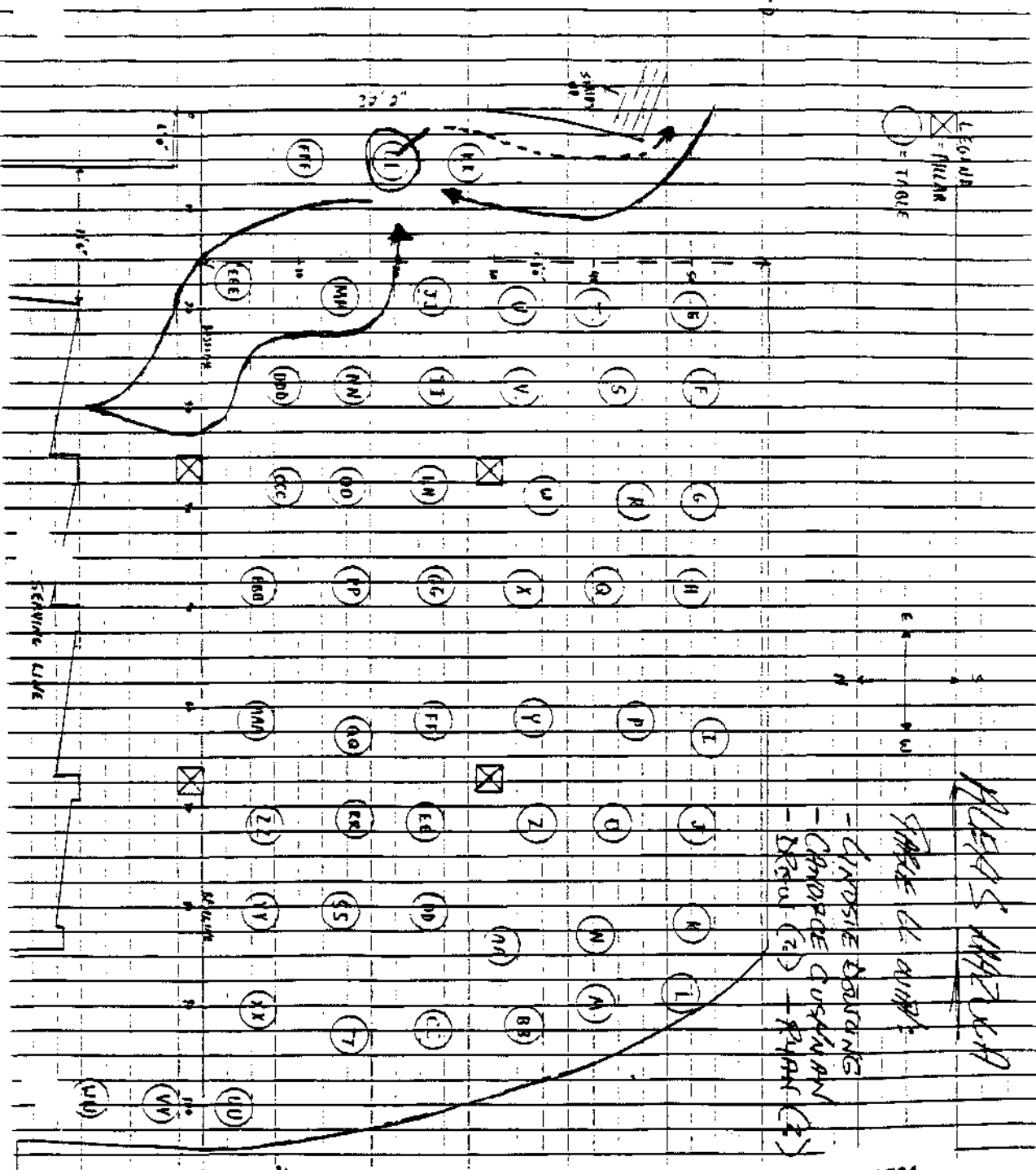

**OBSERVATION/INVESTIGATION:**

On 052499 I contacted Brandon at home by phone, where I told him that I needed to ask him several questions about the shooting. Brandon stated that he would be happy to help. I asked Brandon if he could tell me where he was during 5<sup>th</sup> hour. Brandon stated that he was sitting in the cafeteria at the bottom of the stairs reading a book, when he heard a loud explosion in the parking lot, then he saw a bunch of kids start running. Brandon stated that he got scared and ran down the language arts hall and out one of the doors on the south side then he ran over to Leawood park, then he went home. I asked Brandon if he had seen either of the gunmen, but he replied "no I just got scared and ran"

No further action taken by this Investigator.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 3, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Erica McClaugherty. Erica McClaugherty was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. I contacted Renee McClaugherty, Erica's mother, and made an appointment for an interview for May 10th at 10:00AM.

On May 10th at 0950 I arrived at 7224 West Portland Avenue, and contacted Erica McClaugherty.

Erica confirmed that she is a student at Columbine High School, in the 9th grade, and that she was in the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. Erica related that she arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:00AM, and was sitting at the table identified as "KK". She said that she was sitting with:

- Nick Antonio
- Candice Cushman
- Lindsey Doweling
- Julie McGinley

Erica advised that she was one of the first people in the cafeteria, and when she got there she did not see anything like a large duffel type bag on the floor. She continued to say that while she was in the cafeteria she did not see anyone carry such a bag into the cafeteria.

Erica continued to say that her first indication that there was trouble was when Mr. Sanders came running by telling everyone to get under the table, and the people along the windows began to dive under the tables. Erica said that she got under the table and stayed there until the

people near the windows got up and began running up the stairs. She said that at this time she got up and ran into the choir room. She advised that she went through the upper level of the auditorium and into the north main level hall. From there she went through a hall along the east side of the gym and exited the school building on the north side. She continued to say she ran across the open area on the north side of the school to the tennis courts where she and other students put tables against the fence and climbed over. From there she ran to South Pierce Street and Bowels Avenue, and from there she went to Candice Cushman's house.

Erica reported that while she was in the north hall she heard shots coming from behind her (west). Erica advised that she did not see who was shooting. She further advised that she did not see anyone with guns while she was leaving the school or before the shooting started. Erica advised that she noticed while she was in the north hall way that the glass in the windows in the office area was broken.

Erica reported that she does not personally know anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia, and she has had no dealings with any of its members. She continued to say that none of her friends are associated with the group. She advised that she does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Erica advised that she did not know the names that Harris of Klebold were using on the internet.

Erica reported that she had heard nothing about shootings before they occurred.

Erica advised that she had left her back pack in the cafeteria, and described it as a Black "County Seat". She said the pack contained a camera and binders. Erica did not know the make of the camera.

Erica could provide no further information and the interview concluded at 1020.

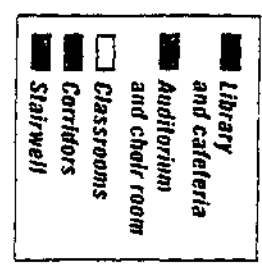
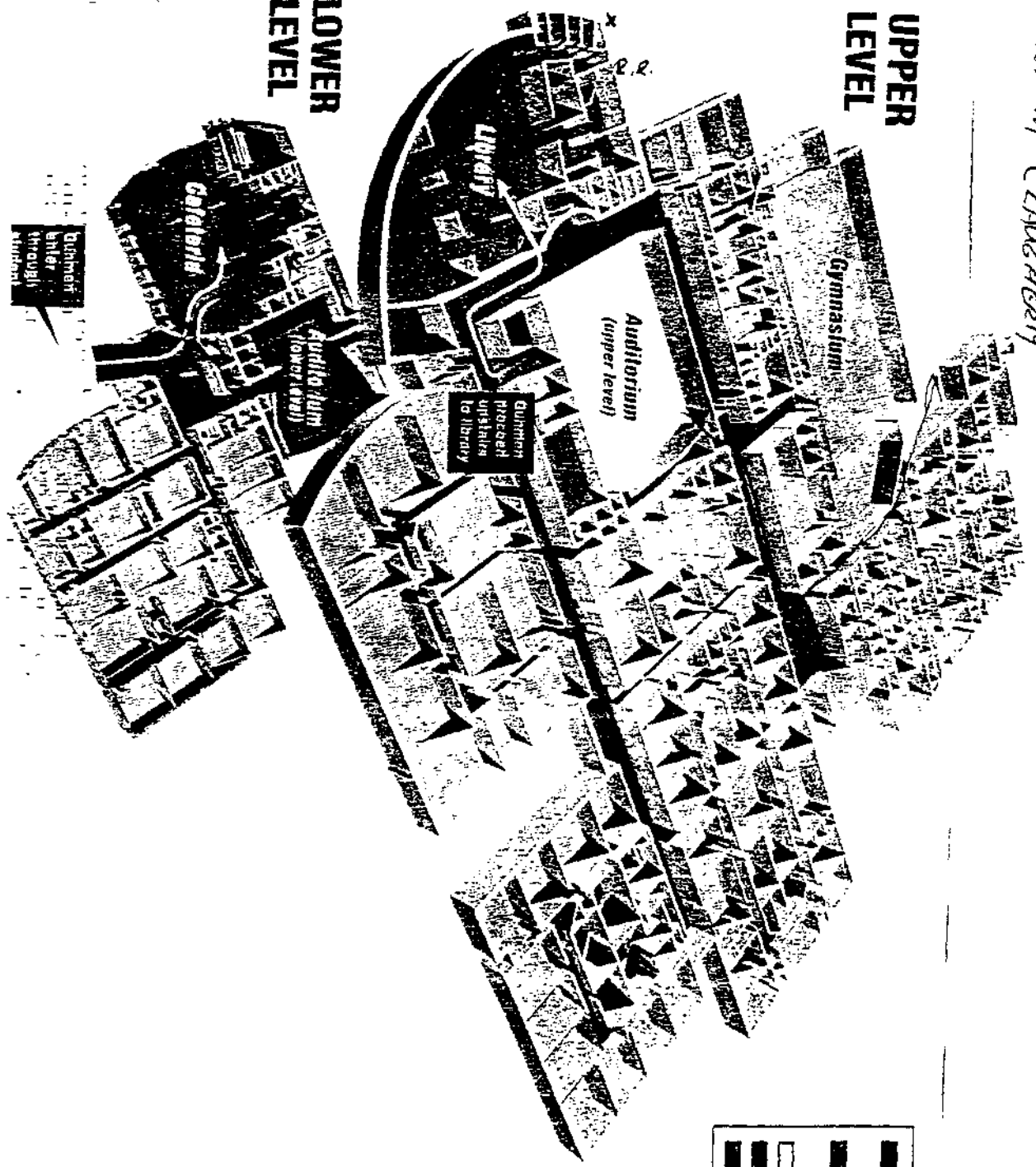

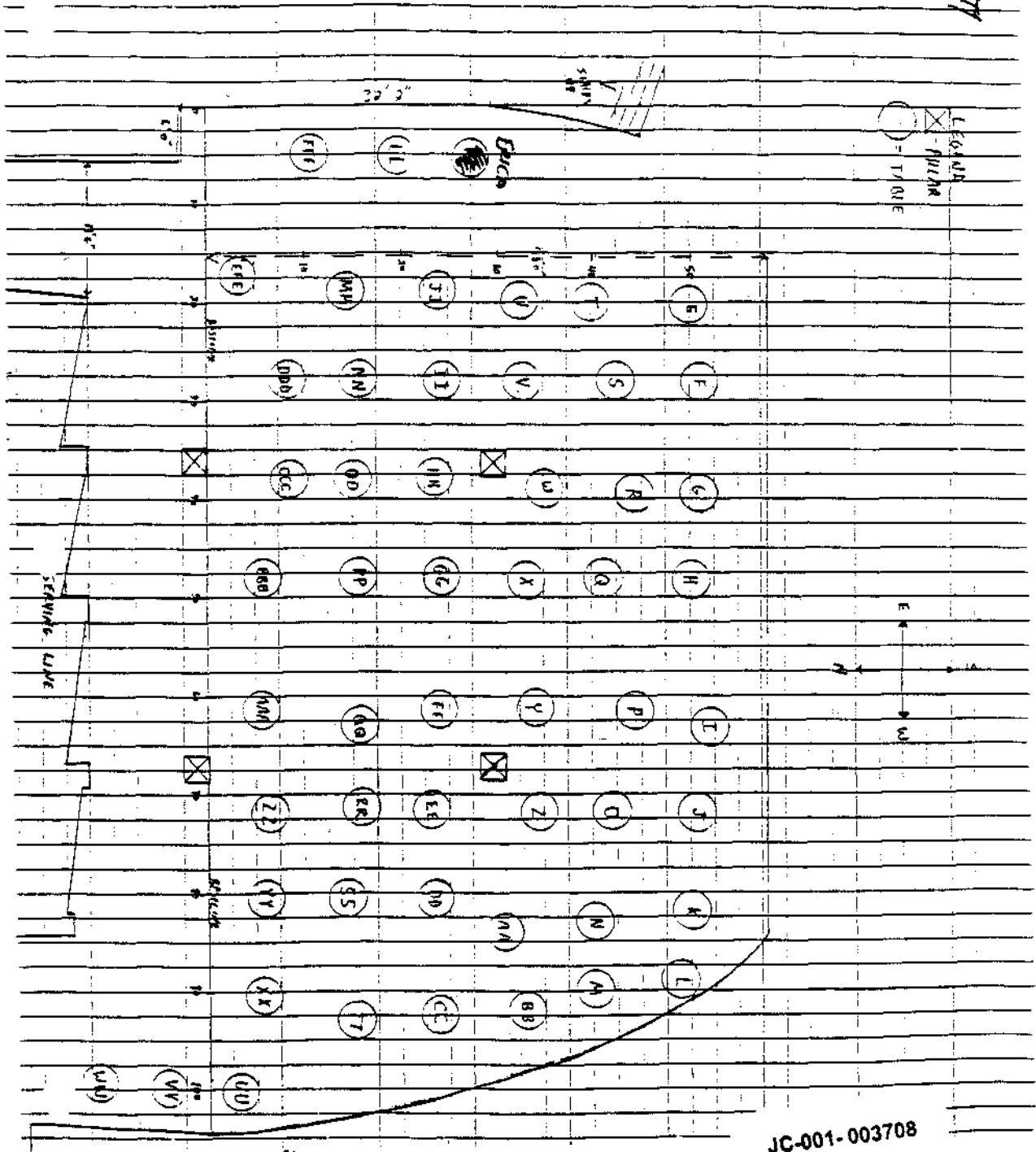

Drew went back to the cafeteria for lunch at about 11:15. He didn't get his food. He sat at table LL, he thinks. He sat with:

Nick Antonio, 978-0639, 7619 W. Friend Ave., Littleton 80123 Dad is Greg (Tony) Mom is Janet

Candice Cushman, 5855 W. Leawood Drive, Littleton 80123, 794-9376 Parents are Bill and Barb.

Ryan Chilelli, 8121 S. Lamar Street, Littleton 80123 979-7727. This may be his dad's office phone. Dad is Robert. Mom is Jacqueline and Erica McClaugherty 972-7485. There may have been a couple of other people there, but he didn't remember who they were.

Drew said that some people had eaten, and they were just sitting there talking. He didn't hear anything. He said that all of a sudden, there was a big hush over the cafeteria and everyone dove under tables. Then, he saw a janitor and Mr. Sanders telling everyone to get down. He got down. He didn't know what was going on. The janitor ran from the east end of the serving line, running south.

Drew said that it seemed like around table AA, people started running toward the stairs and the student store area. Once they got up, everyone got up and ran.

Drew ran to the railing by the stair and dove under one of the railings. On the second tier, he heard gun shots coming from somewhere inside the cafeteria. He heard a boom. He heard several quick bangs. He has done target shooting with a .22 and a shotgun. He said that the shots sounded like they had more power than a .22 rifle. He heard two shots. He heard one of the shots while on the tier and the next one while he was on the third tier. He said that both of the shots sounded like they were coming from the same area. He didn't hear anything else from the cafeteria.

Drew said he saw no smoke in the cafeteria. He did not see anyone shooting. He said that once up the stairs, he ran down the opposite way of the library and out the front door past the choir room.

Drew said that while he was running, he saw shoes and pagers on the ground. He saw a couple of people tripping and falling. Everybody was screaming. He didn't know for sure, but he thought he heard a gunshot or an explosion while he was running. He didn't remember any odors and saw no smoke. When he was running, he didn't see anyone with a gun or shooting, and he saw no explosives.

Drew saw someone in a red car asking what was going on. Someone else said that there had been a shooting inside the school. He thinks that one guy in the car might have been Tyler Jackman. This car was red, a Mustang, older, maybe 1980's. He remembers seeing Tyler later at the park and saw the car. He didn't remember what Tyler was wearing. He didn't remember if he saw Tyler at school that day.

Drew said that he knew Eric Harris from classes. He said that he'd seen Dylan at school, but saw neither Dylan or Eric the day of the shooting. He said that Dylan always wore a black Boston Red socks hat, backward.


Drew said that there was another guy that wore a trench coat. He didn't know this guy's name, but described him as wearing a dark colored beret, dark glasses, having a pale face, thinks he has blonde hair and a smooth face with no acne. This guy would sometimes wear a German shirt. (a black tee shirt with German writing on it.) Drew didn't remember seeing this guy at school the day of the shooting.

Drew had left his red and black Jansport backpack in the cafeteria. He'd been wearing jeans, and a navy blue Old Navy shirt. Inside his back pack were flimsy binders with labels that say what it is and some math books.

Drew never saw duffel bags or anything unusual in the cafeteria and did not see the shooter(s).

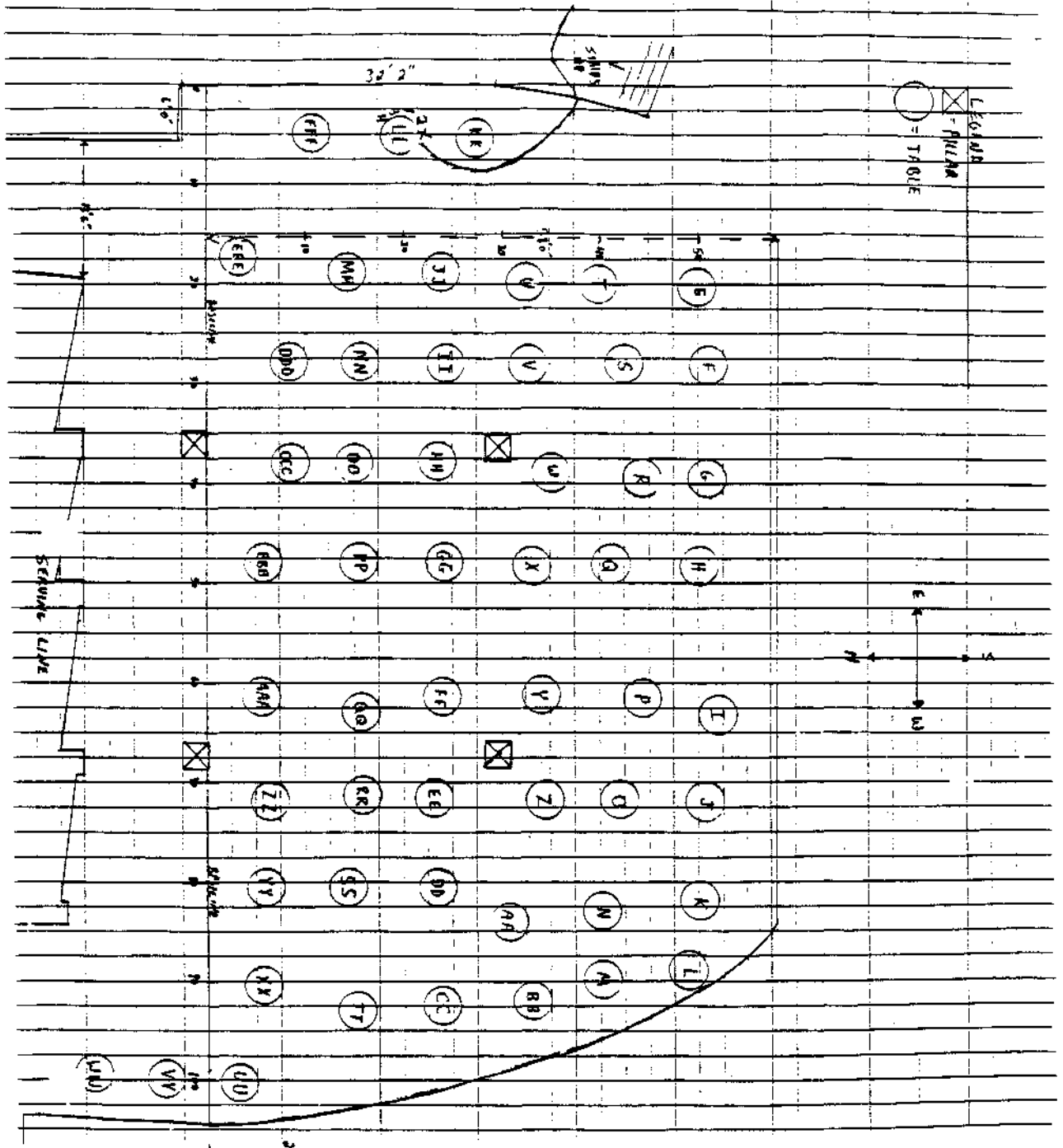

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 3, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Julie McGinley. McGinley was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting. I contacted Susan McGinley and made an appointment for an interview for May 10th at 11:00AM.

On May 10th at 10:45AM I arrived at 9663 West Prentice Avenue to interview Julie McGinley. Julie advised that she is a student at Columbine High School, in the 9th grade, and that she was in the cafeteria on April 20th. She said that she arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:10AM, and was seated at the table identified as "LL". She stated that she was sitting with the following people:

Lindsey Dowelling  
Erica McClaughtery  
Katherine Sloan  
Nick Antonio

Julie reported that she had been in the cafeteria about ten minutes when the people in the north-west corner of the room, along the windows, got under the tables. At about this same time the janitors and Coach Sanders came through the area telling everyone to take cover under the tables. Julie said that she ran to the stairs at the east end of the cafeteria and up the stairs into the south hall. From there she ran east in the south hall and out of the building by way of the east doors near the math rooms. Julie said that she went to Lindsey Blair's hours after leaving the school. Julie advised that she heard four to five shots while she was in the south hall. Julie reported that she did not see who was doing the shooting. She also said that she had not observed anyone with

guns either before or after the shooting. Julie also stated that she did not see anything like a large duffel bag in the cafeteria when she arrived, nor did she see anyone bring such a bag into the cafeteria while she was there.

Julie advised that she does not know either Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris. She said that she does not know any members of the Trench Coat Mafia and none of her friends are associated with the group or its members. Julie is not, personally, aware of the names that Harris and Klebold were using on the internet. Julie said that she had heard that one of them had used the name "wormhole". Julie did advise that last year someone in an English class had written a paper on groups in school, and the Trench Coat Mafia were included.

Julie reported that there had been no rumors about impending trouble at the school prior to the twentieth. The only thing that she could think of that seemed unusual was about a week before the shootings someone had damaged the locks on the doors to the school.

Julie described her pack as a blue and black Jan Sport with a cross sewn on the strap. The pack contained a math book, government book, note book, picture of one of a friend, and a small AM-FM radio.

Julie could provide no additional information and my interview concluded at 1120.

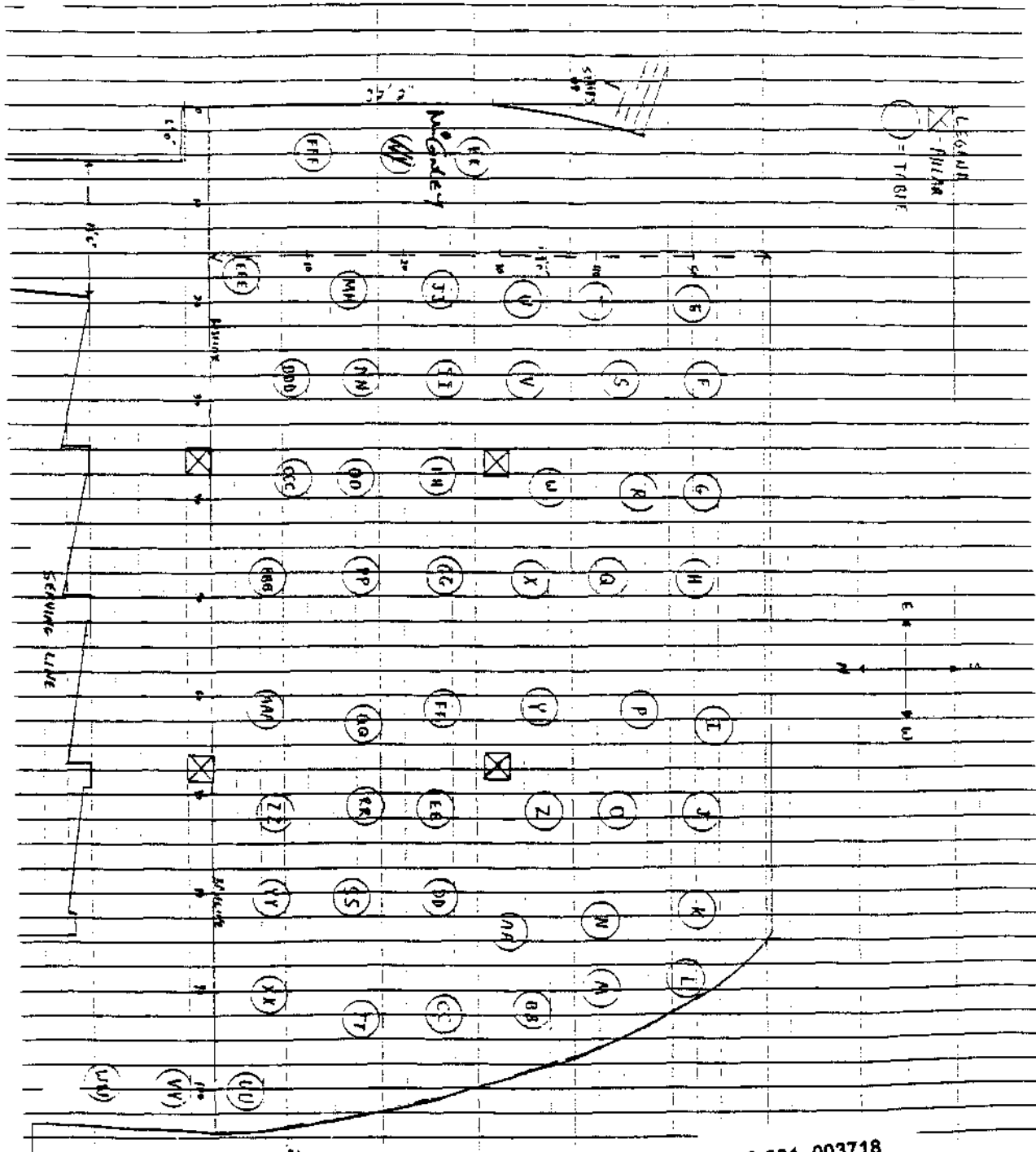

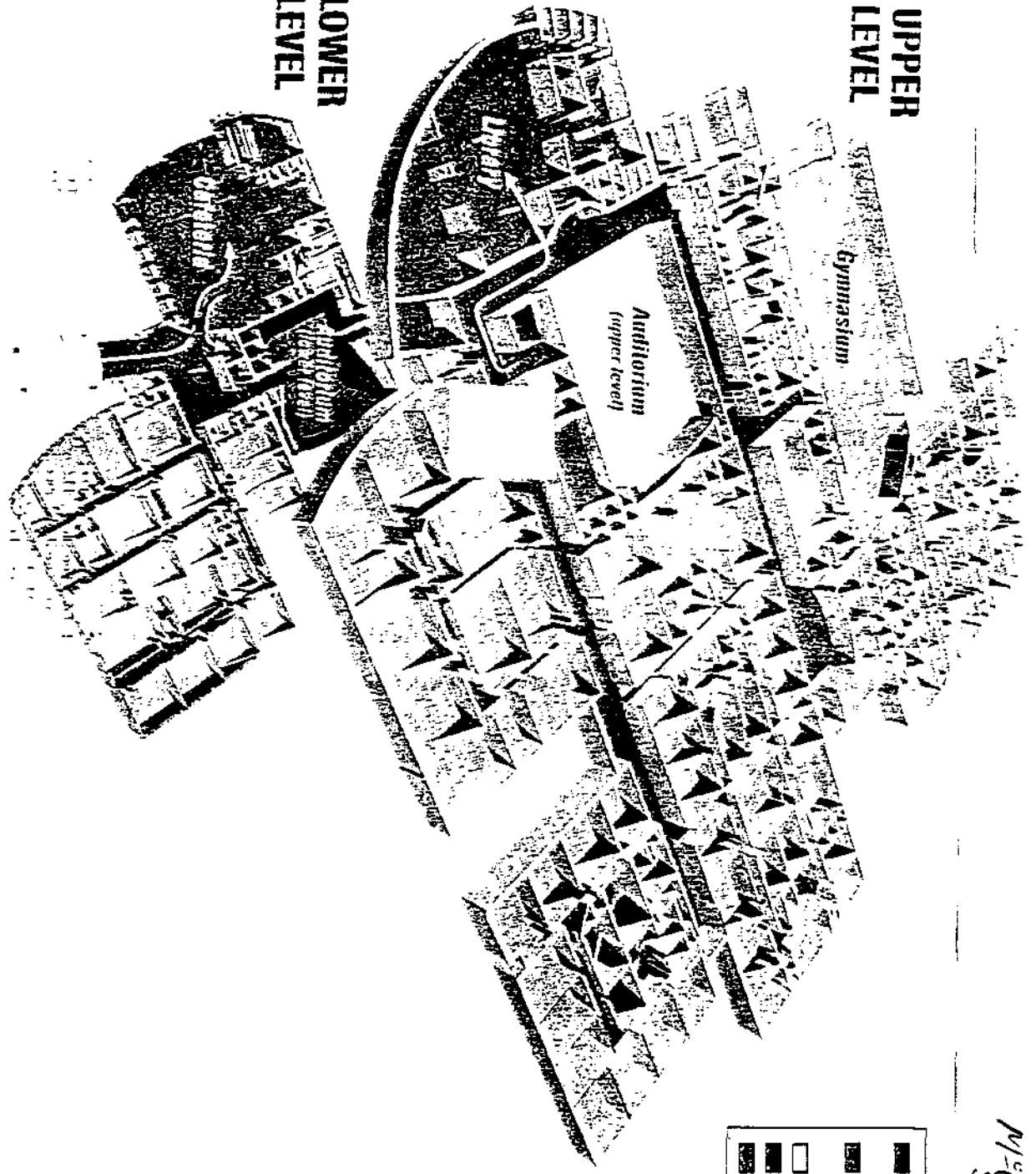

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 4, 1999 I was assigned to do an interview with Columbine High School student Jonathan McMaster who was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting. I contacted Jonathan's father, Tim McMaster, and made an appointment for an interview on May 12th at 1830.

On May 12th at 1830 I arrived at 7273 South Chase Way and began the interview with Jonathan McMaster. Jonathan stated that he is a freshman at Columbine High School. He continued to say that he was in school on April 20, 1999 and was in the cafeteria when the shooting started.

Jonathan advised that he arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:15AM. Jonathan said that he was seated at either table identified as "UU" or "VV" but he thought he was more likely at table "UU". Jonathan said that he was sitting with Tyler Anderson. Jonathan related that he normally does not sit at this table but because the other people who he usually eats lunch with him did not show up. Jonathan advised that he had been there about ten minutes when he looked out the window and observed Dan Rohrbough and Lance Kirklin laying on the ground. Jonathan said that he thought they were messing around and went back to eating his lunch. At this time a couple of other kids looked out the window and commented on the blood. It was believed that a fight had occurred and someone commented that it appeared one of the victims had a "compound fracture". At this time Mr. Sanders came in the west door of the cafeteria and told everyone to take cover. Jonathan stated that he did not hear any shots at first but after the people in the cafeteria got under the tables and it quieted down, he heard possibly three or four shots that appeared to come from outside the

window. Jonathan stated that he did not see who was doing the shooting.

Jonathan said that he and Tyler remained under the table, laying on the floor between 30 to 40 minutes. Jonathan said that they remained in the cafeteria because after there was a large exodus of students up the east stairs there was alot of shooting that sounded like it was coming from the top of the stairs, and Jonathan believed that the students were being shot as they reached the top of the stairs, so they thought it would be safer to remain in the cafeteria. Jonathan related that while he was laying on the floor behind and under the table he noticed legs moving around the cafeteria. Jonathan said that he could not see who was attached to the legs, shooters or students, as the table he was hiding behind blocked his view and he did not want to move around.

Jonathan related while he was behind the table he felt a big puff and a heat wave moved over him. He continued to say that there was a large amount of flames east of him in the cafeteria. According to Jonathan immediately before, 30 seconds, he felt the puff and heat he heard what he described as the sound of running water or a hissing sound. Jonathan said that he did not notice any shooting just before he heard the hissing sound, but he related that there was alot of shooting going on at the time. Jonathan said that he did not see anyone on the stairs just before the hissing sound as he could not see around or over the table. Jonathan also reported that while he was hiding under the table he heard several explosions that seemed to be coming from the floor above him.

Jonathan advised that after about forty minutes they crawled into the hall way leading to the west exit from the cafeteria. They waited near the wall at the west door for a period of time and then observed a police officer in the field to the west of the school. They got his attention, and he directed them to run to the parking lot to the west of the cafeteria. When they got into the parking lot they took cover behind a car and waited there for about another forty to forty-five minutes. He then gained the attention of another officer in a car, and this officer transported them to a cul-de-sac to the west of the school. From there he went to a friends house and called his father.

Jonathan advised that while he was in the cafeteria he did not notice any large duffel type bags that he could recall. He continued to say he does not recall anyone carrying such a bag into the cafeteria while he was there.

Jonathan advised that he was in a math class located on the main level in the south-east corner of the building. Jonathan advised that after class he walked down the hall to the south that leads to the south main hall. He then stopped at his locker (437), and then walked down the south main hall to the stairs leading to the cafeteria. Jonathan advised that from his math class to the cafeteria he encountered no one with a gun and did not see anything that appeared out of the ordinary.

Jonathan advised that he does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, nor has he had any contact with either subject. He continued to say that he does not know anyone who belongs to the Trench Coat Mafia, and none of his friends belong to the group. Jonathan does not know what names if any Harris or Klebold were using on the internet.

Jonathan stated that he had heard no rumors about impending trouble at the school, and had not heard anyone talking about building bombs or buying guns. Jonathan related that he had heard that April 20th was suppose to be important to drug users, something like national drug day. He also reported that he had been told that one of the morning announcements was something like "you don't want to be here today" but did not personally see the announcement.

Jonathan advised that a friend, Chris Wisher, had told him that a [REDACTED] had also been doing the shooting. Jonathan continued to say that he had also heard that [REDACTED] was one of the shooters from a girl whose first name is Kristin and a male student with the first name of Alex. Jonathan did not know their last names. I possibly identified Chris Wisher as CHRISTOPHER WISHER, DOB: 03/19/83. Wisher's address is 6572 West Calhoun Place in Littleton. Jonathan did say that Kristin and Alex were in the tenth grade. Jonathan did not know [REDACTED]

Jonathan described his back pack as a green colored Abercrombie & Fitch. The pack has metal buckles instead of plastic and there is a mesh pocket on the front of the pack and red shoe lace type strings on the zippers. Jonathan said the pack contained a spanish 101 and American Government books, a large binder with his class folders inside, and a note pad.

Jonathan could provide no additional information and the interview ended at 1915.

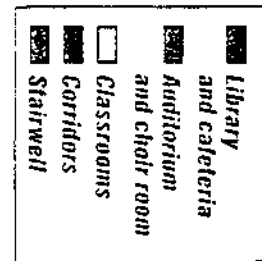
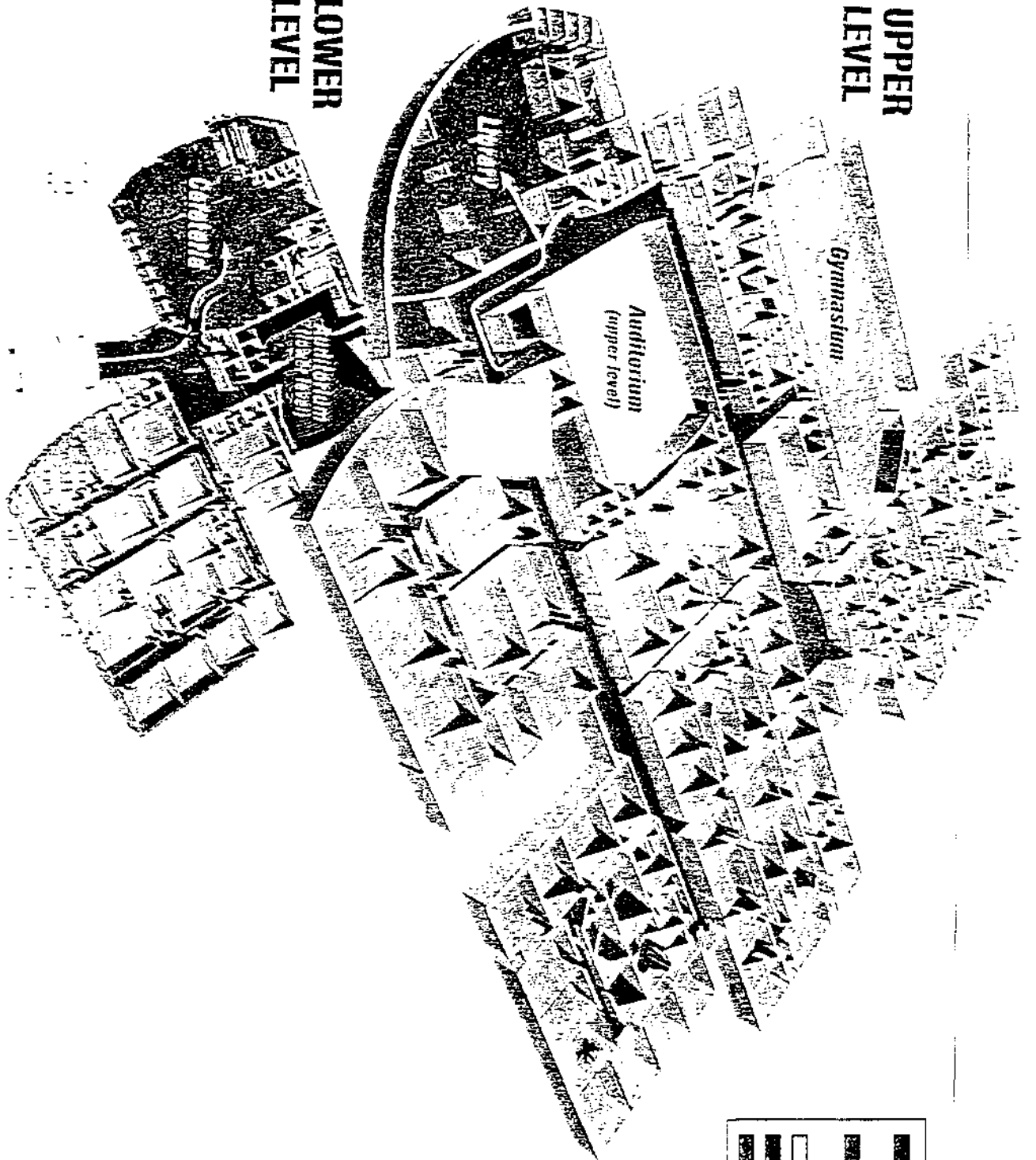

Jonathan McMASTER was interviewed regarding the lead information in order to attempt to further identify KRISTIN. He is currently residing with his father at the above address and phone. He was interviewed at the residence.

McMASTER looked through the 1998 yearbook in an effort to identify KRISTIN, without success. He could not recall her last name, although he said he thought he would recognize it if he saw it. He told me that KRISTIN was in his Spanish 101 Accelerated class and that she was a sophomore this year.

McMASTER told me that he overheard KRISTIN talking with a boy named ALEX (LNU) and another boy named Chris WISHER about the incident, a few days after they returned to classes. He believes KRISTIN said that [REDACTED] was involved, and that WISHER saw [REDACTED] with the shooters. McMASTER said ALEX (LNU) had reportedly told police about this, but the "cops blew him off".

Follow up investigation regarding WISHER reveals that he has been interviewed; control number 1102.

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I checked the class roster, and found that the only girl named KRISTEN in McMASTER's Spanish class is Kristin SCHOENHOFF. SCHOENHOFF was previously interviewed on control number 1578.

I telephoned SCHOENHOFF about this lead. She recalled having a conversation with WISHER and Alex VIVAS. SCHOENHOFF denies that she said [REDACTED] was involved. She states she did not know who [REDACTED] was until after the incident.

SCHOENHOFF said she does not recall WISHER or VIVAS saying that [REDACTED] was involved. She said WISHER had a lot of information about the incident, but she does not remember any of it now.

She told me that her friend Jennifer TINDALL has an older brother, who was in TINDALL's residence during the time following the shooting. The rear of TINDALL's house faces the field near Columbine High School, and he observed three individuals walk past the house, talking on cell phones. These were the three subjects who were subsequently detained by police. TINDALL's brother believed that one of those three individuals was [REDACTED] SCHOENHOFF related this information to WISHER and VIVAS, and believes this is what McMASTER overheard.

On 4-26-99, Inv. Reker did conduct an interview with Mears at his residence, in this interview, Mears stated that he was sitting at either table QQ or RR and that he was facing west toward the large windows.

Mears did not see anything but that a janitor yelled to get under the tables, he then heard shots from outside the west door of the lunchroom which is by the teachers lounge.

Mears than ran into he kitchen area and went into a closet next to the kitchen bathroom and was and during the time he was in the closet, he heard someone yell "drop it".

After an unspecified amount of time, Mears states that he and the other persons in the closet were then rescued by the SWAT team.

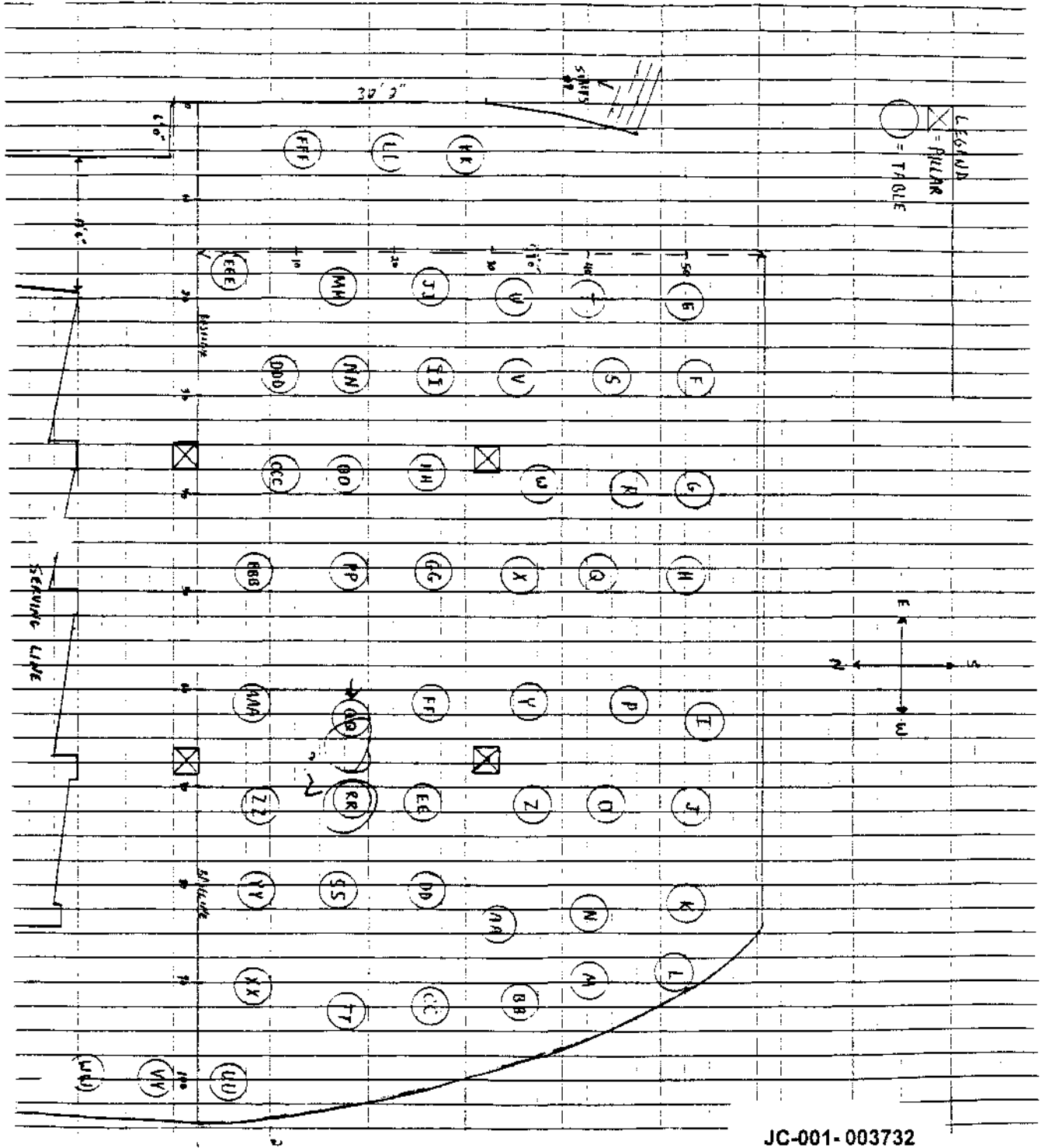

James Alden Medaugh, date of birth 1/27/84, was interviewed at his residence 6674 W. Roxbury Place, Littleton, Colorado 80128, telephone number (303)973-9182, regarding the shooting at Columbine High School (CHS). After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, Medaugh provided the following information:

Medaugh is a freshman at CHS. Medaugh has government class during 4th hour and has "A" lunch. During "B" lunch, Medaugh is in German language class. At approximately 11:10 a.m. on the day of the shooting, Medaugh got out of his 4th period class and went to lunch. Medaugh went to the lunch room after first stopping at his friend's, Nick Buhrer (phonetic), locker. Medaugh arrived at the lunch room at approximately 11:14 a.m.-11:15 a.m. and sat at a table near some vending machines (Medaugh identified table YY as the table he thinks he was sitting at from a sketch of the school and lunch room). Medaugh and Buhrer walked to the vending machines to make a purchase at approximately 11:21 a.m.-11:22 a.m. At approximately that same time or one minute later, while standing at the vending machines, Medaugh heard what he thought was three shots or firecrackers outside the lunch room coming from an upstairs area near some transformers.

Approximately 5 to 7 seconds later, Medaugh heard three more shots. At this time, Medaugh looked out a window of the lunchroom, near the vending machines, and saw his friends Sean Graves, Lance Kirkland and Dan Rohrbough. Medaugh saw Graves go down outside the window. He also saw Kirkland crawling on the ground. Medaugh started walking back to his table and arrived there about 15 seconds later. Medaugh told others at the table that he thought Sean had just been shot. At the table were Fletcher Woolsey and Anthony Caruso. (Cory Hager and Billy Arapkiles may have also been at the table that day but Medaugh could not be sure). Buhrer and Medaugh parted at the vending machines and Buhrer went outside.

Medaugh stayed at his table for about half a minute before a teacher and a janitor came into the cafeteria and told everyone to get down. Medaugh got down on the floor for about one minute before he and many other students in the cafeteria got

up and started moving towards the stairs. As soon as Medaugh got to the base of the stairs, he heard one gunshot coming from upstairs.

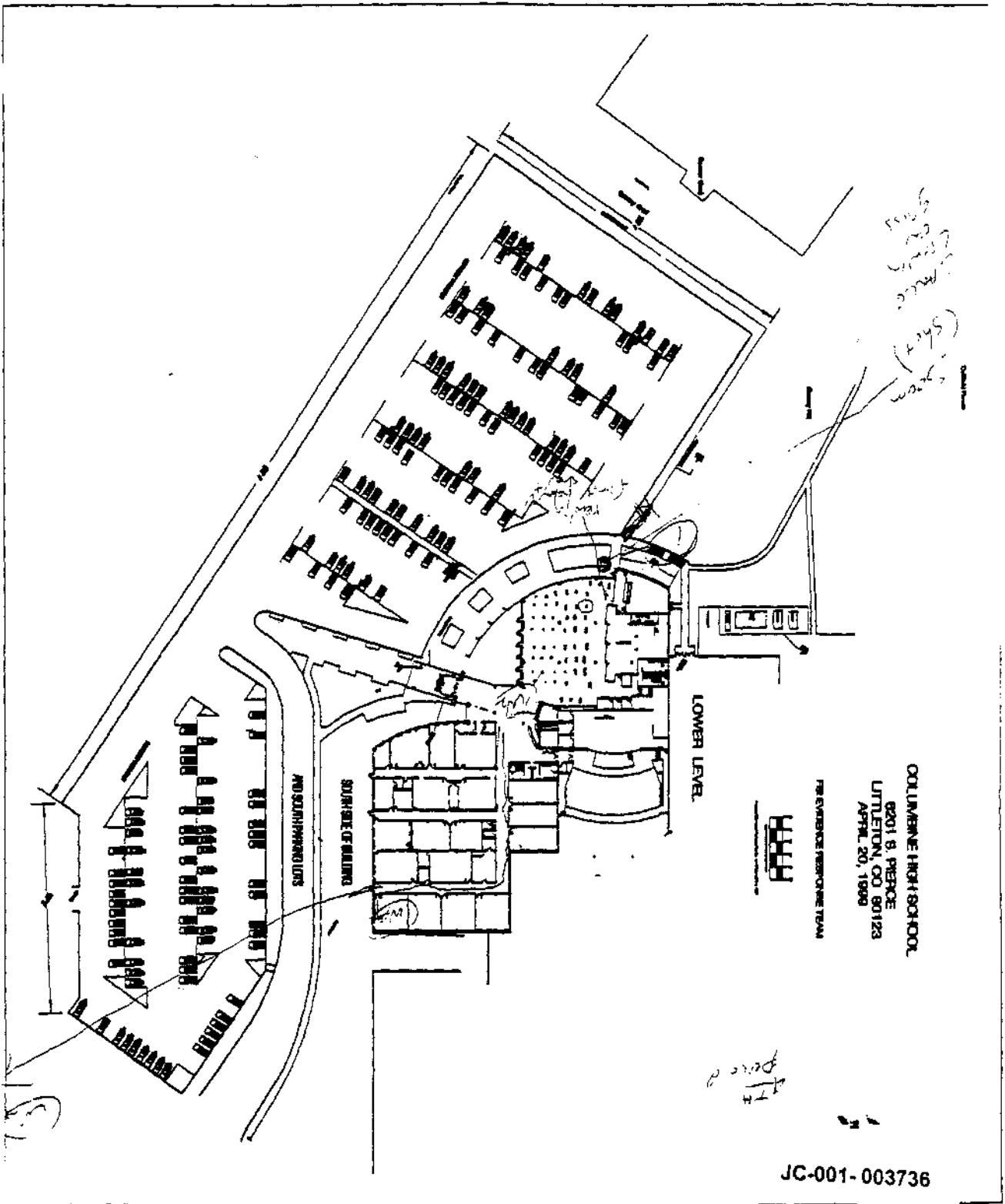
Medaugh then decided to run down the hall to a Spanish language room. Medaugh ran to a Spanish room which was located next to school exit doors which led out to the junior parking lot. Medaugh stayed in this Spanish room with 20 to 30 other students, one teacher (whom he did not know) and one substitute teacher (whom he did not know) for about five minutes. During this time, Medaugh heard approximately three gunshots and one explosion. Medaugh and the others in the Spanish room left the room after about five minutes and fled across the Junior parking lot. Medaugh then ran to a Mormon seminary house on Polk Street where he stayed for the next two hours.

Medaugh has not been interviewed prior to today. Medaugh did not see any shooters in the school at any time. Medaugh did not hear explosions or footsteps on the roof of the school on the day of the shooting. Medaugh kept his backpack with him when he fled the cafeteria and took it out of the school with him when he fled to the Mormon seminary house.

Medaugh has heard of the Trenchcoat Mafia (TCM). He described them as weirdos who always hung out outside, near the stairs by the cafeteria and the senior parking lot. Medaugh only knows one member of the TCM. Robert Perry was in the same debate class with Medaugh for approximately one week. Perry kept to himself during the time he was in the class.

Medaugh stated that the thought for the day on the Rebel News Network (RNN) was words to the effect of, "You shouldn't be here today". Medaugh saw the thought for the day on a T.V. monitor in his second hour class.

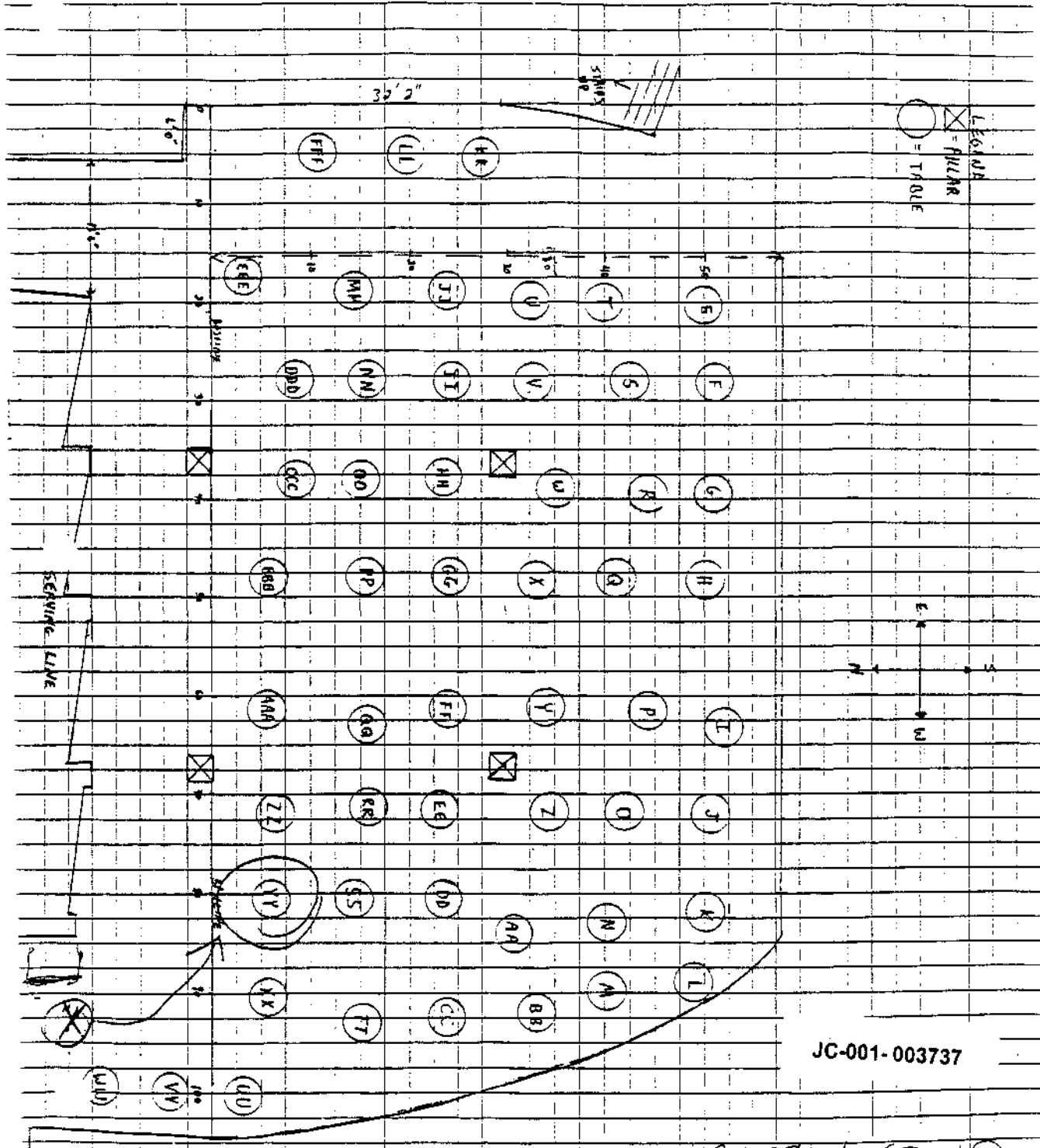

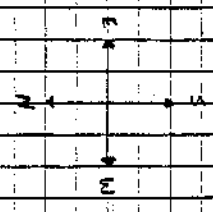

was one other group of boys at table JJ behind her group. She said it is a regular group that meets in the cafeteria for their open 4th hour. She recalled the boys at table JJ were Chad Roybal, Evan Todd, Eric Trujillo and Mike Lyry.

I asked Christina if she recalled seeing any large duffle bags in the cafeteria that were left there before the crowd arrived, or recalled seeing anyone bringing down a large duffle bag and leaving. She stated she did not, but was not looking for anything like this. She recalled that her back was towards the cafeteria, and was facing towards the stairs. She did not recall seeing anyone carrying a duffle bag or anyone wearing a trench coat coming into the cafeteria from the inside stairs from 10:20am until the A lunch began. Christina added that she was not really paying attention to who was coming and going from the area.

She stated around 11:05am the kitchen opened up and she and Jennifer Tindle walked over to get a lunch. They took a direct route to the kitchen. She and Jennifer came back to table U and ate their lunch. The other girls were also eating. When she finished her meal Christina walked her trash over to a trash can near the south doors. She stated that when she returned to the table, Cara Sanders asked Jennifer to accompany her to her car in the south parking lot. Jennifer and Cara left the cafeteria through the south doors. A few minutes later 2 unknown girls came in to the cafeteria from the south doors and appeared upset. They appeared to be looking for a teacher. Someone yelled that someone had been shot. Everybody in the cafeteria stood up and looked out the west windows. Christina did not see anything, then she heard popping noises and a loud boom. Mr Sanders then came down and told everyone to get on the floor. Everyone did.

The crowd waited for a few moments, then began to run towards her as they were heading for the steps. Christina got split up from her table, but ran with another friend, Alexis Wolf. They ran up the stairs into the hallway and down into the auditorium doors. They cut through the auditorium and into the main hallway west of the



administration area. They were running towards the administration exit doors with about 5 other students when the glass in the exit doors was shot out ahead of them. She believed the shots came from behind them. She and Alexis stopped and turned to the right into a short hallway while the other students continued out the exit doors. They stayed in this short hallway for less than a minute before making a run for the exit doors that had been shot out.

They got outside and were advised by a teacher to stay in Clemont Park. Christina did not see the gunman at any time, but was sure she heard shots upstairs near the auditorium when they reached the main hallway.

Christina was wearing Jeans, red tanktop with white short sleeve cover shirt. She left a Gap backpack, black purse and jewelry on the table in the cafeteria.

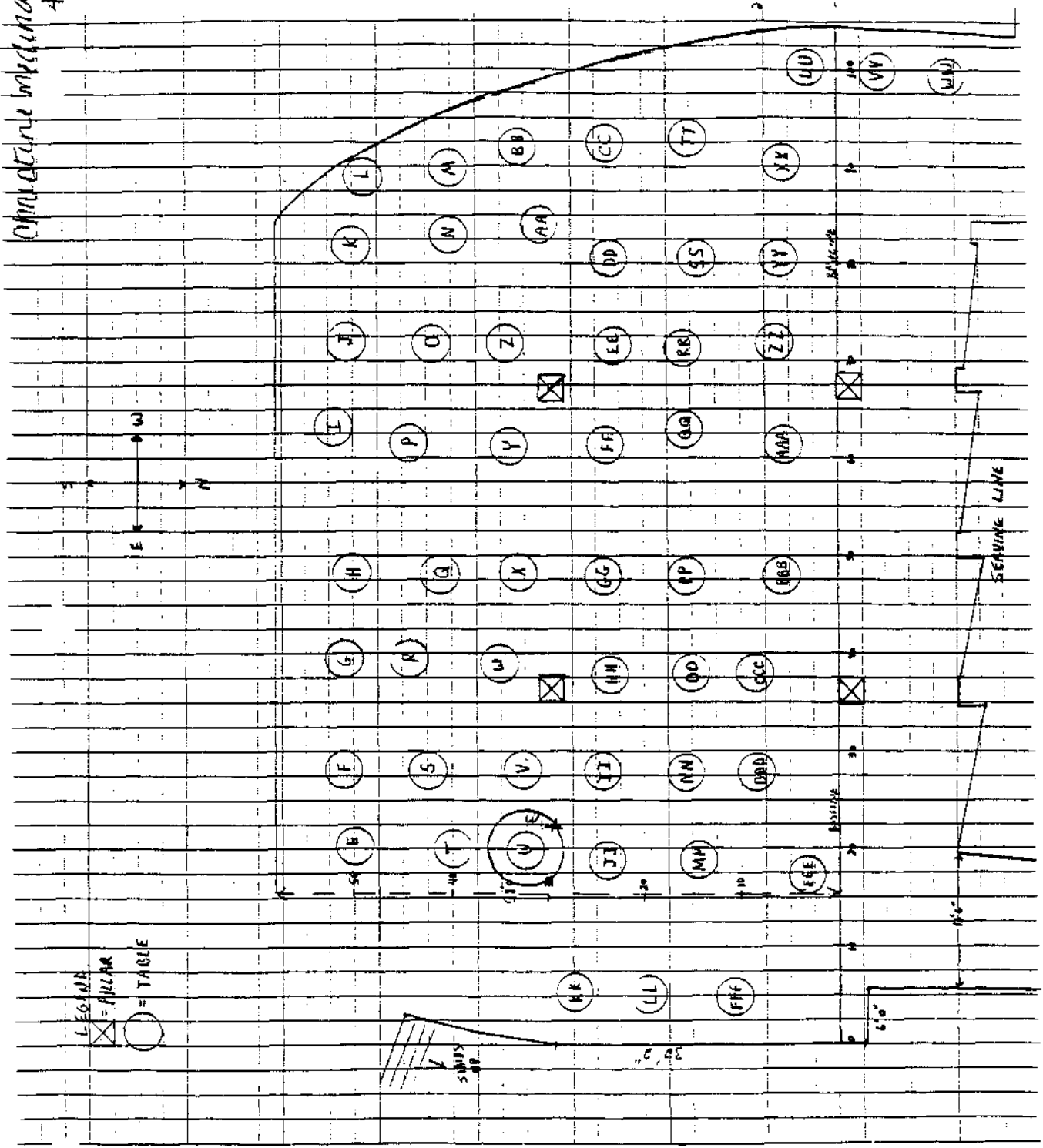
Christina had no information about TCM or Dylan Lebold and Eric Harris.

She stated that while in Clemont park when everyone was "freaking out", she overheard a short (5'2") chubby girl tell another girl that her friend got a call from someone telling her not to go to school today. Christina could give no more description on this person, and did not know who this person was talking about. She was unsure if she would recognize this girl again.

David Michael MESCH, DOB 7/24/83 was interviewed at his residence, 6970 S. Lee Way, Littleton, Colorado on May 11, 1999 at approximately 8:30 AM. MESCH was advised of the personal and professional identity of the writer and the purpose for the interview. David's parents Darlene and Michael MESCH were present during the interview.

MESCH advised that he is a sophomore at Columbine High School, and has "A" lunch period. On April 20, 1999, MESCH recalled entering the cafeteria at approximately 11:10 AM. He waited in line to buy his lunch for approximately 1 1/2 minutes, and then took a seat at a table in the cafeteria. MESCH viewed a diagram of the cafeteria, and indicated that he believed the table that he sat at was "MM". He sat facing toward the west and the windows on that side of the cafeteria. MESCH stated that there were approximately ten other students seated at the table, but he could only recall one, Zach RAUZI.

MESCH stated that he finished eating his lunch and got back into the service line to buy a cookie. While waiting in the line MESCH saw a student running by, and heard what sounded like fireworks exploding. MESCH ducked down in the line briefly, then ran into the kitchen area. He spent approximately 30 seconds in the kitchen, then ran out and eastbound through the cafeteria. He entered the auditorium through the back doors, ran through the auditorium and down the main hall. MESCH stated that Sarah BROWN and Renee PAAUILAINEN ran with him. He then turned north into the hall by the counseling offices and out the north side of the building. He ran through the smoking pit, jumped the fence and ran north into Clement Park, to a parking lot usually used by sophomores. MESCH then got into Zach RAUZI's car with him, and they drove to MESCH's house.

MESCH stated that he never saw the gunmen, or any duffel bags or other unusual objects in the cafeteria. He stated that he had been wearing a green short sleeve "T" shirt and khaki-colored shorts.

MESCH advised that he did not know Eric HARRIS or Dylan KLEBOLD, or any other members of the Trench Coat Mafia. He stated that he had seen the group around, occasionally wearing

MESCH stated that he did not recall hearing or seeing any announcements at the school on that date.

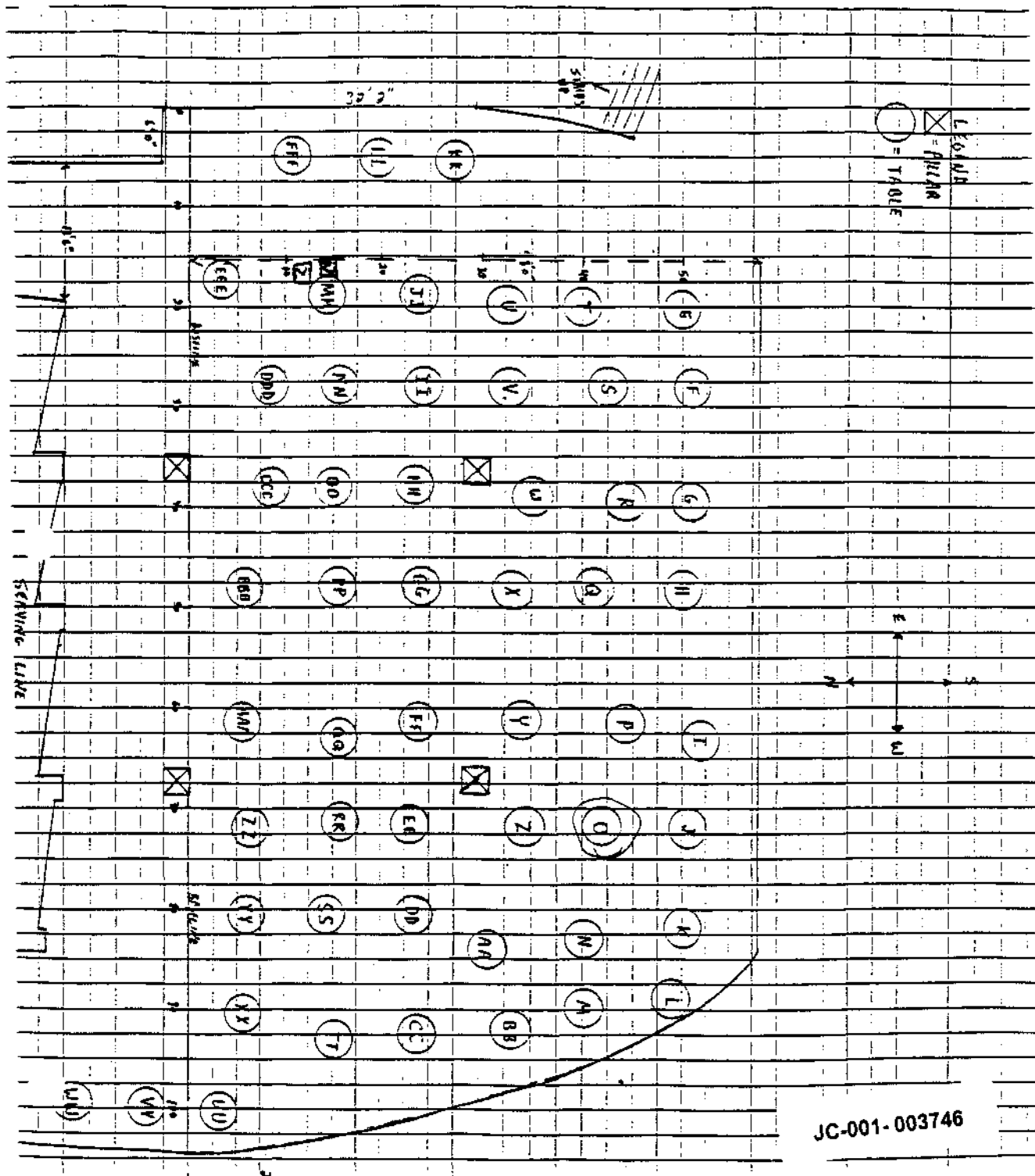

the concrete stairs which lead upstairs to the science area. He believed he was running upright. While going up the stairs he heard and felt another loud blast, possibly behind him and noticed someone laying on the floor near the steps. He ran into the nearest room, which was one of the front science rooms. Brad believed there is 4 or 5 science rooms which lead away from the main hallway. He was in this room with about 9 students and one teacher. They put tables in front of the door to protect themselves. A few minutes later someone walked by the door where they had put tables in front of and stood there. The person then fired a single round through the glass window and into a table. Brad recalled wood and glass sprayed the room, but none was injured from this. He did not see the person who fired this round. The person did not enter the room.

A short time later, the group moved into a neighboring science classroom, further back from the main hallway where about 20 kids were hiding. The teacher, Douglas Kraft stayed with them. He continued to hear gunshots and blasts outside the room. He said everyone was very scared, but they remained as quiet as possible. He believed about 3 hours later, SWAT members rescued the group and escorted them out of the school.

Brad stated that later he recognized Dylan Klebold on TV as the gunman he saw outside the cafeteria around 11:30am. He stated he does not know Dylan Klebold, but has seen him around school as a student. Brad described Dylan Klebold as a loner and would hang out with guys that wore trenchcoats, but did not know any of there names. Brad stated he did not see anything unusual at the school before 11:30am on 4/20/99, nor did he have any information regarding other students who may have been involved.

On 4/27/99 I went back to Brad Miller's home to clarify his specific location in the CHS cafeteria at 11:30am on 4/20/99. Brads parents were also present for this interview. I provided Brad a drawing of the cafeteria, which depicted all the tables and their location in the cafeteria. I pointed out specific areas, such as the food line,

kitchen, and west windows of the cafeteria to give Brad a better understanding of the lay-out in this drawing.

He looked at the drawing and stated he was seated at either table CC or TT near the windows. Brad circled both of these tables on the drawing, but could not be specific as to which table. He stated he was seated facing the kitchen, and Nathan Anema and Tyler Stark, both CHS students were seated with him across the table. He believed Nathan was on his right facing the west windows.

Brad recalled that he came down the concrete stairs alone about 11:20am, stopped at "rebel corner" to buy a salad for lunch. Rebel corner is at the bottom of the concrete stairs towards the south student entrance. He noticed no unusual duffle bags in the cafeteria, and stated "there are hundreds of backpacks in there". I asked specifically about a large duffle bag, he reiterated that he saw nothing unusual. He purchased his salad and walked alone through the middle of the cafeteria, at an angle towards his table. He believed that Nathan and Tyler were arriving at the table at the same time he was. He had just sat down when a teacher yelled "get down".

Brad stated he was wearing a dark blue t-shirt, tan pants and white hat on 4/20/99. He left a black Jansport backpack on the floor near his table. The backpack had books and school notebooks in it.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-07-99, between the hours of 1003 and 1030 hours, I had an opportunity to speak with Elaine Miller in reference to the accident that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99

Elaine Miller explained that she arrived at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, at about 0725 hours, and that she was car pooling with her friend, Jenny Doyle. Upon arriving at the school, they parked in the Junior parking lot, and entered the school from the east side near the Math/Science hall. Miller explained when she first arrived at the school, she went to Ms Mosier's classroom, where she dropped off her cheerleading bag, and then proceeded to her first hour Journalism class. After first hour, she has a Geometry class taught by Mr Smith, but on this date, they had a substitute teacher. After being released from Geometry, she proceeded to her third hour Spanish class, which is down in the Foreign Language hallway, east of the cafeteria.

I provided Miller a map of the cafeteria area and asked if she observed two large duffle bags or sports bags, one being blue in color and the other being orangish/red in color, which were located in the central core area of the cafeteria, and asked if she saw those two bags when she was going to her Spanish class. Miller stated she could not see the bags and could not provide any additional information about the bags. After being released from her Spanish class, she went to her English class, which is up in the Math hall, and was taught by Ms. Bohack. Miller stated they were released from English class at about 1110 hours, and after being released from her class, she went directly to the cafeteria, and believes she arrived at about 1111 hours.



Again, using the map of the cafeteria area, I asked Miller to tell me where she was seated. Miller explained there were three tables just to the west of the student store in REBEL corner, and that she sat at the middle table. These tables were not depicted on the map, and I had Miller draw them on the map. Seated at the table with her were her friends, Amy Staley (303-973-9865), Shannon Zele (unknown phone), Brooke Allison (303-978-9319), B.J. Secord (unknown phone); Isiah Salazar (unknown phone), and Dave Schulte (303-798-4274).

Miller told me after placing her backpack on a chair at the table, she proceeded to the student store where she got her lunch. After she returned back to the table, she placed her backpack, which she described as being blue in color JanSport and placed it on the window ledge near her table.

Miller told me shortly after she sat at her table and began to eat lunch, that she recalls seeing several students running outside, telling me that it was near the southwest corner of the school. Later, she explained to me that somebody yelled from within the cafeteria that somebody has a gun, at which time she recalls seeing the janitors who started to tell the students to get down underneath their tables. Miller described the students, who were sitting over near the west side of the cafeteria, started to run east towards the stairways. Again, she remembers hearing janitors yelling and telling everyone to leave the cafeteria area. Miller told me she ran east down the Foreign Language hall into the last French room in the hallway. Miller described there were anywhere from 40 students and three teachers inside the classroom. After they reached the classroom, she recalled hearing several gunshots and explained that she heard four loud explosions, describing the explosions as being powerful enough to rattle the building and cause ceiling tiles to shake and start to crumble. Miller believes they were in the French room anywhere from 10 to 15 minutes after the incident occurred. Realizing they probably were not safe, she stated the teachers within the classroom told them they needed to evacuate the building, at which time they went out an emergency exit just outside the classroom, and exited into the Junior parking lot. The students continued to run south to the Morman house located at Pierce and Polk.

Miller stated after she got to the house, that she was given a ride by Jeremy Zele, who is Shannon Zele's brother, at which time she went to Shannon Zele's house. Accompanying her to Shannon Zele's house were Mike Foster, Carder Kingsbury, and Colleen Schwartzott. Miller was asked if she knew about what time they left the French classroom. She stated she recalls seeing the clock, and it was about 1135 hours. I asked her if she had called her parents immediately after the incident. She told me she

called her mother and told her what had occurred, and this was between 1145 and 1150 hours.

Miller was asked if she had observed any gunmen while she was in the Columbine High School or after she exited. She told me she did not. I also reconfirmed with her that she did not see the two large duffle bags or sports bags that I had described earlier, and again she told me she had no further information as to who owned those bags or who might have brought them into the school. Miller was asked if she knew about the group "Trench Coat Mafia," specifically Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, or any other members associated with them. She could not provide any information about the group or its members. I asked her if she knew Eric Harris had a Website, and she told me she was unaware of that.

I asked Miller to describe what she was wearing on the incident date. She told me she was wearing a pair of GAP blue jeans, a forest green Abercrombie Poler shirt, and she had some platform shoes on. Miller was asked if there was any rumors about school of anything that was going to happen on the incident date. She explained that the only thing she thought was strange was the phrase of the day said something to the effect of "Don't you wish you weren't here?" Miller could provide no additional information reference this incident.

At the completion of my interview, I had Miller depict where she was sitting on a map I provided her of the cafeteria area, and asked her to show me her direction of travel out of the school. A copy of that map is attached with this supplemental report.

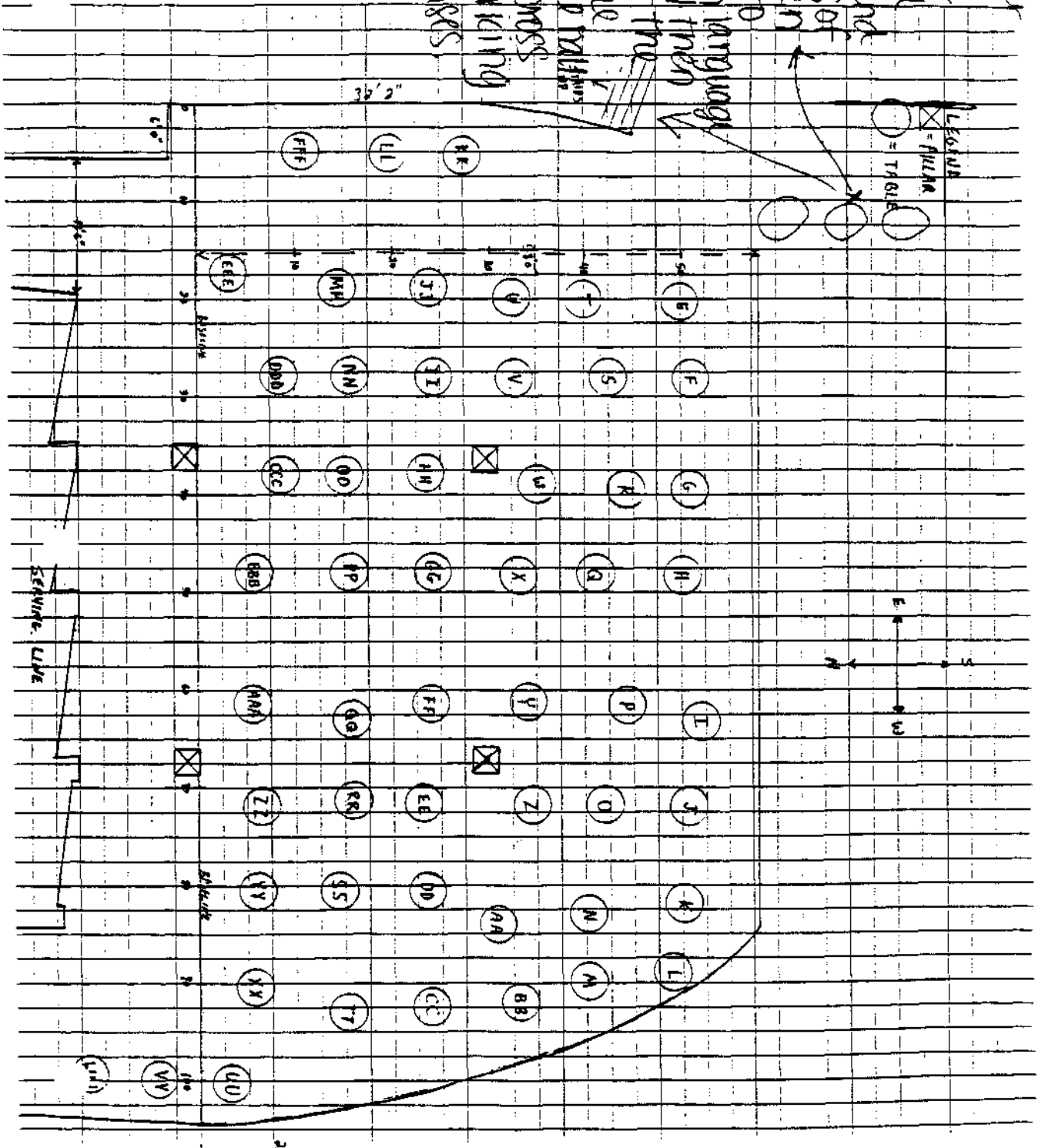

INVESTIGATION:

On April 27, 1999 at 1005 hours I contacted Tim Miller at his home for an interview. His parents were present. Tim then told me the following:

- \* He is a freshman at Columbine High.
- \* When asked, he said he does not know Eric Harris by name or face. He has seen him around school based on the photos he has seen on the news. He said that the same goes for Dylan Klebold.
- \* When asked about other students who wear trench coats, he said that he has see a couple other students like that but does not know their names.

JC-001-003774

\* When asked if he saw anyone associated with Eric, Dylan or the trench coat students the day of the shooting or in the cafeteria, he said he did not.

\* He did not see any unusual objects in the cafeteria. He did not see any object other than backpacks in the cafeteria. When asked specifically, he said he did not see any duffle bag.

\* He said that he got out of his 4th hour science class at 11:10 a.m. He went down the stairs by the science area to the cafeteria. He walked into the cafeteria to the pop machines by the west exit door. He got a pop and then went to his lunch table.

\* Referring to the cafeteria diagram, he pointed to table FF as being the one he was at. He said it was by the pillar. This was then confirmed with the location his backpack was recovered.

\* He was at that table with Devon Castille, Jeff Marony, John Stroble, Pat Vasser, Kyle Hayes, and Austin Stecker.

\* He was wearing jeans, brown shoes, and a blue Rebel football t-shirt that has a small emblem on the front and a large football with a patriot on the back.

\* The first thing he noticed was the students closest to the west windows left those tables and went to look out the window. He heard someone say something about a fight.

\* He then saw Mr. Sanders run in from the west cafeteria door. He thought Mr. Sanders ran in from the outside but never saw him outside. (Teacher lounge door is in the same location.)

\* He said Mr. Sanders told everyone to "get down" several times. He said a janitor with a Yankees hat was behind Mr. Sanders at that time. Mr. Sanders made the warning from the pop machine area by that west door.

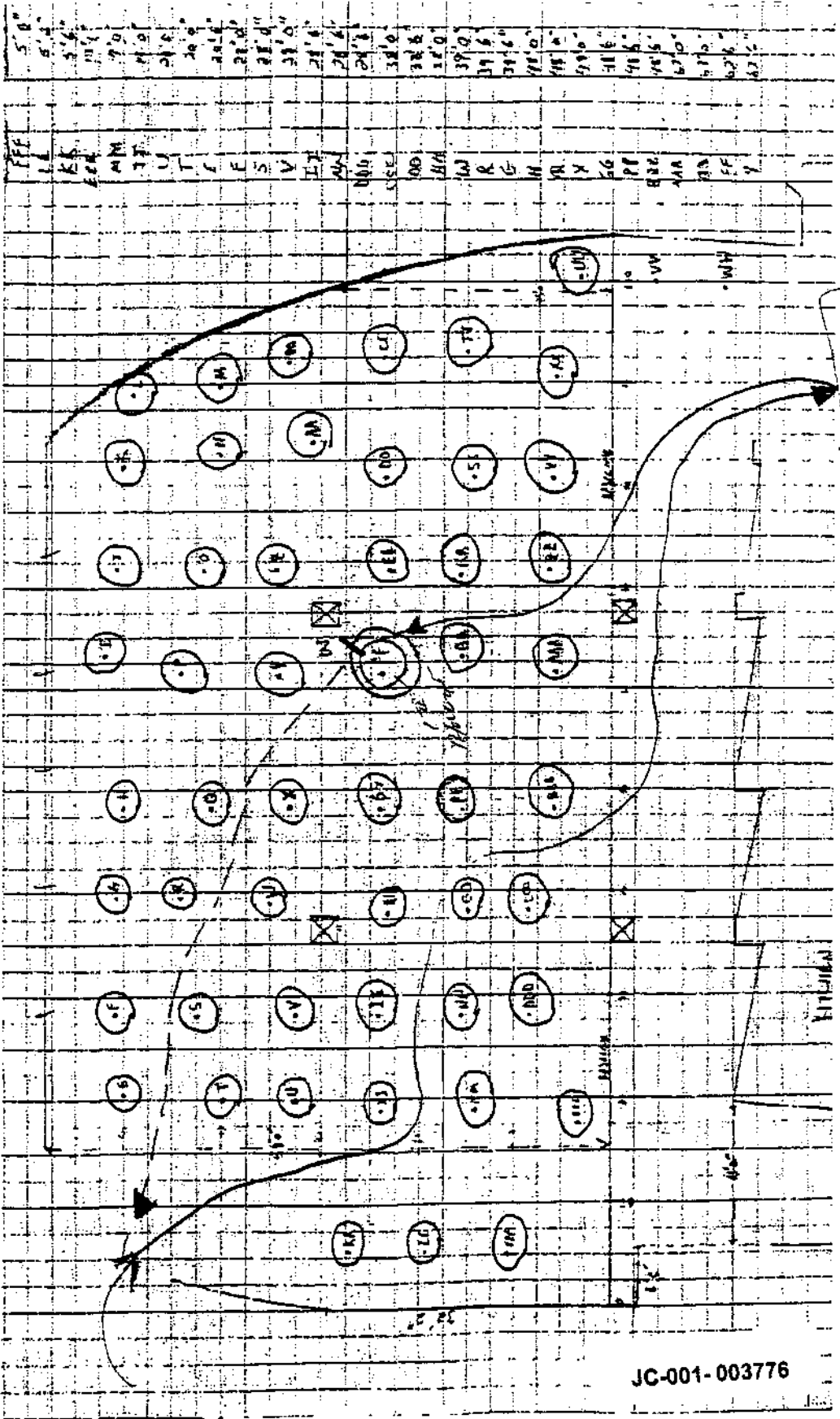

Both of Brianna's parents were present during the interview.

Brianna told me the following:

She went to all of her regular morning classes. At about 11:10, she went to the cafeteria. She went downstairs and then went to the bathroom and then got food at the school store. After she got her food, she was walking back to go sit down, and someone came by screaming from the other side of the cafeteria that there was someone with a gun and to get down.

Brianna was wearing her back pack. She ran into the bathroom. She saw two freshman girls in the bathroom. She didn't know them. Also in there were Tessa Nelson and a girl named Tiffany. Tiffany

is in Winterguard. Another girl, a sophomore named Trisha Mutschler (303 948-0806) was also in there. The girls stayed in the bathroom. The bathroom door was closed. She could hear shots being fired in the cafeteria. She said that she knew what she heard were gun shots because she's heard her dad shoot in the hills.

Brianna said that the stall doors in the bathroom were locked. The girls were standing on the toilets so no one could see their feet. She saw two feet enter the bathroom. She didn't remember anything about the feet. Brianna said that she turned and looked at the other girls. It sounded like the shooter was in the bathroom. She said that she heard the person shoot the wall or something. She heard 3 to 4 shots in the bathroom. She heard what she thought was a bomb go off in the boy's bathroom. She said that when the bomb went off in the boy's bathroom, the feet she saw in the girl's bathroom were not there. She thinks that the bomb went off before the feet came into the girl's bathroom.

The girls stayed in the bathroom. Then Brianna heard shooting from upstairs, from the area of the science hall. She said that they were in the bathroom for maybe 10 to 15 minutes. She peeked out and ran down the first business hall and out the door.

Brianna never saw anyone carrying in the duffle bags. She didn't know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She left her back pack in the bathroom. It was a green Coldwater Canyon back pack. It was hung on a hook in the bathroom.


Brianna said that she knew some of the girls from the TCM. They were Pauline Colby, Kristen Theibolt, and Nicole Marcum. She said that she just knew them to say "hi" to. OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On April 28, 1999 I was assigned to interview Jeffrey Morroni who is a student at Columbine High School and was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting.

On April 29, 1999 at 1530 I went to 7945 S. Webster St. and conducted an interview with Jeffrey Morroni. Jeffrey Morroni stated that he was in the ninth grade and had been in the cafeteria on April 20th. Jeffrey advised that he was seated at the table identified as FF on the diagram marked "Morroni" with Tim Miller, Devon Castill, Jacob Henelstien, and Johnny Strobel. Jeffrey said that Tim Miller had already been interviewed. Jeffrey related that he arrived in the cafeteria about 11:10AM. He continued to say that he did not see anything like a duffel bag in the cafeteria when he got there. Jeffrey said that he had been in the cafeteria about fifteen minutes when students sitting at tables to the west of his all stood up looking out the windows. Jeffrey said he thought a fight had started outside and he stood up and looked out the window. At this same time a teacher came running into the cafeteria from the direction of the west exit door and directed all the students to get down under the tables. Jeffrey reported that immediately after the teacher told everyone to get down he heard a loud explosion and gun shots coming from outside the cafeteria. Jeffrey reported that he hid behind a trash can near his table for about thirty seconds and then he and other students crawled to the stairs leading to the south main level hall. Once at the stairs the group ran up the stairs and east through the south hall. Jeffrey said that he paused a minute to see where Tim Miller was but a teacher told him to keep running. Jeffrey said he turned and started to run again when he heard five shots that sounded like they were coming from behind him in the area of the library. Jeffrey exited the school by way of the main door and ran across Pierce Street to a park on the east side of Pierce Street. Jeffrey

said that he was in the park for ten to fifteen minutes when the group started to run again. He reported that he went with a group to the home of a female student, who he did not know, where they hid in the basement for some time. Jeffrey reported that he did not see anyone with a gun nor did he know who was shooting. Jeffrey said that he had heard no rumors about pending trouble at school on April 20th.

Jeffrey stated that he knows no one associated with the Trench Coat Mafia, nor has he had any contact with anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia. Jeffrey said that he does know Dylan Klebold because they shared some classes but he had no contact with Klebold. Further, Jeffrey stated that he is not familiar with any names Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris might have used on the internet.

Jeffrey advised that his back pack was a black Eddie Bauer and it contained a calculator, spanish book, and Language arts and spanish note book.

Jeffrey related an incident he had observed about a month before the shooting. He reported that he was seated in the cafeteria with friends when a Josh Nielsen walked by the table dressed in gothic clothes. As Nielsen approached Arty Mar to Jeffrey to look at him, which Jeffrey did. As Nielsen walked by the table he looked at everyone and said "I want to slit their throats." Jeffrey advised that he did not think Nielsen was associated with the Trench Coat Mafia but he wasn't sure.

Jeffrey could provide no additional information, and the interview concluded at 1605 hours.

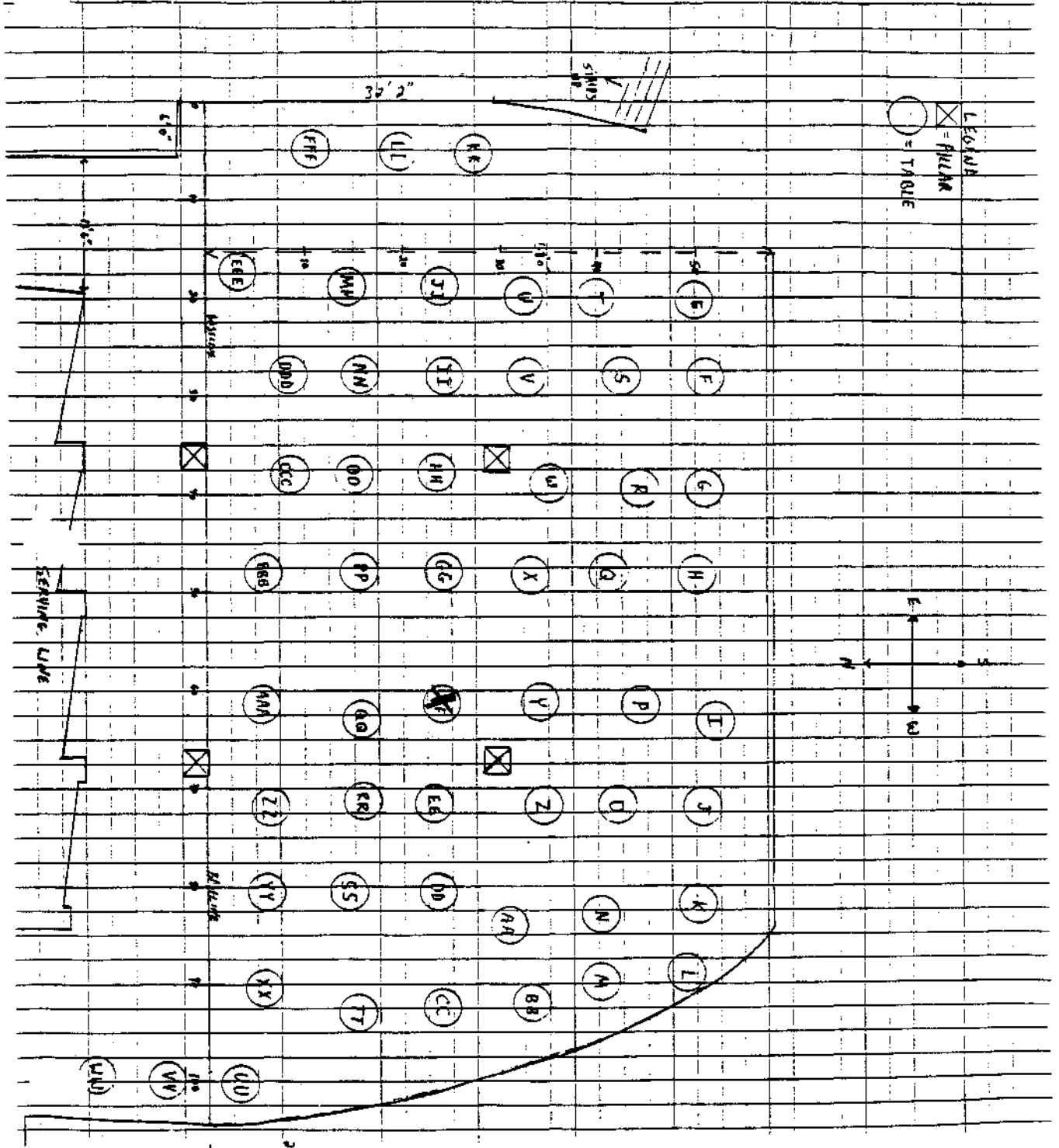

at table FFF there were already people there when she arrived. She listed those people as Elsa, Lacey Deal, Jenny Neighy, Alexis Mazula, Tory Ownes, Candice Cushman, Jasmine Thurmon, Sara Switzeberger and Stephany Lebsack. She said that she visited with the people at table DD and then made her way back to table FFF.

Morton said that when she got back to her table she heard someone yell out that someone had been shot and heard someone yell that everybody should get down. She said at first she didn't want to believe what was happening was true and she stood up for a second. She said that people had started making their way across the cafeteria toward the stairs and as she was standing looking across the cafeteria she saw a person standing with a gun. She said this person was a male and was wearing dark clothes, black pants. He was wearing a light colored shirt and she could see a long gun silhouetted in his hands. She could not describe what type of long gun it was, but said it

initially not a hand gun. She said that she also believes that this person shot the gun several times. She said that she first observed this person near table SS then he moved between the tables ending up between table EE and the pillar. She said as this person was moving through the cafeteria she turned and started to exit and could not identify this person. She said she saw people run into the kitchen and as people were running she heard what she thought were five shotgun blasts, although she did not see anyone shooting. She added that she thought the suspect she saw in the cafeteria might have had a backpack on and did have dark hair.

Morton then ran into the ladies bathroom. She said that she and approximately five other students got into the handicapped stall in the ladies room. She said they were in there for less than five minutes when they heard someone screaming to unlock the stall door. They peeked out of the bathroom and saw Mr. Anders Jr. escorting students into the auditorium area and on to the stage. Morton said she went with the group into the auditorium and on to the stage and down the stairs. She said they started to go up through the auditorium when got to the back they sat in some seats. Mr. Anders Jr. then told them to get on the floor. They again heard some type of shooting or explosions coming from what Morton believed was the cafeteria area. A janitor then came in and told

them to go out through some back doors which exited into the far language hallway and out through the far language wing into the parking lot. Morton said that while she was in the auditorium and while she was exiting the fire alarm was activated.

Morton said that while she was exiting the building and running to Leawood Park she heard several more big explosions. At the park she was able to make contact with her brother who took her home and she was able to contact her mother by telephone. Tracy Morton indicated she received the call at 11:42 a.m.

Morton describes her backpack as maroon in color, Jansport, with her name on the back of the front pocket. He backpack contains her language books, notebooks, a reading book, numerous folders and homework papers, a day planner and her glasses. Morton said she was wearing a black skirt, a white shirt with a black sweater and full black shoes.

Morton said that last semester she had a physical education class with Eric Harris. She said that prior to the class he always wore army or a black trench coat. She said he seemed to be very withdrawn and didn't really connect with anyone in the class. She had no particular problem with Harris in the class. She said she observed no one picking on him, although the seniors made fun of the underclassmen routinely and that everyone sort of expected that, but he was not singled out.

Morton could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia or Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She does not have a ICQ account and has not used the internet to access any of the trench coat mafia sites. She had not heard of any students talking about bomb making or gun acquisitions and does not know anyone with a double pierced eyebrow. She was also not present for the Rebel News Network, Thought of the Day.

On April 29, 1999, between the hours of 0922 and 1014, I had an opportunity to speak with Lauren reference the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Also present for the interview were her parents, Jeff and Kathleen.

Lauren stated that on Tuesday, April 20, 1999, she arrived in the cafeteria of the school around 1030 hours, stating that she does not have a fourth period class and she usually spends most of her time down in the cafeteria area. Lauren identified, from a map

I provided that she sat at table NN and that at the table with her were her friends, Naomi Lucero, telephone number (303) 973-1368, Jenny Polak, telephone number (303) 933-4625, Tina Thorsen, telephone number unknown, Natalie Baker, telephone number unknown, Cassie (last name unknown), telephone number unknown, Nicole Ray, telephone number unknown, and Amy Stone, telephone number unknown

Lauren was asked when she initially arrived at the cafeteria if she observed two large duffle bags or sports type bags, describing one as being blue in color, and another being an orangish red, possibly near the table where she was seated in the cafeteria. I also asked her if she remembers seeing anybody that might have brought those packs in and then walked away from them. Lauren told me that she did not see the two duffle bags. I asked Lauren when she first noticed something was wrong in the cafeteria and to describe the events. She stated that between 1125 and 1130 hours she remembers that an unidentified janitor came from the west side of the cafeteria area and that he was telling everyone in the cafeteria to get down under the tables. Shortly after this she remembers hearing somebody near the west windows of the cafeteria yell, "He's got a gun." At this point she crouched down under the table, where she remained for just a few seconds. She stated during the incident the students who were near the west end of the cafeteria started moving east, at which time she got up and moved east toward the staircase in the cafeteria. Once she reached the staircase she proceeded up to the main level and headed east, passing the science and math rooms, where she exited from the high school

Lauren was asked if she ever saw a gunman in the cafeteria or outside west of the cafeteria. She stated that while she was in the school she never saw a gunman. She didn't stay in the cafeteria for a long period of time. After she exited from Columbine High School she remembers that she went to the park just east of the school, where she remained for a short period of time. While at the park she remembers hearing gunshots and from the park she ran to her friend, Lindsay Blair's residence.

Lauren was asked if she knew Eric Harris of Dylan Klebold. She stated that last semester she had a third period gym class with Eric Harris. She stated that she did not know the individual by name and that she never met Dylan Klebold. Lindsay was asked if she knew of any other members of the "Trench Coat Mafia." Again she stated that she didn't know any of the members. I asked if she knew about Eric Harris' web site. She stated up until she heard the news reports about it, she had no idea about the web site.

Again, I verified that Lindsay did not see the two large duffle bags or sports bags described earlier in the cafeteria, nor did she see any gunman at Columbine High School. Lindsay was asked if she could recall any other classmates who were seated in the cafeteria around her. She told me that she remembers Brittany Barry being in the cafeteria, Lauren (last name unknown), Brittany Jollette, and Brock (last name unknown). Lindsay was asked who else exited from the school with her and remained in the park just east of the school. She stated that Julie Nasland, telephone number unknown, Monty McClennan, telephone number (303) 932-0878, Chanel Plank, telephone number (303) 904-1614, and Renee Shirek, telephone number unknown, also exited the school and stayed at the park with her.

Lindsay was asked if there were any rumors around the school prior to the incident of something "brewing." She stated that the only thing she knew about April 20th was National Marijuana Day. Other than that she could not provide any additional information.

At the completion of my interview, Lauren was provided a map of the cafeteria and asked to depict where she was seated and her movement out of the cafeteria. A copy of that diagram is attached to report.

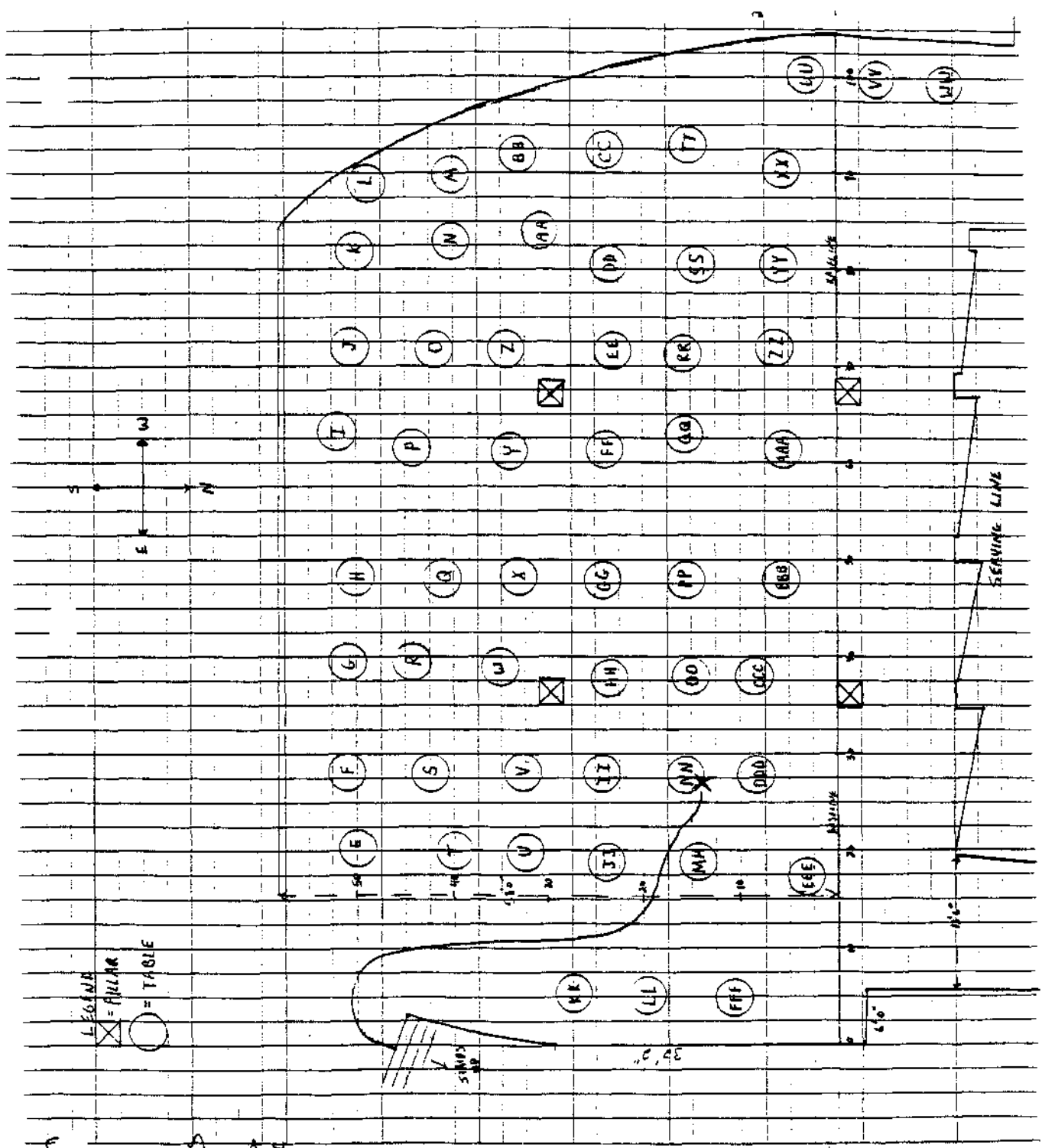

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-07-99 at 0830 hours I interviewed Dawn Muirhead in the presence of her parents at their business, Custom Air Inc., 3930 South Decatur Street.

Dawn stated that her mother drove her to school the morning of 04-20-99 and she arrived at 0720 hours. She stated she entered the school through the front entrance and saw nothing unusual going on outside. She stated her fourth class is an off hour and she entered the cafeteria between 1015 hours and 1020 hours. She stated she used the elevator to get to the cafeteria.

Dawn stated she knew who HARRIS was but she didn't know who KLEBOLD was. She did not know him by name, only recognized who he was. She stated she did not see them at all the morning of the shooting. Dawn stated she was not familiar with the "trench coat mafia" group at all, but was aware that they existed.

Dawn stated that when she got to the cafeteria there were about 30 kids there already. She sat with Lindsey Blair, Jenny Allen, Amy (last name unknown), Melissa (last name unknown), Lindsey Dowling, and Nicole (last name unknown). She stated Kelsey Fowler and Natalie (last name unknown) were sitting next to their table. She stated she did not see any large duffle bags or backpacks left unattended in the cafeteria at that time. Dawn indicated on the attached diagram which table she sat at, table "V".

Dawn stated she got up at approximately 1110 hours and went to the serving line at the Rebel Corner.
