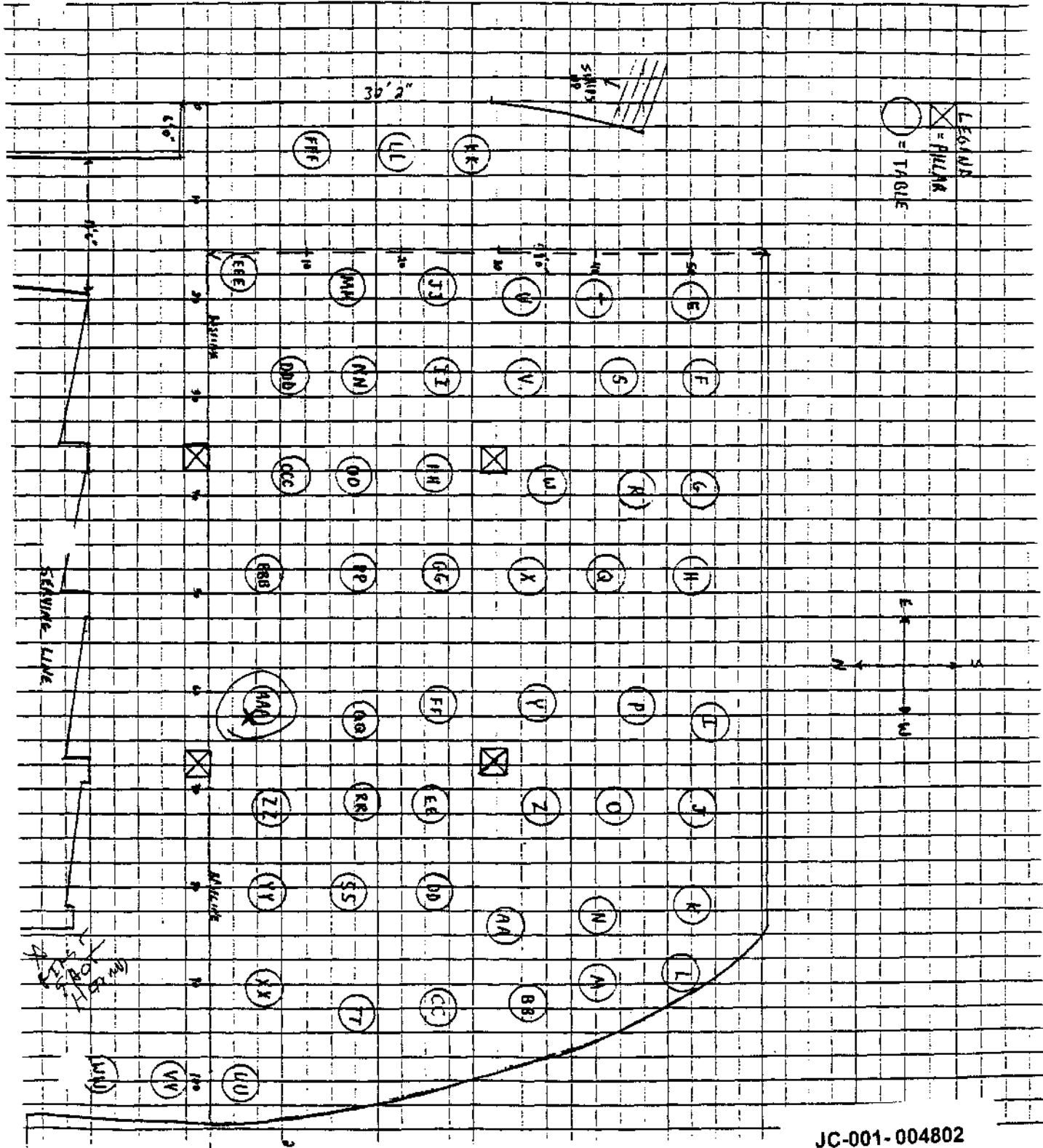

On 5/10/99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN3041 for follow up investigation. The information control narrative stated that Johnny Strobble indicated that Daniel Yager was with him in the cafeteria.

On 5/11/99 I responded to 9956 West Progress Place and interviewed Daniel Yager and his father, Raymond Yager. Daniel Yager confirmed that he was in the school cafeteria when this incident occurred.

Yager stated that his sister, Rachael, drove him to school on 4/20/99 and that he arrived at school at approximately 7:20am. He entered the school through the main entrance and went to his locker, which is number 3, and is located by the stairwell which leads to the commons by the auditorium. He said that he loaded his backpack for the morning and then went to the gymnasium to meet with some friends. He says that he has first hour off and from the gymnasium, after meeting with his friends, he went down to the commons. When he viewed the maps, he couldn't identify exactly which table he sat at during first hour, but thought that it might be table CC, OO, PP, or BBD. He said that for the first half of the first hour he was by himself and did homework, and then he was met by his friends Zack Thompson, Jeff Albason, and Zack Ziccardi. He said that after first hour he has math in the math wing in the upper level. He went directly to math for second hour and did not stop at his locker. Yager said that he did not notice any large duffel bags or backpacks in the cafeteria that were unattended during first hour, and did not notice any suspicious activity in the cafeteria during that time.

From second hour Yager went to his third hour class which is Science in the main level, and then from his Science class he went to his locker before his fourth hour gym class in the gymnasium. He said that they usually allow them to leave the gym class early so they can get to their next class, which in his case is the "A" lunch. He said that he traveled through the school, passed his locker, and into the commons area. He said that he first entered the cafeteria and went to table JJ and then on to his table which he initially thought was Z. He then provided a list of students that were at the table with him. Those students included Joe Tran, Josh Halder, Tom Clagett, Tim Matheson, Zack Thompson, and Scott Streeb. I checked these names on the backpack list and found that their packs were actually found near table X and Q. I referred Yager back to the map and he did change his location to table X saying that now that he remembers it, he was sitting in between the pillars more into the middle of the cafeteria.

Yager also recalled now that he had purchased his lunch and that he'd purchased it from the service line and that he had purchased chicken teriyaki. He said that he was sitting with his friends and that he was eating his lunch



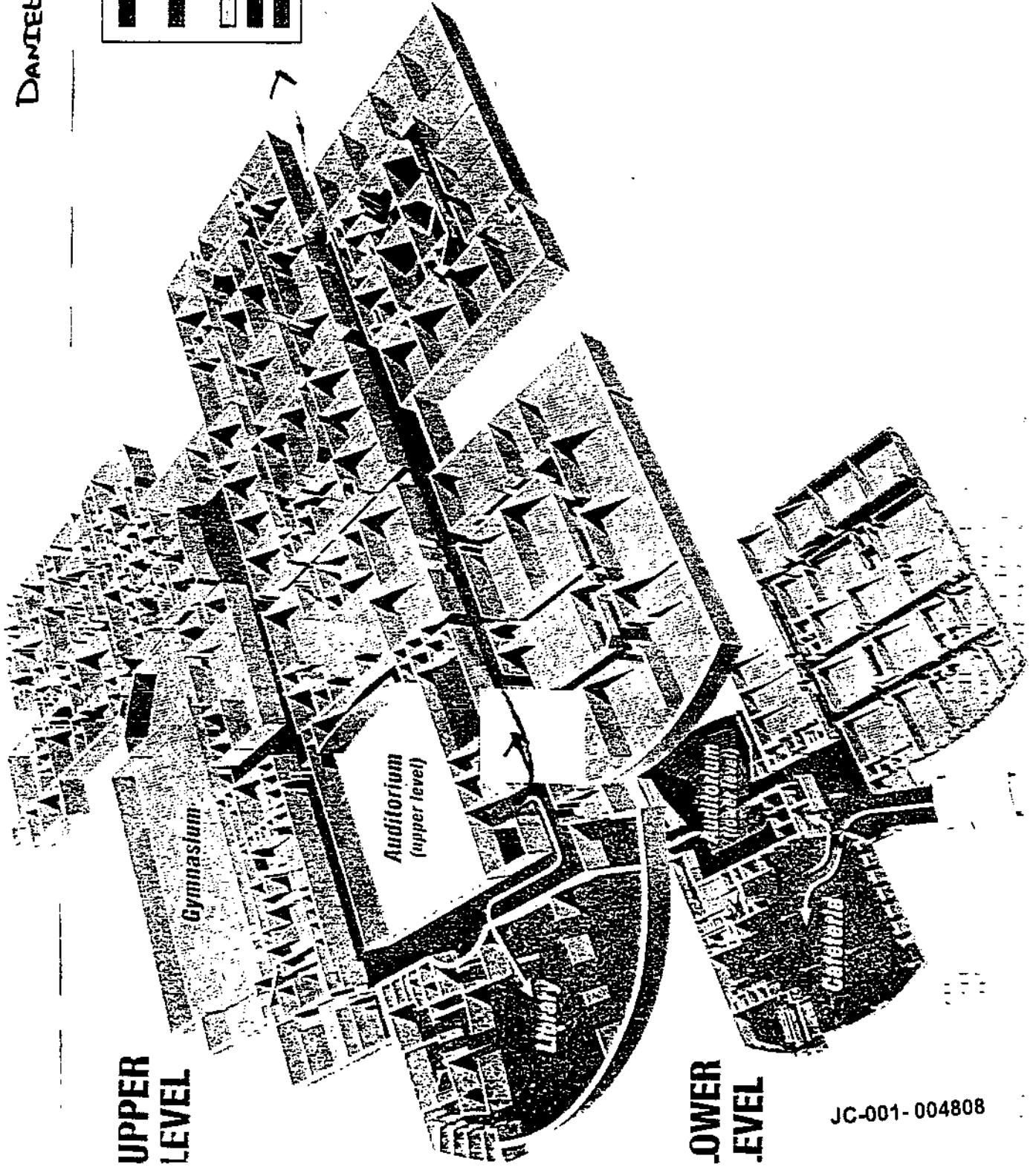
and he had his back towards the west windows when suddenly he turned around and saw that all the students were under their tables. He said about this time, Mr. Sanders came in through the area by the faculty lounge and was yelling to *get down! get down!* as he ran through the cafeteria. Yager said that he did get under his table and that shortly after that there was a panicked rush to the stairs. He said that he grabbed his backpack and jumped over tables and over students, and went with the flow of students towards the stairwell. He said that when he got to the top of the stairs, he heard what he described as four distinctive gun shots. He said that the gun shots sounded as if they were coming from the cafeteria area behind him and not from upstairs. He said that when he reached the top of the stairs he turned and ran eastbound down the main corridor and then out through the doors across the street into Leawood Park. He said that once he got across the street, and into the park, he met up with several of his friends, and that they heard what he believed were explosions coming from inside the school. He said that in the park he was with Joe Tran and Josh Halder. He estimated that it was approximately ten minutes before he heard the explosions and that he recalls hearing six distinct explosions that were muffled and sounded like they were coming from inside the school. He said at that point, he and his friends decided they would go home. He went to one of his friend's house in the neighborhood and called his parents.

Yager took his backpack with him out of the school and didn't leave anything behind in the cafeteria. He was wearing jeans and a red Abercrombie shirt and no hat.

Yager said that he was familiar with the group known as the trench coat mafia prior to the incident at the school. He said he thought that they were more like *Goth* people. He said that he never had any problems with them, but had heard that the athletes gave them "crap". He said that he was never present when this happened, he only heard it through other students. He said that he knew Dylan Klebold by sight because he had been in a weight class that he took during his Freshman year. He said that Klebold was a quiet kid and didn't have any problems within the class and he characterized him as nice while he was in the class. He said he was quiet and didn't

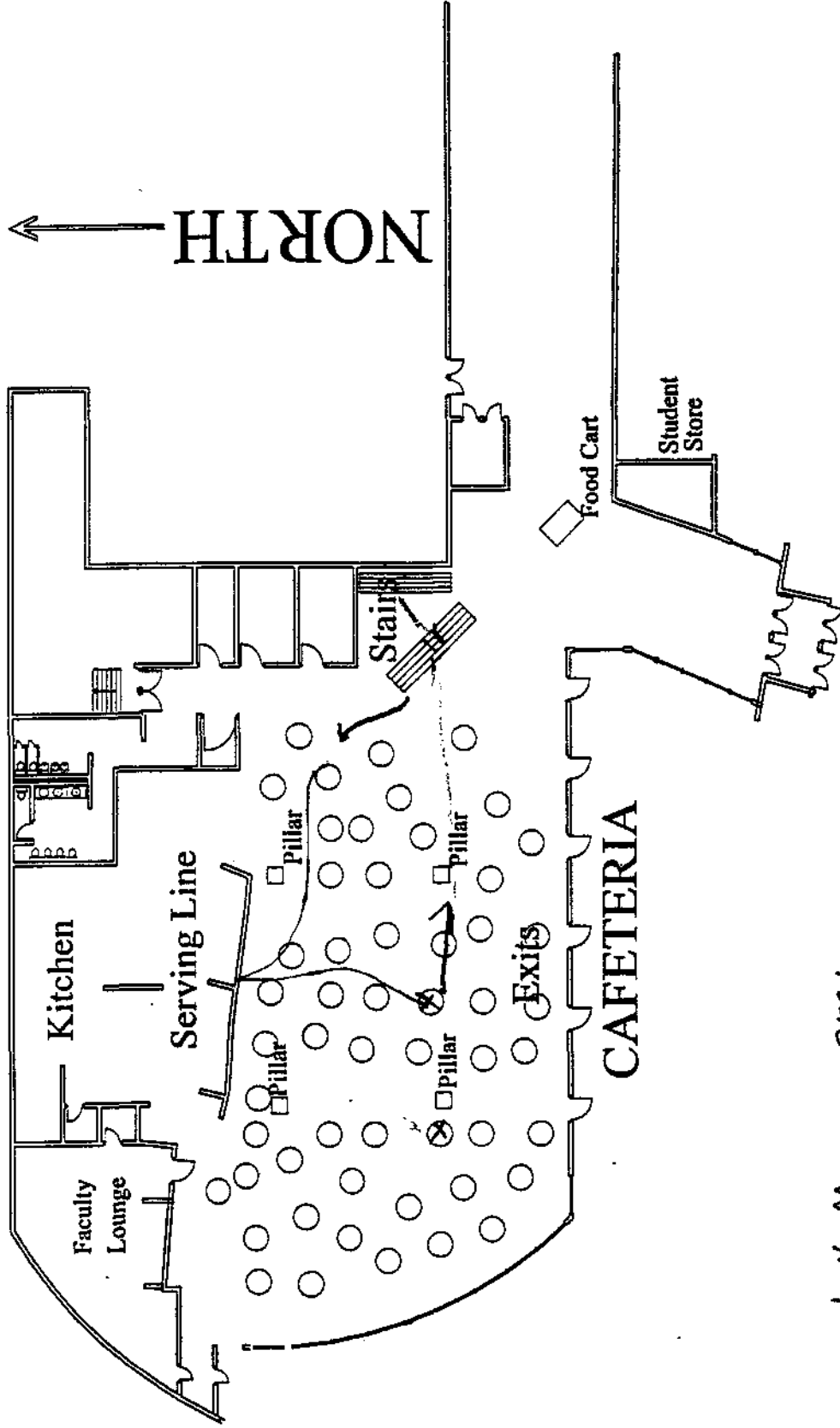
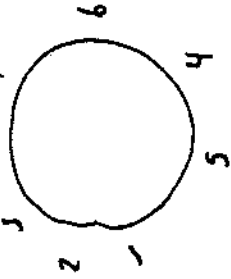

is between the math and social studies rooms. She said she was going to hide in one of the math rooms but decided to run out of the building when she heard the fire alarm sound. She exited the school at the east end of the hallway and ran into Leawood Park.

Kirsten advised that she did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of their friends. She said she knew of no rumors or talk of any kind which would have indicated that this incident was going to occur. She had no further information.

CHS student, cafeteria witness

On June 1, 1999 this investigator met with Kirstin Young at her residence. Present during this interview was her mother, Judith Young.

Kirsten advised that she entered the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 a.m. after stopping at her locker by the gym at the end of her fourth hour class. She said she got her lunch from the lunch counter and sat down at a table with several of her friends. She was shown a sketch of the cafeteria and indicated that she had been at the table marked "X." She identified others at the table as: RACHAEL ERBERT, BRIANNE ZIMMER, KIM WALLENBERG and CRYSTAL MEANNEY. (sp?) She stated that just after she sat down, she heard one of the teachers tell everyone to get down - she thought that teacher was Mr. Craigler. She said they did get down under their table and after about thirty seconds, many of the students began to run towards the cafeteria stairs. She decided to follow them and recalled that when she reached the top of the stairs, she heard some explosions and saw a great deal of smoke. She stated that she ran down the hallway which

I have read the foregoing statement and the facts contained therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I do not maintain that it contains all of the facts or details of the incident, but only those facts about which I have been asked.

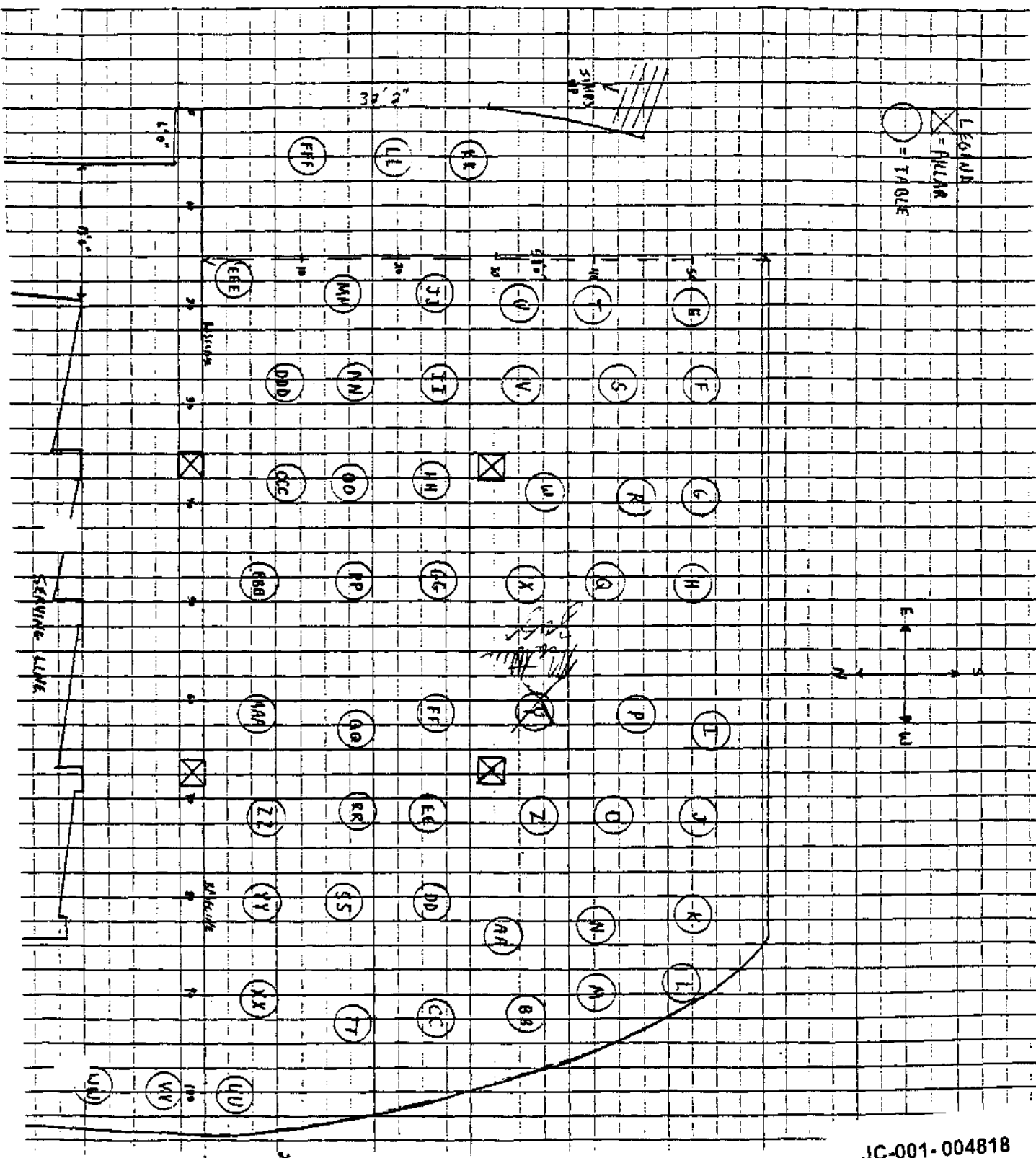

INVESTIGATION

ABOUT 9:10 HRS I CONDUCTED A PHONE INTERVIEW WITH (W) ZAGO. (W) ZAGO SAID AT THE TIME THE OFFENSE BEGAN HE WAS SITTING AT A TABLE NEAR THE CENTER OF THE CAFETERIA. THIS TABLE WAS IDENTIFIED ON THE INVESTIGATION DIAGRAM AS "TABLE Y". (W) ZAGO SAID HE WAS SEATED FACING A NORTH WESTERLY DIRECTION. IN HIS VIEW WERE THE LUNCH TABLES AND THE NORTH WEST CORNER DOOR. (W) ZAGO SAID ALSO AT THE TABLE WAS STUDENT - SHAKESPEAR LOG AND ANOTHER STUDENT HE COULD NOT REMEMBER. HE SAID THE NOISE LEVEL IN THE CAFETERIA WAS VERY LOUD SO HE DID NOT HEAR ANY GUNSHOTS OR EXPLOSIONS. THE FIRST THING HE NOTICED OUT OF THE ORDINARY WAS SEVERAL STUDENTS RUNNING INTO THE CAFETERIA VIA THE NORTH WEST DOOR AND THEY LAY ON THE FLOOR. THEN SEVERAL OF THE NEARBY TABLES STUDENTS ADJACENT TO THE NORTH WEST DOOR ALSO LAY ON THE FLOOR UNDER THEIR TABLES. NEXT A CUSTODIAN RAN THROUGH THE CAFETERIA YELLING FOR EVERYONE TO GET DOWN. SO THE REST OF THE PEOPLE IN THE ROOM GOT UNDER THEIR TABLES. (W) ZAGO STILL HAD NO IDEA WHAT WAS HAPPENING. AFTER A SHORT TIME THE CUSTODIAN DIRECTED THE STUDENTS OUT OF THE CAFETERIA + UP THE STAIRWAY. HE WENT UP THE STAIRS, AND ONCE ON TOP HE RAN EAST THROUGH THE HALLWAY AND OUT THE SOUTHEAST EXIT. ONCE OUTSIDE HE RAN EAST ACROSS PIERCE ST TO LEANWOOD PARK AND HUNGOUT FOR AWHILE WITH OTHERS AROUND THE GAZEBO STILL TRYING TO FIND OUT WHAT WAS GOING ON. STILL NEVER HEARD ANY SHOTS OR EXPLOSIONS. WHILE NEAR THE GAZEBO AN UNIDENTIFIED PERSON YELLED OUT SOMETHING LIKE "THEY ARE COMING AFTER US." THIS CAUSED A PANIC AND LOTS OF PEOPLE RAN EAST ON FIVE ST. (W) ZAGO RAN TO A NEARBY HOUSE WHERE HE STAYED FOR 30 MIN TO AN HOUR. THEN HE WENT TO DAVID MARONIE'S HOUSE. NEXT HE CATCHED A RIDE WITH SHAKESPEAR LOG. (W) ZAGO SAID HE NEVER NOTICED ANY LARGE DUFFLE BAGS OR BOMBES ON THE CAFETERIA FLOOR. HE NEVER KNEW THE SUSPECTS AND NEVER HEARD OF ANYONE HAVING PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF THE OFFENSE.

On May 15, 1999, this investigator met with Shannon Zele at her residence. Present during the interview was her mother, Janet Lebreche.

Shannon advised that she arrived in the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 a.m., after her fourth hour Spanish class which was in the language arts hall on the same level as the cafeteria. She said that she went to the center table in the Rebel Corner area which would be table "B." Others at her table were: Amy Staley, Elaine Miller, Isiah Salazar, David Schulte, B.J. Secord, and possibly, Jason Hensley. She said that after about ten minutes, she saw many of the students standing up and looking outside to the west. She thought there was a fight but then heard one of the students say, "somebody's got a gun." At the same time, she heard one of the janitors tell everyone to get down under the tables. She said that many of the students in the commons area did get down but many began to run to the stairs. She stated that her friends ran out the door at the entrance to the Rebel Corner to the student parking


lot. Shannon began to run toward the stairs when her friend, Paul Freeman grabbed her and urged her to go with him. She and Paul and Elaine Miller ran down the language arts hallway into one of the classrooms at the far east end. She believed there were about twenty other people in the room. She said that after about five or ten minutes, she heard explosions and or shots but could not tell where they were coming from. She said that one of the teachers who was in the room with them went out of the room to see if it was safe. As it appeared to be, they all ran out and exited through a door and ran to Polk St. where they found shelter in a house which is used for seminary classes. Shannon said that she and several of her friends decided to walk home.

Shannon advised that her brother, Jeremy is also a student at Columbine. She said that at the time of this incident, he was at Southwest Plaza in the food court. He has not yet been interviewed.

Shannon stated that she did know who Eric Harris was. She said he came into the International House of Pancakes (Bowles Crossing) one day when she was working there and spent time talking to NATALIE STOWE. She said that BROOKS BROWN worked there also. She advised that she saw Natalie at one of the funerals following this incident and made a comment to her about her knowing Harris. She said Natalie made a remark like, "don't remind me." Shannon said that she believes Natalie had been a close friend of Eric Harris.

Shannon stated that she did not know any of the trench coat mafia members. She said she heard no rumors relating to this incident. She that on that day, she had been wearing blue jeans and a white and blue tank top.

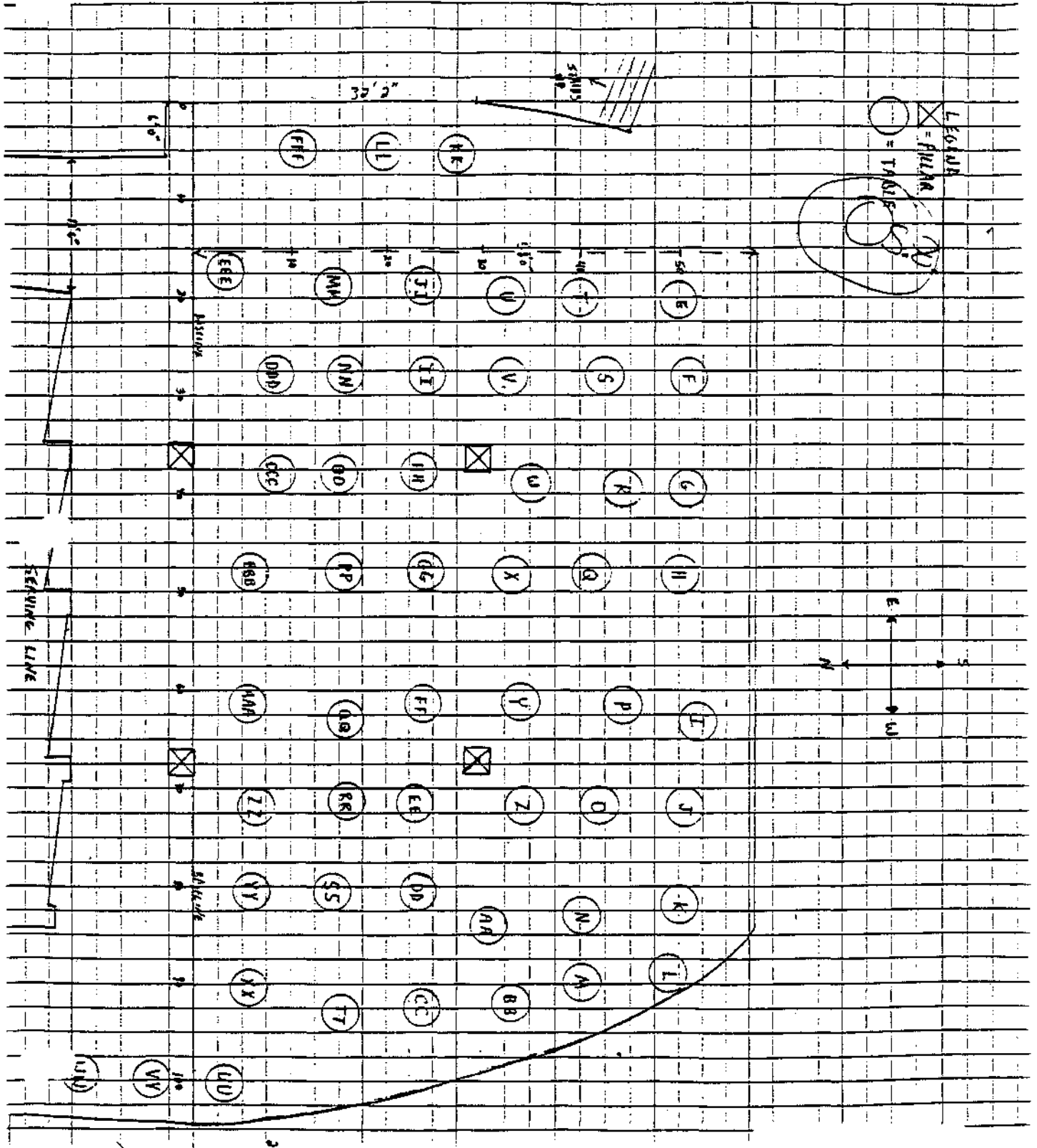

-CHS student; backpack was left at table KK, was in line at Rebel Corner when shooting began; had walked to Rebel Corner with a Tori Owens; ducked under table by Rebel Corner when shooting began; was with Katie Jorgenson, Valarie Mar, and Margo Brown in the Rebel Corner area prior to shooting; ran to southeast corner foreign language room with others for 30 minutes prior to leaving the school; said student Leigh Kamens took leadership role in that classroom prior to everyone leaving; ran to Mormon house and heard a Dawn Muirhead say that she saw a girl get shot outside; heard John Savage at the Mormon house after the shooting telling other students that he was in the library during the shooting and that Dylan Klebold told him that he was, "Just killing people," and that he heard the "nigger" comment made to victim Isaiah Shoels in the library prior to his death; heard two girls named Tiffany (LNU) and Tessa Nelson talking about being in a girl's bathroom when a suspect other than Klebold and Harris came in there and shot the mirrors; no suspect or duffle bag information

INVESTIGATION:

On May 12, 1999 at 1732 hours I contacted Nicole Ziccardi at her home for an interview. Her mother was present. Nicole then told me the following;

* She is a freshman at Columbine High. Since the shooting, she has enrolled at Denver Lutheran High School. She has a brother, Zach, who is a sophomore at Columbine and is now with his class at Chatfield High.

* When asked about Eric Harris, she said that she has never seen him nor heard of his name before.

* When asked about Dylan Klebold, she said that she has a Team Sports class with him last semester. She said that he would play dodge ball in the class and that he played very hard and always had a "sneer" on his face that seemed to her to be a hateful look. Several people in the class referred to him as the, "Jolly Green Giant." She has also seen Dylan this semester in the halls from time to time.

* She said that she used to see another student that wore a trench coat that looked like Dylan Klebold. She said that she used to get the two of them mixed up because they looked so much alike. She said that both Dylan and the other student were tall, wore the black trench coats, and would wear black ball caps on backwards. She said the one student who was not Dylan had a different complexion. Upon looking at the yearbook, she identified the other student who looked like Dylan as Robert Perry.

* When asked, she has never heard of [REDACTED], [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. She did not know any of the associates of the students who wore the trench coats. She only saw Dylan and the other student wear the trench coats but she never saw Dylan and the other student together.

* She thought the trench coat students were just a group at school.

* When asked, she never saw any trench coat student or associate at school the day of the shooting. She also saw no suspicious objects at school that day. When asked specifically, she saw no duffle bags.

* She said that there was a suspicious "phrase of the day" from the Rebel News Network (RNN) the day of the shooting. The message is usually played between 1st and 2nd periods. She could not remember the exact message but thought it had to do with the day being a "bad day" and that the students "don't want to be here today."

* On the day of the shooting, she was wearing a white and brown tank-top, jeans and brown sandals.

* On the day of the shooting, she had Mr. Mosier's science class for 4th hour. After getting out at 11:10 a.m., she walked to the cafeteria with a friend named Tori Owens. She placed her backpack on a chair at the table she was going to sit at. She said her friends usually take the three tables next to the stairs. From the diagram, she identified the table she placed her backpack at as KK. This was confirmed by the backpack list. She did not know who was sitting at that table when she left.

* She then walked to Rebel Corner with Katie Jorgenson for a bagel. The store did not have any so she walked back to the table. She then decided to go back to Rebel Corner for a muffin. She was in line at Rebel Corner with Valarie Mar and Margo Brown.

* She did not know what was going on, but everyone was getting under the tables. She got under one of the middle tables in the hallway outside Rebel Corner. She said a custodian was yelling for people to get down and that the custodian may have mentioned something about a gunman. She thought Mr. Sanders came down from the stairs, but she was not sure.

* After being under the table for about 30 seconds, she said that everyone then began running out of the cafeteria up the stairs. She hung on to Margo's backpack and they ran down the hallway and to the southeast corner classroom in the foreign language area. She said that 20 other students and 3 unknown female teachers wound up in that classroom. The blinds were shut and the lights turned off. She said they all hid under desks.

* She then heard what she thought were gunshots coming from the upstairs area. She heard about 5 shots at first.

* She said a student in the room, Leigh Kamens, took a leadership role while they were in the classroom and tried to keep everyone calm. She thought that it was Leigh that suggested they all leave the room and go out the south exit door next to the room. They had spent about 30 minutes in the room prior to running out.

* She saw no suspects. She remembered hearing noises, but was too scared at the time so she did not remember hearing anything specific while in the classroom.

* She and the others ran south and east to the Mormon house at Polk and Pierce St. Once there she heard several students talking about what they saw.

* She said a John Savage (did not know John, identified him from the yearbook) was telling students that he was in the library when the students were shot there. He said that Dylan Klebold told him he was in the library, "Just killing people." He also talked about the suspects making a racial comment, "nigger," to Isaiah Shoels before he was shot. She said that police officers talked to John and that he identified Dylan and Eric as the shooters.

* She said a Dawn Muirhead told her that she saw a girl get shot outside the school.

* She said that two girls, a Tiffany (last name unknown) and a Tessa Nelson, were talking about being in a bathroom in the school when a suspect other than Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris came in and shot the mirrors.

* She called her mother from the Mormon house.

This concluded my interview with Nicole Ziccardi.

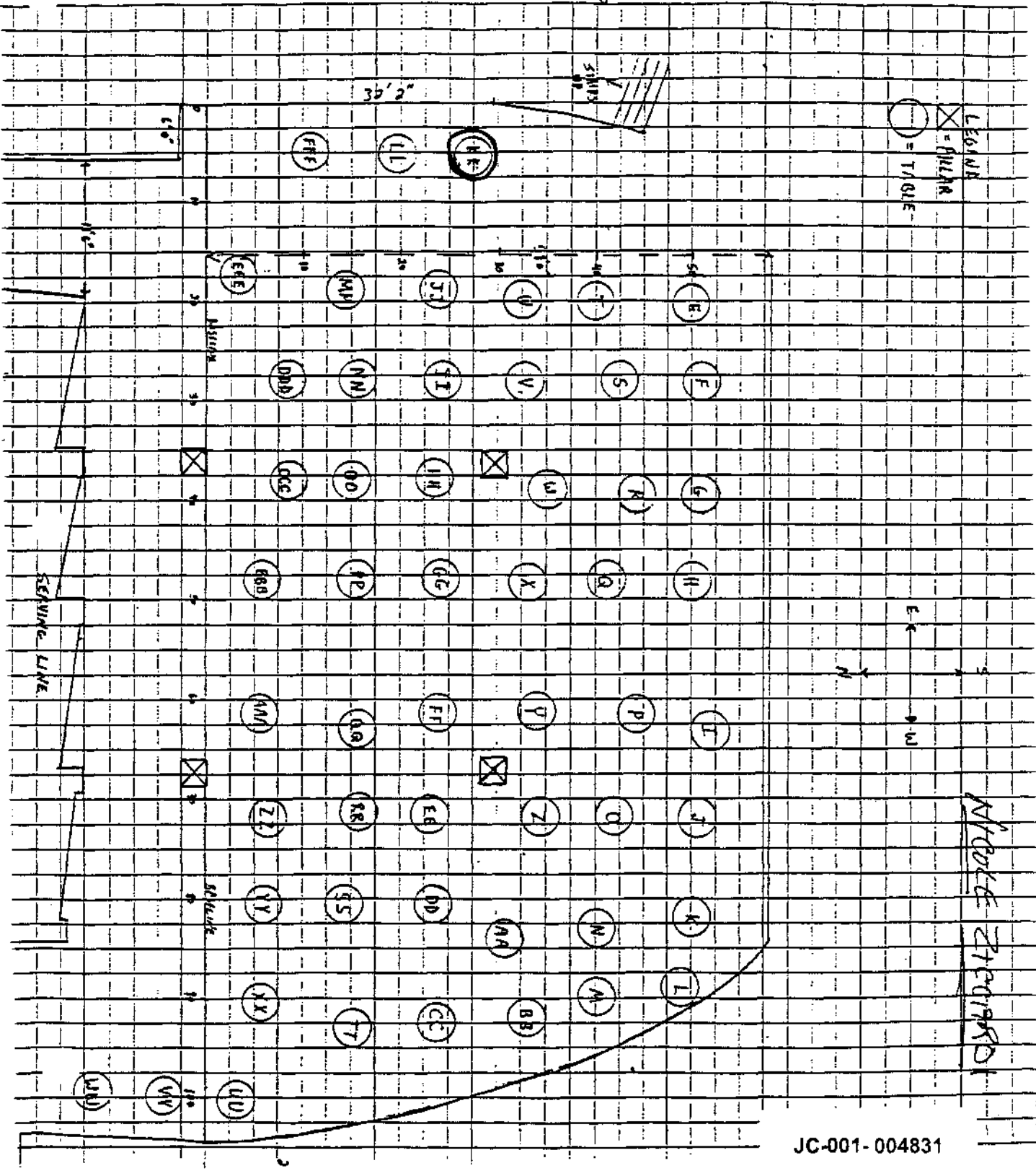
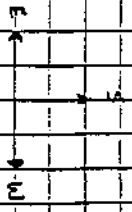

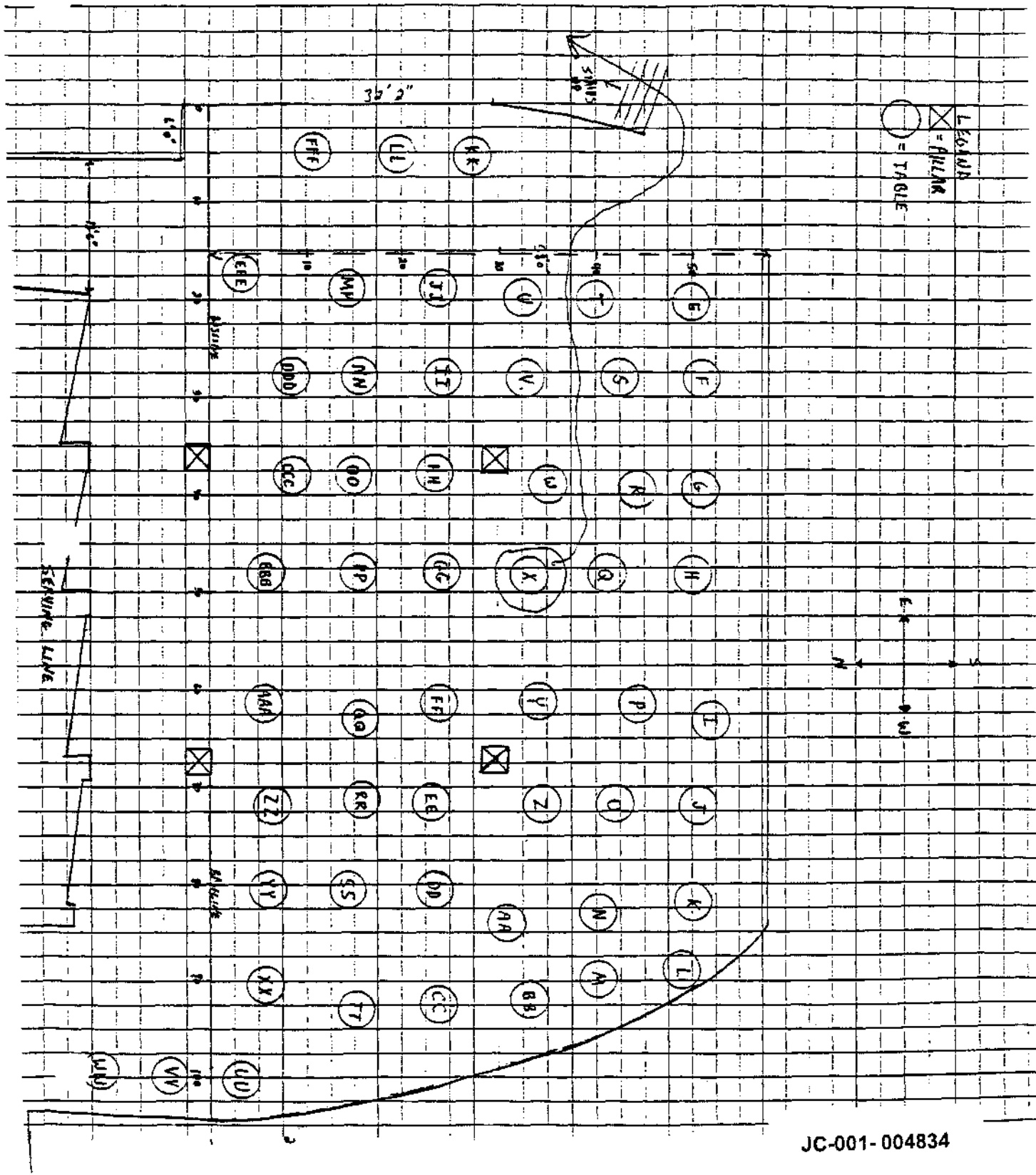
05/21/99, 1415 hrs. Brianne Zimmer was interviewed by Detective S.C. Shott #72049 (DPD) in her home at 5466 S. Everett Way.

Ms. Zimmer stated that she had completed her 4th period French class at 11:10AM and walked directly to the cafeteria. When she got there, she met up with her friends, who she identified as Rachel Erbert, Kristen Young, Crystal Enney and Kim Wallenberg. They all sat at the table she identified as table X on the seating chart. Ms. Zimmer said that she was not aware that anything was wrong until she saw everyone around her ducking under the tables. She said that she and her friends did the same and at that time she could hear what sounded like gunshots or explosions. She remained under the table for approximately 30 seconds then she ran out of the cafeteria through the main entrance then up the stairs towards the library. She said that she and her group were probably the last ones to leave the cafeteria and run up the stairs. Ms. Zimmer said that she ran past the library then down a hallway past the choir room when she tripped and fell. While she was getting up, she could hear gunshots coming from behind her and down the stairs. She said that she got up and continued running down the hallway past the math hall when she saw Mr. Tank and Mrs. Dimanna telling everyone to leave out the door and leave the school grounds. Ms. Zimmer said that she dropped her backpack on the ground near the math offices before she left the grounds. She described her pack as a black "Eastpack" that has several key chains attached. Ms. Zimmer said that after leaving the school grounds, she ran across S. Pierce St. and did not stop until she arrived at Leawood Park.

Ms. Zimmer said that she did not see a black duffel bag in the cafeteria on the day of the incident, nor did she see anyone bringing one in. She does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold personally nor has she ever seen them. She said that she never heard of the Trench Coat Mafia until seeing them on the news. Ms. Zimmer said that while attending Chatfield HS, she heard rumors that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] may have been involved; however, she did not actually hear anyone who said that they personally witnessed anyone shooting a weapon.



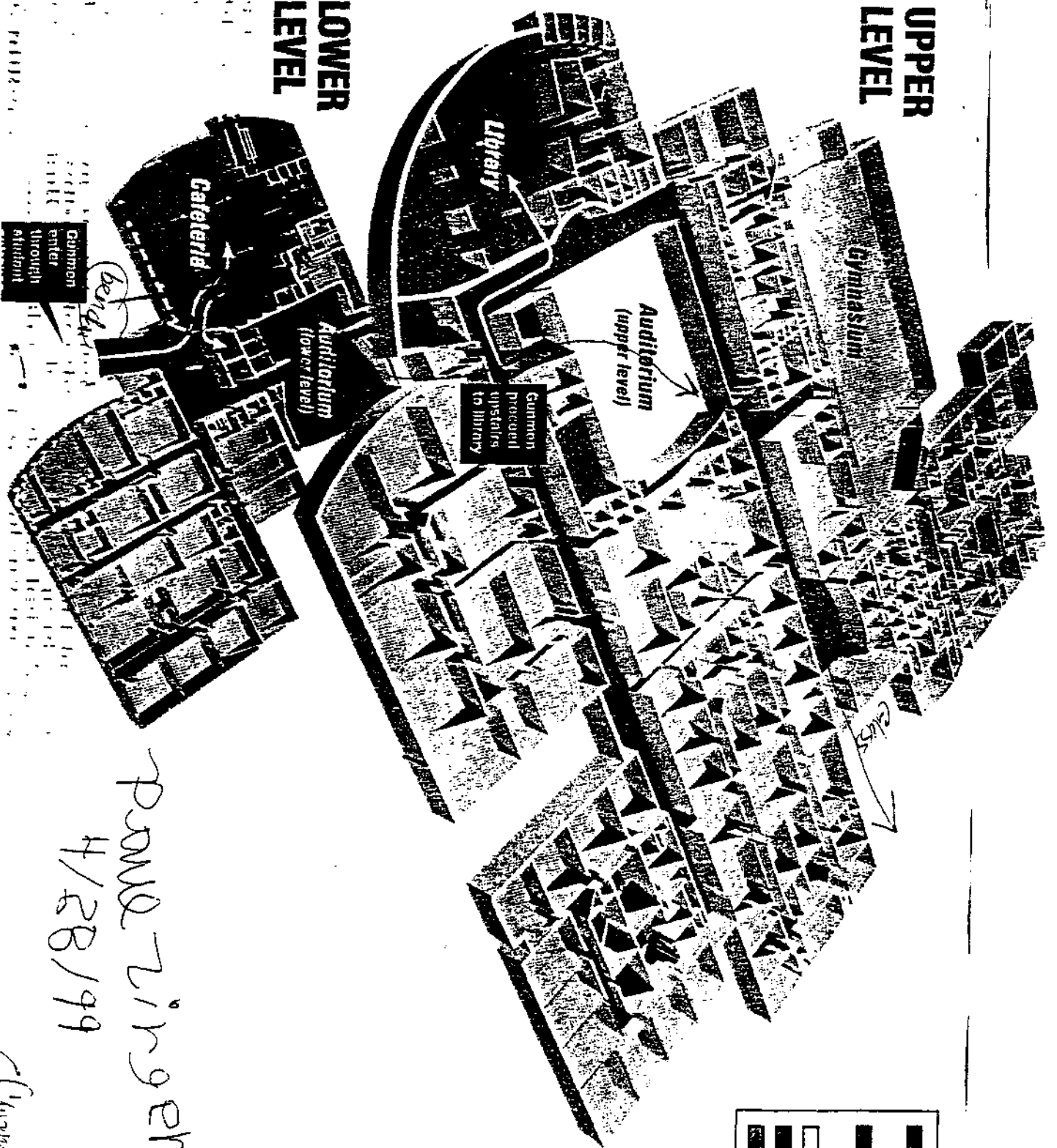
1. On April 28, 1999 I went to the Zirger residence, 6763 W. Roxbury Pl., Littleton, CO 80128, (303) 972-8306, for the purpose of interviewing Frank Zirger, an associate of Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold and others of that group. After interviewing Frank, Mrs. Zirger requested that I interview her younger son, Jean Paul (Paul), who was present at Columbine High School (CHS) at the time of the shooting.
2. Paul Zirger (DOB: 10/04/83, 15 years old) is a 9th grade student at CHS, this being his second year at that school. He does not know, nor has he ever met, Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. He had become familiar with their cars having been identified to him by others (i.e. his brother Frank).
3. On April 20, 1999 Paul and his brother Frank got a ride to CHS with Brian Sargent, arriving at about 7:00 a.m., at which time he sat for a while with his brother until leaving for his first hour class. Paul got out of 4th hour at 11:10 a.m., arriving at the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 a.m., where he sat on a bench inside near the interior entrance. There were a lot of other students in the cafeteria and all the tables were full. Paul was sitting with two friends, Jeremy Smith (who was carrying a blue notebook binder), and Mike Langhenry (carrying a green backpack).
4. Paul said that shortly after arriving in the cafeteria, he recalled that teachers (name(s) unknown), came in, telling everyone to get down because of something going on outside. At that time, Paul and his two friends ran out of the cafeteria with everyone else, and into the auditorium. Paul took his backpack with him.
5. Paul said that upon entering the auditorium, he ran to the top of the steps, and with other students, ran to the main front entrance, at which time he saw a lot of broken glass from the doors. He never saw any shooters, nor did he hear any gunshots or explosions, even while in the cafeteria. (See attached map)
6. Upon exiting the school, Paul ran to a friend's (name unknown) car parked in Clement Park (Toyota Corrola). From there he got a ride home, where he let his mom know that he was okay, and then left with Brijin (LNU), a 10th grade friend of his and his brother's. When they arrived at her house, they got her car and left to look for Frank. They located him in the vicinity of Ken Caryl (Street), and returned home.
7. Paul did not notice anything unusual in the cafeteria prior to this incident, including any large duffel bags, and does not recall seeing anyone wearing trenchcoats that day.
8. Paul knew shooting victims Danny Rorhbough, Kyle Valasquez and teacher Dave Sanders.



Leland Andres, II stated Kristin Thibault, Pauline Colby, and Nicole Markham are students in his chorus class, which begins at 0925 hours and ends at 1015 hours. He informed me that Thibault was not in class during that period, but Markham and Colby were. He stated he did not speak to Markham or Colby during the class.


I asked Leland Andres, II if Thibault usually misses a lot of classes that he teaches, and he stated that she usually does not miss his class.

Leland Andres, II stated his father, Leland Andres, is also a vocal teacher at the school, and if contacted, can provide phone numbers for the three students, which are listed above.

After obtaining this information, I forwarded it to investigators so Leland Andres could be contacted for the appropriate phone numbers.

INVESTIGATION:

On 05/04/99, I met with Leland Andres, Sr., at Chatfield High School reference the incident at Columbine High School. I explained to Mr. Andres that I had heard he was in the school at the time of the shooting and he said he was in the Choir room. I asked if he could tell me what happened. Mr. Andres said at approximately 11:20 hours, three kids came running into the room saying that someone was outside with guns. Mr. Andres said that as soon as the student said that, they heard approximately 5 to 6 shots that appeared to be coming from the west side of the school. Mr. Andres said that he got his class together and left through the east door of the choir room with approximately 30 kids. Mr. Andres said that his son, who's also a student at Columbine, was in the auditorium. Mr. Andres said that he took his students into the auditorium and told them to lay down on the floor and stay there. Mr. Andres said that he and his son locked the doors to the auditorium, after which they heard numerous shots, but could not determine where they were coming from. However, they sounded like they were coming from the west side. Mr. Andres said that he was going back to his classroom to see if there were any more students in there. When he got approximately 10 feet from the door, he heard more shots and he then returned to the auditorium with the other students. Mr. Andres said that Jay, the janitor, arrived at the auditorium and told them that the shooters were upstairs and he had everyone leave the auditorium. Mr. Andres said they left the auditorium and entered the Language Arts hallway and exited through a door in that hallway to the park. I asked Mr. Andres if he ever saw any of the shooters and he said, no, he did not. I asked if he or any of his students were injured during this and he said, no, they were not. Mr. Andres said that once this was all over that day, he did hear that there were approximately 58 to 60 kids barricaded in his office in the choir room. Mr. Andres said that he also heard a rumor that one of the shooters shot at least one shot in the choir room. I asked Mr. Andres if he saw or heard any of the explosions and he said he heard and felt approximately one or two explosions. He said that when the explosions occurred, you could feel them through the walls and the floors at the school. I asked Mr. Andres if he heard any of the shooting and he said yes, it sounded as if it were constant firing and not just random shooting.

I asked Mr. Andres if he was in the cafeteria during the morning hours of April 20th and he said, yes, he was. I asked if he remembered seeing two large duffel bags in the cafeteria and he said "no". I asked if he had seen anyone carrying duffel bags into the cafeteria and he again said "no". I asked if he remembered seeing Eric or Dylan on Monday or Tuesday and he said "no". I asked if he had seen or talked to any of the Tree Coat Mafia on Monday or Tuesday and he again said "no".

Andres then states that he went to the cafeteria and observed students crouched down and he then took a group of kids to the auditorium and that an explosion went off in the hallway.

Andres then took the students to the language arts hallway and then out to the doors to Leawood Park.

Andres did not see the gunman.

Andres states that he has heard speculation that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were involved in this incident.

Andres also stated that on prom night that the kitchen area was in fact accessible during the after prom party as the doors were open.

Andres could not contribute any further information and the interview was concluded.



ANDRES, a music teacher at Columbine High School, stated that he has known Pauline COLBY since she was in the first grade. ANDRES was not sure if the day he saw COLBY was April 19 or April 20 when she said she was feeling 'strange, very strange'. According to ANDRES, nothing else was said between the two of them as they passed in the hallway of the school.

When asked if he knew any of the kids that were associated with the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM), ANDRES said Kirsten Thiebold, Nicole MARKHAM, Alejandra MARSH, and Liddy PERRY were often seen with TCM members. According to ANDRES, THIEBALD would occasionally wear all black.

ANDRES stated KLEBOLD worked for him as a sound man a couple of years ago for a school musical. ANDRES wanted KLEBOLD to assist again this year but KLEBOLD decided against the idea. In class, ANDRES would sometimes have to get KLEBOLD'S attention away from doing homework for another class. ANDRES claimed that he had no knowledge of Eric HARRIS prior to the attack on the school.

According to ANDRES, there was no general impression of TCM members being threatened or harassed at the school. ANDRES opined that the TCM had a self imposed exile from the student body. ANDRES stated he had no first hand knowledge of other TCM members.

Becerra related that Phillips had resided with his father (Charles) up until about a year ago, when he moved out to live with his mother. Becerra stated Phillips was always very nice and she never saw or heard anything suspicious or illegal. Becerra never saw any firearms or weapons at the Phillips house, but was not close friends with Phillips and only knew him to say hello. (Saw)

I have read the foregoing statement and the facts contained therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I do not maintain that it contains all of the facts or details of the incident, but only those facts about which I have been asked.

On 081199 I telephonically interviewed Andrew Breed. Breed has not been interviewed by police prior to this date. Breed was at school on 042099. He was in Mr. Andres Choir class in the choir room when the shooting incident began. He was first made aware of the shooting when fellow student Brandon Reisbeck came running into the room and told his teacher that somebody was shooting a gun. He remembers some students running out of the class while others took shelter in the choir office, he estimated between 50 and 60 students hid in the office. He was one of the students who hid in the office. He said that students got into the room and barricaded themselves in. He recalls students making calls to their parents and to the police from a phone in the room or cell phones. After about four hours he was rescued by the Denver Police Department SWAT team. He was then escorted out of the building through the Commons area and then bussed to Leawood Elementary where he was reunited with his mother. He recalled possibly seeing a gun shot go off, but was unsure. He remembers hearing loud noises such as gun shots or bombs. He did not know Harris, but was on a little league team with Klebold once. He was not and did not associate with either of them. He reported having a bad encounter in the past with what he believed was the TCM. He said that he had a knife held to his throat by one of the TCM members. Breed reported to having no prior knowledge of this incident.

This investigator met with Alison and her father at her home.

Alison stated she has not been interviewed by anyone concerning the CHS shooting. She stated she was in Acting class during period 4 in the auditorium. When the bell rang at 11:10 A.M., Alison went to her choir class next door. She stated the room is next to the auditorium and Mr. Andres (Senior) was lecturing.

Alison stated she heard a lot of pops going on and then heard kids screaming outside the room.

At this time Brandon Reisbeck (Ph. 303-979-1814) came into the room and said; "There are two guys downstairs shooting at people." Alison stated most of the choir class ran out of the room, but almos just kind of fell to the floor.

Alison stated Adam Foss then told most of the students to come into the office at the side of the classroom. They did this and shut the door and barricaded the door as well. The students then shut off the lights and waited.

Alison stated she could hear pops and bangs for awhile then it was quiet and then some more bangs, like bombs going off. Then it would get quite again.

Alison stated Matt Cornwell kept calling the police from the phone in the office and telling them where they were located, but the police had a hard time finding them. Alison stated SWAT finally reached them and the students unbarricaded the door. The SWAT officers led them through the auditorium, behind the stairs downstairs, through the cafeteria and out the side door on the West side. She stated they then ran up the stairs, past a boy on the sidewalk and a girl on the hill, who she recognized as Rachel Scott. At the top of the hill they waited for a police car to take them to Clement park, where they were checked by doctors and then bused to Leewood school.

Alison was asked how many students were in the class and she stated at the beginning about 110 and in the office hiding there were 60 students.

Alison was asked how she knew how many were in the office barricaded and she stated one of the cops made them count how many were in the office before being led out.

Alison was asked how long she thought they were barricaded. She stated about 3 1/2 to 4 hours.

Alison stated she arrived at school between 7:15 A.M. and 7:30 A.M., and she parks on the West side near the soccer fields. She stated she was running late on 4-20-99.

Alison was asked if she knew either of the suspects? Alison stated she knew them both. She stated she has known Eric Harris about two years and first met him in Driver's Ed class. Eric introduced her to Dylan Klebold.

Alison stated she didn't see either of them on the 20th., for her video class as she was running late. She described Eric as kind, really nice to her. A quiet type that wore a lot of black clothes and KMFDM shirts.

Alison described Dylan as really nice, very friendly, quiet, would joke around and he wore black a lot. She stated she has known Dylan about one year.

Alison was asked about computers and she stated she has no computer interest and didn't check or chat on line with anyone.

Alison was asked if she knew any of Eric or Dylan's friends that were in TCM? She stated she did and named, Robin Anderson, Nate Dykman, Chris Morris and Brook Brown. Alison remembered that Bryan Sargent and Zack Heckler are also TCM.

Alison stated further that Eric would wear flannel shirts which were different colors and they weren't black. She stated he would do this every so often.

Alison stated she saw Zack Heckler, 4th. hour in the auditorium.

Alison stated she left a blue backpack, Jansport with a math book with her name on it in the Choir room. She stated it had her car keys on a Honda Key ring that also had a swiss snowboard strap with a clock on it and two keys.

Alison stated she left a black lace shirt with flower lace in the office when barricaded.







On 05-27-99, at about 0945 hours, I contacted Columbine High School student John Broden by phone. I asked him about his observations on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School. Broden stated that he had no classes with Eric Harris, but knew his name and saw him in the hallways during the school year. He would also see Dylan Klebold in the hallway, but had no classes with Dylan. He knew the name Trench Coat Mafia. He said it was a nickname for a group of weird kids. Broden did not see either Harris or Klebold on 04-20-99.

Broden stated that on 04-20-99 he did not go into the cafeteria. He has third period off and left the campus for that time. When he came back, he parked at Leawood Park. He stated his first period is Psychology with Mr. Johnson. He stated that Robyn Anderson and Zach Heckler are students in that class, however, on 04-20-99, neither Anderson nor Heckler was in their Psychology class.

Broden's fifth period class was Choir with Mr. Andres, Sr. Ten minutes into that class, Broden heard students running and screaming down the hallway. Someone stated that there was a person in the school with a gun. The students in Mr. Andres, Sr., class ran into his office. Broden stated that the students turned out the lights in the office and he heard gunshots over a period of about one hour. Some students in the office were able to contact police by using their cell phones. Broden stated that the students barricaded the doorway into the office. The students assisted a student who had diabetes by giving the student a candy bar and assisted another student who had asthma by lifting that student up toward the ceiling to get better air. Some ceiling tiles were removed for better circulation of air. Broden stated that some of the male students took off their shirts and placed them at

On August 31, 1999, at approximately 1600 hours, I responded to 5940 West Rowland Avenue to contact and interview witness Penny Lynn Burton, who is a student at Columbine High School. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred on 04-20-99, at Columbine High School. Penny advised upon my arrival that she wanted to conduct this interview without her parents being present. Although her father, Gary Burton, was in the residence, he was not present during this interview.

Penny Burton said on 04-20-99, she arrived at Columbine High School at approximately 0715 hours, for her scheduled classes. She said she parked her parents' vehicle, a red Saturn station wagon, that she had driven to school on 04-20-99, in Space #312. This parking space is in the junior's parking lot of Columbine High School on the southeast side near the cafeteria/commons area windows and doors. Penny said she was alone at this time and she said during the time she was in the parking lot and while she walked into Columbine High School, she did not see anything unusual or out of the ordinary. Penny said she entered

Columbine High School through the cafeteria/commons doors, which is located across from the "Rebel Corner." Penny said after entering the school, she walked through the commons area, which is along the east side of the Columbine High School cafeteria, and said she went up the stairway from the lower level of the school to the upper level. I showed Penny the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Penny said she did not see either of these items, nor did she see any items of a similar description. Penny said she did not see anybody carrying items such as these on 04-20-99 either. I asked Penny if she recalled seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the cafeteria/commons area on 04-20-99, while she was walking through, and she said she did not remember seeing any of these students at that location on 04-20-99. Penny said after entering the school and going up the stairway on 04-20-99, she went to her first hour Trigonometry class, which is located in the Math hallway on the upper level of the school, and said after that class, she proceeded to go to her second hour Social Studies class. Penny said after her second hour class, she had the third hour off from any classes, so a friend of hers, by the name of Stephanie Williams, went with her to Penny's house, so Penny could get her dress for a "gig" that she said they had later that day, and also so Penny could paint her fingernails for this "gig." Penny said that although she was not certain, she said she did not believe she went into the Columbine High School cafeteria during her time off for third hour on 04-20-99. Penny said after having her third hour off, she went to her fourth hour Chemistry class, then she said she went to her fifth Concert Choir class and arrived at approximately 1115 hours on 04-20-99. Penny said a friend of hers by the name of Michelle Simmons, who was also in this same Concert Choir class, and she exited the Choir classroom into the hallway to get a drink. She said they also talked to a teacher, however, she did not know this teacher's name other than to say that she was a faculty member. Penny said after talking with this employee briefly, they then went back into the classroom where she sat down at her desk. Penny said approximately one minute later, two Choir students by the names of Brandon Reisbeck and Andy Anderson came running into the classroom, and Penny said that Andy told the teacher of this class, Mr. Andres, that there was somebody downstairs, inside of Columbine High School, with a gun. Penny said apparently Mr. Andres did not hear what Andy Anderson said, so Brandon Reisbeck screamed to Mr. Andres and the classroom, that there was somebody in the downstairs part of Columbine High School with a gun. Penny said both Brandon Reisbeck and Andy Anderson were visibly upset at this time. Penny said about the same time, she heard what she recognized as three gunshots that sounded like to her were coming from inside of Columbine High School in the downstairs area. I asked her if she had shot a firearm or been present when a firearm had been discharged and she said she had shot a firearm when she was present with her father, Gary Burton some time ago. Penny said she therefore was familiar with the sound a firearm makes

when discharged. Penny said that during the time this was taking place, the door from the interior of the Choir classroom into the hallway, was open. Penny said she then heard people in the hallway running and screaming, describing them as "a mob of people." Penny said that Mr. Andres told everybody to get down on the floor, however, all of the students got up from their desks and began running in various directions from this Choir classroom. Penny said she ran out of the classroom and into the hallway, then into the auditorium where other people were. She said she saw numerous people running across the upper area of the auditorium. Penny said a friend of hers by the name of Christine Bell, who was present with her, led her out of the auditorium where Penny said she ran into the main hallway. Penny said she remembers that she saw Zach Heckler, Christine Bell, and Patrick Kelley in this area, however, she did not know where these three students went from that location. Penny said she saw a teacher by the name of Mr. Holmes standing by the counseling hall of Columbine High School looking toward the Social Studies hallway, and then she saw Mr. Holmes signal her to run. Penny said she then exited Columbine High School by running out of the door by the wrestling doors. Penny said at no time on 04-20-99, did she see any suspects or students with a gun or explosive device. Penny said as she ran from the school she heard several more gunshots, however, she could not tell me where these shots came from. Penny said she then ran to the "smoker's pit," and then ran into to Clement Park where a friend of hers by the name of Adam Thompson picked her and other students up in his vehicle and they left the area.

I asked Penny Burton what information she could provide to me about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and particularly what information she could provide to me about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris, if any. Penny said she did not know Eric Harris, but said she was familiar with Dylan Klebold because they worked a Columbine High School talent show together during the fall semester of 1998. Penny said Dylan Klebold did not wear a trench coat in the classroom, however, she said she had seen him wearing a trench coat in the hallways of Columbine High School. Penny also told me she believed that Dylan Klebold and Zach Heckler were best friends, but said she did not see Zach Heckler wear a trench coat. Penny described Zach Heckler as very smart and knowledgeable especially about computers. Penny said it was her understanding that Zach Heckler and Eric Harris did not get along with each other. She said she would not consider Zach Heckler as a Trench Coat Mafia student or a Trench Coat Mafia associate.

Penny Burton said she was familiar with Tad Boles, and said Tad Boles "likes me," however, Penny said she considers Tad Boles as a "goofy looking kid" and said he is "weird." Penny said Tad Boles was one of the founders of the Trench Coat Mafia.

but said she had not seen any violent tendencies from Boles. Penny said that Tad Boles told her in the past, that although his father was not a assaultive toward him, his father was violent toward his mother and had hit his mother. Penny said she never saw any evidence such as bruises or other injuries that would indicate Tad Boies father had assaulted him. She said Tad Boles wore a trench coat but put the coat in his school locker during class hours. She also said she would see Tad Boles with other Trench Coat Mafia students during third hour standing along South Pierce Street as a group. Penny Burton said she knew who Robert Perry and Brooks Brown were. She told me she had Robert Perry in a French class about four years ago. She said Robert Perry stayed to himself, and wore a trench coat. Penny said that Robert Perry "smelled." Penny said that Brooks Brown was in her Choir class, however, she said Brooks Brown was not in attendance in this class on 04-20-99. She described Brooks Brown as being "funny and a good actor."

I asked Penny Burton if she had heard anything about anybody else who may have been involved with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris in the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Penny said that Patrick Neville said a white male (unknown name) was seen on 04-20-99 wearing a white t-shirt and a black vest, and said he was standing next to Dylan Klebold outside of the cafeteria throwing bombs on top of the Columbine High School roof.

Penny Burton told me that about two weeks to one month ago (the first part of August 1999), she was talking to Tad Boles and he told her something that she said was bothering her. Penny said Tad Boles told her that if he had not dropped out of Columbine High School, he would have been with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris during the shooting on 04-20-99, at Columbine High School. Penny said Tad Boles also said that if the Trench Coat Mafia had been a part of the shooting incident at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, it would have been worse, indicating that the Trench Coat Maffia students and/or associates were not involved in the incident.

Penny Burton said she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors of anybody who maybe manufacturing explosive devices and/or buying, selling or possessing firearms.

I asked Penny how her parents have been doing since the incident and she said she does not know because they do not talk between them. Penny said she has not gotten along with her parents since she was 13 years old. I gave Penny Burton one of my business cards and later gave her father Gary Burton one of my cards and asked them to contact me in the future if they wanted to speak with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate. I told them I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

He was then asked to wait outside and afterward an interview with him would take place. Zack was very anxious to give a statement.

Zack entered Adam Foss' house and stated he was a Senior with Adam. He stated he was in the choir room as well, when Brandon Reisbeck came into the room and announced someone was shooting. Zack went on to say Mr. Andres told everyone to stay put and then some kids ran down the hall outside the choir room.

Zack stated he was on the way out the door with Everitt Wolfe when Steve Houck stopped at the door of the classroom. At this time Zack stated he looked out the door into the hall and pushed some more people out the door. Then Zack stated they stopped people from going into the hallway and began making them go into the choir office.

Zack stated he looked out into the hallway again, at which time he saw Mr. Sanders get hit with a gunshot. Zack stated Mr. Sanders was

going East in the hallway and it looked like he got shot in the back. Zack stated it looked like Mr. Sanders was hit in the back

near the upper left side rib area. Zack stated the shot sounded like an explosion.

At this time they continued getting everyone into the office. Zack stated he and Adam walked out the front door of the choir room and Ms. Miller yelled at them to get back in and get down. Zack stated he then heard another loud shot.

Zack continued that at this time they went back into the choir room office and barricaded the door. Zack stated he thinks they stayed in the room for three hours. He stated he couldn't distinguish between explosions and gunshots when he was in the office.

Zack stated he heard someone on the roof later on during the stay in the office.

Zack stated he was in the office until SWAT came and got everyone out.

Zack did not see anyone responsible for the shooting.

This concluded the interview with Zack.

INVESTIGATION:

On 08-13-99, I responded to 5646 South Independence Court to contact and interview witness Carey Britton Cecil, who was a student at Columbine High School and graduated in 1999. The purpose for my interviewing Carey Cecil was in reference to the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Carey Cecil told me on 04-20-99, at approximately 0730 hours, her mother Diana Cecil took her to Columbine High School and dropped her off in the Faculty parking lot. Carey advised that after being dropped off in the parking lot, she entered the school by walking through the main doors on the east side of the school by the Columbine High School administrative offices.

Carey said when she entered the high school, she walked in a westerly direction down the main hallway to her locker, which is near the west end of the main hallway. Carey said that her locker number may have possibly been #1870, however, she was not certain. Carey said up to this point, during the time, she arrived at school and went to her locker, she did not see anything that was out of the ordinary occurring at the Columbine High School. She advised that her first hour class begins at 0730 hours and is an Economics class on the upper level of the school. Carey said her second hour class is a Statistics class, and said that her third hour class is Calculus. Carey told me that on 04-20-99, she had her fourth hour class off, and did not have a class to attend on that day. Carey said that due to not having a class to attend, she went into the Columbine High School cafeteria/commons area and selected a table. Carey said that the table that she selected on 04-20-99 is the table that she usually sits at. I showed Carey the diagram of the Columbine High School cafeteria/commons area and she pointed out four tables that she may have possible been seated at on 04-20-99. These tables would be JJ, II, MM, or NN. All four of these tables are located on the eastern edge of the cafeteria and/or just south of the cafeteria serving line. Carey said that she sat at this table by herself studying and did not pay much attention to what was taking place in the cafeteria at that time, however, she did not recall anything unusual or out of the ordinary that happened on 04-20-99 in the cafeteria up to that point. I showed Carey the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria and asked her if she remembered seeing either of these items on 04-20-99. Carey advised me that she did not see either one of these items. I asked Carey if she recalled seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students, or what she would consider Trench Coat Mafia students or associates, in the cafeteria. Carey advised that she did not see any of these students as far as she could remember. Carey advised that her fourth hour was a free hour that was over at approximately 1110 hours, and said that she walked to her hallway locker and then to the Choir classroom on the upper level of Columbine High School for her fifth hour class. Carey said that she arrived in the Choir classroom just prior to the class starting, and said that when she entered the class and sat down, the teacher in this class, by the name of Mr. Andres, was talking. She also said that Mr. Andres yelled at somebody for talking in the class while he was talking to the students. Carey said that while this was taking place, two male students, one of them by the name of Adam Foss and the other student that Carey knew only as Brandon, came running into the Choir classroom and advised Mr. Andres and the class, saying there was someone downstairs in the high school with a gun and was shooting. Carey said that she also realized that in the hallway outside of her classroom, numerous people were running and screaming, however, she thought that this was due to fact that some elementary school kids had possibly gone into the high school and were running in and out of the halls yelling. Carey said about this same time, she heard what she described as one

gunshot, and then a very short time later she heard another gunshot. She said when these shots were heard, half of her Choir class got up out of their chairs and ran from the classroom, however, the other half remained in the classroom. She said that numerous people went into an office that is located next to the Choir classroom to hide, however, she didn't think there would be any room in there so she remained in the classroom. Carey said that she was in the classroom for approximately five more minutes, and then she said she heard two more shots that sounded like they were coming from the area of the cafeteria. She also said as she heard these shots, they seemed to be getting closer and closer to the location she was at. Carey said she stayed in the classroom and then realized that somebody in the hallway could see her through the glass in the door, so she moved to the opposite side of the room to hide. Carey said there was another student with her at this time, possibly by the name of Greg Nason. Carey said that after realizing that she was in view to anyone in the hallway and hiding on the other side room, somebody advised her to come into the office that is located next to the Choir classroom where the other students were hiding. Carey said that after she was in the classroom, the students moved desks and filing cabinets up against the door so if any of the suspects tried to push their way through the door, they would be unable to do so. Carey said the sixty people including herself, remained in this office hiding for approximately three and a half hours before they were rescued by SWAT.

I asked Carey Cecil what information she could provide to me in reference to the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and in particular what she could provide to me as far as information about Dyan Klebold and Eric Harris. Carey said that in her Freshman, Sophomore and Junior years at Columbine High School, she had a German class she was taking and advised me that Eric Harris was in this class. She advised me that during her sophomore year she would consider them to be "kind of pals" and said that they would talk, and said that during this time Eric Harris would associate with other students in the class. Carey said that also during this time she did not see Eric Harris wear a Trench Coat, however, and said that he would wear clothes such as shorts, with a polo shirt or a T-shirt that she said was the standard dress for students at the school. I asked Carey if Eric Harris ever talked about weapons, violence, or bombs, etc., and she told me no, that she did not ever hear him talking about those things.

Carey Cecil advised me that during the first semester of the 1999 school year at Columbine High School, the Choir class she had during fifth hour also had another student in there by the name of Brooks Brown. Carey said that she could not provide any information about Brooks Brown other than the fact that she believed he was in attendance in this class on Monday, 04-19-

99, although she was not certain. I asked her if Brooks Brown was present in the classroom on 04-20-99 and she said no, that he was not there. Carey said that she could provide no further information about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students or their associates.

I asked Carey Cecil if she knew of anybody, or if she had heard any rumors about anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, selling or buying firearms. Carey advised she did not know of anybody that would be involved with any of that.

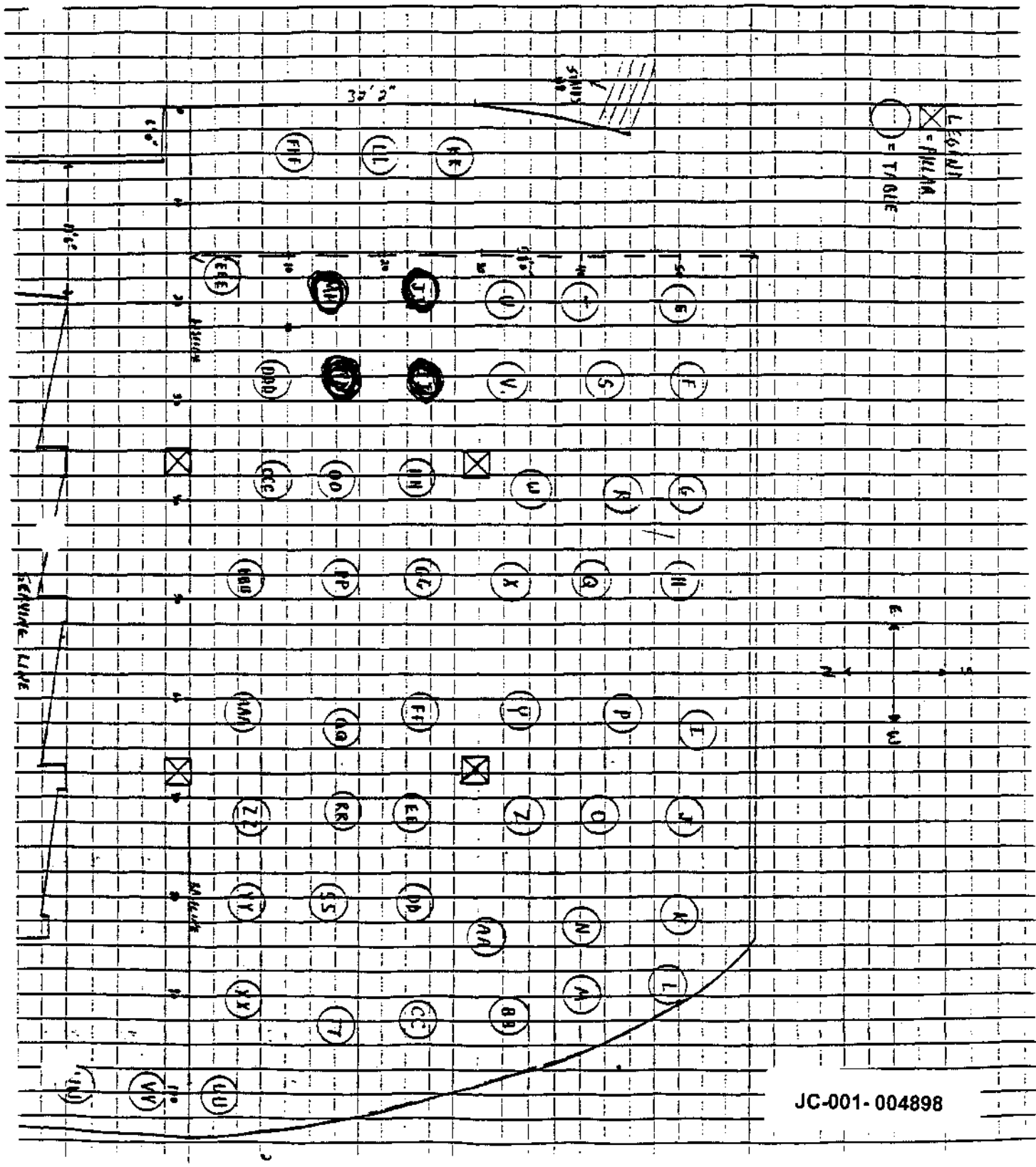

They both advised that they are doing okay and are dealing with it well. I gave both of them one of my business cards and asked them to contact me in the future if they or anyone in their family wanted to speak with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate. I told them I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

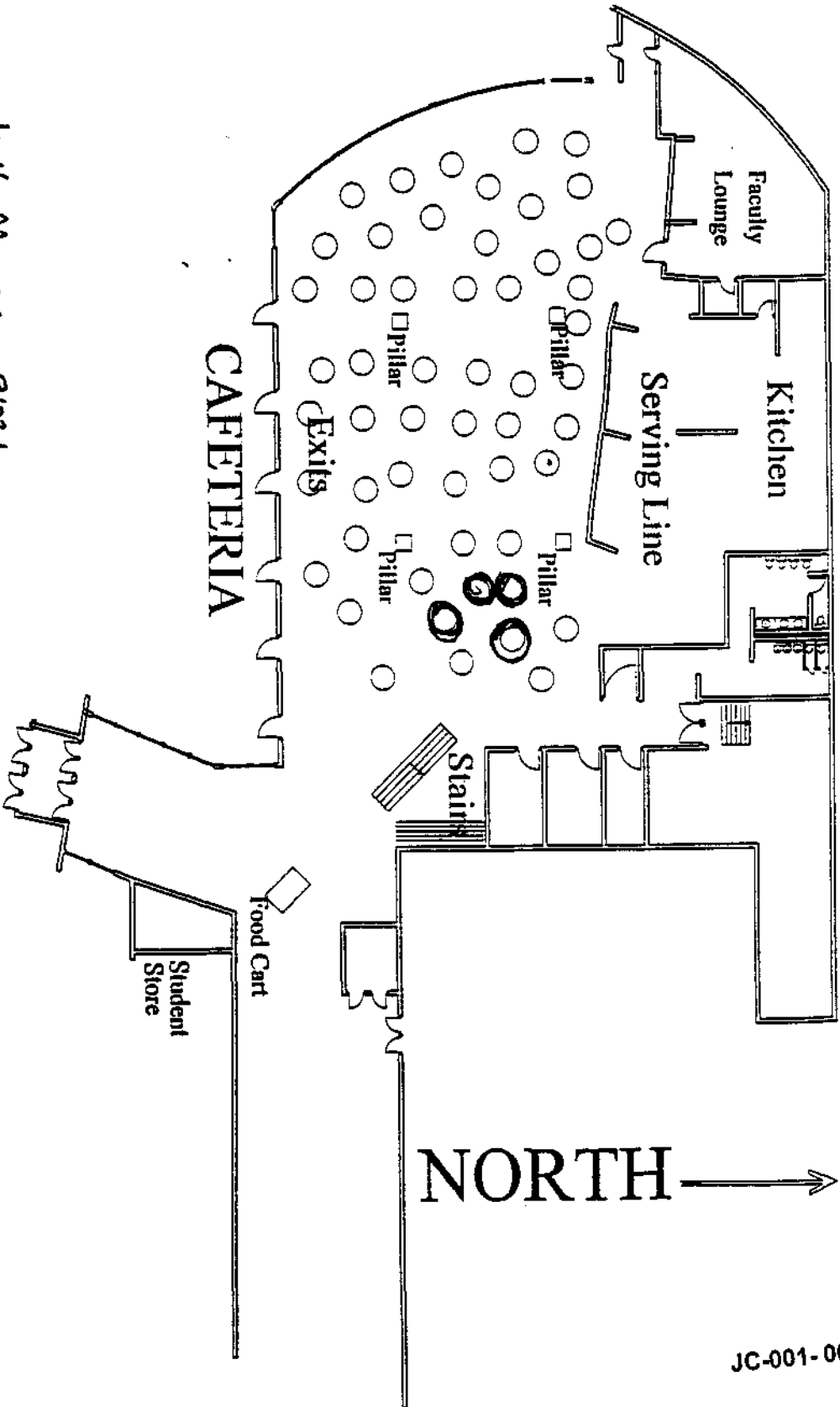
