Telephoned AMF Belleview Bowling Lanes and was told that the Columbine High School does hold their bowling classes at their lanes on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings from 6:00am until 7:15am. The unidentified employee at the bowling alley volunteered, "Klebold and Harris weren't here that day," but added they are normally in the class. The lanes agreed to fax a copy of the bowling scores for that day in an effort to confirm attendance.

Telephoned MACAULEY, Kristine (DOB:060956) confirmed she is a teacher at Columbine High School. She also confirmed she teaches a bowling class at the Belleview Bowling Lanes in which KLEBOLD and HARRIS were registered. MACAULEY described the bowling class is made up of teams of four players which were picked by the students. KLEBOLD and HARRIS were on a team with MORRIS, Chris and DYKEMAN, Nate.

MACAULEY said KLEBOLD and HARRIS "always" attended the class, and arrived very early each day of the class by around 6:00am. She added that MORRIS "rarely" missed the class, however, began to miss more frequently in the weeks prior to the shooting.

MACAULEY thought she recalled having seen KLEBOLD and HARRIS in the parking lot of the bowling alley the day of the shooting. She could not provide any further about their appearance nor if they were with anyone else. She had confirmed that DYKEMAN was present in the class the day of the shooting, and in fact had bowled. She added that MORRIS was absent from the class the day of the shooting.

MACAULEY said another student in the class, "LAPLANTE, Jen" had told her she recalled having seen KLEBOLD and HARRIS in the parking lot of the bowling alley the day of the shooting. She had told her that she had said hello to them and they nodded in response.

MACAULEY provided a list of the 69 students registered for the bowling class, (SEE PAGE #3.) She thought she recalled about 6 or 7 students were absent the day of the incident; however, the attendance list remains inaccessible to her inside the school.

Subsequent to these interviews Belleview Bowling Lanes faxed a copy of the score sheet documentation for April, 20, 1999. This sheet indicated only 3 students out of 73 were absent that day. The absent students included HARRIS, KLEBOLD, as well as MORRIS. These three students were on the same four person team. The fourth member, Nate DYKEMAN showed two scores. Average scores for HARRIS and KLEBOLD had been entered in for both games and were circled, apparently indicating their average was entered in their absence. Nine other students had their averages on their scores for both games. These additional nine were HOFSTRA, Eric; DOYLE, Patrice; IVERSON, Laura; GREENE, Jonathan; HARDY, Matthew; HOUY, Seth; DROBNICK, James; GORTON, Dustin; LAUGHLIN, Chad.





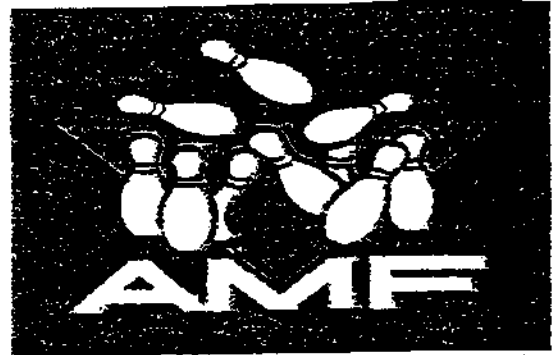

Kristine A. Macauley, 1018 South Saulsbury Street, Lakewood, Colorado, telephone (303)937-3487, a teacher at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Macauley provided the following information:

Macauley is a physical education (P.E.) teacher at Columbine High School. On the day of the shooting, at approximately 11:30 am, Macauley was teaching her fifth period girls P.E. class in the gymnasium area. Macauley usually has between 38-43 students in her class. The class was walking west down the hall just south of the gymnasium, when Mr. Marshall, another P.E. teacher, came running in from outside yelling that someone was shooting. Macauley directed her class from the hall back into the wrestling room. Another teacher, Catherine Baumgartner, was also there. Macauley hid her class in the wrestling room and then went and looked down the hall leading from the gymnasium to the main hall. Macauley saw briefly what she believed to be a gunman at the intersection of the hall. The gunman was wearing white and black and was walking toward the school offices and the main entrance to the school. About that time, Macauley saw the Principal, Mr. DeAngelis. He was in the hallway going west out toward the track. Macauley believes that he was going to get some girls who were left behind in the gymnasium. Macauley then went in the weight room and looked down the hall from the art department toward the school offices and again observed the same gunman. She could not identify the gunman further and did not think he saw her.

Macauley returned to the wrestling room, got her class, and took them outside through the weight room to Clement Field. Macauley came back in twice more. The first time, she helped a girl get out who was hiding in the weight room. The second time, she came in with Mr. Marshall, Mr. Place, Mr. DeAngelis, and Catherine Baumgartner. The other teachers went into the gymnasium to get the students out who were hiding in the storage area by the gymnasium. Macauley went and looked again down the hall toward the school offices, but did not see the gunman.

One of Macauley's fifth period students, Rebecca Heins, wore a black scarf around her neck the day of the shooting. Macauley thought it was odd to wear the scarf with her gym clothes and asked Heins about it before the shooting. Macauley thought that Heins was covering up a "hickey" and jokingly told her that whatever it was it must be important enough for her not to take the scarf off. Heins did not explicitly say that Macauley was right, but did seem to go along with Macauley's joke. At the time, Macauley did not know that Heins was a friend of Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold.

Macauley is the teacher for Harris' and Klebold's early morning bowling class. Chris Morris and Nate Dykeman are on the same bowling team as Harris and Klebold. On the day of the shooting, Nate Dykeman was the only one on their team in class.

Macauley was not in the cafeteria anytime that day.

Student Jamie Conwell reported that when she was in the hallway another student named "Lacey" (last name unk) came running down the hall yelling that someone had a gun.

The following students ran back into the gym where they hid inside a storage closet, for approximately twenty minutes. They were then evacuated out of the building through the back door of the gym and ran to Clement Park.

Kobi Maisel said on 04-20-99, at about 0725 hours, he arrived at Columbine High School for his scheduled classes. Kobi said he attended his morning classes, and at about 1020 hours on 04-20-99, he was inside of the cafeteria at Columbine High School. This was during Kobi's fourth hour class, and Kobi said he was located at the bottom of the stairway by a ledge that the students use to sit on. Kobi said he was talking to approximately twenty of his friends while at that location in the cafeteria. Kobi said when fourth hour was over, he walked upstairs to the second level of Columbine High School and went to his Gym/Weights class, that began at about 1110 hours. Kobi said after dressing out for gym, the students go into the gymnasium area. Kobi said in this room there is a television set, and said on 04-20-99, it was turned on. Kobi said he heard two gunshots but thought they were coming from the television set. Kobi said he then heard the fire alarm for Columbine High School go off and said the students then began running from the gymnasium, to get out of the school. Kobi said he exited the school through the door that leads from the interior of the locker room to the exterior of the school. Kobi said he ran past the basketball court and into Clement

Park. Kobi said approximately one hour later he arrived at the Columbine Library at approximately West Bowles and Long Drive, where he called his brother, Steven Maisel.

I asked Kobi Maisel what he knew about the Trench Coat Mafia and/or the Trench Coat Mafia students, and in particular, Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Kobi said prior to the shooting on 04-20-99, he did not know who Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris were by name. He said he had seen what he believed to be Trench Coat Mafia students in the hallways of Columbine High School, however, he did not know these students' names. Kobi said in the past he had talked to the Trench Coat Mafia students, but did not know their names. Kobi said he would describe the Trench Coat Mafia students as "nice." Kobi said he did not have any Trench Coat Mafia students in any of his classes at Columbine High School. Kobi said he did not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, prior to or during the shooting, but said, "I wasn't looking for them either." Kobi said he did not see the "jocks" pick on or harass the Trench Coat Mafia students. Kobi said he did not observe the Trench Coat Mafia students harass other people either.

I asked Kobi Maisel if he saw any duffle bags or propane tank, such as the ones later recovered in the cafeteria of Columbine High School. Kobi was asked this question due to his statement earlier that he was in the cafeteria on 04-20-99 from approximately 1020 hours until about 1110 hours. Kobi said he did not see either of these items, nor did he see any other items that resembled the ones I asked about.

Kobi Maisel said he has not heard anything about other people possibly being involved in the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. He also said he does not know of anybody, nor has he heard of any rumors about anybody manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms.

I asked Kobi Maisel how he has been doing since the incident on 04-20-99 and he advised he has been doing well.

INVESTIGATION:

On April 20, 1999, while assisting with interviews on the scene of a multiple homicide at Columbine High School, I interviewed Joseph L. "Joe" Marshall, a PE Teacher who had been evacuated from the school by SWAT personnel. Joe Marshall told me that he was teaching a class when he heard a sound like gunshots. He stuck his head out in the hallway and saw a white male dressed in "total black" who was firing a pistol of some type. The male with the pistol also saw Joe Marshall, and began firing at Marshall as he fled down a hallway with a number of the students. Marshall told me that the male fire 12 to 15 times at him, but missed him.

I asked Marshall for a further description of the male, and he told me that the male had medium to long "dirty brown" hair, that he was wearing a long black "Duster" style coat, had on knee-length black boots, and was wearing some type of black ball cap or beret. Marshall could not identify this male, but said that he recognized him as a student at the school. Marshall felt like he would be able to pick the male out of the yearbook. According to Marshall, the male made no statements while he was shooting.

Scott met up with friends, Nate Jui and Brian Zimpfer and Kelsea Bain. They went through Clement Park and got in Brian's car (white four door, may be a Buick) and waited for a couple of seconds. They figured it was someone shooting a gun, and the person would be arrested, and it would be over. Then they saw SWAT members and thought it better to leave because it looked dangerous and it was not safe to stay around there.



On 4/30/99, Lindsey Smith, DOB 1/25/99, 5653 South Harlan Street, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. She was interviewed in the presence of her Mother, Brenda Smith, DOB 5/27/99. She provided the following information.

Lindsey did not go to school on 4/20/99 until approximately 11:15 a.m., because she had an injury to her leg. When she arrived at school, she went to the trainers room for treatment. She was in the trainers room with Scott Parker, and Catherine (LNU), the trainer. Suddenly, they heard gun shots. The trainer turned out the lights, locked the door, and went out into the hallway to investigate. A few minutes later, the trainer returned to the room, and told the students to run out of the school, and keep running to Clement Park. Lindsey followed instructions, and ran out through the weight room, into Clement Park, and ultimately to the public library in Clement Park.

Lindsey did not see either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold on either Monday or Tuesday. She didn't really even know who they were. She had heard of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM), seen other students dress strangely, but didn't have any relationship with any of the TCM. She had also heard that TCM students were very smart, and very good with computers. Lindsey did not see anyone on either Monday or Tuesday carrying any duffel bags in the school. She did however say that a girl named Ashley Mckenna may have heard a gunman say "c'mon [REDACTED] blow it up" sometime during the shooting incident.

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-28-99, at 1200 hours, I responded to 9670 West Gould Avenue to contact and interview Maria Torrejon. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Maria Torrejon told me on 04-20-99, at about 1115 hours, she was in her gym class at Columbine High School. She advised this gym class is a body shaping class, and on 04-20-99, the class was going to take a walk in Clement Park. She advised the gym class is in the upper level of the school, and said there were approximately 20 students in the class on this date. Torrejon advised she was with a friend of hers, Anja (unknown last name), who was an exchange student at Columbine High School from Germany. Torrejon advised she and Anja were going outside for this walk. She advised as she walked out of the gym and into the hall, she heard one to two gunshots, and then she saw the principal, Mr. Diangeles, running down the hall towards them, and he said, "Run, run, get out of here." Torrejon said she then back into the gym with Mr. Diangeles, who opened an equipment storage room for gym, and the students went inside. She advised Mr. Diangeles then left and told them to not open the door for anyone. Torrejon said they stayed in the storage room until Mr. Diangeles returned, along with two other gym teachers (unknown names). Torrejon advised Mr. Diangeles told the students that they were going to try to open the exterior door to the outside of

the school, and told them when this door was opened, to run as fast as they could to Clement Park to get away from the school. She advised when the door was opened, the students did run out of the door exiting the school, and ran into the park.

Torrejon told me when she initially heard the one to two shots while standing in the doorway of the gym class, she did not know what was going on, so she turned around, and believes she saw a male subject dressed in all black clothing that appeared to be tall. She said if it was one of the Trench Coat Mafia students involved, it would have been Dylan Klebold due to the fact that he was tall, and she knew Eric Harris to be short. Torrejon advised she did not know if it was one of the gunman she saw or not due to the fact there was smoke in the hallway when she was looking in that direction.

Torrejon said her friend, Anja, had met Eric Harris at the school approximately one month prior to the shooting, and said they were interested in each other, due to the fact that Anja was an exchange student from Germany and Eric Harris was interested in Germany. She said she knew Eric Harris to wear clothing with German insignias on it. She said she was present when they talked about Germany; however, that was the last time she had seen or talked to Eric Harris.

Torrejon said in her Psychology class, Robyn Anderson was a classmate of hers. She said when she read, through the media, that Robyn Anderson had purchased the firearms for Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris, she said she couldn't believe it because Robyn Anderson always acted and looked like a "good girl."

Torrejon advised she believes the explosive devices could have been taken into Columbine High School on the day before prom, which would have been 04-16-99, which was a Friday. She advised she was in doing community service for the school, and she said there was nobody around or very few people around, and that she had easy access to the entire school at that time. Torrejon said she did not recall seeing anyone in trench coats or Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold; however, she said the school is large and they could have been anywhere in the school carrying the bombs in at that time. Torrejon said she was in the school on 04-16-99, for at least four hours.

I contacted Chris Andrist at the Markert's request, in reference to the Markert children and Torrejon getting their property that was left behind in Columbine High School back prior their leaving for the east coast. Andrist was given the information on the students and Mrs. Markert, and he advised he would contact her on 05-28-99, in the afternoon to make the necessary arrangements to pick up the property. I re-contacted Mrs. Markert and advised her of this.



photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Matthew said he did not see either one of these items in the cafeteria, nor did he see anyone carrying these items in the school or outside of the school on 4-20-99. Matthew Conley said that during the fifth hour class at Columbine High School he went to the Spanish class because he had to clean desks with Peter Forsberg. Matthew said that the Spanish classroom is on the lower level of the high school and on the same level as the cafeteria.

Matthew Conley said that while he and Peter Forsberg were in the Spanish classroom, cleaning desks, a Freshman at the high school came running into the classroom and told them there had been a shooting outside. Matthew said he did not believe the Freshman, however, he then heard the sound of people running through the hall outside of the classroom. Matthew said that he went into the Spanish classroom office to hide, and said he went into the closet, along with other students and teachers. Matthew said that they were in this room until approximately 1430 hours on 4-20-99 when they got together and decided they were going to run from the classroom and exit the school. Matthew said that they ran out of the room, they exited the door on the east side of Columbine High School, and then ran into the student parking lot, where law enforcement officers put them into a police vehicle and transported them to Bowles and Pierce to make a statement.

Matthew Conley said that while he was hiding in the closet of the office in the Spanish classroom, he heard approximately 10 explosions that he described as "big booms" and Matthew said they sounded like they were next door to where he was located. Matthew said these explosions were very loud. He also said that while in the room he heard several gunshots, however, he could not recall how many he heard, and said that these sounded like they were coming from further away than the explosions were.

Matthew Conley advised that he did not see any suspects with explosive devices and/or firearms on 4-20-99 during the shooting.

I asked Matthew Conley if he knew Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris prior to this incident. Matthew stated that Eric Harris was in a gym class that he had at Columbine High School during the first semester of 1999. Matthew said that Eric Harris dressed in "German clothes" and when I asked him to describe the "German" clothing, he said that the clothing would have words written on it or insignias that were in "German." Matthew said that Eric Harris also wore army boots and had seen him wearing trench coats in the past. Matthew said that he never had a conversation with Eric Harris during the gym class or any other time.

Matthew said that he did not know Dylan Klebold prior to this incident. He said after the incident, he saw Dylan Klebold's photograph, and believes that he had seen Dylan Klebold in the hall at Columbine High School, however, prior to this incident he did not know Dylan Klebold's name.

Matthew Conley told me that on 4-20-99, at an unknown time in the morning, while he was parking his car at Clement Park, he saw a male party he knows as Robert Perry driving a small red car in the parking lot at Clement Park. Matthew said he believed that Robert Perry was dropping someone off in the parking lot there, however, he did not know who that person being dropped off was. Matthew said he saw the small red car stop and someone get out of the passenger side, however, he did not know who that was. Matthew said he had not seen Robert Perry for some time and believed that he had dropped out of Columbine High School. He said that he remembers him due to the fact that he had bad acne and said that he would wear the same shirt every day to school. He described this shirt as a "9 Inch Nail's" shirt that had claw mark streaks down the front of it. Matthew Conley said that he did not believe he knew any of the other "Trench Coat Mafia" students or who they were.

Matthew Conley advised me that on 4-20-99 he left his backpack, described as a black Jansport, in the Spanish room, however he has since be able to return to Columbine High School and get that backpack.

Matthew Conley advised me that he did not know what the thought of the day was over the Rebel News Network (RNN) on 4-20-99.

Matthew Conley advised me since the shooting on 4-20-99 he has been coping with the situation well and said he has had no problems. I gave both Matthew Conley and his mother, Dana Conley, my business card and asked them to contact me in the future if they wanted to talk with a JCSO Victim Advocate. Peter began by saying he was going to the Foreign Language Hall after 4th., period to complete some work due to a discipline action for something he had done earlier. He stated he usually goes to the library with some friends and studies during the 5th. Period.

Peter stated he stopped in the commons area after the 11:10 A.M., bell. After a few minutes he continued to the Foreign Language room, he believes it is room number 5.

Peter stated he and another student, whom he doesn't know, were cleaning desks about 11:25 or 11:26 A.M., when Markus Opfer (a ninth grader) ran into the room and stated: "There's someone shooting kids." Peter stated they ran outside to the hallway and saw people running outside.

At this time Peter ran to get a teacher, Brandon Brookfield, a Spanish teacher. Mr. Brookfield took everyone into the foreign language office.

After hearing shots or bangs, Peter stated everyone got into one of the storage rooms. Peter stated five people went into one and four other people went into the other storage room.

Peter continued by saying that after about one and a half hours Mr. Brookfield switched them to another room.

Peter stated the school bells kept going off and he thought it was about 2:05 P.M. He stated the group waited a while and then they left the classroom and exited the South East door.

Peter stated they ran to the path and then to police officers across Pierce St.

Peter stated this is all he knows about personally.

Peter was asked if he remembers when he heard the last shot or explosion. Peter stated he thinks it was about 50 minutes before they exited the building. He stated the shots sounded like they came above them near the science rooms.

Peter was asked what route he used to leave the 4th. period and go to the Foreign Lang. rooms. He stated he left the language arts rooms near the math rooms upstairs and walked to the stairway near the library that ends at the cafeteria.

Peter was asked if he saw anything unusual during that trip and he stated he didn't see anything unusual.

Peter stated he didn't see any suspects and doesn't know the suspects. He stated he may have seen one of them when passing through the halls, but he doesn't remember anyone particularly.

Peter was asked if he remembers who was in the storage room with him. He stated Mr. Brookfield, Mark Opfer, and a freshman and sophomore whose names he doesn't know. Peter stated, Mrs. Hickman,

Mrs. Friend, Ms. Lutz and Mrs. Killiam were in the other storage room.

Peter was asked if he left any property behind and he stated he left his Black backpack, Eddie Bauer with his name on papers and books and a TI 86 calculator in the backpack.

Peter was asked if he normally goes to the library during 5th. Period and he stated he does, along with his friends.

Peter was shown a map of the library and asked where he usually sits and with whom. Peter looked at the map and stated he and his friends usually sit at tables 15, 16, 17 or 20. INVESTIGATION:

On 081199 I telephonically interviewed Michael Berry. He has not been interviewed by police regarding the shooting prior to this date. Berry was at school on 042099, in Mr. Andre's guitar class, in the auditorium when the shooting incident began.

He was first alerted of the shooting in progress when two class mates, Jake and Phillip (last names unknown) came running into the room and said that there some guys with guns, then he heard shots being fired. Then about 12 students came running into the auditorium, he and the other students then began to take cover in the room. After several minutes had elapsed he got up and began to look around to assess the situation, he got out into a hallway and heard more bombs or gunfire, and he ran back into the auditorium.

Berry the recalls that Mr. Andres Senior and Junior began to lock the door to the auditorium doors from the inside. He and other students sat in the chairs for a short time until a janitor, unidentified, came in and told students to get out by going through the business hall. He and several studentd did this, then ran to Leawood Park where they remained briefly. He remembered students running out of the school in a panic, so he began to run further into Leawood, east on Fair Street. He was able to find shelter in a residence there. Several hours later he walked to his home.

Berry remembered seeing Dylan Klebold at school on the 20th. He said he was wearing a black beret, sunglasses, a black cloak (trench coat), and black

pants. He said he saw him coming out of the social studies wing at about 1020 hours. He recalls nothing unusual about Dylan that day, he did remember that Dylan's hands was in his pockets and he was by himself. When I asked Berry how he knew it was Klebold he said, after the shooting I saw his picture all over the media and I know that it was the same kid I saw in the social studies wing.

Berry denied to having prior knowledge of this incident. He said he was not a member of the TCM and did not know any of the members.

Berry saw nothing, he only heard what he believed were gun shot and bombs exploding.

Telephone Interview on May 3, 1999

ACTION TAKEN:

On May 3, 1999 I was asked to do an interview with Jacob SCHRECK, student at Columbine High. I contacted him shortly after 8 a.m. and spoke with his father who stated that Jacob was home sick with strep throat. He had a doctor's appointment and would call me later.

At 1:45 p.m. on May 3, 1999 Jacob SCHRECK call me back and we talked over the phone due to his illness. He related that he got to the High School on April 20, 1999 at between 7 and 7:05 a.m. He takes the bus to school and was with his friend, Isiash (SCHOLE) (sp), a black student, who rides the same bus when they went to the Commons (cafeteria) upon arrival at the school.

They set with Brad MILLER and talked until 7:25 when then left for first hour class. They were sitting about in the middle of the cafeteria, near a trash can.

After gym class, he returned to the cafeteria where he purchased a bottle of water from the school store and left without sitting down. He did not see anything suspicious while in the cafeteria that morning.
