

and saw a trench coat student he identified as Dylan Klebold. He made this identification from being familiar with that student from seeing him in school at times combined with the news media putting a name to that student. He said that Dylan was standing about five yards west of the top of the stairs. (See diagram)

\* He saw Dylan holding something close to his chest with both hands and then saw him throw an object out into the west parking lot. He said that he got a good look at Dylan as Dylan was facing his direction when he threw this object. He described the object as being silver or white and that it looked like a handgun to him. He then described what Dylan looked like as he saw him on the hill the day of the shooting:

-white male, 6'2" to 6'4", skinny, "lots of hair sticking out" on the side that was wavy and curly, light brown in color, that was over the ears, unknown if wearing a hat, unknown glasses, saw sideburns, wearing black trench coat to the knees, unknown shirt, unknown pants, unknown shoes.

\* At this point, everyone started yelling to get down. He then went back to his table and got down. After about 30 seconds he crawled over to the south doors on the west side and came across another student, Jason Autenrieth. Jason told him that Ann Marie Hochhalter was shot and that someone was throwing pipe bombs. He said that everyone from the cafeteria was running up the stairs.

\* He then started back to the window by his table. He then saw Anne Marie Hochhalter's body laying alone outside the west windows by a planter (See diagram). He then heard a loud explosion that sounded like it came from above the cafeteria in the hallway for the stairs. He then saw students who were running up those stairs from the cafeteria to turn around and run back down the stairs to the commons.

\* As he got to the west window again, he saw a bomb go off in the west parking lot (See diagram) He said that he also saw the smoke

from this bomb. He thought this bomb may have been the object he saw Dylan throw when he saw Dylan on the Hill although a minute or more may have passed between those times.

\* He then went to his table, grabbed his backpack and ran out the south doors of the cafeteria. As he was going out the doors, he looked back west and saw who he thought was the same suspect he saw throw the object, Dylan, walking down the bottom of the stairs like he was going to go in the west cafeteria doors. He ran south and did not see if that suspect actually went in the cafeteria.

\* He thought he was one of the last students to leave the cafeteria. He only remembered wearing jeans and a t-shirt the day of the shooting.

\* He did not see anything in the suspect's hands when he saw him on the hill and down the stairs.

\* He ran south and east to a home on Polk Street that had a classroom set up in the garage. He heard more explosions during that time. He then ran home to call his mother. The phone in the garage was not working so he ran next door to a neighbor's, Mr. Tony Martinez, where he used his phone to call his mother. (His mother thought that she got his phone call at work between 12:30 and 12:45 p.m.)

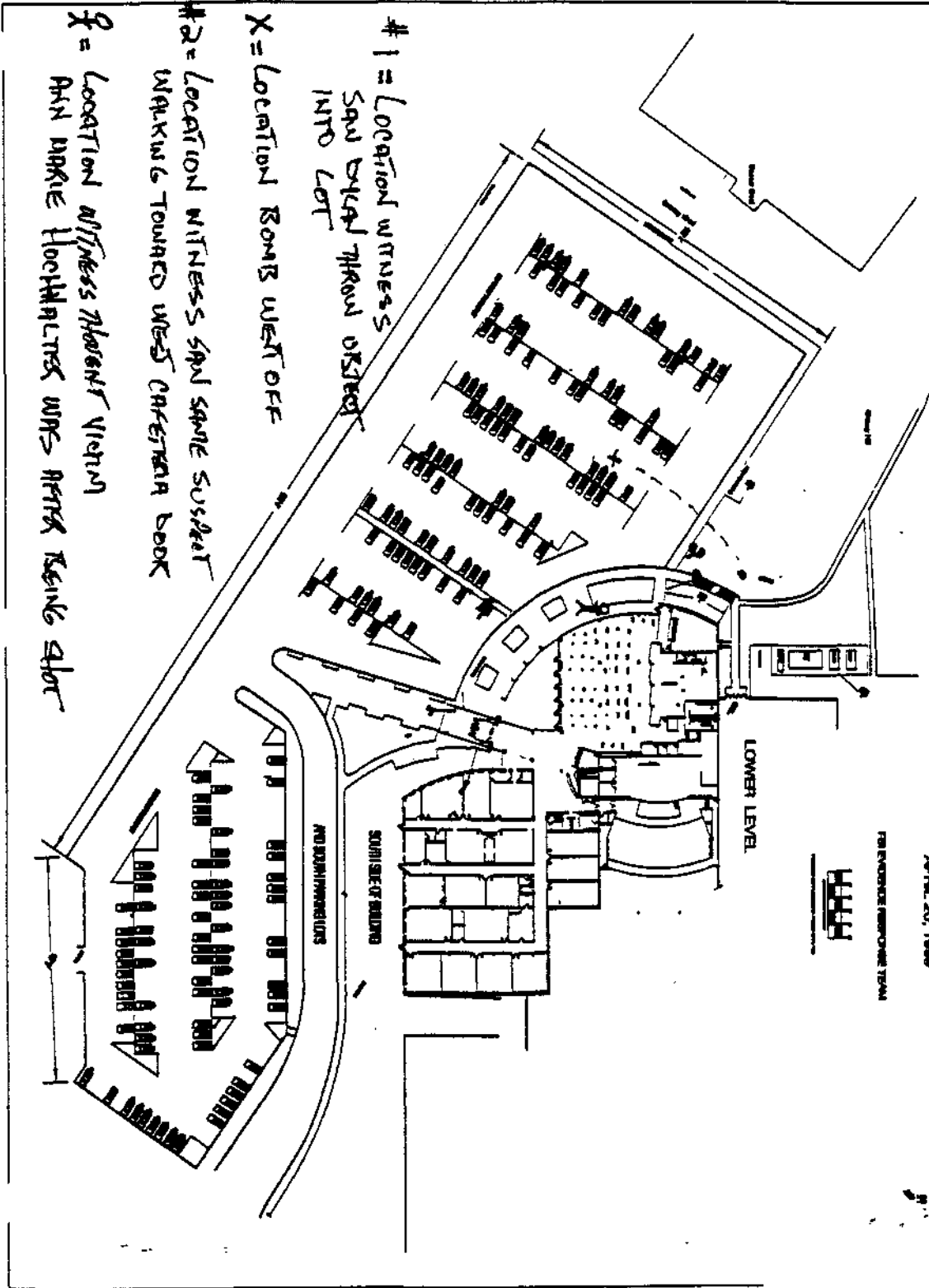
This concluded my interview with Anthony Sammauro.

Mr. Sammauro then told me that he talked with his neighbor, Mr. Tony Martinez, who has a son named Cory that goes to Columbine. Mr. Martinez told him that when he found out about the shooting, he went to the school and tried to get in the front door to check on his son. Mr. Martinez told him that he was being "shot at" when he went up to the front doors. He provided Mr. Martinez' phone number, 303-933-7327.

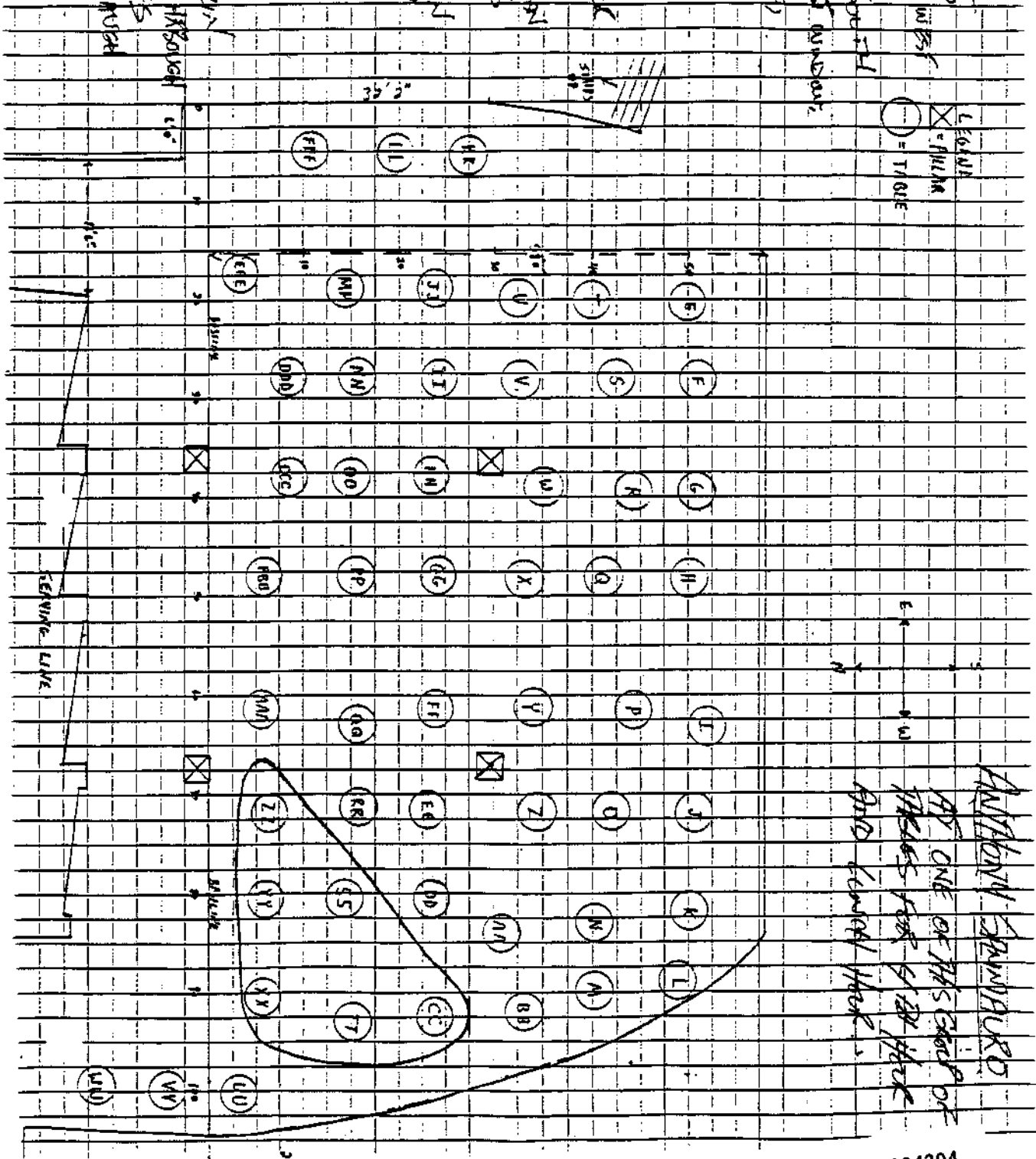

off hour. She sat at table T or U during 4th hour. She was with Michelle Cowles, Lindsey Deyle, Christine Medina and Jen Tindall. She saw nothing unusual.

She stayed in the cafeteria for lunch and moved to table S with Renee Paavilainen, Sarah Brown, Sarah Sales and Amber Dixon. The teachers were running toward the doors. She thought there was a fight. Then, Mr. Sanders and a janitor were yelling for everyone to get down. She thought it was a senior prank. She started to get up and then got down again. After about three or four minutes, everyone started running up the stairs. Jasmine heard gun shots at the top of the stairs in the hall by the science rooms. She didn't hear any while she was downstairs. She went out the doors by the math hall.

Jasmine didn't remember how many shots she heard. She said that what she did hear, sounded like a machine gun going off. She didn't hear, see or smell any bombs or smoke.

Jasmine didn't see the shooter(s).


Jasmine left her black Jansport back pack in the cafeteria. Inside the back pack was a blue Eddie Bauer purse with two pagers in it and notebooks. In her locker was a history book, a green sweat shirt and a gray sweat shirt. Her locker number is 1492. In her gym locker she had her gym uniform, blue and silver warmups and Adidas shoes.

Jasmine said that she didn't know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold before this incident. She said that she had seen last year, about 10 "trench coat guys" and one girl who wore a trench coat. She said that this year, she never saw any of them.

Jasmine knows no one with a double pierced eyebrow. She does not use the Internet. She notice nothing unusual about the RNN announcement.

A copy of the cafeteria diagram is attached to this report.

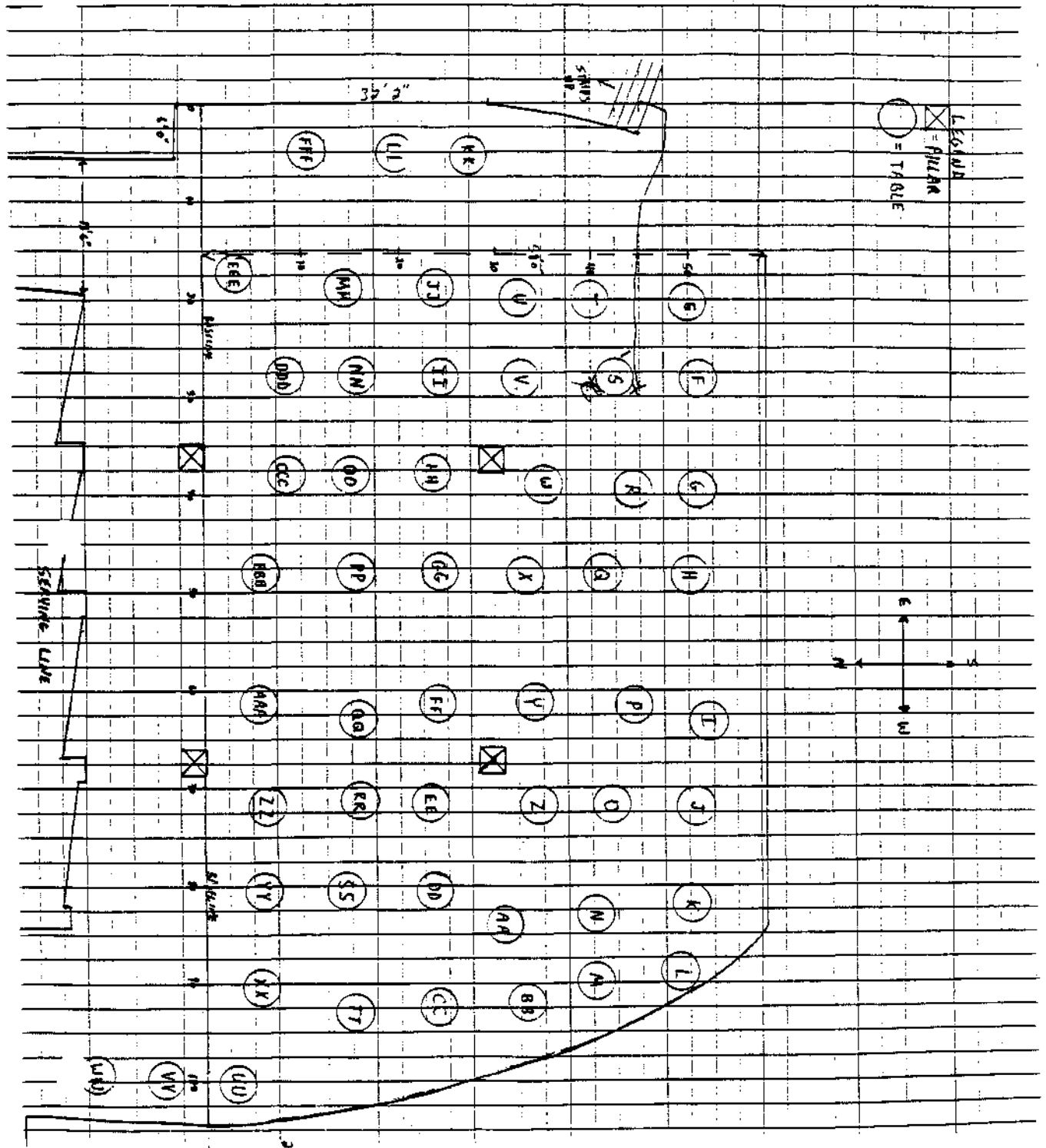

SEAN GRAVES WAS SHOT." SCHLOSSER RAN TO THE BATHROOM ON THE NORTHEAST CORNER WITH SEVERAL UNKNOWN STUDENTS. SCHLOSSER HEARD A "BIG BOOM" THEN COACH ANDRES OPENED THE DOOR. SCHLOSSER AND OTHERS WERE DIRECTED TO RUN THROUGH THE AUDITORIUM AND EXIT NEAR THE FRONT ENTRANCE. SCHLOSSER AND MANY OTHERS FLED OUT A SIDE ENTRANCE, NEAR THE FRONT ENTRANCE, AND RAN TO CLEMENT PARK. SCHLOSSER HEARD SEVERAL SHOTS WHILE RUNNING.

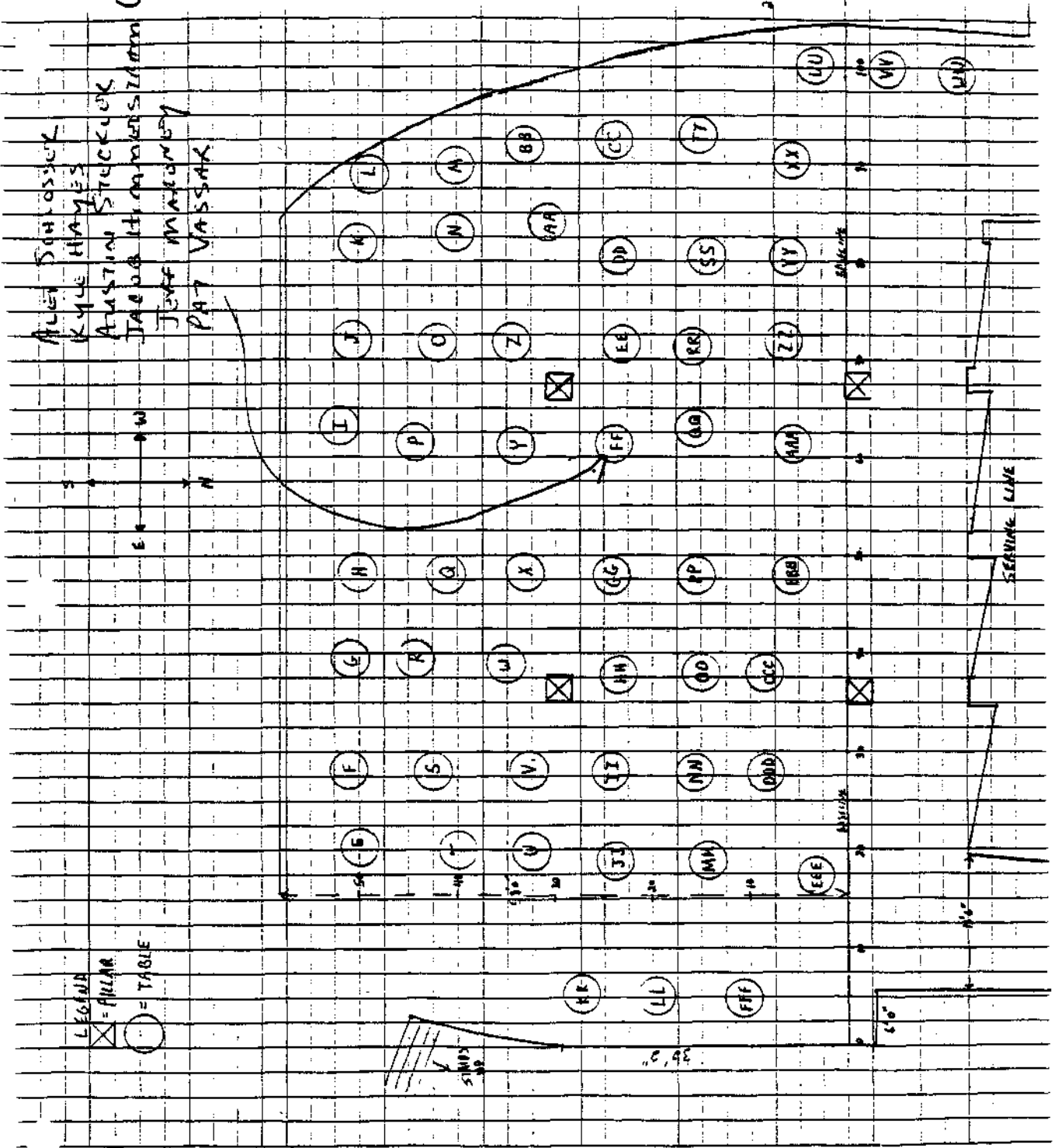

On 5/12/99 I interviewed 16 year old CHS student Megan Schoenbi<sup>en</sup> at her home in Littleton, Co. Megan's mother was present during this interview.

Megan stated she was in the CHS cafeteria around 11:20am on 4/20/99. She eats "A" lunch. She had come from Ms Layman's math class prior to entering the cafeteria. I showed Megan a drawing of the cafeteria and the tables depicted in it. I pointed out a few items in the drawings to help explain the lay-out of the drawing. I asked Megan to point to the table she sat at. She pointed to table "Z", and stated she sat with Carmie Diehl and Stephanie Wise. Megan did not see any unusually large duffle bags in the cafeteria, or see anybody carrying a large duffle bag on 4/20/99, or the previous day.

Around 11:25am she heard gunshots outside the west windows. She described these as sounding like firecrackers. Everyone in the cafeteria stood up to look, then someone yelled "get down". She did not see anyone shooting a gun, but did see smoke outside. She also heard a loud explosion outside. She got down under the table for a minute, then ran towards the steps with everyone else. She continued to hear shots behind her from the same direction they were before. She did not see anything. She ran upstairs with friends and continued running straight east, until she reached the south exit doors on Pierce street. She ran out, crossed Pierce street into Leawood Park.

She and several students went to Sara Lian's house on Caley street and contacted family. Megan did not see any gunman or suspicious people outside the school when she left.

She has no further information on the shootings and had no knowledge of the TCM. She had seen TCM students around school, but did not know them.

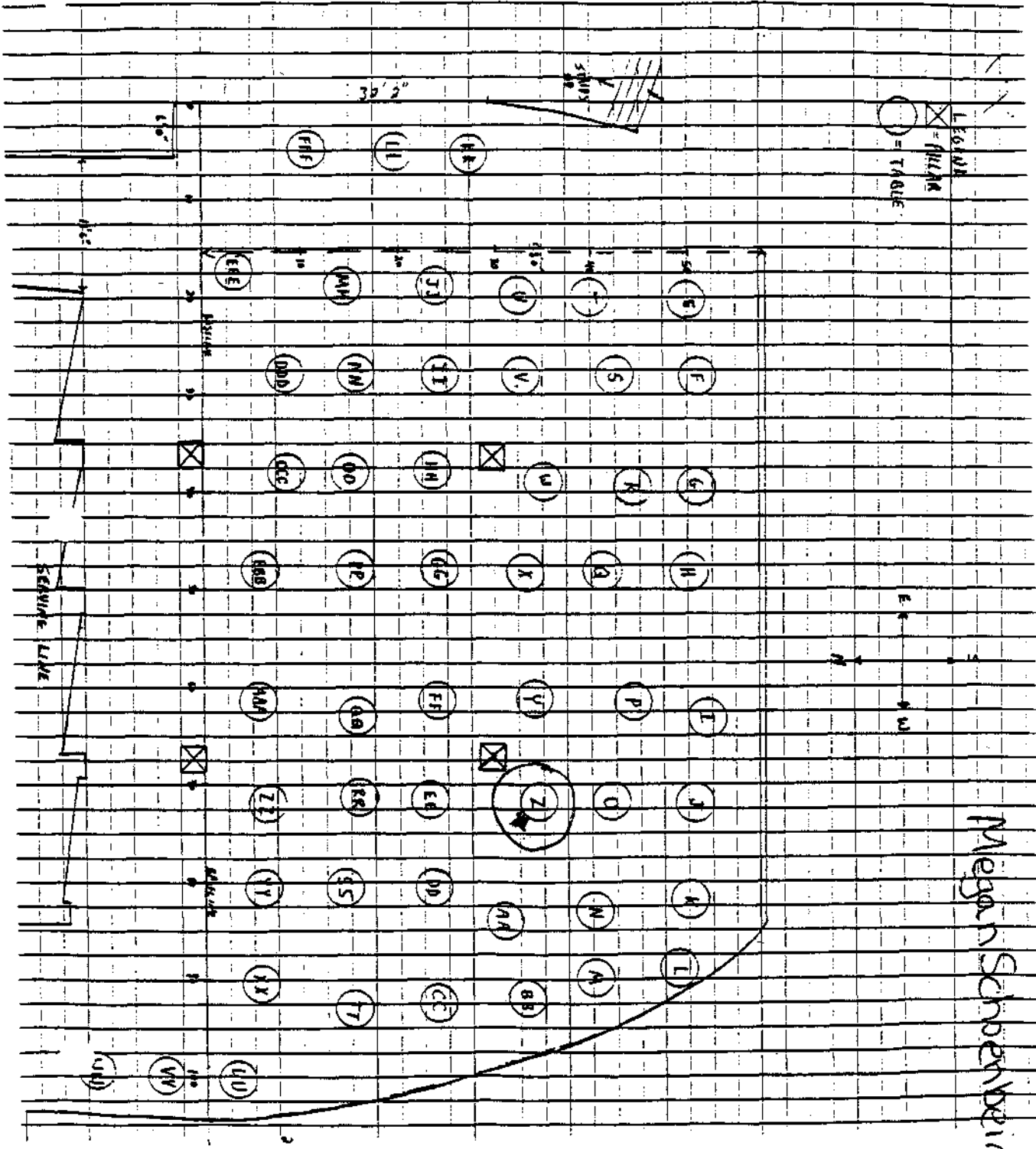
Megan advised me that two friends of hers, Katie Patrick and Beth Lavelly were in the green room, near the library until SWAT rescued them. While they were hiding, they heard a male voice calling for "Joey". Megan advised me that she got this information directly from Katie and Beth. Megan was unaware if Katie or Beth had been interviewed by Investigators.

On 04-28-1999, Kristen Schoenhoff, a sophomore at CHS, was interviewed at her residence. She acknowledged having "A" lunch and was seated at table "LL" with 1. Christine Nadine; 2. Alysha Encinas; 3. Alexis Wolf; 4. Ryan Poole; and possibly 2-3 other friends. Shortly before the incident, Kara Sander and Jenny Tindell had left the lunchroom and gone to their vehicle to pick up some makeup. She has subsequently been told by these 2 individuals that as they returned to the school they heard fireworks and attributed them to 3 male students outside the school, none of which was Harris or Klebold.

Prior to lunch, she had been in the wrestling room in a dance class. She had gone to the girl's locker room and had arrived in the lunchroom at approximately 1105.

While seated in the lunchroom, she first became aware of problems when a number of kids ran to the windows on the south side of the lunchroom and began screaming. She then heard Lee (LNU) a janitor at the school, yelling for everyone to get down under tables. Shortly thereafter, she heard 6 shots, she thought to be inside the lunchroom, and a student yelled, "there are gunmen in the lunchroom, Go!" She ran up the main stairs to the 1<sup>st</sup> level, and exited via the east doors, without confronting any gunmen. Once outside, she got into a vehicle with Joe Malozo and other friends, and they drove from the area, eventually coming home.

Since the incident she has been told that Steven Poole had been unable to exit via the stairs because of the mass of students, and instead used the elevator. When he reached the main floor, the elevator doors opened and Poole saw gunmen going into the library.

She had been wearing a black tee shirt and khaki skirt the day of the incident.

She recalls the RNN thought for the day as being something like "what a bad day to go to school".

She identified Jesse Rush as the girlfriend of Pat McDuffy.

He informed me that Katie was out of town on vacation and would only be home for a few hours on Sunday, August 1st, before leaving again for an extended period of time. I requested that Katie call me Sunday when she arrived home.**

**On August 1, 1999 Katie SCHOTT called me and related the following:**

**She was in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting began. She recalled being at a table by the window next to the parking lot (Table K or L). She heard Teacher Saunders yell at the children to get down. She hid under a table for a short period of time. She did not see the shooters or anything that was happening outside the cafeteria. She then ran up the stairs with other kids and saw smoke and heard bombs.**

**She then ran back down the stairs and down the Foreign Language hall to the last door that leads to a classroom. There she hid for 15 to 20 minutes until a teacher who was standing watch told the kids to run out of the building. She ran to the seminary.**

**Katie does not know the shooters and did not have any other significant information.**

On 5/7/99 I interviewed 15 year old CHS student David Schulte at his home in Littleton, Co. David's mother was present for this interview.


David stated he was in the CHS cafeteria for "A" lunch on 4/20/99, which began at 11:20am. He stated he had been in the cafeteria since around 10:20am, as he has 4th hour free. He recalled that during 4th hour 10:20am until 11:20am he sat at a table with several friends who also have 4th hour free. I provided David a drawing of the CHS cafeteria with the tables depicted in the drawing. I pointed out certain areas to give David a better understanding of the drawing's lay-out. He recalled that he and several CHS friends were sitting at table LL near the steps during 4th hour. Those friends included: Dan and Kim Mohrbacher, Tyson Knapke, Lisa Stepelton, Alburn Hummel and Amy Staley. David recalled that during 4th hour, he sat facing the steps, his back towards the kitchen. He was working on math homework and talking with friends. He stated that during 4th hour many students with free time come to the cafeteria to "hang out". He estimated over 100 kids are in there during this time.


I asked David about seeing a large dark duffle bag in the cafeteria during this time, or anybody carrying a large duffle bag. He did not recall seeing anything unusual. I asked David if he recalled seeing any suspicious people in or around the cafeteria during this time frame. He did not.

At the 11:15am bell, he moved to a table near the student entrance, where he usually eats lunch with a group of other students. Most of the students he has 4th hour with, don't eat "A" lunch, so they leave the cafeteria. He looked on the drawing and stated that there are 2-3 tables near the doors not indicated on the drawing. David marked where he was sitting with his "A" lunch CHS friends. They included Elaine Miller, Carder Kingsbury, Travis Jones, Issaih Salazer, BJ Secord and Kate Rebrovoic. He stated that around 11:30am he noticed everyone in the cafeteria standing up. He believed there was a fight. Then everyone got on the ground, as he heard someone yell "2 people got shot". David got under his table with several friends, then everyone began to run towards the steps. He immediately ran out the student entrance doors and turned towards Pierce street, through the Junior parking lot. He then ran onto Polk ave where he, Travis Jones, Issaih Salazer and Kate Rebrovoic were picked up by CHS student Kara (unknown last name) in a beige full size pick up. Kara dropped them off at Travis's house on W Calhone Dr where David contacted his mother.

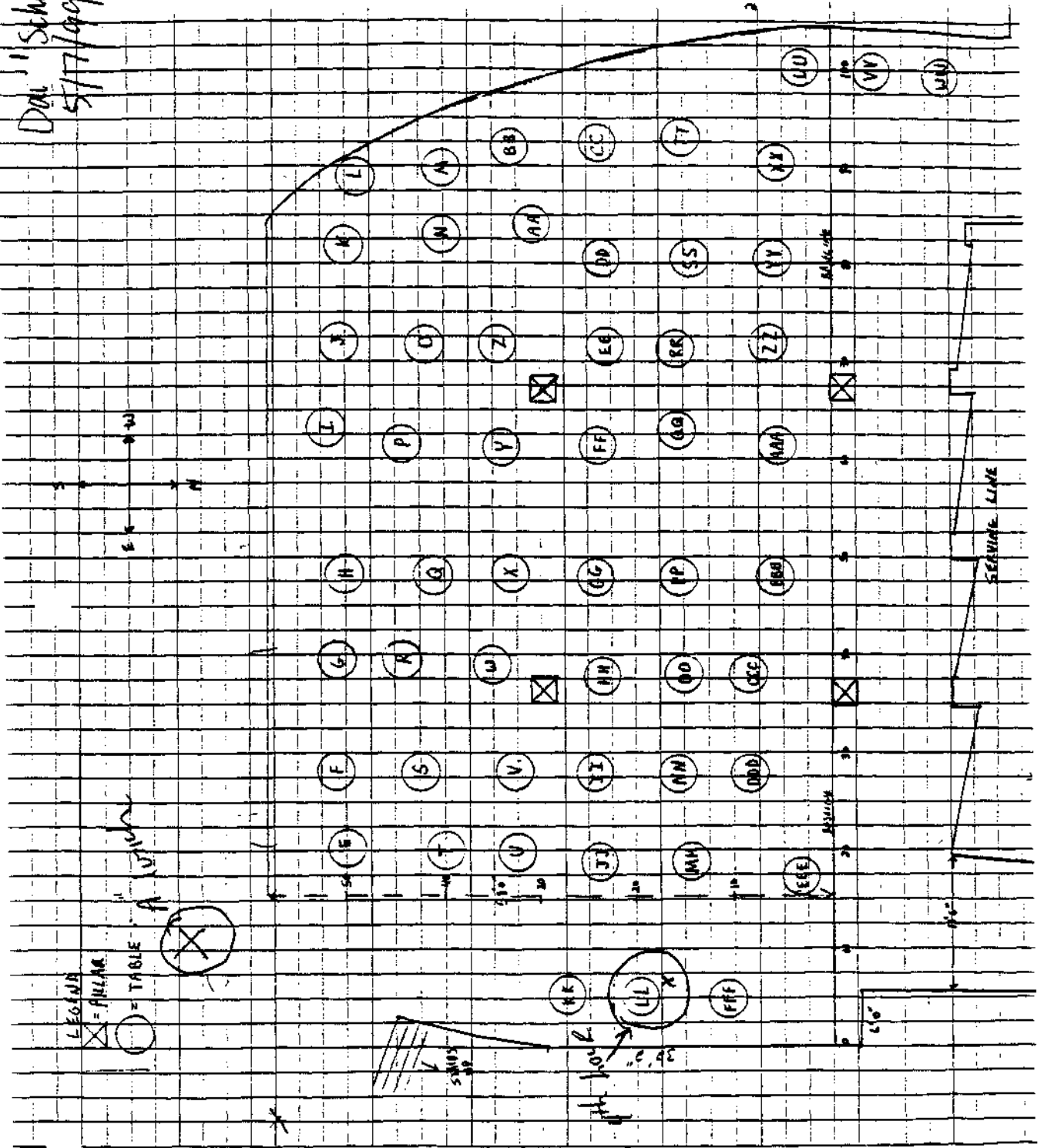
David did not see any gunman inside or outside the building. He believed his group was one of the first ones out of the building. David had no further information on the shootings, or any information of the TCM.

David left behind a blk jansport backpack with school books in it. He was wearing a green long sleeve shirt, with tan shorts and blue cap. David recalled the Rebel News Network thought of the day. He said that the words "you don't want to be here" were scripted on the monitor. David believed it was the seniors, and thought little of it.

On May 6, 1999, this investigator met with Ben Schumann at his residence. Present during the interview were his parents, Rudy and Laurie Schumann.

Ben stated that he spent his fourth hour in the cafeteria, as that is his "off hour." He said he arrived there at approximately 10:20 a.m. and commented that there were not very many students there at that time, perhaps one hundred to one hundred and twenty. He advised that his fifth hour is lunch so he generally stays there following his fourth hour.

He advised that he was at a table with the following persons: Matt Bruce, Matt Hill, Amber Rosetta, Brandy (LNU), Andrea Ellsner, Jessica Arzola, and Candice (LNU). He was shown a sketch of the cafeteria and marked table "F" as where he had been seated.

He stated that at approximately 11:15 a.m., he went over to the Rebel Corner Store and purchased a snack and was walking back to his

table when he saw a number of students run into the cafeteria through the courtyard doors. He said he heard someone yell, "somebody's been shot." Ben stated that he decided to leave the cafeteria and as he was running toward the stairs, he saw a school janitor who was telling all the students to get down. He said the janitor went over to the windows on the west side of the cafeteria and then yelled out for the students to go upstairs. Ben advised that students began to move toward the stairs and it was like a giant wave of students moving in that direction. He recalled that his friend Andrea Ellsner fell down on the stairs and helped her up. As another student fell, he helped that person also. He said he could hear glass shattering back down in the cafeteria. He advised that when he reached the second landing on the stairs, he could hear bullets hitting the wall behind him and said that a piece of shattered tile hit him on the back of the head.

He said he was aware of the location of an emergency exit in the math hall but was headed at first toward the science hall. He stated that he heard a gunshot and ran back down the hall and saw MR. SANDERS on the floor. He said Mr. Sanders was down on his hands and knees and was bleeding from his mouth. Ben saw Mr. Sanders motion with his arm, indicating that he wanted Ben to get away. Ben said he ran toward the math hall and could hear someone yelling, "they're coming, they're coming." He advised that when he approached the edge of the math hall, he heard "a couple of shots."

Ben ran out of the school using the emergency exit in the math hall and continued to run to Leawood Park. (SEE ATTACHED COPY OF FLOOR PLAN)

Ben stated that he does not know Eric Harris, nor does he know Dylan Klebold. He stated that he does know [REDACTED] as they were in the same freshman drawing class. He said he never really spent any time talking to him. He advised that he did know a student who was "really into the trenchcoat stuff." He said her name was Kelly Schwabb. He advised that he did not see the Rebel News Network

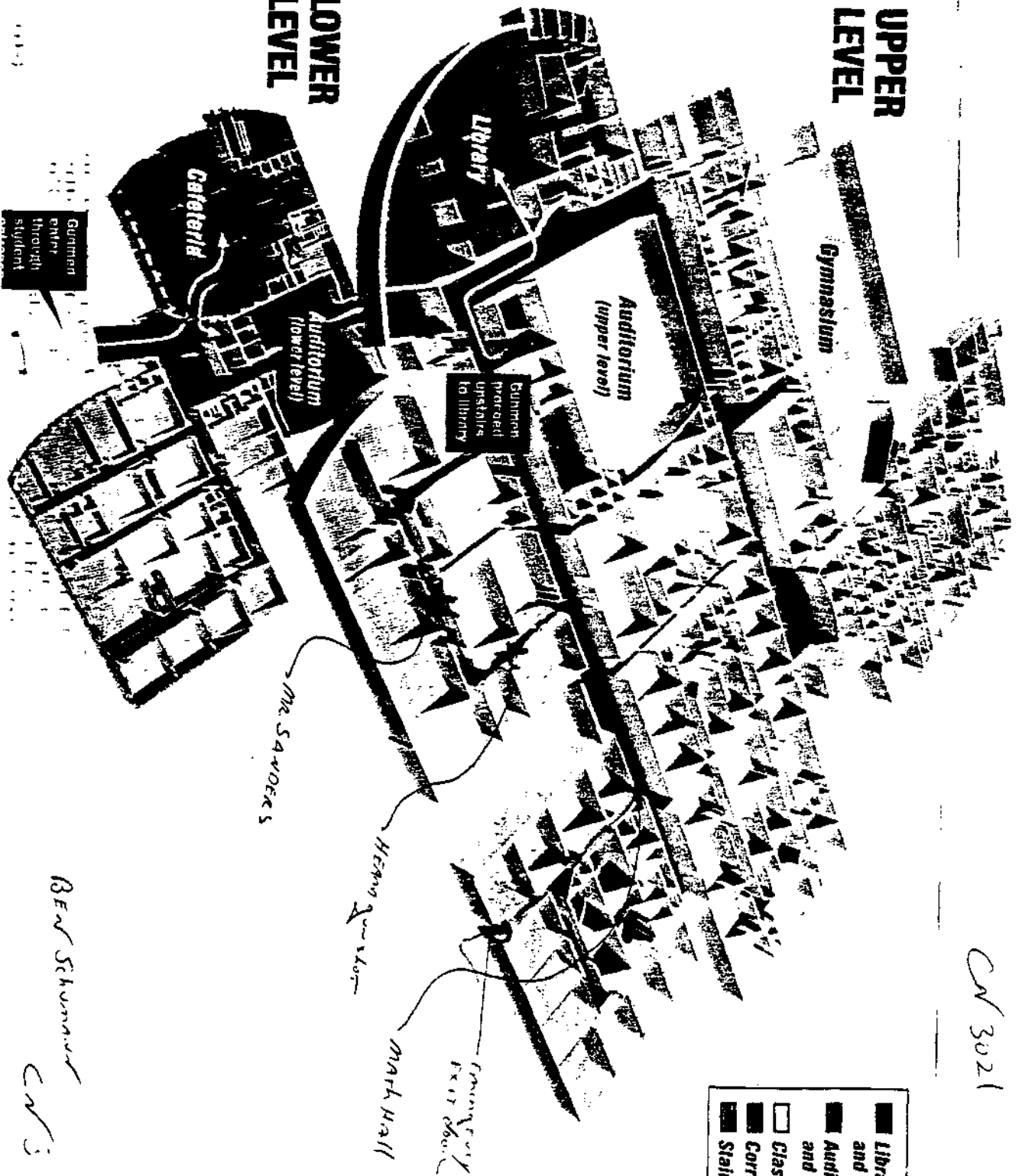

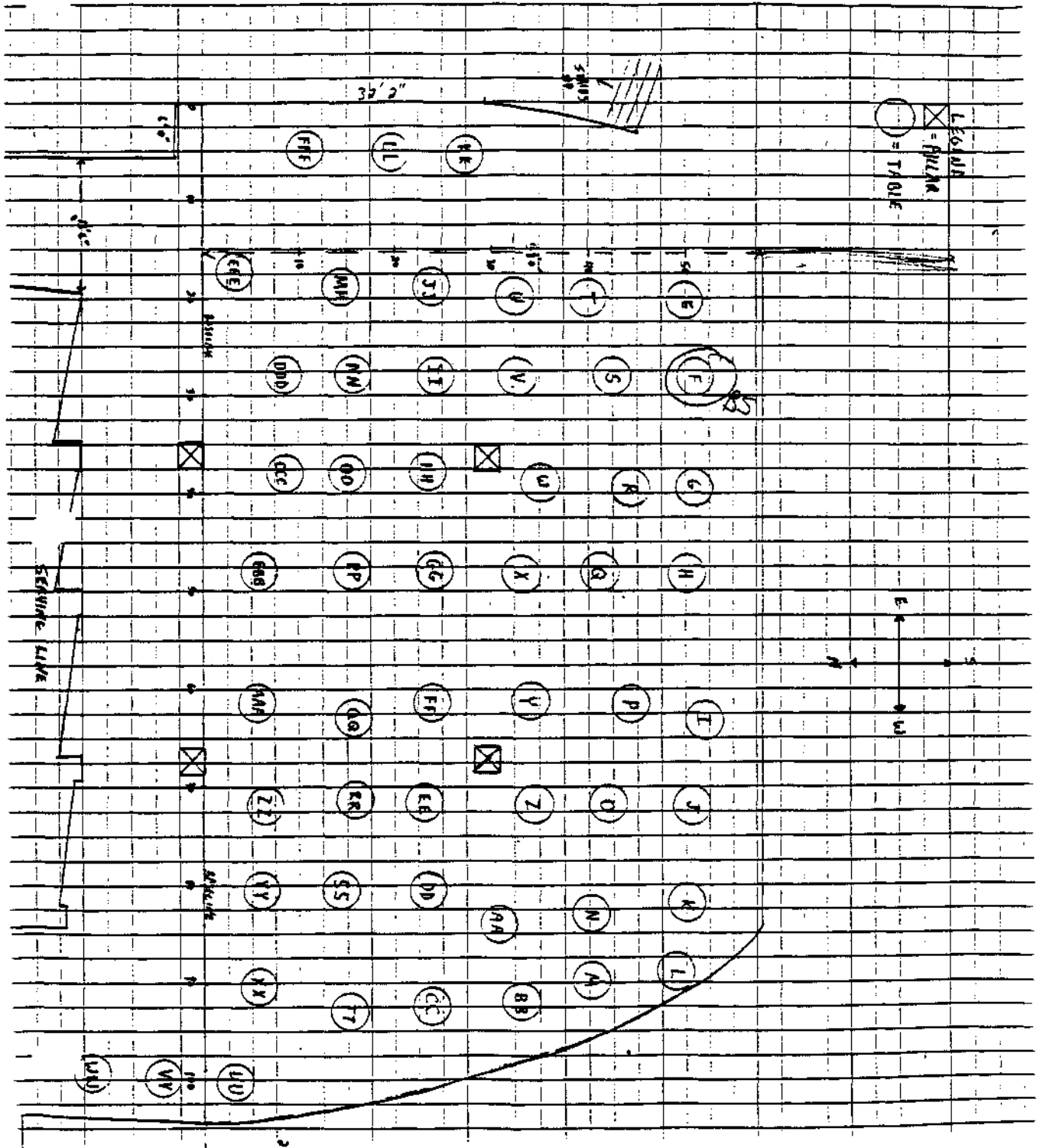

On May 6, 1999, this investigator met with Nicholas Schumann at his residence. Present during the interview were his parents, Rudy and Laurie Schumann.

Nicholas stated that he had returned from a marketing banquet and arrived in the cafeteria at approximately 11:00 a.m. He advised that he works in the store in the Rebel Corner and after about ten minutes, he went into the store's office. He identified others working at the store as Louis Scileppi, Liza Madden, Tina Berracchi, Carrie Green and a teacher, Mrs. Frommer. He said that he and Tina went into the store office and were counting money when a student came in and told them " get down, someone has a gun." Nicholas said he went out into the cafeteria to look for his brother Ben and happened to look out the window and saw a male subject outside at the southwest corner of the cafeteria. He stated that this subject was wearing a white T-shirt and had a white bandana around his head covering short blonde hair. He noted that the person had on dark colored pants and was of stocky build. He said this person was

looking through the windows along the courtyard side of the cafeteria when he suddenly got down on the ground, on his stomach with his hands under his chest - like a push-up position. He advised that this person looked scared. Nicholas stated that he heard some kind of explosion inside the cafeteria but he could not tell where the noise came from.

He advised that he and several others hid in a room, referred to as the Business I room which is adjacent to the store office. He said that he had lost track of time while hiding but did hear what sounded like gunshots coming from the area of the cafeteria. He said that later, he heard more gunshots and voices, "whooping and hollering" as the shots were being fired. He said the shots sounded very rapid, like automatic gunfire, and sounded like two different weapons. He stated that there had been one very loud explosion which caused ceiling tiles to fall. He also recalled there being a large amount of water on the floor from the sprinklers. He said that he could hear more gunshots coming from upstairs as well as the sound of footsteps - running. He described some sounds as that of what he perceived as tables being overturned. He advised that Mrs. Frommer was trying to get an outside line on a phone in the office but all the numbers were busy. He said she did finally get through to the Littleton Fire Department.

Nicholas stated that at approximately 3:00 p.m., a SWAT team came in and took them to safety. He stated that he had been wearing brown pants, a cream colored dress shirt and a tie. He advised that he had removed his shirt prior to being rescued by the SWAT officers.


He did hear about the phrase of the day. He said it was something like "it's going to be a bad day."

Nicholas stated that he does not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, nor any of their friends.

This investigator was advised by Mr. Schumann that Nicholas had been previously interviewed by Det. Don Becchi (SP?) of the Denver Police Department and that this interview had been videotaped.

Attached to this report is a sketch of the upper and lower levels of the school. Nicholas has indicated where he observed the individual outside of the cafeteria and also traced his exit out of the cafeteria.

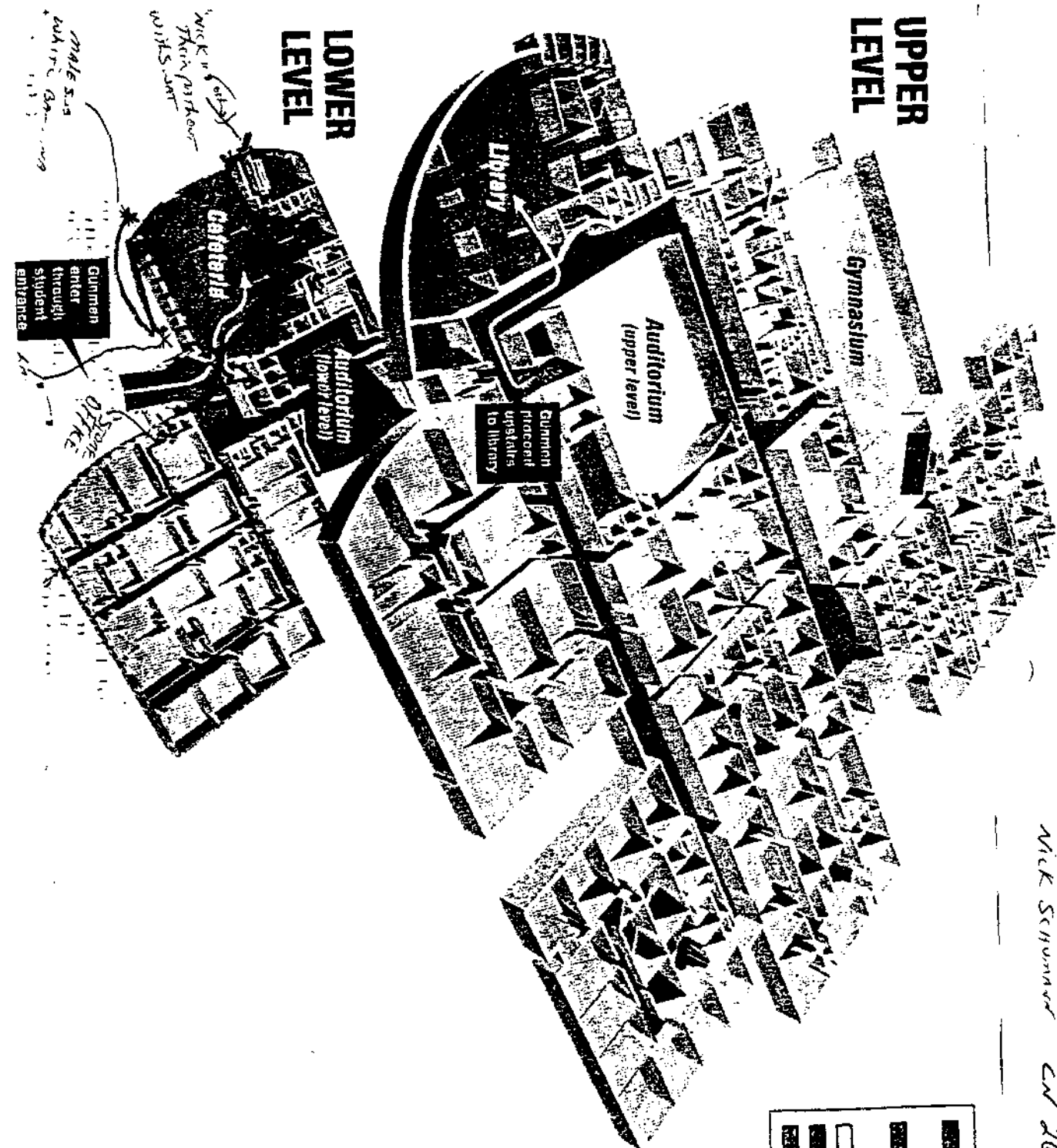

On 05-13-99, at 0930, contact was made with Angela Schwartz, a Freshman at CHS, who confirms being present at CHS on 04-20-99 and being assigned to "A" lunch. She noted being seated at table "P" with Candace Haywood and 5-6 other students whom she could not remember.

She had arrived in the cafeteria at 1115, following her 4<sup>th</sup> hour language arts class. She was first alerted to the situation when Mr. Sanders ran through the cafeteria yelling for everyone to get down under their tables. She remained under a table for a short time, then students soon began running from the cafeteria. She followed a group of students into the lower level of the auditorium, where they took the stairs to the main level, and exited the north doors, near the tennis courts.


Schwartz reports never confronting gunmen while in the school, nor did she observe any suspicious activity in the cafeteria prior to the incident.

She does not know any of the "TCM" members, and notes that this was her first year in public schools. She has attended private schools in the past.

Her blue Jansport backpack was left in the cafeteria with the only personal item being her pager.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 6, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Colleen Schwartzott, who was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting. I contacted the witness's mother, Janice, and made an appointment for the interview on May 11th at 0800.

On May 11th at 0750 I went to 7271 South Upham Street, and contacted Colleen Schwartzott. Colleen advised that she was in the ninth grade at Columbine High School and had been in the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. Colleen reported that she arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:00 to 11:05AM, and was sitting at a table in the hall way in front of the student store. She stated that there were three tables in the hall, and she was sitting at the one closest to the exit door. Colleen advised that she was sitting with the following people:

Mike Foster  
Braden Pollard  
Elaine Miller  
Jeff Knoll

Colleen related that the first indication of trouble was people outside the cafeteria began running toward the west. They then turned around and ran back toward the east. At this same time a janitor and Mr. Sanders came through the cafeteria telling everyone to get under the tables. Colleen said that they got under the table and waited there for about thirty (30) seconds before running out the south-east cafeteria exit. She continued to say that they ran across the south parking lot to South Pierce Street and

then into the neighborhood just south of the school. There they took shelter in a house. She did not know the people at the house who took them in. She said that they stayed at this house for about twenty (20) minutes and then went to another girl's house and from there she got a ride to Mike Foster's house where her parents picked her up.

Colleen advised that while she was seated at the cafeteria table she did not see anyone with a gun come through the south-east exit. She also said that she did not hear any shots while in the cafeteria or while crossing the parking lot. She did say that while she was in the first house she went to there were two to three big booms coming from the school. Colleen said the booms were big enough to shake the house. Colleen further advised that she did not observe any duffel bags in the cafeteria when she arrived, however, she related that there were all ready alot of people in the cafeteria when she got there. Also Colleen said that she did not see anyone carry such a duffel bag into the cafeteria while she was there.

Colleen advised that she had been in math class prior to going to the cafeteria for lunch. She said that she stopped at her locker before going to the cafeteria by way of the south hall stairs. Colleen stated that she did not see anyone with a gun in the library hall on her way to the cafeteria. Colleen said that she thought she heard another student say they had guns and someone had been shot while she was hiding under the table, but she advised that it might have been other students saying this.

Colleen advised that she does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan klebold and she has had not contact with either subject. She continued to say that she does not know anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia, nor do any of her friends associate with the group.

Colleen reported that she had heard no rumors about impending trouble prior to April 20th, nor had she heard anyone talking about building bombs before the incident.

Colleen said that she had left her back pack in the cafeteria, and described it as a Blue Jan Sport. She advised that the pack contained her books, glasses, and keys.

Janice Schwartzott told me that the information that Colleen gave me was the same thing that Colleen told her on April 20th.

Since Colleen could provide no further information the interview concluded at 0814.

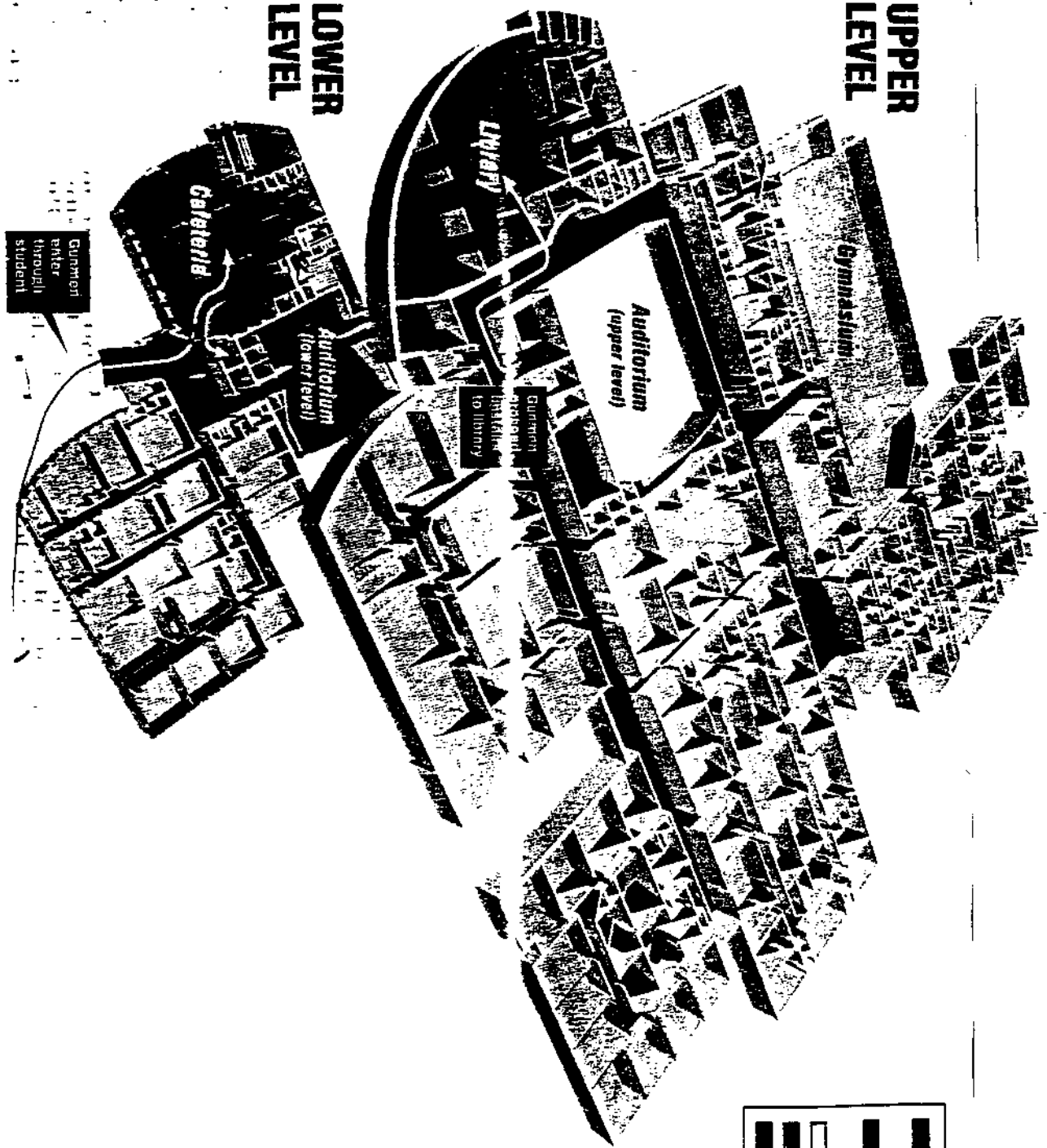

On May 6, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Sara Schweitzberger, who was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting. I spoke to Steve Schweitzberger, Sara's father, by phone and made an appointment for the interview at 0900 on May 11th.

On May 11th at 0845 hours I arrived at 6270 Summit Drive and contacted Sara Schweitzberger. Sara confirmed that she was at Columbine High School on April 20th. Sara advised that she is in the ninth grade and was in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting.

Sara reported that she arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:00AM. Sara said that she had left her back pack at table identified as "GG". However, she had taken a lunch to a friend who was sitting at table identified as "FFF" and this is where she was at the time of the shooting. Sara said that she was with the following people at table "FFF":

The first indication Sara had that there was a problem was when her friend, Chris Marcum, came running into the cafeteria through the west door near the faculty lounge saying something to the effect they've got a gun and someone was shot. Sara thought it might be a prank until the janitors came running by telling everyone to get down. She then heard shots coming from what appeared to be the outside of the cafeteria toward the west. Sara said the sound of the shots kind of echoed. Sara said that she did not see who was doing the shooting.

Sara reported that she hid under the table for about two minutes and then ran to a door in the north-west corner of the lower level of the auditorium. From there she ran up the stairs in the auditorium to the upper level and then exited the auditorium by way of the north-east upper level door into the north main level hall way. From there they went east in the north hall to a hall way on the east side of the gym, between the gym and office area, and then ran north through this hall and exited the building on the north-east corner of the gym. From there they went to the tennis courts on the north side of the school and climbed the fence into Clement Park. Sara advised that because some of the kids were having trouble climbing over the fence, picnic tables were pushed against the fence to assist them. Sara stated that she waited in Clement Park for about ten minutes watching as the police cars began arriving and then she went to the library at Crosss Drive and Bowels Avenue where she called her parents. Sara advised that she waited at the library for her parents to pick her up. Sara also reported that while she was in the north hall she heard shots coming from behind (west) her. Sara advised that she did not see who was shooting. Sara also advised that while she was hiding under the table she saw a big puff of smoke in the parking lot to the west of the school. She described the smoke as being grayish in color.

Sara advised that she did not see any type of a large duffel bag on the floor in the cafeteria when she got there, nor did she observe anyone carry such a bag into the cafeteria while she was there.

Sara advised that she did not know Eric Harris but she had Dylan Klebold in her gym class during the fall semester of 1998. She said that she did not have any dealings with Klebold. She advised that some of the kids would tease him because of his height, as he was the tallest person in the class. Sara continued to say that Klebold would just ignore them. Sara said that she does not know anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia or any of its members.

Sara reported that she had heard no rumors about there being trouble on April 20th, before the 20th. She advised that she thought the 20th might be some stoner celebration like national pot smoking day or something like that. She said that she had heard general talk around school about kids building pipe bombs and potato guns, but she could not attribute it to any one person. Sara also said that she heard that one of the morning announcements said "todays going to be a bad day". She advised that she did not personally hear this announcement. She continued to say that she believed that Harris or Klebold had something to do with the announcements.

Sara said that she had left her pack in the cafeteria and described it as a blue Jan Sport. She said that there was a clip on the strap and a "smily face" painted on it in white out. She stated that the pack contained binders with Bronco stickers on them, make up, and a math book also with Bronco stickers on it.

Sara could provide no additional information and the interview concluded at 0815.

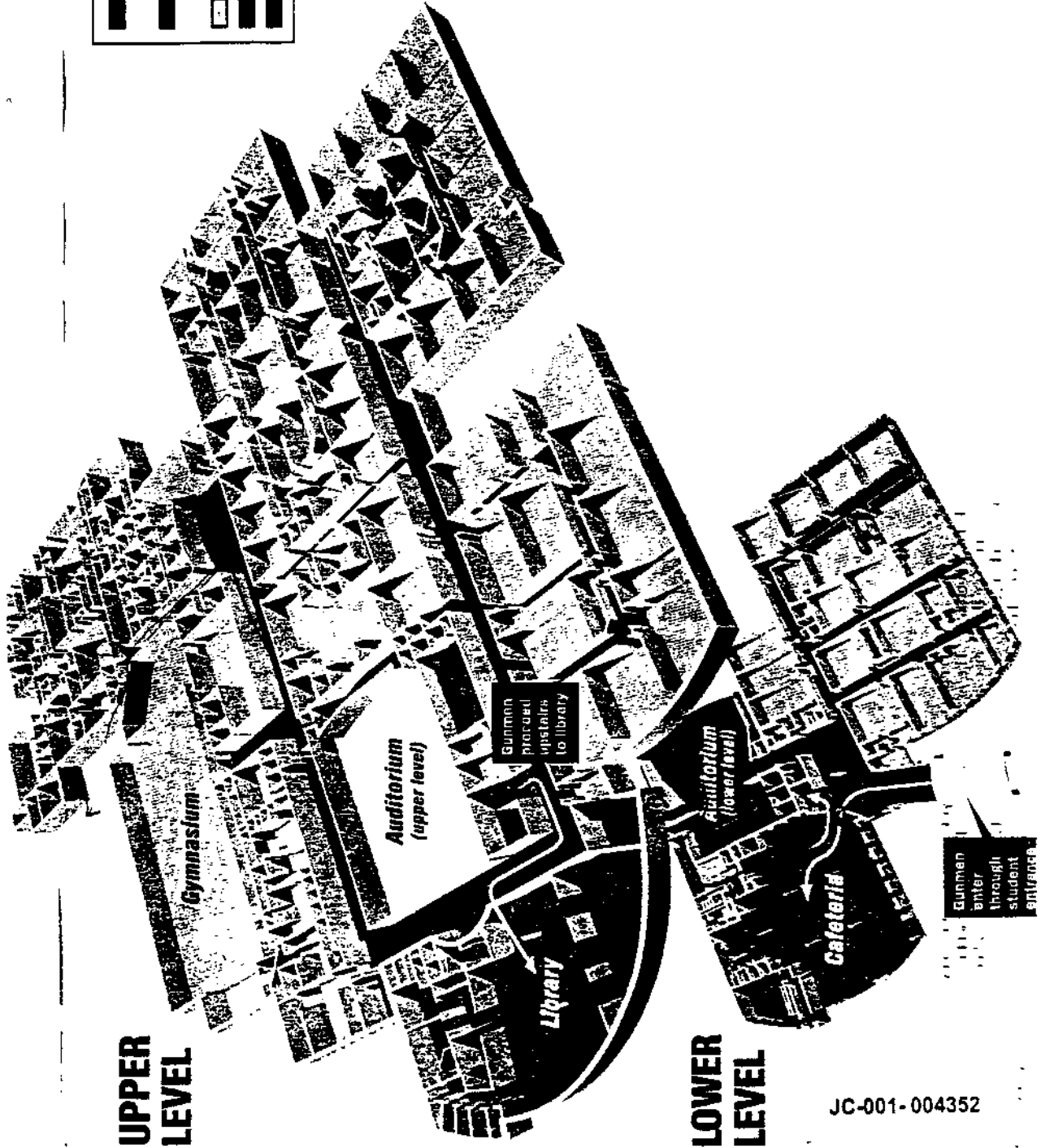

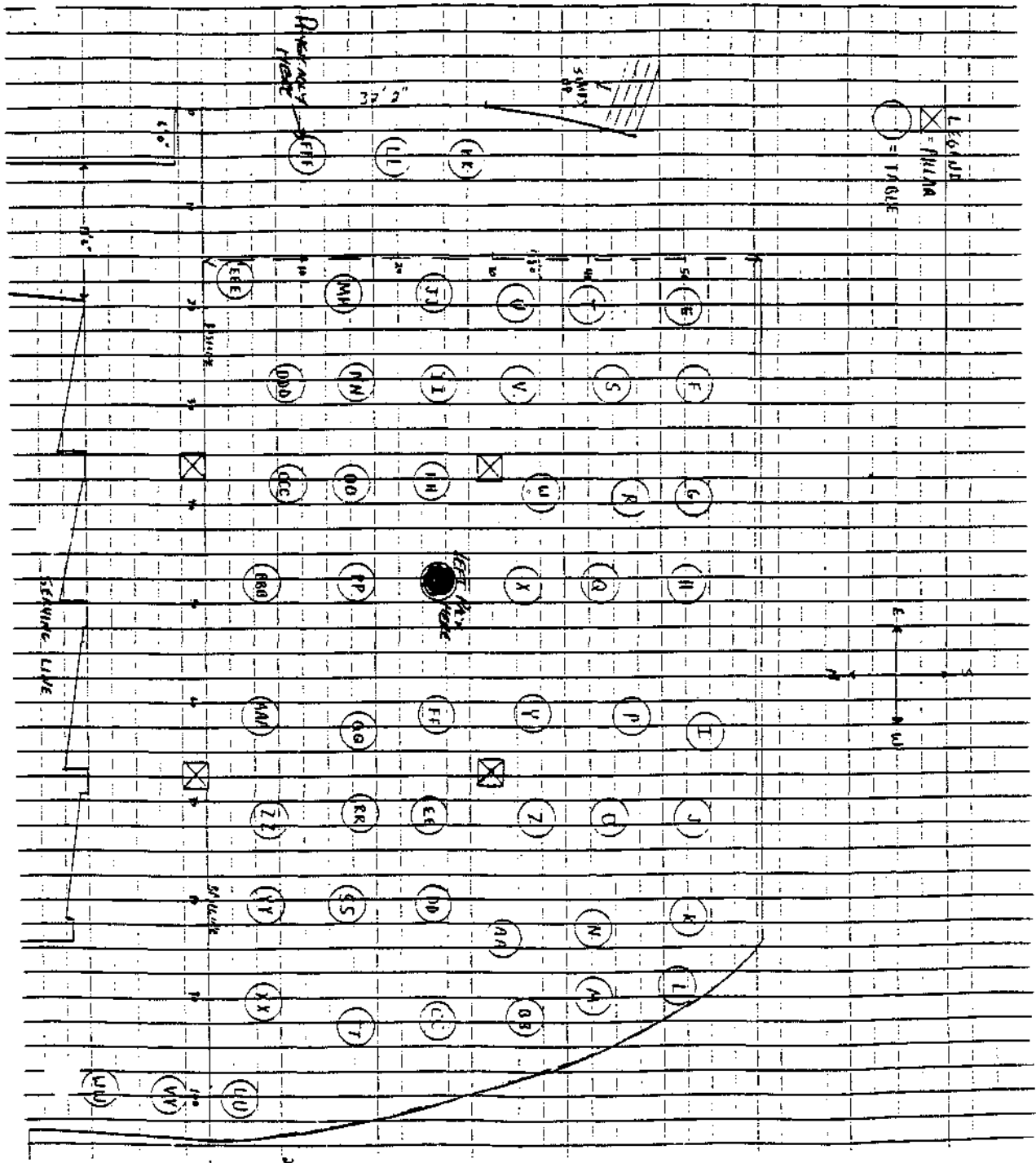

On April 28, 1999, detectives went to SCILEPPI's residence (above), and spoke to him in the presence of his parents, Michael and Rose SCILEPPI. Michael SCILEPPI's cell phone number is (303) 419-8986.

SCILEPPI was inside Columbine High School, working in the school store in the cafeteria prior to the shooting. He did not see the shooters, but heard shots and explosions. He ran back to the office, behind the store area. During that time he said he heard about ten shots in a row, rapid fire. Then he went through the office to a business classroom, where he hid behind a desk. He heard 50 or 60 more shots, and explosions. He used a telephone in the classroom to call his father.

SCILEPPI told detectives that he had been spoken to by someone at Leawood Elementary School after the shooting, "for about two minutes".

[REDACTED] He said he did not have anything to do with either HARRIS or KLEBOLD; however, he related that Brian SARGENT doesn't like him. He said that last year he was riding in a car with Bobby STROBEL (driver) and Chris COWLES, when SARGENT and Chris MORRIS (and perhaps others) were blocking the street. SCILEPPI hollered at them out the window of the car, "get out of the way, fag", and STROBEL started forward forcing them to get out of the way. He recalled that MORRIS came after the car for a short distance, swinging some kind of chain which he had under his trench coat.

Neither STROBEL or COWLES have been interviewed at the time of this report, and at this time it does not appear to be necessary to interview them.

SCILEPPI said some of his friends bowled with HARRIS and KLEBOLD, but he was not involved in that.

SCILEPPI related in unusual event which occurred on Monday, April 19, 1999. He and a friend, Craig WARDE, came to SCILEPPI's residence in Louis' car about 1030 to 1045 hrs. They went into the house, then SCILEPPI went outside to get the mail. At that time he observed two males on the walkway adjacent to SCILEPPI's driveway, walking toward the street from the greenbelt area which runs behind the houses in that block. The males were dressed in black-shirts and black pants. They were not wearing trench coats.

SCILEPPI recognized one of the males as Eric HARRIS; who was personally known to him. He spoke to HARRIS, but did not pay particular attention to the second male; however he believes it was Dylan KLEBOLD.

SCILEPPI explained that there was a game being played among seniors at Columbine, called "Annihilation", in which the participants would shoot at one another with water pistols. The object being that if a player was "hit", he or she would then be out of the game.

SCILEPPI asked HARRIS, "What are you doing back there? Killing someone?" to which HARRIS replied, "Yeah, so don't go back there for a couple days".

The following day, April 20, 1999, a bomb was discovered in the greenbelt behind the residence adjacent to SCILEPPI's, and detonated after being moved by some public service workers. A fire department investigator, Bill MARON conducted the investigation.

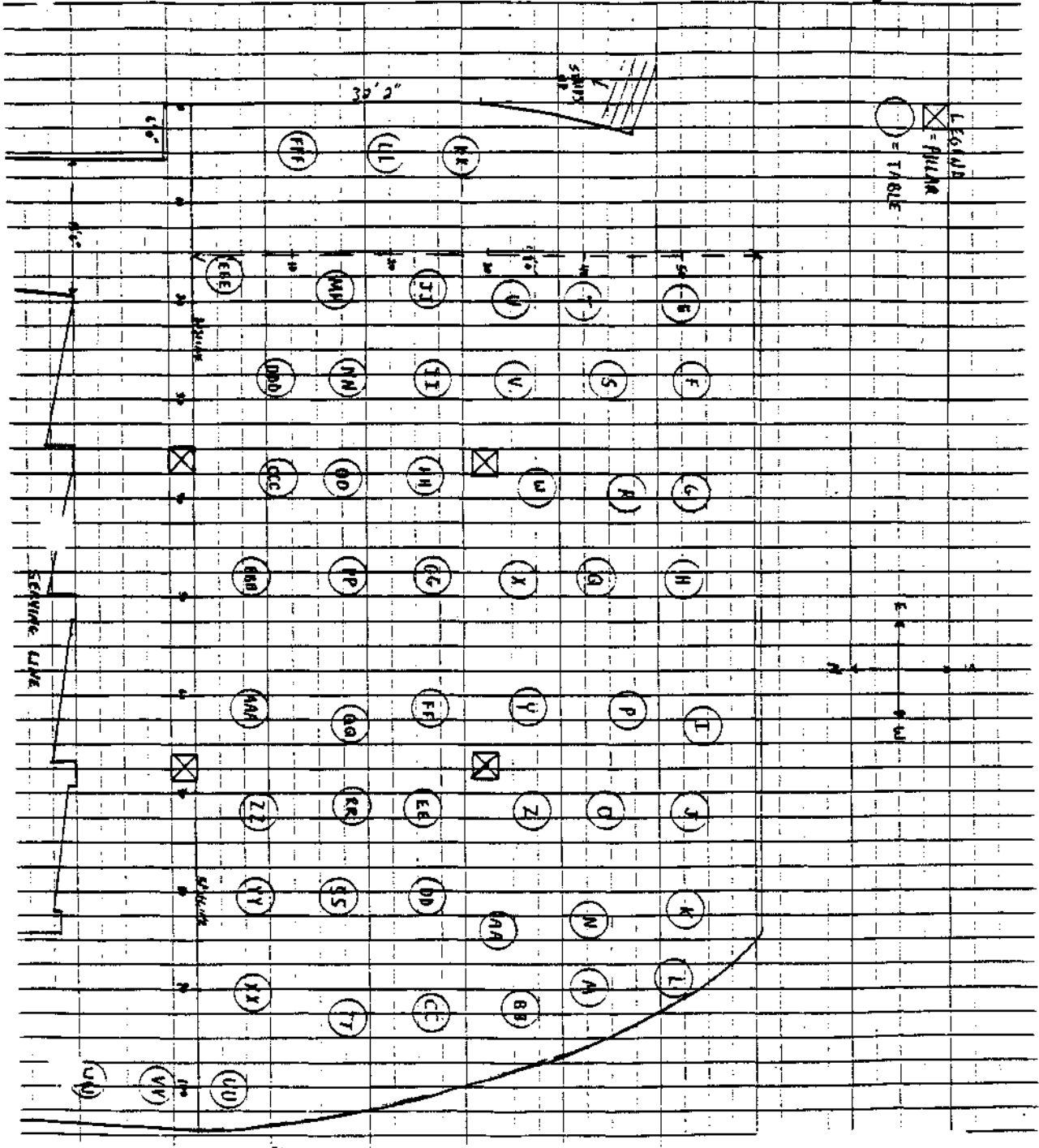

On 5-11-99, Inv Reker did interview Scott at her residence with her parents present.

Scott states that she was sitting at table T and had gone to the west window of the serving line when an unknown male came running in yelling about a person with a gun.

Scott then heard shots and ran into the kitchen area and sat down and while peering over the counter she observed a person with a black ski mask come in to the cafeteria area using the west cafeteria door, and that she could only see him from the shoulder area up. This person did not say anything and after Scott felt that he had gone back out the door, she ran out of the kitchen to the auditorium, and to the main hallway and exited the north side of the school and ran to Clement Park.

Scott also states that a special education student whom works in the library whose name is Nathan Fansler has stated in the past that he has "bombs in his heart." but this day he stated that there were bombs in the trash.

Scott was unable to provide any further information and the interview was terminated.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On June 1, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student B.J. Secord. On June 2, 1999 I spoke with Secord's mother, Mari, and made an appointment to interview B.J. on June 3rd at 1500.

On June 3, 1999 at 1500 I arrived at 6966 South Kendall Blvd. and contacted B.J. Secord. B.J. advised that his correct name was William James Secord III. He advised that he attended Columbine High School and with in the ninth grade. B.J. also advised that he had been in school on April 20, 1999, and that he had been in the cafeteria.

B.J. said that he arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:10AM. He continued to say that he was seated at a table in the hall way across from the student store. He reported that he was seated with the following people:

Isiah Salazar  
Megan Mulvany  
Dave Schulte  
Jason Hensley

B.J. said that he first realized there was a problem when someone yelled "fight" and some of his friends started to run toward the windows on the southwest side of the cafeteria. B.J. said that he also started to walk toward the windows when someone yelled gun or something like that and everyone got under the tables. B.J. reported that while he was under the table he heard two sharpe shots. B.J. advised that there was one shot, a pause, and then the second shot. B.J. said that he did not see who was

shooting nor could he tell exactly where the shots came from because of the screaming and shouting going on in the cafeteria. B.J. said that while he was hiding under the table, he looked up, and out one of the windows and observed Nick Foss outside of the cafeteria on the patio. B.J. said that Foss appeared to be holding his head or was running. B.J. said that he could not be sure what Foss was doing as he ducked back under the table and did not observe Foss very long. He described Foss as wearing a white bandana and a white shirt. B.J. advised that he had observed Foss wearing this same combination earlier in the day. B.J. continued to say that after a short period of time he and his friends ran out of the southeast exit from the cafeteria and across the parking lot to South Pierce Street. From there they ran south on Pierce Street to West Polk Avenue and then west on Polk Avenue to about the third or fourth house west of Pierce Street. B.J. said that there was a man in the front yard. They told him what was happening and took cover in the house. He advised that the man did call 911 and report the shootings. B.J. advised that he does not know who this person is.

B.J. advised that prior to going to lunch he had been in spanish class, which is located on the lower level to the east of the cafeteria. B.J. stated that he walked down the hall way between the lower level of the auditorium and the lower level class rooms to the cafeteria. He related that he did not pass or encounter anyone from the Trench Coat Mafia while he was in the hall way. B.J. said that he did not notice a large duffel type bag in the cafeteria, nor did he notice anyone carry such a bag into the cafeteria while he was there. B.J. also said that he did not see anyone carrying such a bag while he was walking to the cafeteria. B.J. said that he had been at the table only a short time before the shooting started. He advised that he had purchased something to drink at the student store, sat down, and had just started to drink when someone said there was a fight. B.J. advised that he had left this pack at the table. He described the pack as a black East Sport. He advised that he had retrieved the pack on June 2nd.

B.J. advised that he shared a gym class with Dylan Klebold during the first semester (fall 1998) of the school year. He advised that he did not have any contact with Klebold as Klebold was in a sports class, and he had a weight class. B.J. continued to say that he did not talk to Klebold since underclassmen did not generally talk to upperclassmen unless they knew each other. B.J. said that he did not know Eric Harris and was not familiar with Harris's web site nor did he know what names Harris or Klebold used on the internet. B.J. continued to say that neither he or any of his friends are associated with the Trench Coat Mafia. He also advised that he had not heard of the group until he got to high school.

B.J. advised that there had been no rumors about impending trouble at school on April 20th before that day, and he had heard no rumors about anyone building bombs or buying guns.

B.J. related that he ususally rides to school with a neighbor. On April 20th they arrived at school at about 7:00AM and parked in the junior lot. He advised that when he arrived at the school he noticed nothing out of the ordinary occurring in the lot.

B.J. could provide no additional information and the interview

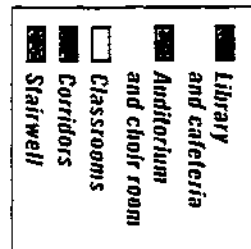
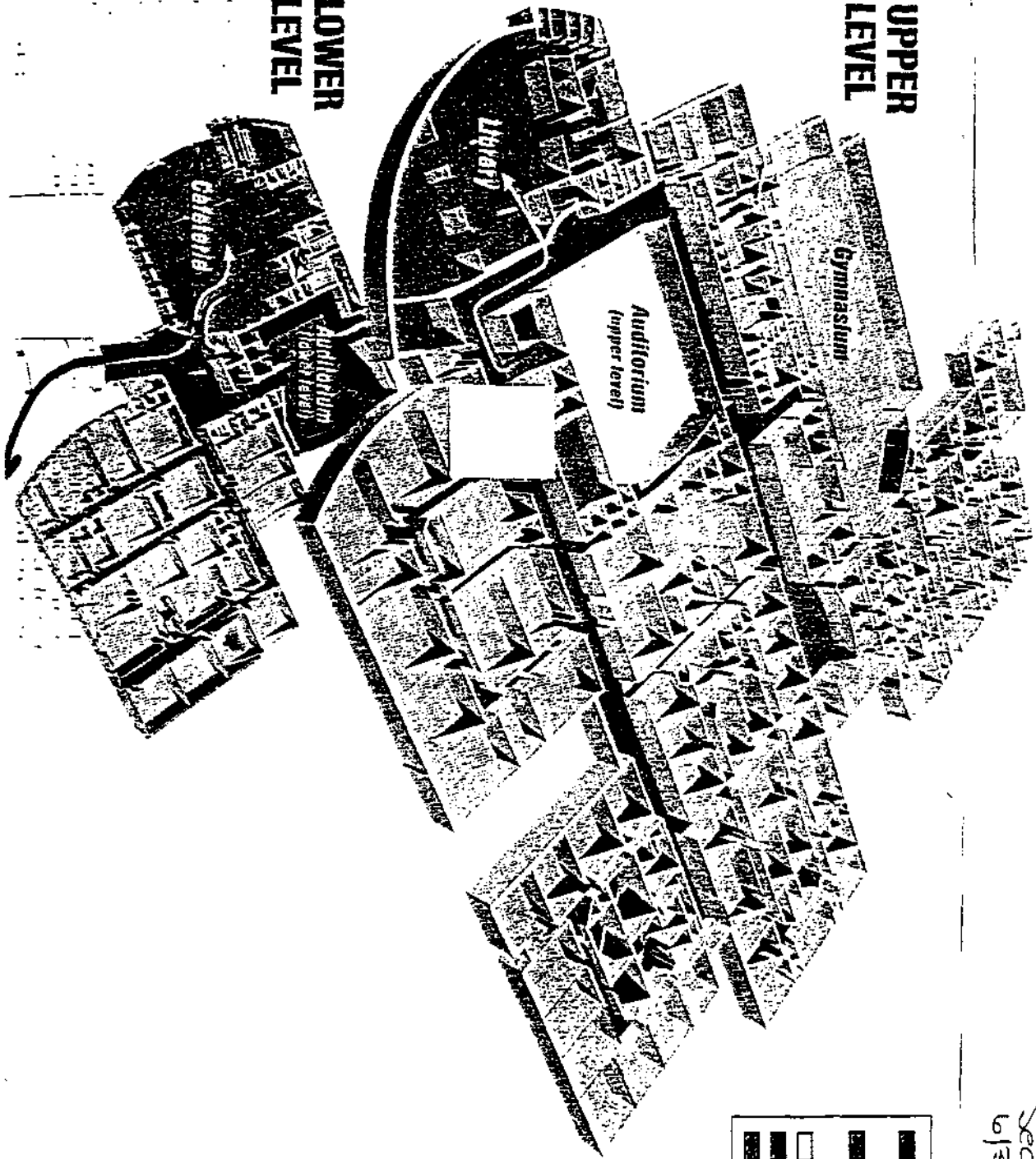

Philip told me the following:

He went to all his classes on the morning of April 20th. He was not in the cafeteria prior to lunchtime. He was sitting at table BB. Initially, he couldn't remember who else was sitting at the table with him. He later remembered that one of the people was Seth Dubois. Another was a student name Jerett Baer, 5453 W Canyon Trail, Littleton 303 973-7622.

Philip said that he turned around to look out the window for some reason. He saw a girl with blood on her and a guy trying to somehow help her right outside the window. He did not know who these people were. Then, he looked to the right of these people and saw Dylan with a double barrel shotgun. When asked how he knew it was Dylan, he said that he didn't know that it

was Dylan until he saw photos in the newspapers. The person he thinks was Dylan was wearing a black trench coat and a black hat.

Philip said that this person then shot another boy who was huddled down on the other side of the fence. He said that this person held the shot gun in one hand. He thinks it was the right hand. He said that this person (he still thinks it was Dylan) shot the boy in the back. Philip looked away. At that point, a custodian was telling people to get down. He got down.

A few minutes later people started running. He went out the foreign language hall. People were wondering what to do. People were saying to get into a room. He looked outside and then he and Jerret took off and ran to Jerret's house.

Philip said that he had heard of the TCM, but never saw them. He said he had only been at Columbine High School since January of this year.

He never saw the duffel bags. He wouldn't know any TCM people if he saw them. He left his back pack in the cafeteria. It was a black and yellow Eastpack. Inside it was his calculator, all his books, notebooks and supplies.

He said that he has no knowledge of anybody else being involved. He does not use the Internet and he thought that the Rebel News Network announcements that morning were regular.

A diagram of the cafeteria is attached to this report.

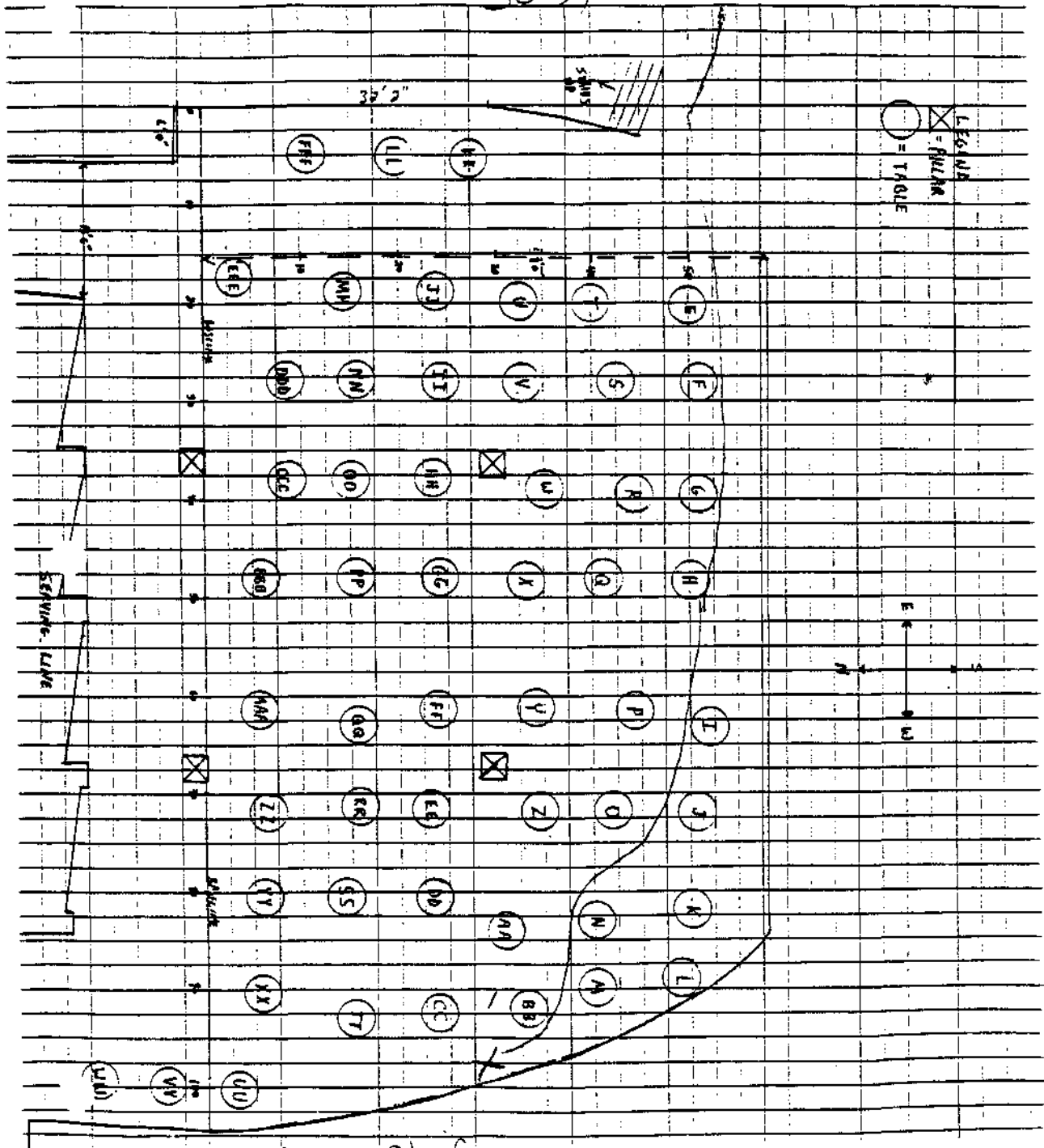



SESOW stated that he was in the south corner of the cafeteria when he heard gunshots and a teacher instructing people to get on the floor. He immediately got on the floor and started crawling towards the stairs. When he was half way to the stairs, he heard two more gunshots and saw some of the band members heading towards the kitchen and decided to follow them. SESOW stated he hid in a kitchen closet for approximately two hours. According to SESOW, members of a SWAT team rescued him and 13 others. He was taken by police patrol car to Caley Court at approximately 1:30 p.m. SESOW stated he did not see the shooters or any strange backpacks or bags in the cafeteria.

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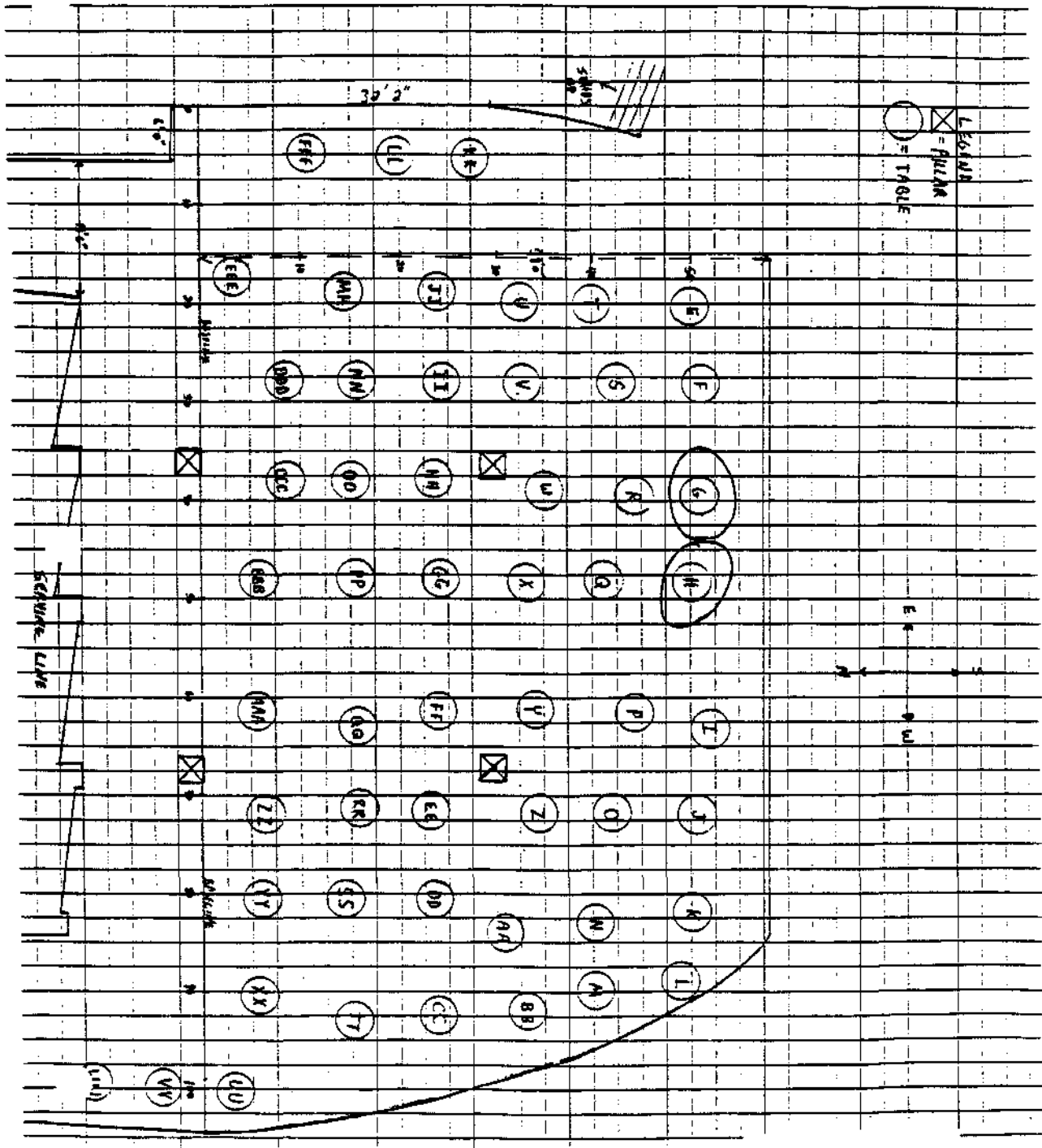

This investigator was interviewing Courtney Shakowski with her mother, Nancy present. Mrs. Shakowski stated her other daughter, Jill was also a witness and wanted to talk to an investigator prior to attending a funeral this date. The following interview was conducted at this time. 8:40 A.M.

Jill stated she was in the Commons Area in the Cafeteria about 11:15 A.M. with Grant Taylor, Margaret Burns and Kelsey Baine.

Jill stated she was at the pop machine by the restrooms and she saw five freshmen running in front of the kitchen and into the bathroom yelling: "Shawns been shot."

Jill stated she didn't know if they were serious or not. Then she heard a shot outside by the stairs going into the building.

Jill went onto say they crawled under tables, right by the pop machine in the cafeteria. She stated this is where the special ed students sit.

Jill stated she heard more gunshots and the suspects started coming in and everyone began running. She stated they tried and couldn't

go upstairs because everyone was coming down the stairs. Jill stated her group then went into the restroom and stood on toilets. After a while they left and looked around. Jill stated Coach Andres was holding a door open to the auditorium. They went through it and into and across the stage and upstairs. She stated about 20 other were there.

Jill stated both Mr. Andres and his son (a teacher also) told them not to go into the upstairs hall as the shooters were in there. The teachers had the students sit between chairs and then they began locking doors. After this the teachers retrieved bats. Jill stated they heard more gunshots and then the fire alarm. She stated it was very loud.

Jill stated someone then began banging on doors and a custodian ran in and said don't open the door because the shooters were out there. Jill stated the custodian had a walkie-talkie and had them run out the hallway by the foreign language/Spanish classrooms and then outside, once he knew it was clear.

Jill went on to say they were in the field by baseball fields and all kinds of people were there. Someone in the crowd yelled: "there he is." and about 200 people began jumping fences and going to homes. Jill stated a homeowner took her and her friends to Leawood Elementary.

Jill was asked if she saw any of the bombs and she stated she only felt them. She stated the first bomb was when she was in the auditorium.

Jill stated she left her backpack in the cafeteria near the kitchen. She described it as a Green Eddie Bauer brand with her ID in the backpack.

This concluded the interview.

On 05-11-99, I responded with a JCSO victim advocate to 7761 S. Yarrow Street, to interview Chad Sharpley and his father Harry Sharpley about the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99

Chad Sharpley told me the following. He said on 04-20-99, at about 11:10 to 11:15, he went into the cafeteria of Columbine

High School to eat his lunch. Chad Sharpley showed me on a map of the Columbine High School cafeteria where he had sat. He also said he was with Brad Bootsma (unknown spelling) and two other students with unknown names. Chad Sharpley also showed me on this map where the other students had been sitting. Chad Sharpley said he was sitting at the table facing in an easterly direction toward the stairs, leading to the second floor of Columbine High School.

Chad Sharpley said while he was seated at this table, someone ran into the cafeteria behind where he was seated and said "someone was shot." Chad Sharpley said he thought this was a senior prank and therefore, did not pay much attention. Chad Sharpley said he possibly heard two gunshots at that time, and then heard what he described as "a smoke bomb" go off outside of the cafeteria. He said when he looked outside, he could see smoke in the air. Chad Sharpley said someone told the students in the cafeteria to get down on the floor and under the tables. He said he did this and stayed there a short time until students began to get up off the floor and run across the cafeteria and up the stairways to the second floor of Columbine High School. Chad Sharpley said when he got to the top of the stairs, he turned left and ran down the hallway toward the science hall. Chad Sharpley said he did not hear any noise, gunshots, explosions, etc. near the library at the top of the stairs. Chad Sharpley said while running he turned into a small hallway and ran toward the door and said when he was about ten feet from the door, he could hear gunshots (unknown how many) hitting the door in front of him and ricochet off of this door. He said he had not been injured during the incident. Chad Sharpley said he continued running through the doors and exited the school.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** Chad Sharpley said during this incident, he did not see any of the suspects or anyone else with firearms and/or explosive devices. I showed Chad Sharpley photos of the duffle bag and the propane tank that was later found in the cafeteria at Columbine High School. He said he did not see these items before or during the incident. He also stated he does not know of any students, nor has he heard rumors of any other students who may be manufacturing explosive devices. He also told me he does not know of any students possessing firearms.

Chad Sharpley said he did not know suspect Klebold or suspect Harris and said he did not know anything about the Trench Coat Mafia.

The victim advocate with me during my interview advised Chad Sharpley and his father Harry Sharpley to contact her office

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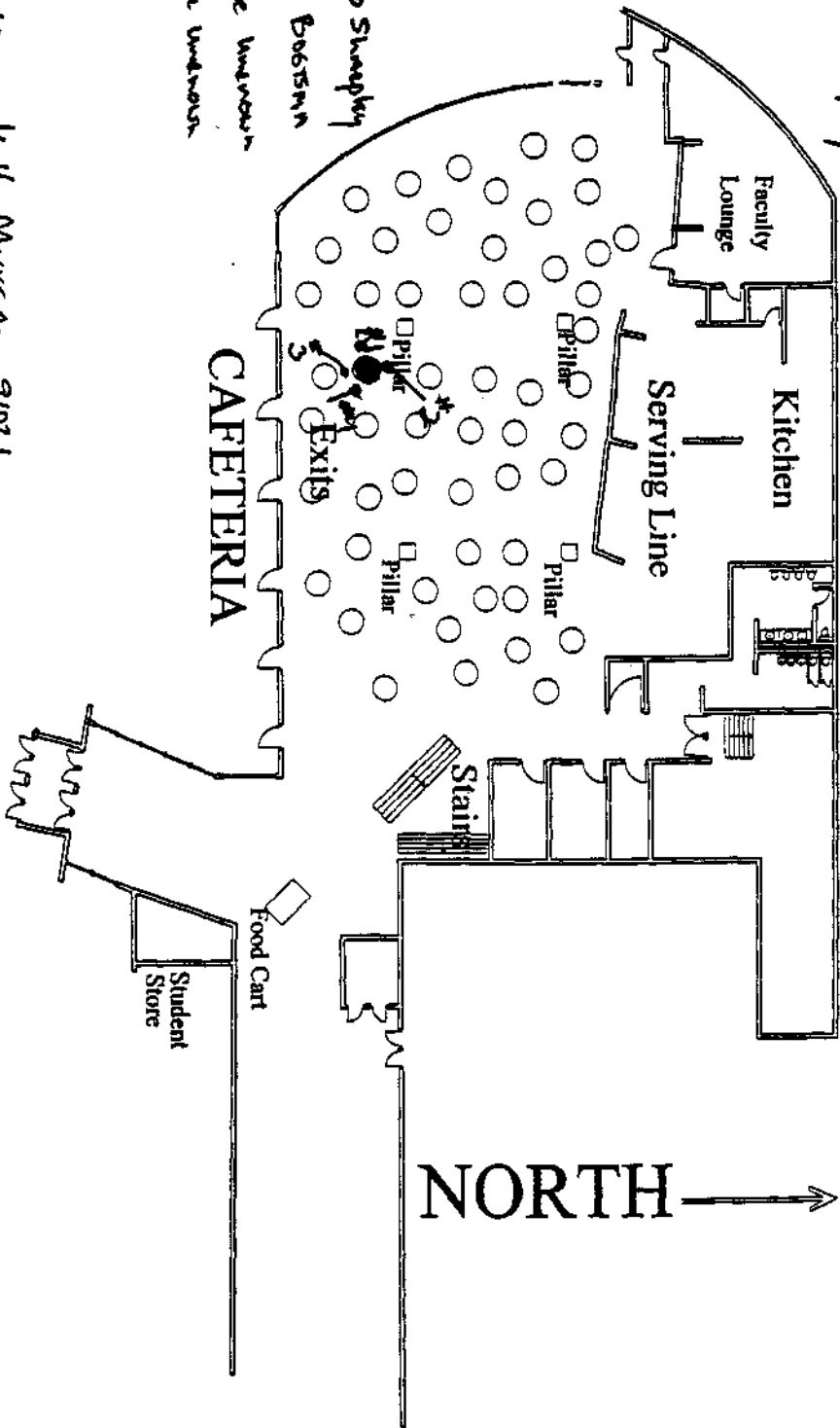
