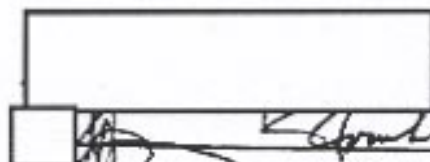

[redacted] was interviewed at his residence in the presence of his father, [redacted]

[redacted] After advisement of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, he provided the following information:

[redacted] at Columbine High School. He normally eats lunch during fourth period, which he has free, and at the end of the period at 11:10, he and his friends normally go outside. On April 20, 1999, just prior to the 11:15 bell, he and his friends [redacted] [Last Name Unknown] were sitting at a table inside the cafeteria near the south window, which faces a parking lot.

[redacted] saw Dylan Klebold walk into the southwest entrance to the cafeteria from the parking lot. He was dressed all in black, with black trousers, black shirt, black boots, a black trenchcoat and a black Colorado Avalanche hat worn backwards, which had a Boston Red Sox emblem sewn on it. [redacted] does not recall Klebold carrying anything, and saw him walk over to the vending machines in the cafeteria.

According to [redacted] during lunch, Klebold and Eric Harris would normally sit in Klebold's BMW in the parking lot on the south side of the cafeteria and watch people. [redacted] only knows Klebold and Harris by sight.

After the 11:15 bell, [redacted] and his friends walked out of the southwest exit of the cafeteria, towards the soccer field. He heard a sound which sounded like fireworks, similar to a string of Blackcat firecrackers going off. [redacted] indicated that prior to April 20, 1999, he had never heard gunfire. About 50 yards away, outside on the west side of the cafeteria, he saw a tall white male, dressed all in black, with a black trenchcoat, and what he thinks was a black hat and dark sunglasses. At the time, he did not recognize this person, but thought it might be [redacted] a member of the Trenchcoat Mafia who is about the same height and build.

[REDACTED] saw this person shoot at three students near the southwest corner of the cafeteria with what he thinks was a shotgun, based upon the loud noise and the slower rate of fire. This shooter then pointed the shotgun at [REDACTED] and his friends and fired four or five shots at them. [REDACTED] and his friends fell to the ground and covered their heads. When [REDACTED] looked up, he saw the gunman walking towards the southwest cafeteria entrance.

[REDACTED] also saw a white male dressed in a white short-sleeved tee shirt and blue jeans, kneeling with his back to him near the northwest corner of the cafeteria. He did not recognize this person, and since his back was to him, could only tell he had either light brown or blond hair. This person had no weapon nor other gear visible.

[REDACTED] saw this person throw an object one-handed on top of the cafeteria/library roof. It appeared metallic with sunlight glinting off of it, and one to two seconds after landing it exploded with a loud bang, a flash of fire and a pall of smoke.

While he observed the person in the black trenchcoat shooting outside and the person in the white tee shirt throwing the explosive device, he also heard very rapid gunfire coming from somewhere within the school. [REDACTED] was unable to see who was doing this shooting or tell exactly from where in the school it was coming from.

After this person threw the bomb, [REDACTED] and his friends got up and ran to a nearby house on Teller Court, where [REDACTED] called his father to let him know he was safe. [REDACTED] indicated he noted the time of the call as 11:20 a.m.

[REDACTED] knows two members of the Trenchcoat mafia, [REDACTED] a former Columbine student who graduated last year, and [REDACTED]

After the end of fourth period at 11:10 a.m., he and [REDACTED] [No Further Information], telephone number [REDACTED] intended to meet another friend in the cafeteria and leave school grounds for lunch. When their friend did not show up, they decided to stay at school and study.

[REDACTED] started to walk to his locker, located in the east/west hallway on the south side of the auditorium, near the Science 12 room. While he was on the stairs located at the southeast corner of the cafeteria, he heard a lot of commotion coming from the cafeteria. He looked down into the cafeteria and saw people moving around and heard screaming. He also heard shots and the sound of projectiles striking walls and lockers, which at first he thought were paint balls from the sound the striking rounds made. He started back down the stairs and heard someone shout, [REDACTED] "get out! Someone has a gun!"

[REDACTED] was able to look outside the window on the stairs and saw several students trying to hide and others lying on the ground on the south side of the cafeteria. Mr. Sanders, a teacher at Columbine High School, began telling everyone to head downstairs into the cafeteria, but after hearing gunfire, told everyone to go upstairs.

A large group of students went up the stairs on the southeast corner of the cafeteria, and once at the top, ran to the right and east through the east/west hallway on the south side of the auditorium and out the exit by the math area.

[REDACTED] and Mr. Sanders went to the left towards the library, and [REDACTED] hid behind a pillar near the top of the stairs.

The other person was dressed all in black, black trousers, black shirt, black trenchcoat, a black beret, and was wearing what appeared to be a black mask. Synopsis: Threat to attack federal building(s) on 4/30/1999.

Details: Attached for each receiving office is a copy of the text from an Internet chat room "conversation" which contains non-specific threats to an unidentified federal building which is to occur on 4/30/1999. Also contained in the text are threats to agents who attempt to contact the subject. This information is furnished for appropriate security measures by each field office and to make notification to other federal agencies located within each division as deemed necessary.

On 4/27/1999, the Houston Division received a copy of a transcript from a conversation that occurred in an Internet "chat room." The conversation took place between approximately 11:00-11:30 PM CDT on 4/25/1999. The "Littleton, CO" chat room, hosted by an Internet content provider called Excite, was dedicated to discussion of the recent Columbine High School mass murder in Littleton.

A participant in the chat room, who used the moniker of [REDACTED] or possibly [REDACTED] identified himself as a 20 year-old male. During the conversation, the subject made the following remarks, among others:

"Columbine is a shit school"  
"I love the school shooting"  
"...should have kill more"  
"you cannot trace me"  
"if I ever go to court, they will drop the whole case, God is an asshole!"  
"I blame society"  
"I am gonna bomb a federal building on April 30, watch cnn"

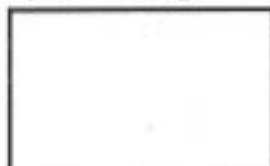

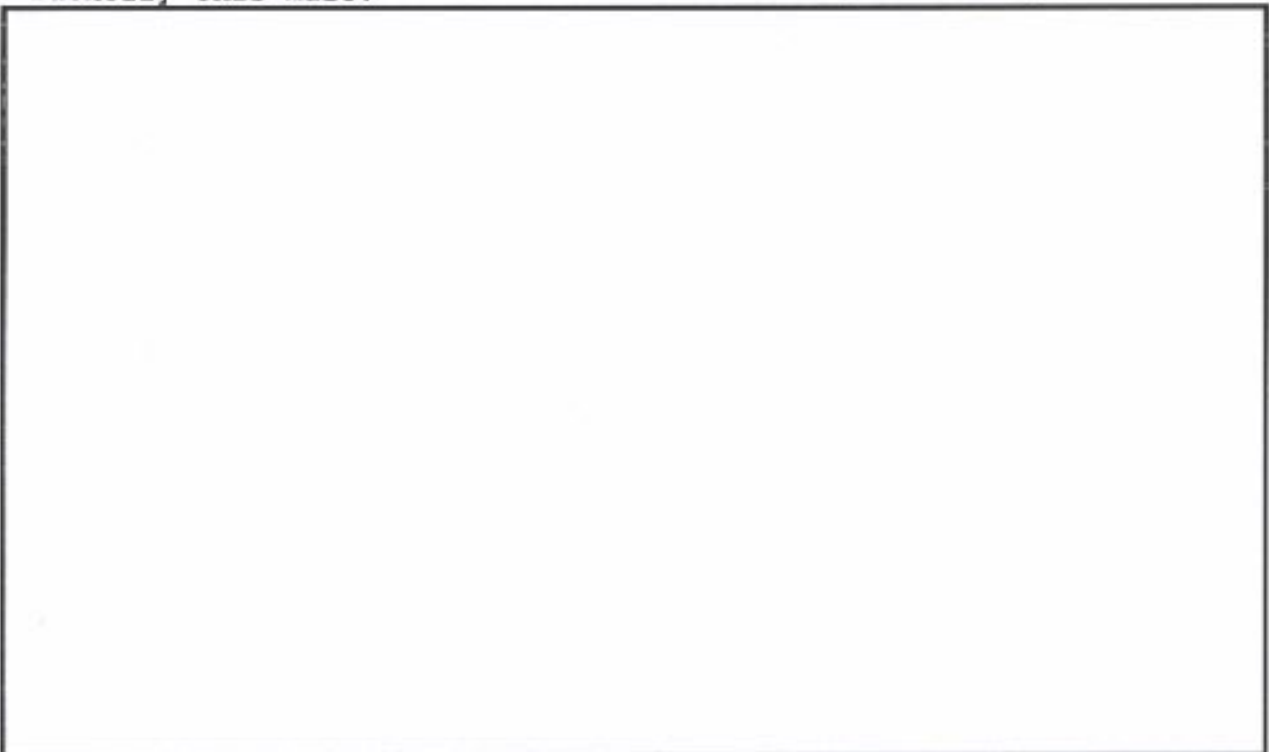
