Shooting incident at Columbine High School of students and faculty on April 20, 1999.

SYNOPSIS:

On April 20, 1999, two individuals identified as Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold assaulted the Columbine High School with four firearms and numerous improvised explosive devices which resulted in numerous deaths and injuries to students and staff and destruction to school property.

NARRATIVE: JC-001-008202

- On April 20, 1999, Eric Harris, DOB 4/9/81, and Dylan Klebold, DOB 9/11/81, assaulted the Columbine High School located at 6201 S. Pierce, Littleton, Colorado, with four (4) firearms and numerous improvised explosive devices. Twelve (12) student victims, one (1) faculty victim, and fifteen (15) injuries were sustained as a result of the assault. Both suspects, Harris and Klebold, were killed as a result of self-inflicted gunshot wounds.
- 2. Suspect vehicles were identified in the southeast and southwest parking lots of the high school which were identified as belonging to Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. A black BMW belonging to Eric Harris was found to contain improvised explosive devices and also located inside the vehicle was an Intratec, TEC-DC9, 9mm gun box with the serial number D061505. This information was traced on 4/21/99 firrough ATF Tracing Branch with the following results: firearm was received by Larry F. Snyder, doing business as Adventure Guns & A+ Enterprises located at 120 W. 70th Ave., Denver, Colorado 80221, telephone number (303)427-5423. According to tracing, Mr. Snyder went out of business and the Intratec, S/N D061505, was transferred to Mr. Snyder as part of his personal collection. On 4/22/99 attempts

to contact Mr. Snyder were negative. According to information obtained, Mr. Snyder's address for the firearm business was terminated 5 years ago and the phone number belongs to another individual as of 5 years ago. Information was obtained from property records that Larry F. Snyder presently resides at 7891 York Street, Unit 2, Denver, Colorado, 80202, telephone number (303) 880-5882. Numerous attempts to contact on 4/24/99-6::pm; 4/26/99-3:00pm £ 7:30pm; 4/27/99-called the (303) 880-5882 number and left message; 4/27/99-10:00am paged (303) 690-7068 no return call. The pager number (303) 690-7068 is the phone number for A-1 Painting listed in the phone book. On 4/27/99, an attempt to contact with Mr. Snyder was attempted with negative results. S/A Motte left his business card with the occupant of Unit 1 at the same address to give to Mr. Snyder. Information of Mr. Snyder's business as A-1 Painting was obtained from this individual along with vehicle information as a late model grey Ford pickup with camper shell with A-1 Painting on the side.

- 3. On April 21, 1999, the firearms used in the Columbine High School shooting were obtained from crime scene personnel as follows:
 - a. Stevens, model 111D, by Savage, serial number A077513, double-barreled shotgun, 12 gauge, 2 %" chamber.
 - b. Hi-Point, model 995, 9mm carbine, 9 X 19 luger, by Beemiller, serial number A59610.
 - c. Savage-Springfield, model 67H, 12 gauge pump shotgun, 3" chamber, serial number A232432.
 - d. Intratec, model TEC-DC9, 9mm, serial number D076305.

Firearms Tracing Branch notified of firearms recovered and urgent traces initiated with Ed Steeley, (304) 274-4100.

- 4. On this same date the following information was obtained from Ed Steeley, ATF Firearms Tracing Branch, relating to the urgent firearm traces:
 - a. Savage, serial number A077513 shipped 3/10/69 to Otasco Wholesale, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Then shipped on 9/15/69 to Coast to Coast Federal Firearms Licensee in Alva, Oklahoma who is linked to Otasco. Coast to Coast Federal Firearms License number 57309397 is out of business. - 5. On this same date, information obtained from FBI as to an interview conducted with a Nathan Dykeman indicates that Dykeman was a witness to a transaction where suspect Dylan Klebold paid \$300.00 to a Phil Duran. According to Dykeman the money was for the purchase of a shotgun. According to the FBI, Dykeman was going to cooperate with police by coming to the Denver FBI office and be polygraphed as to the information regarding the money transaction. According to FBI Special Agent Jack Magrath, another individual, Chris Morris is affilliated with the Trenchcoat Mafia, a group of students of which the two suspects Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold are a part of. Morris supposedly has information pertaining to firearms in which Phil Duran is a possible source. Interview scheduled with Morris, his parent(s) and his attorney for 3:00 pm on 4/22/99, by FBI Denver.
- 6. On April 22, 1999, completed trace information was obtained from ATF Firearms Tracing and forwarded to S/A Motte via ASAC Joesting. The following information related to the traces is as follows:
 - a. Stevens, serial number A077513, responsible party for the license is a Dean and Pamela Blatz, 527 Barnes, Alva, Oklahoma. According to ATF Tracing, the dealer has no records for the time period requested related to the shotgun.

MARRATIVE:

- On April 22, 1999, S/A's Motte and Moreland interviewed Mr. Spain at his residence 1. located at 315 E. 1st Street, Johnstown, Colorado. Mr. Spain stated that he did have a Federal Firearms License registered in the name of "Just Guns" located at 2695 92nd, #3, Federal Heights, Colorado.
- Mr. Spain states that he had surrendered his FFL license due to the business not 2. being as prosperous as he had hoped for. Mr. Spain was asked what he had done with his remaining inventory and he stated that he taken what was left of his inventory and transferred them to his personal inventory. He then gave the inventory to a longtime friend of his identified as Larry Russell, telephone number (303) 426-4066, who resides at 9525 N. Lowell Blvd., Westminster, Colorado. Mr. Russell would have disposed of the firearms at various gun shows. Mr. Spain was asked if Mr. Russell kept detailed paperwork on firearm transaction and Mr. Spain believed that he did.
- Mr. Spain stated that he could call Mr. Russell and ask him about the disposition of the remaining firearms from Mr. Spain's inventory and determine if he had any receipts for them. This was agreed to and Mr. Russell was contacted via telephone.

- 4. Mr. Russell stated that he had obtained the remaining firearms from Mr. Spain and had disposed of them at gun shows. Mr. Russell was asked if he had any receipts of the transactions and he stated that if the firearms were disposed of prior to October 1998, he may or may not have a receipt. If the firearm was transacted after October 1998, he would have completed an appropriate ATF F 4473 for the transaction. Mr. Russell stated that as of October 1998 he was licensed by ATF as a Federal Firearm Licensee. Mr. Russell was given S/A Motte's pager number and instructed to call if he had any additional information. The two suspected Savage shotguns serial numbers were given to Mr. Russell to check with his records.
- 5. At approximately 2:40 p.m., Mr. Russell paged S/A Motte and stated that he had no ATF F 4473 showing the disposition of any of Mr. Spain's firearms. Mr. Russell stated that he would check his receipt book for any firearms sold at the gun shows which he might have.

Mr. Choate stated that at this gun show in late fall he encountered an individual who was carrying an old Winchester. 30-30 rifle and asked him if he would like to trade the firearm for the Hi-Point carbine. Mr. Choate stated that the individual agreed and the transaction was completed with the exchange of the Hi-Point and \$400.00 for the Winchester rifle.

- on April 22, 1999, S/A's Motte & Moreland interviewed Mr. Larry Russell at his residence located at 9525 N Lowell Blvd., Westminster, Colorado, telephone number (303)426-4066.
- 2. Mr. Russell stated that he had obtained the 30 to 40 firearms from Mr. Royce Spain's inventory and sold them at the Tanner Gun Show located at I-25 and 58th Avenue in Denver, Colorado. Mr. Russell stated that he had obtained 4 or 5 Intratec firearms from Mr. Spain but did not recall who he had sold them to at the gun show. Mr. Russell stated that if he had sold any of the firearms after October 1998, he would have completed an ATF F 4473 since he would have obtained his FFL license. Mr. Russell stated that he did not have any ATF F 4473's for any of Mr. Spain's firearms that he had sold.
- At Enterprises and he stated "Larry Snyder, yes I Know Larry". Mr. Russell stated that he had purchased an Intratec, .22 caliber pistol from Larry Snyder in the past but have never purchased an Intratec, 9mm pistol from Larry Snyder.
- 4. Mr. Russell was asked if he had ever received an Intratec pistol box with the wrong serial number into his inventory and he stated he had not.
- 5. Mr. Russell was asked if he used any form of labeling on any of his firearm boxes

besides the manufacturers labels. Mr. Russell stated that when the manufacturers label comes off he uses a stick-on label to mark the firearm box. Mr. Russell was asked what type of stickers and he stated that they were small round colored stickers. When asked what color, Mr. Russell stated that he used yellow and green ones and had also used some ugly blue ones. Mr. Russell was asked what type of information was placed on the sticker and he stated that he would write the model number only on the sticker.

- 6. Mr. Russell was asked to show S/A's Motte and Moreland what the sticker looks like and Mr. Russell brought out an Intratec firearm box with a yellow sticker on it. On the sticker was the model number and the serial number of the Intratec enclosed in the firearm box. Mr. Russell was asked about the numbers on the firearm box and he stated that it was the model number. When shown the numbers, Mr. Russell was surprised that this one had the serial number on it.
- 7. Mr. Russell was asked about the receipt book with the receipts for the firearms he sold at the gun show for Mr. Spain. Mr. Russell stated that he was only able to find a small number of receipts at this time. He stated that he could not find the receipt book and does not remember if they were put in an envelope or box in the garage, but cannot find them. He stated that he would search for them.
- 8. Mr. Russell stated that all of Mr. Spain's records were submitted to Out of Business section once he transferred the remaining inventory to his personal collection.
- 9. Mr. Russell was asked if he had sold any Savage shotguns that belonged to Mr. Spain. Mr. Russell recall's purchasing a Savage shotgun in almost new condition from an individual but does not recall if he did or did not sell any Savage shotguns belonging to Mr. Spain.
- 10. Mr. Russell described Mr. Snyder as 6'0" to 6'1" tall, slim white male. Mr. Russell stated that the last time he had seen Mr. Snyder was 2 or 3 Tanner Gun Shows ago.
- 11. Mr. Russell stated that when he was selling Spain's firearms at the gun show, his proceedure of identification was as follows; he would ask for the individual's form of identification to verify the individual's age and that they were a Colorado resident.

- On April 23, 1999, S/A Motte and Detective James Vonderohe of the Arvada Police 1. Department, interviewed Kelli Lea Brown, DOB 08/22/81, with her mother present, Mrs. Lodi Patterson at their residence located at 5756 W. Elmhurst, Littleton, Colorado. Ms. Brown relayed the chain of events surrounding her contacts with Robyn Anderson.
- Kelli Brown stated that on a Sunday in December 1998 or January 1999, Robyn Anderson left a message at Kelli's house for her to call Robyn back at her residence. Kelli calls Robyn back and Robyn states that she had been out doing a favor for Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. Kelli stated that Robyn did not elaborate on what the favor was nor did Kelli ask.
- Kelli was asked to start from the date of the shooting at Columbine High School and 3. address all contacts with Robyn Anderson. Kelli stated that on Tuesday, April 20, 1999, she was called by Robyn because Robyn is felling guilty about what happened at Columbine High School. Kelli tells Robyn that she will be coming over to her house and arrives over at Robyn's house at approximately 7:00 to 7:30 pm. Robyn takes Kelli up to her room and tells her about the favor that she did for Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. Robyn states to Kelli that since she was 18 years old, she brought Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold into the gun show and paid cash for the guns she helped them acquire. Kelli stated that Robyn told her that the guns that

were purchased were a semi-automatic rifle for Eric; a double-barreled shotgun for Eric; and a shotgun for Dylan. Kelli stated that Robyn was felling very guilty about assisting with the purchase of these firearms.

- Kelli stated that on Wednesday, April 21, 1999, she called Robin to see how she was doing and told Robyn that she would be coming over to Robyn's house about 11:00 to 11:30 am. Kelli and her mother, Mrs. Lodi Patterson, arrive at Robyn's residence at approximately 11:30 am. The reason for going over to Robyn's house was to convince Robyn to tell her mother about the firearms purchased by Robyn for Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. Kelli stated that when they arrived at Robyn's house, Kelli went up to Robyn's room while Mrs. Patterson spoke with Robyn's mom. Robyn's mom went to answer a telephone call and Mrs. Patterson goes to Robyn's room to talk with Kelli and Robyn and convince Robyn to tell her mom about the guns purchased. According to Mrs. Patterson, Robyn is feeling guilty about the firearms purchased for Harris and Klebold. Mrs. Patterson and Kelli are told by Robyn that Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold told her they were going to hunt with the firearms. Around this time, Robyn's mom comes upstairs and Robyn begins to tell her mom about the guns purchased. Kelli and her mom go downstairs and wait. After a short period of time, Robyn's mom comes downstairs and thanks Kelli and Mrs. Patterson for convincing Robyn to tell her about the guns purchased for Harris and Klebold. According to Kelli and Mrs. Patterson, Robyn's mom states that they will be contacting the police.

- 2. Mr. Duran was informed that there is evidence that he was involved in the purchase of firearms by Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and that he had supplied them with a TEC-9 pistol.
- 3. Mr. Duran stated that he did not provide Harris and Klebold with any firearms but his friend Mark Manes had. Duran stated that he had been approached by Harris and Klebold and had referred them to Manes to acquire the TEC-9 pistol. Duran stated that he gave Harris and Klebold, Manes' telephone number of (303) 979-4899 and to contact Manes directly for the purchase of the Intratec, TEC-9, 9mm pistol.
- 4. Duran stated that Manes had purchased the TEC-9 pistol approximately 6 months to a year ago at the gun show located at the Mart at I-25 and 58th avenue in Denver, Colorado. According to Duran, Manes and he had taken the TEC-9 up in the mountains to a location known as Rampart and shot it a number of times.
- 5. Duran was asked about a video tape recording of target shooting occurring at ATF SF 2120.2 (02-1998) (Formerly ATF Form 1270-2 (400))

Rampart with Duran, Manes, Manes' girlfriend, Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold shooting the firearms used in the Columbine High School shooting. Duran stated that he knew of the video and that he was the one who was filming the event. Duran identified Manes' girlfriend as Jess or Jessica LNU.

- 5. Duran stated that the last time he had been shooting with Manes was 3 to 4 weeks before the shooting incident at Columbine High School. Duran further stated that he has been shooting with Manes in the past at least 2 times a month for a long time. Duran stated that he has been shooting with Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold and Mark Manes at least 2 or 3 times.
- 7. Duran stated that Mark Manes lives off of W. Alder with his parents which is nearby to where Duran's parents live.
- 8. Duran stated that Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold gave him \$125.00 which was to be given to Mark Manes for the sale of the TEC-9, 9mm pistol. This money was the balance owed to Manes from Harris and Klebold. Duran stated that he gave the money to Manes.
- 9 Duran further stated that Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold had met with Duran and Manes at the gun show located at I-25 and 58th Avenue also known as the Mart.
- 10. Duran signed an affidavit surrounding these circumstances and events.

- On April 24, 1999, Robyn Anderson was interviewed by S/A Motte and Arvada Detective James Vonderohe at the Arvada Police Department. Present at the interview was Anderson's attorney Michael Root. The interview was recorded and videotaped and this information was relayed to Anderson and her attorney.
- Anderson stated that in December 1998, on a Sunday, she was contacted via telephone by Dylan Klebold who asked her if she would be willing to get them into the gun show at I-25 and 58th Avenue. Anderson stated that she would and Klebold and she Harris came to her house to pick her up and bring her to the gun show. Anderson stated that it appeared from conversation with Harris and Klebold that they had been at the gun show the day before looking around. This would have been Saturday. Anderson further states that Klebold and Harris picked her up at approximately 10:00 am.
 - Anderson stated that Klebold and Harris had been searching the gun show for private dealers so that they would not have to complete any paperwork. According to Anderson, after entering the gun show, Klebold and Harris went directly to a private dealer. The dealer asked Klebold and Harris if they brought someone 18 years old this time. Klebold and Harris stated that they had. Anderson states

that she showed her drivers license to this individual and after reviewing it, handed it back. According to Anderson, Harris or Klebold asks the individual if he has anything shorter then the shotgun they were looking at and the individual tells them they can cut the barrel down. The individual then obtains a tape measure and shows them how far they can cut down the barrel. Anderson explained to S/A Motte that the gun was long and the individual was saying they could cut it down to the first barrel ring. As if to cut it down to the shortest length of not less than 18 inches. Anderson stated that the price of the shotgun was over \$100.00 but less than \$300.00. Anderson stated that Klebold paid for this shotgun from money that he had in his wallet and that this shotgun was for Klebold himself.

- 4. Anderson described this individual as being an older white male, grey-white beard with grey hair, heavy-set. Anderson stated that this individual remained seating the whole time of the transaction. No receipt was given for the shotgun purchase.
- Anderson states that they walked around the gun show for awhile looking for private dealers. They made contact with another private dealer and Eric Harris negotiated for a double-barreled shotgun. According to Anderson, Harris' money was clasped together with a large notebook binder clip and located in Anderson's purse. Anderson does not recall if she paid for the shotgun or if she gave the money to Harris to pay for the shotgun. The dealer did not ask for any identification nor was a receipt produced.
- 6. Anderson describes the individual as somewhat balding with a round face. She could not recall any other features. Anderson further stated that this shotgun was for Eric Harris.
- 7. Anderson stated that the three of them wandered around the gun show somemore and contacted another private dealer. This dealer was selling a black rifle. This individual asked to see identification and after viewing it and checking with a party at the next table for verification, gave it back to Anderson. Anderson stated that the rifle was in a box on the table with two magazine clips. Anderson stated that this purchase was transacted like the previous one with Eric Harris. Anderson had Harris' money on the binder clip and either she paid for the rifle or Harris did. She does not recall. Anderson could not describe this private dealer. Anderson stated that no receipt was produced by this private dealer.
- 8. Anderson further stated that Harris and Klebold bought more ammunition clips and ammunition from another individuals table. Harris also purchased a folding knife at another table.
- Anderson stated that Eric Harris named one of the firearms purchased Arlene.
- 10. Anderson was asked if she knew of any other attempts to purchase firearms by Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold to which she replied the she did not.
- ? Anderson was asked to draw on a diagram the locations of the private dealers and she complied by drawing in S/A Motte's notebook.
- 12. Anderson stated that after the purchases were made, she, Klebold and Harris left the gun show and proceeded to Eric Harris' house. They dropped Harris off with his

shotgun, rifle and merchandise and proceeded to her house. Anderson states that she drove her car to Dylan Klebold's house and Klebold drove his car into the garage. Klebold placed the shotgun under his jacket, grabbed his bag of merchandise and went up to his room. Anderson states that Klebold attempts to place the shotgun in a dresser drawer in his bedroom but it does not fit. He then tries to place it behind the toilet roll dispenser after it is removed but it does not fit. Anderson believes that it is eventually placed in Klebold's closet.

- 13. Anderson states that she recalls the date of the purchase of these firearms as being in December because she and Klebold were planning to study Calculus at his house because the finals for that class was December 16th and 17th with a make-up day of December 18th, 1999. Anderson believes that the date of the purchase would have to be December 13th, 1999.
- 14. Anderson was shown a picture from the newspaper which depicts the 9mm carbine and stated that it is the rifle purchased by Eric Harris.

- Snyder was asked if he used any form of marking system on the firearm boxes he had in inventory. Snyder stated that he would mark the firearm boxes with a circular

- 5. Snyder produced numerous receipt books which contained firearm sales. A receipt of the transaction of the Intratec, TEC-DC9, 9mm pistol, serial number D061505 was located. The firearm was sold to a William Erwin on 2/16/96, who identified himself with Colorado drivers license number R19113. Erwin resides at 160-8 S. California Avenue, Loveland, Colorado. The transaction occurred on receipt number 343663.
- Snyder stated that the last gun show he has attended was approximately 2 to 3 months ago.

SYNOPSIS:

Report of interview with Mr. William Erwin, 4432 Sweetgrass Drive, Loveland, Colorado 80537, on April 29, 1999.

NARRATIVE:

- On April 29, 1999, Mr. Erwin was interviewed at his residence located at 4432 Sweetgrass Drive, Loveland, Colorado, 80537.
- 2. Erwin stated that he had traded the Intratec, TEC-DC9, 9mm pistol, serial number D061505, with the box it came in and all its accessories, for other firearms at Grandpa's Pawn & Gun in Longmont, Colorado.
- 3. Erwin produced a Seller's Bill of Sale for the transaction at Grandpa's Pawn & Gun. The bill of sale showed the transaction date of the trade to have occurred on April 20, 1996 by Erwin and the owner of Grandpa's Pawn & Gun, Mr. John Teeples. Erwin traded the TEC-DC9 for a Colt, model 6601, serial number CMH007508 and a KBI, model PJK-9HP, serial number B62973.
- 4. The Seller's Bill of Sale receipt for the trade of the TEC-DC9 dated 4/20/96, a customer receipt of the purchase of the TEC-DC9 from Larry Snyder dated 2/16/96 and the manual for the TEC-DC9 was obtained as evidence from Erwin.

Report of interview with Mr. John Teeples, owner of Grandpa's Pawn & Gun, 312 Main Street, Longmont, Colorado 80501, on 4/29/1999.

NARRATIVE:

JC-001-008231

- On April 29, 1999, Mr. John Teeples, owner of Grandpa's Pawn & Gun, located at 312 Main Street, Longmont, Colorado, was interviewed at his place of business.
- Teeples was shown the Seller's Bill of Sale provided by Mr. Erwin for the transaction of the Intratec, model TEC-DC9, serial number D061505 and asked to review his records as to the transaction of this firearm and to whom it had been sold.
- Teeples reviewed the information from the bill of sale and queried his computer for the details of the sale. According to Teeples' records, the TEC-9 was obtained in trade from Mr. William Erwin on 4/20/96, with the Intratec box it belonged with. On 4/30/96 the firearm was purchased by DaNae Sue Fortin, 845 South Edinburgh, Loveland, Colorado. Teeples stated that Mrs. Fortin is his daughter, and she had purchased the TEC-9 as an investment. Teeples stated that he sold the TEC-9 with its original box and accessories to his daughter, Mrs. Fortin..
- 4. According to Teeples records, on 10/17/97, Fortin traded the TEC-9 with the original box and accessories back to Grandpa's Pawn & Gun for a 14 carat, yellow gold, 1 carat ring. Teeples stated that when he gets items in his store that are a

good investment, he conveys it to his daughter. Fortin thought the 1 carat ring was a better investment that the TEC-9 and therefore traded the TEC-9 for it.

- 5. According to Teeples' records, the TEC-9 was wholesaled on 10/30/97 to a Federal Firearms Licensee identified as "Just Guns" located at 2967 West 72nd, Westminster, Colorado 80030. Teeples provided a copy of the license for "Just Guns" and indicated that he was familiar with the licensee, Royce Spain and his associate Larry Russell. Teeples stated that he was not sure who came in to pickup the TEC-9 but he does recall that it either had to be Spain and Russell together or Russell by himself. Teeples dies not recall Spain coming into Grandpa's Pawn & Gun by himself.
- 6. Teeples provided a copy of the ATF F 4473, for the transaction of the TEC-9 to his daughter, DaNae Sue Fortin on 4/23/96; a copy of Royce Spain's Federal Firearms License d.b.a. Just Guns; Spain's sales tax license and business card.
- 7. Teeples stated that he had an additional document that he creates and maintains for his records when he deals wholesale in firearms. Teeples provided an ATF F 4473 for the sales transaction of the TEC-9 and 3 other firearms to "Just Guns", Federal Firearms Licensee, Royce Spain. The three other firearms are; Ruger, model P89, 9mm pistol, serial number 310-78803; Thompson Center Contender, .22 caliber long rifle with Bushnell scope, serial number 1662; and a Colt, model SP1, .223 caliber rifle, serial number SP149345. The transactions for all four firearms occurred on 10/30/1997.
- 8. Teeples also assisted in the drawing of the layout of the Tanner Gun Show at the request of S/A Motte.
- 9. Teeples was asked if he had any records pertaining to a Winchester, model 1894, 30-30 caliber rifle, serial number 32631. After reviewing his records, Teeples stated that he had no records pertaining to that firearm.

SYNOPSIS:

Report of interview with Ronnie Lee Choate, via telephone, telephone number (970) 282-8099, on April 29, 1990.

NARRATIVE:

- On April 29, 1999, S/A Motte was paged by Mr. Choate at approximately 8:50 pm. The
 page was returned to telephone number (970) 282-8099, Mr. Choate's residence and
 the ensuing telephonic interview was conducted.
- Choate stated that he had been in Grand Junction, Colorado for the day, returned home and his wife had told him that S/A Motte had stopped by and asked him to call.
- 3. Choate stated that he had not been sleeping very well since the interview with S/A Motte and the realization that the Hi-Point rifle he had purchased and then traded was involved in the Columbine High School murders.
- 2. Choate stated that he still did not recall the date he traded the Hi-Point rifle but did state that in November of 1998, he had been at the Tanner Gun Show located at I-25 and 58th Avenue in Denver, Colorado. Choate stated that he did trade the Hi-Point at the Tanner Gun Show to a man who was approximately 40 to 50 years of age. Choate stated that on the November dates of the Tanner Gun Show, he did rent some display tables and the Tanner Gun Show officials would have those records. Choate stated affirmatively that he had already traded the Hi-point rifle for the Winchester 30-30 rifle prior to the November gun show.

- 5. Choate stated that when he traded the Hi-Point rifle for the Winchester rifle, he went to the Tanner Gun Show exclusively to trade it and remembers that he did not have a table rented on this day.
- 6. Choate stated that in September 1998, he went antelope hunting in Gillette, Wyoming and took employee's from his work. Choate further stated that in October 1998, he went elk hunting in western Colorado in area 421. Choate added that the trade of the Hi-Point for the Winchester had to have occurred in late September or early October 1998.
- 7. Choate stated that at the November, Tanner Gun Show, on the dates he rented a number of tables, he was accompanied by a friend of his, Don Bingham. Choate further stated that Mr. Bingham is a contractor in Grand Junction, Colorado who owns Bingham Painting and provided his telaphone number of (970) 243-7777.
- 8. Choate was asked by S/A Motte to research the dates he went hunting so that a date for the Hi-Point trade transaction could be pinpointed.

SYNOPSIS:

Report of interview with Mark Manes, DOB 3/25/77, 6002 W. Alder Avenue, Littleton, Colorado 80128, on 4/30/1999.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. On.April 30, 1999, at approximately 10:25 a.m., Mr. Manes was interviewed at the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco & Firearms office located at 1961 Stout Street, Suite 630, Denver, Colorado 80202, by Special Agent Marcus C. Motte. Present at the interview was Mr. Robert Ransome, attorney for Mr. Manes, Special Agent Larry Krisl, Jefferson County Investigator Kate Bantam and Jefferson County Assistant District Attorney Brian Boatwright.
- 2. Manes stated that he had purchased the Intratec, model TEC-DC9, 9mm pistol, serial number D076305, from the Tanner Gun Show located at I-25 and 58th Avenue in Denver, Colorado, also known as the Merchandise Mart. Manes stated that the purchase occurred in the summer/fall of 1998, from a private dealer he identifies as Eagle Enterprise.
- Manes produced a USBank statement for the period of July 23, 1998 through August 24, 1998, which showed the monetary transaction amount of \$491.00 on August 5, 1998. In a separate column of the purchase line a date of August 2, 1998 was reflected and which lists Westminster, Colorado. In the first column, the statement reflects the purchase as being from Eagle Enterprise. Manes stated that he could not find the actual receipt he signed at the gun show when he purchased the TEC-9 with his debit card, but indicated that he would continue to search for it.

- 4. Manes stated that he recalls purchasing the TEC-9 on Saturday, August 2, 1998 and at the time of the purchase he was accompanied by his friend Brian Distel and Distal's older brother or step-brother. Manes does not recall the name of Distal's older brother/step-brother. Manes stated that both individuals were present at the purchase of the TEC-9. Manes stated that he purchased the TEC-9 for \$491.00.
- 5. Manes described the individual that he purchased the TEC-9 from as being in his late 60's, short grey hair and could not recall if this individual had any facial hair. Manes stated that he could identify this individual if he saw him again. Manes stated that this individual had one table at the gun show and had 3 or 4 TEC-9's on display. Manes does not recall any other individual at this individual's table. Manes stated that he also purchased from this same individual a barrel extender tube for the TEC-9 and a 30 round magazine clip. These purchases were conducted with Manes' USBank debit card of which he has had for approximately 1 % years.
- 6. Manes stated that Brian Distal drove his car to the gun show that the three of them attended. Manes states that he has known Distal for approximately 5 years. Manes was asked if he purchased any ammunition from the gun show and he stated that he did not, but Brian Distal did from Gart Brothers sports store at Wadsworth and Bowles.
- 7. Manes was asked if there was anything else about the gun show purchase of the TEC-9 that he remembers. Manes stated that the plastic case that the TEC-9 came in had a different serial number than the actual firearm did. Manes states that this black plastic gun case with Intratec on it had a white/blue sticker label with the wrong serial number on it. Also on the plastic gun case was a blue sticker approximately one quarter inch round, the size of a paper punch, with no writing on it. Manes stated that on the receipt provided by Eagle Enterprise, the correct serial number pertaining to the TEC-9, serial number D076305 was written.
- Manes stated that the last time he had spoken with Brian Distal was a couple of nights after the Columbine High School incident.
- Manes was asked for additional information about the Tanner Gun Show and provided that the admission fee to enter was \$5.00. This was the first gun show he had attended and Brian Distal who collects guns and hunts, asked him if he wanted to go along with him and his brother. Manes agrees to go. Manes stated that the price of firearms at gun shows is cheaper than retail stores. Manes stated that at the table where he bought the TEC-9, the individual had displayed 3 or 4 TEC-9's, 2 MAC-11's and approximately 5 or 6 handguns.
- Manes stated that the dealer did not make much eye contact with him at the time of the purchase and further described him as having a wrinkled face, 5'8" to 5'9" tall and heavy set. This individual was wearing a gold ring on his right hand and wearing a white button up type shirt. Manes indicated that the time of purchase was approximately 2:00 p.m. Manes added that the TEC-9 also had a 12 round magazine clip in the box.
- 11. Manes stated that after the gun show, they dropped Distal's brother off at his

house near Colfax Avenue and Sheridan. Manes stated that they were thinking about going shooting and decided not to.

- 12. Manes remembered that he spent over \$300.00 for the TEC-9, \$60.00 for the barrel extender and \$45.00 for the 30 round magazine.
- 13. Manes initially indicated that they had gone shooting the next day but after reviewing the bank statement date realized that the date he attended the gun show must have been Sunday, August 2, 1998 and therefore decided that they had not in fact gone shooting the next day. Manes stated that they must have gone shooting that same day.
- Manes stated that they went shooting around Rampart and indicates that it is down Foxton Road to 67, to Platte River Road and eventually to Sugar Creek Road. Manes stated that they went up a small valley and shot the TEC-9 and Brian Distal, he believes, shot his Desert Eagle. Manes stated that he shot all of his ammunition except for ten rounds and Brian shot all of his ammunition.
- 15. Manes was asked what types of firearms dies he have and he stated that he has a Ruger, .45 caliber pistol and a Ruger, mini-30.
- Names was asked who his shooting partners are and he stated that Phil Duran, Brian Distel, Greg Marcilliott are his shooting partners. Manes stated that his girlfriend, Jessie Miklich was present when they went shooting of three occasions.
- 17. Manes stated that he has gone shooting 3 times with Eric Harris and 2 times of those three times, Dylan Klebold were present.
- 18. Manes produced a receipt for January 23, 1999. Manes stated that this receipt was for the purchase of the Ruger, .45 caliber pistol that he bought at the Tanner Gun Show on this date. Manes states that Phil Duran, Phil's dad are at the gun show. Manes believes Phil's brother is also present but is not sure. Duran had told Manes earlier that two guys from his work might be showing up at the gun show and are interested in his TEC-9. Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold show up at the gun show and are introduced to Manes. Duran states to Manes that Eric Harris is interested in buying the TEC-9. While walking around the gun show, Harris and Klebold ask Manes about the TEC-9, so Manes shows Harris and Klebold the TEC-9's he sees around the gun show and points out the one he has and its accessories. Harris and Klebold ask Manes how much he wants for the TEC-9 and Manes tells them \$500.00. Harris and Klebold agree. Manes states that Harris had to go to work and so does Duran so it is agreed that Duran will give Klebold Manes' cellular telephone number, and Klebold will call Manes later that evening.
- Manes stated that prior to everyone leaving, Harris and Klebold purchased ammunition at the table next to where Manes had purchased his Ruger, .45 caliber pistol. Manes states that he was informed by Klebold and Harris that they got a good price for ammunition and Manes also buys some ammunition from this table. Manes stated that he was requested from the person at the table to show identification and states that he doesn't know if Harris or Klebold were asked for identification.

- 20. After leaving the guns show, Manes is dropped off at his residence located at 6002 W. Alder Avenue, Littleton, Colorado. Manes stated that Duran had to be at work at 5:00 p.m. Manes stated that Harris and Klebold were both cooks at Blackjack Pizza located at S. Pierce and Ottawa and that Klebold, Harris and Duran all worked together.
- Manes states that at approximately 6:00 to 6:30 p.m. he is called by Klebold on his 21. cellular phone. Klebold asks if they are going to go ahead with the sale and Manes says yes and gives directions to his residence. Manes states that Klebold comes over, rings the bell and Manes lets him in and they go to Manes' bedroom. Klebold views the TEC-9 and Manes states that he shows Klebold how to operate the firearm, work the safety and clean it. Manes states that there was no manual with the TEC-9. Manes asks Klebold if he wants it and Klebold states that he does. Manes stated that since he wanted the firearm now, Klebold would have to pay \$300.00 down now and the balance of \$200.00 in two weeks. Klebold agrees to this and pays Manes the \$300.00. Manes states that no receipt was given at this time but had told Klebold that he would give him a receipt when the TEC-9 was paid in full. Manes stated that Brian Distal and Greg Marcilliott show up at his house with some beer and he invites them into his bedroom. Manes introduces Distal and Marcilliott to Klebold and all four have a beer together. After the beer Klebold decides to leave. Manes walks him to the door and does not see what Klebold is driving. Manes states that he tells Distal and Marcilliott that he has sold the TEC-9 to Klebold for \$500.00 and that \$200.00 is still owed. Prior to leaving, Klebold tells Manes that he would call him on Manes' cellular phone when he had the \$200.00.
- Manes states that two weeks later, he and Duran went shooting at Rampart with Harris and Klebold. Manes states that this is the first time they go shooting with Harris and Klebold. Harris and Klebold had the TEC-9 and possibly the Hi-Point, 9mm rifle. Manes states that he forgot to ask for the \$200.00 owed by Klebold and later that evening he calls Duran and asks him if he can get the \$200.00 from Harris and Klebold. Manes states that a couple of days later, Duran gives him the \$200.00 he is owed from Klebold and Harris at Duran's house.
- Manes states that the second time he goes shooting, Harris comes up but Klebold has to work. Manes states that Harris has the TEC-9 he sold them and the Hi-Point, 9mm rifle. Manes stated that this second time shooting was one week after the first time they went shooting together with Klebold and Harris. Manes further stated that Phil Applegate was present, Brian Distal was present and had brought along two AR-15 rifles. Duran was present but did not have any firearms and also present was Manes' girlfriend Jessie. Manes stated that they were shooting at orange dots which they had bought at the Giddy-up Mart on Highway 67. Manes stated that how they organized to go shooting was that everyone would meet at Manes' house and they would drive up to Rampart. Some of the shooters would meet on location at Rampart. Manes further stated that they would coordinate to go shooting over the phone and that this process was a common one wince they went shooting almost every weekend.
- Manes states that the third time they went shooting with Harris and Klebold was when the video tape was made. Manes stated that on March 6, 1999, Duran and Manes decided to go shooting up at Rampart. Manes brought his Ruger, .45 caliber pistol and Ruger, mini 30 rifle. Manes stated that Duran did not own any firearms but his

dad did, so he did not have any firearms with him. Manes states that they were joined later by Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and had brought along the TEC-9. Sometime during the target shooting, Harris and Klebold brought out two sawed-off shotguns. Manes described the shotguns as having the barrels and stocks cut off and that one of the shotguns was a pump action and the other a double-barrel. Manes stated that he shot the pump shotgun and told Harris and Klebold that they had better hide the shotguns in case anybody comes by. Manes stated that the video equipment used belonged to Columbine High School and was brought up by Harris and Klebold. Manes further stated that Duran was doing the filming and so did he. Manes states that the Hi-Point rifle was brought up on this day and he asked Harris where he had obtained it. Harris stated that he got it from his cousin. Manes asked Harris and Klebold where they got the shotguns and they replied, "We got 'em". Manes states that he presumed they had stolen them. Manes concluded that they used trees and bowling pins for targets on this shooting day.

- 25. Manes recalls that Klebold or Harris asks if Brian Distal wants to sell his SKS rifle. Duran and Manes ask Distal if he is interested in selling the SKS rifle to Harris and Klebold and Distal states he does not know if he wants to sell it.
- Manes asked if he has any information regarding any ammunition purchased by Klebold and Harris. Manes states, "The night before the 'Columbine Massacre', Thursday, before the 20th of April," Harris called Manes' house from his house and asked Manes to purchase some ammunition for his 9mm. Manes stated that he would and would call him back that evening. Manes forgets about the ammunition purchase and Harris calls back on Monday, April 19th. Manes forgets again and at approximately 8:00 p.m. he is called by Harris. Manes feel bad he has not purchased it for him and decides to go immediately to purchase the 9mm ammunition. Manes states that Harris wanted 2 boxes of 9mm ammunition. Manes goes to K-Mart near his house and purchases 2 boxes of 9mm ammunition for Harris and 1 box of .45 caliber ammunition for himself. Manes states that he pays with his debit card and on the way home he calls Harris to meet him at Manes' house to pickup the ammunition. Manes states that he waited in the driveway of his residence until Harris shows up. Harris pays Manes \$25.00 for the 2 boxes of ammunition and they talk. Harris talks about the Marines and they discuss this for awhile. Manes asks Harris if he was going shooting tonight and Harris says maybe tomorrow.
- 27. Manes was asked how old does he think you have to be to buy ammunition? Manes stated that he thought you had to be 21 years old. Manes was asked why would Klebold or Harris contact him to buy ammunition. Manes replied that you had to be 21 years old to buy ammunition. Manes was informed that you had to be 13. Manes stated that he believed that Klebold and Harris were 18 years old and seniors in high school. Manes was informed that Duran had told him that Klebold and Harris were both 17 years old. Manes stated that after the Columbine High School shooting, was when Duran told him that Klebold and Harris were 17. After some discussion, Manes admitted that he assumed that Harris and Klebold were both 17 years old based on them not being able to purchase firearms and ammunition.
- Manes was shown the receipt from a K-Mart store located in Littleton, Colorado which reflected the sale of ammunition on 4/19/1999. Manes admitted that the purchase of ammunition reflected on the receipt shown to him was his purchase of the 9mm and .45 caliber ammunition that he bought for Harris and himself.

Manes also stated that Matt Jackson and Greg Marcilliott stopped by his house a few days after the Columbine High School shooting and they talked about concerns that Manes had that he had sold the TEC-9 and ammunition to Harris and Klebold.
- 30. Manes was asked if he had any E-mail addresses and he stated that he did. Manes stated that he had a computer at home, one at work and his parents had a computer too. Manes stated that his E-mail address at home is shub@denverlink.com and the E-mail address at work is <a href="mailto:m
- 31. The USBank statement, a receipt dated January 23, 1999 and a business card were retained as evidence. Interview completed at approximately 1:30 p.m.

Report of Interview

SYNOPSIS:

Report of interview with Ron Hartmann and Jim Washington, at the Federal Bureau of Investigation office located in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on April 30, 1999.

MARRATIVE:

- On April 30, 1999, Mr. Ron Hartmann and Mr. Jim Washington were interviewed at the FBI office in Colorado Springs.
- 2. Hartman and Washington state that Stevens, model 311D, 12 gauge, double-barrel shotgun by Savage, serial number A077513 was sold to an 18 year old female on November 22, 1998. This 18 year old female had just turned 18 a few weeks prior and her age was confirmed by her Colorado driver's license. According to FBI Special Agent Keith Howland, Hartmann and Washington were 100% sure the female was Robyn Anderson and the young man who accompanied her, they are 80% sure it was Dylan Klebold.
- 3. The sale of the shotgun was conducted by Anderson who paid for the firearm in cash which she produced. No receipt was given and when the shotgun was handed to Anderson, Klebold took the firearm himself.
- 4. An FBI 302, Report of Interview is attached with a full narrative of the events surrounding this firearm transaction.

On 04/30/1999, James Royce Washington (PROTECT IDENTITY), also known as Jim Washington, 6020 Snowbird Drive, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80918, a white male born 12/21/1947, Social Security Account Number 237-70-9180, voluntarily appeared at the Colorado Springs Resident Agency. Washington was accompanied by Ron F. Hartmann, also of Colorado Springs. Also present during a portion of this interview was Supervisory Senior Resident Agent Gregory B. Groves. After being advised of the nature of this interview and the identity of the interviewing agent, Washington provided the following information:

Washington is employed as a Senior Investigative and Security Specialist with the Defense Security Service (DSS), 1935 Jamboree, Suite 170, Colorado Springs. Washington has been with the DSS for 17 years and has a total of 26 years of service with the United States Government.

Washington advised that he is an avid gun collector and often goes to gun shows to sell, trade or purchase guns and supplies. Sometimes he will take his daughter along with him to shows.

In late October 1997, Washington met Ron Hartmann because they lived near one another and Hartmann had brought Washington his guns from a show in Pueblo, Colorado, which had to be canceled due to the blizzard in Colorado at that time. Since both of them shared an interest in gun collecting and frequented the same shows, they agreed to start going to shows together and sharing the expenses of obtaining a booth or table. In addition, one man could watch the table and their inventory, while the other one walked around the show to see what was available.

On the weekend of 11/21-22/1998, Washington and Hartmann went to the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in Commerce City, Colorado and set up two tables together. On Sunday 11/22/1999, Washington did not have his daughter with him; it was just he and Hartmann at their tables.

On Sunday afternoon (11/22/1999), Washington was sitting in a chair facing to his right, looking at Hartmann. Washington guessed that it was sometime after lunch. Hartmann

was talking to someone across the table from him when a young female and a young male approached their tables and began talking to Hartmann. Washington stated that Hartmann was standing and he recalled Hartmann asked the female for her license and saw the girl give it to him. Washington could not see the male clearly due to the vertical gun rack on the tables, which blocked his view of the male. He saw the female clearly. He stated that he even looked up when he heard Ron say something like "You don't look 18".

Washington advised that since the shootings at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colorado, he now believes this female to be Robyn Anderson. He described her as having shorter hair than she has now, as determined by her photographs on the television and in the newspapers. Anderson was wearing jeans and a light colored top. She had a shoulder bag, possibly of denim material, which had a flap but no snaps.

Washington stated that after the shotgun was sold, Ron Hartmann handed the gun to Anderson, but the male took it. He heard Hartmann say something to the effect of "it's nice of you to carry it" to the male. As the couple walked away, Hartmann turned to Washington and said "That girl just turned 18." Washington stated that he had no recollection of the male because his view was blocked by the gun rack and there were several people around the table at this time, some of whom were asking Washington questions. Neither Washington nor Hartmann could identify anyone around their tables who could provide any additional assistance.

Following the initial news reports about the shootings and the weapons involved, Washington did not think anything about this particular show and their sales of guns at the Tanner Gun Show. He wondered who had sold the weapons which were used in the shootings. After Robyn Anderson was identified and her picture appeared on the news, Washington immediately recognized her as the female who had purchased the shotgun from Hartmann. He telephonically contacted Hartmann and told him of this fact, but Hartmann did not believe Washington at first, because the news reports did not mention that Anderson had purchased the shotgun.

Washington stated that he wished to cooperate fully with this investigation. Washington does have concerns for his personal safety due to the numerous leaks of information to the media about the progress of the investigation. He feels that Hartmann legally sold a shotgun to an 18 year old individual and did nothing illegal and cannot be blamed for what happened at Columbine High School. Washington fears that if his identity got out, people would attack him or his family and vandalize his home out of vengeance for what happened. He does not believe people would act rationally toward either him or Hartmann if their identities were divulged.

Washington could provide no additional information at this time and the interview was terminated at this point.

On 04/30/1999, Ronald Frank Hartmann (PROTECT IDENTITY), also known as Ron Hartmann, 3835 Blazingwood Way, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80918, a white male born 08/08/1939, Social Security Account Number 150-30-9559, voluntarily appeared at the Colorado Springs Resident Agency. Hartmann was accompanied by James R. Washington, also of Colorado Springs. Also present during a portion of this interview was Supervisory Senior Resident Agent Gregory B. Groves. After being advised of the nature of this interview and the identity of the interviewing agent, Hartmann provided the following information:

Hartmann served 20 years in the Armed Forces, with his time split between the United States Navy (1957 - 1961) and the United States Air Force (USAF) (1961 - 1977). Upon retirement from the USAF, he became a civilian employee of the United States Government, first at Fort Carson in Colorado Springs and then with the Defense Logistics Agency in Ogden, Utah. Due to downsizing on the part of the United States Government, when the program he was assigned to in Utah was shut down, he retired from the Government and is currently unemployed.

Hartmann advised that he is an avid gun collector and has been for most of his adult life. Hartmann enjoys going to gun shows because it is usually a good gathering place for serious collectors and he has gotten to know many individuals over the years. Sometimes he goes to these shows to look around and see if there is anything he wishes to buy or trade for and sometimes he goes and sets up a table or booth and sells some of his guns and associated supplies; such as knives and reloading supplies.

Hartmann described the shows in the Fall and Spring as being the best ones to go to in order to buy, sell or trade items. Two to four times per year, Hartmann will set up a booth or table and sell items. In addition to this, he estimated that he attends about six to seven shows a year when he is not selling. Mostly he sets up a table or booth at the Sertoma Gun Show in Colorado Springs and a few shows, including the Tanner Gun Shows at the Merchandise Mart, in the Denver area.

In the Fall of 1997, around the time of the blizzard, both Hartmann and Jim Washington, had set up individual tables at a gun show in Pueblo, Colorado. Hartmann was staying in Pueblo and Washington had come down and set up his table on Friday and had returned to Colorado Springs. Due to the blizzard, Washington could not return to Pueblo and the show was canceled due to the conditions. Many dealers had displays set up but could not come and retrieve their guns for some time. Hartmann told the coordinator of the show that he would take Washington's guns back to Colorado Springs with him and return them to Washington, as long as someone else inventoried them before Hartmann left. This was done and Hartmann met Washington for the first time when he returned Washington's guns to him. Due to their mutual interests in guns and in going to these gun shows, they decided to begin going to the shows together, rather than separately.

During the weekend of 11/21-22/1998, Hartmann and Washington went to the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in Commerce City, Colorado. They set up two tables side-byside at this show. At each end of the tables, there was a horizontal qun rack containing a few quality guns with a sign saying "Do Not Touch", which either Washington or Hartmann would pick up and display to a potential buyer. At the very center of the table, straddling the two, was a vertical rack containing older guns, which Hartmann called "beaters", which the public could handle if they chose to do so. Hartmann advised that at this show, they had approximately 12 to 15 guns for sale in addition to knives, scopes and reloading supplies and equipment.

Hartmann advised that on Saturday (11/21/1998), there were a lot of people at their tables, but they did not sell much inventory. On Sunday (11/22/1998), there were a lot of people milling around; more than normally observed on a Sunday according to Hartmann.

Hartmann advised that if you were standing in front of their tables looking at them, Washington was on the right side, sitting on a chair facing to his right and Hartmann was standing on the left side.

Hartmann believes it was Sunday afternoon, sometime after lunch, when a young female came up to their tables

accompanied by a young male. The female stood facing Hartmann and the male stood with one arm resting on the vertical gun rack in the center of the tables. The female said to Hartmann, "I would like to buy that shotgun." Hartmann said "This one here, the double barrel?" She replied "Yes." He asked "How old are you?" and she replied "18". He stated that she was very young looking and so he asked her for some identification "Can I see your driver's license?" Without any hesitation, she reached into her wallet produced a Colorado Drivers License for Hartmann to see. Upon inspection, Hartmann determined that she was in fact 18 years old, just having passed her birthday a few weeks before the show.

Hartmann stated that the price tag on the shotgun said \$245.00 and he told her the price. The female pulled out a wallet from her bag and counted out the money. Hartmann stated that as best as he could recall it was mostly \$20 bills and there were no large bills in the total. She handed him the cash and he counted it out. Once he was satisfied that she had paid the correct amount, Hartmann reached for the shotgun and removed it from the rack and handed it to her. At this point, the male accompanying her, reached over and took the shotgun from Hartmann's hands. Hartmann said he made a statement to the effect of "Are you going to be a gentleman and carry it for her?" and the male replied "Yes."

Hartmann described both the male and female as being nice looking kids and had no reason to question them. He described the male as being about 5'11" tall, since he is 5'10", and the female as being about 5'6" or so. The male was taller than the female. The male was wearing a dark, short-sleeve shirt. Hartmann could not recall what the female was wearing at the time. He just recalled that both were clean-cut. Hartmann went on to say that the female had blond hair, not real long and she a round face and was of medium build; not skinny, not fat. He also described the female as being timid in her demeanor. was Hartmann's impression that she was nervous because she did not ask any questions about the gun. Hartmann put this down to the fact that she had never purchased a gun before.

After their transaction was completed, the couple left Hartmann's tables and walked away. Hartmann turned towards Washington and remarked "That girl just turned 18."

Hartmann advised that he did not initially think about this incident following the tragedy at Columbine High School until Washington called him on the telephone to remind him of the girl. After the media coverage of the shooting and his discussions with Washington, Hartmann now believes that the female who purchased the shotgun from him at the 11/22/1998 Tanner Gun Show was Robyn Anderson. He is 100% sure of this. He is also 80% sure that her male companion was Dylan Klebold. Hartmann also advised that he has an image in his mind that while he was conducting the transaction with Anderson and Klebold, across the aisle from his tables was a young male holding a pump shotgun, who appeared to be waiting for them. Hartmann could not identify this male.

Hartman stated that the shotgun Anderson purchased from him was a Stevens Model 311D, 12-gauge double barreled shotgun, serial number A077513, with a 28" barrel and the choke was full and modified. Hartmann also advised that the shotgun was mechanically in good condition, had a walnut stock, the finish was good and that the bluing on the barrel was very streaky, as if the original bluing had worm off and someone had tried to reblue it. Hartmann was able to determine this from some old records he keeps for insurance purposes.

Hartmann stated that there was no paperwork produced for this sale and no receipt was given or asked for. Hartmann advised that he had personally purchased this gun sometime before this show, but he could not determine exactly when and where he had done so.

Hartmann stated that he keeps a record of the manufacturer, the model numbers and the serial numbers of all of the guns he has for insurance purposes and is constantly updating these records as he buys and sells guns. When he updates his records, he discards the old records.

Hartmann advised that once they left his stand, he did not observe them again. He and Washington did gun shows the following weekend in Colorado Springs (Sertoma); in about February 1999 in Colorado Springs and the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in March 1999. At none of these subsequent gun shows did Hartmann observe either Anderson or Klebold.



Hartmann stated that while he is reluctant to be providing this information, he felt an obligation to do so. He wanted it clearly understood that he was coming forward as soon as practical after he became aware of the situation that the shotgun which he sold in November 1998, was sold to Robyn Anderson accompanied by Dylan Klebold. He expressed concerns for his personal safety due to all of the leaks of information being made to the media. Hartmann stated that he made a legal sale of the shotgun to an individual, 18 years of age or older, and had broken no laws. Hartmann is afraid that if his identity is somehow released to the media, he will become a target for vengeance and will be viewed as responsible for the tragedy at Columbine High School.

Hartmann turned over to the interviewer a hand-drawn diagram which he had used while describing the layout of his booth and the positions of all parties at the time of the sale of the shotgun. In addition, he advised that the table behind theirs was occupied by the Golden Gun Club and when you faced outward, to their left were three tables full of ammunition being sold by some people from Pocatello, Idaho.

Hartmann had no additional information and at that point the interview was terminated. He did advise that if he recalled any additional information, he would contact that the interviewing agent.

SYNOPSIS:

Report of interview with Phil Duran, DOB 11/28/76, on May 10, 1999.

NARRATIVE:

- On May 10, 1999, Phil Duran was re-interviewed at the Denver ATF office located at 1961 Stout Street, Denver, Colorado. Present at this interview were Phil Duran and his attorney Matt DePetro, ATF S/A's Marcus Motte and Larry Krisl and Mark Pautler of the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office.
- Duran was asked about his relationship with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and stated that Harris worked as a cook at Blackjack Pizza and had been prior to Duran working there. Klebold was also a cook and had been hired there approximately 7 months ago. Duran stated that he had been hired a Blackjack Pizza in January or February of 1998 and had worked there as a driver, cook and manager.
- 3. Duran stated that he had been approached by Klebold and Harris to purchase them guns on 2 or 3 occasions. Duran stated that he told them he would not purchase guns for them because he did not want his name on any paperwork for their purchase. Duran stated that he had been approached by Harris and Klebold on 1 occasion to purchase ammunition but had not purchased any for them.
- Duran stated that he believed that Harris and Klebold were 17 or 18 years old.

 Duran stated that he did not ask them how old they were but stated that you had to be 18 years old to be a driver at Blackjack Pizza. When asked by Special Agent Motte if Duran assumed that Harris and Klebold were 17 years old, Duran stated "Yes". Duran stated that he felt that the reason Harris and Klebold asked him to

purchase firearms was because he was 21 years old. Duran also stated that nobody has asked him to purchase guns for them besides Harris and Klebold.

- 5. Duran stated that he told Harris and Klebold that he had a friend who may want to sell his TEC-9 and gave Mark Manes' home phone number. Duran stated that he told Manes that Harris and Klebold would be calling him to purchase the TEC-9. Duran stated that the time period of this conversation and the giving out of Manes' home telephone number had occurred around the end of February or the beginning of March. Duran further stated that approximately 1 to 2 weeks later, Harris and Klebold gave him \$125.00 to give to Manes for the balance of money owed on the TEC-9. Duran states that he gave the money to Manes who thanked him.
- 6. Duran stated that he has known Mark Manes for approximately 7 years. They attended Columbine High School and Colorado's Finest Alternative High School together. Duran stated that the last time he spoke with Manes was on Saturday, May 8th, 1999 Duran stated that they did not talk about the shooting, just about how each was doing.
- 7. Duran stated that Manes purchased the TEC-9 approximately 6 months to 1 year ago at the gun show. Duran states that it was in the summer or fall of 1998. Duran stated that he attended a qun show with Manes in December 1998 or January or February 1999. Duran recalls that his father was also present. Duran stated that he had told Harris and Klebold that he and Manes would be going to the gun show and Harris and Klebold stated that they would meet there. Duran states that Harris and Klebold walked around the gun show with Manes and himself and Manes pointed out the TEC-9's that were displayed at the various tables and explained to Harris and Klebold what his TEC-9 was like. Duran stated that Manes bought his .45 caliber handgun at this gun show and believes that Harris or bought a knife from a dealer that sold knives and swords. Duran stated that it looked like Harris and Klebold had bought other items from the bag they carried but he is not sure. Duran stated that Manes bought a 20 to 30 round ammunition clip for the TEC-9 at this gun show. Duran stated that Manes filled out the appropriate paperwork for the purchase of the .45 handoun and they had to wait approximately 1 % hours for the transaction to be completed.
- Duran was asked about target shooting up at Rampart Range and stated that he had Я. been shooting 3 times at Rampart with Harris and Klebold. Duran stated that the first time they went shooting was around the end of February. Harris and Klebold brought up the HiPoint rifle and the TEC-9. Duran stated that on the 2nd target shooting day occurred around the beginning of March, Harris and Klebold brought up the same two weapons, HiPoint rifle and TEC-9. Duran stated that all the shooters would meet at Manes' house and carpool up to the target shooting sight. Duran states that Harris and Klebold stated on the evening before at Blackjack Pizza or on the morning that they were going to go shoot at Rampart for the third time, that they had a surprise to show when they arrived at Rampart. Duran recalls the date to be around the middle of March. Duran stated that the surprise turned out to be two sawed off shotguns which Harris and Klebold produced from a black duffle bag. One was a pump action shotgun and the other a double barrel break-open shotgun. Both shotguns had the barrels and the stocks cut down. Duran stated that Harris predominantly shot the pump shotgun and Klebold shot the double barrel shotgun. Both Harris and Klebold had cuts on the webbing of their hands from the recoil of

the shotguns. Duran stated that Klebold had the worst cut since it was constantly bleeding. Duran stated that Harris and Klebold both shot the TEC-9 and Harris mostly shot the HiPoint rifle. Duran stated that Harris stated that the HiPoint belonged to his uncle or cousin. Duran said he asked Harris and Klebold where they got the shotguns and they would not tell him. Duran assumed they got them from his father or were possible stolen. Duran further stated that he believes he drove Harris and Klebold up in his car to Rampart. He further states that he believes that he transported Harris and Klebold's firearms in his car at least once. Duran further stated that they always went shooting on Saturday's at the Rampart location. Also brought up to the Rampart location was the TEC-9 and the HiPoint rifle. According to Duran, the individuals that were present on all three shooting events were Harris, Klebold, Jessica (Manes' girlfriend) and himself. Duran stated that he never brought up any firearms because he did not own any.

- 9. Duran states that on the third time they went shooting, Harris and Klebold brought up a video camera and filmed them shooting at the Rampart Location. Duran stated that he did most of the filming but that Manes did some filming too. Duran stated that Manes asked for a copy of the video tape from Harris and Klebold and a copy was provided to Duran who watched it and gave it to Manes. Duran stated that on one occasion when Harris was shooting a 12 gauge slug into a tree he stated. "I wonder what that would do to a person". Duran stated that they would shoot at orange target stickers that they acquired at the Giddyup & Go store that is located approximately 5 miles prior to the entrance to Rampart. Duran stated that the directions to the store were southbound on Highway 85 to the Sedalia turn off sign. Take a right and the road would take you to the store and further up the road would be Rampart entrance. Duran stated that Harris and Klebold would bring bowling pins from their bowling class to use as targets.
- 10. Duran was asked when the was the last time he saw Harris or Klebold and he stated that he saw Klebold picking up his paycheck at Blackjack Pizza approximately April 9, 1999 or sooner.
- Duran stated that he heard from his girlfriend Cristina Applegate, that Mark Manes had come over to their house either the day of or the day after the Columbine shooting event and was visibly distraught over the incident. This was due to Manes' involvement with Harris and Klebold and the TEC-9 sale. Duran further stated that he knew that Manes had purchased 9mm ammunition for Harris and Klebold the day before the Columbine shooting.
- 12. Duran stated that Chris Morris is a close friend of Harris and Klebold and they always "hung out" together.
- Duran was asked if he had any computers and he replied that there are two computers at his house but they belong to his roommates Brian and Angel Pytlinski. Duran stated that he has a new laptop but obtained it approximately one month ago. Duran gave his permission for any computer searches. Duran stated that Angel Pytlinski also worked at Blackjack Pizza as a driver and Brian Pytlinski works for either BPI or BPS at Colorado computer company.
- 14. Duran concluded that he had overheard one day while at work at Blackjack Pizza, Harris stating that Klebold or Harris had "made up" with Brooks.

This is to inform you of the status of the Columbine Shooting investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco & Firearms in relation to the firearm portion of the investigation.

To date, a search of the Bureau of A.T.F. Federal Firearms Licensee's database is being conducted and compared to the Tanner Gun Show list for the dates that the three (3) long guns were purchased by Anderson for Harris and Klebold. Once this list has been generated, the current or past FFL's names that match the Tanner Gun Show list will be contacted via interview by inspectors of our agency. These inspectors have been given a list of questions to ask these present or past FFL's and requested to review their bound books, if applicable. This search of information is to determine if Anderson is subject to a federal felony if an ATF Form 4473 (yellow form) was completed or if an FFL is subject to a federal felony if the firearm transactions were conducted "off paper". There is also the possibility that the three (3) transactions were conducted by a private party's and if this is the case, no one is subject to any criminal penalties. I will keep you informed as this portion of the investigation continues.

On 04/30/1999, Ronald Frank Hartmann (PROTECT IDENTITY), also known as Ron Hartmann, 3835 Blazingwood Way, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80918, a white male born 08/08/1939, Social Security Account Number 150-30-9559, voluntarily appeared at the Colorado Springs Resident Agency. Hartmann was accompanied by James R. Washington, also of Colorado Springs. Also present during a portion of this interview was Supervisory Senior Resident Agent Gregory B. Groves. After being advised of the nature of this interview and the identity of the interviewing agent, Hartmann provided the following information:

Hartmann served 20 years in the Armed Forces, with his time split between the United States Navy (1957 - 1961) and the United States Air Force (USAF) (1961 - 1977). Upon retirement from the USAF, he became a civilian employee of the United States Government, first at Fort Carson in Colorado Springs and then with the Defense Logistics Agency in Ogden, Utah. Due to downsizing on the part of the United States Government, when the program he was assigned to in Utah was shut down, he retired from the Government and is currently unemployed.

Hartmann advised that he is an avid gun collector and has been for most of his adult life. Hartmann enjoys going to gun shows because it is usually a good gathering place for serious collectors and he has gotten to know many individuals over the years. Sometimes he goes to these shows to look around and see if there is anything he wishes to buy or trade for and sometimes he goes and sets up a table or booth and sells some of his guns and associated supplies; such as knives and reloading supplies.

Hartmann described the shows in the Fall and Spring as being the best ones to go to in order to buy, sell or trade items. Two to four times per year, Hartmann will set up a booth or table and sell items. In addition to this, he estimated that he attends about six to seven shows a year when he is not selling. Mostly he sets up a table or booth at the Sertoma Gun Show in Colorado Springs and a few shows, including the Tanner Gun Shows at the Merchandise Mart, in the Denver area.

In the Fall of 1997, around the time of the blizzard, both Hartmann and Jim Washington, had set up individual tables at a gun show in Pueblo, Colorado. Hartmann was staying in Pueblo and Washington had come down and set up his table on Friday and had returned to Colorado Springs. Due to the blizzard, Washington could not return to Pueblo and the show was canceled due to the conditions. Many dealers had displays set up but could not come and retrieve their guns for some time. Hartmann told the coordinator of the show that he would take Washington's guns back to Colorado Springs with him and return them to Washington, as long as someone else inventoried them before Hartmann left. This was done and Hartmann met Washington for the first time when he returned Washington's guns to him. Due to their mutual interests in guns and in going to these gun shows, they decided to begin going to the shows together, rather than separately.

During the weekend of 11/21-22/1998, Hartmann and Washington went to the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in Commerce City, Colorado. They set up two tables side-byside at this show. At each end of the tables, there was a horizontal gun rack containing a few quality guns with a sign saying "Do Not Touch", which either Washington or Hartmann would pick up and display to a potential buyer. At the very center of the table, straddling the two, was a vertical rack containing older guns, which Hartmann called "beaters", which the public could handle if they chose to do so. Hartmann advised that at this show, they had approximately 12 to 15 guns for sale in addition to knives, scopes and reloading supplies and equipment.

Hartmann advised that on Saturday (11/21/1998), there were a lot of people at their tables, but they did not sell much inventory. On Sunday (11/22/1998), there were a lot of people milling around; more than normally observed on a Sunday according to Hartmann.

Hartmann advised that if you were standing in front of their tables looking at them, Washington was on the right side, sitting on a chair facing to his right and Hartmann was standing on the left side.

Hartmann believes it was Sunday afternoon, sometime after lunch, when a young female came up to their tables

accompanied by a young male. The female stood facing Hartmann and the male stood with one arm resting on the vertical gun rack in the center of the tables. The female said to Hartmann, "I would like to buy that shotgun." Hartmann said "This one here, the double barrel?" She replied "Yes." He asked "How old are you?" and she replied "18". He stated that she was very young looking and so he asked her for some identification "Can I see your driver's license?" Without any hesitation, she reached into her wallet produced a Colorado Drivers License for Hartmann to see. Upon inspection, Hartmann determined that she was in fact 18 years old, just having passed her birthday a few weeks before

Hartmann stated that the price tag on the shotgun said \$245.00 and he told her the price. The female pulled out a wallet from her bag and counted out the money. Hartmann stated that as best as he could recall it was mostly \$20 bills and there were no large bills in the total. She handed him the cash and he counted it out. Once he was satisfied that she had paid the correct amount, Hartmann reached for the shotgun and removed it from the rack and handed it to her. At this point, the male accompanying her, reached over and took the shotgun from Hartmann's hands. Hartmann said he made a statement to the effect of "Are you going to be a gentleman and carry it for her?" and the male replied "Yes."

Hartmann described both the male and female as being nice looking kids and had no reason to question them. He described the male as being about 5'11" tall, since he is 5'10", and the female as being about 5'6" or so. The male was taller than the female. The male was wearing a dark, short-sleeve shirt. Hartmann could not recall what the female was wearing at the time. He just recalled that both were clean-cut. Hartmann went on to say that the female had blond hair, not real long and she a round face and was of medium build; not skinny, not fat. He also described the female as being timid in her demeanor. It was Hartmann's impression that she was nervous because she did not ask any questions about the gun. Hartmann put this down to the fact that she had never purchased a gun before.

After their transaction was completed, the couple left Hartmann's tables and walked away. Hartmann turned towards Washington and remarked "That girl just turned 18."

Hartmann advised that he did not initially think about this incident following the tragedy at Columbine High School until Washington called him on the telephone to remind him of the girl. After the media coverage of the shooting and his discussions with Washington, Hartmann now believes that the female who purchased the shotgun from him at the 11/22/1998 Tanner Gun Show was Robyn Anderson. He is 100% sure of this. He is also 80% sure that her male companion was Dylan Klebold. Hartmann also advised that he has an image in his mind that while he was conducting the transaction with Anderson and Klebold, across the aisle from his tables was a young male holding a pump shotgun, who appeared to be waiting for them. Hartmann could not identify this male.

Hartman stated that the shotgun Anderson purchased from him was a Stevens Model 311D, 12-gauge double barreled shotgun, serial number A077513, with a 28" barrel and the choke was full and modified. Hartmann also advised that the shotgun was mechanically in good condition, had a walnut stock, the finish was good and that the bluing on the barrel was very streaky, as if the original bluing had worm off and someone had tried to reblue it. Hartmann was able to determine this from some old records he keeps for insurance purposes.

Hartmann stated that there was no paperwork produced for this sale and no receipt was given or asked for. Hartmann advised that he had personally purchased this gun sometime before this show, but he could not determine exactly when and where he had done so.

Hartmann stated that he keeps a record of the manufacturer, the model numbers and the serial numbers of all of the guns he has for insurance purposes and is constantly updating these records as he buys and sells guns. When he updates his records, he discards the old records.

Hartmann advised that once they left his stand, he did not observe them again. He and Washington did gun shows the following weekend in Colorado Springs (Sertoma); in about February 1999 in Colorado Springs and the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in March 1999. At none of these subsequent gun shows did Hartmann observe either Anderson or Klebold.

Hartmann stated that while he is reluctant to be providing this information, he felt an obligation to do so. He wanted it clearly understood that he was coming forward as soon as practical after he became aware of the situation that the shotgun which he sold in November 1998, was sold to Robyn Anderson accompanied by Dylan Klebold. He expressed concerns for his personal safety due to all of the leaks of information being made to the media. Hartmann stated that he made a legal sale of the shotqun to an individual, 18 years of age or older, and had broken no laws. Hartmann is afraid that if his identity is somehow released to the media, he will become a target for vengeance and will be viewed as responsible for the tragedy at Columbine High School.

Hartmann turned over to the interviewer a hand-drawn diagram which he had used while describing the layout of his booth and the positions of all parties at the time of the sale of the shotgun. In addition, he advised that the table behind theirs was occupied by the Golden Gun Club and when you faced outward, to their left were three tables full of ammunition being sold by some people from Pocatello, Idaho.

Hartmann had no additional information and at that point the interview was terminated. He did advise that if he recalled any additional information, he would contact that the interviewing agent.

On 04/30/1999, James Royce Washington (PROTECT IDENTITY), also known as Jim Washington, 6020 Snowbird Drive, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80918, a white male born 12/21/1947, Social Security Account Number 237-70-9180, voluntarily appeared at the Colorado Springs Resident Agency. Washington was accompanied by Ron F. Hartmann, also of Colorado Springs. Also present during a portion of this interview was Supervisory Senior Resident Agent Gregory B. Groves. After being advised of the nature of this interview and the identity of the interviewing agent, Washington provided the following information:

Washington is employed as a Senior Investigative and Security Specialist with the Defense Security Service (DSS), 1935 Jamboree, Suite 170, Colorado Springs. Washington has been with the DSS for 17 years and has a total of 26 years of service with the United States Government.

Washington advised that he is an avid gun collector and often goes to gun shows to sell, trade or purchase guns and supplies. Sometimes he will take his daughter along with him to shows.

In late October 1997, Washington met Ron Hartmann because they lived near one another and Hartmann had brought Washington his guns from a show in Pueblo, Colorado, which had to be canceled due to the blizzard in Colorado at that time. Since both of them shared an interest in gun collecting and frequented the same shows, they agreed to start going to shows together and sharing the expenses of obtaining a booth or table. In addition, one man could watch the table and their inventory, while the other one walked around the show to see what was available.

On the weekend of 11/21-22/1998, Washington and Hartmann went to the Tanner Gun Show at the Denver Merchandise Mart in Commerce City, Colorado and set up two tables together. On Sunday 11/22/1999, Washington did not have his daughter with him; it was just he and Hartmann at their tables.

On Sunday afternoon (11/22/1999), Washington was sitting in a chair facing to his right, looking at Hartmann. Washington guessed that it was sometime after lunch. Hartmann

was talking to someone across the table from him when a young female and a young male approached their tables and began talking to Hartmann. Washington stated that Hartmann was standing and he recalled Hartmann asked the female for her license and saw the girl give it to him. Washington could not see the male clearly due to the vertical gun rack on the tables, which blocked his view of the male. He saw the female clearly. He stated that he even looked up when he heard Ron say something like "You don't look 18".

Washington advised that since the shootings at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colorado, he now believes this female to be Robyn Anderson. He described her as having shorter hair than she has now, as determined by her photographs on the television and in the newspapers. Anderson was wearing jeans and a light colored top. She had a shoulder bag, possibly of denim material, which had a flap but no snaps.

Washington stated that after the shotgun was sold, Ron Hartmann handed the gun to Anderson, but the male took it. He heard Hartmann say something to the effect of "it's nice of you to carry it" to the male. As the couple walked away, Hartmann turned to Washington and said "That girl just turned 18." Washington stated that he had no recollection of the male because his view was blocked by the gun rack and there were several people around the table at this time, some of whom were asking Washington questions. Neither Washington nor Hartmann could identify anyone around their tables who could provide any additional assistance.

Following the initial news reports about the shootings and the weapons involved, Washington did not think anything about this particular show and their sales of guns at the Tanner Gun Show. He wondered who had sold the weapons which were used in the shootings. After Robyn Anderson was identified and her picture appeared on the news, Washington immediately recognized her as the female who had purchased the shotgun from Hartmann. He telephonically contacted Hartmann and told him of this fact, but Hartmann did not believe Washington at first, because the news reports did not mention that Anderson had purchased the shotqun.

Washington stated that he wished to cooperate fully with this investigation. Washington does have concerns for his personal safety due to the numerous leaks of information to the media about the progress of the investigation. He feels that Hartmann legally sold a shotgun to an 18 year old individual and did nothing illegal and cannot be blamed for what happened at Columbine High School. Washington fears that if his identity got out, people would attack him or his family and vandalize his home out of vengeance for what happened. He does not believe people would act rationally toward either him or Hartmann if their identities were divulged.

Washington could provide no additional information at this time and the interview was terminated at this point.

BOULDER POLICE SWAT MISSION COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL INCIDENT LITTLETON, COLORADO APRIL 20, 1999

On April 20, 1999 at 1557hrs, SWAT members received a page stating that Jefferson County Sheriff's Department was requesting a full SWAT response to the incident at Columbine High School. They requested that the SWAT Team respond to the Command Post at Leawood and Pierce in Jefferson County. The same page was sent to the Boulder County Sheriff's Department SWAT Team at 1601hrs.

Team members were instructed to respond to the Boulder Police Department and the team would respond to the incident as a group. Boulder County SWAT was advised to respond to the CJC and they would also respond as a group. Boulder P.D. SWAT departed the Police Department at 1635hrs, with all remaining members being instructed to respond to the Command Post in Jefferson County via POV

The Boulder P.D. SWAT Team arrived at the Command Post and staged at 1730hrs, where SWAT Commander Joe Pelle stayed at the Command Post and the Team staged to the south of the CP and east of Columbine High School.

An Entry Team was formulated by Commander Sullenberger with the following members. #1) Brad Frederking, #2) Rich Denig, #3) T/L Tom Wickman, #4) Mark Heminghous, #5) Jeff Kessler, #6) Rick French, #7) Nathan Vasquez, #8) Grog LeFebre, #9) Bill Palmer, #10) Stove Headley, #11) Pat Wyton, #12) Kurt Weiler (scribe), #13) John Smith. Assistant SWAT Commander Robert Sullenberger and Fred Gerhardt set up at the SWAT van, along with Negotiators, Mary Manka, Larry Gibson and Vicki Bresnahan. SWAT members Darin Joko, Mike Cody and Scott Morris were at scene, but not authorized entry into the High School, until they completed their basic training

All members were briefed with the following information: There was unexploded ordinance, some of which had timers, inside of the school as well as the possibility of booby traps. It was believed that there were 25-29 dead students inside of the school, which included 2 dead


suspects. The 2 dead suspects were dead in the Library, with wired devices on their person. While the team was being briefed, EOD was inside of the school looking for devices and removing them. At the time it was unknown if there were any other students or suspects hiding inside the school. Columbine H.S. is a very large school (see attached map) with numerous catwalks. The 2 dead suspects were current students and it was assumed that any other suspects may be students also. School maps and one of the suspects photographs were given to team members (see attached).

The following is a chronological sequence of events:

1830hrs	Three devices located in the school by EOD, one of which as described as being quite large. SWAT members were evacuated to the north for safety. Once the device was removed, members returned to the SWAT Van.
1835hrs	Team Leaders from BPD, BSO, Thorton, Northglenn and Adams County met, where it was decided the BPD and BSO would make entry into the school from the S/W and enter the lower level into the cafeteria. BSO agreed to clear the classrooms to the south, while the PD cleared the cafeteria. The two teams would then meet and clear the auditorium that had catwalks. This was a basic plan that was subject to change during the search.
1850hrs	Three team members were sent to pick-up food for the team from the Salvation Army truck, north of the SWAT Van.
1909hrs	C.P. advised BSO and BPD SWAT to deploy to the S/W corner of the school and prepare for entry.
1912hrs	Both teams deployed from the BPD SWAT Van.
1930hrs	EOD still inside of the school and about to exit the building. Team Leaders were advised that a member from EOD would be assigned to each team, prior to entry being authorized.
1932hrs	CP advises all Team Leaders that they are to mark each door with a magic marker, to indicate that the room had been cleared and which agency had cleared the room. Teams could also mark the floor tiles with this information. Bresnahan and Gibson relayed magic markers to BPD SWAT.
1945hrs	EOD still inside, attempting to disarm two devices.
2000hrs	EOD still inside, unknown when entry would be authorized
2020hrs	EOD located a vehicle in the parking lot with multiple devices. Due to the number of EOD personnel needed on the vehicle, there were not enough members available to be assigned to each team.

2021hrs	Bomb dogs being used on the exterior to check the parking lots and grounds for possible devices.
2045hrs	C.P. instructed the team scribe to pinpoint the location of all suspects/victims on the map for Jefferson County Investigators
2055hrs	C.P. advises that there are major delays with deactivation of devices located by EOD.
2100hrs	Explosion - EOD exploded a device with a secondary explosion.
2115hrs	C.P. advised the entry team to respond back to the staging area. Entry not to be made for 1.5 to 2 hours, due to devices inside Columbine High School.
2130hrs	Commander Pelle came to staging area and briefed the team on the reasons for pulling the teams back to their staging areas and additional information.
	 13 children and 1 teacher in the school, according to the Coroner. Early SWAT Teams were successful in extraction a number of students and did a preliminary clearance. At last count, 30 explosive devices and 1 heavily armed car bomb (S/E lot) had been found. Threats received toward other schools in the area for the next day 2 suspects believed dead inside, 1 arrest, 1 - 2 other suspects/associates. CSP SORT Team and Reserve Deputies holding the inner perimeter. Second SWAT sweep needed in conjunction with EOD to thoroughly clear the interior of the building Including rafters, catwalks, ect EOD had reported that some of the devices have been sophisticated, including timing devices and mercury switches Jeffco Crime Scene Tech's will take over the scene, once the sweep is completed.
2200hrs	Team advised that 31 explosive devices had been located by EOD. This consisted of pipe bombs and gasoline bombs, where EOD was currently removing 2 devices from the cafeteria. At the time there were 13 students, 1 teacher and 2 suspects dead inside of the school. Teams were not expected to make entry for 1 hour
2215hrs	Larry Gibson, Vicki Bresnahan and Mary Manka were advised that negotiators were no longer needed and were released.
2225hrs	C.P. advises all teams that entry will be made in 10 - 15 minutes. An EOD member would be assigned to each team to search the school.
2235hrs	Explosion - EOD - accidental detonation in bomb trailer. Three explosions, no injury to EOD member, but was blown off the bomb trailer.

2240hrs	Team member equipment check (lights and radios).
2300hrs	Jefferson County EOD E-4 assigned to BPD SWAT and E-5 to BSO SWAT
2301hrs	BPD SWAT and BSO SWAT deployed to entry point.
2306hrs	All teams authorized entry into the school.
2310hrs	All teams placed on hold till ATF is cleared from the school.
2316hrs	Entry made
2328hrs	BSO SWAT reports a pipe bomb located in the cafeteria. EOD moved forward and took control of the device.
0045hrs	Cafeteria cleared.
0058hrs	BPD SWAT exits Columbine High School
0103hrs	C.P. advises all teams to meet at the pavilion for debriefing and for team scribes to turn over their maps to Jefferson County
0145hrs	BPD SWAT en route back to the Boulder Police Department.
NOTE:	This incident was debriefed on Wednesday, April 21, 1999. Psychotherapist Marilyn Kruegel spoke and handed out a Helpful Hints list to all SWAT members.
