**INVESTIGATION:**

On 06-01-99, at about 10:30 a.m., I telephoned the Yazzie residence as follow up on DN3883. At that time, I spoke with Kathleen Yazzie, Levi's mother. Kathleen confirmed what Levi had told me about student Scott Shaffer on 05-28-99 (DN3570). She explained that Scott Shaffer's parents are divorced, and that Scott has been living at her home for several months due to problems he'd been having with his mother. Kathleen said that Scott recently drove to Oregon for an extended camping trip with his father, and that upon their return, Scott plans to move out of her home and in with his father, somewhere in the Denver metro area.

Kathleen then told me that her son, Levi Yazzie, was not at Columbine High School during the shootings on 04-20-99. She said that on 04-19-99, Levi, who played on the school's varsity baseball team, injured his knee. On 04-20-99, Kathleen said that Levi's knee was still bothering him, and that he called her from school after his third period to see if she would phone in an excused absence for his fourth period. Kathleen said that she then called the school for such excused absence, and that Levi came home. Kathleen said that Levi arrived home at about 10:30 a.m., and stayed for lunch. Kathleen said that Levi then returned to school at about 12:15 p.m. Kathleen said that about ten minutes later, Levi phoned her from a friend's (Ryan McGrath / 12<sup>th</sup>) cell phone to report what had occurred at the school and that he was OK. Kathleen said that she told Levi to return home, which he then did. The interview concluded at about 10:40 a.m.

On 4-30-99 I interviewed Yealy at his residence. He advised me that he was with his girlfriend at the memorials at Clements Park at about 2130 hrs on 4-26-99. Yealy also told me that his curiosity had just gotten the best of him so they walked on the west side of the fields on the west side of the school when he encountered a barbwire fence. Yealy saw a downed corner of the fence and he alone decided to cross the fence and perhaps get a closer look at the school that he has been seeing on the news for the last few days. He said he had no intention on going into the school or even getting close. He said he doesn't know anyone involved in the incident and doesn't even know anyone living in south Jefferson Co. Yealy denied being with the Trenchcoat Mafia although he admitted that he does own a London Fog style trenchcoat that he likes to wear during inclement weather.

<b>NATURE OF CASE</b> <b>COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL / HOMICIDE</b> <b>INTERVIEW OF FRANK ZIRGER (CHS STUDENT / TCM ASSOCIATE)</b>		

1. On April 28, 1999 I contacted Frank Zirger (DOB: 10/21/80) at his residence, 6763 W. Roxbury Pl., Littleton, CO 80128, (303) 972-8306. The interview had originally been arranged through his mother the previous day, who gave her consent, and was present in the home, known to him as either but not in the interview.
2. The original lead on Frank Zirger came from fellow CHS student, Pamela Silva. She had related that Frank had told her that he had seen Eric Harris at CHS on the morning of April 20, 1999 with another student identified as "Red".
3. Frank Zirger is currently a junior at CHS, having attended the school since 9<sup>th</sup> grade. He knew both Harris and Dylan Klebold, describing them as "acquaintances". He knew Harris as either "Reb" or "Red", and of the two, he knew Dylan better. Frank met them both last year through Brian Sargent and Tad Boies. Sargent and Klebold had a video class together. Frank would often go to breakfast at a local McDonalds with Klebold and Sargent.
4. Frank said that he did not associate much with Reb, describing him as quiet and "respected" by others in their peer group. He observed that Reb primarily associated with Dylan, Chris Morris, and Nate Dykeman, all of who had an early morning bowling class together. He described Dylan Klebold as "happy", never angry, and if anyone ever made fun of him, he seemed to let it "roll off his back". Frank never saw either Harris or Klebold express anger towards others. Frank said they seemed to be normal, and was very surprised at what they did.
5. Regarding the "Trench Coat Mafia" (TCM), Frank said that a large group of fellow students began hanging out together in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade on Pierce Street near CHS, but he is uncertain how that name became associated with the group. Frank has never considered himself a member of TCM. He said that the group treated each other as "family", often bugging each other when departing company. The incident at CHS was never discussed within the group as any sort of plan, and he cannot believe that anyone would assist them. None of the group ever discussed pipe bombs. Frank knows former CHS student Joe Stair, but said that he has rarely seen him since he graduated (January 1999).
6. On April 20, 1999 Frank said that he, his younger brother Paul, and Nicole Dickey all obtained a ride from Brian Sargent to CHS, arriving at about 7:00 a.m. Frank does not have a scheduled 1<sup>st</sup> hour, and while the others went to class, he went to the cafeteria with Nick LNU, George Shriner, and Michael Bogatz. The four of them usually walk from the school over to the corner of S. Pierce and Polk where they smoke.
7. Shortly after 7:00 a.m., he and the other three named above, left the school from the cafeteria, along the sidewalk separating the junior and senior parking lots, and in the direction of Polk. Frank is familiar with Eric Harris' car, a light gray 1989 Honda Prelude with a "Ramstein" sticker on the rear window. As Frank walked past the junior lot, he saw Eric's car parked in the junior lot with the trunk open, and saw Eric behind the car, somewhat bent over as if he was doing something in the trunk. The car was approximately 30-40 feet from the school. Eric was wearing black fatigue pants and possibly his black KDKFM T-shirt. This caught his attention because it was unusual to see Eric at school that early, and that he was not parked in his usual spot, which is in the senior lot. He had already walked past the car, passing within about 10-15

feet of it, and did not say anything to Harris. He does not know if any of the others with him saw Eric. Frank said that while not absolutely certain, there may have been another male standing near the car with Eric, described as tall, slender, black pants, black waist-length jacket with no patches, whose back was to him. Frank does not recall noticing Dylan Klebold's car at the time, which he knows to be a black BMW. (See attached CHS map whereby Frank Zirger identified his route from the school, location of Harris, and the usual parking spaces of Harris, Klebold, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED])

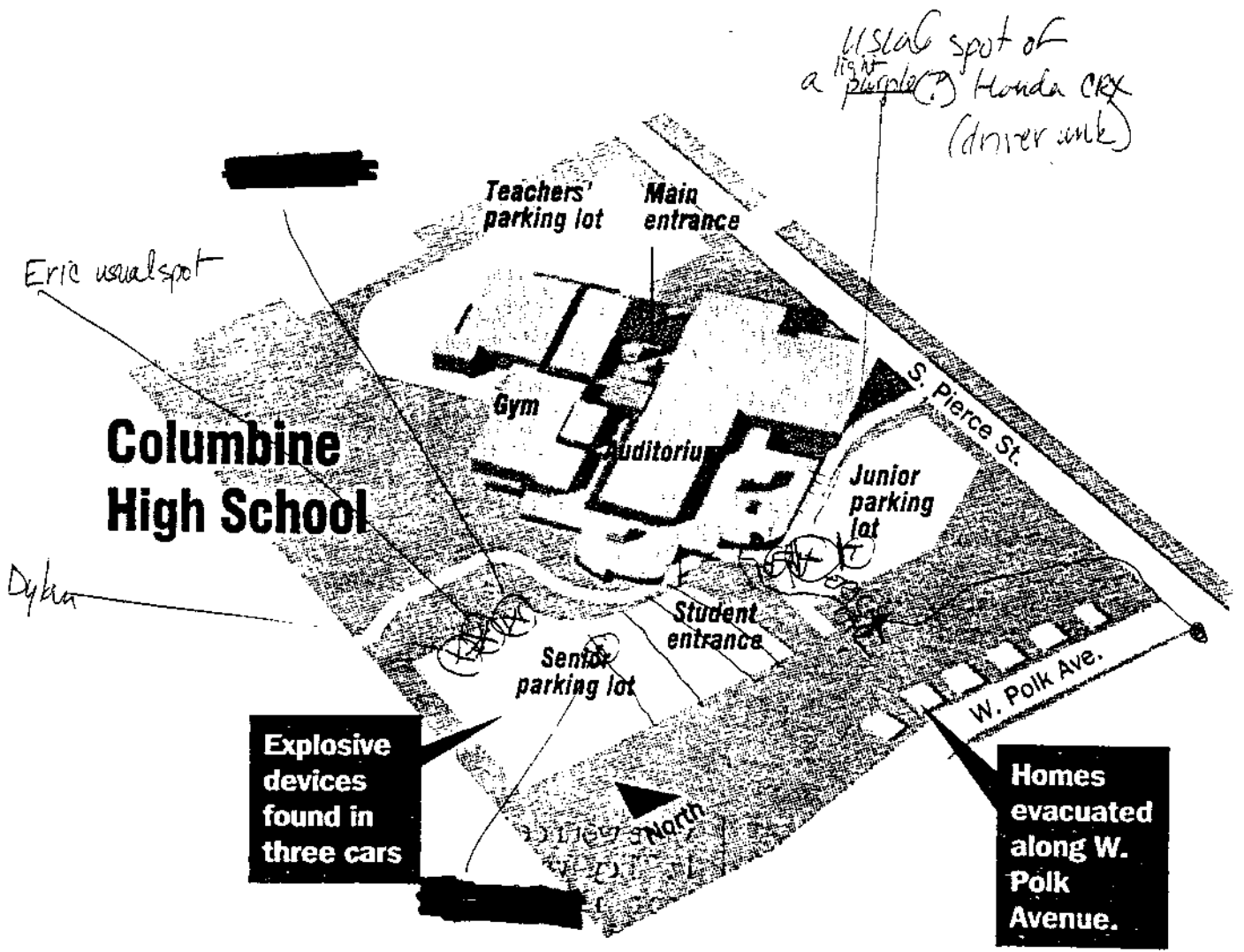
8. Frank said that because of the terrain near the school, he could not see Harris' car or the parking lot once they were at the corner of S. Pierce and Polk. He and the others returned to CHS via the same route at about 8:50 a.m., and he does not recall seeing Eric's car parked in the same space, nor does he recall seeing either Eric or Dylan the remainder of the day.
9. Frank said he was at school attending each of his classes from 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4<sup>th</sup> hours, which ends at 11:10 a.m. He then went to Brian Sargent's car, which was parked in his space in the senior lot, arriving at about 11:15 a.m. He, Sargent, and Nicole Dickey drove to the Burger King near the Cooper 7 Theatre (S. Pierce).
10. They returned to CHS at about 11:45 a.m., and saw several police cars and police around the school. They were advised by an officer of the shooting, and told to leave the area. They drove to Frank's house, arriving at about 12:30 p.m., stayed briefly, drove to Nicole's house so she could get her car, and he then returned home. His brother, Paul, had arrived home at about noon.
11. Frank said that of the shooting victims, he knew Isaiah Shoals, Rachel Scott, Brian Anderson, and \_\_\_\_\_ Fleming. He has not discussed the shootings with his friends. Frank said he would like to be contacted for counseling services, and I made a referral to the victim advocate.

She got back to the school approx. 1125 hrs. and had to park in Clements park due to all the road blocks. She began walking toward the school and got as far as the teachers parking lot when she encountered a lot of students running from the building. At this point she turned and ran back toward the park but was not allowed to take her vehicle. She caught a ride with friends and left the area. She did not see or hear any shooting or explosions.

Zobjeck also told me that Klebold was in her first semester gym class and that they did not get along. Klebold was always cheating at the games in class and was always pushing people.



Roger Anderson, home address 8170 W. Massey Drive, Littleton, Colorado, 80126, telephone number (303)979-6826, date of birth June 27, 1937, was contacted at the home of his son, Wade Anderson, located in San Antonio, Texas, telephone number (210)699-4923. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, Anderson provided the following information:

Anderson was loading dump trucks at the corner of Caley Street and Pierce Street, across from the south parking lot of Columbine High School, on the morning of April 20, 1999. At approximately 10:00 a.m., Anderson recalled seeing a Jefferson County Sheriff's Officer on a motorcycle sitting at the Caley/Pierce intersection watching for speeders. About 15-20 minutes after the officer left the area, Anderson saw two vehicles turn off Pierce and onto Caley Street. Anderson advised that the two vehicles came about 100 feet onto Caley Street and then made a u-turn and return to Pierce Street. Anderson did not know which direction the vehicles traveled on Pierce.

Anderson stated that the first vehicle was a black or dark blue BMW that contained four teenagers. Anderson recalled that the teenager in the passenger seat of the BMW was wearing a light colored baseball hat. The second vehicle that was tailgating the BMW was described by Anderson as a light colored mid-sized vehicle containing two individuals.

Anderson shared his information with two patrol officers on April 21, 1999, when he was back at his work site. Anderson stated that he has been working in excavation for over 25 years and must always be observant of his surroundings. Anderson stated that he though it was unusual for kids to be driving around in a BMW and that was why he took notice of the incident. Anderson advised that was currently visiting his son in Texas and would be returning to the Denver area on May 1, 1999.

On Tuesday, April 20, 1999 at around 1300 hours I responded to the  
Jefferson County Sheriff's command post regarding the shooting at

Columbine High School. While on scene, three young men were taken into custody in the area of the park that were similar in appearance to the possible suspects in this shooting. One of the persons taken into custody was a James Brunetti. Jeffco S.O. Sergeant Pat Woodin requested I interview Mr. Brunetti.

At 1359 hours I entered a van where Brunetti was seated. He was cuffed and being escorted by Jeffco S.O. Deputy A. R. Walker. His property was already in a bag and I was handed his Colorado I.D. He said he only heard about the shooting. His hands were then bagged for a GSR collection kit.

I then read Mr. Brunetti his rights per Miranda reading from my pre-printed card. When asked if he understood his rights he replied, "Yes." When asked if he would tell his side of the story he replied, "Oh, yeah." Brunetti then told me the following:

\* He lives with his mother, Joanie, and his sister, Jannine. His mother works at C.U. Boulder but he did not know in what capacity.

\* He came with two friends of his; Matt Akard who he described as his best friend and lived on Gray Court in Arvada, and Matt Nalty who he described as a good friend who lives in Broomfield and drove the three of them to the scene in his white car, unknown model.

\* When asked what he was doing this date from the time he woke up, he said he had stayed the night at Matt Akard's home. They woke up around 10:00 a.m. and Matt Nalty called over there around 10:30 a.m. They had all planned on going to a concert in Littleton for a band called, "Drop kick Murphy."

\* He needed cigarettes so they all met over at his house. While there, the news of the shooting was on television. He said his sister was watching the television and they talked about his sister's ex-boyfriend named Anson who attended Columbine High. They wondered if he was okay so they decided to drive into the area and see what was going on.


\* He said they approached some cops to ask questions then the cops took them into custody with weapons drawn.


Mr. Brunetti then was taken by another van where a GSR kit was completed. The three young men were then released and told to leave the scene.

Mr. Brunetti was extremely cooperative and said he understood what was going on due to the seriousness of the situation.

Within the next few days I received a call from Mr. Brunetti saying that the cops were following him and he wanted some kind of written statement that he and his friends were no longer suspects. I also received a message to call Matt Nalty who also was saying he wanted to be officially cleared. I made no follow-up calls to Mr. Nalty.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-24-99, at about 3:55 p.m., I interviewed Eric Carline as follow up on DN3670. The interview was conducted at Eric's home.

Eric told me that on 04-16-99, at about 5:00 p.m., he was inside his home when he heard the sound of gunshots coming from behind his home. Eric said that he walked out onto his back deck to ascertain where the gunshots were coming from. Upon doing so, he discovered they were coming from below a hill, directly behind his home. Although he didn't see the shooter(s) Eric said that he was somewhat angry in that whoever was shooting apparently didn't realize they were in such close proximity to his and other nearby homes. Eric said that he then yelled a few times from his deck for the shooter(s) to "Knock it off," assuming that they would hear him, quit shooting, and go away. Eric said that despite his yelling, the shooting continued and he then called the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office to report it. Eric said that shortly after making this call, the shooting stopped. Eric said that he didn't think anything of this at the time. He said that two or three times a year, he hears gunshot from people who shoot along the Deer Creek Canyon roadside, and assumed this was simply another such incident.

Eric told me that on 04-20-99, the day of the Columbine shooting, he arrived home from work earlier than usual (around 3:30 p.m.).

p.m.) and began walking his dog in the neighborhood. While retrieving his mail, Eric said he ran into a new neighbor, Brian, with whom he works at Lockheed Martin but hadn't seen for several years. Eric said that the two of them then began discussing media accounts of the events that occurred at Columbine, and also the presence of police and news media in their neighborhood.

[REDACTED] Eric said neither he nor Brian knew at that time why the police were in the neighborhood. Eric said later that night, while watching television at his home, a member of the newspaper media knocked on his door and asked him if he knew anything about the Klebold's. Eric told him that he didn't, and that he had no desire to talk to reporters. Eric said this person then left without further incident. Eric said that he returned to watching television coverage of the Columbine shooting, during which he then learned why the police and news media were in his neighborhood.

Eric said that that night, he began thinking about the Columbine shootings, [REDACTED] and the possibility that the gunshots he had heard the previous Saturday may somehow be connected. Accordingly, Eric said that the next morning (04-21-99), he telephoned the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office and left a message to that effect with Investigations Sergeant Randy West. Later in the day (around 3:00 p.m.), while on a job at Buckley Air Force Base, Eric said that he again telephoned the Sheriff's Office and spoke with one of the Investigations secretaries. Again, Eric reported the gunshots he had heard on 04-16-99 and the possible link with the Columbine shooters. Eric said that the secretary told him she would pass the information on to the appropriate investigators. Eric said that he never heard back from anyone from the Sheriff's office, and that he never called back because he assumed the investigators were busy and he didn't want to be a "pest."

Eric said that on 04-26-99, at about 7:20 p.m., he was on his back deck and noticed a yellow, older model pickup truck, with a white camper shell, parked approximately 75 yards east, along Deer Creek Canyon Road, of where he had heard the gunshots on 04-16-99. Upon closer observation (with binoculars), Eric said he saw a person walking in and around the bushes near the truck. Eric said that it appeared this individual was looking for something. At first, Eric said that he assumed it was an investigator following up on what he had reported. Eric said that he became curious, and walked down to where this truck and individual were. Eric said that as he approached this individual, he realized it wasn't an investigator. Eric said that this individual, whom he described as a white male, late 20's to early 30's, shoulder length brown hair, was walking in and around the bushes and appeared to be intently looking for something. Eric said that he said something like, "nice evening for a wa

huh?" to this individual, who didn't acknowledge him. Eric said that because this individual didn't seem too friendly, continued walking past him, toward the creek. Eric said that as he walked past the truck, which he described as 10-15 year old, he noted the license plate: Colorado 20395YS. Eric said that he then left that area and returned home. Later in the evening Eric said that he checked the area again and that this individual had left. Eric thinks this individual may have been looking for spent shells.

Prior to concluding the interview, Eric took me to the two areas along Deer Creek Canyon Road he had pointed out. The area where he heard the shooting coming from is a dirt shoulder on the south side of Deer Creek Canyon Road, approximately 100 yards from [REDACTED]. The area where he saw the individual and yellow truck is also on the south side of Deer Creek Canyon Road, on a dirt shoulder / circle drive, about 75 yards west of Cougar Road. The interview concluded at about 4:00 p.m.

During our conversation, Drew stated that about 1000 hours that day he was sitting on the front porch of his house. He told me that a light blue compact car, which he believed was a two door, drove westbound past his residence. He stated that they were going a "little" above the speed limit. He stated that the windows were down. I asked him how many people were in the vehicle, and he stated that there were four males in the car. He stated they all were wearing black clothing. I asked him what color hair they had, and he stated all he can remember was that one or two of them had brown hair. I asked him about the driver's hair color, and he stated that he could not remember. I asked him if they said anything as they drove by or if they noticed him. He informed me that they did not see him, but they were yelling a different language. I asked him if that could have been the radio playing in the car, and he stated no they were yelling.

I asked him if they had anything in their hands or hanging out of the car. He stated that the guy in the right rear passenger seat had something in his left hand, but it might have been the seat belt from the front seat. 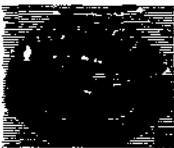

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

On 5/12/99, Laura Chlumsky, DOB 12/6/54, 6516 South Saulsbury Court, Littleton, Colorado was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. She provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Mrs. Chlumsky was in her yard working at approximately 11:15-11:20 a.m. when she heard what she believed to be gun shots in the vicinity of the high school. She called a neighbor and told her what she thought was going on, and told the neighbor that she was going to drive to the school to see what was happening. She drove toward the school on Pierce, only to find it blocked off by law enforcement. She then drove around the general area in the neighborhood. At approximately 11:40 a.m. she noticed a young man standing on the corner of Hoover and Teller Avenues. She thought that this boy was probably a Columbine student. She asked the boy if he knew what was going on at the high school, and he responded "I think I do, but I don't want to say". She told the boy that if he knew anything, he should immediately report it to the authorities. He responded that he knew that he should. She told him that there had been shots fired at the high school, whereby the boy placed his face in his hands and said in a distressed tone, "Oh my God, no"!! Mrs. Chlumsky stated that her impression of his reaction was one of disbelief or remorse as if he knew what was happening at the school, versus one of a shocked reaction or surprised. Mrs. Chlumsky told the boy that he needed to report what he knew to the authorities. There was a lot of vehicle traffic in this vicinity, and about at that time, Mrs. Chlumsky's daughter pulled up with her friend, Marcie Visnic. Her daughter briefly talked to her, and told her that the boy she was talking to was Brooks Brown. Mrs. Chlumsky stated that her daughter saw Brooks get into a sport utility vehicle at this intersection, and drive away. Mrs. Chlumsky later saw a newscast with Brooks Brown on it, and confirmed that this was the same boy she had talked to at the intersection of Hoover and Teller Avenues.

Linda Reffel stated what is this doing here talking about the propane gas tank. Linda thought it was a helium gas tank to blow up the balloons for the party.

I showed Ms. Dierken the photo of the propane gas tank that was found in the cafeteria. Ms. Dierken identified the propane tank in the photo as being the same one she saw in the freezer on April 17, 1999.

Ms. Dierken was asked if the freezer door was ajar or was the door shut. Ms. Dierken stated the freezer door was shut.

Ms. Dierken was also shown the photo of the blue duffle bag which was also in the cafeteria and was asked if she saw that bag in the freezer. Ms. Dierken stated she did not remember if she saw the blue bag or not.

In addition Ms. Dierken remembered seeing Dylan Klebold at the party with a kid with green hair.

On 4/27/99, SA Michael W. Howell contacted managers at Costco, Park Meadows Mall, 8686 Park Meadows Center Drive, Littleton, Colorado regarding the Columbine High School shooting. The managers were advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, which was to check for purchased made by Harris and Klebold on 4/13/99. Dave McGuire, Manager, telephone number (303)708-0815 and Cynthia Cordell, Assistant Warehouse Manager, telephone number (303)708-0012 advised that they would check the Costco computer database to determine if Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold had made any purchases at Costco on the date April 13, 1999.

On 4/27/99, SA Howell was telephonically contacted and advised that no purchases were made by Harris or Klebold on the date mentioned.

On 4/27/99, SA Howell contacted Connie Goodlow, date of birth 12/23/46, 8505 E. Temple Dr. #442, Denver, Colorado 80237, regarding Rapid Start Control Number 1492, a tip Goodlow had called in stating that she had seen Harris and Klebold in Costco on 4/13/99. Goodlow advised that she saw three white males wearing black trench coats inside Costco on 4/13/99 between 15:45 and 16:15. The three were near the food area of Costco eating free samples which had been placed out. After seeing pictures of Harris and Klebold in the paper, Goodlow realized that two of the three individuals were Harris and Klebold.

Goodlow described Harris as a white male, approximately 5'10", approximate age 17-18, wearing a black trench coat (which came down to the ankle) with a hood. Goodlow described Klebold as a white male, approximate height 6'1"-6'2", approximate age 17-18, wearing a trench coat (which came down to the ankle).

Goodlow described the third individual as a white male, age unknown, approximate height 5'10", wearing a trench coat which was shorter than Harris's and Klebold's trench coats.

Goodlow did not see any of these individuals carrying any items and did not know if they made any purchases.

Cecilia Hicks Grossmann, DOB 06/21/1951, 3221 Shalimar Terrace, Pueblo, Colorado, telephone (719)562-9136, was telephonically interviewed by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Grossmann provided the following information:

On 04/20/1999, at approximately 11:30 am, Grossmann went to the residence of Marilyn Taylor, 6526 South Teller Court, Littleton, Colorado, to pick up some items from Taylor. Grossmann was in the residence until approximately 11:40 am. As Taylor and Grossmann were walking to Grossmann's car, Brooks Brown ran up to the house and asked if he could use the telephone. Taylor went and retrieved her cordless phone from the house.

Brown was really nervous and related that he had just come from the school. Brown had met an ex-friend of his outside of the school. The ex-friend told Brown that he liked him and that he ought to leave the school. Brown thought this ex-friend was crazy and did not know what he was going to do. Brown's ex-friend just turned 18 years old and Brown thought that he was getting a gun for his birthday. Brown did not say how his ex-friend was going to get the gun. Brown did not say what the name of the ex-friend was. Brown said as he was getting away from the school, he heard some shots, but did not know what was happening. Brown wanted to call the Sheriff as well, but Taylor and Grossmann encouraged him to just call his parents. Brown was unable to contact his mother by telephone, but was able to reach his father. Brown made arrangements with his father to pick him up in the neighborhood near Taylor's house.

This was the first Taylor and Grossmann had heard of the shooting. Grossmann had driven by the school at approximately 11:25 am and had seen some students milling around outside, but did not know what was going on.

Per information control sheet #1789, I contacted (W)Hall at her residence, regarding information she might have of possible suspect accomplices.

(W)Hall stated, that on the evening of 04-15-99 she was at Columbine High School, attending her daughters elementary school music program. The program, which was held in the gymnasium, ended at 8:30pm. Before leaving, her 10 year old daughter, Patricia needed to use the restroom. (W)Hall allowed Patricia and her 6th grade friend, Heather Hanson, to go to the restroom alone. The children used the restrooms near the cafeteria, returned and they left the school.

On 04-20-99, after the shootings, they were watching media reports of the event. Her daughter observed a photo of Dylan Klebold on T.V. and advised (W)Hall she had seen him in the school the night of the music program. (W)Hall stated, her daughter described how Klebold had a goatee and was standing with two other males. They were all dressed in black, no trench coats, and had heavy chains around their necks. The trio were standing near the top of the stairs, above the cafeteria and were not causing any trouble, although
