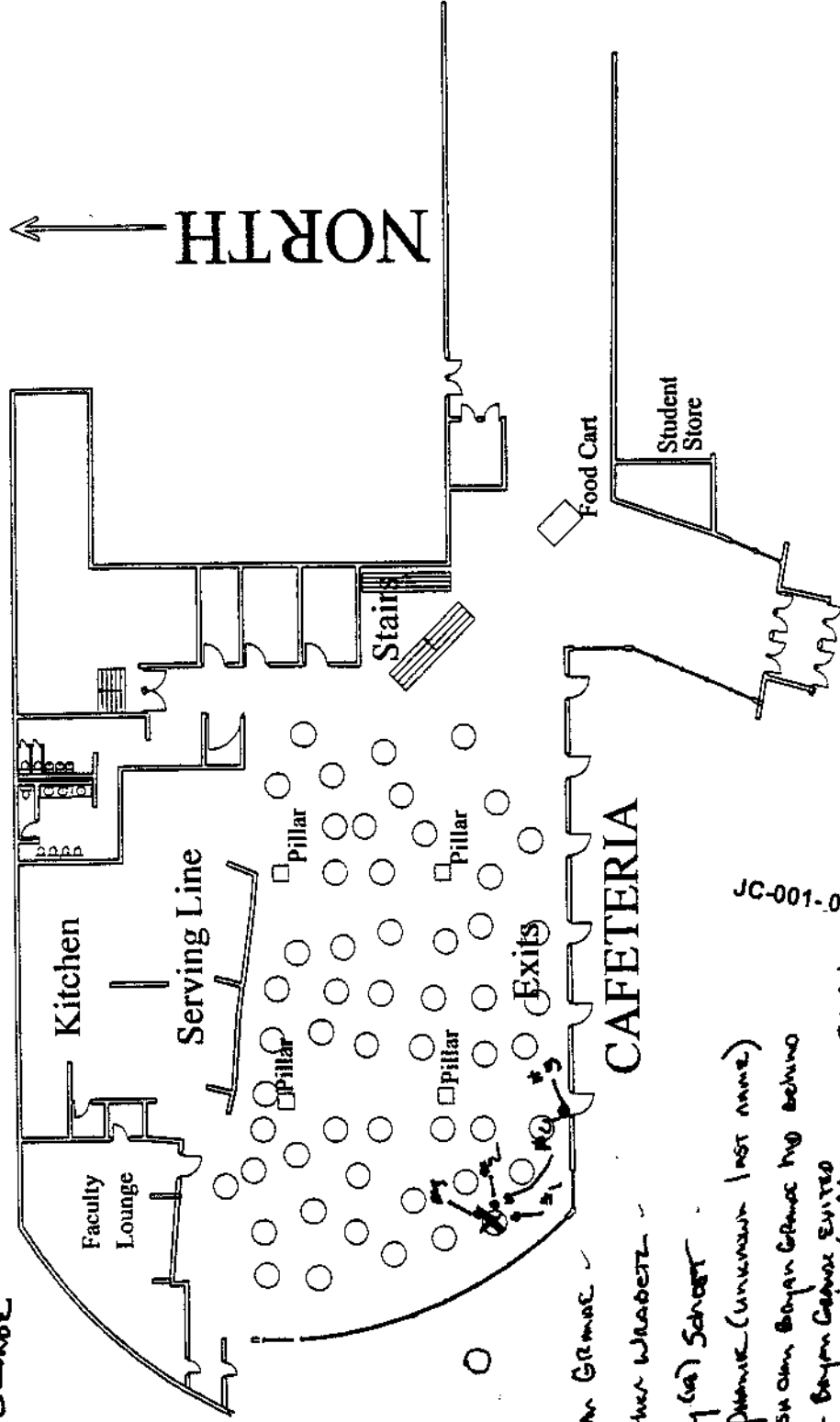

INVESTIGATION:

On May 6, 1999, at about 1820 hours, I responded to 7912 South Otis Court to interview witness Candace Grande, along with her father, witness Gary Grande, in reference to the shooting at columbine High School on 04-20-99. Candace told me the following: She said on 4-20-99, between 1115 and 1117 hours, she arrived into the cafeteria at Columbine High School. She said at that time she was wearing a yellow "Old Navy" backpack with a stuffed penguin attached to it, about the size of a baseball, and she said she also had a clear tupperware container. Candace Grande said she put the backpack underneath the seat she was sitting at and brought out the tupperware container which had her lunch in it. On a map of the cafeteria of Columbine High

School, Candace Grande showed me where she had been seated. This was a table along the south side of the cafeteria and west of the stairs. She said her table was closest to the doors on the south side of the cafeteria that lead outside. Candace Grande said she was at this table with the following other students. Jennifer Arzola, Matt Bruce, Andrea Elsner, and Ben Schuman. Candace Grande said approximately two minutes after sitting down, a fellow student named Ben Schuman came running to their table from the student store, located in Columbine High School, and said, "Someone go shot." Candace Grande said the janitor inside the cafeteria yelled at everybody to get down on the ground and underneath their tables, which is what they did. Candace Grande said approximately one to three minutes later several students got up from under the tables and began running in a north easterly direction toward the stairs that lead to the upper part of Columbine High School. Candace Grande said that as she got to the top of the stairs she heard three what she called gunshots that sounded like, "pop, pop, pop" and she said they sounded to her like they were coming from the downstairs part of the high school. Candace Grande said after running to the top of these stairs she turned to her left and ran down the school until she got to the exterior doors and exited the school. Candace Grande said she ran from the school, across Pierce, and into Leawood Park, where several other students were at. Candace Grande said while in Leawood Park she heard what she believed was a bomb that detonated inside of the high school.

Candace Grande advised me that until this incident she knew nothing of the "Trench Coat Mafia," nor did she know any of the members or activities. Candace said about one to two weeks prior to this incident she saw a male subject she described as tall, approximately 6'2", wearing a black baseball cap backwards that had a red bill, and said he it was a male subject and he was wearing a dark colored trench coat. As far as Candace Grande could remember, this party was alone and at the time was walking down a hallway in Columbine High School by himself. She said on 4-20-99, prior to or during this incident, she did not see any people wearing trench coats or other clothing that the the "Trench Coat Mafia" students wear.

Candace Grande said that on 4-20-99, the clothing she was wearing was a white men's dress shirt, worn over a black tank top, gray pants, and brown sandals. She said she did not see any duffle bags or the propane tanks in the cafeteria on 4-20-99. Candace Grande said she does not know of any other students or other people that may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or in possession of firearms. Candace Grande said she does not know anybody at Columbine High School with a double pierced eyebrow.

Candace Grande advised that while she was running from the top of the stairs to exit the school, the shots that she described may possibly have come from the library or the commons area. She said either one could be possible, she does not know.

Candace Grande said when she was in Leawood Park she did not hear any gunshots directed towards the students in the park, nor was she aware that anybody had believed they had been shot at in the park. She said she went with Matt Bruce eastbound on Fair to Gray Street, where Kevin Kuoni picked them up and took them to Matt Bruce's place. It was at Matt Bruce's place where Candace Grande contacted Gary Grande by telephone.

I gave Candace Grande a business card and advised her if she needed to talk to a JCSO Victim Advocate to contact me and I would make those arrangements for her. She did say that she has been in contact with a counselor through a private organization.

DISPOSITION: Case is open, pending further investigation.

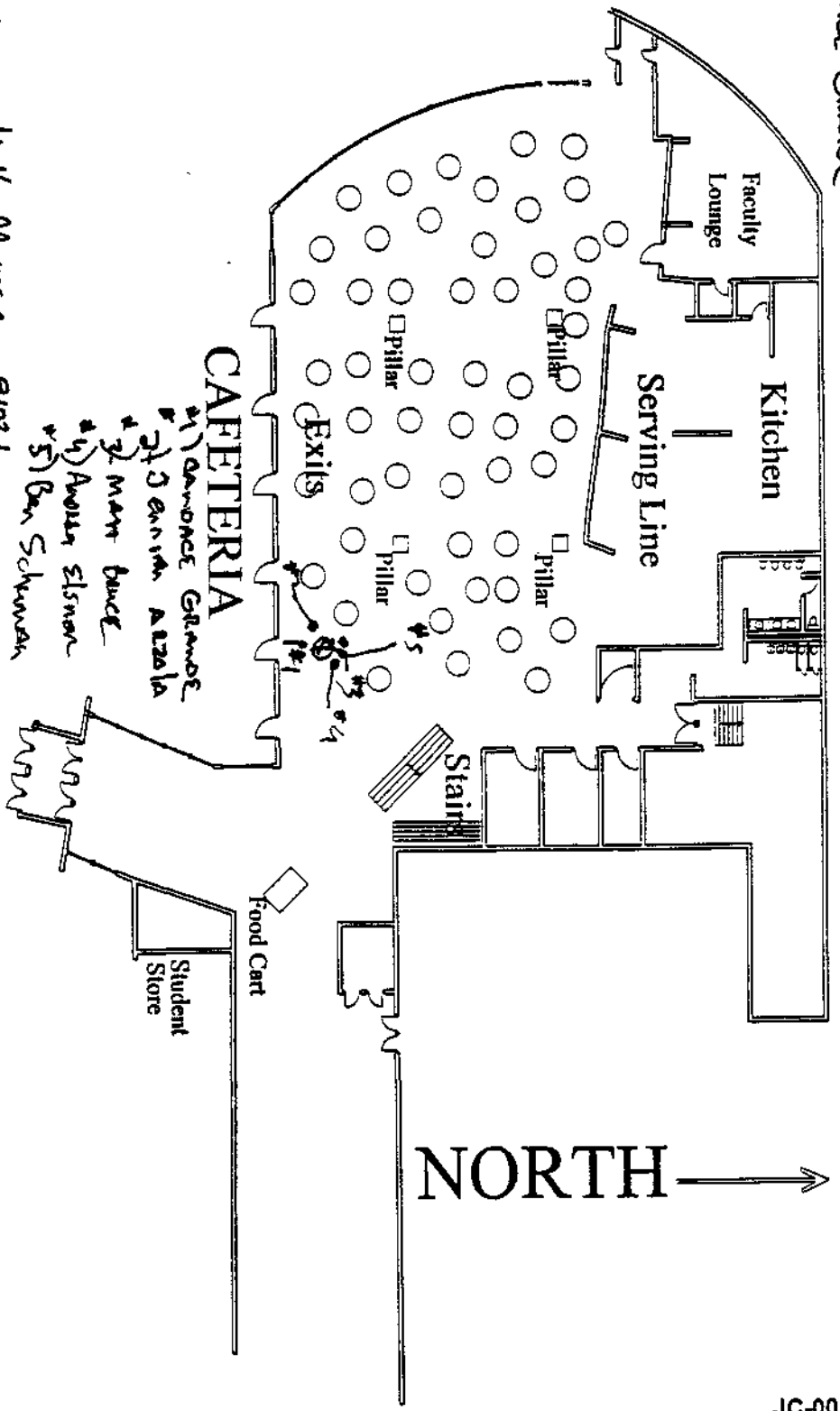

Daniel R. Grange, DOB 03/09/1984, 5484 South Hoyt Street, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)979-0265, a freshman at Columbine High School, was interviewed at his home in the presence of his mother, Dixie Grange, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Grange provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Grange got out of Spanish class, taught by Mr. Freund, and left the foreign language department and went directly to the cafeteria. Grange sat down at a cafeteria table (marked BB on the diagram sketch). Also sitting at the same table as Grange, were Spencer Wright, Aaron Wright, Seth Dubois, and Michael Huntington. Grange was sitting facing west with Aaron Wright sitting to his left. Grange does not remember who was sitting to his right.

Grange had not gotten his lunch yet, when he heard a pop, which sounded like a firework outside the cafeteria. Grange looked out the west windows of the cafeteria and saw a boy running up the hill to the northwest of the cafeteria. Grange estimates that the boy was about 40-45 feet away from the building. Grange was unable to describe the boy further. Grange did not see anyone else outside the cafeteria. Grange thinks that someone then yelled for everyone to get down. Grange got down under his table. While under his table, he observed an explosion next to a black Honda Passport in the parking lot approximately 30-35 feet from the building. Grange does not think anyone was around the explosion.

After the explosion, someone told the students to run. Grange grabbed his backpack and got up and ran up the stairs to the main level. Grange saw Mr. Sanders lying about 15 feet to the right of the top of the stairs. He was struggling to get up and had blood coming out of his mouth. Just east down the main hallway, a teacher, Ms. Miller, was directing students into the science area and Grange ran into a classroom in the southwest corner of the science area.

There were about 60 students hiding in the classroom, including a teacher, Mr. Friesen. After a few minutes, Mr. Sanders came in and fell just inside the door. They locked the classroom door and used their shirts to try and stop the bleeding on Mr. Sanders. There were no other injured in the classroom. The class huddled in the classroom for approximately three hours. Grange did not see the gunmen, but thinks that at some time they did go into one of the science classrooms east of where he was and tried to start a fire by turning on the gas and throwing a bomb.

After three hours, a SWAT team came and evacuated them from the classroom. The SWAT team made them all put their hands on their heads and sent them out down the stairs and out the school by the faculty lounge. Once outside the students waited for police cars to take them to Clement Park.

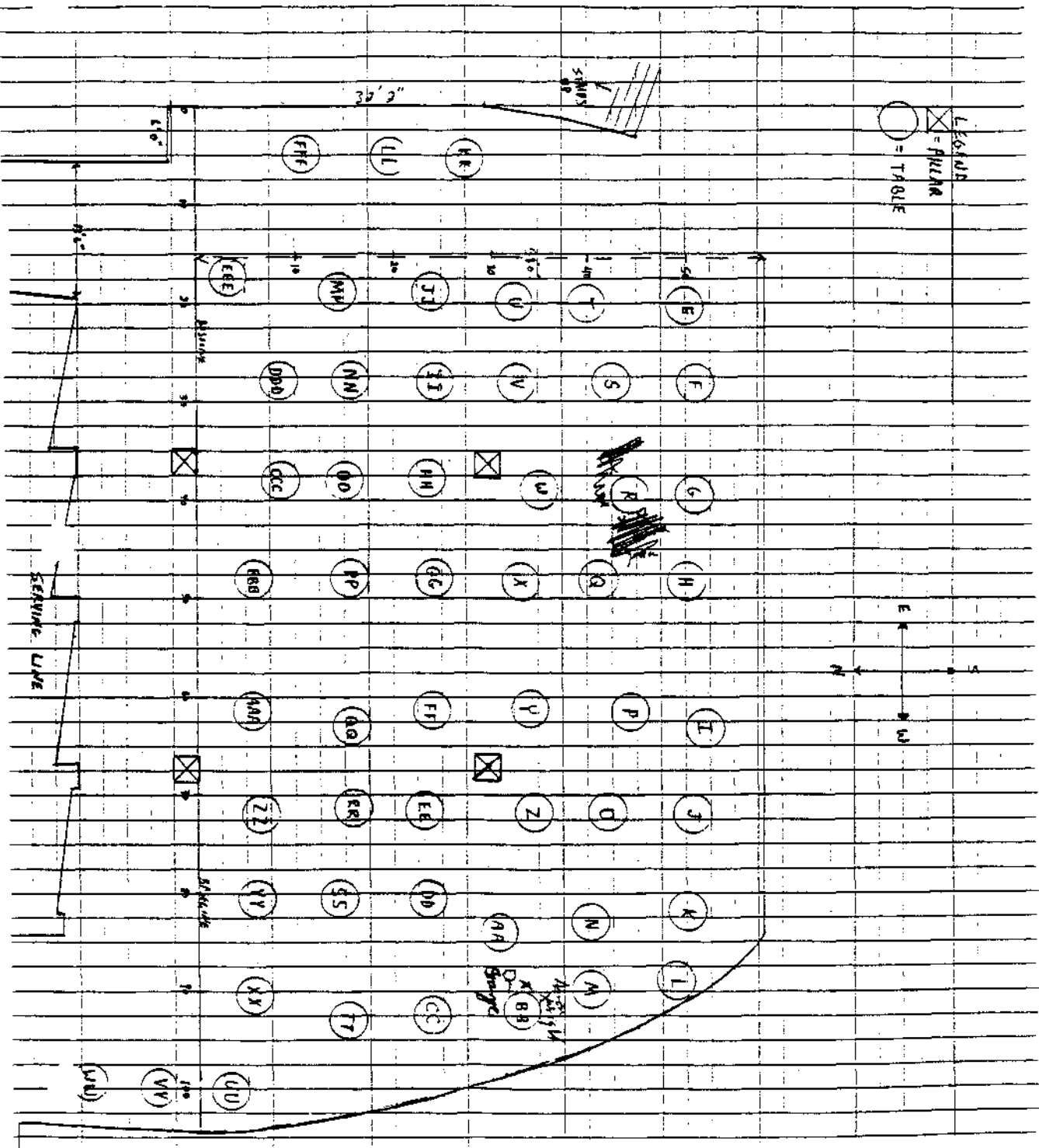
Grange was also in the cafeteria before first period with Spencer Grange, Aaron Wright, Spencer Wright, and Spencer Taylor. They were sitting in the vicinity of the table marked H on the diagram sketch. The cafeteria was approximately two-thirds full at that time. Grange did not remember seeing any large duffle bags sitting in the cafeteria before first period or at lunch. Grange did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of the other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia. Grange did not see any of the gunmen during the shooting.

Grange is aware that his friend Aaron Wright saw one of the gunmen in the parking lot prior to the shooting with a large black duffle bag. On the day of the shooting, Grange was wearing khaki shorts, bright blue shirt, white socks, and white and blue shoes. Grange may also have been wearing a Cleveland Indians hat.




On 04-27-1999, contact was made with Samuel Granillo regarding his observations on 04-17-99. He noted being in 1st (A) lunch, seated with Sarah Slater (303-973-5968), at table "YY" as identified on the drawing as prepared by S/A Dirito. He reports no suspicious items in the area of the table. Nor did he observe either suspect or known associates in the lunchroom prior to the incident.

He was first alerted of trouble by Mr Dave Sanders running into the lunchroom from the area of the senior parking lot and yelling "Get Down". He initially thought it to be a fight in the parking lot, and maybe someone had a gun. A very short time later, Mr Sanders ran into the lunchroom a second time and again yelled "Everyone under the tables". He began to exit the lunchroom with other students via the main stairway, when he heard a loud explosion from that direction and turned and ran into the kitchen area where he met 2 kitchen workers, and 14 other students. (Included among the 14 was Sarah Slater, Ricky Green, Heather Leitz and Tanya (LNU).

They all entered a storage room in the kitchen and Granillo barricaded the door, and laid on the floor with his feet against the door. On two occasions, person(s) unk tried to get in the door, but he was able to hold it ed. While in the storage room, on at least 2 occasions he heard someone enter a walk in frig in the kitchen. He heard voices in the kitchen, and described them being in normal tones, but could not understand what was being said. He thought he heard walkie-talkies during this time.

While in the storage room, a 911 call was made and the occupants of the room talked with a dispatcher identified as Heather Leitz's father. They remained in the storage room from 1130 until 1400, at which time SWAT officers broke into the room and escorted them from the school via the teachers

INVESTIGATION:

On 5/4/99 Investigator Reker and I met with Laura Green at her residence, reference the Columbine shooting. I explained to Laura why we were there talking to her today. I asked Laura if she was in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting and she said "Yes" she was. At this time I showed her a sketch of the cafeteria and asked Laura to circle the area where she had been sitting. Laura circled table "KK" and placed an "X" where she was sitting. I asked Laura to tell me what happened that day when she was in the cafeteria. Laura said that she was sitting at the table and saw Mr. Sanders run by telling everyone to get down underneath the tables. Laura said she then heard a gunshot. Laura said everyone stayed under the tables for a short time and then started running up the stairway. I asked Laura if she knew where the gunshots were coming from and she said she believed they were coming from outside by the cafeteria window. Laura said when they ran up the stairs, they went to the choir room. They stayed there for a short time and then she and approximately 60 other students went into the choir office. Laura said that while in the choir office, various students barricaded themselves in there by putting filing cabinets and desks by the door so no one could get in. Laura said someone turned off the lights to make it look like no one was there. I asked Laura how long she was in that office and she said approximately 4 hours until a SWAT team came and opened the door to get them out. I asked Laura if she heard any other gunshots while in the choir office and she said yes, she heard "heavy gunshots" and felt possibly one or two explosions through the flooring of the school. I asked Laura how she exited the building once the SWAT team was there and she said they went through the auditorium to the stage and out the back door towards the cafeteria and then up the stairs and outside.

I asked Laura if she saw any of the shooters and she said no, she did not. I asked Laura what time she was in the cafeteria, and she said approximately 11:00 a.m. I asked Laura if she saw any duffel bags in the cafeteria when she was there and she said, "no". I asked if she saw anyone carrying in large duffel bags and she again said "no". I asked Laura if she saw Eric or Dylan on Monday or Tuesday of that week and she said no, she did not. I asked Laura if she left any of her property in the cafeteria and she said she did leave an Eddie Bauer purple backpack containing her school books and papers. I asked Laura if she had heard any rumors regarding any other suspects, bombs or guns which were involved. Laura said that she remembers talking to a girl in her church, who said she saw a shooter dressed in a white shirt. I asked Laura what the girl's name is and she said Nicole Janda. I asked Laura what she was wearing on the day of shooting and she said she had on a green skirt and blue sweater.

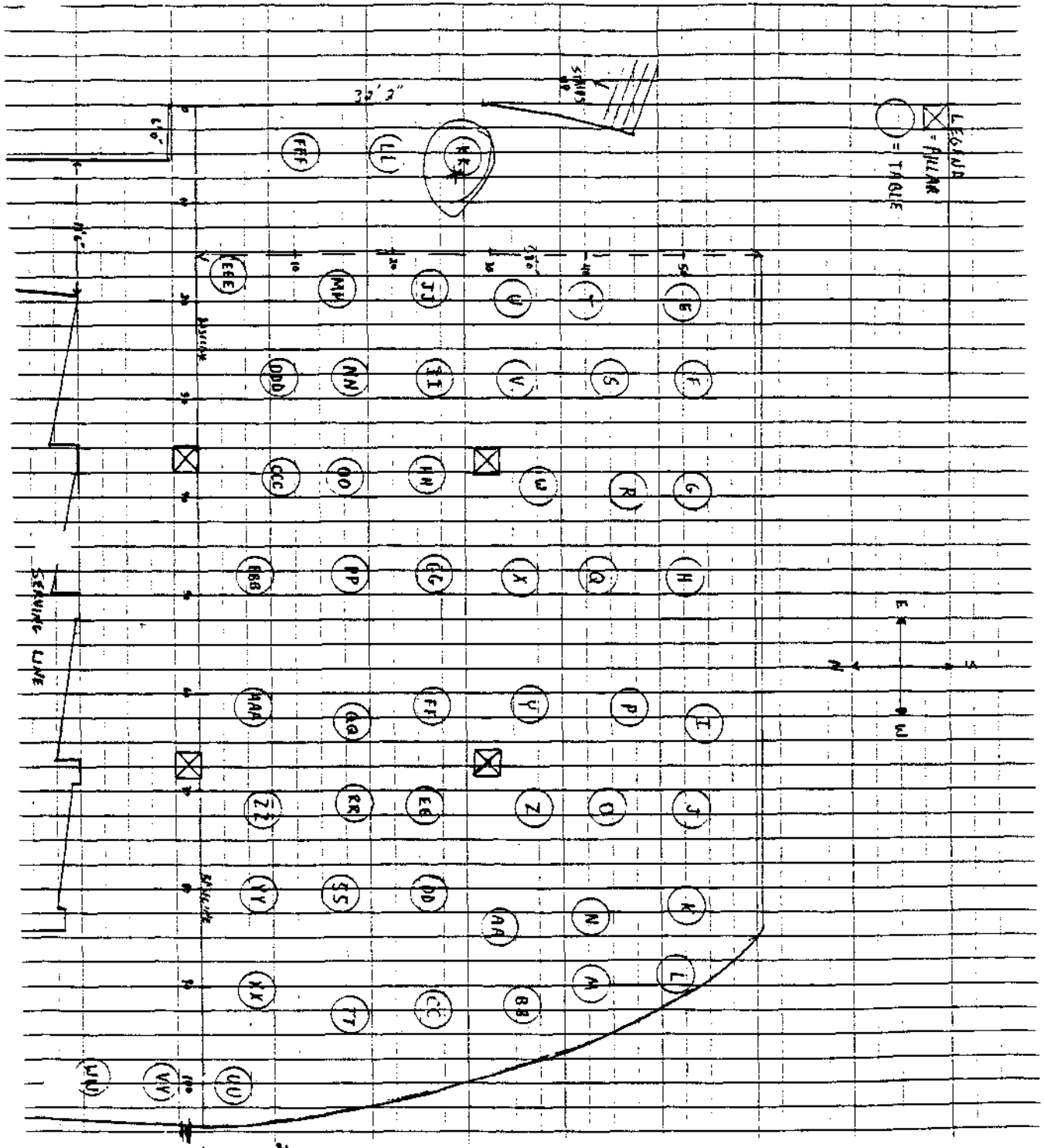

GREEN stated he was eating lunch in the cafeteria when the attack began. GREEN said he and several of his friends were sitting at a table in the middle of the cafeteria, approximately 30 feet away from the west windows. The following students were seated at his table:

- Dustin GORTON
- Greg GARCIA
- Kristin GARAMENO
- Paul ANDREWS
- Sean ROBERTS
- Austin MEARS
- Daniel LAB

According to GREEN, lots of kids started screaming and running into the cafeteria. He then heard gunfire which appeared to be coming from outside. GREEN and his friends took cover under the tables for a short period of time. GREEN and several others then started running for the stairs but they heard gunfire so they turned and ran into the office located in the kitchen. There were approximately 18 people hiding in the office when SWAT team members located the group and escorted them out of the building two hours after the attack began. GREEN stated he did not see any backpacks or bags other than the ones that were with his group of friends. GREEN also stated that he did not see any of the suspected shooters.

On April 28, 1999 at 1200 hours I met with Richard Green and his mother, Polly Green, at 6357 West Geddes Drive in Littleton, Colorado for the purpose of an interview

Richard Green provided the following information about the Columbine High School incident, which occurred on April 20, 1999:

- Rich stated that he left choir class at the 11:10 a.m. bell and went straight to the cafeteria. He stated that the choir room is upstairs near the Library. He stated that he was with Paul Andrews (979-1732) and Brett Kostalnick (973-2199) when he walked down the stairs and into the cafeteria. He stated that they generally went to the same table that they always sit at. Richard identified that table as "RR" of "EE" from the FBI Evidence Diagram. Richard also drew his route of entrance on the diagram as well. Richard stated that he was facing west while sitting at the table.
- Richard stated that he was sitting at the table before the 11:15 bell rang. Richard stated that they "generally put their backpacks down to save their place and then go and get food". He stated that most of them had gotten their food when "everything started to happen". Richard stated that he was "almost done when it started". Richard stated that the following were also at the table:

Paul Andrews
Brett Kostalnick
Greg Garcia (979-8117)
Dustin Gorton
Dan Lab
Kristen Garameno
Shawn Roberts

- Richard stated that Paul, Brett and Greg are all good friends and that the remainder of the people are just kids he "hangs out with at school". He stated that they "all had backpacks except for Dustin Gorton". Richard stated that Dustin sat down right after he (Richard) did. Richard stated that he was wearing beige pants, a white shirt and a navy blue cover shirt. Richard wears glasses and stated that he had them on at the time. He stated that he carries a green backpack with a Star Wars logo on it. Inside the pack were Biology, Language Arts and a Choir book. He stated that he left his backpack on a shelf in the kitchen storage room where he eventually retreated when the gunfire started.
- Richard stated that Mr. Sanders ran inside from the west door near the teacher's lounge and was yelling, "get down". Richard stated that he heard about two or three shots coming from the outside (west side). Richard thought that they were "hand gun shots". He stated that he got under the table and was there for about 30 seconds. He stated that while under the table he only saw the backpacks that belonged to everyone at the table. He stated that he did not see any "large duffel bags".
- Richard stated that they "thought they may be coming inside so they got up and left". He stated that he and Dan Lab started to run towards the stairs and "got about half way" when they heard "three more shots come from the upstairs". He stated that they then ran "into the kitchen and hid in the back storage closet". Richard stated that he did not see the shooters outside or at the top of the stairs.
- Richard stated that there were 18 people in the storage closet including kitchen aids. He named the people that he could remember and they are as follows:



- Richard stated that there was a phone in the room and they tried to call 911 but the line was busy. He stated that Matt Depew called his father, a Police Officer, at his work. He stated that they all stayed low to the ground and barricaded the door with CO2 pop cylinders (blue in color) and also a bunch of pre-packaged food. He stated that several of them put their feet up against the door.
- Richard stated that they could hear somebody outside the door. He stated that he thought it was "just one of them", but didn't know who it was. He stated that this person (s) did not talk. He stated that he heard several "clicks" and thought that this person (s) was "loading a shot gun". He stated that he did hear two "shot gun blasts", but does not know where they were "aimed or if they hit". He stated that they also heard a bunch of "kitchen noises, like pots and pans rattling". He stated that the person (s) was in the kitchen for about 5 or 10 minutes.
- Richard stated that ultimately they were in the storage area for about two hours and that they heard gunfire up until one-half hour prior to their rescue by the SWAT team. He stated that the shots were then "else where" and would "rattle the ceiling tiles". He stated that they all "just stayed low to the ground". He stated that several of the students were starting to get "panicky" prior to their rescue.
- Richard stated that while in the storage area, [REDACTED] told him that it "could be Dylan" and [REDACTED] was on "Dylan's top 10 hated list". Richard said that [REDACTED] told him that [REDACTED] got into a fight with Dylan last year.
- Richard stated that about two hours in to the event, somebody knocked on the door and said they were the SWAT team. He stated that they opened the door slowly and then followed their directions. He stated that they made a human chain, holding on to each other, and went to an area behind the stove. He stated that they then went to the teachers lounge, out the window, hugged the wall and to an area near an ambulance or fire truck.
- Richard stated that he never saw any of the shooters but thought that one of them was upstairs while they tried running for the stairs. He stated that he did not see any of the large duffel bags that we have spoke about. He stated that it "seemed like a normal typical day" up until the event.
- Richard stated that he "knew of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM)", but that he called them "the Trench Coat Posse (TCP) instead". He downplayed the question and laughed, stating "there just a couple of kids trying to dress different". Richard denied Dustin Gorton being "a member or an associate" of TCM/TCP. Richard stated that he has "talked to Dustin Gorton about this since the shootings" and Dustin told him (Richard) before it became public that "it would be Dylan (Klebold) and Eric (Harris)". Richard stated that Dustin mention "a couple of other names too, but later said "it was just the two of them"". Richard denied knowing who "the couple of other names" were.
- Richard stated that Dustin also told him (Richard) that "he (Dustin) knew they (Eric and Dylan) had guns". Richard stated that Dustin said "Dylan and Eric made a video of the guns for their class" or words to that effect.
- Richard stated that he spoke with a Lea Murphy after the shooting. Richard stated that Lea Murphy told him that she "one of the them with a gun and it was not Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold".
- Richard stated that he "knew of Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold", but can't ever remember talking to either of them. Richard stated that he "saw them about two or three days before the shootings in the hall". He stated that he did not see them the day of the shootings.

- Richard did not mention that he had spoken to an agent from CBI the evening before this interview. I told Richard that it was likely that someone from the DA's Office would be contacting him in the future and his mother, Polly Green, stated "Richard doesn't like Government much".

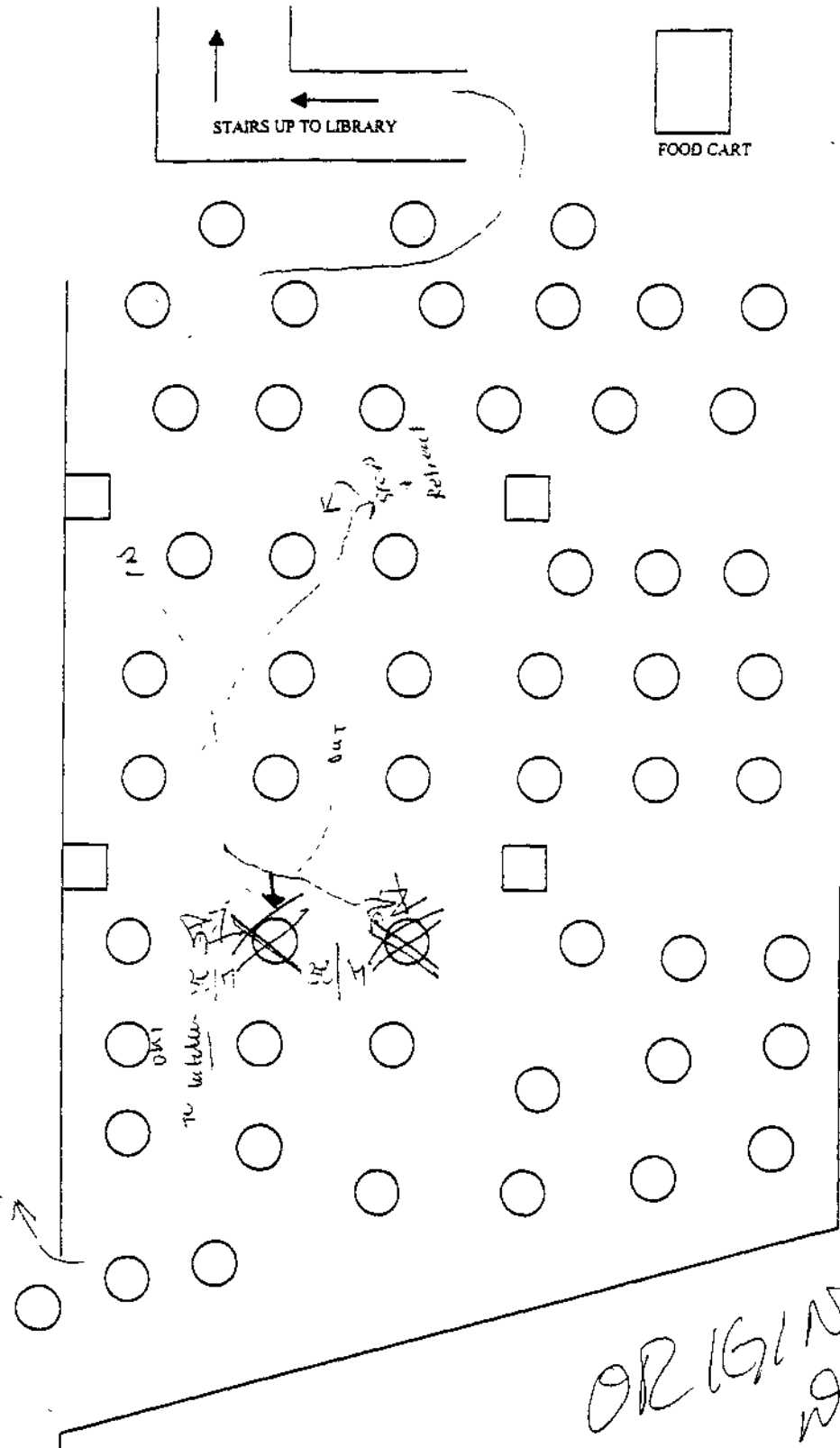
