

On 06-23-99, between the hours of 1300 and 1308, I had an opportunity to speak with Richard Stephens also known as Ryan in reference to the Columbine incident that occurred on 04-20-99 through the use of school records, I had identified Ryan as being on lunch period "A" and was calling to see if he was on campus when the incident occurred.

Upon contacting Ryan, he told me that he left school at 1115 hours, and went to lunch with his friend Erik Trenck. Ryan explained that they exited from the school through Rebel Corner, walked out into the junior parking, where they got in Erik's car and drove to New York Bagel, which is located on West Bowles Avenue, just east of Wadsworth. While at the bagel shop.

Ryan said that they saw Mr. Moore and Mr. Tonelli and while they were eating at the bagel shop, the store received a phone call from an unknown office staff member from Columbine High School, who contacted Mr. Moore and told him to get back to the school, advising them of the incident. Ryan stated that both the teachers got up and left quickly.

Ryan was asked if he observed anything out of the ordinary when he exited from the high school on the incident date, such as any gunmen or if he heard any gunshots or explosions. Ryan stated that they left prior to the incident. They did not observe anyone or hear anything and he had no additional information to pass on reference the incident.

Ms Stewart said her son Aaron has mental problems. He was enrolled in special classes at Columbine and is now in Jeffco jail for stealing money she had for her church group. Aaron has mental problems and was in jail during the time at Columbine and is not enrolled at school at this time. He did not know anyone involved just liked to dress in the gothic look.

His sister Emily K. Stewart dob/08/10/83 was in the lunch room at about 11 25 on the 20th, was told to get down, heard shots and ran down back hall into the auditorium and onto the stage into the band room and out of the building onto the soccer field. This took about ten mins. She said she did not see anything. She thought there was about 10 to 15 people in the TCM. The only name she knew was Frank Zirger.

On 05/03/99 Aaron Stewart was contacted at the Jefferson County Jail.

Aaron Stewart advised TCM was a group of outcast students. The individual membership did not like school and did not like the jocks. The individuals felt the jocks were getting all the recognition in school. The individual members would hang around together, drink beer and smoke marijuana. One of the meeting places they would always use was a tunnel under Peirce Street.

Aaron Stewart stated he never became a member of the group although they tried to get him to join. Aaron stated he knew the individual that started the TCM but could not remember his name. Aaron described him as being 5'11" to 6'0" tall, always wore a black hat and worked at Black Jack Pizza. The individual graduated from Columbine High School in 1997.

Aaron Stewart advised Erik Harris had mentioned on previous occasions that he was going to get even with the jocks and make the high school famous.

Aaron Stewart was unsure of the names of the members of TCM but thought there was approximately 15 members.

Aaron Stewart has been in custody at Jefferson County Jail since 03/11/99. He claims he has no knowledge of the incident or who could be involved.

On April 21, 1999 after interviewing James Stewart at his home, I
talked with Laura about this case. Laura told me the following:

* She was off campus when the shooting started. She was just
getting back to school when the incident was on-going.

* When asked if she knew Eric Harris, she said that she did not
know him personally but does know of him. She did not know if he
was part of the trench coat students.

* When asked if she knew Dylan Klebold, she said she knows him by
face and name. Dylan was in her French class last year. She said
Dylan and another student named Zach Heckler got kicked out of that

class all the time. They were disruptive. She said that Dylan was an obvious trench coat wearer.


* When asked if she knew a [REDACTED] she said the only [REDACTED] she knew of like that was a [REDACTED] (possible last name) who was part of the trench coats who committed suicide a year ago.


* She did not know a [REDACTED] nor anyone associated with a white Bronco.

* She did talk to the Denver Post but did not have any other media contact.

* She added that she thought the suspects were shooting at Leawood Park because of all the commotion she saw in that area as she was arriving in the area of the school.

On 04-28-99 at 2030 hrs. Chris Stinson was interviewed at his residence (6383 W. Burgundy Dr.). His mother and stepfather were present for the interview (Shellie O'Brien and Douglas O'Brien). [REDACTED]

He knows them, in 7th and 8th grade knew Harris well, when they got to high school basically grew apart. [REDACTED]

Chris Stinson has many friends who are in sports, he is not. Chris Stinson's interests in school are mostly with the acting classes and choir. He knows of Chris Morris and Brooks Brown who are friends of Harris. There was a incident involving Chris Morris where he was in an acting class, he was assigned to a group for a play and he never attended the class. The members of the group told Chris Morris if he doesn't attend and help out they wanted him out of the group. Chris Stinson is very aware Chris Morris is a known associate to the Trench Coat Mafia.

Chris Stinson was part of the Homecoming Royalty and a close friend Brandon Ricebeck was Homecoming King. [REDACTED]

Chris Stinson knows Brooks Brown who he describes as a good choir student. For the last 2 weeks of class Brooks Brown did not go to class for a unknown reason. Brooks Brown according to Chris Stinson has ties to the Trench Coat Mafia.

Chris Stinson was home sick on 04-20-99, he did not attend school at all. He was home sick with a temp. of 104 degrees which his mother explained.





Steven Sumida advised me that prior to the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, he had never heard of the Trench Coat Mafia or the Trench Coat Mafia students. Steven Sumida said that he plays football, wrestling and lacrosse at Columbine High School, however, he has never been picked on or harassed by anyone that may have been a Trench Coat Mafia student. Steven Sumida advised that he had heard of "jocks" picking on and/or harassing members of the Trench Coat Mafia, however, he has not personally witnessed any of this.

I asked Steven Sumida if he had seen anyone in the hallways or in Columbine High School that he may believe was a Trench Coat Mafia student. Steven Sumida said that he had noticed a few students who may have been Trench Coat Mafia students and he identified by their method of dress only. He said that he had never talked to any of them nor have they talked to him.

Steven Sumida said since the shooting on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School, he has been doing fine dealing with the incident. I asked him to contact me in the future if any of his family members or himself want to talk with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate. I advised him I would make the necessary arrangements at that time.




On 5/13/99, Spencer Taylor, DOB 8/28/81, 6225 West Coal Mine Place, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agent and Detective, and the nature and purpose of the interview. He was interviewed in the presence of his Mother, Tina Taylor, DOB 12/1/57. He provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Spencer arrived at the Columbine High School at approximately 7:10 a.m., and went to the commons. He sat with Spencer Grange, Daniel Grange, Aaron Wright, and Spencer Wright. They sat there until their first classes started at approximately 7:30 a.m. Spencer didn't see any duffel bags or packages that looked out of the ordinary to him. His last class prior to first period lunch was chemistry class. He departed from this class, walked down to the commons, and exited the south side of the cafeteria. He walked in the cafeteria lot, placed his backpack in his truck, and then walked to the Mormon Seminary house on the corner of Pierce and Polk. He did not see anyone or any activity that caught his attention while in the parking lot. He went into the house, and just as he was sitting down, several students ran into the house yelling that there was a shooting at the school. He remained there for several hours, and later departed with friends after the incident.

Spencer has seen Klebold and Harris around, but didn't really know them. He has also seen other Trench Coat Mafia students around, but didn't really know or associate with them. He noted that when he was a freshman, the TCM members wore their trench coats more often than they did in the past year. He stated that he thinks that the TCM is just basically a group of outcasts. They dress differently than most other students, and don't participate in school activities such as football games. He didn't believe that they were violent or prone to violence. He does know a girl named Alejandra Marsh that does hang out with the TCM, but he doesn't think that this girl is actually one of the TCM. He said that she was a bit odd, but that she was very intelligent. He has had classes with her on and off during the course of the past few school years. She actually asked Spencer to the sweetheart dance in 1998, however he declined. He again said that he doesn't spend time with Alejandra, but only sees her around school, in the halls, or in an occasional class.

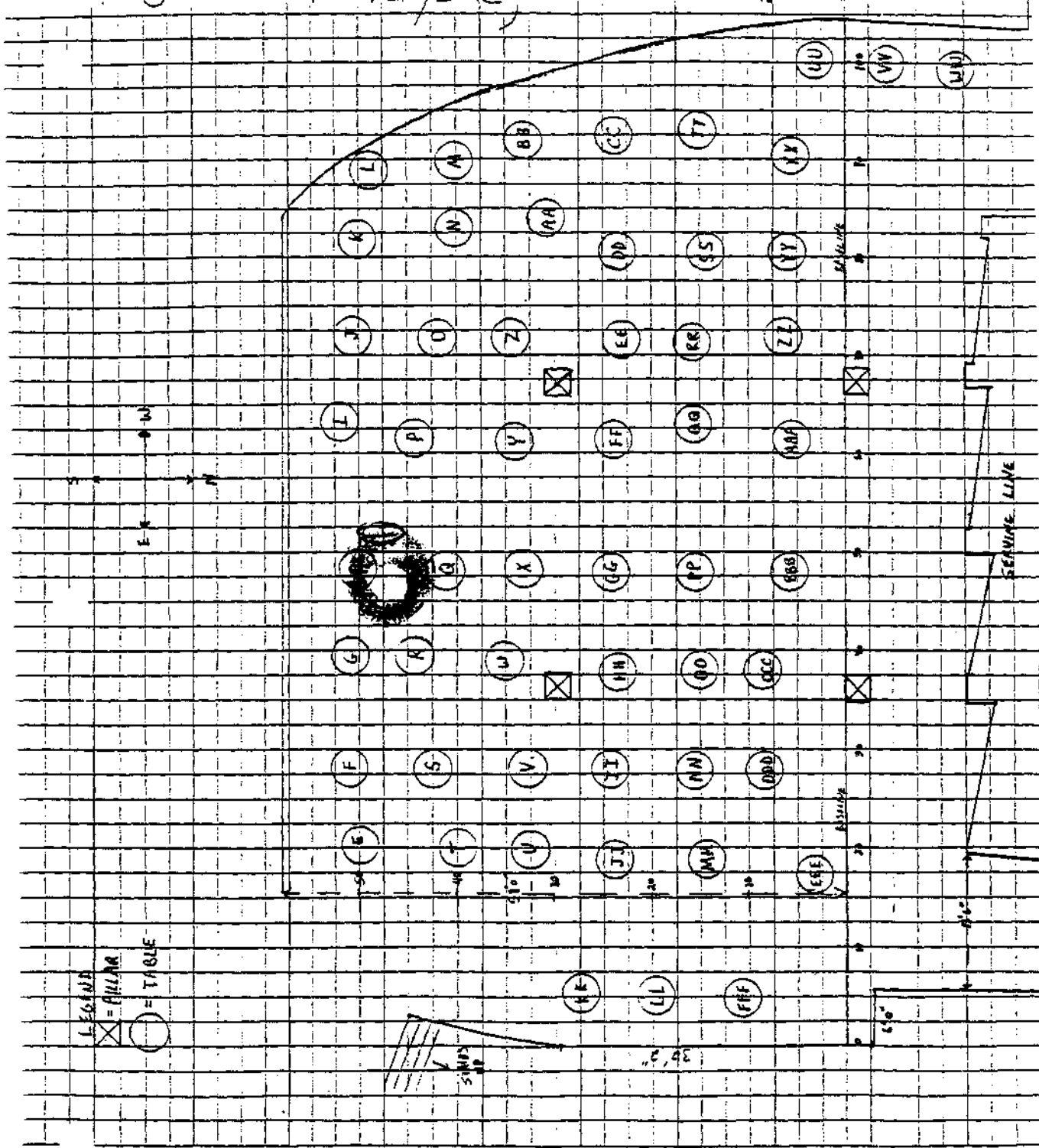

Narrative:

On 5-13-99 Inv. Craig Schoshke, Assistant Principle Chris Mikesell and I interviewed Andrew Thomas. Andrew was contacted as his name was brought up in an interview with Eric Veik in lead 3314. He reportedly took part of the conversation were Eric discussed bring in a device into the school to prove a point that it could be done.

At the beginning of the conversation I asked Andrew if he was aware of why we had asked him into the office. He told me he thought it would be reference the conversation he and Eric had about security at the school. He said everyone he talked to was paranoid. He said they discussed how it would be easy to bring a back pack of stuff into the school but he said no one would really do what Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold had done. He went on to say he was "pissed" about not being able to go to school at Columbine and all he had to do to go to school at Chatfield. I asked who he was "pissed" at and he told me Dylan and Eric. He said he thought the use of parents guarding the doors was silly and would feel better if there were police there who would look into back packs.

I asked Andrew to tell me who all was in the conversation and he said Eric Veik and Adam Dressel. He said after they talked about what the security concerns were they began discussing what could be brought into the school in a back pack. He had said why not some empty PVC pipe and just dump it out on the table. This would show everyone how inadequate the security was. He said they talked for a while but could not really remember all that was said because he did not mean to do anything or believe anyone else would do something like this. I asked him if he remembered anything about gasoline. He said Eric had said something about it but could not remember what he said. I asked him if fifty five gallons was discussed and he said not that he could remember. It was more like one to five gallons. He said at least that is what he thought they would be talking about. We then discussed if anyone spoke on how to build a device or a fake device and how to bring it in to the school. He said he did not. 



if he observed anything out of the ordinary that morning when he walked into the cafeteria area/Rebel corner. Erik told me that he did not see anything which would leave him to believe anything was wrong. Erik attended his regular classes that day and after being released from his fourth hour history class, taught by Mr. Fleener, that he and his friend, Ryan Stephens, exited from the school at about 1120 hours. Again, he told me that they exited through Rebel corner, went out in the junior parking lot and left school. Erik explained that he went to New York Bagel for lunch that day and the bagel shop is located on Bowles Avenue, just east of Wadsworth. He told me that while he was eating lunch at the bagel shop, he saw two teachers from the school, Mr. Moore and Mr. Tonelli.

At this point I confirmed with Erik that he had left prior to the incident, he did not observe any gunmen, nor did he hear any gunshots or explosions. Prior to finishing my interview, I asked Erik if he had any additional information. Erik told me that as he was walking out of school, going to lunch at about 1120 hours, that he recalls Brooks Brown was walking out of the school behind him. He told me that he believes Brooks is an associate of the "Trench Coat Mafia." He described Brooks with brown curly hair, but wasn't wearing a trench coat that day. I asked him if he recalled where Brooks went. He told me that after he exited the school he didn't pay much attention to him and has no idea where he went. Erik also proceeded to tell me that he was contacted by an investigator about two weeks after this incident, who explained to him that [REDACTED] Erik was unable to provide any additional information as to who that investigator was that contacted him



I asked Kelly Trinniman what information she could provide to me about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and in particular, what information she could provide about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Kelly told me she had no information about Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris. Kelly advised me that in her second hour class at Columbine High School, there was a female student that Kelly knew only as "Lydie" or "Lydia," that wore a trench coat in this class. Kelly advised me that this female student sat at the back of the classroom, and stayed to herself in the class. Kelly said she could not remember anybody that this female student had associated with in the Math class.

Ryan told me that at about 0930 hours, on 4-20-99, he exited the Columbine High School cafeteria and went up the stairway to the upper level of the school to attend his biology class. This biology class lasted until approximately 1030 hours. Ryan said his fourth hour is "A" lunch time, so he exited Columbine High School with a friend of his by the name of Mike Kompinski, and said they went to Ryan's vehicle (a red Toyota Celica) that he had parked on West Fair Drive, east of south Pierce Street, in the one hour parking area. Ryan said he and Mike got into this vehicle and left for Ryan's house to eat lunch. Ryan said while he was in the school and while they exited the school, he did not see any of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students that he can remember. He said he did not see anybody or anything out of the ordinary while leaving. Ryan said he took Mike to his residence at 7610 West Friend Avenue to eat lunch. Ryan said after lunch, Mike and he tried to return to Columbine High School for their next classes, however, was unable to do so due to the police presence in the area of the school.

Ryan Typher said prior to 4-20-99, he did not know the names of any of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students. He said he knew who the "Trench Coat Mafia" was due to their style of dress, but said he did not know any more about them. Ryan said when he would see the "Trench Coat Mafia" students in Columbine High School, he did not see anybody harass or picking on them, including the "jocks." Ryan said he had not seen the "Trench Coat Mafia" students harass or pick on other students either. Ryan said that he played baseball, however, he was not harassed by any of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students for being an athlete. Ryan said he knew who Isaiah Shoels was and I asked him if he ever witnessed any type of racial harassment or racial intimidation by anyone towards Isaiah Shoels. Ryan said he had not seen any racial intimidation or problems towards Isaiah Shoels and in fact said that everybody seemed to like Isaiah.

Ryan Typher said that he has not heard about anybody who may have possibly been involved either prior to, during, or after the shooting at Columbine High School on 4-20-99. He said he has not heard of anybody, nor has he heard any rumors of anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms. Ryan also said he did not know anybody with a double pierced eyebrow.

I checked with the FBI Rapid Start personnel, and was told that Tiffany Typher had been interviewed and the report showed an information control number of 4254.

I asked Ryan Typher how his family has been doing since the incident on 4-20-99, and he said that he is doing better, however, he said his sister, Tiffany, is taking it rather hard due to the fact that she knew Eric Harris previously. I advised Ryan if anyone in his family or himself wanted to talk with a JCSO Victim Advocate to contact me and I would set up the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

DISPOSITION: Case is open, pending further investigation.
