After hesitating at the pillar he continued to the stairs leading to the second floor. As he was going up the stairs he looked up and over his shoulder to the second floor. He saw a fire burst from the balcony area that overlooks the stairs by the library. The girl next to him fell, but he believes she was able to get back up. [REDACTED] could not see any individual or gun that may have caused the fire burst. At the top of the stairs he turned left and entered the auditorium.

In the auditorium, [REDACTED] heard several gunshots coming from an area that would have been behind the back stage of the auditorium. He proceeded out the set of doors on the far side of the auditorium, turned right and headed to the front door of the school. As he was running down the hall he ran into a friend named [REDACTED] at Columbine High School. As [REDACTED] LNU reached for the door at the front of the school the glass shattered. [REDACTED] doesn't know if the glass was shot out or what caused the shattering. [REDACTED] then ran through the teacher's lot towards Clement Park and the Pavilion. At the Pavilion he saw [REDACTED] a friend of [REDACTED] teacher at Columbine High School, was in his car and told the boys to keep on running. [REDACTED] kept on running and at the intersection of Pierce and the street that Leewood Elementary is on, he ran into [REDACTED]. They then saw [REDACTED] does not recall the name of the [REDACTED] her friend, possibly named [REDACTED] drove [REDACTED] parent's house. [REDACTED] then called his parents and shortly after that [REDACTED] father came home.

[REDACTED] at Columbine High School. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] he saw someone run from the front door area toward the back of the school as the fire alarm was going off. [REDACTED] also a student at Columbine High School was in the Tech Lab near a window and saw a guy run from the front door or upper commons area towards the back of the school as the fire alarm was going off. [REDACTED] believes the fire alarm doors shut and lock as the alarms go off. The doors are made of steel.

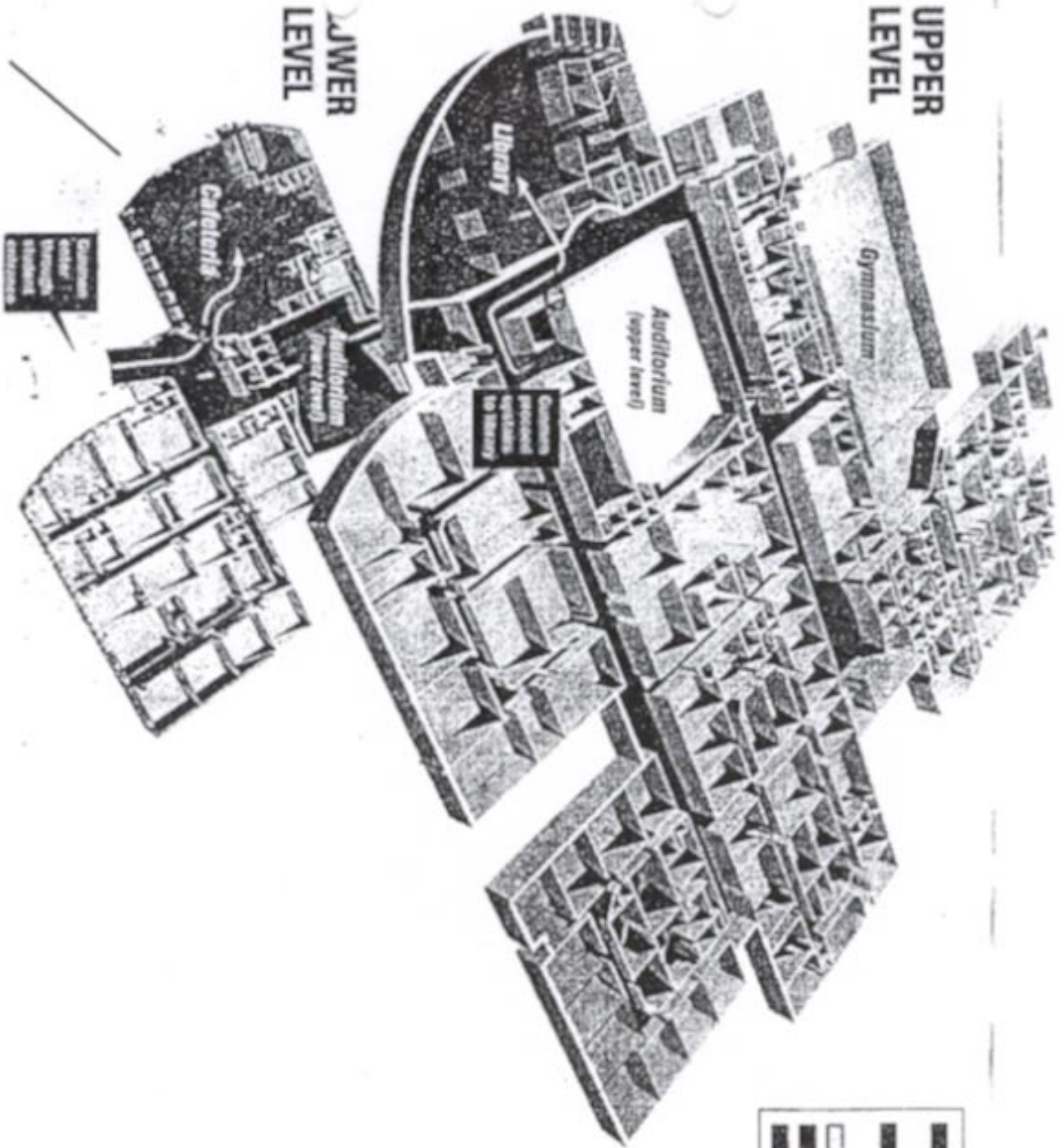
[redacted] at Columbine High School. [redacted] was in the auditorium [redacted] prior to the shootings. [redacted] had left through the back entrance of the auditorium to get a drink of water, when he heard several gunshots. He ran back into the auditorium and told everyone that someone was shooting a gun. At that moment [redacted] told him, the fire alarm went off. [redacted] ran out of the building and was running up the hill towards the ball fields. A gun shot apparently went by his leg as he was running up the hill. [redacted] then went to the maintenance shed for the fields and the maintenance guy pulled them into the shed for safety. From inside the shed they called the police and a SWAT team eventually got them out of the shed.

Attachment A is a copy of the school diagram which has been marked to where he sat in the cafeteria and where he saw the fire burst as he ran up the stairs. Attachment B is a statement [redacted] wrote on Wednesday night, April 21, 1999, concerning the shootings at Columbine High School.

[redacted] was interviewed at his residence in the presence of his parents [redacted]. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the interview, [redacted] furnished the following information:

[redacted] at Columbine High School. On April 20, 1999, at approximately 11:15 a.m. [redacted]

[redacted] At approximately 11:20 a.m., [redacted] to get a drink of water at a fountain down the hall. After getting his drink he was walking back to the classroom and heard an explosion in the front upper commons area. He then heard the fire alarm go off and began following the fire escape plan. As he was leaving the building he heard someone say, "he has a gun".

After exiting the school on the northside, [redacted] went to "the pit". Other students were talking that it must of been a senior prank until an officer stated that there was a man with a gun. The students were pushed back to Clement Park and [redacted] jumped the fence and went to the parking lot by the baseball fields. He was again pushed back to the school parking lot (Clement Park area) and then out to Bowles Avenue. During his exit from the school, [redacted] ran into his friend [redacted] at Columbine High School.

After reaching Bowles Avenue, [redacted] Last Name Unknown (LNU), [redacted] and an unknown female riding in her car, agreed to give them [redacted] a ride to [redacted] house. They arrived at approximately 12:15 p.m., at [redacted] residence. At approximately

[redacted] stated that he was off campus at the time of the school shooting. [redacted] left campus at the end of 4th hour, approximately 11:20, with [redacted] (phonetic) and [redacted] in [redacted] car, a [redacted] (make and model unknown). [redacted] did not see anything unusual happening at the school when he left. [redacted] and his friends drove back to the school approximately 20 minutes later but could not get back on the school grounds due to the number of students who were running away from the school. [redacted] then heard a gunshot and ran to a lady's house near the school. [redacted] left the area in his car.

[redacted] later learned that [redacted] was on the soccer field during the shooting.

## CASE SYNOPSIS/EXAMINER CONCLUSION

On April 20, 1999, two armed gunman assaulted Columbine High School, in Littleton, Colorado shooting students and throwing improvised explosive devices. They killed 13 people before killing themselves.

The two gunman were described as being part of the "Trench Coat Mafia". [REDACTED] friend of the gunman. [REDACTED] interviewed about his foreknowledge of the events which transpired on April 20, 1999. [REDACTED] had no prior knowledge that the two gunman, Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, were going to assault the school. [REDACTED] agreed to a polygraph examination.

On April 21, 1999, [REDACTED] voluntarily appeared at the Denver office of the FBI accompanied by his parents. [REDACTED] parents were not present for the examination. [REDACTED] was advised of his rights as per the Interrogation; Advise of Rights Form. He advised he understood them, initialed them, and signed the waiver. He was then admonished via the Consent to Interview with Polygraph Form. He again stated he understood his rights, initialed them and signed the waiver.

[REDACTED] friends with both Harris and Klebold. He denied knowing that they were going to attack the school. He also denied any knowledge concerning explosives used by the gunman. He denied being involved in the assault, or the planning of the assault. Following this discussion [REDACTED] was afforded a polygraph examination consisting of the following relevant questions:

[redacted] at Columbine High School (CHS). [redacted] has known Dylan Klebold since [redacted] and Eric Harris since [redacted]

[redacted] Klebold went with Robin Anderson to the prom and the after prom and seemed happy.

[redacted] had classes with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and saw them everyday at school. On 4/20/99 [redacted] left CHS at the same time during their lunch hour at approximately 11:15 am. [redacted] got in their separate vehicles and drove out of the CHS parking lot. While driving out of the parking lot they both saw Eric Harris driving into the school in his 2 door gray Honda Accord. [redacted] honked her horn at Harris and waved and he waved back. [redacted] also waved at Harris. [redacted] proceeded to her home where she remained until she headed back to school at the end of the lunch hour. When she tried to go back to school the street was blocked off and [redacted] thought that there may have been an accident. A police officer told her that there was not going to be any more school because there had been a school shooting.

[redacted] explained that what the media was referring to as the Trench Coat Mafia was just a bunch of guys who hung out together. They were not a gang. She estimated that there were probably 8 - 10 kids who wore these trench coats. The kids whose names she could remember were Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold [redacted] [redacted] has hardly seen [redacted] wearing a trench coat. [redacted] has probably only worn a trench coat two or three times since January of 1999.

[redacted] and Dylan Klebold were best friends and like brothers. [redacted] and Eric Harris had previously had a fight [redacted]

[redacted] and Harris had resolved their differences and were friends again, although they were not as close as they used to be. [redacted] believed that Harris' closest friends were Dylan Klebold, [redacted]

[redacted] expressed her disbelief that Harris and Klebold could have done what they did at CHS. She believed that Harris and Klebold kept to themselves. [redacted] is in shock over what has occurred. She believed that Harris was closer with Klebold, since [redacted] and Harris had their falling out.

Harris, Klebold, [redacted] worked at Black Jack Pizza. [redacted]

Harris did not get along with the "jocks" at school. The "jocks" made fun of Harris because of the way he dressed. He wore black pants, black boots, a trench coat and a shirt bearing the name Rammstein. He also had a hat with the initials of some techno group. [redacted]

[redacted] that the "jocks" pissed him off and they did not even know who he was.

[redacted] recalled that during their junior year Harris had stolen some computer parts from school and had been caught along with some other people.

[redacted] believed that Klebold had to be drawn into this by Harris on Sunday after the prom. [redacted] stated this because she recalled that Klebold was having so much fun at the prom.

[redacted] did not recognize the name Phil Duran. She had no idea where the weapons came from which were used by Harris and Klebold.
