ACTION TAKEN:

On April 20, 1999 all Investigative Agents with the Colorado Bureau of Investigations, Denver office were advised over the radio to respond to Columbine High School to assist on a shooting. The Reporting Agent, Linda R. HOLLOWAY (R.A.) arrived on scene at 1:20 p.m. Numerous emergency personnel were already on scene and a command post had already been set up by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

The R.A. contacted several of the students as they were being shuttled from the High School to the area near the Command Post. The students that I contacted are listed below. An attempt was made to contact a parent or family member by cell phone and the children were turned over to counselors or victim advocates

Adam's parents were contacted by the R.A. and informed that Adam was safe, however he had Received a rib injury and would be transported by ambulance to a nearby hospital

Jonathan VANDEMARK related that he had seen one of the armed gunmen. He described him as being short, having blond spiked hair and carrying an ooze with a black strap attached. He further stated that the gunmen belong to the Trench Coat Mafia. He further related that he had seen three or four bodies on stairs as he ran from the building at approximately 1445 to 1450 hours.

Kristine KOELLNER of CBI related that she had located information from the Internet on this group of people who identified themselves as the Trench Coat Mafia. Information that she had located was relayed to the R.A. at the High School and I relayed it to the Command Post. One page of the information was a message from a person identifying himself as LANG SILAS. He related in his message that he was the leader of the Trench Coat Mafia and that he would die on April 20, 1999.

At 2045 hours on April 20, 1999, Barrie GOETZ of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation, Pueblo office related to me that he had noticed a carving in a picnic table in the park to the north of the High School. A canopy covers a picnic area where laboratory personnel were gathered and being briefed on the scene. The carvings were the numbers "4:20" and on the opposite side of the same wooden table were the numbers "187". Both carvings appeared that they had been freshly cut through the painted surface of the tables. This information was related to Chief Investigation Kate BATTON.


On April 21, 1999 the R.A. assisted in the identification of the vehicles in the parking lots adjacent to the High School. Lists of registration information were relayed between CBI and the Command Post that were obtained through the Colorado Department of Motor Vehicles. Each vehicle in the parking lots had a piece of tape attached to a window and the names of the registered owners were written on the tape.

The Bomb Squad searched several cars to identify suspicious items that could be seen or that had any potential association with the shootings. The following lists of vehicles were searched by the Bomb Squad during the time period I was involved with the vehicle identification:

After marking numerous vehicles in the north student parking lot, the R.A. assisted inside the High School with Evidence Team #5 in the collection of evidence in the main hallway of the building.

SUMMARY: Linda HOLLOWAY of CBI arrived on the scene at 1:20 p.m. I contacted several students who were being shuttled from the High School, search them and debriefed them for any pertinent information. Their parents were contacted and they were turned over to victim advocates or school counselors. I also assisted in identifying and marking vehicles located in adjacent parking lots and kept track of some of the vehicles that were searched by the Bomb Squad. I later assisted Team 5 with evidence collection inside the school

ACTION TAKEN:

On April 22, 1999 Agent Linda R. HOLLOWAY of CBI was asked to contact Evan TODD, a victim of the Columbine High School shootings. The information given at the time of the assignment was that Mr. TODD was a victim and had received some injuries that were treated at a local hospital and that he had been released. I contacted Evan TODD at his residence and made arrangements to meet him on April 22.

On April 22, 1999 at 1500 hours (3 p.m.) I interviewed both Evan TODD and his older brother, Adam TODD. It was learned that both brother attend Columbine High School and had information.

Evan TODD related that he was in the library when the shooting started. He was with his friend, Ryan BARRETT, when he heard an explosion. He remembered hearing kids running and a teacher related that there were kids with guns. He stuck his head out of the library and saw Eric HARRIS with a shotgun. HARRIS shot the shotgun at Evan TODD, but missed. Evan TODD ran for cover and hid under the copy machine and then under a library desk.

The two gunmen entered the library. They were shooting. He remembered a gunman

saying "STOP NIGER" and then they shot the black student ISALAH. He recalled hearing a girl praying and then heard gun shots and he could not hear her anymore. He believed that they killed her.

He recalled them saying "ALL JOCKS STAND UP - NOW IS THE TIME FOR REVENGE FOR MAKING US OUTCASTS".

The gunmen then discovered him hiding. Dyland KLEBOLD held a shotgun to his head and he was called a "FAT FART". He was asked why they should not shoot him. He told them that he never had any problems with them and his life was spared.

Evan TODD further recalled that Eric HARRIS had blood coming from his nose. He stated that the two gunmen stuck very close together as if protecting each other's back. They were not talking on hand held radios however he did remember hearing bombs going off in other areas of the building while HARRIS and KLEBOLD were in the library.


Evan TODD received minor injuries which included shrapnel in the eye and in his shoulder. He was treated and released from the hospital.

Adam TODD then related that he had a class with Eric HARRIS and they were in the same senior class. Adam was sick that day and did not attend school. Adam further informed me that the blue Mazda that was parked closest to the door in the Senior parking lot belonged to Zach HECKLER who he believed was a close associate of HARRIS and KLEBOLD. He showed me a recent news paper article dated April 21 that showed officers taking cover behind the Blue Mazda during the shootings. Adams and Evan supplied me with two large senior photographs depicting the 1999 Senior class. Both photographs contained the same people, however, one depicted the students taking a traditional class photograph and the other allowed students to do whatever they felt like.

They pointed out HARRIS and KLEBOLD in the upper left of the pictures and stated that the student around them were their friends and associated with Trench Coat Mafia. Sitting immediately in front of the two shooter they identified Zach HECKLER and Brook BROWN.

In the humorous photographs, the group in the upper left hand corner appear to be holding their hands as if to be pointing a gun at the camera. These photographs were taken for copying purposes and will be returned.

ACTION TAKEN:

On May 7, 1999 the Reporting Agent Linda R. HOLLOWAY contacted twin brothers Adam and Jason SANDS at their residence in Littleton. Both of the boy's natural parents were present during the interviews.

It was learned that the two boys drove themselves to school on April 20, 1999. Adam stated that they arrived at the school at 7:15 a.m. and parked in the parking lot at Clement Park. He walked to his locker, past the cafeteria and to his first period class in the Language room in the lower level of the school. After 4th period, he went to the cafeteria, arriving at between 11:13 and 11:14 a.m. He didn't recall seeing any duffel bags in the cafeteria or seeing anyone carrying anything unusual into that area.

He had already gone through the lunch line and purchased his lunch before the lunch period began for the rest of the students. He sat at table XX with several other friends. He was shown a map to verify where he was at in the cafeteria.

Other students at his table were, ERIN BROWN, DAVID JOHN SMITH, DAN PALMETER, MATT DEPEW, ERIC LARSON, JACOB BAUER, MARTY LAYTON, MIKE LAVAN, DAN REICKS AND BRENDON TRUJILLO.

His first knowledge of the incident was when he observed other students rush toward the windows. He heard two loud gunshots. He recalled seeing a kid up on the hill and run and jump over the fence (approximately 7 1/2 feet tall). This kid was described as being thin, athletic, having short hair and wearing dark clothing.

He got down and began crawling. He then got up and ran up the stairs and out the math doors. He drew on a map his movements through the school. He ran across Pierce Street and into Leeward Park. He was with Melissa PORTER, who also ran from the cafeteria.

He remembered hearing two "shots" when he was under the table and two shoots when he was on the landing on his way up the stairs. He did not see the gunmen or any students who were shot.

He knows both Dylan KLEBOLD and Eric HARRIS. He talked to Dylan in the hall on the previous Tuesday. He thinks that Dylan has A Lunch also and maybe Eric HARRIS has the same lunchtime.

He is involved with what he referred to as "Fantasy Baseball" on the computer where kids interact over the Internet. Dylan KLEBOLD is involved with this same Fantasy Baseball game and he has chatted with him on "chat lines" in the past about Fantasy Baseball. His screen name is "AD232323". This is the only communication he has had with KLEBOLD. Another person involved with this game is Chad LAUGHLIN who may be the "leader".

When asked what he was wearing that day he stated that he was wearing kacki shorts, and old dark blue or green shirt and a white baseball cap. He left behind his maroon Coleman backpack in the cafeteria which contained books and binders and a TI 83 calculator.

When asked what he had heard about the shooting, he stated that a friend, David EAGLE, told him that there was a third gunman who had blond streaks in his hair. He heard that there were three more people involved who were outside the school and ran.

He also heard that other kids in Deb Williams's science room heard one of the shooters talking on a cell phone and using the name "JOE".

He heard from Nelson EAGLE that the manager of Clement Park, John SPALINGER, saw three people run from the school, who may be gunmen. He showed me briefly on his computer the Fantasy Baseball game.

When asked if he remembered the "Thought for the Day" he thought it was "I bet you wish you weren't here today 4:20, 4:20".

He doesn't know anyone with a double pierced eyebrow.


I then spoke with his brother, JASON SAMUEL SANDS. He went to school with Adam and met friends in the math hall before going to 1st period Spanish class. He has B Lunch and was in math class when the incident started.

He first heard kids screaming and "bangs". The fire alarm went off and he went out the front doors to the math pod and across Pierce Street. He was out of the school within 5 minutes of the beginning of the incident.

He heard from teacher Mrs. MULLINS that shots had been fired across the street toward the kids in Leeward Park. He did not personally witness anything.

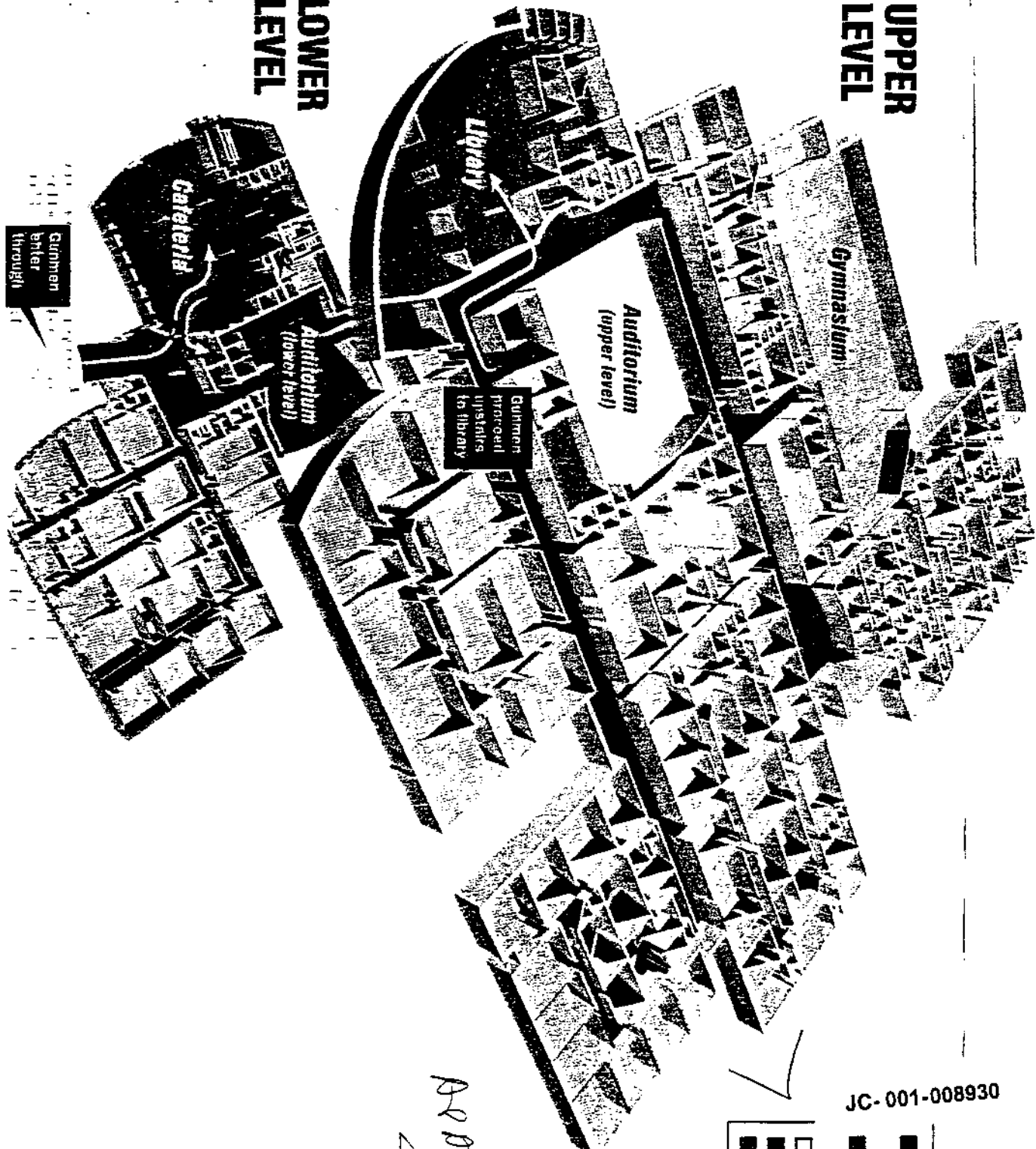

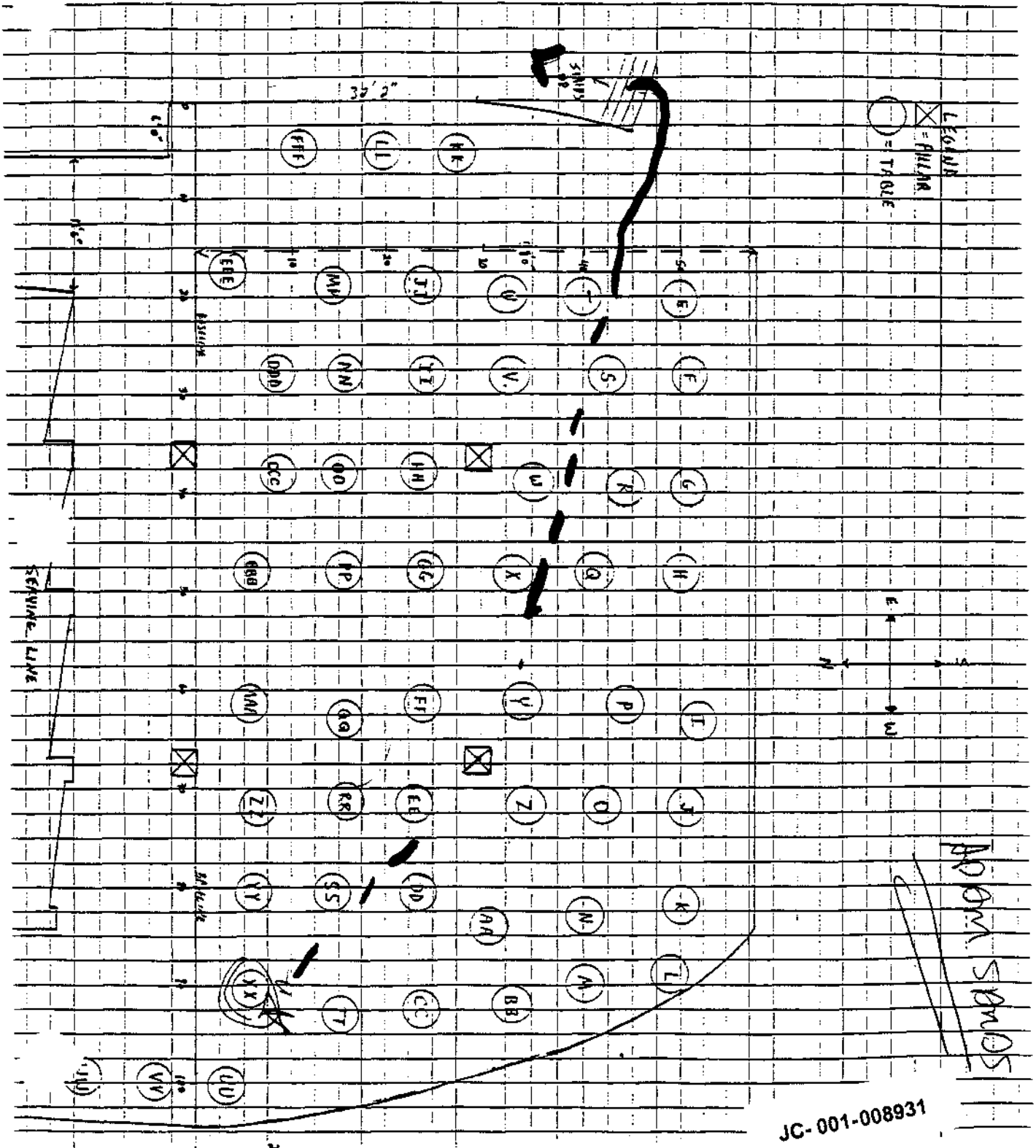

ASSIGNMENT SYNOPSIS:

Carmen ZAMORA, (303) 432-7129 witness, was contacted on April 28, 1999 at her home. ZAMORA stated she was checking out through the line at Target and the clerk told her that she was Eric HARRIS'S ex-girlfriend. The clerk told ZAMORA that she knew the shooting was going to occur. ZAMORA provided the numbers off the top of her receipt and then described the clerk as a female, 5'05", 17-18 y/o, blond hair with gold/blue stripes in the front.

The receipt numbers were given to the Target store manager, D. GREEN. GREEN provided the name of Lauren PIEHN and stated she would be at work at 08:00 a.m. on April 30, 1999.

Lauren PIEHN was contacted on April 30, 1999 at approximately 09:00 a.m. PIEHN initially stated she did not know anyone at Columbine High School. After the Reporting Agent told PIEHN he would re-contact the witness that provided the information on statements that PIEHN had made she changed her story. PIEHN stated she made the information up just to be closer too the incident and she should not have done this. No additional information relating PIEHN to the Columbine incident could be determined and the interview was ended.

ACTION TAKEN: On June 22, 1999 Detective Kate BATTAN, of the Jefferson County Sheriff Department contacted the Reporting Agent. Kate BATTAN is the lead investigator on the Columbine High School shooting. Detective BATTAN requested the Reporting Agent conduct and origin and cause investigation on a fire that occurred in the school library at or near table #15 on April 20, 1999. The laboratory team assigned to the area had photographed, collected evidence, and taken a sample of the suspected accelerant used to fuel the fire. Detective BATTAN requested additional documentation to determine the pre-fire placement of the device. The Colorado Bureau of Investigation case number for the enclosed fire investigation is #99D-0146.

The Reporting Agent originally observed the scene of the fire on April 21, 1999, while working in the library on a different assignment. The area of fire damage was centered on the south edge of table #15, and a thin layer of liquid was present on the table surface. Several small pieces of glass were observed on the table top and surrounding floor. A flat circular disc consistent with a Mason type lid was observed on the floor near the base of table #16

The Reporting Agent met with Agent in Charge Tom NETWAL, of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation on June 23, 1999. AIC NETWAL stated samples were taken of the suspected accelerant on table #15 when the library was processed and is currently being analyzed in the laboratory.

The Reporting Agent met with Kate BATTAN and Chris ANDRIST, of the Jefferson County Sheriff Department on June 24, 1999, at the library. Chris ANDRIST provided a brief synopsis of the evidence collection process in the west portion of the library. The library remained under the control of the Jefferson

County Sheriff Department and was still considered a crime scene area. Although the physical evidence throughout the library had been documented and collected, table #15 was in its original location from the time the fire occurred. This was evident because the area around all 4 corners of the table had been traced onto the carpeting, and were still in the original scene examination position.

The west area of the library was examined from the least amount of fire damage to the most. No fire or smoke damage was observed on the east, center, and north office area of the library.

The west side of the library was examined. Several of the west side windows were broken out and had been covered with plywood after the incident. There was no evidence of fire ventilation patterns through the openings in the windows, and they appeared to have been damaged by gunfire. The remains to several wooden matches were observed on the floor and furniture throughout the west side of the library. Several of the matches were broken, and some had pieces of duct tape on them where they had been fastened to the end of various explosive devices, to be used as igniters. There were several areas of blood soaked carpeting under the computer station and wooden library tables in the west side.

Table #16 was examined. Previous scene examination on April 21, 1999 indicated that shooting victims, Isaiah SHOELS and Matt KECHTER were located under the north side of table #16 when they were shot. Matt KECHTER had fire damage on his left hand, right lower corner of his shirt, and right thigh area of his blue jeans. An ink pen was located in his right hand. The fire damage consisted of surface damage to the blue jeans; partial consumption of the shirt material and third degree burns to the ends of several fingers on the left hand. Preliminary coroner reports indicate the fire damage to Matt KECHTER hand and clothing was post-mortum and not the cause of death. No evidence of an ignition source was found on or under the bodies of SHOELS or KECHTER. A partially straightened paperclip was on the floor under the body of KECHTER. The paperclip was examined and no evidence was found to contribute it to the fire damage on KECHTER'S body or the device used on the surface of table #15. The remains to a charred wooden match was found partially under the southwest corner of table #16. The top of the table was examined and a dark semi-circular scuff-mark was observed on the surface above KECHTER'S body. The mark is somewhat consistent with a wooden match strike; however, a wooden match typically does not leave a heavy carbon deposit on the striking surface. A carbon deposit may be left if the match or striking surface is contaminated with a secondary fuel. Burning duct tape or a fuel soaked material would be a reasonable secondary fuel. The underside of table #16 had no evidence of fire damage. The floor and chairs around table #16 were examined and no evidence of fire damage was observed. A directional pattern of glass was observed on the floor between

table #16 and table #15 The glass radiated out from the south side of table #15 towards the southeast corner of table #16. The glass was curved and the thickness was inconsistent with that observed in the west windows of the library

The bottom of a jar was found on the floor near the southeast corner of table #15. The construction of the bottom portion of the glass jar is consistent with the curved glass observed on the floor between table #15 and #16. Several of the pieces were threaded and had smoke deposit patterns from continuous exposure to fire.

The area south of table #15 was examined and the floor had several areas of blood soaked carpeting. This is the area where both suspects were found. The Reporting Agent observed no areas of fire damage on the suspect's bodies before they were removed from the area. The carpeting, books and ceiling were examined and there was no evidence of fire damage. The bookshelf east of HARRIS'S location was covered with body tissue in an upward pattern from near floor level. A circular pattern of the same type of body tissue was observed on the ceiling directly above this area. Body tissue was also observed on the surrounding furnishings including the top of table #15.

The top of table #15 was photographed and then layer searched. The remains to a note about Race was observed on the west edge of the table. The note was handwritten on an index card and stated:

Race- a group of people who share common physical characteristics perceived as a distinct group. Ethnicity- set of cultural characteristics that distinguishes one group from another. Minority Group- a group that demonstrates similar cultural/physical characteristics, and are denied equal treatment because of it. Discrimination- Denial of equal treatment of individuals based on group membership. Prejudice- unsupported generalization about a category of people. Racism - Belief that ones own race or group is naturally superior. Slavery- Ownership of one group by another. De Jure Segregation- segregation based on laws. De Facto Segregation- Segregation based on informal norms. Active Bigot- A prejudice person who actually discriminates. Timid Bigot- A prejudice person who does not discriminate. Fair Weather Liberal- A non-prejudice person who does not discriminate. Legal Discrimination- upheld by law. Institutionalized discrimination- Outgrowth of structure of society.

The note could not be contributed to the fire on the top of table #15. The note did however relate in topic to the unburned schoolbook located on the top of the table and was consistent with a homework assignment.

The top center portion of the table was covered with an oily amber colored liquid pattern. An analysis of the pattern revealed it originated approximately 8 inches inward from the south edge of the table. Splash patterns extended from this area towards the north side. A blistered area of the tabletop was located on the south edge of the charred schoolbook. The only secondary fuel in the area of the blister was ordinary combustibile. This blistered area was caused by a smoldering paper fueled fire that exposed the top of the table to heat for an extended period of time.

The piece of body tissue on the top of table #15 was located in the edge of the liquid pattern. The tissue measured approximately 2 inches by 2 inches. The top surface of the tissue had a shiny surface consistent with that coating left by the oily liquid observed across the table top. The tissue was adhered to the tabletop surface and was removed with a metal scraper. The area of table surface under the tissue had no smoke staining or evidence of the oily liquid. The tissue would not have adhered to a pre-oiled surface. The lack of smoke deposits and liquid residue under the material also indicated the tissue was on the table before the device containing the oily liquid released its contents. An examination of the surrounding area indicated the tissue was included in a directional pattern extending away from the area where the suspects bodies were found.

A thin line-shaped burn pattern was observed on the south edge of the table #15 top surface. The pattern extended over the south edge of the table and radiated approximately 8 inches towards the center. The burn pattern had a protected area in the center creating a shadow pattern consistent with a fuse or wick type device.

The floor under table #15 had several areas of blood soaked carpeting. The carpet directly under the south edge of the table had an oily residue stain consistent with the liquid from the top of the table spilling over the edge. No fire damage was observed to the floor. The bottom side of the table was examined and also lacked any type of fire damage. The west end of the center support to the table had several bullet type holes in it. The holes were directional from the north to the south. Several small pieces of wooden match remains were found on the floor near the south side of the table.

The following five items were taken from the fire damaged area on table #15:

- Item #1016, a sample of charred paper
- Item #1017, a charred notebook.
- Item #1018, paper towels.
- Item #1019, index cards.
- Item #1033, cutting from pants

The samples were collected immediately after the shooting, by lab personnel that

processed the scene. Agent in Charge, Tom NETWAL, of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation analyzed the samples. The samples were processed under CBI Laboratory number, D99-1333. The following is a synopsis of the laboratory testing results:

- Item #1016, revealed the presence of a gasoline class liquid.
- Item#1017, revealed the presence of a gasoline class liquid.
- Item #1018, did not reveal the presence of a combustible or flammable liquid.
- Item#1019, revealed the presence of a gasoline class liquid.
- Item #1033, did not reveal the presence of a combustible or flammable liquid.

Witness statements and information obtained from a warrant executed on the suspect's homes indicated they had accessed research materials on homemade Napalm. Homemade Napalm is generically gasoline that has been thickened to a gel like consistency by the use of a variety of thickeners. Common gelling agents are mild soaps, motor oil, animal fats, and Styrofoam peanuts. The gel like substance is designed to stick to items it is thrown on once the transportation device has fractured. The large surface area created when the liquid is dispersed allows it to vaporize at a faster rate thus creating a rapid spread fire. The fuse/wick on a Molotov cocktail type device is not designed to penetrate the container and ignite the contents. It is designed to ignite the product in its vapor form once dispersed. A container simply placed in a stationary location may not ignite at all due to the fuse burning itself out. It is reasonable for the fuse device to apply enough heat to the exterior of the container and cause it to fracture in that location. This condition is consistent with the fuel pattern and lack of heavy fire damage observed on the top of the table #15. Threaded pieces of the top of the glass bottle used to contain the fuel were found on the tabletop. The threaded pieces of glass were heavily charred indicating a pro-longed exposure to fire. The fuel pattern on the table was consistent with the determined bottle location, near the south edge. The glass and fuel directional patterns were inconsistent with a high-pressure content release, and no evidence that the bottle was thrown against the table was found.

SUMMARY.

The Reporting Agent initially observed the fire damage in the CHS library on April 21, 1999. On June 22, 1999, Lead Investigator Kate BATTAN requested the Reporting Agent to conduct an origin and cause investigation on fire that occurred inside the library of the school on April 20, 1999. The assigned laboratory personnel had already processed the scene and collected evidence, including samples of a suspected accelerant liquid and glass remains of a container found near table #15.


The area of origin was determined to be at or near the top of the south edge of Table #15. This determination was made after analyzing post fire movement and

intensity patterns, liquid pour patterns, glass debris fragments, and layer searching.

The cause of the fire was determined to be intentionally set. This determination was made after ruling out all other possible fire causes in or near the area of origin. The directional liquid and glass patterns indicated a glass container with a wick was placed upright on the south edge of table #15. A fuse type device was lit and the device was left to burn in that position. Body tissue in a pattern consistent with the suspects wound patterns was adhered to the surface of the table. The liquid spill pattern and surface soot from the fire were observed on the outer layer of tissue. This observation indicated the body tissue was on the top of the table before the liquid was released from the container.

Fire damage was observed on the left hand, shirt, and upper right pants of shooting victim Matt KECHTER. KECHTER was found under the north side of table #16. The area on and around KECHTER was searched. A single charred wooden match was found partially under the southwest corner of table #16. The top of table #16 had a 6-8 inch scratch across the surface. The scratch curved and appeared to be partially made up of a black carbon deposit. The matches used to ignite some of the devices used in the school on April 20, 1999 were duct taped in place to be used as a fixed igniter. Burning duct tape will increase the release of carbon and may have contributed to the soot residue left on a striking surface. The area between table #15 and #16 and the fabric seat cushions were examined and no evidence of fire damage was observed. No communication was found between the fire damage to KECHTERS body and clothing and the fire that occurred on top of table #15.

Per your request, the following is a synopsis of our involvement at the Columbine High School crime scene. If more information is needed, please contact me at your convenience.

In response to a teletype received on the morning of April 21, 1999, that indicated a need for additional personnel to assist in perimeter security, I made the decision to offer any assistance that we could provide. After discussions with Sheriff Bruce Hartman of Gilpin County and Chief Art Hutchison of the Black Hawk Police Department, it was determined that we would stagger our response throughout the day.

Gilpin County Sheriff's Dept. sent deputies during the morning and into the afternoon, Central City Police during the late afternoon and evening, and Black Hawk Police during the late afternoon and throughout the night. The assignment that we received from the Command Post was simply to assist in the security of the outer perimeter.

Lt. Terry Krelle and I were assigned to relieve Gilpin County Sheriff's personnel and patrol an area in and around the athletic fields to the North and West of the school in Clement Park. Our responsibility was to keep unauthorized persons out of that area, as it was still classified part of the overall scene. Numerous contacts were made without incident. We also responded to a medical situation in the Press area and after preliminary evaluation, asked that an ambulance also respond. Littleton Fire Department Paramedics arrived and assumed control of the incident. Our time on scene was from 1700 hours, until 2200 hours, when we were relieved by a Black Hawk officer. The Command Post advised that our assistance was no longer needed. We cleared the scene at approx. 2230.

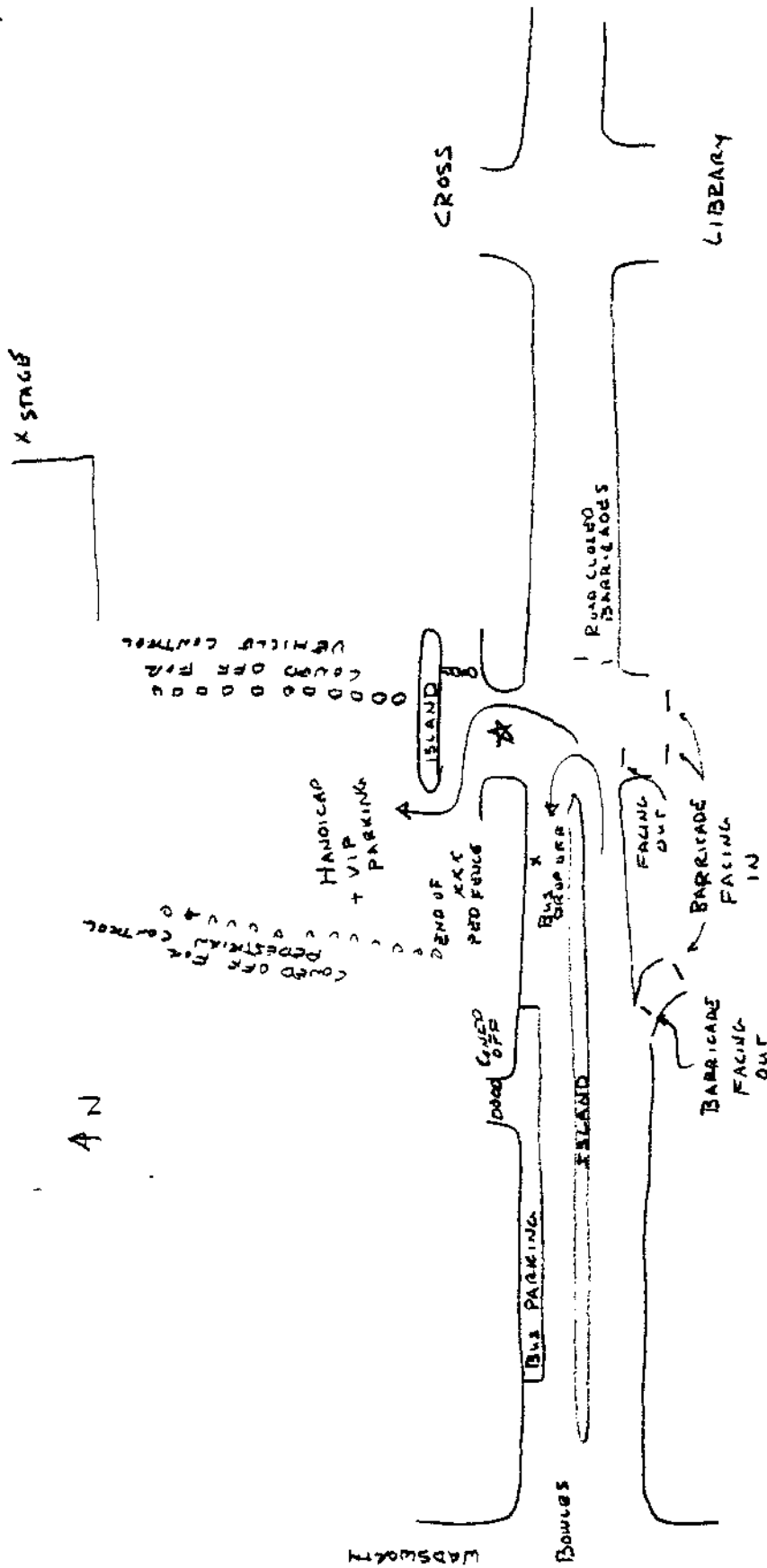

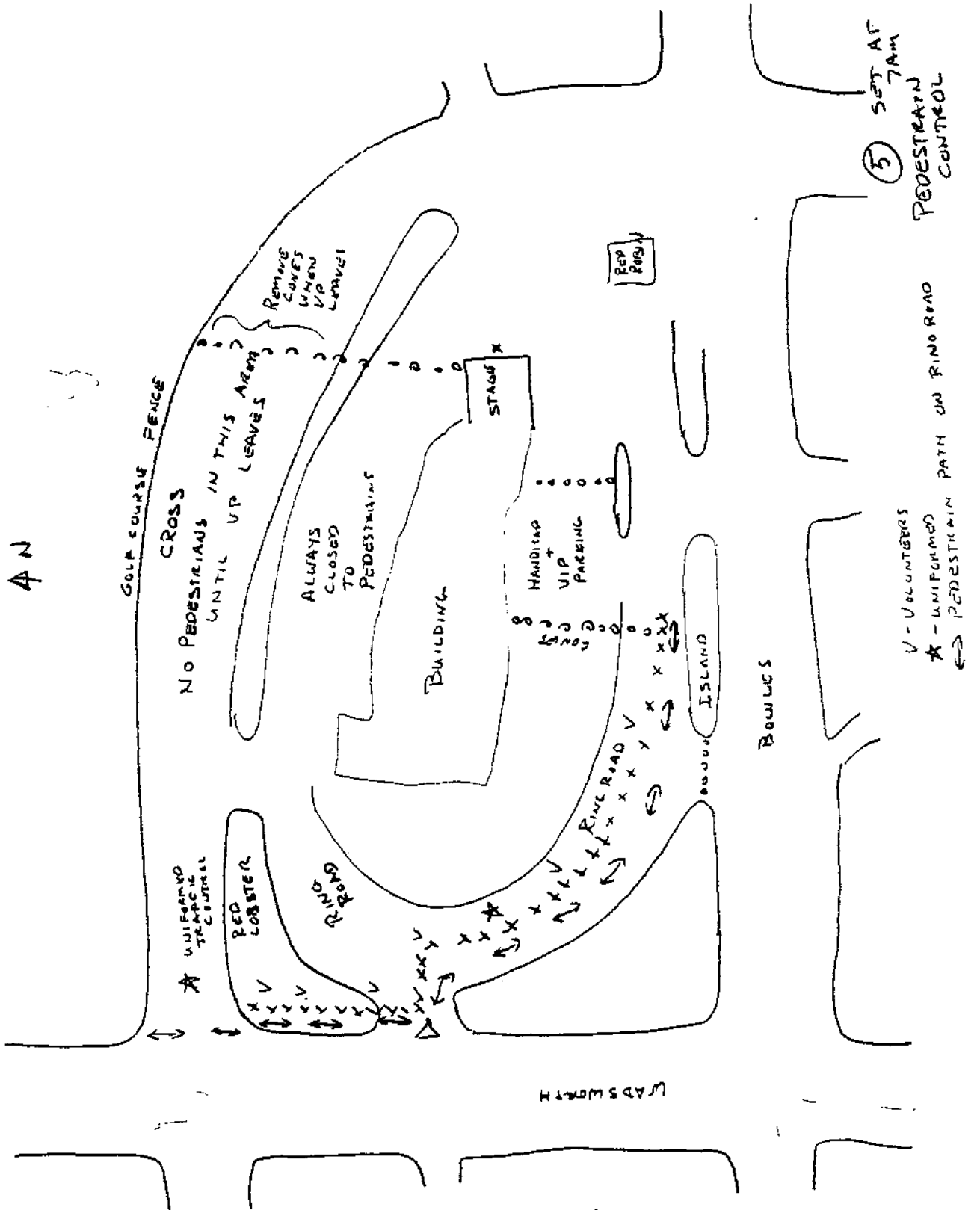

(W)Clark stated he told (W)Talocco he had seen three kids in the back of the school laying down, apparently shot. He did not have any information on vehicles or other suspect activity. Boss advised Horst Rossmueller call him on the day of the shooting. Rossmueller talked about how terrible the incident was. Boss stated hat Rossmueller is an associate of some of the employees working at the Cutlery When Boss saw the picture in the paper he recognized Rossmueller , which he knows as "Horst" Boss stated that on 04/21/99 at around 11 30 PM he was clicking through channels on his TV when he observed "Horst" on one of the late night talk shows.

Boss advised Rossmueller has never purchased any items from the Naked Edge Cutlery Boss gave us an employees name of Daniel Gvion Clem, 1811 E. Mineral Pl , Littleton, Colorado, Phone: (303) 797-7426, which is a close friend of Rossmueller Ross stated Clem had already talked to the police about Horst Rossmueller.

Boss stated Rossmueller works at the Software place on the bottom floor of the Mall. Boss stated Rossmueller had disappeared two days before the shooting and know one knows where he went Rossmueller has a habit of disappearing for two days at a time.

On 04/28/99 at approximately 11.20 AM we contacted Jennifer White. DOB. 04/29/78, store manager of Software Etc., at Southwest Plaza Mall. White advised Rossmueller was employed there however he would not be in to work until 04/29/99 at 2:00 PM

On 04/29/99 at approximately 2 30 PM we interviewed Horst Rossmueller at Software Etc. Rossmueller did not attend school at Columbine High. Rossmueller graduated from Heritage High in 1998 Rossmueller was associated with TCM during his senior year. Rossmueller joined the TCM in Oct 1997 and stayed until he graduated.

Rossmueller advised the name TCM came about after someone come up to the group and asked if they were the Trench Coat Mafia. The name just kind of stuck after that. The group was just a butch of kids that would hang around together after school

Rossmueller stated he never saw anyone in the group with any guns. An individual by the name of Chuck Phillips would always talk about swords and bring books to show pictures of different swords.

Investigator Mike Jeffries read the names off of the list of TCM's we had and Rossmueller reconfirmed that the names were members of the TCM as he knew them.

Rossmueller advised he had no knowledge of the incident prior to it occurring at Columbine High School.

Jeff Boes was not at the school on the day of the shooting. He was on suspension due to being caught with a pipe (drug paraphernalia) two weeks ago. Joe is a freshman at Columbine High School. Jeff had no knowledge of the suspects and was not at the grade level to attend classes with them. He had no information to add. His father verified that Jeff was at home on suspension during the incident.

Mike Boes, a Senior at the High School, was on a bus returning to school from a field trip. The bus was not allowed to return to the school and Police had surrounded the school. Mike heard people yelling as they ran from the school. He quoted an unidentified student as saying, "Crazy Fucks are blowing things up".

Mike stated that the Trenchcoat Mafia started with about 20 people and now has only 11. Joe Stair, a member, was in a drawing class with Mike. Stair had drawings of bombs in his sketchbook and joked about blowing up the school. This was because he hated jocks and school. Stair also collected swords according to Mike.

Mike is not currently a jock, but was on the school diving team.

We were then advised that three possible suspects in the shooting were running towards us on the west side of clement park. We engaged the suspects and provided cover for JCSd deputies who took them into custody.

Myself and Detective Keough are members of the Jefferson County Critical incident team and were paged to the command post at Pierce and Bowles. I met Detective Keough at approximately 13:30 p.m. and remained on scene until we were released by Lt. Chism at approximately 19:15 hrs.

NARRATIVE:

This is supplement to the report to Detective Scott Fowle's offense report.

I was assigned to administrative duties at the Edgewater Police Department on Thursday April 20, 1999. I was monitoring the radio when I heard Jefferson County duties calling for assistance.

We responded to the command post at Coalmine and Pierce St. We arrived at about 11:40 hrs. I advised the command officers in charge of our arrival and equipment.

I was later contacted by Deputy Pedigo who was requesting a team to clear the maintenance shed west of the high school at Clement Park. Myself, Detective Fowle and a Denver Police Officer assisted Deputy Pedigo with his request.

Requested them to vacate This action was directed by the Jefferson County deputies.

Myself and the other officers started to walk back to the command post when deputies began requesting assistance just west of the maintenance shed. Due to the close proximity we responded to their location. A employee for the maintenance shop gave Deputy Pedigo permission to use a golf cart and secure it next to there facility. We used this cart for a quick response when Deputies requested assistance.

Upon arrival I assisted the Jefferson County deputies with taking three juveniles into custody. I used my AR-15 to cover the deputy who searched and placed hand cuffs on one subject.

I went back to the command post and stood by for any other assignments. I was on scene until about 16:30 hours.

On 4/27/99, SA Michael William Howell interviewed Greg Garnet, date of birth 4/2/72, regarding a phone tip he called into the Columbine High School Task Force (RAPID START CONTROL NUMBER 1229). Garnet was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview. He then provided the following information:

Garnet works at Pep Boys, 5134 S. Wadsworth Blvd., Littleton, Colorado, telephone number (303)932-0606. Garnet saw two white males enter the store on a weeknight, approximately one week before the shooting. The first male was described as a white male, approximately 5'9"-5'10", with short hair, eyeglasses and blue jeans. The second male was described as a white male, approximately 6'1", long hair with a red streak, fingernail polish, a white substance on the lips, and all black clothing (including a black trench coat).

The two individuals asked Garnet if the store carried skull and crossbone gear shifters, glow sticks and road flares. Garnet showed the two individuals where the road flares were located. They asked if they could get a discount if they bought them all and were told that they could not. The two individuals were in the store for approximately 25-30 minutes and Garnet does not believe they made any purchases. Garnet said the individuals were acting Agoofy@while in the store. Garnet has not seen the individuals in the store before this date or since this date.

Thomas Greenburg, DOB 6/19/71, Manager, Pep Boys, 5134 S. Wadsworth Blvd., Littleton, Colorado, telephone number (303)932-0606, was interviewed on 4/27/99 by SA Michael W. Howell. Greenburg was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview. He then provided the following information:

Greenburg was advised by one of his employees, Greg Garnet, that two individuals wearing black trench coats and silver lipstick were looking to purchase road flares, fluorescent candles, and skull gear shifter knobs. Greenburg did not see the individuals and does not think that they made any purchases. Greenburg believes they were in the store on a weekend and in the evening.

On 4/27/99, SA Michael W. Howell interviewed Logan Richins, DOB 10/1/82, Pep Boys employee. Richins was also present in the store when the two white males were in the store. Richins was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and
